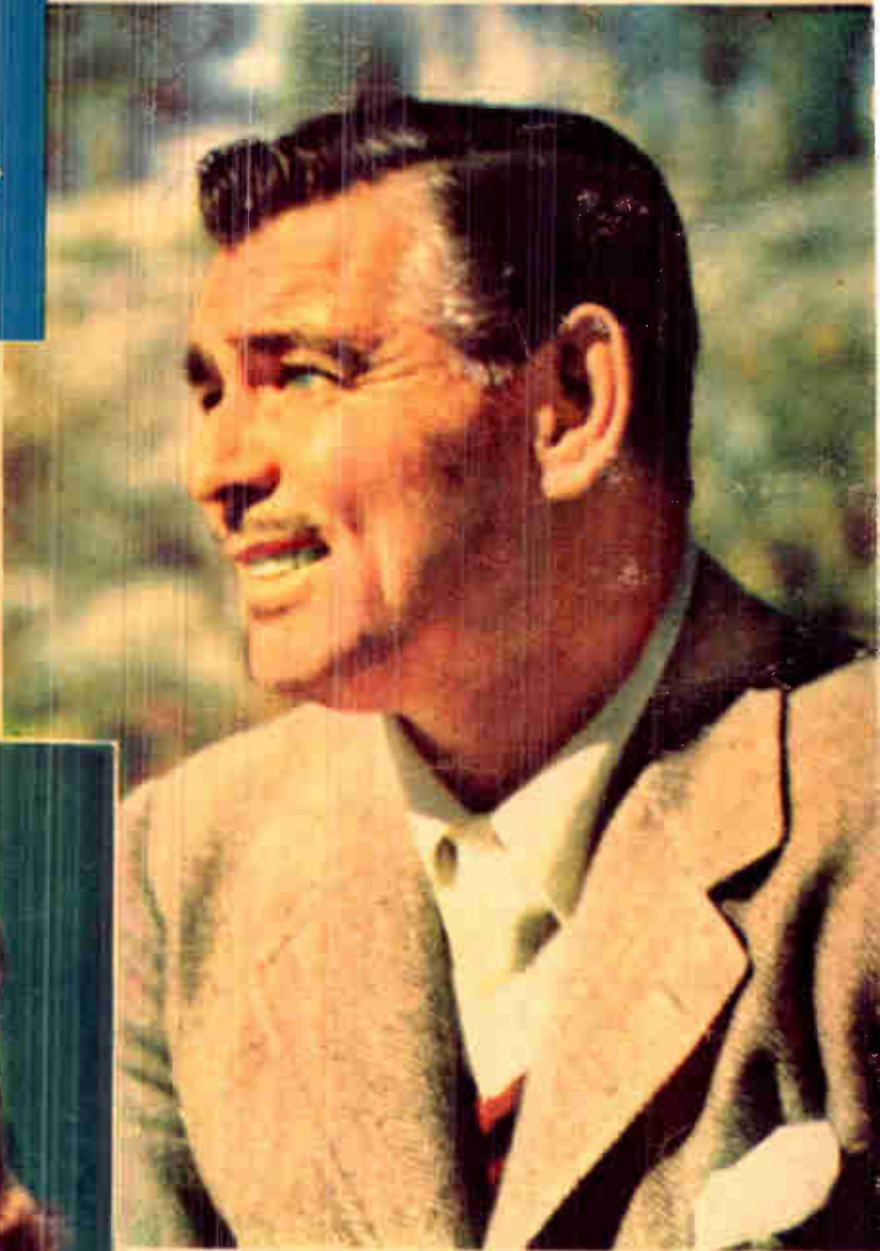

# YOU WON'T LIKE HIM

# ... at First!

Hollywood's newest deejay, Bob Crane, comes to KNX with a reputation to live down . . . and up to.

**G**ET the bum out of town—that's always their first reaction," says Bob Crane of his listening audience. "But I've been fortunate that the station management has always countered with 'Give the guy a chance.'"

Bob comes to Hollywood and Station KNX to replace Ralph Story with a reputation for zany gimmicks and weird sound tracks. And, what should endear him to sponsors, he is the only surviving announcer who has ever incorporated 11 separate commercials into a 15-minute program.

"It's hard to describe the show in words," he comments. "You have to hear it to understand it. I don't say to appreciate it—just to understand it. The thing is, I kid the sponsors, but I make myself the foil.

"For instance, I had one bit where I was doing a commercial, overdoing it . . . on and on and on. Then I had a sound track cut in with 'Aw, shuddup!' The argument then was between me and the sound track.

#### Imitated

"However, I had to give up that particular routine because the youngsters were imitating it at home. The parents had a legitimate beef, so I have had to give some thought to the things that kids might pick up and use at the wrong time."

Bob took his first radio job at Station WLEA in Hornell, N. Y., after playing drums professionally with the orchestras of Billy Butterfield, Eddie Sefranski and Larry Fotine, as well as with the Connecticut Symphony Orchestra.

"I had finally married the girl I had been going with since she was 13," he recounts, "and I thought it was time to settle down in one place.

"Of course, it took me three years to get the job. But I had built up plenty of experience through auditions. I was thrown out of some of the finest radio stations in the East. They all said my voice wasn't right.

"I found out later that I was hired

at Hornell because it was a small town and I was the only hick-town boy among the five finalists. They thought I'd be happier there.

#### Fired Everybody

"The first week after I got the job, they fired everybody. I don't think I had anything to do with it. It was just that they didn't like everybody, and I guess the only reason I was kept on was I had a charming face.

"It was there that the idea began, I guess, for the zany stuff. The first one was on a Borden commercial and I had a 'moo' come in at various times.

"Later at WBIS in Bristol, Conn., I started the sound effects. Thinking back now, I realize it was pretty bad—women screaming, bombs going off and real weird stuff. But I learned.

