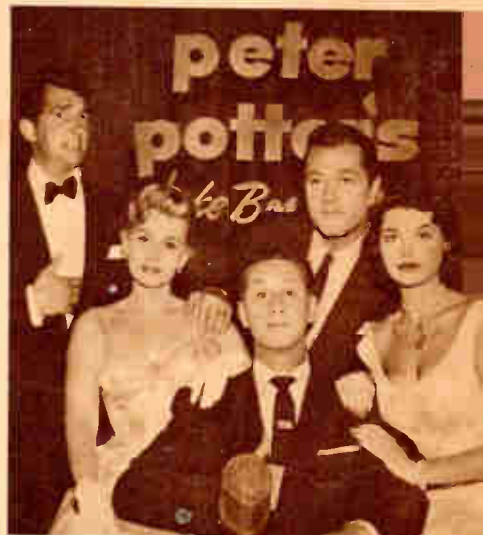

# MEN Had to Like Her

*Fae Thomas' unusual occupation takes her to the four corners of the earth without ever leaving the dark room.*

**F**AE THOMAS travels around the world on films, yet she's never been out of the United States. As the producer of KCOP's *Golden Voyage*, Fae confines her travel to screening 20,000 feet of film a week.

Only five percent of the film submitted is acceptable for *Golden Voyage's* format. Because the show is screened in black and white, Fae must minimize the impact of color footage if the only merit is color and color alone.

Fae deals with adventure-lecturers who have garnered maturity along with their exciting travel film. They know their business and they know it well, but it's difficult for them to conceive that a mere wisp of a young woman would know how to appraise and edit their wonderful film for a television production. Their attitude is one of Fae's greatest obstacles. However, she invariably overcomes the Doubting Thomases.

The fact that Fae, too, knows her business is evidenced by the high praise lavished on the series. Of a more personal victory are the letters she receives from travel-bitten lecturers thanking her warmly for the splendid job she did in editing their films into well-paced half-hour programs. Some of the appreciative letters state that they liked Fae's version so much that they intended to re-edit their lecture film.

Selecting the film, and tactfully convincing the adventurers that certain portions of their film must be deleted is only part of Fae's chores. As producer she must see that all departments involved are kept abreast of developments. Her sense

of organization keeps things rolling smoothly. So smoothly, in fact, that she usually has four shows ready to go ahead of schedule. Just to make sure she doesn't have any time on her hands, Fae also writes the continuity.

On the personal side . . . the petite producer is a theater major of Utah University . . . has worked in radio, ad agencies, written copy and produced teleplays. Her pet gripe is aimed at people who discriminate against women as TV directors and producers. She objects to men who claim women are not emotionally geared to take the pressures of television. But Fae is grateful to Jack Douglas for giving her an opportunity to prove that the fair sex can hold its own in a competitive field.

Jack is reasonably demanding. But after first working with him on *I Search for Adventure* and carefully studying his approach and ideas on subjects, Fae now finds that she can

think the way he does about film editing . . . what makes an exciting, fast moving telefilm. She knows how to avoid the pitfalls of meaningless footage and thus can tighten a 90-minute film into 21 minutes of interesting viewing.

The bachelor girl calls herself a lazy writer and an avid reader of murder mysteries. She describes Mr. Right as a man with intelligence, sense of humor, vitality and an awareness of everything in life. A pretty tall order, but after meeting Fae Thomas there's no doubt that she's a gal who gets what she wants.

She hopes one day to leave the dark room and really travel. Yes, she has the bug and of all the countries she's seen on film the one place that has priority above everything else is Italy, because it is a composite of many things. And you can bet when Fae takes to flight she'll keep a 16mm camera busy shooting footage for *Golden Voyage*.

# HOW THIS SHOW *Beat* *Dragnet*

*It's taken a long time, and a lot of people, but CBS-TV's Climax! is now on an equal footing with the shows it opposes—such as Dragnet—and in many cases, has even surpassed ALL competition.*

**I**N TELEVISION, as in baseball, it's tough to have two strikes against you. And that's exactly the situation KNXT's Climax! found itself in after being on the air for only a few short months back in 1954.

The first strike was a strong pitch by the unpoetic name of Justice. That was the name of the high-rated NBC-TV show which came on the same time as Climax! (Thursday nights at 8:30 p.m.) It was even rougher than that: the windup came with Groucho Marx at 8:00 p.m.; the pitch was Justice; and the follow-through came with Jack Webb's Dragnet at 9:00 which cut the hour-long Climax! right in half. The Marx, Justice (now Jackie Cooper on The People's Choice), Webb combination was, and still is, one of TV's outstanding hour and a half blocks.

The second strike thrown at Climax! was its own fault. The high-budgeted, much-publicized hour-long drama got off to a disappointing start. Other shows and sponsors might have been happy with the results, but CBS-TV and the Chrysler Corporation (the sponsor) were not. They didn't want a good show; they wanted a great one.

On the basis of current ratings, Climax! has become exactly that—a great TV show.

The third strike never came. Instead, Climax! clouted hit after hit, and is still swinging away with an amazingly high TV batting average.

#### Tide Turns

How did it happen? Why did it happen? When did it happen?

