# Bumbler Makes Good

**H**ANK McCUNE is one of the fortunate ones endowed with the kind of faith that not only moves mountains but also big industry.

When Hank decided to go out on his own to make and sell a telefilm series, his friends discouraged him at every turn. However, Hank, who has been in the broadcasting industry since 1938, doesn't discourage easily.

Trying to sell a situation-comedy series is mighty tough, especially when you are its star and not some big headliner. Since Hank had so much faith in himself and his series he decided that he was "it." With pilot in tow, he undertook a sales tour throughout the Eastern cities. Hank became a steady passenger on the Greyhound busses, but eventually the "little guy" got his foothold in the television market. As soon as he had ten stations under his belt, the star of the Hank McCune Show hurried back to the Coast and started cameras rolling.

### Typical Situation

Hank co-stars with Hanley Stafford, who acts as a dignified foil for Hank's many amusing bumbblings. No matter what Hank tries to do, it doesn't seem to materialize the way he intended it. For instance when he tried to help a young friend in the newspaper publishing business, it might have been successful if his printer's ink had been anything but the disappearing kind.

Then there was the bathing suit incident that backfired. Hank invested in a stock of brief but good-looking suits, only to learn much later, and to his dismay, that the bathing suits had a peculiar quality of melting away on contact with water. As in all such incidents, no matter how hard Stafford tried, he couldn't seem to keep Hank out of trouble because the unexpected always happens to the lanky McCune.

Today the Hank McCune Show is seen in more than thirty-three major markets (KLAC-TV locally). Hank's faith, nerve, ability and determination have paid off.

Despite success, Hank is more than just the star of the series. He also serves as producer and public relations liaison. Recently, in the midst of shooting a script, Hank had to fulfill a personal appearance commitment in Chicago.

On the day he was to appear in the windy city, he started rehearsal at six a.m.; boarded a plane at one-thirty in the afternoon; arrived in Chicago at eight-thirty, then dashed to a sales meeting where he showed a Hank McCune film and delivered a brief talk. He boarded a returning plane at eleven-thirty and arrived in Los Angeles the following morning at six. Then Hank headed straight for the studio where he worked for nine full hours.

Seems incredible, doesn't it? But not for Hank. He doesn't have a lazy bone in his body.

the list. Not too long ago, one song, 'Harbor Lights,' was on 'The Hit Parade' for twenty-five weeks and you can run a little dry after that long a time."

While getting the ideas may not be too difficult—at least to Dan Lounsbury and William Nichols—the execution of the ideas is often a different story.

"Crying in the Chapel" had been on the Parade for several weeks. The producers wanted to have Dorothy Collins sing it in a setting that would give audiences the illusion that she was standing at the far end of the interior of a church. This presented quite a problem, but it was finally solved in an ingenious way. A picture was taken of the inside of a chapel. Then one particular section of it was enlarged and placed in the middle of the entire picture. Dorothy stood about twenty-five feet away from the camera and the effect was startling in its realism. You would have sworn she was standing at the far end of the church.

## Behind Scenes at

**W**HEN radio's long-time favorite, "The Hit Parade," announced it was going into TV, the reaction could be heard for miles. The consensus of the uproar was "It's impossible."

There was good logic behind all the arguments that it couldn't be done. After all, how could anyone get so many different ideas for the staging of a number that might be on the Hit Parade for weeks? How could repetition of idea and execution possibly be avoided? And, besides, how could the producers be certain that a number would definitely be on the Parade the following week?

As to the last point, while in New York I talked with Dan Lounsbury, who, with William Nichols, produces this successful NBC-TV show.

"Bill and I meet on Tuesdays before the show," Dan said, "to check the numbers we *think* will be on the program that week. Perhaps *assume*

would be a better word for use. We keep a chart of each song presented on 'The Hit Parade' and who sang it and if it was done as a general production number. In this way we avoid any repetition. Dorothy Collins might do a song one week, and then either Russ Arms or Snooky Lanson or Gisele MacKenzie will do it the next time around.

"We have to operate on the theory that a song that was a hit one week will be on the list the next week—and we go to work from there. In planning the show we try to open with a production number and we usually include two possible routines, depending on the results of the final survey of the songs' popularity.

