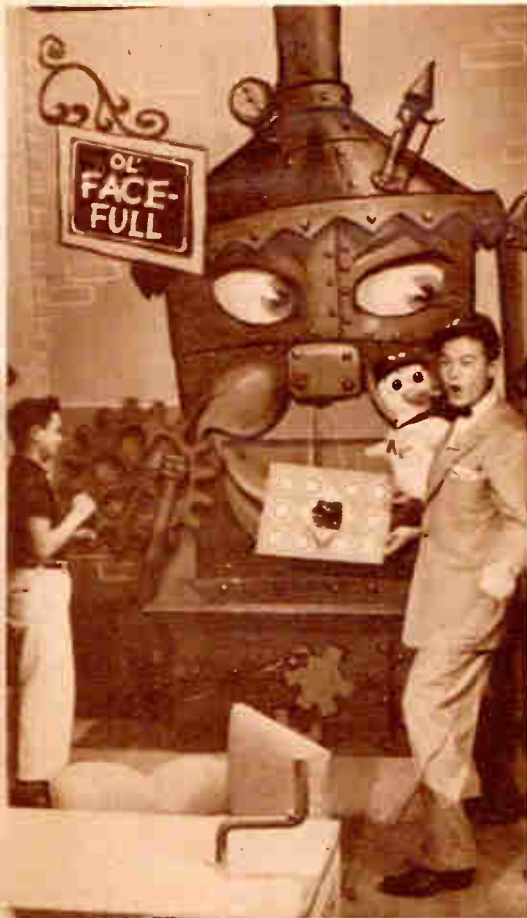

What's So Funny About "Funny Boners"?

CHILDREN have more fun than anybody. Give a look at NBC's "Funny Boners" and see for yourself.

"Funny Boners" is a happy combination of children, stunts, a saucy duck (Webster Webfoot), and Jimmy Weldon, a witty ventriloquist who possesses an infectious grin and a tremendous sense of humor.

Jimmy needs no introduction to the small fry. He and his famous duck, Webster, have been a very popular pair on the local videolanes for the past two years. When NBC lined up its Saturday morning block of children's shows, Jimmy and his webfoot pal were a perfect choice to emcee Ralph Edwards' new stunt show, "Funny Boners," featuring children as contestants.

Jimmy has endless vitality and enthusiasm and the moppets are completely fascinated by him. Texas drawl and all. Speaking objectively about his new show, Jimmy explained: "In many cases stunts pay off better with children than they do with adults. Children are uninhibited and are eager to participate. They have no fears of looking silly when performing some tomfoolery. As a matter of fact, some children find delight in acting silly. It's play

and it's fun. And that's exactly what 'Funny Boners' wants to get across."

"Children are also sensitive little creatures," commented Jimmy Weldon, "so we make sure no child bears the brunt of a gag or stunt. There are no losers on 'Funny Boners'—all of our contestants win something. Producer Les Raddatz and his co-writer Cal Howard are both family men (Les has seven children, Cal two), and have first-hand experience when it comes to dealing with children."

Jimmy claims that hosting "Funny Boners" is enormous fun because he loves to work with children. But those who know the irrepressible Weldon claim that it's Jimmy's knack for lampooning that helps to put the show across. Friends tell a classic story about Jimmy. At one time he was a student at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art's in London studying the role of "Romeo." Clad in traditional tights awaiting "Juliet's" line from the balcony: "Wherefore art thou Romeo?," Jimmy replied with all the gusto his Texan schooling could give him, "Hyar ah is. Honey Chile!"

Apparently he started early preparing for "Funny Boners."

What It's Like To Be Mrs. Paul Coates

Renee Coates presents an exclusive home-side view of her noted husband. If you expect a completely sugar-coated impression, read and get a surprise.

I CAN ONLY say that my husband, Paul Coates, is a fair husband. If I said he was a good one I'd spoil him.

Paul works so hard with his column and his two KTTV shows, "Confidential File" and "Flashbacks," that it's difficult for him to be the perfect husband. Not that I'd want perfection. That would be dull. I would like it if he could be home more often, but I have accepted his career and have to, therefore, accept the demands it places on him. Usually, Paul gets up thirty or forty minutes before his first appointment, has a fast cup of coffee, and is gone—often until two or three in the morning. He does a good deal of his work at night, you see. As a rule he goes out in a prowl car on police calls about two or three nights a week in search of material for his column and sometimes he has to go out several weeks to get one good column.

Oddly enough, now that Paul is busier than he ever has been he does get home for dinner more often than he used to. When he was doing just his column and "Bachelor's Haven" he never had dinner at home. Now he can manage it about two or three times a week.

Characteristics

Characteristically speaking, Paul is a moody man—but as peculiar as it may sound, his moodiness is of the pleasant variety. He'll come home feeling very silent. Occasionally I may comment that he's not

being very sociable and he'll say he's sorry, and he will try to snap out of it. That's one thing about Paul—he's not afraid to apologize and he refuses to argue. He simply disagrees.

I usually try to pay attention to things he doesn't like but at times I have to go against his wishes. For example, he has felt for some time that our two boys shouldn't go riding horseback. However, our daughter has taken riding lessons for quite a while and I felt that the boys should take them too—so each week they have their lesson. I always feel guilty for doing this and Paul does make references to the matter, but I guess maybe I'm a little stubborn too.

