**I**'M A HAPPILY married man, even though slightly confused, and I love my two wives

This, in itself, may be regarded as confusing, but it's really simple. You see, I have a very fine wife by the name of Henny at home and then there's Joan Davis, to whom I'm married in "I Married Joan" for NBC-TV. Not that I married her for the sake of the network, mind you, it's just that that's where the TV show is seen.

Actually, the number of hours I spend with Joan are more than those I spend with my wife. I'm sort of anaesthetized with Joan for eight hours. But however you want to call it, the fact still remains that I spend most of the day's speaking hours with her.

## **Wives Keep Him Busy**

I get the "wifely" treatment from both ends. I am subjected to such routines as "Why are you so late?" by both Joan and Henny. I'm even reminded by both when I need a shave and, of course, my clothes are given the once-over by such remarks as "About that suit you're wearing—of course, you're kidding."

Henny and Joan get along very well, however, and I suspect they

are even closer friends than I think. At least, whenever there is a matter of policy and Joan wants to get me to do something I may not like, she very subtly goes over my head and takes up the subject with Henny. I end up doing it.

At times, Henny, who is an actress, works on the show and she and Joan inevitably get into a corner and trade all kinds of small talk. But from the look on their faces at times—as they stare at me—I'm not so sure the talk is small. I got a hunch it's loaded with a Mickey.

Anyway, the two girls are such good friends that Henny even sent Joan some flowers on the opening of our show with a card reading, "To Jim's Other Wife."

I have a sneaking hunch that Henny likes the kind of husband I am on the show better than the kind I am at home. At least, she is always saying, "Why aren't you as charming here as you are on the TV show?" I try to shrug off this typical feminine reaction but she has a point. Take the way I am at breakfast on "I Married Joan." Lots of funny chatter, big smile, loud laughs—happy as all get out. At home—well, no laughing and scratching. All my answers are in monosyllables. I'm no charm boy here. Come to think of it, I have

more trouble learning my lines at home than I do on the show.

I've had some scenes to play in "I Married Joan" that were too close to home to be comfortable. These I always try to play very differently from the way they're done in my little "nest." After I've done them and am sure I was very subtle, I get a look from Henny that proves I wasn't kidding her for a minute.

## **Likes Being Married**

Doing a program like "I Married Joan" is about as serious as getting married. I'm subjected to a person as much of the time as I would be in a marriage. I have to make adjustments in my work with Joan the same as I do at home. I have to respect her periods of silence, her moods just as I have to respect Henny's. And, in both cases, it has seemed wise not to be too cherry in the mornings. Yet—with all their little traits—and in spite of the fact that they're as domineering as most women, Joan and Henny are easy to get along with.

My two wives may give me problems, but I'm one guy anyway who can come home with lipstick on his collar because the same lipstick also caressed that paycheck.

# WHY I TOOK

*Joan Caulfield is the latest motion picture star to invade TV with her own show, "My Favorite Husband" for CBS-TV. And she's not even vaguely frightened at the prospects.*

**I**F I HADN'T BEEN lucky enough to have been chosen as the subject for "This Is Your Life" one evening, I probably would never have gone into TV. But now I'm in it—and glad I made the move."

Lovely Joan Caulfield tossed this remark out with no tremor in the voice, no dancing nerves, none of the accompaniments so accepted when a motion picture star takes the plunge

into television. Here was one lady who had herself quite a challenge—since she is doing her show "live"—and was anxious to meet anything TV wanted to throw at her.

### Show Is Born

"Harry Ackerman of CBS saw the 'This Is Your Life' show and asked for a print of it," Joan went on. "And things began to move from that moment on.

"While I was waiting for further word from Mr. Ackerman my husband, Frank Ross, who produced that wonderful picture, 'The Robe,' and a friend, Andrew Solt, and I had discussed doing a TV show. We thought up one based on the Arabian Nights, but the budget was too prohibitive. A couple of other ideas came into our minds but nothing took shape until Mr. Ackerman approached me to play the lead in his favorite project, 'My Favorite Husband.'