"It was at WICC in Bridgeport, though, that I worked the thing out. And, as I said, everybody was crying, 'Throw the bum out—he thinks he's funny. He's a bum!'

"The station was getting nasty notes and the newspaper was getting letters to the editor. But after awhile, I think the reaction was 'He realizes he's sickening—so I like him.'

"Anyway, when I started there, the station had 55 percent of the listening audience and the third year we had 80 percent. I've never kidded myself that they were all Crane lovers, but the fact remains they were tuned in."

Bob seems to be one of those people to whom things happen. Like the time he and his wife went to see "Witness for the Prosecution." At a crucial and dramatic moment, the alarm on his wrist watch went off.

#### Nonchalant Robert

"I tried to be nonchalant about the whole thing," he says, "but my wife was under the seat."

And, of course, the day they drove into Los Angeles was the day of the worst smog attack in history.

As for his plans for the KNX show,

he keeps the gimmicks out of the 6:15 to 7:00 a.m. segment. But after that, expect anything. His music is neither rock 'n' roll nor long hair. He tries for the middle of the road.

"If I run true to form," he predicts, "it will be the housewife who hates me the most to begin with. I think I will win over her daughter first, then her husband, and about a year later the lady herself."

The thing of real importance to the coming of Bob Crane is that he has reproven an old saw, and one which the moguls of radio might well remember.

At 28, he is a success because he came up with a fresh slant on an old idea. Other radio personalities have kidded the sponsor, have used sound tracks and zany gimmicks.

But Bob does it a little differently. You may decide he is a fresh kid, but you'll have to admit he has a fresh slant.

**I**T MAY SEEM unusual that a TV station's acquiring of some old movies should receive so much attention, but when KTTV leased for a period of seven years the MGM library of great films it was indeed startling news.

Some of film's finest movies and most renowned stars making their TV debut are in this list. So valuable was the library considered that Loews, Inc., had previously turned down an offer of \$50,000,000 from a syndicate for the films. Richard Moore, president of KTTV, was the one who pulled the coup and negotiated the lease of the films for \$4,000,000.

#### The Deal

Up to the time Dick Moore started negotiations, CBS put in its bid for the MGM films. Dick, over a period of time, set out to convince Loews, Inc., that they should be part of the TV field—that they should enter the medium actively and not just as producers of shows for TV such as was the case last year with the MGM Parade. He reasoned that since they were the largest produc-

ers of entertainment they should not rent their product but should become an active participant in television. The company finally decided to buy 25 percent of KTTV and to lease the library to the station. CBS, incidentally, got the pictures for its network with the exception of the Los Angeles outlet. This alone was an unusual arrangement and proves how valuable the films were considered. Networks as a rule do not buy any product unless it is for use by *all* of its stations.

#### Pictures To Be Seen

Altogether, 725 films are involved in the deal—all MGM pictures except "Gone With the Wind," made up to and including the 1949 releases. This was the golden age of the movies and a partial list of the films you will see is enough to convince anyone this is an entertainment bonanza. Among the pictures are: "The Good Earth" with Paul Muni and Luise Rainer; "Camille," "Anna Christie," "Anna Karenina," "Ninotchka," all of Garbo's classics; "Min and Bill" with Wallace Beery and Marie Dressler; "San Francisco" with Gable and Jeanette MacDonald;

George Putnam will be moved up to 10 p.m. so the pictures can be shown on KTTV every night at 10:15 with a super production showing from 8 to 10 on Fridays. The station can go two years without ever repeating a film. Most important of all, no cuts will be made in any of these pictures. *You will see the original product intact!* This is really news!

"Some people may miss the first showing of one of their favorites," a station official commented, "so we would welcome any letters from our viewers as to films they want to see and missed or those they want to see again. It is entirely possible we might repeat such productions in less than two years. After all, we are here to please our viewers. Such letters will have much to do with our future policy."

There is much speculation already as to what these movies will do to the ratings of competing shows. It is safe to say that KTTV will have more than a lion's share of the viewers—with Leo the Lion roaring. No one can argue with the far-reaching effects of this KTTV move.

# Star for '56?



**E**ACH YEAR television seems to come up with new stars who cop most of the honors and awards for outstanding performances — particularly the annual "Emmy."

This past year it was Nanette Fabray. Previous winners were Loretta Young and Imogene Coca.

With the fall season just beginning, it's still too early to make any sensible predictions about the current crop of new shows. Insiders, however, say to keep a sharp eye on vivacious, red-haired Jeannie Carson, the star of CBS-TV's musical situation comedy series, *Hey, Jeannie!*

Since Jeannie is not only a newcomer to TV but also to our American shores, the public knows very little about the little lady who portrays a pert Scottish immigrant lass — with a knack for getting into and out of trouble.

To begin with (and probably to end—as far as the eligible American bachelors are concerned), she's married. The lucky man: Bill Redmond, who is also her manager.

Her real name: Jean Hardy, born in Yorkshire. Her parents: Peter and Netta Hardy. They were both in show business—he as a comedian and writer, she as a singer—but they wanted their daughter to have no part of it.

As a result, she worked as a hotel maid, usherette and children's nurse. Show business was literally in her blood, however.

She lied about her age, joined a chorus line, and during World War II toured the British Isles with the ENSA, the English version of our USO.

As a "single," she appeared at the famous Hippodrome and Palladium in London, and in September, 1952, she opened at the Saville Theater with the lead in "Love From Judy."

If it hadn't been for Noel Coward, Jeannie would have been a flop in that production. After a miserable first-half performance, she felt discouraged enough not to go on when Coward sent her a congratulatory note. She finished the play, took 14 curtain calls, and played the role for 17 months.

Next came a five-year motion picture contract with J. Arthur Rank and an offer to star in *Hey, Jeannie!*

That's exactly what she is doing now—as you can see by tuning in to Channel 2.

