# Man of Scoops

*Clete Roberts isn't the type of newscaster to sit behind a desk and read off the reports. He goes all over the world where news is being made — and he finds a headline everywhere.*

▲ **CLETE ROBERTS** is always nabbing "exclusives" for his KABC-TV "World Report" show, but one of his biggest was his interview with these French paratroopers just before they left for the battle at Dienbienphu.

**C**LETE ROBERTS is the rovingest reporter anywhere! At least once a year, and often two and three times a year, Clete is off on a round-the-world trip covering the hot spots, those about to be so hot, and those that are mildly warm in search of news for his KABC-TV and nationally syndicated show, "World Report." This man not only gets the news—he has often made it.

On his recent trip, Clete covered all Europe. He interviewed the new Mayor of Berlin and on June 17 he covered the Unity Day anniversary of the East Berlin riots.

#### French Paratroopers

But probably his most notable scoop was his interview with the French paratroopers just before they took off for the battle at Dienbienphu. Clete was the only reporter to be given this interview, and it was one he didn't particularly enjoy.

"How could I enjoy talking to those young Frenchmen, even though they were so confident, when you knew that they'd all be dead in a few days?" Clete remarked.

In addition to his interview with the paratroopers, Clete interviewed the first American "CAT" (Civil Air Transport) pilot to be injured during the Dienbienphu siege.

Clete has always had a knack of finding news. Last year in Seoul he filmed the riots protesting the armistice then being signed. But while in Korea he also ran into a purely human interest story.

It seems that an Air Force sergeant heard of some Korean children who had been found in a cave. He loved youngsters so he started giving them food and candy. Then one day he went out on a mission—and never returned. The men in his outfit de-

cided, as a memorial to the sergeant, to take care of the children themselves. They got together enough money to build a hospital and an orphanage, doing most of the actual construction work themselves. To this day soldiers take their week's rations of candy to these children.

#### Seer

Clete has also become, because of his vast experience as a reporter, something of a political seer. About two and a half years ago while he was in the Philippines he was standing on the steps of the palace, the government building, filming his show when Magsaysay came out. Clete immediately exclaimed, "You're Magsaysay, aren't you? I'd like to talk to you." Magsaysay was impressed because Clete was the first American to pronounce his name correctly. At the time the Philippine official was in the government and Clete had heard much about him. After the interview, Roberts put his arm around Magsaysay and said, "This is the man to watch in

the Philippines." He is now President.

Not too long ago, Clete completed this story when he was on hand to cover the arrival of a ship carrying a complete rice mill and other supplies sent by the Lions Club in the States to help the Philippine nation get started again. And Magsaysay was at the dock; as President, to receive the supplies.

On his news-hunting travels, Clete doesn't carry a pencil and notebook. Instead, he's loaded with 822 pounds of equipment, which includes a camera, extra film, lights, batteries, and a transformer for operating off a jeep, airplane, or any other power supply he can hook onto.

There's only one disadvantage to his job—he is away from home so often that he hardly ever gets a chance to see his wife and three children. But they know that he's doing a great service to the public. In fact, if you want to keep informed about the world around you, you can't afford not to see Clete Roberts and his "World Report."

*The Power and Magic of Ralph Edwards' Heartwarming Teleshow Has Brought About Miracles for Those Who've Been "Subjects"*

**D**EAR RALPH EDWARDS: Someday we hope you pull something unique on "This Is Your Life." Not that you don't, every Wednesday evening, but this is more in the nature of a Before and After treatment. We hope you gather up some of your outstanding "subjects" and let them hold a testimonial telecast to tell the world how you and your TV show changed their lives. It would be illuminating and inspirational.

Take the case of Lillian Roth, whose story has been repeated twice—you have her third re-run scheduled again September 15. Lillian gives entire credit for her sensational comeback and the ability to finish her book, "I'll Cry Tomorrow," to your presentation of her on "This Is Your Life."

Granted that Miss Roth's story was one of towering ups and bottomless downs, her appearance with you gave the world an opportunity to see that she was still young and beautiful and what's more, that her shining talent was no longer obscured by alcoholism. We all know how, after her life was reviewed by you, she went on to headline the bill at the Palace in New York, then Chez Paris in Chicago, La Vien Rose in New York, and now is attracting more interest than ever with her absorbing

book. What many don't know, on the other hand, is that you actually dug her up out of the soggy past. It was when "Truth or Consequences" was a filmed TV show and in one of your stunts you presented the life of songwriter Nacio Herb Brown, who had written "Eddie Was a Lady" specifically for Lillian Roth. You wanted her to sing it on the program and that's how you first became acquainted with her and her tremendous story.

