Goal Without Gold

As for the biggest treasure hoax he has investigated so far, Davis gives that non-distinctive claim-of-fame to the treasure of pirate Christopher Myngs. "He supposedly left over one and a half million pieces of eight on the island of Pines south of Cuba.

"The story goes that the famous pirate plotted to split the treasure with the King of England. As we tried to show on our program, I don't think such a treasure even exists.

"From that, however," Davis concluded, "don't get the idea that lost treasures don't really exist. It wasn't long ago that over two million dollars of the lost treasure of Cheichen-itza in Mexico was uncovered. You'll never convince those men that all lost treasures are hoaxes."

For the present time, Davis, Hill, Wallace, and company, are not so concerned with making a fortune. They're just trying to make ends meet on their first runs—and then really cash in on the TV re-runs. For them, that's where their own *Treasure Unlimited* may become a reality after all.

THEY couldn't do another travel show. Bill Burrud, Jack Douglas and others had monopolized that field and quite successfully on TV for the past five years. But travel and adventure programs were here to stay. So what to do?

Come up with a gimmick. Devise a "travel show with an angle." And that's exactly what they did—the "they" being Hal Davis, Jerry Hill, Bob Wallace and Art Hannifin. Hal is the only name and face familiar to TV fans, because he's the actual treasure-investigator we see in action every week on *KTLA's Treasure Unlimited*.

"The idea of going after a lost treasure on our travels was a natural," producer Hill explains. "The biggest gamble we took was not going after a treasure but starting this show in the first place. We've done it strictly on our own. I have had top agency and network officials tell me we were crazy to start this kind of a project without any 'big name' backing. But we've done it—and are still doing it. Sure we've made mistakes. We know that. But we think the programs are getting better all the time, and that once we have made a good showing here in Los Angeles we'll be able to sell the filmed show in other markets throughout the country."

De Truth or Debunk

As for *Treasure Unlimited* itself, ad-

venturer Davis explains that "we make no pretense of saying we are going to find a lost treasure. We merely travel to a certain place where a treasure is known or reported to be. And then, on our journey, we either verify or completely debunk the story."

Has the *KTLA* crew found any of the lost treasures? Naturally not, or else they'd quit TV and retire. Or they would turn around and sponsor their own show and thereby insure their own success.

"The most valuable things we've discovered so far, in a monetary sense, are these pieces of eight," Davis declared as he took a beat-up Spanish coin from his pocket. "It's not worth too much in terms of treasure, but it is to me," the rugged, blond explained. "I found it one day quite by accident on the Chagris River in Panama."

That was the trip that Davis and his one-man camera crew, Dick Bushe, were tracking down the mystery of the lost treasure of Francisco Pizarro in Peru.

"Of all the places we've been so far, I think that Pizarro's treasure is the most likely that can be found. From the island of Tobago, to the mainland, and then on a road about 50 miles long anyone could uncover a treasure at any time. Where the men in Pizarro's party dumped their treasure no one knows. But it is there. I think our research verified that."

LAST SPRING Danny Thomas received 40,000 letters when it was announced that actress Jean Hagen was deserting her role as his TV wife, "Mrs. Williams," to pursue other commitments. How does a family man ease a wife out of a script and re-build his TV home life?

Forty thousand viewers each came up with what he or she thought was a solution, all the way from casting the letter-writer as Danny's spouse to relegating his TV wife to the voice of a permanently bedridden "Mrs. Williams" in an adjoining room.

"I was heart broken," Danny admitted when questioned about losing Jean. Then added, "We looked as if we'd been married 12 years!" This might be construed as both good and bad. Bad from the angle that most of the script situations had been exhausted, or, as Danny puts it, "We were getting our premises at the bottom of the barrel."

After considerable cudgeling of grey matter and careful planning, Danny neatly disposed of his TV wife, became a widower, and reappeared on CBS-TV last fall with two new family members: second wife, Marjorie Lord, and stepdaughter, Angela Cartwright. Needless

to say, he's again a happy family man. "My TV family is now supporting me!" he exclaims delightedly. "Take Sherry. If we have a show built around her, I don't have to worry. And Rusty. He's one of the finest actors his age. If we have a show built around him I not only don't have to worry—I don't even have to show up! He's always a hit. Pound for pound he's the finest actor in the world. A baby Spencer Tracy. You know the old saying about when in doubt lead spades. I say, when in doubt do a show on Rusty.