In an operation as complex as Cli-

max! it is inevitable that there are innumerable hows, whys and whens. If one particular day, however, had to be pinpointed it would probably be on the occasion when President L. L. "Tex" Colbert was chatting with Bill Lundigan, host of Climax! and the only "star" who is featured each week on the program.

The show was still in its infancy and the prospects for the year 1955 were being discussed.

Emphatically, President Colbert exclaimed, "1955 is going to be a

crucial year for us, Bill. We've got to do business, big business. If we don't succeed in 1955, it may be the beginning of the end."

Naturally, the first job that must be done in any business is selling. And what better means could Chrysler use than through television—the most powerful advertising medium in the United States today—and through its two big shows, Climax! and The Shower of Stars!

That was the beginning—the go-ahead sign from the Big Boss himself. The beginning, not of the end, but a year of amazing sales and TV successes.

The Big Three of Chrysler—President Colbert, along with Vice-President James Cope and advertising Veepee Charles Jacobsen—spearheaded an all-out promotional campaign.

The bills were high—but the results paid off. Within the first three months of 1955, Chrysler Corporation had sold more cars than in the entire previous year of 1954.

Climax! and The Shower of Stars were instrumental in setting this and subsequent records. Many men were responsible for the rise of Climax! as one of TV's top shows.

First there was the "middleman" in the set-up—Al Scalpone of CBS-TV—who convinced Chrysler that Climax! could do the job for them.

A new producer, Martin Manulis, was assigned to the CBS-TV dramatic show. Time and experience have proven that money alone is not enough to assure a success in television. Climax! was and still is one of the highest-budgeted programs on the air—\$45,000 to \$60,000 a week. And sometimes, especially if it's a colorcast, the total figure runs even



higher. Manulis, however, was the man who made the dollars and cents pay off. He was responsible for the selection of story material; for the selection of the big-name stars who appear each week on Climax!; and in the final analysis for the upsurge of Climax's! popularity. Even when Edgar Petersen filled in for Manulis during the summer of 1955—and did such a wonderful job in surpassing Dragnet in the ratings—it was Manulis who was the guiding light.

Of course, the greatest producer in the world wouldn't last very long without his right-hand man—the director. This function on Climax! has been ably handled on alternate weeks by Allan Reisner and John Frankenheimer, two of the best in the business.

Climax! also has a unique situation in that Director Bud Cole handles the Chrysler commercials each and every week. The emphasis on well-directed and well-planned commercials is probably the main reason that the Climax! "pitches" have received so much favorable comment.

#### Bill Lundigan

The other reason, of course, is Bill Lundigan himself, who serves the double function of host and pitchman.

A former movie star (whose career was interrupted by his World War II service as a Marine combat photographer) Lundigan has one of the most unusual and best set-ups in the entire TV industry. In addition to his on-camera activities, Bill acts as an ambassador of good-will for Chrysler. Unlike most TV performers, he is employed directly by the sponsor. Each week finds him galavanting around the country attending meetings and special functions of the various Chrysler dealers.

Bill is also active behind-the-Climax!-scene. He reads and offers suggestions on each and every script. Each week the Climax! cast features some of the biggest names in the dramatic world. But Bill is the only "regular." He definitely intends to star in one of the shows someday, but he is looking for just the right part. Mainly known for his light comedy roles in the movies, he considers his acting in the 1947 production of "I Climb the Highest Mountain" as his best work. He would like at least to equal that performance when he does a Climax!

Although during our interview with Bill he was too modest to take any credit for Climax's! success, there's little doubt in anyone's mind (particularly the sponsor's) of the important role he has played. "I think you might also include a little thing called 'luck,'" Bill commented. "Greatness by a man, nation, or institution has never been achieved without a certain amount of that commodity.

"Of course, now that we've done the top job we thought we could do," Bill continued, "the most difficult thing of all is to hold it."

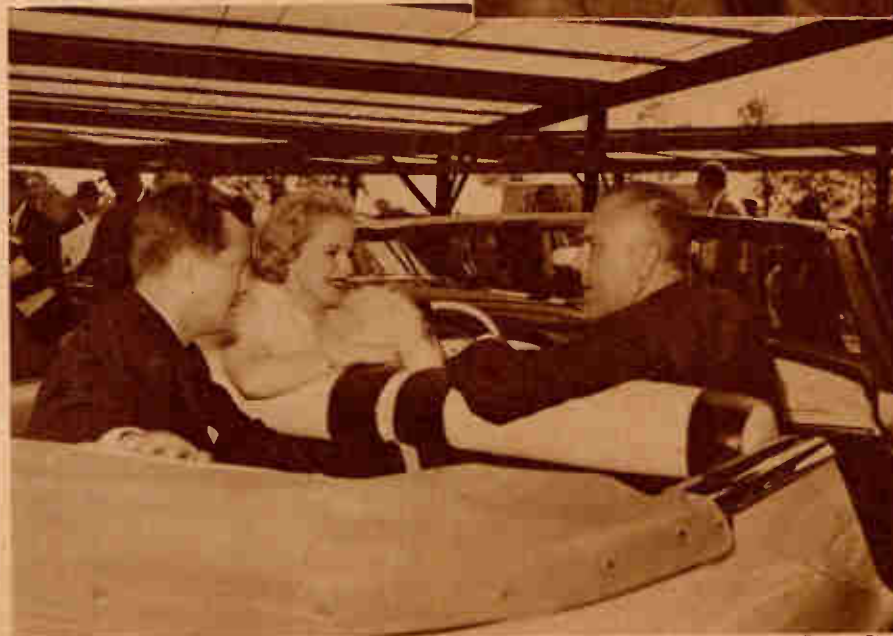
He was smiling confidently when he said it.