Your keen showmanship and gift for sensing what makes great human interest recently resulted in Gilda

Gray being a "This Is Your Life" subject. Already the wheels of change have started to roll with a new part being written for her with an unlimited run at Turnabout Theatre.

Joan Caulfield is another famous personality who has you to thank. Her being signed to co-star in "My Favorite Husband" on TV was the direct result of her appearance on your program.

#### Others

But it isn't only "names" whose lives you have changed. For exam-



ple, we recall the case of Dr. Kate Newcomb, a country doctor from the North Woods of Wisconsin. After "This Is Your Life" had focused nationwide attention on the hospital which she and her townspeople were trying to build, lookers contributed \$125,000. Today the dream is reality—an institution completely equipped and staffed. Not only Dr. Kate's life but that of her patients is being changed.

Helene Ruthling of Tesuque, New Mexico, found herself speeding in new channels, too. She runs a children's ranch as you well know, much of it free to those who can't pay, and these youngsters make musical Christmas trees. After Mrs. Ruthling teleguested with you, Magnins took on "her line" and the last we heard, she and her little charges were making nothing but money and were practically fighting off the customers.

And speaking of customers, we're reminded of that terrific actress Sara Berner, who spilled a tear or two when you honored her. Did you ever hear about her trip to Tulsa right after the show? She went to the big department store there and she couldn't shop because everybody stopped to chat about "This Is Your Life." Finally the clerks closed up the store (it was late afternoon) and let Sara have it all to herself while they enjoyed staying overtime waiting on her.

Arthur Franz, one of the principals in "Caine Mutiny," was cast in a picture for United Jewish Appeal after he'd appeared as a "subject." As you are well aware, this led to his important picture role.

United Jewish Appeal also entered into the appearance of Mrs. Hannah Kohner, whose life-dramatization brought about better understanding for the project. Since guesting with you, she has traveled to many cities to show the kinescope of the pro-

gram. For the first time, the appeal has been receiving nickels and dimes from "the little people."

**Help to Young**

Another worthy cause spotlighted by you, Ralph, is juvenile delinquency. Rev. Andy Griffin, who works on the east side of Los Angeles to help those growing up in less fortunate circumstances, has been offered aid, both financial and physical, after telling the story of his life (he is a convict turned minister, as we recall). One lady, an expert in make-up and hair styling, has opened a course for the east-side girls. She thinks that if they are given a chance to improve their appearance they'll also improve their morale.

Something else to your everlasting credit is the way you handled the appearance of Mary Ann, the rehabilitated dope addict. You presented her life with such taste and dignity that hope was transferred to other addicts. Yet you still drove home the idea that "even once is too much and there is no turning back without suffering the agonies of the severest physical torture."

Offers to buy Mary Ann's life story and offers of motion pictures are now under advisement. Caution is being taken not to release anything which might smack of sensationalism.

Another story, gripping and brave, was revealed the evening you "did" Louis Zamparini. A major motion picture company has bought the rights to his life drama.

You can be proud of what you accomplished for Emma Jo Wengert, the woman falsely convicted of murder and finally freed through efforts of Erle Stanley Gardner and the Court of Last Appeal. Through your program, she was happily reunited with her parents whom she had carefully shielded from shame. Emma Jo received bushels of letters after the telecast. They commended her for not harboring any bitterness

about the false sentence and said that just seeing her on television did more to exonerate her than a million words could have accomplished.

"This Is Your Life" proves lots of things, Ralph. We don't mean to presume by telling you this. For Fifi Dorsay, for instance, it proved "that I wasn't dead." She's getting lots of bookings now. In fact, soon after she appeared on your program, your production chief, Al Paschall, wanted Fifi to do him a favor by making a personal appearance and she was

# How Radio Saves Lives!

**H**OW MANY times has this happened to you? You are driving along a highway. Maybe you are going faster than you usually do? Maybe you had a "few too many" at the last stop? Maybe you are not concentrating on your driving?

lives, especially during heavy traffic hours and on week-end vacations.

One of the outstanding and most dramatic safety programs on the air today is Mutual-Don Lee's "Could This Be You?" It is aired by some thirty stations throughout the Don Lee area and has a weekly listening audience of almost three million people.