"I liked the idea and the part almost at once. I had done a little television before—and had been especially pleased to see that I was considered for off-beat kinds of roles that would never have come my way in pictures. Roles like the one I did in 'The Girl in the Park' with Herbert Marshall for the Ford Theatre.

"Everything was going along fine in the negotiations until I learned that 'My Favorite Husband' was to be done live. My first reaction was 'Oh, no! No live show for me!' But I gradually began to weaken. I reasoned that since I had done a good deal of stage work, had always liked playing to an audience and having control over scenes I was playing, perhaps a live show wouldn't be so bad. I finally said I'd do the program part live and part film. Well, anyway, I weakened some more and the first thing I knew I had agreed to do the whole show live."

# THE TV Plunge

Joan isn't in the least worried about all the things that may happen to her on the show. Nothing can bother her after the experience she had in stock.

"I was doing 'Dream Girl' one summer when the whole set fell down on us," she laughed, "so you can see that it would take a lot to get me upset. Naturally, I hope the sets for our TV show don't get that nervous.

"Because of my stage work, playing to an audience, which bothers some performers, has no horrors for me. I've learned that an actress had to decide whether the audience is to be her friend or not—and then make them her asset."

## Familiarity

Joan then brought up the much-discussed business of TV's wearing out a star's welcome. This is the primary bugaboo.

"I think it's up to the performer to be interesting and attractive enough so that an audience is kept intrigued and not bored," Joan said flatly. "This is a challenge, at least to me, and one that I hope will keep me on my toes. I think familiarity is a good thing for a TV performer—if it's served up delectably.

"I've already seen how familiar a star does become to the public on the basis of the Ralph Edwards' show

alone. The day after I was on 'This Is Your Life,' I was shopping in the market when a man selling muffins stopped me, handed me a package of the muffins, and told me how he liked the show. This would never have happened to a straight movie star. Then people are constantly waving at me as I drive in my car. All this is an intimate kind of friendliness that I like.

"I don't think the top TV stars need to worry about their future. I'm sure Lucy and Desi will be serving the same charming comedy five years from now—even though it may be served differently."

Probably the most satisfying thing to Joan about her new career is that it has changed her attitude about acting completely.

"I used to do pictures, even though I didn't like the parts, just because I was being paid so much," Joan said. "Now the money isn't the concern. It's the chance to create something really good. It's thrilling to feel you have a chance to act again."

Joan paused momentarily, and then a broad smile covered her face.

"About that business of a TV star's getting too familiar to the public," she remarked lightly. "Maybe you'd better ask me that question a year from now. Perhaps by then audiences will have had more than enough from me." She added with a sigh, "I hope not."

Joan needn't worry. You can expect to see "My Favorite Husband" and Joan Caulfield around for some time to come.

# Are You a Candidate for the Morgue?

*Live dangerously if you like but not while driving through traffic*

**T**HAT AMBULANCE careening down the freeway has another traffic victim. It could be your wife, son or mother. Are you heading for the morgue?

The radio-TV unit of the Traffic Education Section has been trying for the past five years to educate the public to the fact that safety is everybody's business. They have programs scheduled on KFI, KXLA, KPOL, KGH, KFVD, KCCS and KLAC-TV. Normally this wide coverage should saturate the market and come across to the listening audience but the continued high rate of traffic fatalities has the department wondering.

The radio-TV unit is a part of the Traffic Education Section which is supervised by Sgt. Frank L. Crewe. The unit's current project of programs was organized in 1948.

Officers Pat Kearin and Paul Jackson are assigned to the full time job of preparing and presenting radio and television programs on traffic safety. During the past five years a total of more than 500 hours of actual air time has been logged by this unit.

The mail response to these traffic safety programs indicates listener interest and popularity. "Motorist's Melody Time" (a combination of traffic stories, events, traffic quiz and popular music) has brought mail response from sixteen Western states, several Eastern states, Canada and, of course, from Texas.

Letters of appreciation come from listeners who are veteran drivers.