Paul is a good father in most respects, even though he doesn't have as much time to spend with the children as he would like. He does talk to them a lot on the phone. When they're not in school he'll call them two and three times a day. He calls me eight or nine times each day just to say hello and check on things at the house. It is in this respect that Paul is an attentive husband. He's not the doting kind, though, who brings a wife presents or who is sentimental about such things as anniversaries.

In fact, come to think of it Paul isn't sentimental at all in the way a woman thinks of a man. When he's home, for instance, he will sit down at the piano and play all the old tunes he'd heard his mother play. He can't read music, he never

had a lesson, and so he does all of his "musicaling" by ear. In the numbers he plays he is sentimental, and yet he never thumps out a single song that has any romantic connotation between us. It's things about the past that interest him. That's why he likes doing "Flashbacks." He really loves those old film clips he shows.

In most ways Paul is a serious man and yet he has a good sense of humor—a trifle off-beat though it may be. There is one story that really typifies his humor.

He went in a prowl car one night with some police on a call to East Fifth Street, not the coziest neighborhood around. They arrived at a bar in time to see a man come out dripping blood. His abdomen had been sliced by another man. The police and Paul tried to question him but he would give no information. So Paul, who gets very rambunctious and acts too much on impulse at such times, followed the trail of blood up the stairs to a room. Without thinking of the danger he was putting himself in he opened the door. He told me later that it was only when he opened the door that he realized the chance he was taking. The police were right behind him advising him to let them go first. Well, the man who had done the knifing was inside. The police took him downstairs, and as he was going down he passed the man he had knifed. Very politely he said, "Excuse me." Paul thought this was very funny. And so did I when Paul told me the story.

The more I try to put Paul's character down on paper the more I realize what a complex person he is. For one thing, he isn't extravagant but he has extravagant tastes.

He never has time to shop for clothes or things he needs so I do

most of his shopping for him. Not long ago he kept saying, "I need some shoes." But each week he'd find himself short of time—and he'd quietly complain that he'd never have those shoes. I finally bought them for him myself.

It is in food that his extravagant tastes express themselves. He's not a hot dog or hamburger man—that's for sure. That's one reason why I'm glad he can't get home for dinner so often. I'm not the fancy cook, but even when I prepare lamb chops for Paul I know he likes some extra spice or seasoning on them.

He likes service too. He doesn't realize how much he orders it. I didn't catch on to it for quite a while either. I had been getting him this, that, and other other whenever he asked for it and then one day he said, "Please get me a glass of water." I started to and then stopped abruptly. "No, I won't," I said to him suddenly. He looked surprised and commented, with injured pride, "You needn't say it like that" and got it himself.

I think our son, Timmy, must have walked 10,000 miles by the time he reached his present age getting things for Paul. One day he caught on too and when his father asked him to bring him something, Timmy said, "I don't want to." You should have seen how surprised Paul was!

Sleeping Habits

Paul does see the humor about this—even though he doesn't often see humor in his work. He is very impatient about his jobs. He gets riled up easily when things don't go right. He was impatient even as a

kid. He never wanted to go to school. He just wanted to be a writer. He told me he used to go around with a hat on his head, pencil behind his ear, pretending to be a reporter. In high school he did become editor of the paper. But it's amazing he ever got to school. In all the years he was a student he accomplished two things—he never got to school on time and he didn't get along with any of his teachers.

A friend of his used to get up at six-thirty every morning, arrive at Paul's house about seven-thirty, sit on a chair by Paul's bed, and spend an hour or more trying to get him to get out of bed and to school. As a result, both Paul and his friend were always late.

Paul didn't get over the habit of not wanting to get up until recently when "Confidential File" forced him to arise early for necessary appointments. When we were first married I was astounded by his ability to sleep so late. I used to ask him, "How can you stay in bed so long?" He only answered, "All my life I tried to get up early and I couldn't quite do it—and I can't do it now. It's not that I don't want to get up. I just *can't*." I believed him when he couldn't even get out of bed in the early hours of the morning to give our first baby her bottle.

He knew this was wrong and he'd apologize. He'd say, "I know I shouldn't stay in bed and I'll try to get up," but he couldn't. To teach him a lesson I even let him sleep through important business appointments—but this didn't faze him either. I'd walk past his room, would get annoyed, and would slam the children's door. This usually would make him get out of bed. He'd come in for coffee. I wouldn't speak to him, he'd apologize, and that would be it.

Of course, it is true he worked late—often until two or three in the morning—so it wasn't too unreasonable for him to sleep until one or two in the afternoon. But if he hadn't slept so late he could have finished his work at the paper earlier. I can remember him doing his column at some unearthly hours. And as late as it was he was as meticulous as ever about what he wrote. He might be at the bottom of a page and yet if he made a mistake in the next line he'd rip the sheet out of the typewriter and start all over again. I used to sit there, waiting for him, praying he wouldn't make a mistake.

Paul used to worry a great deal about his column. Now he can worry about his TV shows too. One thing is certain—Paul is consistent. Twenty years from now if he's still doing the same jobs he'll be worrying about them just as much as he does now. He's what could be called a perfectionist.

Having been a dancer, I used to think show business was a demanding life. Being Mrs. Paul Coates is just about as hectic—but it's more fun.

The child sensation of two decades ago brightens up your TV screen in a new comedy series, "So This Is Hollywood."

FACED the footlights when I was four and lived through thirty years of show business without a bruise or a scratch, that is, until television came along." So spoke lovely Mitzi Green, star of NBC's new series, "So This Is Hollywood."

