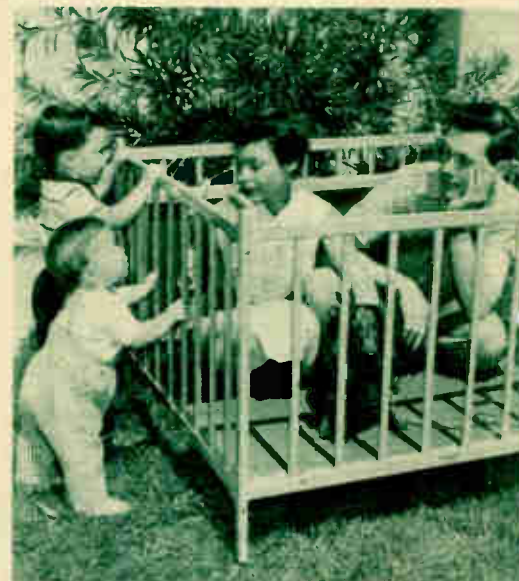

**PERFORMING**

The panel members—Johnny Mercer, Stan Freberg, Bobby Troup, and a femme vocalist—prove what good entertainers they are on the performance segment of the program. Panel members on other shows are content with answering questions but not the happy crew on Musical Chairs.

Mercer, the tunesmith, sings a lyric or two in his own inimitable style. Satirist Stan Freberg renders novelty tunes with the best of them. His "John and Marsha," "The Thing" and "St. George and the Dragonet" hits made juke box history. Stan's amusing voices and flair for comedy adds levity to the program. And Bobby Troup, young composer of "Daddy," contributes his share of entertainment to the program with his instrumental trio (which plays all the background music on the show) and with his vocal and piano artistry. Thus far we haven't heard quizmaster Bill Leyden sing but we've been warned that the emcee-platter-spinner, with a degree in archaeology yet, can whistle a pretty tune.

The panel and its head guy are typical men who can't make up their mind about the women they want on the show. So, and wisely too, they've had guest femme-panelists June Christy, Helen O'Connell and Margaret Whiting share the honors. A perfect trio of glamor and melody.

There's no upstaging on "Musical Chairs" because its members have musical stature and respect for each other's talents. Yes, "Musical Chairs" is different. Different from the kid game but equally as entertaining.

"Actually our program is format-ed by the viewers. Their questions are used to stump the musical experts. Unofficially, Johnny Mercer is dubbed the professor. Who else but he would recognize an obsolete record made twenty-five or thirty years ago? Professor Mercer wasn't stumped by a Rudolph Valentino recording sent in by a viewer. Frankly, I never even knew he made records. Then there was the Joan Crawford disc that almost fooled the panel, but Professor Mercer came up with the answer on that one too."

**M**USICAL CHAIRS" is one of the few panel shows that dares to be different. Perhaps it will set a precedent.

Panel shows are fast becoming a drug on the market. Even the panel show with a twist has run into a rut. Most of the twists follow the same pattern. But the members of "Musical Chairs" are not only quick with the answers but they are also fast with a song. Their combined years of experience total seventy-five, and that's a lot of musical knowledge.

Bill Leyden, quizmaster of the KNXT airer, boasts that there is no rehearsal and no tip off on this stanza. He claims: "It's more stimulating to cope with the unexpected than knowing all the answers before going on camera.

"We try to keep our show friendly and informative, leaving biting and snide remarks as well as brittle dialogue for other shows.

# Ralph Edwards's

**LAST SEASON** Fifi D'Orsay was inveigled into the guest star spot on Ralph Edwards's "This Is Your Life" under pretext of presenting a plaque. The gimmick was that the plaque announced that Fifi was subject for the program and this she would know just as soon as she started to read the inscription before making the presentation.

Fifi read the whole thing through—not once, but twice—and neither time did it get a rise out of her. The first time, Ralph thought she would eventually do a big "take," but when she breezed through the inscription a second time without giving vent to a typically flamboyant D'Orsay response, Edwards said to himself, "She knows. Somehow she found out that her life was going to be done tonight and she's not the least bit surprised."

You've read stories about Edwards's greatest thrills on TV but this episode with Fifi was one of his biggest chills. Finally, in desperation, he pointed out the potent part of the inscription and to his utter relief, the D'Orsay gal "came to" with a characteristic bang and cleared way for the show.

The ever-present risk of somebody

finding out that he is to be guest star of NBC-TV's "This Is Your Life" is constantly being narrowed. Scripts no longer pass through many hands at NBC, but are typed in Edwards's office and mimeographed by one commercial printer whose lips are buttoned tighter than a majorette's jacket.