"And then there's my new daughter, Angela. A kiss bug. A love bug. When you see her, you just want to eat her. She has such a twinkle, especially when the audience laughs. I didn't think there'd be a female Rusty, but I can see her happening in Angela.

"Then my new wife, Marjorie Lord. A fine actress. Great sense of humor. A sensitive person. And she wants the job. Like me, she's been on the road and is happy to settle down. She came to me after we'd finished shooting on Thanksgiving Eve and said 'Thank you.' When I asked her what for she said, 'This will be the first Thanksgiving I've spent with my children in four years.'

"Another thing about Marjorie—she has an Irish temper. I wanted a woman who wouldn't faint if I yelled at her. I yell at home, you know."

Honesty

With a cast like this, it's not hard to see why Danny thinks his TV family is supporting him in more ways than one.

He swears:

"One minute
I want to kill 'em
... the next
I can hug 'em!"

In another sense, his real life family also supports Danny's TV series. It makes him an adherent to honesty. He really yells at home some times, so he'll yell, too, at his TV family. Danny doesn't like TV families which are all sweetness and light, nor ones in which the dad is a sucker. "You can't be an idiot father forever," he claims.

"Sometimes on the show I'll take my belt off and chase Rusty. Whether he gets whipped is up to the audience. We try to show everybody in as good a light as possible. But sometimes we step on toes. Then I get letters which say, 'God bless you for doing what you did' (taking a belt after Rusty, disciplining Sherry, standing up and telling the wife off).

As for Danny and "Mrs. Williams" fighting now and then on TV, he's all for it because he believes every married couple has its spats and therefore a TV pair should to remain true to life.

Pact

"When Rosemary and I were first married we agreed that we'd never let the sun set on a fight. Sure, we've had some brannigans. Then it gets dark and pretty soon it's shower and pajama time and we have to make up. Not just a peck on the cheek, but a kiss on the mouth. In all our married life there've been only three times when we kissed and snarled. The rest of the time it's been *toujours l'amour*.

"I've had a couple of letters saying that we fight too much on the TV show. I ask you, how in God's green earth can you kiss and make up if you don't fight?"

A little squabbling, life's small and large excitements, its problems, lots of love make up Danny's TV family just as these ingredients have comprised his own life.

Speaking of his TV family, he says, "Let's not change it. It's essentially a happy family. As for me, one minute I can kill 'em, the next I can hug 'em."