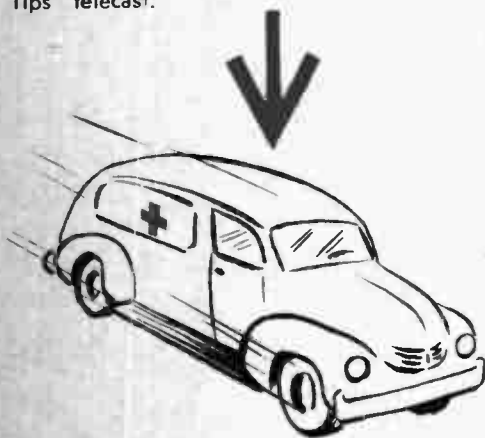
This is the kind of a letter which makes the department beam: "I have been driving for twenty or thirty years, and never had an accident. Even so, I learned something about driving safety from your program."

A great many commendations have been received by the Department and the officers who present these programs for their clear and concise explanations of various traffic laws, violations and problems. In 1951 the National Safety Council awarded KFI and the "Motorist's Melody Time" the Public Interest Award for exceptional service to safety. Police departments throughout the country have studied the Los Angeles Traffic Education's program.

Betty White devotes a portion of her "Hollywood on Television" program to Officer Jackson who demonstrates "Traffic Tips." With the aid of a blackboard and model cars he illustrates proper driving habits—parking, stopping, turns, right-of-way—and stresses safety precautions. Officer Jackson states that the greatest killer is speed—speed too great for existing conditions.

In addition to their various programs, the traffic education section also publishes a number of pamphlets on traffic safety. These booklets are available by merely writing to Traffic Education Section, 411 East First Street, Los Angeles 12, California.

The department has done everything possible to educate the drivers. Now it's up to you. You can be your own traffic policeman. You can save your life—if you want to.

## Stop, Listen, Look (Shows You May Like)

### "The Jack Benny Show"

**KNXT**, every third Sunday, 10 p.m.

**Jack Benny's** new show for the fall season picks up right where the last one left off—high in the humor groove.

From his opening remarks to the final fade, Jack, of course, keeps the proceedings moving along at a humorous pace. In fact, the only weak spot in the entire half hour **Page Eight**

was the "Kitzel" scene. It just didn't come off.

Naturally, there was a good deal of interest in the appearance of guest star, **Marilyn Monroe**. There was a sneaking suspicion that **Miss Monroe** might lay a few good-sized eggs, so it is a pleasure to report that she socked over her particular kind of personality with a bang. Looking glamorous and alluring, she gave the viewers all they wanted—and more.

"Rochester" was on for only a brief moment but managed to make that moment ring the expected bells. Others in the cast registered effectively.

**Jack** is still just about the smartest man on TV. He is very wise to appear only thirteen times in a season. In this way his material and his personality never become "tired" to the audience and there is always a desire to see his show when it does hit TV. Other star performers should look at **Jack** more carefully and realize that this is one of the best ways to last on television. He keeps the audience wanting more instead of making them say, "Is he on again?" **J. H.**

### "Your Show of Shows"

Saturday, 9:00 p.m.  
NBC-TV (KNBH)

"Your Show of Shows" launched its fifth season with a conservative change in format. It's stars, **Sid Caesar** and **Imogene Coca**, are still on hand to amuse, bemuse and delight the viewers, but **Liebman** has re-emphasized the Broadway revue format by surrounding his stars with new name talent.

The most radical departure from previous seasons was his reduction in "regular" cast members. **Margarite Piazza**, the **Billy Williams Quartet**, **Bill Hays** and the **Hamilton Trio** are but a few of the familiar faces who will no longer perform before "Shows" cameras as "regulars."

The returning ninety-minute TV extravaganza had a few weak spots but the sum total of "Shows" forms a pleasing pattern. The welcome back bit between **Caesar** and **Miss Coca** set the pace for the top talent package, which included **Nat King Cole**, **Lily Pons**, **Tamara Toumanova**, **The Charlivels** and **Robert Monet**.

**Nat King Cole** rendered two songs in his traditionally appealing manner. **Miss Pons** sang "Je Suis Titania" from "Mignon." Her beautiful voice and the production left little to be desired.