"I have done practically everything in the business—danced, sung, emoted. But television is proving that I'm no slouch when it comes to playing the role of stunt girl 'Queenie Dugan.' No one has ever taken the trouble to explain to me just why I haven't a double for my zany stunts, so I've just concluded that the budget makes no allowances for such trivia. Consequently, Mitzi Green, mother of four, former child actress and musical comedy star, is now TV's new stunt girl.

"I play the role of a warm-hearted stunt girl, wise in the ways of Hollywood and wise enough to know that I'll never be a star. Therefore, I concentrate my efforts on promoting the career of my young, wide-eyed roommate, 'Kim Tracy' (Virginia Gibson). Leading supporting roles are played by Gordon Jones, a stunt man, and Jimmy Lydon, agent for 'Kim' and myself. Gordon and Jimmy, like myself, work towards furthering 'Kim's' career."

Speaking of careers, Mitzi began hers at the age of four doing imitations of Moran and Mack. Mitzi's parents were a famous vaudeville team called Keno and Green. The veteran actress, Elsie Janis, spotted Mitzi doing an act with her parents and "dragged" a couple of Para-

mount executives to the theater to see the talented youngster.

Mitzi was signed to a long-term contract. Her big hits were "Tom Sawyer" and "Huckleberry Finn." Playing with such child stars as Jackie Cooper and Jackie Coogan, Mitzi made fifteen films between the ages of eight and eleven.

Growing Up

As Mitzi stretched in inches she grew up in musical comedy. She starred in the Rodgers and Hart musical success, "Babes in Arms." And she also appeared in George Abbott's "Billion-Dollar Baby." The sylphlike, streamlined Sophie Tucker branched into radio and nightclub work. In recent years, however, she has made only infrequent appearances in nightclubs, TV and radio because she wished to devote most of her attention to her four children.

Mitzi is married to motion picture director Joseph Pevney and their youngsters range from eleven-year-old Joel, eight-year-old Jan, four-year-old David Jeff, to baby Brian Jay.

The versatile comedienne is a perfect choice for the role of "Queenie Dugan." Her eldest son Joel is convinced of his mother's great prowess as a stunt woman and he openly boasts of the fact that she gets hit on the head and takes pratfalls regularly.

Mitzi admits that despite her bruises she's getting to like her rugged television routine. "I'm happy in the new medium," she says, "even if I'm the only one in the series who projects exclusively in a black and blue system."

Off Lens (Personalities)

Karl Freund, Golden Anniversary

Karl Freund, dean of cinematographers, will celebrate his 50th anniversary in motion pictures this year and the occasion will be marked with completion of his book: "50 years: From Nickelodeon to I Love Lucy."

Freund, who has been a cameraman, writer, director and inventor, is a jovial, oversized extrovert who is a master of his art. A teen-ager in 1905, he began his career as a projectionist in Germany. Studying art at Koeniginhof University, he became ardently interested in photography and was signed as a Pathe News cameraman.

By 1922, Freund was recognized as one of the world's outstanding cameramen. He was the first to put a camera on a dolly (it had been stationary until then) for the great film, "Last Laugh." Many of the films he made then are being shown now in New York's Museum of Modern Art. Among them is the original documentary employing a technique called then, "stolen shots" which used hidden cameras under existing conditions. In 1927, he introduced wire recording.

Lucille Ball never forgot Freund's artistry and when "I Love Lucy" was set into motion, it was among the first to be signed. It was his debut in the medium.

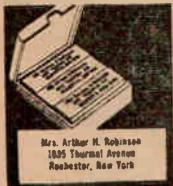

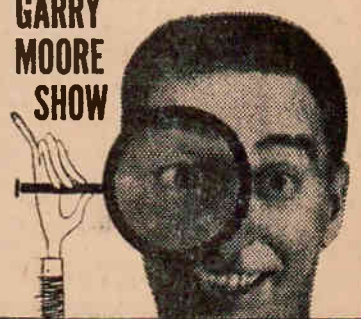

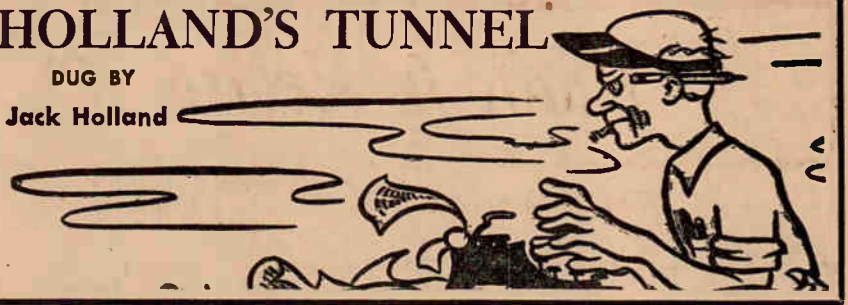

The last **Spectacular**, starring **Martha Raye**, **Milton Berle** and **Ray Bolger**, wound up considerably on the debit side of the ledger. **Bolger** came through nicely with a couple of numbers, but **Uncle Miltie's** stock-market routine was much too long and overdrawn and was painful instead of funny. Somehow these big epics just don't come off. It's still a case of trying to pad too much to fill in time. The most successful shows among the **spectaculars** have been productions like "Lady in the Dark" and "Naughty Marietta," where a definite plot line sustains the hour-and-a-half playing time. But the most annoying thing about these **spectaculars** is having to see them in black and white. Since they are being done in color the washed-out and anemic effect you get on the un-hued sets is a mess.