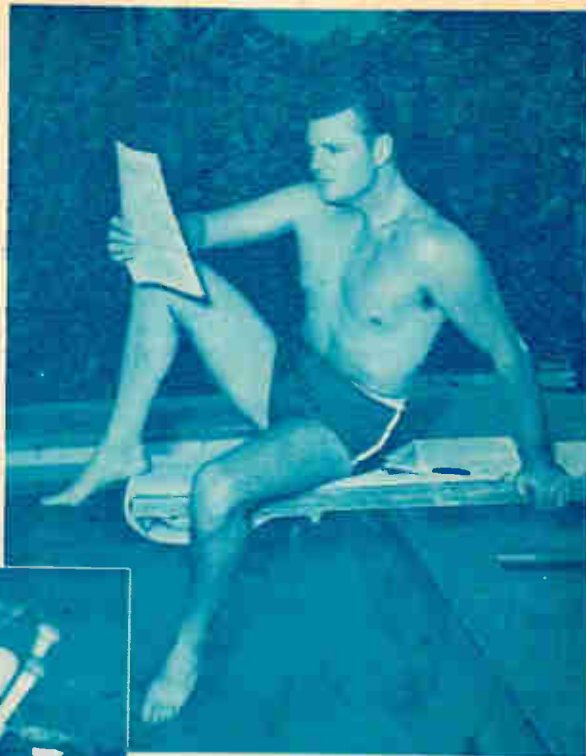


**PRESIDENT COLBERT** (front seat) discusses future plans with Bill Lundigan and Mary Coster, both of whom handle the Chrysler commercials

## 'Don't Tempt Me'



THE SWIMMING POOL is a good place to relax and rehearse one's musical numbers. KABC's young baritone almost became a professional boxer but show business held the winning card.

**K**EEP YOUR EYE on Bill Hamilton. He's a triple-threat man. You never know whether he's going to turn up on KABC's microphones, the baseball diamond or in the ring.

Over the years, Bill has been tempted by three careers with promise of success in all three of them. The rugged 6'3" San Franciscan frequently demonstrated his right upper cut technique when he was aboard the troop transport USS Admiral Eberly. Bill prefers to play his fistic career down and almost apologetically comments: "Although I held the title through eight bouts, I never quite felt like a champ. You see, I fought the same guy eight times. He was the only other heavy-weight aboard besides me. You know, after our first four fights, they used to say my long-suffering opponent collapsed at the mere sight of me.

"For a while I considered making boxing my profession, but decided that such aspirations would be in-

consistent with my musical ambitions. I had studied sax and clarinet since I was a kid and I had always hoped that one day I would follow in the show biz footsteps of my parents.

"Forsaking boxing, I devoted my athletic energies to week-end baseball. One Sunday, during a ball game in Pasadena, I was spotted by a scout for the Seattle Rainiers who asked me to train with the team. Once again I was almost tempted to pursue an athletic career. I thought of the lay-off between seasons and the constant stream of guys who are always competing for your job. I was betwixt and between when I got an unexpected phone call from my former chief petty officer, Jimmy Grier, asking me if I would like to join his band at the Biltmore.

"That did it. From then on there was no deviating. After the Grier booking I played sax for Frank DeVol at the Palladium. Frank gave me an opportunity to render a few vocals. And I must admit I enjoyed fronting

the band with a ballad or two. I started to concentrate on vocal spots from then on and I did a regular singing stint with Betty White on her network TV show.

"Last spring I made my debut as a singer on my very own show, *Make Mine Romance*. It's the answer to all my career floundering. It's music, live music, and the format of my program permits me to sing five or six consecutive numbers without interruption. The commercial copy is tagged at the opening and closing of the program. It's great. It's just what I've always wanted. I don't think I'll ever be tempted to become a professional athlete again, although I'll always continue to be a Sunday ballplayer and a regular visitor to the local gym.

"Just to keep my feet firmly cemented in this radio business I play sax with Rex Koury's ABC stereophonic orchestra because you never know when there'll be a demand for singers who can double on alto, clarinet and flute."

## Second Glances (Critical Comment)

### Point With Pride

. . . to Jack Benny's amusing interview with Red Sanders and Duffy Daugherty. The coaches and comic worked up a cute routine. Jack's revival of the old timer radio skit was a nostalgic bit of yesterday and gave many televiewers an insight to the old radio days.

. . . to NBC's Happy New Year spec generally and particularly to Barbara Ann Scott's graceful skating sequence. Despite the fact that the dialogue was pre-recorded the distraction was overlooked by the agility of the skaters. And the amusing film of the English Christmas poem *On The Twelfth Night* was sheer but delightful nonsense.