**Tamara Toumanova**, the renowned ballerina, danced to **LeRoy Anderson's** new tango. She was ably assisted by a male group. However the choreography underplayed her talents, and was certainly not appropriate material for her TV debut.

**The Charlivels**, the sensations of two continents, leaped and twirled their spectacular way across the video screen. **Caesar's** pantomime, "The

Dentist's Apprentice," was overdone and did not come off; however his Professor bit with **Carl Reiner** was up to its usually good standards.

**Robert Monet** in a final production number was rather weak. Viewers were prone to compare him to the exuberant **Bill Hays**. Despite its high and low spots, "Shows" returns as a top calibre show, with imaginative direction, camera angles and lighting.

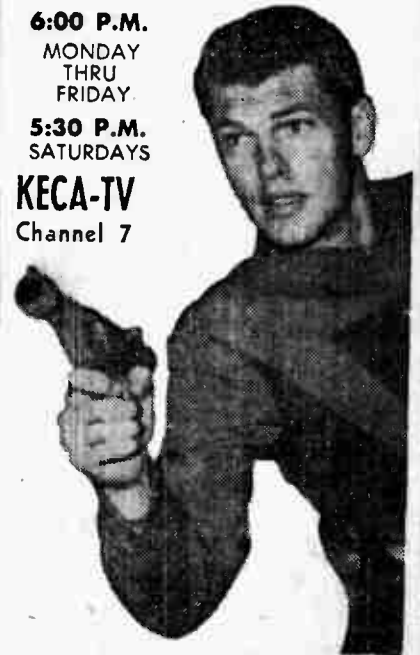

# RECORD Notes to You

**TOPS IN ALBUMS:** What is easily the best dance album of the week (and may turn out to be the best of the year) is Coral's "Let's Dance"—eight great instrumental sides by Les Brown and his Band of Renown. With tunes like "Cherokee," "Stompin' at the Savoy," "Jersey Bounce," "One o'Clock Jump," "Flying Home," "Lullaby in Rhythm," "Brown's Little Jug" and "Perdido" given the classic Brown treatment, it's difficult to pick any one favorite . . . they're all great! . . . Nat "King" Cole (Capitol) provides the week's vocal topper with "Two in Love"—eight songs for lovers as only the King can sing them . . . "Tenderly," "Handful of Stars," "There Goes My Heart," "Little Street Where Old Friends Meet" and the others in this album should go well with soft light and romance.

**BEST IN SINGLES:** Bing Crosby (Decca) sings a pair of Continental favorites, "Embrasse Moi Bien" and "Mademoiselle de Paree," both recorded in France. The latter is a typical French waltz song and "Embrasse" is reminiscent of "La Vie En Rose," but don't judge by one ear full; both must be heard several times to register their true beauty.

Billy Eckstein (MGM), the Metro-nome vocal award winner for 1953 joins with the instrumental winners on a double-sided version of "St. Louis Blues." With everyone getting a crack at the spotlight and Mr. B making with both a straight and scat version of the lyric, how can it miss?

Rosemary Clooney (Columbia) could have a winner in "Shoo, Turkey, Shoo," a rhythmic novelty featuring a chorus of children, and the multiple-voiced Rosie singing as you like her on the heart ballad "Lonely Am I." . . . Vic Damone (Mercury) does his best singing in many a month on "Ebb Tide," originally an instrumental by Bobby Maxwell; here's a fine combination of top material and performance.

Teresa Brewer (Coral) has a pair of top discings in "Too Young to Tango" and "Ricochet" and look for either one to hit the bell for Coral.

Kay Starr (Capitol) has a similar winning pair in "Swamp Fire" and "When My Dreamboat Comes Home," both swung high and handsome to excellent Dave Cavanaugh backing. . . . A.M.

I SAW SOMETHING PRETTY NICE happen the other day. You'll see it, too, if you're tuned to your TV set, Channel 4, on Friday, September 25, when "Glamour Girl" hits the screen. The reason I have advance information is that the other afternoon I was in the NBC-TV studios in Burbank when the tele-show was being kinescoped for release ten days later.