The "Peter Pan" effort was quite a noble experiment for TV—but the most amazing thing about it is that the poor cousins on the West Coast had to see it at such a ridiculous hour. Who was able to see it in its entirety? Most people were still working when the show began and, in fact, the majority of viewers were just getting home from the job when it was over. It does seem that when a show of this magnitude is conceived, some small consideration should be given to the millions of viewers on the West Coast. Look, you boys back in New York who line up these super deals, we love your city, but we're plenty tired of getting the short end of your deals. Thought those days went out with kinescope.

Caught **Mae Williams'** act at the **Biltmore Bowl** and she's doing a sock job. Everyone hopes her persistent jinx has finally given up and that this is the beginning of big things for her. However, it's amazing that a place as big as the **Bowl** lets its customers behave the way a few of them did the night I was there. One table in particular was "decorated" by several loud-mouths who were obviously loaded. They talked all during the acts and yet no attempt was made by anyone at the **Bowl** to stop them. Not only did they annoy the performers but they made things unpleasant for the rest of the people who were trying to enjoy the show. If this is all the consideration the place has for its performers and its customers, then it's a good place to avoid.

Last week marked quite an event in **Ray Bolger's** career. It was his 20,000th public performance! Prior to the time **Ray** went on TV he made 19,942 appearances on **Broadway**, in vaudeville houses, supper clubs, movies, benefits and overseas during World War II.

Last week's ABC-TV program is number 58—total, 20,000. Of all those performances, **Ray** remembers vividly the opening night of "On Your Toes," when he danced "Slaughter on Tenth Avenue" with **Vera Zorina**. And, of course, he can't forget "Once in Love With Amy," the theme of his TV series and his hit song from "Where's Charley?"

Guild Films is filming what should be a mighty popular show. Called "It's Fun To Reduce," it will show American women how to lose weight happily. The show started in Pittsburgh a year ago and was a top-rated program. Now it's being filmed with **Margaret Firth** as star. She has great confidence in the show, so much so that she says, "Anyone who applies herself to the suggested reducing routine of our show will look better, feel better and be better." Be patient, girls—it will be along soon.

Odd and Ends: Elizabeth Patterson took off for New York to appear on an upcoming **Milton Berle** show. While in New York she will probably do other shows.

Hope you caught the "Lassie" show a week ago last Sunday—about the snake bite. It was a heart-tugger for sure and beautifully done. Even old cynics called me and said they hadn't seen anything so touching in ages on TV. This series remains consistently good. Its canine rival, "Rin-Tin-Tin," is also gaining steadily in popularity. . . **Laraine Day** is starting a new TV series, a sort of female "Dr. Kildare." Looks very promising too. **Ted Post** has already directed the pilot and is set to meg others. . . **Bill Bendix** is so nicely on the mend now he even went to the races a few days ago, but with his doctor along just in case. When **Bill** was at the **Good Samaritan**, NBC thoughtfully sent him a TV set so he could watch his favorite shows. . . Huzzahs to **Paul Coates** for his efforts to alert the public by his last Civil Defense show. Next week this column will give the contents of the emergency first aid and food kits **Coates** and **Civil Defense** authorities recommend that each family purchase.

It was TV night for sure at the **Cocoanut Grove** with NBC's **Kaye Ballard** and **KCOP's Florian ZaBach** headlining. It was a solid show, although overlong. **Ballard** is a riotously funny girl but she should drop "Funny Valentine." the **Mambo** number and the **Fanny Brice** impressions. Watch this girl go, though. She's really funny. As for **Florian**, he should be the hottest thing on TV. He has a terrific personality, a wonderful sense of humor and great talent. His **Grove** stint ought to build his stock tremendously.

Southern California's oldest major independent radio station, KFWB, will celebrate its 30th Anniversary with a month-long program of promotion.

Working Whistler

Dorothy Roberts is one girl who always whistles while she works because her work—on radio, at least—is whistling. Dorothy is the girl who, every Sunday night, opens the KNX-CBS' exciting psychological dramatic series "The Whistler" with the thirteen weird notes of the theme for the program. Again, just before the drama begins, Dorothy whistles, this time just eleven notes, and again at the close of the show, thirteen more notes.

That's all, just thirty-seven notes, once a week—but they rank among the most eerie notes of any put together for theme music. As a matter of fact, Wilbur Hatch, musical director for "The Whistler," and the man who composed its weird melody, says only about one person in twenty is even able to come close to the exact melody.

The reason, Hatch explains, is that the tune has a very bad interval of an augmented fourth. It may be a "very bad interval," but it's paid off well in quick identification of the show by the listeners.

Dorothy has been whistling the E-

minor "Whistler" theme ever since the program first started, back in 1942. She was selected in an audition and although not possessing the prettiest-sounding whistle, her tone gave the eerie touch that the notes demanded. So, she got the job—and has held it ever since.

Dorothy's whistling sets the stage perfectly for the entrance of "the man who walks by night"—"The Whistler."