### View With Alarm

. . . to the over abundant commercials on the NBC coverage of the *Rose Parade*. The group who saw the coverage in NBC's color studio were victims of their host and unable to switch to another channel. Aside from the gross commercialism the coverage itself was inadequate. Coordination between passing floats and their description missed at several points in the parade. The fact that the parade was being televised in color meant very little to viewers who were disappointed by poor camera angles and too frequent commercials.

Reports from others who were not strapped to Channel 4 say that KTLA did a bang up job of covering the *Rose Parade*. Understand it was due to the fact that KTLA covered the parade twice, from two different locations along the parade route. They were stationed three-fourths of the way down the line of parade and at the terminal point. The floats were slower paced at these locations than they were at the beginning of the line of march thus enabling Channel 5 to obtain far better camera angles. Those who saw KTLA's coverage in color report that it was very pleasing. One more thing about a local station's coverage—Channel 5 did not overdue the commercial bit. Congratulations KTLA you outdid the nets.

But in the final analysis, the station which garnered the largest viewing audience, and without the benefit of color, was KTTV, which averaged a 21.0 rating.

# Lifelines

**THOUGH SHE'S LOVING EVERY MINUTE** working with her good friend, Noel Coward, in the CBS-TV production of "Blithe Spirit," Lauren Bacall is Nervous. "What if I should make a mistake—in front of 30 million people!" she worried when I lunched briefly with her last week.

**MISS BACALL, WHO ADMITS** she's a "quick study," isn't nervous about only remembering her lines, her stage movements, how she looks. "Let the cameraman worry about my appearance," she drawled. Her apprehension is about coordinating all her responsibilities. Since the showbusiness saying is that an actor really has something to worry about when he no longer worries about doing his best, it would appear that Miss Bacall's anxiety is healthy.

**PLAYING THE ROLE OF NOEL COWARD'S** first wife who returns from the spirit world to liven things up, (Claudette Colbert plays Wife No. 2) Miss Bacall will be a literal vision

in gray. Her Don Loper dress will be a sophisticated gown of gray chiffon, her face and arms will be covered with greenish-gray make-up, only her lips and finger nails will be colorful red.

**THIS "BLITHE SPIRIT" PRODUCTION** will have been in rehearsal for almost three weeks by the time the TV cameras move in for the telecast. For the first time in TV history, a preview of the show will be held on Thursday preceding the program—there'll be a live audience (not the press)—at which a kinescope will be made so that Coward and his cast may see themselves as others will on the actual telecast. Why no one has ever done this before is a TV mystery, but one reason Coward is using the kinescope procedure is that he is directing his play as well as playing the principal character, so the film record of the presentation will enable him to appraise the rehearsal results of his dual activity.

**HUMPHREY BOGART, MISS BACALL'S HUSBAND,** plans to view the production on his home TV set. "He's asked in a bunch of friends," Mrs. Bogart shrugged.

**THE BOGARTS WATCH TV JUST LIKE** any other family—nighttime TV, that is. At mention of daytime video, Miss Bacall made protesting noises. All of it is pretty dull, she thinks, except for "Alistaire's program"—Omnibus, to you. The Bogarts usually have dinner on trays in the library where "we are glued to the set" (they have color). Mrs. Bogart is of the hopeful opinion that there is some good TV stuff to be seen at night and that TV is improving all the time. One thing she doesn't go for is quiz shows.

**DOING A REGULAR TV SHOW,** she claims, is not her meat. She's a picture actress first and last. A good TV appearance can enhance one's stock as a movie star, she's well aware, but a not-so-good whirl at TV can really hurt. Pick and choose your roles, prepare carefully for your TV stint, and worry about coming off with flying colors seems to be Miss Bacall's formula for video. If she doesn't do every-thing exactly right on "Blithe Spirit," she'll be unhappy, but when she gets home after facing the cameras, Mr. Bogart will be waiting to praise or comfort. What's done is done and move on to the next thing, is his philosophy. Personally, I don't think "Bogey" will be called upon to offer his shoulder for crying on. His "Baby" will make a great little ghost.

**NICE LETTER FROM WRITER Milton Geiger** tells me that his Benedict Arnold script is on **You Are There** on

Sunday, January 15. Milton is pretty excited about this one. His radio and now his TV plays are in seven high school textbooks. . . . **Edgar Bergen** appears to have a hit in **Do You Trust Your Wife?** **Jim Morgan,** show director who was formerly with **Queen for a Day,** told me at luncheon that he'd be happy if Wife picked up 50 per cent of \$64,000 **Question's** audience (it follows this program everywhere in the country). Incidentally, Mrs. Hickey, the winsome wife on the first show and mother of 11, expects her twelfth. A lot of the success of this new quizzer will depend on the quality of contestants. They've had a hard time getting good ones for films made prior to the program's debut, but expect plenty of mail once the show has become established. Here's a chance for a qualifying TV-Radio Life couple to submit their bid!