BY NOW YOU ARE PROBABLY familiar with the procedure on "Glamour Girl"; from four participants picked from the studio audience and informally interviewed by emcee Harry Babbitt, one is chosen by audience applause to undergo the glamour treatment. The transformation takes away your breath.

THIS PARTICULAR DAY, Mrs. Walter Hester of Hawthorne was reporting back before the cameras after her intensive twenty-four hour glamourization. As the curtains parted, there she stood in all her glory and yards and yards of champagne taffeta and net . . . a beauty to make anyone gasp. This in itself was a story.

BUT THERE WAS A STORY behind the story—chock full of that old tear-jerking human interest stuff. It seems that the day before, a plain, unglamourized and a very unhappy Mrs. Hester had first appeared on the program asking to be given the full treatment in an effort to gain a reconciliation with the husband from whom she had been parted for three weeks. She was frank enough to tell Harry Babbitt that she loved her man and wanted him back; that their two children kept asking about daddy coming home and that she didn't know what to tell them.

FROM THE START, glamour expert Mary Webb Davis and others working on the show felt it was only kind to dampen any hopes Mrs. Hester might have about her husband rushing to her side as the result of her winning the glamourization course. But sly Jack McCoy decided to play Cupid on the qt. Fully aware that he was handling the proverbial dynamite, but also figuring he might be able to effect a reunion of the couple, he called Mr. Hester at work, "I'm Jack McCoy of 'Glamour Girl' and your wife just won the contest to be glamourized on our television show. You can hang up on me if you want to, but . . ."

MR. HESTER DID NOT CHOOSE to hang up. He listened attentively while McCoy told him what Mrs. Hester had said on the program.

THE FINALE FOUND Mrs. Hester posing as a real Glamour Girl on the NBC-TV stage, completely unaware of Jack McCoy's phone call. Suddenly, her newly-found poise was put to a rigid test, for onstage walked her husband, a tall, handsome chap, whose welcome was a mixture of outstretched hands, and moist eyes which looked bedazzledly at the glamorous and radiant Mrs. Hester greeting him. As soon as the show signed off, thoughtful McCoy escorted the pair to a room adjoining the studio and quietly

itself. (If it could be proved that you did invent the darn thing, thousands of viewers might turn on you in righteous wrath.)

When it's suggested that every panel show is an imitation of "What's My Line" this is an insult to the inimitable work of your fine panel and moderator. The basic idea of finding out what a person does for a living via your original method has not been imitated to my knowledge—although Mr. Capman of my office had an idea many years ago called, "Give Us the Business," which could be judged similar to yours, but has never been produced. As soon as some one comes up with an idea using these specific ingredients—then you can call "imitation."

The business of trying to protect television and radio ideas from plagiarism is not new to me since I originated "The Quiz of Two Cities," and have successfully kept this idea of inter-city competition as my own exclusive production for many years. However, I could not presume to claim an origination of the basic pattern of quiz simply because I was fortunate enough to use the ingredients in a novel manner. I did know one man in radio in Baltimore who used to argue that all quiz shows were imitations of his program since he was one of the first to ask a question in the early stages of radio. Clever?

Frankly, gentlemen, my reason for being rather upset at the idea of you originating the panel show is that I

# Is There Free Speech on TV?

*Can news commentators on TV and radio really present the truth any more or are they being muzzled into half-truths? Hard-hitting Paul Price lets you in on the facts*

**P**AUL PRICE, one of the hardest-hitting radio-TV columnists in Los Angeles, recently found himself on KECA-TV as a news commentator for his paper, the Daily News. Nobody expected Paul to pull any punches on his program. So far, if he's pulled any nobody has noticed it.

Paul began his first show on TV with a rather blunt statement that many things would be said in the weeks to come that would annoy a lot of people—mainly the pressure groups which he promptly named. But he was serving notice that he and his paper would not be muzzled by any such outfits. Since he was appearing on a station he had attacked at one time for bowing to pressure groups, the Hollywoodites waited for the axe to fall on Paul's head.

It's nice to report he's still on TV—and still kicking up a good gale.