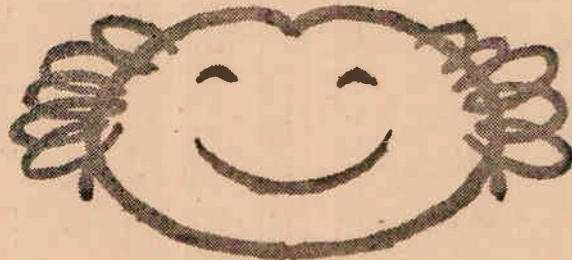

Hi-Fi searchers for the unusual should bend an ear toward MGM's LP "Spanish and Latin-American Music for Unusual Instrumental Combinations." Most outstanding of the quartet of contemporary compositions is Carlos Chavez' "Toccata For Percussion Instruments". Although it is played by only six musicians, more than 15 percussion instruments are used to interpret this brilliant and idiomatic work. Another interesting composition is Revueltas' "Ocho Por Radio", or "Eight Musicians Broadcasting." As its title implies it seeks to almost humorously depict what might happen while listening to Mexican radio on a slightly defective set with much interference. "Ritmo Jondo" is in Flamenco rhythm for chamber orchestra, with its typical hand-clapping background, while "Choros No. 7" is one of the famous Villa-Lobos series of sentimental serenades. . . .



"Dance Date" (Mercury LP) features the fine band of Ralph Marterie in a round dozen of the old familiar in the jazz and romantic mood. "Bumble Boogie," "Detour," "Take the 'A' Train," "Oye Negra," "Moonlight In Vermont" and the others lend themselves to either your dancing or listening fancy. Marterie plays with a strong beat and excellent arrangements that have made him one of the nation's top new dance bands. . . .

"Little Girl Blue" (MGM LP) easily rates the top vocal spot of the week's long-play records if for no other reason than it brings Joni James in torchy mood for not only the title song, but also "I'm Thru With Love," "It's the Talk of the Town," "These Foolish Things," "Too Late Now," "In Love in Vain," "Autumn Leaves," and "That Old Feeling"—eight great reasons why little Joni holds so firmly the place she occupies in the heart of of Little Girl and Boy Blue everywhere. . . .

Fred's Corner

To predict what's going to happen in the Pacific Coast League this year is strictly for fools—so here we go! Prediction number one—San Diego will not repeat! Bob Elliott will have his hands full replacing Harry Elliott and the league's leading hitter, Dick Sisler, who at this time is an announced "retirement" and the pitching that stood him in such good stead last year may not hold up this year. San Diego will be a contender though, and repeater, if pitching is as good as it looks on paper.

Prediction number two—Oakland will move up at the gate, and possibly in the standings, though their third place finish of 1954 means it's hard to go up. Lefty O'Doul, who used to be a favorite hated rival in Oakland when he bossed the Seals, seems to have Oakland fans on his side, judging from the east bay clamor. Lefty will get the most from his material, and the Oaks should have some outstanding players on their already good roster when the season opens.



Prediction number three—the Los Angeles-Hollywood rivalry, which has produced so many thrillers for southland baseball fans, will be keener than ever. It looks as though both clubs will have outstanding young talent on the roster. There's something about the traditions established—the new players seem to be as aware of the rivalry as if they themselves had created it. That's one question fans often wonder about: How can a player who's worn an Angel uniform one year, don a Hollywood one this year and feel a team loyalty? Somehow a few days of playing with a group does the trick, and the holdovers on the Hollywood roster will need to do little indoctrinating to acquaint the newcomers with "the big series."

While the league is by no means an easy one to predict, it's easy to see at a glance that Hollywood has good men at every position. Dale Coogan and Paul Pettit, who hit well at Salinas last year after voluntarily being sent down, will vie for the first base job. Monte Basgall is back at second. Shortstop candidates include Jim Bauer, a White Sox bonus prospect of Memphis background, and at third in addition to holdover Lucky Lohrke there's Lauren Babe who played for the Athletics and Yankees, Warren Goodrich of Stanford, and a fellow named Lee Rodriguez who hit a fabulous .439 in the Arizona Texas League. Gail Henley, who played under Rod Dedeaux at USC a few years back is a leading candidate for one of the outfield berths along with Bobby Del Greco. The catching is bolstered by Pete Naton, with the Pirates last year, and the pitching roster includes Red

Munger (17-8), Lino Dineso (19-8), George O'Donnell, Ed Wolfe and Fred Strobel, plus newcomer Ron Neccai, who hurled a no-hitter, fanned 27 men in a single game and was hailed for stardom until ulcers interrupted his career. Now, in a comeback role, Neccai (pron. neith-eye) may well be a big winner for the Bragan lads.

The Angels and Seattle likewise have some good new faces that may upset the entire pre-season line. It's always the unexpected that changes a pennant race—a pitcher who is supposed to win twenty games and comes up with a bad arm—or the pitcher who's been a just-average hurler develops a new pitch—and wins twenty.

On paper right now, San Diego and Seattle have some seasoned hurlers who could, with good years, make it tough on the league. But there are always the intangibles—the hustle, spirit and great defensive play, plus clutch hitting that makes a big difference.

One thing can be surely stated: All clubs have done their best to come up with teams their fans can be proud of, and some of the "front office" hustle and drive of the winter season should be reflected on the diamond this spring and summer. It looks like the Pacific Coast League's biggest year.

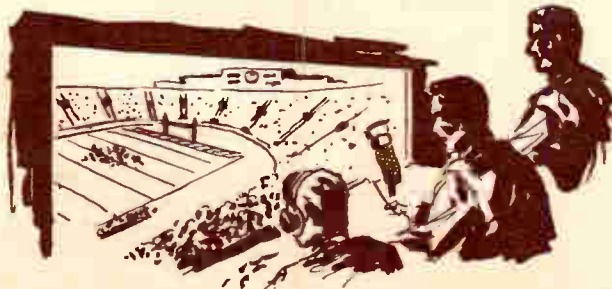

"What I Think About Bob Kelley"

Jim Healy, "Ole Kel's sidekick," gives some of his personal impressions on the controversial KMPC sportscaster.