"Oddly enough, getting the ideas for staging the various numbers isn't our most difficult job—and in our four years on TV we have done well over 1100 different stagings of songs. However, I hasten to add that we're always glad when a new number hits

Another tricky effect was achieved through an electronic device. A semblance of a window shade was set up in the middle of the screen. Below it were three men dancing and above it were three girls. Suddenly, the men's feet would be dancing in one part of the set, their torsos and heads in another. At least, such was the effect created. The same illusion was created with the girls. At the end of the number the window shade came down and wiped off the figures of the dancers entirely. This was done by the use of an electronic wipe.

When Dan and Bill get together on Tuesdays, eleven days in advance of each telecast, they mull new ideas and check the previous show. On Friday, the same group gets together with the camera director, Clark Jones, and set designer, Paul Barnes, to discuss scenic sketches and tentatively set up the technical layout for the TV cameras. While this is going on, the producers and writer

sketch various pre-production ideas on drawing boards.

When Monday rolls around, the team is joined by the executive TV producer, the musical director, Raymond Scott; audio supervisor, Ed Marshall; arranger, Ray Charles, and Charles Russell, agency show representative, for a full-dress staging meeting. At four that day there is another meeting at the home of Tony Charmoli, choreographer—and this is blocked out. Problems settled here include who will be in each number, the type of costumes and props, changes in scenic design and vocal arrangement, integration of the extras. Often this session lasts until early in the morning.

Tuesday morning, detailed assignments are given to the costumer, the set construction and prop representative, and other members of the technical staff. By the afternoon of that day, the soloists know what numbers they are to do—and all performers know the staging details for their routines.

## the "Hit Parade"

*TV-Radio Life's Jack Holland, on New York sojourn, gets an eyeful by going backstage*

Wednesday noon is rehearsal time for the dancers—and Tony puts them through their paces. Thursday at nine a.m. the soloists and the Hit Paraders (Rae Whitney, Betty Harris, Jerry Beitzel, Arthur Malvin, Mel Larned, Edwin Linstrom and Jerry Duane who are led by Eugene Lowell) go through their stints.

Friday morning the orchestra is joined in a full rehearsal by the chorus and then by the soloists and chorus. In the afternoon everyone returns and the dancers rehearse at one, followed by the soloist at two. And from three to five-thirty all performers get together for the first time to put the show on in a complete form.

Saturday, of course, is the big day with no time off the rule at Radio City's huge Studio 8-H. Each num-

ber is blocked out on the studio floor until five p.m., the entire working period broken down into half-hour units by songs and personnel involved. At six-fifteen comes the signal for the first run-through with the cast, sets, props and cameras. Immediately after this first full rehearsal the production staff and cameramen adjourn to the viewing room to check notes and arrange any necessary changes.

At nine—dress rehearsal. And at ten-thirty—the show is on!

The success of "The Hit Parade" is the result of many great talents working together in unison. More than that, its popularity is due to the fact that here is one TV show where the full use of imagination is employed and where originality is the rule instead of the "It's been done

before so it must be good" theory.

"Three things make our show possible," Dan Lounsbury concluded. "One is good talent. Another is the best director and choreographer plus detailed planning. And the third is the 'esprit'—a feeling that everyone is enjoying doing the show. And in spite of our many headaches we do have fun!"

The next time you think that TV is content to settle for the mediocre, give a look at "The Hit Parade." If this show can present such outstanding production every week, what's holding up some of the other big-time programs that can't even dream up one slightly different routine on an hour-long show? The impossible can be done! But the men and women behind "The Hit Parade" don't consider good, solid TV is impossible.

# Will Telemeter Pay Off?

It's official now. TV is here to stay. Today TV is a man.

Naturally this is not news to the twenty-seven million people in the United States who own TV sets, and to the many millions more who watch it constantly. From the day TV was born, it was destined to become the greatest means of communication in the world.

However, ever since its birth, and moreover ever since it started having growing pains in 1946. TV has been slandered, scorned and stunted in its growth by the once all-powerful movie industry.

In public and private for the past seven years, the Movies and TV have been at war. Today there is no war. There is peace, or at least a temporary truce.

The truce came at approximately 5 p.m. this past Saturday at the Racquet Club in Palm Springs. The mediator was Telemeter, a new pay-as-you-see device for watching television programs.

There were many reasons, some obvious and some behind-the-scenes, why Telemeter was at least able to get the two media together for a sensible and long-awaited meeting.