"When I got the TV show," Paul commented, "I knew people expected me to do the same kind of expose work I try to do in my column. So I was torn between giving straight news or hoking it up with the ham. I finally decided to play it straight—and yet not to mince words on important issues of the day. I'm happy to say I've had a lot of good mail."

## Attacks

"So far I've attacked the handling of the housing hearings by Clare Hoffman, the 'book-burning' incidents, the charging people for going to emergency hospitals, and, of course, Senator McCarthy. The response has been quite gratifying. In the case of the emergency hospitals, the City Council got enough mail at any rate to persuade them to reverse their former decisions and support the veto of Fletcher Bowron, who was then Mayor.

"Before doing the show I talked to fine news commentators like Chet Huntley, Frank Goss, and Bob Garred about handling such a program—and also to get their views on how honest you could be. I got some good pointers. And I've learned for myself that there is freedom of expression as far as radio and TV stations are concerned but not as far as some people are concerned. I don't know of an instance where a station has told a commentator he could or could not say what he felt like saying on his program—and yet often these same stations have bowed to the pressure of certain groups and forced a newscaster off the air.

"Maybe I've been lucky but nobody at KECA-TV has bothered me or asked to see any script, or tried to censor my views in any way. For this I'm very grateful."

KECA-TV, in fact, wanted Paul on their station because they wanted a fearless commentator who would arouse interest in controversial issues, who would speak up and tell the truth.

"There is more freedom of speech on TV and radio than in newspapers," Paul went on, "because there is no editorial policy to abide by on these mediums. If the day ever

comes when there is an attempt to control my freedom of thought and of speech, that's the day I quit being a commentator."

Paul, in analyzing his work so far on TV, has been frank to admit he isn't the most professional of commentators. He put it more bluntly by saying "I've had my stinking moments—quite a few of them." But since his first few shows he's been getting mail, all of it encouraging him and saying that while he may not be as glib as some of the top-ranking commentators he sounds as though he means what he says—and this they like.

## TV a Hard Job

"I frankly don't care much for TV work," Paul said honestly. "It's just too difficult—at least, for a columnist. Fortunately, my job is made somewhat easier with the fine help I get from Saul Halpert, who writes the show with me.

"I'm not as nervous now as I used to be because I know I'm going to foul up somewhere on the show—and so I stop worrying. I'll just continue trying to do my best and hope people can stand me."

As long as there are men like Paul Price on TV, you can be sure that freedom of speech will continue to be a fact and not a mere ideology.

# Elmer Peterson's A Family Man Now

**W**HAT HAPPENS to a roving reporter when he takes root?

For one, Elmer Peterson, it meant a complete change in his mode of living. Peterson has spent almost a quarter of a century as a journalist and traveled half-way around the world gathering news. While he was an A.P. correspondent his home office kept stressing the desirability of his single blessedness. Whenever a remote assignment would come up his colleagues chorused: "Send Elmer, he has no family ties."

However, several years ago when he took root to try the new medium of television on KNBH, he woke up to the disadvantages of bachelorhood. The world-at-large was no longer his home. Here was a man in his middle years, crammed full of wonderful experiences which became impersonal and meaningless because he had no one with whom to share them.

Peterson's loneliness was terminated when he consulted an interior decorator to help furnish his apartment. She was so helpful and charming a person that Elmer Peterson lost little time in changing that was "his" to "our" apartment. Now Elmer has a "ready-made" family to share his rich experiences, for in addition to his wife Jeanne, her 13-year-old son, Terry, is enthralled with Elmer's authentic foreign correspondent yarns.

The currently-stay-at-home journalist likes, in rambling fashion, to reflect about the gay and lighter side of his career. The gruesome side of

the news is treated, by necessity, objectively and dispassionately.

### Early Days

In his early days of reporting, his remuneration was measured largely by adventures. The monetary factor had little bearing on the situation. He supplemented his income when he was assigned to Stockholm in a most pleasant manner. Capitalizing on filmland's avid interest in Greta Garbo, he became an expert on the star. Under various nom de plumes, Peterson fed fan material to several publications in the States.