LET'S GET ONE thing straight. This is a story of what Jim Healy thinks of Bob Kelley.

Understandably, Jim is more-than-slightly prejudiced in his viewpoints on the controversial KMPC sportscaster. You see, Kelley is Healy's boss. Jim has been on Bob's payroll ever since 1950. As his writer, assistant, and occasional fill-in man, Healy knows "Ole Kel" as well if not better than anyone in town.

"It's amazing," Jim explains, "how much we agree on sports. If we didn't I guess we wouldn't be working together as long as we have."

"As everyone knows, Bob belongs to what might be called the subjective school of sports announcers. That is, he does not just read facts and figures on the air. He tries to tell you what he thinks about those facts and figures. I even feel more strongly about this than Bob. On the KMPC show, we never use a story word for word just the way it comes over the news service wire."

Loved or Hated

As a result of this approach to sports, one fact is certain: Bob Kelley may or may not be the best sports announcer in Southern California (that's a matter of individual opinion), but there is little doubt he is the most liked—or hated—sports-caster. Listeners either agree or disagree with him, and violently so.

"That's another amazing thing," Jim continued. "Everybody who meets Kelley in person likes him. I've known some people, who, although they never met him, disliked Kelley immensely just because of his viewpoints. Then they meet him in person. And they change their minds about him. Bob is just that way. Off mike, he's so amiable and easy to get along with that you just couldn't help liking him."

Healy brought out another unus-

ual item about the perennial Los Angeles Ram and Angel play-by-play announcer. Despite the hundreds of games Kelley has broadcast and telecast he still gets extremely nervous before each contest.

"It's almost become a standing joke between us," Healy laughed. "Before a contest, such as a Ram game, Kel will call me three or four hours ahead of time. He wants to get out to the field. I tell him he's crazy. What's he going to do, mow the lawn, or put on the yard-stripe markers? Actually, he wants to get there ahead of time to talk to the coaches, or the players, or anyone. Sometimes he won't even talk about sports. He just has to be there to get rid of some nervous tension."

"Now all Kel has to do is get me on the phone and say, 'Come on, let's cut the grass'—and I know what he means."

"Papa" Kel Is Religious

In personal life, Bob Kelley is not only the devoted father of four Irish lads (one more and he'll have a basketball team) but he takes his religion seriously.

"No matter where we are, or how late we've been up the night before, comes Sunday morning Kel never misses Mass."

"I remember the trip we made back to New York this Fall. We woke up late on Sunday morning. Nevertheless, Kel, who is a regular usher at his own Catholic Church, got on the phone and found out where the nearest church was. We made the 11:15 Mass and then beat it out to the Polo Grounds in time for the game. (Which, incidentally, we both enjoyed because the Rams won.)"

Despite their great friendship and agreement on sports activities in general, there are a few things that Healy and Kelley don't see eye-to-eye on.

"I happen to love horse racing," Jim admits. "But Kel thinks the whole business is pretty silly and useless—though, I will say, he still does a thorough job of reporting on it."

"As long as I can remember, we've had a long debate on no-hitters in baseball. Along with such announcers as Fred Hessler and Red Barber. I think a sportscaster owes it to the public and the players to tell whether a pitcher has a prospective no-hitter. Kelley is not superstitious about it, but he disagrees. He never has, and probably never will give in."

"And if that's the worst thing we ever argue about, I guess we'll both be in business for a long time to come."

Anybody Got Any Ideas?

"Your Hit Parade" continues to confound so-called experts who said it was impossible to present new production numbers for the same song week after week. Not that those behind-scenes haven't had anxious moments.

NBC-TV's "Your Hit Parade" bounces merrily along each week on your channel just as though everything was duck soup. To see the "joie de vivre" on this show you'd never imagine that anybody had any trouble.

Don't kid yourself. The slight matter of working out new ideas for some hit songs that stay on the survey week after week is not a job for the faint-hearted. But somehow that elusive idea is nabbed at just the propitious moment.

Bill Nichols, assistant producer and writer, recently took time to analyze a few of the more prevalent headaches.

Tough Jobs

"I think the toughest job we have ever had was finding new ideas for 'Harbor Lights,'" he said. "This one stayed on for weeks. Our difficulty here was that the specific location, a harbor, was mentioned in the song and so we had to work out routines that could include a harbor-like activity. We staged the song in such ways as a singer in the back of a ferry, a singer in a crow's nest of a ship, a singer on an ocean liner.

"Another difficult song was 'Doggie in the Window.' Again we were trapped by a specific location. With the necessary ingredients of a dog and window you're certainly limited in ways of presentation. For the

same basic reason, 'Little Shoemaker' was difficult and recently we've had our problems with 'Papa Loves Mambo.' What can you do differently with that one?"

The songs used on the show are judged hits by a survey which checks the best sellers in sheet music and phonograph records, the songs most heard on the air and the songs most played on the automatic coin machines. All types of music have found their way to the top—novelty tunes, love ballads, revivals of old favorites, and popular adaptations of musical classics. Raymond Scott, whose orchestra provides the exceptional musical treats, says, "There's no such thing as a trend in popular music. You can't find indications of states of mind, economic or political patterns or anything else. Tastes haven't changed much in the past eighteen years. If it's a good song, people will like it. And if it's romantic and good, they'll love it."