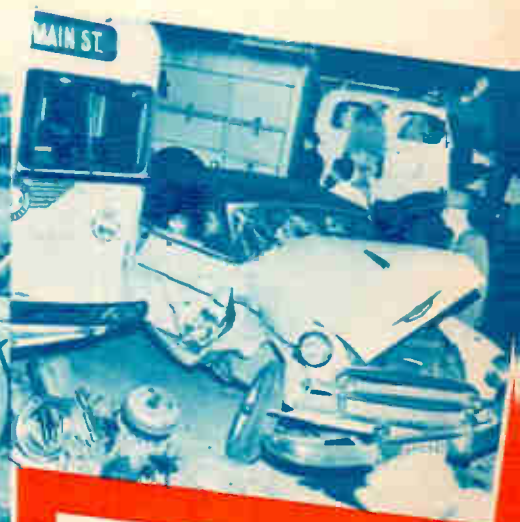
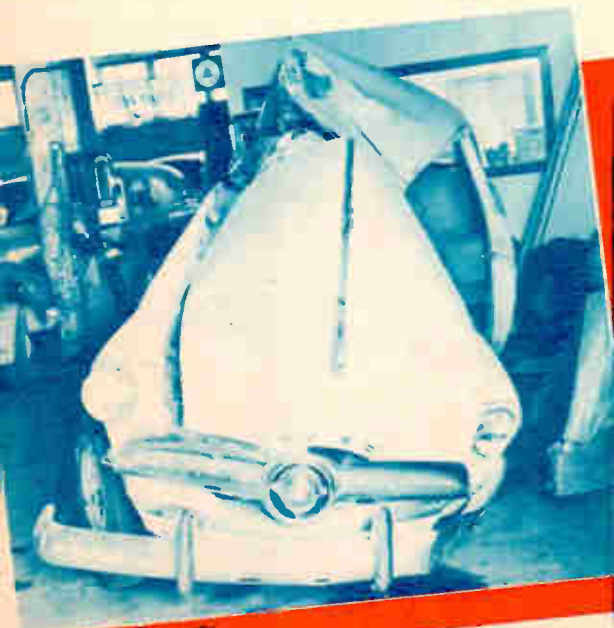
Since starting this program back in October, 1948, Sergeant George Amans of the Washington State Patrol has made approximately 3,000 on-the-spot interviews with careless drivers. For his work, the thirty-nine-year-old, six-foot three-inch patrolman has received numerous awards including the National Safety Council first-place award and an Alfred P. Sloan commendation.

Although Sergeant Amans may not have a piece of paper with fancy inscriptions on it from all of his listeners, he has undoubtedly gained the everlasting respect and gratitude of many motorists who might have been involved in terrible accidents if they hadn't heard and heeded his advice.

## In & Out of Focus (General Comment)

### Going Western

Doye O'Dell, bandleader Eddie Cleto and his Round-Up Boys and Homer Garrett and his square dancing Y-Knot Twirlers, all from KTLA's "Western Varieties," will appear in person at the newly reopened Casino Gardens Ballroom in Ocean Park starting Saturday, August 21 and weekly thereafter. The Casino Gardens will feature a Western Jamboree every Saturday night and plans are being made to start special square dances every Sunday afternoon in the near future.

### Stone in Valley

Cliffie Stone is bringing his "Home-town Jamboree" to the Valley Garden Arena every Saturday, starting August 23. The origination of the popular show and dance from the Arena will give Valleyites their first real mass entertainment spot.

Stone, a native of Burbank, moves his family television show and dance to the Valley Garden spot after four and one-half years of presenting the program from El Monte's Legion Stadium where it has always been tremendously successful.

The television show, presented from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. over KCOP is for the entire family. Following the show Stone's orchestra will play for dancing until 1:00 a.m.

With Stone will be Tennessee Ernie Ford, Molly Bee, Joannie O'Brien, Billy Strange, Harry Rodcay, Gene O'Quin and Herman the Hermit in addition to Cliffie Stone and his orchestra. These same personalities will entertain during the dance following the television show every Saturday night.

In addition to the Saturday night entertainment Stone plans to present other name attractions at the weekend at the Valley Garden Arena. He will bring in name orchestras and western bands for a full weekend of entertainment.

Here are the numbers and names of his "babies": Thirty studios for Radio City, N.Y.; five in Washington, D.C.; five in Denver; five at the old Melrose Studios of NBC in Hollywood; five in San Francisco; eight at NBC, Sunset and Vine; thirteen in Chicago; two at NBC-TV in Burbank . . . and now the first of its kind . . . the new color studio in Burbank.

**THE OTHER AFTERNOON THIS BUSY MAN** leisurely showed me a small model of the fast-rising building, then took me into this enormous, time was saved with this method which pours the yawning cavern of steel and concrete. The same method of "on the ground" construction used for the black and white studios two years ago has been employed again. I knew that much concrete in forms on the ground, then, when set, hoists the huge slabs into place and welds them with the steel skeleton. (There are 2200 welds in this color TV studio.) But in addition to time, this method is economical in that it doesn't use heavy wooden forms. It is also safer for the workmen at ground level, rather than many feet in the air.