Ever since the night Jeanette MacDonald's life was to be telecast and she, walking onto the parking lot was accidentally told to spot her car next to Nelson Eddy's, the big hush-hush has descended. The one attendant now taking care of cars gives a very cagey response to all comers and doesn't speak unless spoken to.

There's a little bespectacled man at the south door of the theater. He won't let anyone in unless he knows the person works on the show or is okayed then and there by someone who has authority. All these precautions are taken to avoid the chills that come once in a lifetime—a "This Is Your Lifetime," that is.

Before-show chills were experienced last summer when "This Is Your Life's" guest star was Mrs. Hannah Kohner, the refugee. Her brother, scheduled for reunion with her on the program, was delayed getting out of Tel-Aviv and did not arrive

in Los Angeles until the morning of the telecast.

Last Christmas, when Mrs. Ruth Eiler's life formed the basis for the program, her three sons were to be reunited with her. All were in the service—one in England, one in France, and one in Korea. The son in Korea was at the front. A letter telling him of plans was sent and he responded by phoning his sister and saving he would try to attend the event. However, due to military security, Paschall couldn't book passage for the lad and was left dangling in uncertainty. Finally only two weeks before showtime the fellow cabled from Tokyo that he was on his way. But this was the last contact with him until the morning of the telecast, when Al's phone rang and the voice at the other end of the line said, "This is Keith Eiler. I'm in San Francisco!"

Chills do arrive despite many precautions. Ralph Edwards has been experiencing them ever since he put "Truth and Consequences" on the air. One of Ralph's earliest and chilliest stunts was something to do with sliding stairs, which Edward's production manager, Al Paschall, had built at a cost of more than \$2000. The idea was to have a beautiful girl at the top of the stairs and to

# Greatest Chills

assign a young man the chore of making his way to the desirable beauty, meanwhile singing. The catch was that a certain word he would say was one which tripped the stairs, spilling the aspirant into a tub of water at the bottom of the climb.

### Risky

As Paschall recalls today, the stunt had never been tried before with a person walking up. It had always been used with the man walking down. Every precaution was taken, but it was impossible to time the drop of the stairs and there was also a chance the chap's toe might get caught and throw him backwards. To prevent this from occurring, Al had iron toes made for the contestant's feet.

Real chills of horror passed over everyone connected with the program when a completely unforeseen thing happened. The guy fell head first, straight into the tub of water. Slowly, as he lay submerged and very quiet, a purplish tinge spread over the water. Ralph and Al rushed to the man in the tub, firmly believing he had been fatally injured.

He turned out to be a professional, and the purple "blood" oozing into the water was dye from his wet tuxedo!

Another tight spot was the time a cow being used on one of the stunts somehow or other became separated from its "keeper." Suddenly plunking on the stage which was deserted except for Ralph, the cow saw the blazing footlights and grew confused. First thing Edwards knew, he was being pursued by a frantic bossy, with no one in sight to call off the chase. "Ha, ha, ha!" Ralph laughed deceptively for the studio audience's benefit, all the while trying to keep nimbly out of the cow's path and praying for help. It was late in arriving, but effective—eventually.

One big chill Ralph will never forget happened when a microphone fell into a water tank where a contestant was going through a "consequence." Trying to retrieve the mike, the famed emcee was "assisted" by the contestant, who accidentally plunged Edwards into the tub. It had six feet of ice cold water in it.

# That Man From Indiana

*In which Herb Shriner, the Hoosier wit, discusses by questions and answers what makes that Mr. Shriner tick. You'll know that very funny emcee of "Two for the Money" better when you read this.*

## 1. Do you ever get nervous or upset?

I'm relaxed when it counts on the stage, but I get anxious beforehand. You get under a terrific amount of pressure in this business. I don't think it matters, though, that I get nervous before a show. But I do confess that I'm usually upset about things that I can't help anyway—such as technical problems. I don't think many comics—and I use that word loosely—worry about whether jokes are funny, but instead fret and stew about whether or not the audience is going to get them.

## 2. Have you ever had stage fright?

Not in the respect where I couldn't perform. You almost have to be a little anxious or you can't generate that little excitement you must have to do a job well. I've often breezed through a show and have come off realizing I hadn't said a lot of the things I could have said—and gotten some laughs.