History of "Hit"

"Your Hit Parade" has come a long way since April 20, 1935, when it first went on radio. On that first broadcast Lennie Hayton was leading the orchestra and Gogo DeLys sang the number one song, "Soon." Five years later Barry Wood, Bea Wain, The Hit Paraders, Orrin Tucker, and Bonnie Baker headlined, Mark Warnow conducted, and the top song was "When You Wish Upon a Star." In 1945 Lawrence Tibbett

and Joan Edwards were the featured singers and the first-place song was "Candy." In 1950 Jeff Clark and Eileen Wilson were on hand to sing "If I Knew You Were Comin' I'd've Baked a Cake."

Today the stars are Dorothy Collins, Snooky Lanson, Gisele MacKenzie, and Russ Arms—with The Hit Paraders and Dancers.

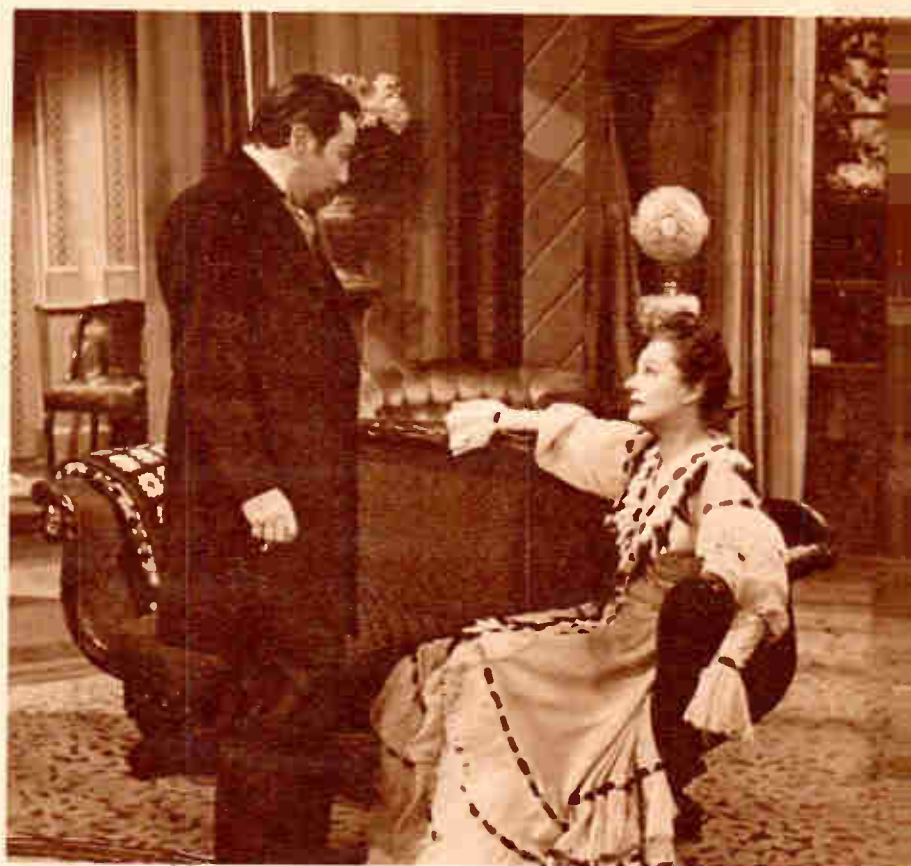
Some people wonder how the "extras" are chosen on the show. These songs are often those that held first place repeatedly in past surveys. In 1938 "A Tisket a Tasket" was the Number One song, so in the Easter show of 1953 the number was repeated as an "extra."

There have been several memorable moments on this show. One of the highlights was the 1952 special telecast from aboard the new U.S.S. United States just before her maiden voyage. This involved the use of nine cameras, miles of TV cables, and a mammoth working crew, but it was a milestone in TV programming. The annual Christmas show is another terrific undertaking. It is staged in part from the TV studio and part from the famous skating rink and promenade of Rockefeller Center.

When you consider what "Your Hit Parade" has accomplished, you are even more amazed at the lack of imagination and ingenuity used by other TV shows without half of the production problems of this NBC-TV stand-out.

The Strength

THERE IS ONE printed line on "U. S. Steel Hour" which in actuality is more important than any of the actors' credits in the hour-long ABC-TV dramatic show.

It reads: "Produced by The Theatre Guild."

All viewers of the award-winning drama see the line, but few realize the immense importance and work behind those five words.

The one person who is the real authority on the subject is Armina Marshall, associate director of The Theatre Guild. It was a cold, wintry day when we visited Miss Marshall in her office, located atop the Theatre Guild building at 25 West Fifty-third Street in uptown Manhattan.

(Incidentally, this building has one of the strangest oddities to be found anywhere in modern civilization. The one and only elevator is cleverly hidden on the main floor and looks more like a closet than what-it's-supposed-to-be. This elevator goes up but doesn't come down! At least it takes passengers up, but for some strange reason which was never fully explained, once you have reached the top, you have to walk down the winding wooden steps. All of which merely disproves the theory that everything which goes up must come down.)

Behind The Guild

What is The Theatre Guild? How did it start, who runs it and what does it have to do with the award-winning "Steel Hour"?

Although TV may indirectly be looked upon as competition for theatre-goers, Miss Marshall doesn't regard it that way. "TV has given new and tremendous opportunities to everyone connected with the theatre. The legitimate theatre as we know it today in America is definitely a luxury. High production costs have proportionately increased ticket prices. People who really want to see a legitimate play will not allow TV or anything else to stop them."