**ONE SPONSOR DIDN'T MAKE MANY** friends by loading the Pasadena parade telecast with commercials. "I won't buy any more Minute Maid!" I heard one lady exclaim when the third commercial barged in right at the start of the proceedings. I found audio plugs, which didn't kick the parade picture off the screen, much easier to take than those fading the picture. . . . **Durante and Jackson** certainly paid a clever but tender tribute to the dancing feet of ex-partner **Lou Clayton** on the **Texaco Show.** . . . Congratulations to **John Daly** who has never missed a **What's My Line** show and to the show itself upon soon entering its seventh year. Panel, so we were told, has batted 75 per cent right. It takes 94 persons to put on the telecast!

Too, too long has the lovely music written by Edvard Grieg for string orchestra been overlooked—and MGM Records is to be commended on its long-playing album of Grieg's complete works for this scoring. As interpreted by The Arthur Winograd String Orchestra, this is the true music of the great Norwegian composer along folklore lines, and while all may not be familiar themes, these selections for string orchestra provide nearly an hour of the most melodic and sincere listening pleasure yet available on this label.

In the vocal field, particularly outstanding are those by Lillian Roth (Epic) and Julie London (Liberty). Miss Roth's selections comprise those featured in her film biography, "I'll Cry Tomorrow." These are all old favorites she introduced years ago and, tied together with her own narration, provide a nostalgic journey to yesterday that will be a welcome addition to any library. Julie London's album, on the other hand, is in entirely different mood. To the accompaniment of guitar and bass, Julie sings with her heart in her voice; not loud, not showy, but in tune and very sincere. This is an intimate voice—one that you'll like to hear again and again. Some will call it song-selling; you'll say it's one of the easiest to listen to.

"New Solos by an Old Master" (Riv-erside) very aptly describes Joe Sullivan's pianistic LP of a round dozen favorites, half of them his own great solos that have become jazz classics with the years. Joe's style is still the one that sparked early recordings with Nichols, Goodman and the Bob Crosby bands; it can be raucous, swinging, barrelhouse or symphonic . . . but it's still the one and only Joe Sullivan. "Jazz for Tonight" (Coral) features selections from an after-hours jam session in a private home, with Steve Allen (pianist) joining Shavers, Hinton, D'Amico and others in a brand of quiet jazz that's a delight to the ear . . . it swings . . . it's quiet . . . it has a beat . . . and it's understandable

Well, about this time war breaks out, and she has to go home to her family and he has to go to war and he is killed and the lovers don't get to be together and that's a hell of a love story, don't you think?

"The Man Between." (5) Jan. 15, 7:30. Director Carol Reed has been responsible for some very good suspense pictures ("The Third Man," "The Fallen Idol") and here is another example of his work. It has a rather involved plot that doesn't really matter, because it is in the atmosphere and the characters that the viewer feels the realism and danger, but I'll tell you a little of it, anyway. "Sound of Fury." (9) Beginning Jan. 17, 9:00. Originally titled, "Try and Get Me," when first released, this is another film that is better than average. It is an investigation of the personality of mob violence and tells its story with little compromise and quite a lot of intelligence. Returned war veteran Frank Lovejoy is broke, can't get a job and falls in with professional hoodlum Lloyd Bridges in a scheme to kidnap a rich boy. There is a murder, the men are captured and a mob decides to lynch them. Richard Carlson plays a reporter who witnesses the growth of this stupidity and cruelty and tries to do something about it. The three featured players give performances that are a little better than is their wont and the result is a gripping unpretentious melodrama.

"Blackout." (13) Jan. 17, 8:30. If you can believe it, this is another English picture in which the American, Dane Clark, is framed for murder and has to find the real culprits in order to clear himself. This plot is identical with at least six other films that utilized the talents(?) of American actors a few years ago. Dane gets drunk, is offered five hundred lbs. to marry a girl, and wakes up the next morning and can't remember a thing, finds corpses all around him . . . go on from there. Dane is not great in this one.