## 3. Has a contestant ever thrown you on your CBS "Two For The Money" show?

Once in a while. I can't ad lib as often as I'd like because I have to allow time for the game to be played. Contestants do blurt out some embarrassing things and I'm constantly holding my breath for fear one of them will toss out a dirty word.

## 4. How many of your comments on the show are ad lib?

About fifty percent are. Before the show goes on I get a lineup on what the contestants are like and what they do, so I have something to go on. It's not too tough a job. I never see the people beforehand but when I know their occupation I can think of some joke to fit. It's not too easy to think of quick flips with people taken right out of the audience, but for those who write in in advance I have an easier time. I'm actually a professional conversationalist. I'm trying to entertain people, so it's not really important whether I ad lib or not. People don't believe you anyway if you say you ad lib so why make an issue out of it? The only obligation I have is to entertain so it doesn't make any difference how I do it. Frankly, I'd rather give the contestants the money first and then they might not mind listening to my jokes.

## 5. What beliefs did your parents have about raising you?

They were resigned to it. I was the only child. The only one they kept.

## 6. What was your earliest ambition?

I was sort of interested in mechanical things. I had a basement full of toys. I got interested in the harmonica, though, and went into

music. The mechanical thing popped back again and now I'm interested in foreign sport cars and in motor sport car shows.

## 7. What was your first break in show business?

Playing the harmonica in a local radio station in Fort Wayne, Indiana. I started appearing regularly on radio and the station also had a little artists' bureau which toured acts all over Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio. I was on a good many of these tours. I started doing the jokes then too—mostly remarks I'd heard in Indiana. They got snickers so I got encouraged to make up a few jokes of my own.

## 8. How did you meet your wife?

Eileen had a date with another fellow on the radio show—and she was brought this evening by the other guy's date. She paid no attention to me at all, but by the next date she was with me and the girl I'd dated was with the other fellow. We just did a switch. We were married not too long afterwards. I call her "Pixie" and she's pretty critical of my work. She doesn't always laugh at my jokes, that's for sure.

## 9. What kind of a husband are you?

I don't have enough time at home to find out. Even my baby, "Indie," gets mad at me when I have to go away, and when I come back from a trip I have to make up to her all over again. When I am home I guess I rate pretty good as a husband, but I have to re-woo my wife too when I come back. She usually decides I should celebrate my home-coming by taking her shopping so she can buy a hat or some new furniture. My wife sure is a clever woman.

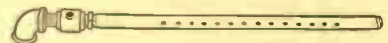

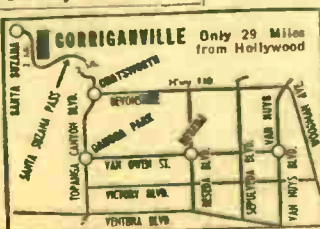

PEOPLE ARE STILL TALKING about their disappointment in Sherwood's "Backbone of America." That's what happens when viewers are built up to expect *The Ultimate*, then receive *The Mediocre*.

PEOPLE ARE ALSO DISCUSSING the big-splash color on NBC's Tournament of Roses coverage. By some manipulation, I managed to see both the colorcast at NBC's Burbank studios and the black and white telecast at home. Let's face it—b.&w. is pretty dull after you glimpse television in all its glory. However, it's still hard to look at those small color screens, so let's hope a larger (but NOT TOO expensive) color tube is produced soon.

MY ONLY COMPLAINT ABOUT NBC's coverage was the sometimes-fast brush-off given floats representing

endless labor and quite a lot of money. Several times the camera turned away abruptly from a floral masterpiece (even while description was still going on) to focus far down the street on a band or equestrian group. Was the rush THAT big?

NOTED THAT NO RADIO OR TV actress was mentioned in the Ten Best-Dressed Women list. *Mary Livingstone*, to name one, is always elegant simplicity and *Gracie Allen* is the last word in chic.

HEAR TELL JOAN BENNY, COULD illuminate a large hall with her gorgeous marquise diamond engagement ring.

RED SKELTON HAS POSSIBLY HIT on the answer to his overloaded work schedule. He's signed a three-year contract to transcribe a radio show for Ziv.

CBS-TV's WALTER CRONKITE flitted in and out of town last week, was

feted at a luncheon at Perino's. (Lucky me! Got to sit next to him.) We talked mostly about the high-powered assignments he'd covered during 1953, notably the Inauguration, Nevada bomb tests and Coronation. I had not known how closely BBC had made every commentator stick to a script. No ad libbing except on the

weather, the crowds and minor personalities. There was even a provision should something disastrous happen in the Abbey. Provided the altar was unharmed or not involved, cameras were to focus on it and soft music was to be played. Cronkite said peers and peeresses followed scripts, too, with places in them indicating when they could leave the room. It was rather amusing, he said, to see the nobility coming down the steep improvised stairs and backing away (in deference to Her Highness) in direction of the rest rooms.