**THERE WILL BE SEVERAL DIFFERENCES** between the black and white studios and the new color studio. One of them is in air-conditioning. Due to the tremendous amount of lighting required for color-casting, the studio will be much warmer and will place a greater load on the air cooling system. Instead of a 300-ton unit, the new one will be 450 tons. There will also be more electric gear due to color.

**\$1,800,000 OF THE \$3,500,000 BEING** spent on this color studio will go for construction, the remainder for equipment of the studios. Right now top NBC-TV officials are furrowing their

Don't look now, but there's more than a little concern over CBS way about whether or not Mario Lanza will actually appear on the first of the new Chrysler shows. Sure he's been set, he's agreed to make his TV debut, he's reportedly losing weight, but because of his often erratic behavior at MGM there are those who would hate to make any firm bets that he'll be around come the night of the show. The attitude now is, "We don't care what he weighs in at just as long as he's there." The producers of the show have every confidence that he'll be present and accounted for, but others who are familiar with Mario's habits don't share that confidence. There was even talk about the advisability of having someone ready to step in at the last moment—just in case—but nothing is even contemplated now about setting up any substitute star. If CBS were to ask MGM about Lanza, the studio might say, "Don't depend on him until he's on stage and the cameras are turning." It'll be a big coup for CBS IF he shows, it'll be a great event for TV audiences IF he's on hand for the show, it'll be an indication that Mario has really changed IF he joins Betty Grable and Harry James for the opener. All anybody can do now is to sit and wait and hope for what some consider a miracle.

In case you haven't heard, sponsors and stations are now turning a deaf ear to scheduling any more old movies for TV. Even die-hards among TV audiences have had enough of these antiques parading asthmatically around the channels. Besides, most people have seen these moth-eaten relics at least three times now. There will always be an audience for movies on TV, but not as large an audience as there used to be. Some of the studios which refused to let go of their backlog of pictures for TV may now have found that they have waited too long because television seems to be coming out of the movie-stage. It has always seemed odd that since there was an audience for late evening shows on TV that the stations didn't use this time to develop new shows. The hours could be given to a showcase of new talent, new ideas. Perhaps this will be the next step now

that movies seem to have had their hey-day.

Add to ridiculous commercials: the one saying that even though the little wife burned the roast and the cake fell flat the guests didn't mind at all because she served that delicious coffee. Can't you just see hungry dinner guests getting no dinner and then licking their chops over a tantalizing aroma of some coffee? Oh, brother!

A column or so ago we made a remark that it would be an intriguing idea if a disc jockey show didn't do a commercial after each record. Some mail has come in about that. One letter referred us to "Platterama Party" which is heard on KABC and stars Don Marlowe. Another reader told us to listen to KGIL in San Fernando which plays records from six a.m. to midnight. Seems these stations give far more music and fewer commercials. In the interest of music and to encourage you to switch your dial from the "commercial-happy" stations, we refer you to KGIL and "Platterama."

Walt Jensen of "Quick, What's the Answer" is a man with a sense of humor. When we took a crack at him for his corn and his "Bye now" routine, he had a quick comeback—a casual reminder that he has more sponsors participating in his show than has almost any other radio personality. All of which proves that Mr. Jensen is apparently well glued to a solid financial seat. Okay, Walt, go on and be corny. You aren't the first to prove that it pays off. We bow humbly in your direction.

One of the more nauseating experiences on TV is watching that fellow done up, for no apparent reason, in a space suit and demonstrating cottage cheese on the Laurel and Hardy show over KNXT. It's hard to imagine even the kids going for this bunch of tripe. If there's anything we can do without, it's watching any performer, especially a "commercialist," talking down to the youngsters. Maybe some children go for this type of selling, but those we've watched suddenly get up when Space Man comes on to get a glass of milk or a sandwich. They're always back for Laurel and Hardy, however. Will the time ever come when sponsors stop making fools out of children just to sell something? The product advertised on this show, incidentally, is one of the best and certainly should be sold with more taste.

Celebrating its Twentieth Birthday Party this year, Decca Records commends the event by issuing that many new long-playing releases this month. Biggest and most extensive item is a musical autobiography called "Bing" (to be reviewed later). Among the first releases is "A Night At The Roosevelt," featuring the music of Guy Lombardo and his Orchestra in a round dozen selections in the dance mood he established at this popular New York night spot in 1929. Selections are familiar standards and include the popular Lombardo medleys.