## Hit Hard

The movie industry has been hit, and hit hard, in the pocketbook by the TV industry. People are just not going out to see movies as much as they used to because they can sit home and watch some really fine entertainment on their television screens. The big and good motion pictures are making more money than ever before, but the average flicker has not fared so well. The movie magnates believe that Telemeter can solve their problems.

**What is Telemeter and how does it operate?**

Briefly, it is a coin box that can be attached to any and all types of TV sets. Without any money going into it, Telemeter "scrambles" the picture on your screen. With money, (the exact amount for each program is indicated on a dial on the machine and can vary from five cents to two dollars) Telemeter "unscrambles" the picture and you can see the program just like any other TV show.

This is exactly what the movie men wanted. Now they hope (we say "hope" because Telemeter is still a long way from reality), to have new movies shown simultaneously at local theaters and in homes.

## Estimated Prices

Because Telemeter machines are not yet in full production, and because there is yet no economic barometer established on which to base rates, the price of Telemeter to the

public has not been finally determined. At Palm Springs, however, Telemeter officials did quote some estimated prices.

**Telemeter machines will be leased (not sold) for one year for \$21.75. Each subscriber will be required to plunk a minimum of \$3 a month into the coin box. The prices of individual shows, naturally, will vary upon the cost and importance of the program.**

In Los Angeles, for example, this is how it will work. Say there is a world premiere of a picture such as "Forever Female" which was shown in Palm Springs last week for the very first time. Telemeter will buy the time from a local channel, or possibly from an entire network. If the program is scheduled for Channel 4 at 8 p.m., at that time and on that station, there will be nothing but a "scrambled" picture. Regular shows will be seen on all other channels.

If you at home figure that the movie (or the special event, or big fight, or whatever Telemeter is presenting) is worth the price they are asking, then you deposit the money, and the program is yours. If the program costs sixty cents, and you put in seventy-five cents, a credit of fifteen cents is automatically registered on the Telemeter device. If the next time you want to see a show which costs twenty-five cents, you then only have to deposit ten cents.

## Sink or Swim

It is on the question of money that Telemeter will sink or swim. The public may not be willing to pay any price for any type of coin box for any type of program.

At the "peace" conference at Palm Springs the officials of Paramount Pictures and International Telemeter Corporation (Paramount owns over fifty per cent of Telemeter) expressed the opinion that they believed Telemeter was the answer to all the problems that "free TV" has presented.

**Even Sam Goldwyn of MGM, who has no direct financial interest in Telemeter, participated in the meeting. Mr. Goldwyn said: "TV is here to stay."**

This itself is not a very revealing or startling fact, but it was a clear sign that the Movie Generals had finally capitulated to the TV insurgents.

The "hot" war between the two mediums was over. Now a new "cold" war has started. How far will Telemeter, or any other pay-as-you-see system be able to penetrate the present commercially-sponsored programs on the air?

Only time and the TV public will tell if Telemeter will pay off.

# How To Make Your Own Christmas Decorations

**E**LEVER TV-RADIO LIFE readers are just the type, we think, to enjoy making their own Yuletide ornaments. Besides being much less expensive than store-purchased decorations, the bedazzlements a woman whips up for her home's adornment are inevitably stamped with the maker's taste and personality. What creative artist doesn't enjoy answering, "I made it myself!" when oh's and ah's greet her efforts?

One of the simplest and most effective ornaments for any home is suggested to TV-Radio Life readers by KHJ's Norma Young. Her idea is a Kissing Ball, which gets its interesting name from the mistletoe fastened in the center. First select a well-proportioned raw potato. Punch a few holes into it, using a nail or other pointed instrument. Fill holes with twigs of myrtle so that the greenery sticks out like a porcupine. Center with mistletoe and tie with a red ribbon to hang over a door. (This is a fine holiday decoration because it stays fresh, due to the moisture in the potato.)

KTTV's Nancy Dixon was just bursting with novel ideas when we asked her to come to our readers' assistance. Nancy suggests this tree decoration: take three-inch-wide red rayon satin ribbon (stiff) and cut it up into five-inch pieces. Tie loose knot in center. Clip each end of the ribbon as you would a hair ribbon. This gives the effect of a little red bird. Underneath the knot, tie a tiny piece of ribbon (any color you have) to attach to the tree. Tie two or three to each branch. Fill in with gold balls. This decoration is so effective that none other's actually needed.