CRONKITE ENJOYS DOING "YOU ARE THERE," says he can't walk down the street any more without someone stopping him to suggest an idea for the show. He is busy now planning a new early morning tele-show for the East and scheduling a thirteen-week series revolving around Congressional elections (he thinks these will be more important this year

## "Suspense" Bans Audience

No audiences are allowed in the studio when CBS's "Suspense" takes to the airlines. A chuckle, a cough, or a gasp at a sudden gunshot could kill the effect of a good murder. An uncontrolled audience might even laugh at the soundman's gyrations to produce the noise of a scuffle or the thud of a falling body.


Realism is the prime ingredient of a good "Suspense" show. To create it, producer-director Elliott Lewis confines his dramatic cast to half a studio, screened from the orchestra as well as any onlookers. Behind the actors, the soundmen work in split-second coordination with the dialogue.

The only time the screen between the musicians and the dramatic cast is removed is when a singer guests on the program essaying a combination singing and dramatic role, as in the case of Dinah Shore who did a song-drama of "Frankie and Johnny" and Rosemary Clooney, who played a girl who craved excitement and found it in the love of a racketeer in a dramatization of the blues classic, "St. James Infirmary."

Another important reason for the no-audience rule on "Suspense" is the freedom it affords the stars. Not having to worry about their appearance, they concentrate strictly on performance. Tony Curtis emotes in a T-shirt, Agnes Moorehead takes off her shoes, Joan Crawford shows up at the studio without the customary coating of mascara on her eyes.

"So I can cry," she explains, "without looking like I'm in blackface."

**TOPS IN ALBUMS:** Add another to the list of fine original-cast albums by Columbia in "Kismet," featuring Alfred Drake, Doretta Morrow, Richard Kiley, Joan Diener and Henry Calvin. Its delightful melodies, borrowed with taste from the music of Alexander Borodin, serve admirably to bring the magic and pageantry of the East to your living room. Here is a musical show worthy of comparison to "South Pacific," in an Arabian Nights sort of way, that should be a top-selling item.

**BEST IN SINGLES:** The Modernaires (Coral) have a top medley of songs from the forthcoming filmography, "The Glenn Miller Story." That includes "I've Got a Gal in Kalamazoo," "Moonlight Cocktail," "Elmer's Tune," "Moonlight Serenade," "Chattanooga Choo-Choo," "String of Pearls," and others so nostalgic to Miller fans.

Jo Stafford (Columbia) really belts out two of her best in many a week in "Make Love To Me," and "Adi-Adios Amigo" with its up-sambo tempo.

For contrast in style and tempo, Felicia Sanders really sells "Ma Curly Headed Babby" in warm, quiet manner for the best modern waxing of this gay nineties favorite and just about the best song this little gal has turned out since "Moulin Rouge."

Billy Eckstine (MGM) contributes two choice ballads cut neatly to his fit in "Rendezvous" and "I'm In A Mood," sung with plenty of drama and heart as only Mr. B. can.

Red Foley (Decca) has a terrific vocal boogie in "Tennessee Whistling Man," that could be a biggie in both Western and pop fields with its strong beat and whistling passages by Jerry Teifer.

Nat "King" Cole (Capitol) does his usual fine styling on "Answer Me. My Love" with its haunting melody that'll find hummers on its first hearing.

Woody Herman Orch. (MGM) has a fine pair of instrumentals in the grand tradition of The Herd for Ellington's "Prelude To A Kiss" in moody arrangement, and the colorful, pulsating "Cuban Holiday" is brisk Bahaman tempo.

Not many new platters this week, but what's lacking in quantity is made up in quality.—A.M.

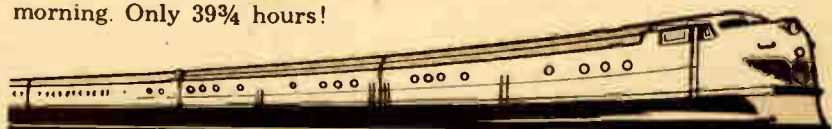

## TV's Most

**F**OR SOME time "Hallmark of Fame" has confused the experts. It's long been thought that any show that was once tabbed the "critic's darling" would never last long on TV. Yet this one has been arty, it hasn't gone commercial, it has believed that the public is intelligent enough for its kind of fare—and it has wound up being a consistent winner.