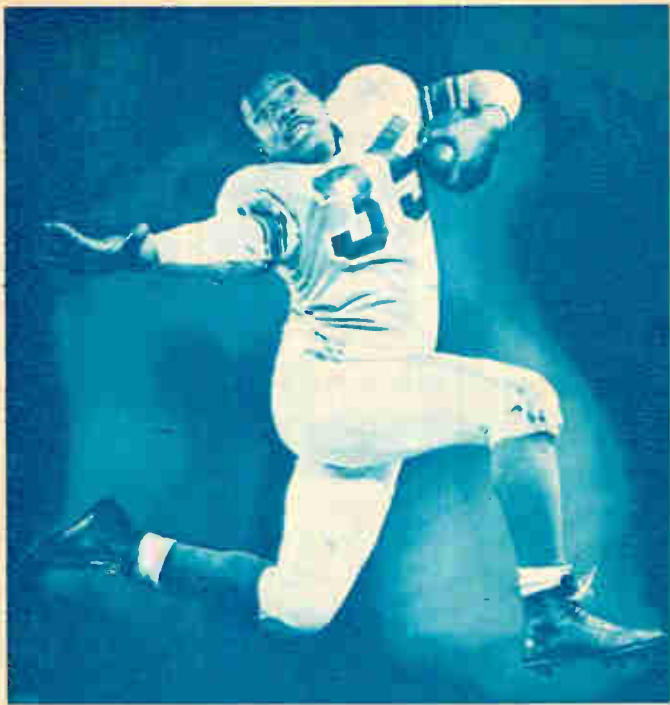

# HOW THEY PRE-TEST STUNTS FOR

## Beat the Clock

*Show's "idea men" reveal backstage "rehearsals" before acts pass muster.*

**F**OR A LONG time the standard prop for a certain type stunt on Beat the Clock was an expensive (90-cent) cream pie. Frank Wayne and Bob Howell, the show's idea men, decided to cut financial corners and use a cheaper prop: pieces of bread covered with whipped cream and apple butter. When the time came to use the new concoction, Bud Collyer explained the substitution to the audience. Right away the complaints rolled in.

"People didn't think we should use the 'staff of life' in this manner," Frank said wryly. "They didn't object to the apple butter and the whipped cream; they just didn't want us to use bread—at two cents a slice—in place of a very costly pie."

Otherwise, Beat the Clock seldom registers any beefs on the stunts and so far as the contestants themselves are concerned, the show in Frank and Bob's memory has never had a disgruntled participant. "No hurts, no one messed up, no one embarrassed," summarized Bob.

Howell, who has been dreaming up stunts for six years, and Frank, who has five years to his credit, used to submit twenty ideas weekly. Now they think up ten. "We're not running dry," they claim. "Our mortality is less. Now we're able to conceive things which are more possible—more feasible."

### Have To Be Right

The ideal stunt is one on which a contestant fumbles a few times and then succeeds. An occasional loss is considered to "add ginger" to the show, but too many losses are seriously avoided because the audience would naturally lose interest. To provide stunts which are a little tough but not too rough is then the big problem.

Here's how they do it: Bob and Frank submit their ten ideas each and CBS-TV fills the orders for props. On Thursday preceding the show the stunts are tested in Liederkranz Hall, where two men and two women "make like" contestants. Actually these people are actors drawn from what Frank calls "our family of stand-ins"—twenty-five to thirty persons who constitute Beat the Clock's "guinea pig" section. They are the type quick to catch on but they possess no more than a contestant's normal ability.

Sometimes the tests show a stunt to be too difficult. Then a way to ease it is formed. Likely as not the stunt may be too easy and another element must be introduced to make it qualify. Often Bob and Frank rush to the rescue when the actors can't get the hang of a trick. They are pretty good at pre-testing their own stuff.

"Frank is the mechanical type," comments Bob. "He comes up with Rube Goldberg stuff. I think up funny positions. We have a limited budget, so all our stunts must be simple. An expensive prop, for us, is anything that costs \$100. Besides being a good stunt, we have to think of it in terms of re-using the prop."

### Pick Best

Out of the 20 stunts submitted for a program, only seven will be sifted for the telecast. Then there is a stand-by stunt for each of the seven. On the average, one stunt of the seven is apt to be tossed out at the last minute, usually because when stunts are viewed as a complete show there may be two stunts too similar.

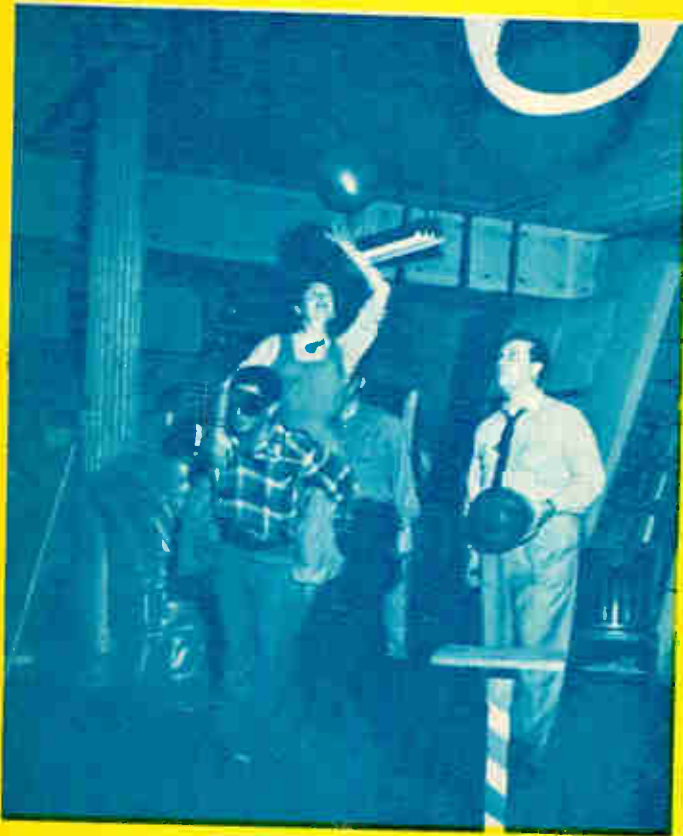
Also, when Saturday rehearsal comes and a different set of actors

is brought in to do the final stunt-testing, a stunt which played beautifully on Thursday may not look even slightly amusing with another pair of test-contestants. Then again, a prop is apt to go bad at the last moment and some stunt reshuffling has to be accomplished in a hurry.