## Stockings

Nancy also has a good idea about making stockings from red felt (using a small sock for pattern). Bind the top of the stocking with white felt, write name of child for whom intended in clear nail polish, sprinkle with gold dust and put peppermint cane in top.

KTLA's Dorothy Gardiner suggests that you get some round white foam plastic balls and fasten sequins on them with common pins. Or take ordinary Christmas balls and personalize them by printing the name with glue over which metallic dust has been sprinkled. If you want to give money, stuff it into the ball through the top, then write "Break Me" in metallic dust on outside of ball. A real surprise gift.

Nancy Holme, KECA newslady, recalls two ideas which were used when she was a little girl and to which she still clings. She uses blown-up balloons as ornaments which can be taken down and played with on Christmas Day and she also attaches cards (showing pictures of horns, San-

ta and other holiday motifs) with red string to the tree.

Rita LaRoy of KTTV has many suggestions for the season, among them this: decorate a white tree with silver balls and pine cones made from Reynolds Wrap. First, wad paper napkins (wet) into balls and cone shapes. Squeeze Wrap to wrinkle and wrap balls and cones. Use no candles on tree, but have white or blue spotlight. Rita has a swell gift-wrapping idea—use a scarf or hankie to do up small gifts.

## More Suggestions

KTTV's Norma Gilchrist is loaded with original ideas for home-made Christmas adornments. Instead of using tinsel for her tree she uses any kind of foil, new or salvaged, cuts it in strips about half-inch or less wide and five inches long and drapes it over or ties it on strong thread or silver string. (It's best to tie the foil strips as you put it over the thread, then they won't slip.) This makes a wonderful tree festoon.

Norma also takes apples, maybe a couple dozen large and same number small (cranberries or crabapples are good) and sprays them with colored or metallic paint. Tie these way back in the tree as they're too heavy for tips of branches. If you'd rather, instead of apples use plastic ping pong balls. Or how about empty thread spools? These string beautifully, Norma says.

Mary McAdoo of KNBH has one or two pet decorations. One of them is links made into a chain—remember the ones you used to make in kindergarten? Only Mary uses one-inch Satintone Ribonette, cut in six-inch lengths. Moisten with a little water before fastening links together.

Mary also has an idea for Christmas balls which are scratched and marred. Paint a face on the ornament. Paste on a ten-inch doily to give choir boy collar effect. Make hair of metallic foil. Roll edges over lead pencil for page boy effect. Hang on tree with red pipe cleaners.

## Cookie Ornaments

If you want to hang your tree with Christmas cookies in the old fashioned way, KNXT's Mercedes Bates tells how.

Cream 1 cup shortening and 1 cup sugar. Add 3 well-beaten eggs and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Sift together 3 cups Mix and roll thin, cut in desired

flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, ¼ teaspoon soda and add to mixture. shapes, place on oiled cookie sheet, pressing down on each a loop of cord long enough to tie to Christmas tree. Bake eight minutes at 425° degrees.

Cool and ice with 1 egg white beaten stiff to which 1 cup powdered sugar tinted with food coloring and flavored with ½ teaspoon of vanilla has been added.

## Double-Duty

Clever Jean King of KECA has an excellent idea for tree decorations. Get small-sized perfume as gifts, tie in various colored net bags with ribbon bows and hang on tree. Also get inexpensive silver cuff links and tie in colored bags with bows. Use these as presents for people who may drop in during the holidays and to whom you may want to give some small remembrance.

If you're real ambitious, try this idea of Nancy Dixon's: make popcorn balls in two sizes; use small one for Santa's head and large one for body. Make hat of triangular-shaped red felt. Use small flat Christmas candies for eyes, nose and mouth. Let small red candles serve as buttons.

We hope that by now you're all enthused over the prospect of a make-it-yourself Christmas. Continuing this idea, next week we will run a feature on decorations for mantels, tables and door, prepared especially for TV-Radio Life readers by KECA-TV's Gordon Baker Lloyd. Watch for it in the December 18 TV-Radio Life.