Tired but happy, 475 fans of the Los Angeles Rams football team returned to town after a weekend in San Francisco arranged by Forest Smith and promoted only by six plugs on Bob Kelley's KMPC Parade of Sports show.

The only promotion for the trip was on Kelley's Parade of Sports, co-sponsored by Forest Smith's Duck Press, Nickabob and El Pescador restaurants. Six announcements were made, over a two-week period.

Within 45 minutes after the first plug hit the air, 74 reservations had been made. In all, 550 reservations came through, over the two-week stretch, of which 75 had to be turned down because there were no accommodations on the train.

Forest Smith intends arranging other special trips to San Francisco for the **October 20 Cal-UCLA fracas, and the USC-Stanford battle October 27.**

# Reviews

## Noah's Ark

Tuesday, 8:30 p.m.  
NBC-TV, Channel 4

Judging by the first episode of Noah's Ark, director-producer Jack Webb of Dragnet fame gives us an ample sample of that thing known all too seldom in the slough of new shows making their debut this season. That thing is quality.

Webb is a meticulous craftsman, a perfectionist, and it comes across through the television screen that he no doubt thoroughly masters the material at hand and digests it before writing or actual production begins. Through this approach the raw material—the work of a veterinarian—that might seem but poor picking for dramatic fare on television, becomes suffused with interest and drama.

As a director, Webb again follows through in his casting. There is a satisfying completeness in Paul Burke, May Wynn and Vic Rodman in the leading roles. And the same must be said of the smaller roles, each making an important contribution to the whole. One feels that however excellent the talent of each performer is, his work is enhanced by Webb's incisive direction that elicits the performer's best.

But however one may analyze Webb's work, Noah's Ark adds up as a worthwhile and entertaining entry into this year's line-up of television prospects.—Bill Weber.

## Broken Arrow

Tuesday, 9 p.m.  
ABC-TV, Channel 7

Not so auspicious was the debut of Broken Arrow. However great any hope might be that succeeding episodes will rise above this initial presentation, there is too much promise of carefully plotted cliches and stock characters.

Within the past few years there has been an increasingly mature approach to stories of the early West that seems to have come about with the deepening interest of America in its historical origins. With increasing research into the historical past, stock characters and plots have been thrown overboard in reaching deeper into the reality of early periods of America.

It is, perhaps, on this score that Broken Arrow suffers most. There is little realization of character beyond the stock figures that have peopled "B" Western pictures since the first days of the Western. Coming off particularly badly, as is usual in portraying Indians, is the character of Cochise, who appears like a cardboard figure of plot convenience. This is not to say that Michael Ansara, who plays the role, does not do the part justice, but that the role itself offers little penetrating insight into the psychology of the Indian.

However, since the same may be said for all characters in Broken Arrow, it is perhaps unfair to demand something of this entry beyond its evident intent—a more or less pedestrian affair with the Wild West.—Bill Weber.

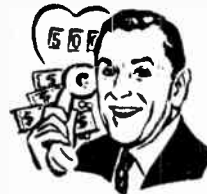

# HOLLAND'S TUNNEL

DUG BY JACK HOLLAND

The new shows are upon us now like a rash. Here are a few candid opinions of the current offerings:

**The Brothers.** While this wasn't as funny as the riotous and annoying sound track would make you think it was, it was still a more than promising new show. Paced by amusing situations and by the expert performances of **Gale Gordon** and **Bob Sweeney**, this one can create quite a sizable dent. Here was one comedy that didn't knock itself out with implausible and ridiculous gimmicks. Its comedy stemmed from the characters—who were almost entirely believable. Even more, they were likable. If **The Brothers** can maintain this start, things look very good for it.

**The Herb Shriner Show.** Herb is a funny man with a droll humor that is infectious, but outside of the mad film clips he ran along with his commentary, his new CBS-TV show is a rather routine affair. **Red Skelton's** appearance from **Hollywood** to wish **Herb** luck was interesting technically but offered little else. Perhaps **Herb** will find the right approach as the season goes on. It's too much of a case now of wondering where to go. It would be good to see this one turn out to be a smash.

**Noah's Ark** is a warm, sentimental, human story of a young veterinarian,

an older veterinarian, and a young girl. It has plenty to recommend it, primarily good stories and a careful and thoughtful attention to production. **Jack Webb** has a potential winner here. The only drawback is that it is pitted against some pretty tough competition.

While this department didn't catch the event in question, several viewers have complained about **Name That Tune's** being cut off at the most interesting moment to make way for a short talk by **Adlai Stevenson**. This is not the most sensible way of wooing voters, judging by the irate comments, even comments from those who are for **Stevenson**. The **GOP** and the **Democrats** had better be careful where and when they buy their time for their speeches. They may think it's wise to get a spot where they have a captive audience, but instead they're only going to alienate the very voters they're after. They should definitely see to it that the time they buy on TV is clearly designated—and that it is not thrown in on another show as a surprise.

**C. W. Bobay** writes to find out what happened to **Polka Parade** on **KCOP**. The answer is simple: the station tried to keep it on as long as possible, but there was no sponsor interest. Since programs have to be paid for in the

final analysis, there was no choice but to yank **Polka Parade**. Many people seem to miss that show.

Amusing note: **Constance Cameron**, TV actress, tells this one on herself. When she came here from New York to do work on TV, she looked for an apartment for a whole month before she discovered she dared follow up ads for "**Bachelor Apts.**" She thought they were for men only!

The tunnel has just seen **Paramount's "The Ten Commandments"** and the impact of this picture is still with me. There's been a lot of talk about movies having a rough time because of TV, but I can only say that with pictures like this one, the motion picture industry will remain perfectly healthy. This is a monumental achievement, an inspiring, stirring, remarkable production. It runs three hours and 39 minutes and you wish it would go on longer. Not once was I aware of the time. The entire cast is excellent with **Charlton Heston**, who recently did **Playhouse 90's** initial show, as **Moses**, doing a brilliant job. **Yul Brynner** is magnificent as the Pharaoh. All in all, "**The Ten Commandments**" is **Cecil B. DeMille's** greatest accomplishment—and a movie I heartily urge you all to see. It will be one of **Hollywood's** classics for years to come.