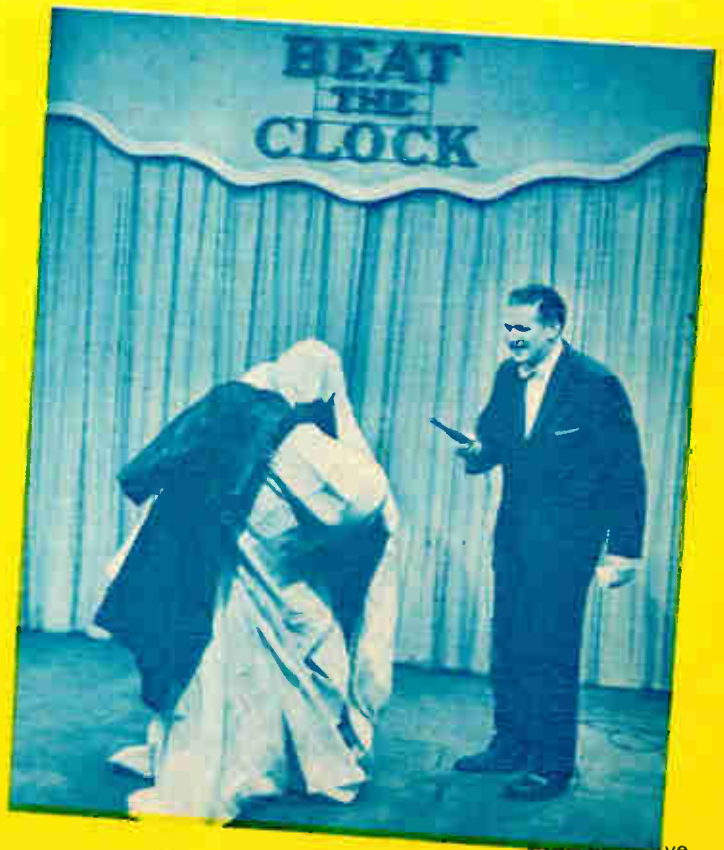
In Bob and Frank's thinking, the stunts fall into categories like "balloon," "elastic," "screen door," and so on. The screen door type has the element of something happening out of the contestant's control in addition to the clock deadline—like a door slowly closing while a participant tries to accomplish an objective in time to beat the clock and get through the door before it shuts in his face. Bob and Frank consider this type of stunt to have clicked if during the course of its playing the collective audience lets out six or seven loud screams. In the final analysis, a stunt can't pass muster in the testing stage if it (1) is practically impossible to do (2) is dull to watch (3) is in bad taste.

On the average, feminine participants are not as avile as men. Nor do they appear to think as well on their feet. Frank, who always does the show's warm-up, picks the contestants right out of the audience. "I have an insurmountable amount of luck," he claims. "Usually I can judge from a person's talk how well he or she will respond. My basis for picking is they should look presentable and look as if they want to have fun."

Now and then Frank really picks a dilly of a contestant—someone who can solve in nothing flat a trick which should have taken three minutes. "In that case," the idea men shudder, "we stand backstage with egg dripping off our faces."

# Your Life

## IS UP TO YOU

**L**IFE Is What You Make It, the new KNXT show, could be considered a tearful display of human woes and misery. But it differs from such tear jerkers because it proves that a person can build a new and better life in spite of bad breaks and unhappiness. As such it has its inspirational value.

It is also different in that the idea for the show was born in the mind of a sponsor. Mr. M. Mitchell of King's Men products thought up the show. He then called Al Burton about the idea and Al was handed the producing reins. Louise O'Brien and Bobby Sargent were shortly thereafter set for the musical portion of the show.

Life Is What You Make It doesn't concentrate just on the experiences of people who have built themselves new lives. It tells their stories, yes, but there is decided emphasis on entertainment. When someone from show business is on the program, he usually winds up his story by either re-enacting a phase of his life or by entertaining in some way.

### Celebrities

"We've had some fascinating people on already," Al Burton remarked one day. "One of the most interesting was George Burton of Burton's Birds—you know, the birds that appeared for so long in Ken Murray's 'Black-outs' and were also in 'Bill and Co.' George used to be a bronco buster but a horse threw him, his back was broken and one vertebra completely severed.

"He was, for all intents and purposes, an invalid for life but his wife told him how much he had to live for. One day she brought home a couple of little love birds. He became interested in them and soon taught them to land on his finger and other tricks. One morning one of the birds fell on the floor and

Burton involuntarily made a move out of his bed to pick it up. It was then that he discovered he could move his legs. Today, he has made a career out of his birds. He gets around as well as anyone, and yet the vertebra in his back is still severed. Medical science doesn't know how he is able to get about. He claims he owes his recovery to the birds who helped him to regain the use of his muscles.