"Meet Me At Dawn." (5) Dec. 18

10:00. This one is all about a duel that is to be fought over a mysterious woman, and the scandal that such shenanigans kicked up in turn of the century Paris. William Eythe is the nominal star of the film, but Stanley Holloway, as his confidant, is much the best actor in the proceedings, most of which are rather forced. I don't know who plays the mysterious woman, she's that mysterious, but she's a looker at any rate.

"Friendly Enemies." (11) Dec. 15, 11:20. The time is World War I, and the central figures are Charles Winger and Charles Ruggles, as two American citizens of German birth who have difficulty reconciling their loyalties. Winger is duped by a German sabotage ring into contributing money he thinks will be used for peace propaganda, but which is instead utilized to sink a troop ship on which his son is sailing to France. The plot is, as you can see, a little contrived, but the picture makes an honest effort to investigate the plight of the German American of that time and comes off fairly well, I think.

"Angel On My Shoulder." (9) Dec. 13, 9:00. This movie was never considered to be any great shakes, but for some reason I enjoyed it on TV . . . probably because it was free. Paul Muni is a gangster gone to hell, literally, and brought back to earth by Lucifer, Claude Rains, to ruin the life of an honest judge, also played by Muni. However the gangster falls in love with Anne Baxter and begins to reform. Need I say that everything works out to everyone's satisfaction but Satan's?

"The Time Of Your Life." (5) Dec. 13, 4:00. William Saroyan's Critics' Circle and Pulitzer Prize-winning (although he refused the Pulitzer) play is here brought to the screen with an all-star cast, as they say. James Cagney is a barroom philosopher, much given to champagne and dime store gewgaws, who tries to straighten out a few lives during the course of a day's drinking. The whole affair is quite plotless, but not pointless, I think, as it advances Saroyan's perennial theme that man is good.

"Girls In Chains." (5) Dec. 15, 4:30. In that case, I'm the missing link.

A note to the producer of the "Topper" series: It has become rather well-known chatter in town that you are something of a task-master on your show. The attitude of the cast and the crew is anything but calm and friendly, mainly because of the constant pressure and demands from your office. Having been on the set myself at times I have sensed the tension and the unrest among those who are trying every way possible to do the best kind of shows for you, for CBS, and for the public. **This sort of thing does not lend itself to perfect production—and it certainly creates no desire among the actors and the crew to do their best.** A little word of praise and appreciation goes a long way towards making everyone want to do better. A little consideration towards others works wonders when it comes to a finished product. No one wants to do anything when he's being nagged at. And everyone likes to be treated as a human being with feelings instead of as a machine. Maybe the pressure is coming at you from others. If so, **you must know that it is not the way to get a happy company.** You have a show here that can be one of the best on TV. You have a good director, good actors, and a good crew. Let them know you appreciate what they're trying to do and you'll find your troubles and your problems doing a fast fade. **You want the best—they'll give it to you IF you let them.**

Maybe we're dull but we don't get all of Bill Davidson's message on his KECA show in the afternoon. He chatters away amiably and in a friendly way, but his comments are so far out in left field as a rule that it's hard to

follow him. Your informal air is refreshing, but what gives with the material?

Jack Bailey almost passed out last week during a "Queen for a Day" telecast. The gal who won wanted a baby sitter who could also milk goats. Bailey and his cohorts expect almost anything and are usually prepared for any eventuality, but this one was a dilly. I was sitting in the control booth during the show and heard a Myrtle Scott call in saying she knew someone who could baby sit and milk goats. This saved the day for Jack! But there must have been a good many people who said to themselves, "I knew the show was fixed!" So help us, the call was legit.

Mae Clark has had a new career start as the result of her TV appearances recently, but she is not a former silent motion picture star. She was a star of the talkie period. Who can ever forget the famous scene when Jimmy Cagney shoved a grapefruit in her face? It may not be polite to give a lady's age, but Mae is 43, so you can see she is not tottering on the verge of antiquity.

**Prediction:** Shirley Thomas will be the most widely known and quoted Hollywood radio correspondent. She gives the up-beat side of the town and its people—and it's paying off.

In case you think the TV picture hasn't changed, here's food for thought. Last year one station had 126 hours given to local TV shows. Now it has seventy-six. The networks are taking over, boys, and that's the picture. And they will continue to take precedence from here on in! **Local programmers had better wake up fast!**

### A TELEMETER TALE

It was an unusual experience watching a football game on TV—without commercials.