**Walt Disney** is currently producing the **Johnny Tremain** pictures for future **Disneyland** showings. He is spending a million dollars on two TV films—so you can see he believes in this production. From what I was able to see in production, I would

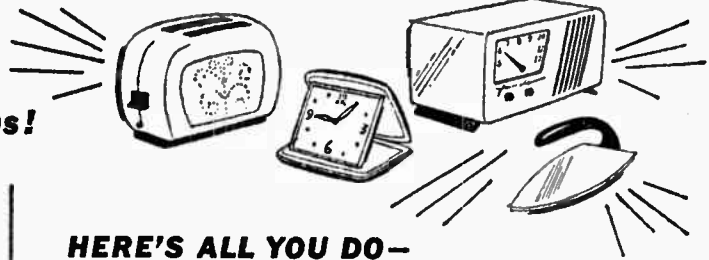

WHAT EXCITEMENT KULDIP RAE SINGH kicked up on the season's Groucho Marx opener! This handsome young college student from Pakistan was already a cinch with his NBC audience when Groucho asked him to sing. If you saw the program you'll have to admit that he did a very personalized job with "The Eyes of a Woman in Love." The studio audience gave him a tremendous hand. But that was only the beginning.

THE FOLLOWING MORNING (Friday), John Guedel's office had calls from every major motion picture studio in town and two recording companies. MGM, Warners, Paramount,

20th Century-Fox, Universal, RKO, Lawrence Welk, Spade Cooley, Dot Records and others lost no time in following through.

ALL THE TIME THIS FUROR was in progress, "Cooldip," as Groucho fancied calling the young man, was far away in Puerto Rico where his father, an importer in Pakistan, was vacationing.

TO GO BACK A LITTLE, last May, Kuldip, who is studying at UCLA, sent a recommending letter to Marion Pierce, who sifts the Marx mail at the Guedel office. Miss Pierce was so interested in what she read about Kuldip that she asked him to come in for an interview. She was not only taken by his big brown eyes but convinced that he had appeal. Because it was late in the season, they were unable to schedule Kuldip until July, when films were being shot for this fall. At the time the young man appeared for the show's filming, both the Guedel people and studio audience liked Kuldip, but there was no further reaction. Efforts to interest influential persons in the TV film before it went on the air drew a zero.

THAT'S WHEN KULDIP went off to Puerto Rico to visit his folks and to find out whether, if he did click, his father would stand still for a shift in Kuldip's career from doctor to show business. The father was not too willing.

IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING KULDIP'S appearance with Groucho, and the startling response, the young fellow made plans to hurry back to Hollywood. Meantime, one studio was so eager to land him first that it sent a man to Puerto Rico to look him up—didn't have even an address, had to check every hotel. Guedel's office phoned Kuldip and advised him not to sign any contracts until he arrived back in Hollywood. (Father, meanwhile, had reconsidered and may give complete blessing to the change in Kuldip's plans.)

WHEN I TALKED LAST WEEK with Bernie Smith, one of the show's co-directors, he said they were all convinced Kuldip will be in pictures, on TV and records almost overnight. As you may know, during the program Groucho asked the audience whether the boy should go into show business. By the first of the week, 1000 letters had already come in and at this clip, 10,000 are expected.

THIS IS THE BIGGEST RESPONSE the Marx show has ever drawn except for Gonzalez Gonzalez, who pulled 17 calls from studios. It appears that Kuldip is eliciting more insistent mail than Gonzales.

THE GUEDEL OFFICE THINKS Kuldip will be "the West Coast answer to Elvis Presley."

THEY COULD BE RIGHT. I started getting mail on Kuldip almost immediately after his appearance. One woman wrote: "I'm a 40-year-old mother of two teen-age girls and I drooled with them last evening over a gorgeous young Indian named (as close as I can get it) Kul dit Singh, who really sang! My teen-agers, who have been Presley fans, told him (Elvis) to get lost."

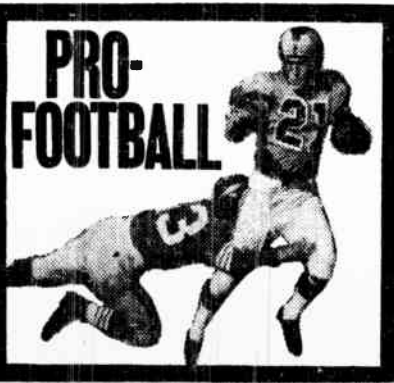

## Review

### Circus Boy

Sunday, 7:30 p.m.  
NBC-TV, Channel 4

Watching a new show make its appearance in the television world is something akin to taking in the birth of a new baby. There is a great deal of expectancy, of course, high hopes, and promise for the future. The only difference is that the new-born television offspring shows a clearer hand as to future potential than the human animal.

And any hopes of future promise I had held for Circus Boy were somewhat dimmed by the announcer's promise that the next episode would depict just what could happen to a circus at the hands of flood, rains, flames, and a killer-cat on the loose. As enticingly cataclysmic as this might sound, I found myself unmoved at the prospect.

Circus Boy, as even the title might lead you to suspect, is the story of Corky, a 10-year-old boy, orphaned by the fact that his parents were circus aerial performers who eschewed using the net in their act and had become the ultimate victims of gravity.

I have never had any aversion to either circuses or children. I have always been a staunch adherent of both. Thus, I rather suspect my opinions of Circus Boy were formulated by what happened during the next 30 minutes.

What happened lay in the writing department. While the basic premise of a youngster in a circus offers rich material, it also poses incredibly difficult problems.