The astute commentator marvels at the advancement in the past two decades of news reporting: "I covered the Coronation of George VI in 1937 via radio; in 1952 the Coronation of Elizabeth II was televised and who's to know how the next one will be reported. The new video tape, which records both visual and audio simultaneously may be surpassed by a newer yet undiscovered means of communication." As far as TV is concerned he would like to see more documentaries on the air. "The March of Time," and "See It Now"

predominate the field with little if any competition.

Some day Peterson hopes to write a book of humorous anecdotes pertaining to expense accounts... their uses and abuses. The European's misconception that all Americans are rich has always amused him. He once tried to get an interview with a Lithuanian official. The official was most cordial and invited Peterson to conduct his interview at a luncheon. The next day Peterson met the official, who was flanked by thirteen courtiers, at a swank restaurant. The lunch was festive and the interview satisfactory until Peterson was presented with the bill. The "rich American" found himself paying the check because he was unable to talk his way out of the embarrassing situation. Peterson's home office enjoyed the incident and laughed at his expense because they never did reimburse him.

But the last laugh's on Peterson. If he undertakes any roving-news-assignments from here on out his contract must include provisions for his family to accompany him and a generous expense account.

# Is Show Business Bad for a Child?

*Margaret Whiting, one of the nation's most popular singers, wouldn't mind at all if her daughter went into show business—but only under certain conditions.*

**M**MARGARET WHITING'S little two and a half year old charmer by the name of Debra has apparently chosen her career already. At least, she recently remarked to her mother, "I want to go on the stage and sing like you." Whereupon she went into an on-tune version of "I Believe," using her own lyrics.

"Debra listens to me sing all the time and even imitates my movements," Margaret laughed. "She digs everything I do. I'm happy to see that she has this interest, but I don't want her to go through any precocious stage. If that happens, one of us must go!"

Margaret is more than slightly interested in her daughter's ability. Having been raised in a famous theatrical family herself, the well-known radio and TV and recording star knows what kind of a life can be ahead for her youngster. She is consequently viewing the future with real confidence.

## Will Help Daughter

"If, in the years to come, I find Debra has real talent I'll do all I can to help her," Margaret remarked. "I'd like her to follow in my footsteps. Show business is a wonderful exciting life, but a hard one. It isn't glamour—it's just grueling work—

but the results are worth all the efforts.

"I've often been asked how to get a start in this business, and I've always advised young people to go to someone whose advice and honesty they can really trust and find out just how much talent they really have. If there is genuine ability, then I usually advise lessons from a competent teacher. After that, singing with a band is excellent training. This is the same advice I'll give Debra.

"This kind of career is just too tough these days unless you have exceptional talent. There are too many great talents not doing well for anyone with a mediocre ability to take a chance.

"Show business is, however, anything but a bad life. It has its disadvantages, yes, but so does a plumber's life. You have to work like gangbusters to survive—but there is never any success in any kind of job without conscientious and hard work.

"There is certain advice I'll pass on to Debra—based on the lessons I've learned. One little item I'll thoroughly instill in her is this business of spotting phonies.

"I've told the same things to my sister, Barbara. I've told her that she'll meet a lot of phonies who can easily turn her head if she's not care-

ful. And I've cautioned her to remember that the fame she may have today can end tomorrow. It's easy to think that because you're an actress or a singer you're something extra special, extra great. But you're just a gal doing a job—or trying to. And once you start believing your publicity to the point where you think you're so much no one can do without you, you're already dead.

"I believe Debra has real talent. At least, she has a good sense of rhythm and she does love music, but this is only the beginning. She'll have no glory ahead of her unless she's willing to get in and dig."

Margaret, who has just had a couple of solid hit records in "Something Wonderful Happens" and "Waltz to the Blues," didn't mind saying whom she considered the real headliners in her field.

"Kay Starr and Perry Como are two of the best and they have both kept their heads," Margaret said. "Kay has a wonderful natural enthusiasm when she sings and Perry Como is consistently good. The same is true of the really great Nat King Cole. He is tops."

While you're speaking of top drawer talents, don't forget this Margaret Whiting gal. She is show business itself. And with a mother like this to guide her, young Debra should do very well, thank you.