The occasion occurred last week when the SC-Notre Dame football game was televised on a closed circuit to some seventy sets in Palm Springs.



It marked the very first time that any program was transmitted under the new pay-as-you-see Telemeter system.

With a few exceptions, the actual physical sensation of watching the game was not any different from viewing any other football game on TV.

First of all, someone had to cough up a buck's worth of change and plunk the coins in the Telemeter box attached to the top of the TV set. Regular programs were being shown on all the channels, except Channel 6, the Palm Springs community station. On Channel 5 there was nothing but a bunch of blurred, scrambled images. When you put the first few dimes or quarters in, nothing happened. However, when the total reached exactly one dollar—click!—there was a perfect picture.

From then on, excluding the commercials, Tom Harmon and the four-camera KTLA crew of Klaus Landsberg did as fine if not better job than the big networks in covering the Trojan massacre. You sat with several other persons in the comfortable environment of the famed Racquet Club and oo-ed and aw-ed at the long runs and missed passes.

The real big difference was not so much what you SAW, but what you were THINKING.

What did this mean? What effect would Telemeter, or any other pay-as-you-see method, have on television, and the movie industry, and the whole American public?

Telemeter, 50 per cent of which is owned by Paramount, hoped that it would be the beginning of a new and lucrative era. So far, they have invested over \$3,000,000 in this new coin gadget. They have visions of twenty-six million and more TV sets in American homes, each with a Telemeter box on it, and each one collecting plenty of nickels, dimes and quarters for big sporting spectacles, special events, and first-run movies.

The movie magnates have dreams that Telemeter will put them back into big business again with enormous profits. They do not want, nor expect, Telemeter to turn into a three million dollar nightmare.

## Wrestling Is My Business

Ed "Strangler" Lewis is a doll. At least that's what my wife says he is. But then she call me "baby" too. While her choice of words may not be all that it should be, she expresses the opinion shared by thousands of friends of Ed Lewis.

Last week we talked about wrestling fans lamenting that they were born twenty years too late to see any real man in wrestling tights. And I wrote that today's fans haven't missed anything, with the exception of Joe Stecker and Jim Browning's powerful legs and the talents of Lewis.

"Big Ed," as he is called by members of the wrestling fraternity, specialized in a headlock such as none of us will probably ever see again. Those who were ever on the business end of the Lewis headlock hope so.

Ed developed his arms and shoulders to the point of almost superhuman strength. In his hey-day, when he put the squeeze on someone, their eyes would almost bulge out of their heads. Referees to a Lewis match had to be extra alert because opponents would pass out with the tremendous pressure of the headlock before they could give a submission signal.

In my opinion, Big Ed is the greatest wrestler of all times. This respect is shared by nearly all members of the wrestling fraternity. Not only was he the greatest, but the most loved and respected.

Ed, who held the world's heavyweight championship five times, was the profession's biggest money maker. His income during his wrestling years was in the millions. And his hand was never slow to his pocket to help a down-and-outer. Lewis always had a twenty or a fifty for someone in need.

As big, famous and busy as he was, he was never stingy with a helping word of advice for an ambitious youngster in the mat game. Nearly twenty years ago, I wrestled Ed in Indianapolis. A few nights later I was caught between trains in Terre Haute, Indiana. Lewis was stranded too. This proved to be one of the most valuable

# Is Paul Coates

**M**R. PAUL COATES is a controversial character in our chaotic town. During the past few years he has become as much of an institution in Los Angeles as the La Brea Pits.

Of course, it was Paul's daily column in *The Mirror* that gave him his first big break. That established his name.

But it took TV to establish his face—and a lot of other things. And it took a lot of time and various types of programs before Coates could do the type of show on TV for which he is best fitted.

By nature, by instinct, and by anything else that you can think of, Paul Coates is a newspaper man—the kind of guy who likes to get a lead on a good story, track it down, and then dig into it for all it's worth.

So how did he start on TV? As a witty, slightly sarcastic panel member on KNXT's "Bachelor's Haven."

Next, he emceed a Hollywood-type, almost-strictly-show-business-format on "Table at Ciro's." Although he made it click, Paul looked uncomfortable and out of place in this role.

After that came his job as moderator on ABC-TV's "Our Famous Husbands." Once again, he did as good if not better job than anyone expected.