Ella Fitzgerald's collection is simply called "Ella"; a more descriptive title would have been "Mellow" for this is her quieter, more sincere voice. With Ellis Larkin at the piano, she is a relaxed Ella, and her interpretations in casual manner of "Star Dust," "Until The Real Thing Comes Along," "My Heart Belongs To Daddy" and the others are just



"South Of The Mason-Dixon Line" very aptly describes the style and choice of selections by the Lawson-Haggart Jazz Band. These ten good men and true (followers of two-beat jazz) romp through "Alabama Bound," take its bluesy for "George On My Mind," stomp it for "Tennessee Waltz" and so on through the eight southern states, never once letting up in their enthusiasm with a beat.

"Peggy" on the cover of an LP can only mean Peggy Lee—and only Peg. in her sexsational intimate style, can sing songs like "How Strange," "That's Him Over There," "That's What A Woman Is For" and the others included and convey the feeling she is singing for you alone. Call it personality, versatility, vitality—whatever adjective you use to describe her singing, it's great.

"Four Boys And A Guitar" spotlights The Mills Brothers in a group of eight selections—great standards and wonderful novelties which they have made their own in their individual way. "Window Washer Man," "Basin Street Blues," "Carnival In Venice," and "This One Today" are especially effective sung in the Mills tradition . . . (P.S. Watch for Decca's autobiographic musical LP—"Bing"—no Crosby fan will be happy without it—and that includes . . . A.M.)

# CANADA KICKS OFF

You have probably heard by this time that NBC-TV this Fall will telecast Canadian professional football games each Saturday from Aug. 28 to Nov. 20. We think you're going to like it. But lest you suspect that it is played with sticks and a human skull, allow me to set you straight.

To begin with, the game played up North is virtually indistinguishable from American football. If anything, it is faster and more wide-open. And what's more, you will see plenty of familiar faces on your screens. Typical of the many American stars who have crossed the border to play with Canadian teams are Gene (Choo-Choo) Roberts and Tex Coulter, ex-New York Giants stars; Chuck Kunsinger, hard-running halfback from Florida; Lou Kusserow, former Columbia great; Glenn Dobbs, of Tulsa and the Los Angeles Dons; J. D. Roberts, All-American guard at Oklahoma in '53; Ed Songin, ex-Boston College quarterback; and Tom McHugh, former Notre Dame fullback.

NBC-TV will telecast a 13-game series involving member teams of the Eastern Big Four—Hamilton, Ottawa, Toronto and Montreal. We also hope to carry the Grey Cup game, which immediately follows the regular season and determines the national champion. The current kingpin is Hamilton, which is coached by Carl Voyles, formerly of William and Mary, Auburn and the pro Brooklyn Dodgers.

As for the Canadian brand of football itself, there are several differences, but I don't think it will take you more than one half of the first game to catch on. The Canadian gridiron is ten yards longer and eleven and two thirds yards wider, midfield

thereby being the "55-yard line." Also, there are twelve men on a side instead of eleven. The extra man, called a flying wing, is usually employed as a flanker. Most teams use the T or split-T formation.

Canadian teams get only three downs instead of four in which to make ten yards. The result is that their attacks are designed to produce the long gainer. They really throw the ball around, as you will see.

They don't have a backfield-in-motion rule up there, so any area in the opposition's defense can be quickly assaulted. Downfield blocking, however, is permitted only within ten yards of the line of scrimmage. In other words, once the ball carrier reaches the wide open spaces, he's really on his own.

Touchdowns count five points, rather than six. One point, called a "rouge," is scored against a team which receives a kick in its end zone and fails to run the ball out. A rouge also can be scored by punting the ball out of the end zone, which is twenty-five yards deep rather than ten. A premium therefore is placed on good punting, and the result is that there are few ties in Canadian football.

In short, it is fast, exciting, rugged football. This souped-up version of America's favorite Fall sport is specifically designed to produce thrills and entertainment for the spectator. I think it is entirely reasonable to foresee the day when the North American game will be standardized to combine the best features of both Canadian and U.S. football. And when that happens, a professional football World Series is to next step.

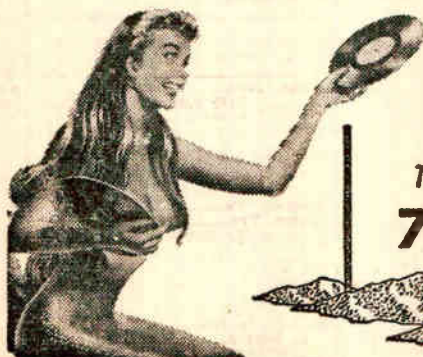

## Tom's Corner

I don't know if it is because of recent developments at Gilmore Field or not, but for some reason, there seems to be a lot more rhubarbs in baseball this year. And accordingly, there seems to be a general misunderstanding as to why a player or manager "beefs" about a close call. Usually, the average fan says: "Why argue with the umpire . . . he won't change his mind!"