Behind "Steel"

As far as the "Steel Hour" is concerned, The Theatre Guild and its staff members do all of the behind-the-scenes work.

They select the plays. (An endless and sometimes thankless job.) They pick the actors. They arrange the sets, set up schedules, and work with director Alex Segal during the many rehearsals.

In exchange for this, naturally, the sponsor reimburses the Guild for its work. But the Guild has done

Behind "U. S. Steel"

On each "U. S. Steel Hour" telecast, the credit appears: "Produced by The Theatre Guild." Who is behind the Guild? How does it function? What does it mean to the TV industry?

"Actually," Miss Marshall began, "our TV connection with the 'Steel Hour' is an outgrowth of the same association with the United States Steel's radio program, 'The Theatre Guild on the Air.'"

In private life, Miss Marshall is the wife of Lawrence Langer, the founder of The Theatre Guild in 1919 and its director since 1939. Through the years, the Guild has developed and fostered such playwrights as Eugene O'Neill, George Bernard Shaw, Philip Barry, S. N. Behrman, Sidney Howard, Maxwell Anderson, William Saroyan, Robert E. Sherwood, and many others. With the aid of a "subscription" plan, which is the largest in the world, The Theatre Guild is unofficially recognized as "the national theatre of America."

more than just produce plays for TV: it has given the new industry dignity, quality, and years of experience and know-how.

For consistency, the productions on the "U. S. Steel Hour" have been as good as, if not better, than any other dramatic show on television. And The Theatre Guild has been the real strength behind these plays of "Steel."

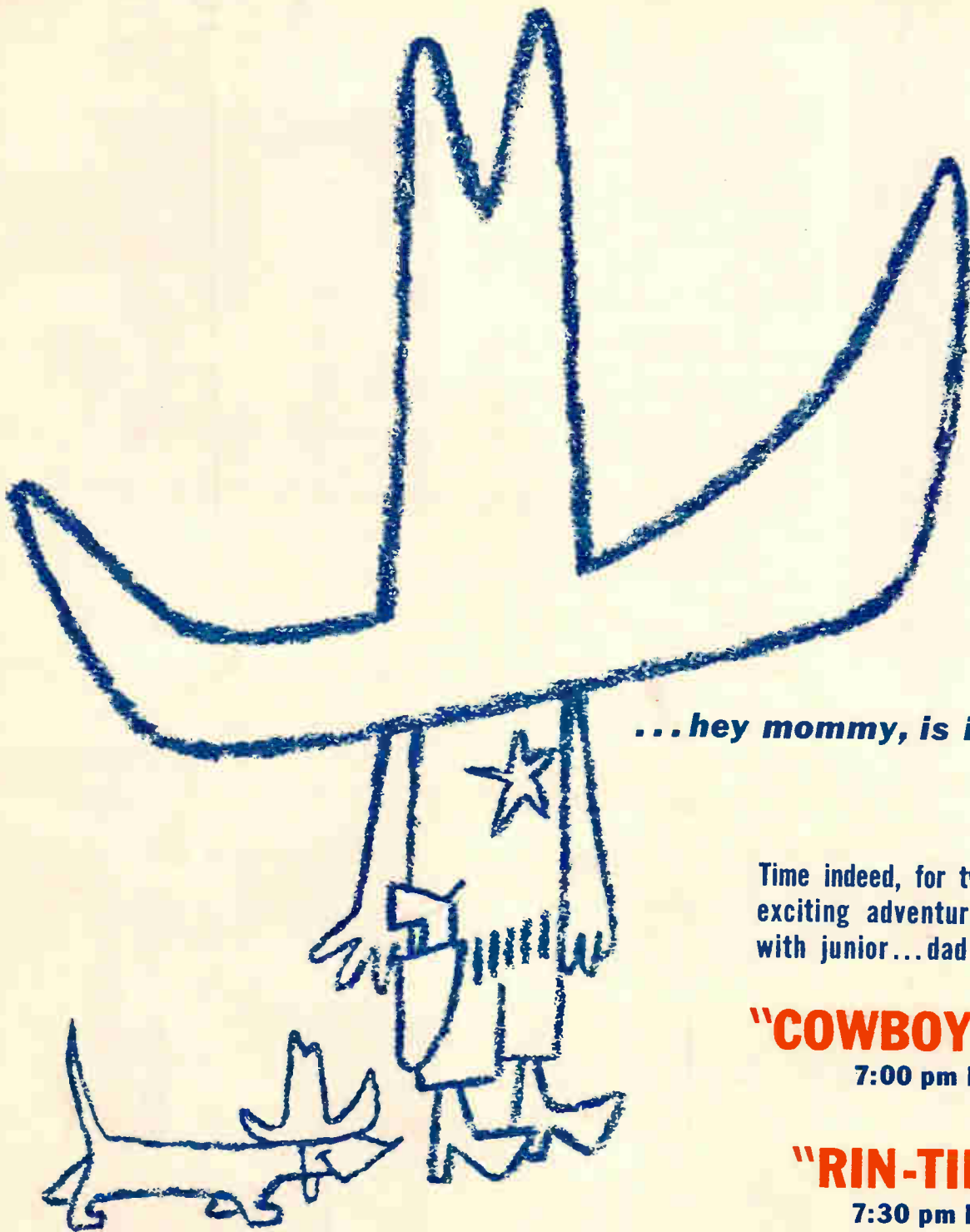
There have been times, however, when a telecast, in the opinion of the critics, "did not live up to expectations."