### Finally Fits

However, as witty panel member, emcee or moderator, he was still not showing the TV public the real Paul Coates—the "find-out guy," the racketeer-buster, the man who could himself smell a crime and then make the entire public aware of the rotten and disgusting odor.

Finally, four months ago, Paul got his chance. KTTV, Channel 11, on the lookout for new, good, and worthwhile programs, contacted Coates. He told them about his idea of "Confidential File."

"I want to expose rackets in Los

Angeles. All kinds of rackets. I'll have B-Girls, and prostitutes, religious quacks, and unscrupulous businessmen on my program. I'll show the public who and what these people are.

"I'll take people where they ordinarily couldn't and wouldn't go. It'll be 'Off-Beat Journalism' on TV. It won't be nice, but I believe it will be effective and will make for a better city and better community," Coates explained.

The station officials were shocked when they heard Paul. B-girls, prostitutes, quacks, social misfits on TV? It sounded impossible.

But the officials at KTTV knew the great job that Coates had done for another Chandler outfit, *The Mirror*. They knew what they were doing when they gave Coates the "go-ahead" sign. Three weeks after the original negotiation, Coates put his first show on the air. It had taken Paul Coates several years, but he was

## Fluke Or Not?

Naturally, now that he has done, and is doing, so many different types of TV programs, the question has arisen in many minds: "Is Paul Coates a TV Fluke?" (A "fluke," by definition, is "an accidentally successful stroke at billiards or pool; hence, any accidental stroke of luck.") In other words: Was Coates just plain lucky to be a TV success?

In person, as in his column, Paul answers this question very honestly, and very much to the point:

"Yes, I admit it. I *was* a TV fluke. I felt I was a TV fluke until this program (Paul Coates' Confidential File) came along.

"Don't misunderstand me. I owe everything I have done in TV to KNXT's 'Bachelor's Haven.' It gave me my first big break in television. The movie stars didn't want to stick their necks out on the program, so

they picked me. I have a lot of fun on the program, but I never take it too seriously. Until the KTTV show came along, I never took any of my TV shows too seriously. They were, and still are, lots of fun. But now this 'Confidential File' is a lot of hard work. Yes, I was a TV fluke. But I don't think I am now."

Assisting Paul on his Sunday night program are Irv Kirschner, film director; Jim Peck, assistant writer and producer, and Serge Goncharoff. Unseen and unsung, are members of the police force and other law-enforcement agencies, and the "tipsters" who provide Coates with his leads.

## Not All Roses

To the outsider, it may appear that Paul Coates leads quite an ideal life. A newspaper columnist, a TV star, a happily-married man with a lovely family. What more could a guy ask for?

But there are some disadvantages to Paul's own "racket." For example,

after his series of articles and his TV show on the clip joints operating in downtown Los Angeles, Paul received several letters and even a few phone calls. (Paul makes it a rule never to refuse a phone call. If he did, he would miss out on many good stories.)

A woman, with a deep, gruff voice, called Coates one day.

"Is this Paul Coates?"

"Speaking," he replied.

"Listen, you blankety-blank. Lay off the Main Street story, or else you'll wind up in a dark alley."

She hung up. After the call, and several more threatening letters, Coates had a special police guard for three months. Where he was, they went also.

The police wanted Paul to carry a gun with him. They gave him a .25 caliber gun.

"I took it in my hands, felt it, and gave it back to them," Paul explained. "I'm afraid of guns."

# "Kids Put Us In a Straight Jacket"

**D**O THE small fry keep us on our toes? You don't know the half of it," sighed Bill ("Kit Carson") Williams with a shrug of his rugged shoulders. "Those kids really have us buffaloed.

"Whenever my sidekick, Don (El Toro) Diamond, and I meet the youngsters they barrage us with questions. No matter what the topic, the lead-in to the interrogation is always the same—it's invariably 'How cum ...?'

"'How cum you don't get your clothes dirty,' or 'how cum you never show any scratches after a fight,'

or 'how cum there are more than six shots in your gun?'

"The thread between reality and make-believe is invisible as far as the kids are concerned. They're sticklers for authenticity and as logical as can be. We try to answer their questions by explaining the problems of filming a show. Much of it is above their heads even though they say, 'Oh, I see,' after a technical explanation.