Well, actually, the player or the manager is not expecting the umpire to change his mind on this particular call . . . his arguments and conversation are intended for the NEXT call. He believes that perhaps the next call . . . may go in their favor. This of course is not a steadfast rule . . . and it always doesn't work . . . but if you are wondering about the rhubarbs on the field, you can be sure the complaining team is looking for the next one. Not the one on which the complaint is made.

Talking about the Big Rhubarb with Bernier . . . a few viewers asked why I hesitated on calling at once that Bernier had slapped Umpire Chris Vallenti. Actually, like the fans at the ballpark, I was stunned, I was sure that Bernier had slapped Vallenti, but the incident hit with such a sudden explosiveness, that I was actually dumbfounded. I immediately sent Lennie Corbosiero, my assistant at the games, to President Clarence Rowland's box to get Mr. Rowland's official view. Mr. Rowland said that he had "no comment" on the incident . . . so we then talked about it.

In all the years I have been working

baseball games, I had never before seen a player strike an umpire. My immediate reaction was: "That's all for Bernier . . . his career is finished." And when his sentence was announced the next day, namely that he was suspended for the remaining part of the season, I felt Carlos had gotten off mighty easy.

For many years I have argued that battling with umpires or game officials is useless. Many times, in the heat of a close game, a player will say something that he actually doesn't mean. And on this spur of the moment remark, he will be thumbed to the showers. Having participated in many baseball games, I can understand the temper of a ballplayer when he feels the umpire made an error . . . but in the final analysis, no player is doing his club any good in the dressing room. Games are won on the field . . . not in the showers.

Baseball rhubarbs are part of the color of our national pastime and are something that I certainly would hate to see left out . . . yet at the same time, it is my personal opinion that long, drawn-out hassels do nothing but irritate everyone . . . umpires, players and fans alike.

Umpires are human so it is not impossible for them to make a mistake. Yet in honesty . . . they are calling the plays as they see them. They "boot 'em" as does everyone. But overall, I can't think of anyone who has as "thankless" a job as an umpire. And contrary to what a lot of folks may think . . . umpires are humans, just like you and me. They have families, are good parents and a lot of them go to Church on Sunday.

So before you "blast" the umpire for a call against your home team, think of what you would do in a like situation. Umpires in my book can't win. For no matter how hard you try . . . no one can please "all of the people all of the time" . . . and in has ever been involved in a baseball scandal in the long history of the game. That's a record that should never be overlooked.

Let's keep the arguments in baseball . . . controversy is always good . . . but let's play the game. And may the best team win.

Now, don't misunderstand me, this is a great studio to work for, but I had made them about \$30,000,000 with my pictures and I was, therefore, surprised when they couldn't give me the assistance I asked for. I told them I was glad I had found out how they felt and that now I could go out and try on my own. They said I wouldn't find it easy to start over again, but I made several pictures the public seemed to like after that—"Big Wheel," "Fireball," and "Quicksand." And just recently I finished making for Paramount, "Bridges of Toko-Ri" with that wonderful director, Mark Robson.

## Private Life

"Naturally, my private life has been the subject of much discussion. All right, so I've had three marriages. But that doesn't make me a character. When I was married to Ava Gardner, who is a wonderful girl by the way, the town had us married and divorced over and over. We just couldn't live a normal life. It's hard to stay married here, but I believe that now I have found the happiness I've always wanted.

"Elaine is a wonderful wife. She recently starred opposite me in the picture, 'The Atomic Kid.' She has gotten me out of a financial hole but good! # Henry Fonda Speaks His

*One of the theatre's and movies' most distinguished personalities has invaded television — and for a reason that is honest to say the least.*

**M**ANY STARS have given all kinds of high-sounding reasons for hitting the TV trail, but Henry Fonda isn't the type of person to indulge in clichés. He went into the medium for a solid, practical reason.

"I had had many offers to do TV shows," the star of CBS-TV's "The Star and the Story," a Four Star production, remarked after walking off the set where he was filming commercials for his sponsor. "I turned them all down because at the time I was doing eight shows a week in 'Mr. Roberts,' then I was busy playing on Broadway in 'Point of No Return,' and I just finished doing 'The Caine Mutiny Trial' in New York. That left me little time to do any television. The only thing I had played in on TV was a 'Medallion Theatre' presentation of a sequence from 'Arrowsmith.'