Albert McCleery, the producer of "Hallmark," recently moved the show from New York, where it formerly originated, to Hollywood. And he has found the move a wise one.

"I teathed on little theatres early in my career," Albert remarked, "and have always felt that what I was attempting to do in theatre and in TV had a close association with the grass roots movement. Not that I actually came from the grass roots, but I think I know what the public will and will not accept.

"We moved 'Hallmark' from New York for several reasons—the extra space with which to work, and space is so necessary, and also because we felt Hollywood was closer to the grass roots idea than New York. Look

at the stars Hollywood has built. A person like Marilyn Monroe is a product only this town could have boosted to fame. She has something in common with the average person in America. On the other hand, the big stars of Broadway like Katherine Cornell and Lunt and Fontanne do not have this close association with Mr. and Mrs. John Doe.

### Is the Show Too Arty?

"I know there are some people who do not consider 'Hallmark' as having even the slightest connection with the grass roots. They look on it as arty in many respects—and in some telecasts we do go arty. But the difference is we do not go along with the idea that TV audiences are morons. We like to feel they're far more intelligent than they're given credit for.

"Not too long ago we did a dramatization of Moliere's 'The Imaginary Invalid.' Let's face it—this was art. The baby sitters in America turned us off but we think a good many other million kept us tuned in.

"I try not to go overboard on art, especially after one lesson I learned. About a year ago I got on a mirror

kick. I was using two, three, and four mirrors for effects on shows. Finally, the technical director on the program got fed up. 'What's with all the mirrors?' he exclaimed. 'My wife saw the show last night and said it looked drunk.' I got to thinking that if she felt this way—and she was prejudiced in favor of the program—how must other women feel? So I now use mirrors only on occasions."

"Hallmark" used to do dramatizations of biographies only, but now it can nominate anyone as the subject. In the case of "The Imaginary Invalid," Moliere was the topic so an example of his work was used.

Albert McCleery has plenty of problems with his show. And yet since he came to Hollywood to work he has gained fifteen pounds and is in fine health. One of his obstacles in the beginning of his TV career was getting people to go for his unique kind of staging. He uses no sets. Instead, he goes in for selective realism. If he wants to show a banquet room, for instance, he shows only a mirror and a punch bowl and has an orchestra playing softly in the background. This poses a prob-

## Unusual Show

lem for the technicians and cameramen too because it is hard for them to block out movements for the actors with no set props like doors as guides. The entire show is usually played with only a couple of lights going so that much of the movement of the actors is done in the dark.

"I have always liked this suggestive kind of staging," Albert went on, "and when I wanted to do it on TV I was really given some unusual looks. Only two men, Pat Weaver and Fred Wile, believed in me. It was fortunate they did because they were my bosses. I tried the technique on 'Cameo Theatre' and Pat and Fred gave me the money to develop it. Weeks went by without much attention being paid to our show and then a national magazine gave us a big write-up. Soon the newspapers began taking notice of us, and then the public wrote in saying, 'We're glad you don't use all that scenery.' Actors, too, liked being on the show because without emphasis on close-ups and on people instead of on sets they were noticed much faster—even though they may have had just a bit role. Almost overnight, then, we found we were the critic's darling.

### Writers A Problem

"Our peculiar staging is not so much a problem as you'd think. Our biggest headache is finding superior writers. There's a wonderful field for writers here—and we're always on the lookout for those who can do work for us. In one way, it's not too hard to write for our show because there's no restriction placed on the number of scenes. With no scenery to change we can have as many scenes as we'd like. On one program we had thirty-two changes of scenery.

"Our other problem is casting. When we first came to Hollywood I had a tendency to send for some actor I knew in New York for a part. I always did this at the last moment when I'd get misgivings about a performer here. Now I don't do this so much any more. Barry Jones, however, came from the Isle of Man to do 'The Imaginary Invalid' for us."

### Sarah Churchill

The star of "Hallmark" is, naturally, Sarah Churchill. But for a while it looked very much as though either Miss Churchill or Albert would have to go since the two fought like cats and dogs.

"I met Miss Churchill first some time back when I was doing 'The

Would-Be Gentleman' with Bobby Clark on TV," Albert commented. "I cast her in a role and we had one of the biggest knock-down and drag-out fights ever seen. Then, some years later, when I was approached to do 'Hallmark,' Miss Churchill was already on the show. We were both given orders to get along together—so it was kind of a shotgun wedding. We still argue, but on a different basis. I'm her severest critic and she's mine. We've helped each other and we've learned from each other. I have learned that when Sarah makes up her mind to do a certain show, she's going to do it, and if she's wrong she has to find that out for herself. There's a bit of her father's iron will in her.