"Youngsters aren't the least bit concerned that more than six shots were heard because the film cutter needed a close-up of the hero and the amount of shots was secondary to getting

that additional footage in the can.

"The shooting schedule doesn't permit us time to change our wardrobe, therefore we never appear disheveled after a knock-down drag-out fight.

### Budgets

"A simple comparison between TV and movie budgets will illustrate the problem we have to face. In the motion picture, 'Shane,' they spent three weeks filming terrific fight scenes, which lasted five minutes on the screen. Revue Productions completes at least eight half-hour "Kit Carson" telefilms in the space of three weeks.

"Because we play to such a large audience of children, we adhere to rigid story lines. Scenes of brutality are avoided. The scripts make a point of showing that it pays to use, first, your head; then your fists, if necessary; and your guns only as a last resort. There are never any bad Indians in the scripts (although according to reports the real Kit Carson was an Indian-hater and went after unscrupulous warriors with a vengeance).

"Don Diamond plays his role of 'El Toro' for laughs. He never burlesques or ridicules the Mexicans. My grammar, as 'Kit Carson' that is, is impeccable, a fact for which parents and teachers are duly grateful. Furthermore, 'Kit Carson' avoids smoking, saloons and shady ladies—and kisses only his horse. Kids don't mind a sidekick having romantic tendencies, but they strongly object to the hero becoming entangled with the lady fair.

"The restrictions kids put on the 'Kit Carson' series seem endless. There's no doubt about it, they literally have us in straight jackets. They call the shots and we follow them."

**T**HE MEADOWS GIRLS, Jayne and Audrey, are in a way TV's mystery girls, so little is known about them.

Jayne ("I've Got a Secret") and Audrey (Jackie Gleason Show) are CBS's gift to television. The girls have a penchant for finding themselves in amusing situations. Perhaps it's a reflection of their "unusual background."

They were born in Wu Chang, China, where their parents were missionaries. Jayne recalls that when they came to this country they had a tough time with the other kids because they couldn't speak a word of English. "They used to laugh at our Chinese clothes," she says. "But it didn't take us long to learn American slang and ways, and how to wear American clothes."

The Meadows family had settled in Sharon, Connecticut. When the girls got out of school there was nothing for them to do career-wise in the community, so they decided they might as well go in for dramatics.

"We knew a girl in town who had a florist shop," they explained, "and she used to bring manure down to New York every morning in her station wagon, so we would drive down with her. Then when we got into

town, we'd have to give ourselves a thorough airing before making the rounds of the agents and casting offices. On the return trip, there would be a carload of alcoholics coming up to take the cure at one of the places in town. So between the smell of manure and alcohol, we'd almost suffocate."

### Success

Despite their peculiar transportation problems, both sisters managed to make their marks in the entertainment field. Their combined credits, in every facet of show business, are too numerous to mention. However, Audrey built a reputation in the theatre and in TV for her droll comedy.

When Jackie Gleason was looking for someone to play the wife of Ralph, the bus driver (Gleason) in *The Honeymooners*, Audrey auditioned for the role. "Jackie took one look at me," she says, "and said I'd never do. He thought I was too young and that I didn't look sloppy enough. I returned home and dressed in the get-up of a skid-row character. I had a photograph made and sent the picture to Gleason. When Jackie saw the photo he couldn't believe it was me," she smiled. "He hired me then and there."

While Jayne's producer-director husband, Milton Krims, is in Europe

making a picture, the girls are sharing an apartment and the two of them spend a great deal of time in the kitchen experimenting with strange and unusual food combinations. Jayne's favorite dish is something called "Knau," which is a concoction made of the roots of water lilies and, according to Jayne, it's the most delicious food she's ever eaten.

Jayne loves to sew. She designs her own clothes and also makes chic outfits for Audrey. When it comes to interior decoration, she's in her glory and thinks nothing of sitting up all hours of the night making draperies, bedspreads and curtains.

While Jayne is busy with her sewing skills, Audrey loves to practice by singing the scales. At sixteen she made her debut as a coloratura soprano in Carnegie Hall.

Both girls fondly recall their maternal grandmother, who was stone deaf. Because of this handicap, she developed a number of beautiful artistic abilities. She had a vivid imagination and used to sit for hours telling her granddaughters stories. She also directed them in little plays.