"Then one day I got a page-long telegram, detailing the idea for a series to be called 'The Star and the Story.' The producers wanted me to be the host and to give the commercials. I wasn't too interested until I saw the dollar sign at the end of the telegram. That did it. I was offered more money than had ever been suggested before, I had some time off before starting the picture version of 'Mr. Roberts,' and so I took the spot.

## Stars vs. Commercials

"I can't say I heartily liked the idea of being a host on a dramatic show nor did I like giving commercials, but an actor has to be practical. I will say now that doing commercials is very hard. I learn lines easily, but the dialogue I have to learn for this show is something entirely different. Each 'plug' sounds just about the same so I can't learn several in advance for fear of mixing them up. In addition, since our commercials are often tied in with western lore I have to memorize some of the odd names hung on stage drivers of the old days plus pronouncing mining terms.

"In a movie, an actor will usually have one or two big scenes that are exceptionally demanding. The day finally comes when he has to play them and he braces himself. Once they're 'in the can' he can relax and be human again. But the commercials are as bad as any difficult

scene I ever played—if not worse. There is no one for me to play to—except the camera—and I get self-conscious looking into the lens. The problems connected with this type of 'acting' don't end there. I may get through with the speech and then the 'head' on the beer I'm pouring (the sponsor's product) may not come off right and I have to do it all over again.

"I have had very little chance to see TV, let alone play in it, so consequently I don't know how other 'hosts' act on shows. But I most definitely feel that stars of programs should not give commercials too. I think it's wrong for them to have to step out of character to become a salesman. I know that if I do a play

on 'The Star and the Story' I won't do the commercials too. But there are no plans as yet for me to turn actor on the program."

## TV Drama

The very genuine, likable star was put on the spot when he was asked for his opinion about TV dramatic shows—and, as to be expected, he didn't turn his answer into a well-worn cliché.

"I haven't felt that the majority of shows have been very good," he remarked candidly. "I did see one—I don't know what program it was on—with Lloyd Nolan and Jane Wyatt that I thought was excellent. I was sure at first it was 'live' but I learned later it was on film. I think you'll

find most dramatic programs going on film from here on in."

If the day ever comes when Henry does do TV regularly—as an actor—it is very doubtful if he'll settle for any more "live" shows as he once did for "Medallion Theatre."

#### Live TV for Him?

"That was quite an experience!" he exclaimed. "We rehearsed for a week in a hotel ballroom with chalk lines on the floor to map our positions. We began to feel rather se-

cure until we went to the studio the day of the performance for the technical rehearsal. This went on until about five-thirty in the afternoon, and after dinner we came back to do the dress rehearsal. Everything went wrong—and so by show time none of us felt in the least secure. This is not good for any actor. The answer seems to be to have more technical rehearsals but this is too expensive—which leads us right back to film again as the way to resolve the problem."

#### Private Life

As far as his private life is concerned, the star is doing nicely, thank you. He is married to the former Susan Blanchard and they have an eight months old girl named Amy. He also has two older children, Jane, sixteen, and Peter, fourteen, from a previous marriage. They live in an old brownstone house in the middle of New York. No country home for them—but a replica of an eastern country estate at the studio that is used as settings for his TV commercials.

"Susan has no ambitions at all for a career," Henry commented. "She was once under contract to 20th Century-Fox but gave it up of her own

volition. If you were to ask her why, she'd say, 'No talent.'

"My son, Peter, and I have a great time in the summer fishing. Not long ago we spent three days catching tuna off of Long Island. The last day we were ready to go back home when a big shark suddenly got hold of the tuna Peter was dragging in. For thirty-two minutes he fought the shark and finally 'boated' it. It weighed 170 pounds! It had been such a tough fight that it was some time afterwards before Peter could unclench his fists. Believe me, that was quite a catch for a boy of fourteen! And he wouldn't let anyone help him.

"While we were in California for the TV series, we stayed at the beach. Peter got a job there at the hotel and was very proud of his 'career.' As for me, I had about twenty minutes on the beach. I was working the rest of the time.

"Once I finish the work for 'Star and the Story' I'm heading back to New York—and not necessarily to do another play. I'm in the mood for a rest, so I hope no one sends me a script I can't turn down."

It doesn't look as though TV has firmly "boated" Henry Fonda.



# Everybody's A Ham!

*"Before Your Eyes" has proved that almost anybody can be an actor—that is, if he has no inhibitions and doesn't have to do "Hamlet." At least that's the idea of Idabel Overlease, who does research for this show.*

**T**HERE'S A LITTLE ham in all of us, and as writer-researcher for the KTTV "Before Your Eyes" show I often wonder about that "invasion of privacy" dodge. Nothing is private to us, and the more we invade the better they like it!