# This Can Change Your Life

*If you think you can do nothing to help the world, if you feel your life is meaningless, "The Christophers" will be a beacon to light your way to greater things.*

**W**ITHOUT ANY fanfare preceding it there is a TV show simply listed as "Christophers" in your logs for KHJ-TV and KTTV. Yet, if you watch this inspiring program, you may find your whole life changing—for the better.

Founded by Father James Keller in 1945, the Christopher movement operates on one principle—to remind each and every individual of the role he can play, with God's help, to change the world for the better. The theme is to promote love where there is hate, to present truth where there are lies, to establish order where others are promoting confusion. In short, to apply the divine truths to human affairs.

So important has been this movement that television stations have offered "The Christophers" free time. The money to pay for the making of the films comes from unsolicited subscriptions from all over the country.

## No Solicitations

"We have never made any solicitations of any kind for our television programs—or for any of our work

for that matter," Father Keller said when he was at the Goldwyn Studios recently making a film. "In fact, we play down any attempts to get money. Anyone can, however, write in for free literature about the movement—and we get on an average of 1000 to 1200 letters a week asking for this material. We have just sent out close to the millionth piece of literature.

"We spend about \$250,000 a year for our TV series and, through God's help, we have managed to meet our budget. Of course, there are times when we have finished a picture but haven't had the money to pay for the cutting. Somehow, though, we always are taken care of.

"We have had many motion picture stars and other celebrities ask to appear on our show. We never ask anyone to make an appearance. Some of these stars are afraid to do the program on an ad-lib basis, but when they tried it they were amazed at the new release of power inside of them. They tapped sources of their talent they didn't even know they had.

"You see, there is great power in the average person that has never

been touched—and that's what we try to bring out in our shows. The power which God has put in each of us.

## Force For God

"It should be obvious to almost anyone that there is tremendous force for evil in this world. The Christopher movement tries to develop individual talent and responsibility to turn this into a force for good.

"We have concentrated on the four vital fields—education, government, communication, and labor. These fields touch all of our lives—and those who are intent on making evil predominate have usually centered their activities here. We have worked to get people with good in their hearts to concentrate on these fields.

"To illustrate, we made a film recently called 'Atomic Energy Can Be A Blessing.' Other topics we have undertaken are 'You Can Change the World,' 'Television is What You Make It,' 'Let George Do It,' a discussion of basic American principles with twelve steps that make for better government. Danny Thomas, Robert Young and Dennis Day were in this. In 'You Can Change the World' we used Eddie 'Rochester' Anderson, Jack Benny, Ann Blyth, Bing Crosby, Paul Douglas, Irene Dunne, Bob Hope, William Holden and Loretta Young. Other films were 'Government is Your Business' and 'Faith, Hope, and Hogan,' featuring Ben Hogan, Ralph Kiner, Bing Crosby, Bob Hope and Phil Harris. Hogan explains the hard work necessary to be a champion golfer—and we point out how hard work is necessary for Christopher achievements."

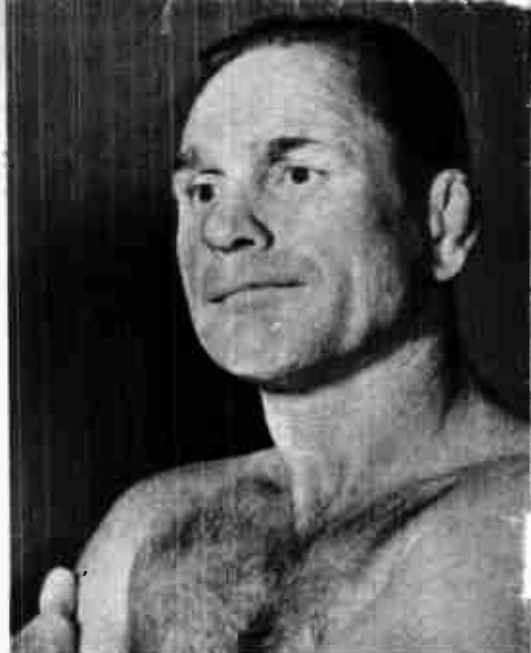