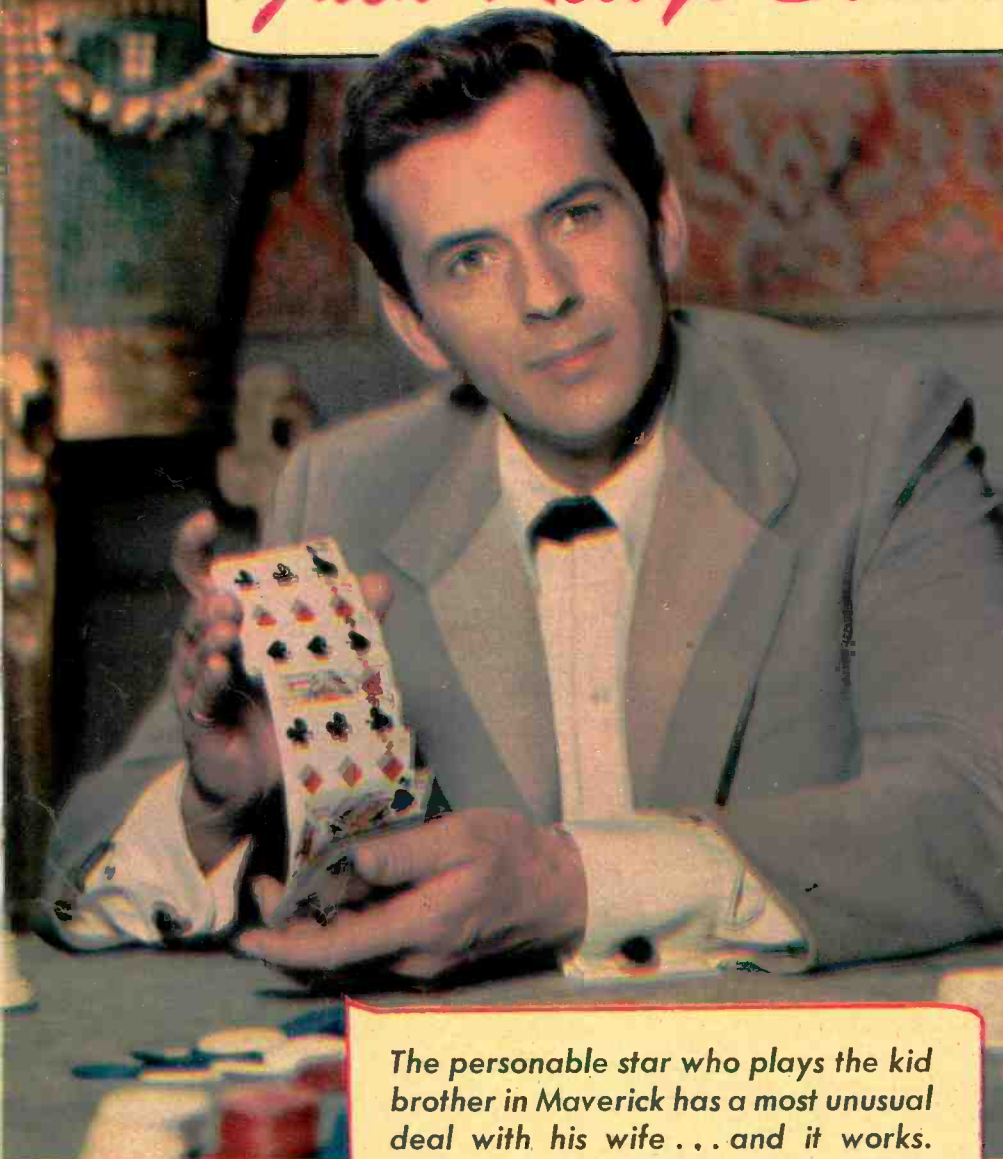


DANNY SUCCUMBS to charms of his little Linda, played by Angela Cartwright. (Color cover and pictures by CBS.)

Jack Kelly's Strange Pact



The personable star who plays the kid brother in Maverick has a most unusual deal with his wife . . . and it works.

JACK KELLY and his most decorative young wife, Donna (known professionally as May Wynn) were throwing one curve after another.

To begin with, they passed on the surprising information that they were busily engaged in writing for TV and had submitted a treatment for a *Maverick* episode. That they tried *Maverick* was no shock because, after all, Jack has recently been adding even more class to the Warner Bros. ABC-TV series in his portrayal of Jim Garner's kid brother.

"When Donna and I got married," Jack commented, "we discovered we had both been interested in writing for some time. In fact, I had a huge card-

board box loaded with scripts and treatments I had done. Donna had been equally enthusiastic. She has turned so much to writing now that she has almost forced herself into retirement as an actress — and she has done some fine things — the last being in *Noah's Ark*.

"Writing has become even more important recently because of the pact we made when we got married. We made a vow that neither of us would take a picture or TV assignment that would send us on location and keep us apart. Before I did *Maverick* I was asked to do a picture called 'Hongkong Incident.' It was to be shot in Hongkong. I told the producers I would do the picture only on condition that Donna went along too, all expenses paid. There was

a good deal of consternation for a while, but finally everything was solved when a part of an Eurasian was written in and Donna was given the role."

"I've had several pictures offered to me recently," the lovely Donna smiled, "but they've involved location and I've turned them down. I am not in the least sorry either we made this pact. I think it was by far the best thing we ever did."

Donna has taken on all the chores of a wife with a happy kind of fortitude — even to the cooking bit, which she loves. For a while, though, the cooking was throwing her.

"My schedule was so uncertain on *Maverick*," Jack explained, "that I'd often get home late to be greeted by a tearful wife and a ruined dinner. She had warmed over the dishes so often they were almost non-existent. This was bad because Donna is a superlative cook. Now we keep the freezer full of extra-thick steaks.

"I am a pretty good cook too. In fact, when I was courting Donna I tried to impress her by fixing dinners for her and her friends. But the crowd grew so much and the steaks got so thick I had to cut down on this."

"The first dinner I ever cooked for Jack and me was terrible," Donna said. "To this day, I don't know what happened, but Jack was so right when he said, 'This is probably the foulest dinner I've ever tasted.'"

These two are obviously blissfully happy. Jack's career, which has been up and down, has been booming since *Maverick*. And, in a way, he is surprised to be on the show. He had done a previous series for Warners called *King's Row*, and when it collapsed things were not so hopeful for Jack. In two years he didn't do one part at the studio. Either his price was too high for a role or he was the wrong type. Then came *Maverick* and someone thought of him for the younger brother. A photographic test of Jack and Jim was made and Jack was in.