On our program we do the real stories of real people selected from the files of an organization—perhaps a welfare or charitable organization, or perhaps P.T.A. or National Guard. We point up the work of the organization through the story of someone they have helped, and so far I have found no shrinking violets.

The usual procedure when we have decided upon a certain organization is for me to research it for a story. I go through the place with the public relations head, talk to everyone, select a star and then go home and write a shooting script for the camera crew. The story is then re-enacted on silent film and after it is edited I write a running narrative for Bill Steen, our narrator. The participants are brought back at the end of the show for an interview live-on-camera at the studio on the night of the show.

In the case of the Seeing-Eye Dog Foundation at Azusa, the star was Greta, a German Shepherd. We re-enacted Greta's story from the time she was picked up, lost and wandering, and taken to the Monrovia Pound. The Seeing-Eye Foundation saw her potentialities and we followed through on her training right up to the blind person who received her. And you never saw such a ham as Greta!

On location at an orphanage not long ago, we were working with a group of Catholic nuns. The cameras were held up for a few minutes because one of the sisters had left. When she reappeared the other nuns looked at her accusingly, "Sister! You dressed up!" they charged. We all turned and looked in amazement—she was exactly the same as she had been—black habit, starched white bib—maybe she put on her new rosary. They all had a good laugh at us and thoroughly enjoyed being actresses for a day.

The extraordinary part is the fine acting. Of course we are telling their story, and they have only to be themselves.

When we did a show on alcoholism I selected a man from the group because he looked so like a drunk! Most of the shooting was done on Skid Row, and when our alcoholic was complimented on his fine acting, he said, "Who's acting? All I have to do is remember the days when I was down here!" He was later tested for a drunk part at one of the major studios and I understand he got it.

In doing a program for the Presbyterian Neighborhood Houses we dealt with a family of four brothers. One of them had finished four years of college in two years and was working hard to better himself. Another was in college majoring in sociology and doing settlement work. The third was hooked on narcotics, in and out of Camarillo. The fourth was serving a term in San Quentin for murder!

I asked the Presbyterian Commit-

tee how far I could go in depicting the two brothers who were "nogoodniks." They were hesitant, and pretty sure I would have to soft pedal that part. But when I went to the family for my research I found no reticence. "Why not?" they said, "It has been in all the papers—and will Mama be in the picture, too? She could be looking at junior's picture and crying . . ." I consider it a sensible way to look at the matter. All things cease to be sinister when they are dragged into the sun.

Although our show is heavy on drama it is not a sensation shocker. There have been occasions when we have stretched a point, such as the program for Civil Defense showing what would happen to a community like Temple City if Communist cells rose and took over just before a bomb was dropped in Los Angeles Harbor.

At first the Chamber of Commerce took a dim view of the whole idea.

"We don't want you to do an Orson Welles here," they told me, "and scare the townspeople to death."

"I hardly think that's likely," I pointed out. "If such a thing were to really happen the commies wouldn't be so cooperative as to allow cameramen to run around after them photographing every move."

But now that I think of it, I'm not at all sure. They'd probably get as big a charge out of it as everyone else does on our show. Petrov would probably run home and get little Ivan to shove in front of the camera just before they blew up the city hall!

Thus far, Penny is the only DeFore child to express any desire to enter show business. However, Don doesn't believe in pushing children into show business unless they show definite talent for it. He hates precocious

children, especially those in grease-paint.

#### Church Work

The DeFores are a well-knit family group. The two eldest children sing in their church choir. Don is a member of the church board and Marion is active in the women's guild. When vacation time rolls around they all pile in the station wagon and head for places like Yosemite or Sequoia National Parks.

Don met Marion in Chicago while on tour and she gave up her career as a vocalist in 1942 to become Mrs. DeFore. Blue-eyed and petite Marion does all the cooking for her hungry family and has only part-time help about the house. She laughingly says her cooking has to please Don because he's the one who taught her how to cook. When he was a struggling young actor he found it more profitable to prepare his own meals than to eat in restaurants. Don has a hearty appetite and is strictly a meat and potato eater.

In his spare time Don likes to tinker with his power tools and make furniture. He put up and painted the redwood fence enclosing his almost two acres of property and he did most of the masonry work in his backyard. He's a golf enthusiast and enjoys writing too. Some day

Don and his advisory board deemed it necessary for the Academy to attract both the big and little people in the industry to make it a workable, democratic group. Despite some opposition from certain factions, Don and his aides accomplished worthwhile changes in the Academy which, from all indications, appear likely to give additional prestige and popularity to the organization.