Though the circus is known to every American from an audience point of view, the behind-scenes world of circus life and psychology of its performers is extremely remote from the comprehension of the general public. To interpret this strange world to the outsider takes the insight that comes only from long living in the circus world plus an extraordinary gift for interpreting it. For this reason there have been few great books or pictures on the circus despite the obvious wealth of story material. The psychology of the circus cannot be interpreted by such well-meaning observations as the clown Joey's declaration that a "circus isn't worth a wooden nickel without a heart" or the traditional cry of "Hey, Rube."

Mickey Braddock, playing the role of Corky, the circus boy, is an appealing youngster with potentialities. And Noah Beery, Jr., Robert Lowery and Guinn "Big Boy" Williams turn in good performances although somewhat bogged down by cliché dialogue.

Under the department of direction must come the shot of an elephant weeping. Though not conversant with the lachrymal tendencies of an elephant, the tear-soggy eye of a pachyderm left me emotionally frigid. I simply don't believe an elephant is moved to tears by the same emotional stimuli that move the human to tears.—Bill Weber.



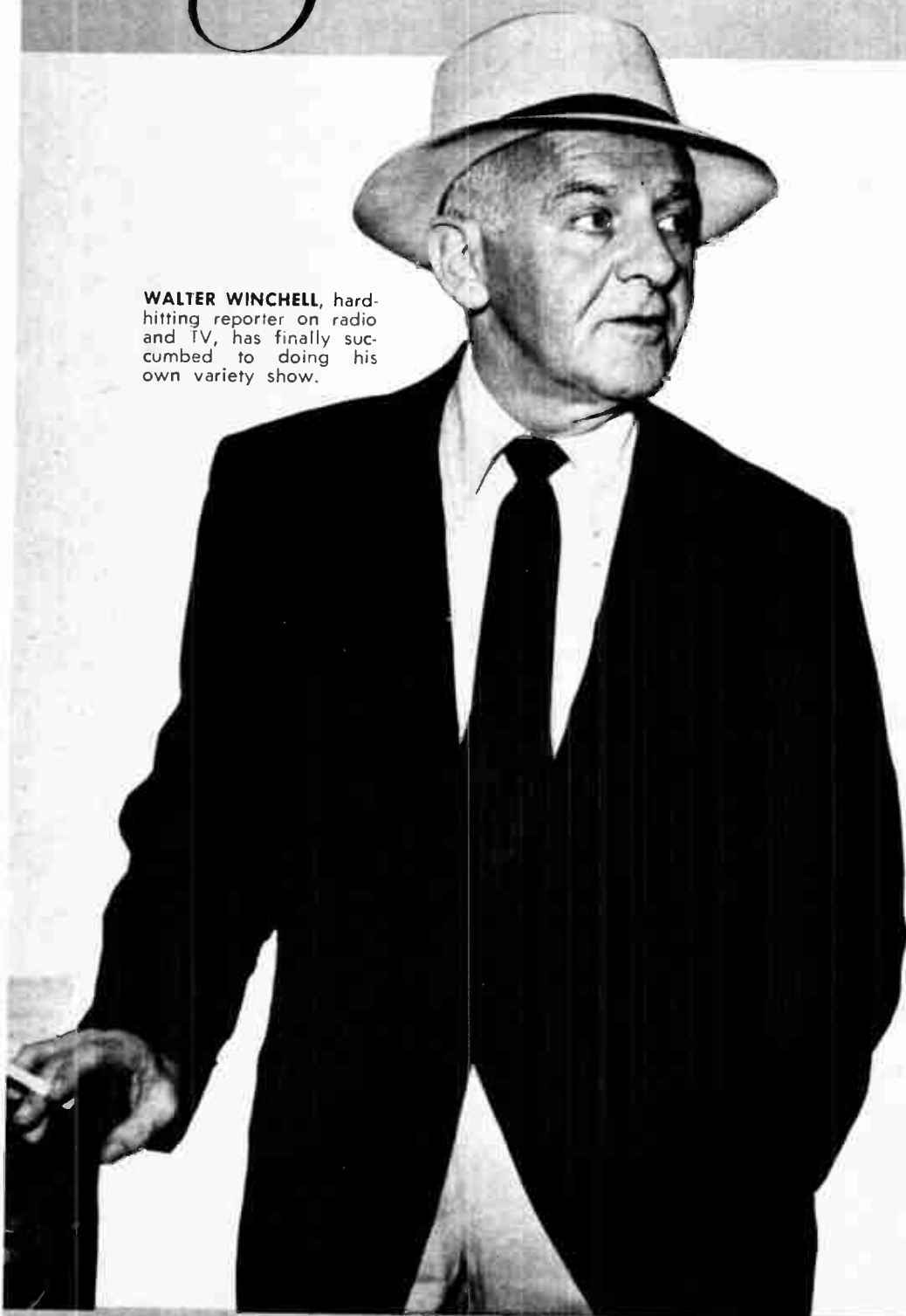

# "I Wasn't Living"...

**WALTER WINCHELL**, hard-hitting reporter on radio and TV, has finally succumbed to doing his own variety show.



**S**OME PEOPLE said I was washed up and a dead duck. To tell you the truth, I am trying to catch up with the hearse. I didn't have enough to do. I wasn't living a 24-hour day. Rather, I should say, I wasn't working a 24-hour day."

So spoke Walter Winchell in his expectedly clipped, frank, revealing way.

When Winchell, known for so long as a dynamic radio commentator, announced he was going to emcee a variety show for NBC-TV there were more than a few startled expressions of surprise.

"What's he trying to do? Get in on Sullivan's and Allen's racket?" This was the reaction of some.

"What can a newspaper guy like Winchell do with a variety show?" said others.

"Winchell an emcee? You know, he might just happen to pull a good show out of his hat. He sure has fire and pep at any rate and he says what he thinks." Such were the opinions of another group of people.

Actually, it's not as surprising as you'd think that Winchell is doing such a show. The only big surprise is from Winchell himself—he can't quite believe he is doing it.