"She is a terrific worker, though, and one of the greatest TV craftsmen I've ever known. She's the technician's delight because she's never been known to be out of place while a show is being blocked. She has an uncanny ability to be just where she is supposed to be. Our association recently has been on a rather pleasant plane. And frankly I wouldn't give a penny for an actress without temperament."

If you're getting tired of the usual TV fare, keep your eye on "Hallmark of Fame" and give yourself a treat.

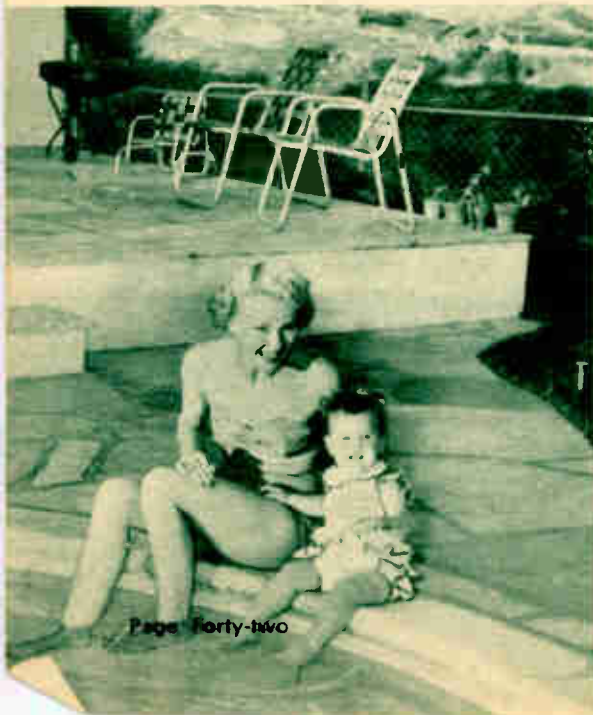

**G**OT A PROBLEM? Who hasn't!

Most of us have more than our share of them and in many instances we have similar problems. However, our solutions may vary, depending on which avenue of approach we employ to solve these problems.

The premise of the CBS radio stanza, "Make Up Your Mind," is based on the problem and its solution cycle. True it's another panel show but it is not all light and froth.

It even has a consulting psychologist on the program. After the panel has had its turn at discussing a problem, to which both serious and amusing solutions are proffered. Mrs. Lee R. Steiner, a psychologist, reviews the situation. She points up cause and effect but leaves the listener to make up his own mind.

"Make Up Your Mind's" four lively panelists are on mike primarily for their entertainment value. But Mrs. Steiner's sage advice keeps this show from becoming "Bachelor's Haven."

You can imagine what fun the panel can have with questions like the following: What would you do if you were engaged to a young man after a brief acquaintance and upon meeting his twin you couldn't tell which one you were engaged to? . . . What would you do if you were emoting on stage and a piece of scenery was about to shatter on stage? . . . What would you do if you were a widow and fell in love with your former husband's brother? . . . What would you do if you could step into a time machine with a choice of three buttons, marked "Yesterday," "Today" and "Tomorrow"? Which button would you push?

After the panel has rakishly kicked these problems about, Mrs. Steiner adds her wise comment. For example, she summed up the last problem stated above thusly: "To live in the future may be satisfying to an idealist; to choose the present may indicate a certain contentment with life and deep personal satisfaction. Most of us find our best achievement in combining all three—learning from the past, finding a goal for

our ambitions in the future, and getting the most we can out of the present."

Jack Sterling is the emcee who moderates the panel's lively discussions of hypothetical problems submitted by listeners. Jack has been in show business since he was two when he literally made his debut as Little Willie in "East Lynne"—of all plays.

Panelist John S. Young, former United States Ambassador to Haiti, and Edith Walton, known for her book reviews and as an editorial consultant, are regular members on the panel. A celebrity guest and members from the studio audience complete the "Make Up Your Mind" panel.

The chief humorist on this question-solving panel is John S. Young who advises: "Keep yourself honest, and there'll be one less rascal in this world" or "When a man puts a ring on a girl's finger, he sometimes puts himself under her thumb." Have you got any problems? Just ask John S. Young and he'll give you the "proper" advice.