"Eben Ahbez, the composer of 'Nature Boy,' is another who appeared voluntarily on our show. Incidentally, all of our guests ask to appear. He was born in Brooklyn and had never seen a tree. When he got older he reasoned there had to be better places in the world—places where a bit of nature could rub off. He decided to walk to California. Like all young men he dreamed of riches, of beautiful scen-

ery, but at this stage in his life he had no money at all. To save money on haircuts he let his hair grow long. That has since become a trademark. He got a job first as a fruit picker and one day in his ramshackle room he found a book which included a poem called 'God of Nature.' It expressed exactly how he felt. Then, while lying in the hammock near his room, the song 'Nature Boy,' came to him. It was the change in his whole life."

### Mail

Several people have written in to say that Life Is What You Make It inspired them to go on. One man was on the verge of suicide and hearing one show made him realize that there was something to live for. Another man told of an experience he had. He was working for an insurance company and was about to lose his job because he hadn't sold enough. One day he read a story which preached the philosophy of doing for others without thinking of any personal award. He started practicing this. He met a 19-year-old kid who was starving, brought him into his home, and also helped get the boy a job in an aircraft company. While at the house, the fellow invented a gadget for use in planes, and to help him sell the invention he asked his benefactor to go with him to see the president of the company for which he worked. The man went along, the boy sold the invention, and the man himself sold a million dollars worth of insurance to the president. Since that time, he has sold so much insurance he is riding on easy street.

"We figure that if we are helping people to this extent," Burton remarked quietly, "we have nothing to worry about. We are proud that we are able to do good—if only in small ways. That gives our show a real purpose."

# Playwrights '56

## ... A BIG GAMBLE?

FRED COE was formerly with Producers' Showcase where he worked with Mary Martin on the memorable "Peter Pan." He is now head man of NBC-KRCA's Playwrights '56.

**F**RED COE really gets around.

This man with the young ideas and with the sporty crew cut has sparked the progress of such shows as TV Playhouse, Producers' Showcase, and now he's actively engaged in another dramatic offering titled Playwrights '56.

Coe has seen TV dramas come and go. Many of the formulas now accepted in TV drama originated first in the alert and imaginative mind of Fred Coe. He isn't the type of man to embark on another kind of show unless he believes it could in some way be different and challenging. He feels Playwrights '56 is just that—another step ahead in a field that had suddenly become bogged down in pat formulas.

Fred was sitting in his office in New York. On the 28th floor it looked over the magnificent skyline. He had just finished a conference with a writer and was eager to talk about his new "baby."

### New Concept

"Playwrights '56 is an outgrowth of many things in TV drama," he began earnestly. "I hope to take the basic feelings of the old TV Playhouse when the emphasis was on the writer, but I want to give that writer better tools with which to work. We're not trying to be a spectacular, but we are trying to breathe new life into dramatic anthologies. We have a healthy budget, a patient sponsor, and most of the things money can buy so we're not feeling too much pain.

"We are definitely out to give broader scope to drama. The old Playhouse got to be known as closet dramas where many famous plays

were done. They were called closet dramas because they were produced in small studios. Our plays originate in the big color studios in Brooklyn and we also use, at times, the facilities in Hollywood when we occasionally do shows from the West Coast. That, I believe, is one of the big differences between Playwrights and other such productions. We can produce in Hollywood as well as in New York—and we are thus able to use stars in Hollywood without their having to come to New York.

"Yet, we are still aiming for creative results, but coupled with more production. We are doing off-beat things too, such as our dramatization of a segment of William Faulkner's book, 'Sound and the Fury.' 'The Battlers' was another different kind of show to do.

"I guess, for want of a better definition, we are trying to reach a happy medium between the spectacular and the hour-long drama." Fred was alert to the fact that TV dramas had somehow lost part of their distinction. And he had a good answer for such a development.

"The great problem of TV drama is to keep from looking like every other show," he stated. "It's not easy to find ways to get an audience without gimmicking yourself. We have no gimmicks. We are instead concentrating on the primary requisite to all good dramas—top writers.

"We are experimenting in some ways but we are not as experimental as we used to be on the Playhouse. The experiences on that show taught me a lot. And because of what I learned I hope to be less formulaized, to give more movement, to be more energizing.

"We are fortunate in one way in that we have more time to do our shows since we're on every other week. And working occasionally in Hollywood is another stimulant."

From listening to Fred, you got the impression that Playwrights '56 was to be a further development of the principles of the Playhouse. He pointed out the fine things that show had done, the many great talents it had introduced. Actresses and actors like Kim Stanley, Rod Steiger, Eva Marie Saint got their first breaks on the Playhouse. Writers like Paddy Chayefsky, Horton Foote, and directors such as Delbert Mann found their entry into wider areas of fame.

"When we took on Producers' Showcase, many of these people moved to the Showcase," Fred continued. "Since we were adapting established plays on this show, there wasn't the same chance for the artists to be creative but it gave the writers and the directors opportunities to broaden their field—the writers by adapting properties and the directors by interpreting established plays.

"Playwrights '56 is somewhere in between the Playhouse and Showcase. We can be creative in a new property written for TV or in a property designed for TV. We marry all that to more production. We hope, thereby, to give TV audiences a new and a more exciting concept in TV drama. Who can say at this point if we have succeeded?"

In short, Fred Coe, after all of his experiences, is still looking for something new to try. It is creative minds like his that will keep TV drama from falling into a rut of mediocrity.