"I am doing it for a couple of reasons," Winchell remarked. "One is I wanted to prove I was still up and about. I also wanted more to do. I'm a guy who likes to be busier than anybody ought to be.

#### His Show

"In the case of the NBC show, though I frankly didn't want to do an emcee variety thing. However, I was approached by two very fine sponsors and they chose the show for me. In the past, many offers have been submitted to me, such as a \$15,000-per-show offer in addition to \$16,000 weekly for my newscast simulcast by ABC President Robert Kentner. I chose the present NBC-TV production because, as you know, I have been off TV since June 26, 1955, and I purely and simply missed being on TV.



# SAYS WALTER WINCHELL

*There are some interesting facts behind Winchell's move into a variety TV show. His role as an emcee isn't as unexpected as it would seem to be.*

"My wife is excited about it, too—probably because she thinks getting in a rat race will make me easier to live with. She has been great. I raised the money and she raised the babies. Her love and understanding for over 30 years explains my survival."

There has been much speculation about Winchell's new show and how, if in any way, it will differ from Ed Sullivan's or Steve Allen's. Just how different can a variety program be? many speculate.

Winchell apparently isn't worried in the least about this because in answer to TV-Radio Life's question he said simply, "I'm not in competition with Steve and Ed. I think their shows are very big-time.

"I just hope that nobody connected with my show makes it duller than anyone else's. I have a great deal of confidence in my triple-threat producer-director-writer Alan Handley so why should I worry?"

"There will be no specific format. I intend drawing from the absolute top personalities in every field. As I have stated, this is a variety show. I'll probably make it a little different, though, in that I'll cover my favorite story in dramatization form, novelettes, vignettes, and the like.

"Sure I'll use top names, but in a slightly different way. By a different way I mean that after Allen and Sullivan have auditioned them and made good, we'll be happy to hire them and use their talents in a way

never seen before by TV audiences.

"As for my behind-the-scenes work. I have no idea how much time this will take since I have had no experience in this particular field. That's Alan's department."

Winchell's work on his new show will not change his interest in his news programs.

"As a matter of fact," he remarked, "I just got a new sponsor. Outside of my TV and radio newscasting I have also been preparing myself by emceeing night club shows, featuring singing sensation Roberta Sherwood."

## Personal Side

Winchell will certainly be living now—and at a pace he seems to enjoy. But he doesn't expect his new activity to do much about changing the kind of person he is.

"Me? I describe myself as moody. I have a temper, a sense of humor, I think," he laughed. "I am sensitive and 90 percent of all the lies said and written about me—are true."

"When do I retire? When I'm unconscious. When do I get up? Too early."

Then, with a chuckle that summed up the whole matter of his activity as far as he was concerned, he said when asked what his average day was like, "You wouldn't believe it."

# DICK POWELL

## *Gives It Straight*

*The host-star of the Zane Grey Theater has always been a man to speak his mind with no holds barred. He offers some pertinent observations in this exclusive article.*

DICK POWELL, noted motion picture star and producer, now adds to his TV activities with his role as host of Zane Grey Theater.

DICK POWELL, one of film-dom's most respected and admired men, was sitting in his plush offices at 20th Century-Fox where he was at work as producer-director of some of the studio's top-drawer pictures. It was an odd place to find a man who was doubling in brass as host and occasional star of the new CBS-TV Zane Grey Theater series.

In the first place, it was unusual to see Dick's acting as host on a TV series. And in the second place, it was equally unusual to find him even in TV at all considering some of his past experiences.

### CBS Action

There is no secret to the fact that Dick, along with others in the Four Star organization, was considerably irate when the CBS network summarily yanked the Four-Star Playhouse off TV in favor of one of its own shows. Dick was so incensed that he helped to bring about an investigation by the Senate into the CBS activities. In short, the network was charged with monopoly.

"It's true I didn't want to do the Four Star Playhouse last year," Dick admitted candidly, "but at the same time I was upset by CBS' action. Independent stations as well as others brought about the monopoly charges, and even though it was later decided there was no monopoly, most of us were not exactly convinced. I have felt that networks shouldn't own shows as well as time since the air is supposed to be free. And I felt, therefore, it wasn't fair for CBS to withdraw Four Star Playhouse just to put in one of its own shows. The motion picture industry was forced to stop actions of a similar nature a couple of years ago.

"That, however, is something that so far is status quo. Four Star now has other properties at work, among them Hey, Jeannie! and the current Zane Grey Theater. I am frankly surprised to find myself back in TV again, but I had no choice since I'm part of the Four Star company.

"When the William Morris office brought us the Zane Grey properties through Hal Hudson, who is now producing the series, I thought it a good commercial venture. Hal had the rights to the stories and Four Star decided to film them. Actually, this is a three-way partnership between Four Star, Zane Grey Enterprises, and my own company, Pam-eric.

"I had never wanted to be a TV host, but here again there wasn't much choice. David Niven and Charles Boyer, who are also part of Four Star, couldn't host the Zane Grey series with their English and French accents, so the job fell to me. I also agreed to the host spot because I have control over what is done.

"As for acting in the series, I will only star in three. I've done enough acting in my life and I would just as soon stay off the screen for a while. Besides, I'm busy enough with my other TV and film work.

"I do believe we have a good property in the Zane Grey Theater. It won't be a western as such—with the chases and the like. Rather, it will present the emotional sides of the stories. We can't even do some of the Grey books, either, because they are too big in scope to get into a half-hour slot."

Dick then discussed the progress TV had made in the last few years. Being a man of intelligence and judgment, his views were of more than passing interest.

### TV's Progress?

"Film TV hasn't made the progress that live TV has," he stated. "Live TV had to improve its earlier technique—it was that lousy. They have made remarkable strides since then. But film has not changed much because of the constantly rising costs in the physical side of production. The first year Four Star was in operation we lost money, but we made a profit in the next couple of years. However, our profits in no way measured up to the advanced

production costs. The increased salaries of the actors alone is a sizable item."

Naturally, Dick was interested in the effect TV has had on the motion picture industry. It is significant to note that he has just signed a producer contract with 20th Century-Fox, all of which would indicate that he hasn't given up the movies as a lost cause.

"You know, TV has been the healthiest thing that ever happened to the movies, even though it has hurt the industry," Dick went on. "You see a company like 20th making an hour TV show in a few days. It is not unusual to expect them to make an hour and a half film for TV soon—also in a short production time. Someone is bound to figure out that if a TV show can be done in a few days and be good, a motion picture can use the same technique with the same amount of time and expense being saved. Television is sure to have its effect on reducing production costs of the movies.

"TV has also been good in that it has given the motion picture industry its first real competition. This is healthy for any business."

Dick will have enough time—he hopes—to do both his TV and movie jobs. The three Zane Grey films he stars in will take nine days of shooting and it will require four days to film his host spots for 39 films. He has, of course, a steady run of meetings for the TV properties. And then there are his movie responsibilities.

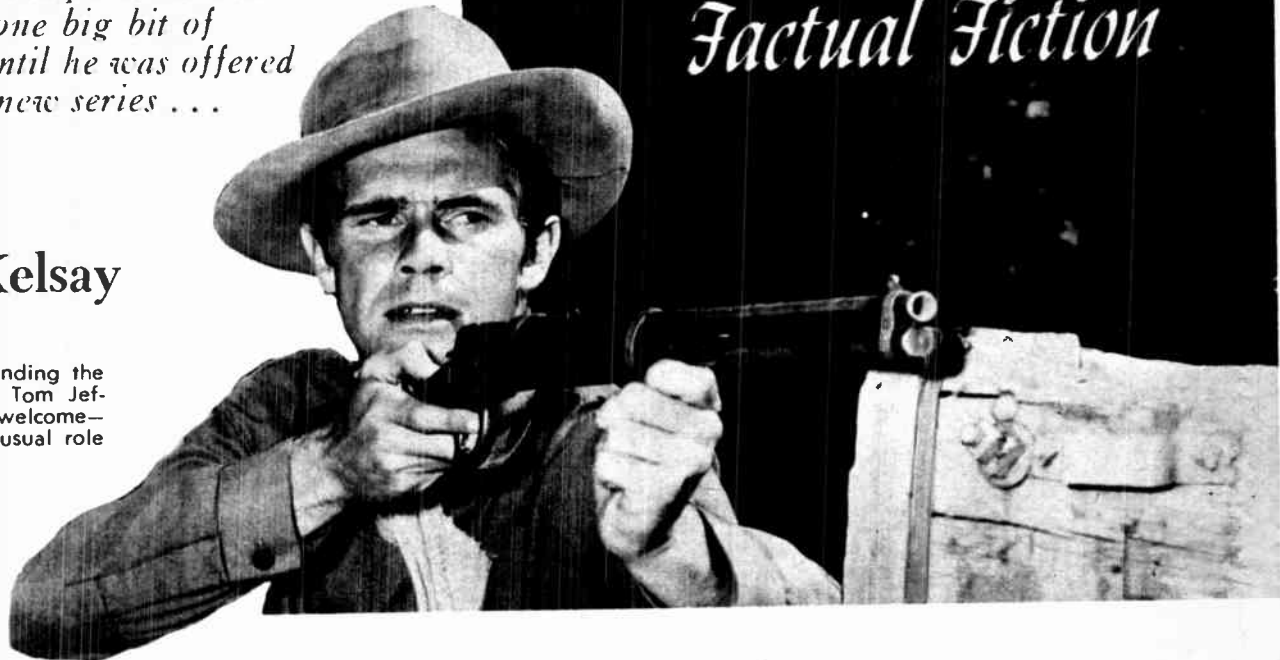

## *Broken Arrow... Factual Fiction*

**JOHN LUPTON** is finding the "hard" character of Tom Jeffords a new—and welcome—departure from his usual role of acting.



**F**OR NEARLY ten years now, John Lupton has been plying his trade as an actor, on the stage, in the movies and in television. "I have been very lucky," he says, "in that I have not been typed. I've played villains and heroes and brave men and cowards. However, most of the men I have portrayed have been sensitive types, such as Pittenger in 'The Great Locomotive Chase' and Marion Hodgekiss in 'Battle Cry.'

"So, when the role of Tom Jeffords was offered me in the new TCF series, Broken Arrow, I was quite honestly excited about it, for this is a real frontiersman, a man who is able to take care of himself physically.

"In the book, 'Blood Brothers,' Jeffords was very well drawn, but perhaps a little 'harder' than we are playing him in the television version. We are doing him as a bit more understanding and sensible in his dealings with the raw West.

#### **Intelligent Man**

"He is an intelligent man, a former Army scout, who is something more than just a rough and tough guy. He becomes the Indian agent who arranges the truce with the Apache chief, Cochise, and eventually becomes a blood brother to the great leader."

Cochise, incidentally, is played in the series by Michael Ansara who has a reputation as a Shakespearean actor.

"This has been a new thing for me, to sketch one character through a sustained series," John continues. "I have found out that the guy has more scope than I realized. The big problem has been to inject a little humor into the role, because Jeffords is usually in a tight spot with the

Indians or with the heavies. He does not have much time to be clever with words.

"One nice thing, though," John laughs. "I get to change clothes in this one. I was on a picture down in Death Valley once where the director insisted we wear the same outfit throughout the shooting for 'realism.' I was pretty dusty before we got through."

With the addition of Broken Arrow to the Tuesday night schedule, KABC-TV has two hours of uninterrupted frontier drama, beginning with Cheyenne, followed by Wyatt Earp and concluding at 9 o'clock with Broken Arrow.

John doesn't feel that this is too heavy a schedule for the action viewers. "There have always been frontier and adventure shows with a strong following," he says. "Actually, there are two schools of audience—the love interest for the women and the action for the men. I imagine the poor guy at home likes to get a chance to switch that dial over to adventure now and then.

#### **Romantic Interest**

"Not that there won't be romantic interest in Broken Arrow. There will be, for this is necessarily beamed at an adult audience and the stories are on an adult plane. After all, most of the children are in bed by 9 o'clock.

"But this is also historical fiction. Cochise was an intelligent man who realized that if the Indian wars continued his people would be wiped out, and when the various truces did not work out, he died of a broken heart. This is true drama, real-life drama of our American history. These two men, Jeffords and Cochise, both grew in stature from knowing one another and learning from one another."

Now 29 years old, John began his career on the stage in high school plays in Milwaukee. On graduating, he won a scholarship with Edwin Strawbridge's Lyric Theater, a road troupe that presents plays for children. He had a featured role with Mae West in "Diamond Lil" and toured the country with Katharine Hepburn in "As You Like It," which was the vehicle that brought him to California and the attention of MGM, for whom he did numerous lesser parts.

#### **Pedalers**

A relatively new bridegroom, he and his wife, the former Ann Tyson, have an apartment on Beverly Glen, but are currently looking for a house of their own. This has not interfered with their newest hobby—bicycling. Fess Parker, John's former roommate, introduced them to the sport, and now Sunday finds them pedaling their way to the beach and back.

John's aim in life is to stay "in the work I like. I hope to grow into a true character actor, and I want someday to be a big man in the industry—which I think is true of every man's ambition, whether he is an actor or works in a factory.

"I am especially happy with the opportunity to work in Broken Arrow, because I have found that a series is necessary to identify an actor. You can work six movies a year, and people remember you only as 'that nice young man who was in that other picture we saw.'

"With a regular series, you come to be known by name—which is the best way to be identified."

For the benefit of TV-Radio Life's readers, the name is John Lupton, which is a name you will have cause to remember.

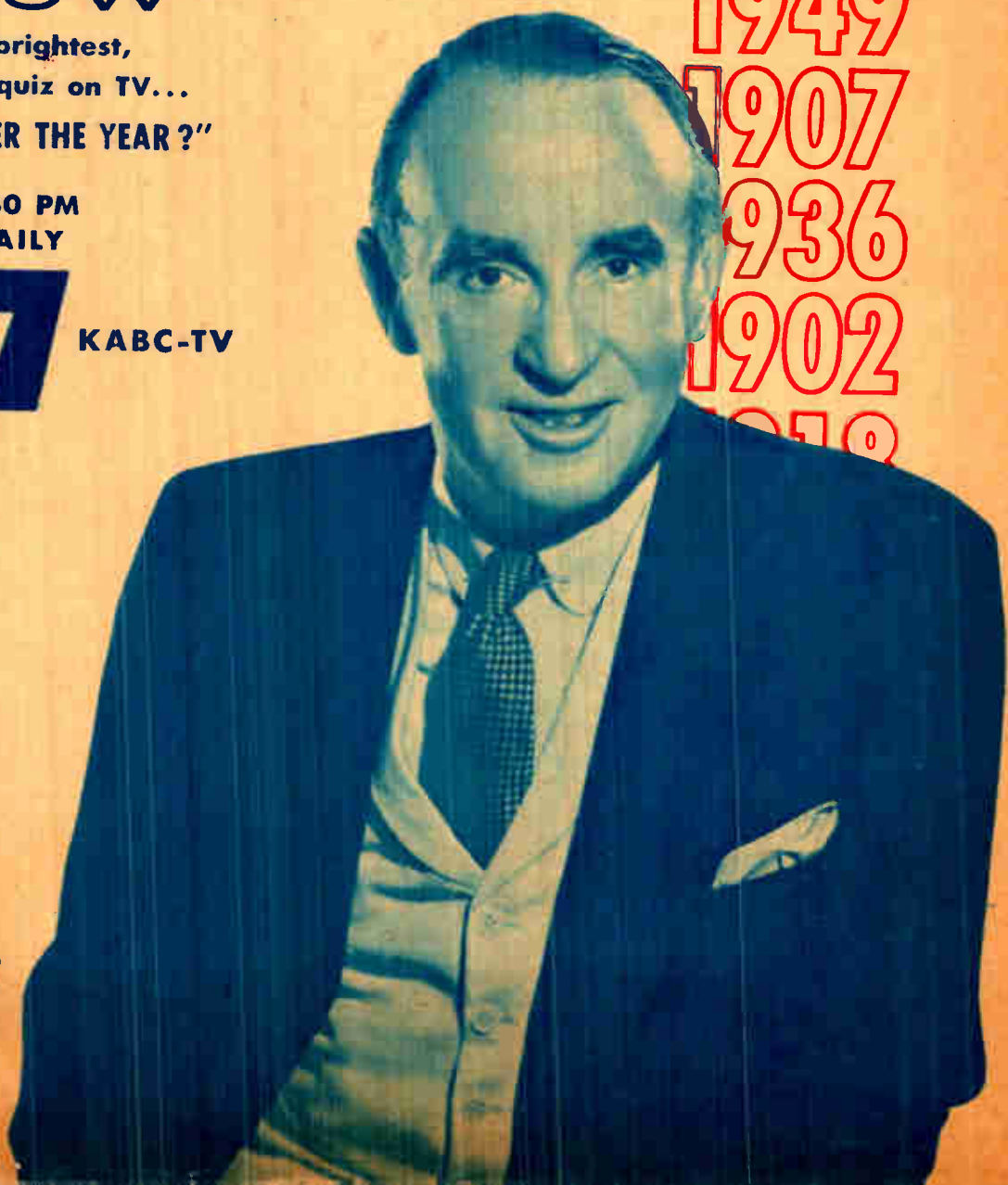