"Jim was so established in the role that I had some misgiving the first few shows I did," Jack explained, "but he was so great — he treated me like a brother — that after a couple of shows it was a pleasure to be back at work again.

"We don't consider *Maverick* actually a western. In fact, I did one show recently where there wasn't either a horse or a gun. Consequently, I'm one of the few actors attached to a successful show who doesn't have to be fast on the draw."

With a series like *Maverick* and a wife like Donna, Jack Kelly really has been kissed by the blarney stone.

"Return to Paradise." (2) Feb. 8, 10:00. 1953. This James Michener tale has **Gary Cooper** as a soldier of fortune who stumbles on a Pacific island paradise that is being turned into a minor league hell by a tyrannical preacher, **Barry Jones**. Cooper encourages the natives to rebel, successfully, and to the reverend's astonishment, they continue to go to church without being driven. Cooper also finds love in this period, only to lose it when his wife dies bearing a daughter, and this is the young lady he meets once again years later when he returns during World War II to find himself a legend. These are the sparse facts of a fairly entertaining idyll attempting to show the glories of natural living, and succeeding mainly in the lilting passages of **Dmitri Tiomkin's** musical score.

"Talk of the Town." (5) Feb. 9, 7:30. 1942. A woolen mill burns down and a foreman is killed, leading to the indictment of workman **Cary Grant** for the crime. He escapes what begins to look like mob justice and hides out in **Jean Arthur's** farmhouse, which Jean has rented for the summer to law school dean **Ronald Colman**. This situation logically develops to the point where Grant and Colman become good friends and Colman must choose between a Supreme Court appointment and defending an unpopular cause. Despite the surface grimness of the plot, this is a literate and amusing comedy.

"Keeper of the Flame." (11) Feb. 14, 8:00. 1942. Foreign correspondent **Spencer Tracy** returns home to cover the untimely death of a "great American," and during the course of his investigation, becomes convinced that the suffering widow, **Katherine Hepburn**, murdered her husband. A bit melodramatic at times, but the two stars certainly merit a look.

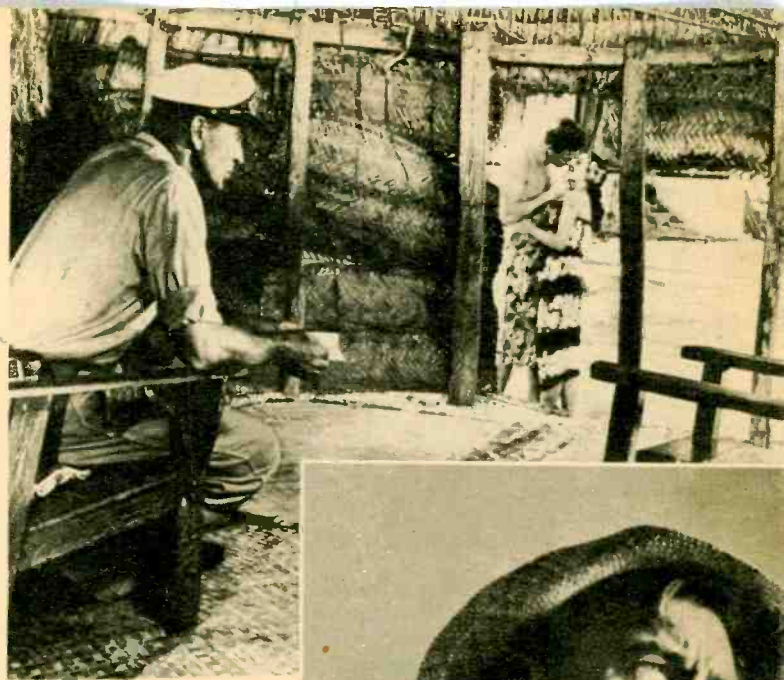
"Underworld Story." (9) Beginning Feb. 10, 9:00. 1950. Originally titled, "The Whipped," (sounds like my autobiography) this one presents **Dan Duryea** as a blacklisted reporter who tries to buy **Gale Storm's** little newspaper only to wind up running the rag covering the special story of the murder of **Herbert Marshall's** daughter-in-law. Marshall's son admits the killing to papa, but the maid becomes the chief suspect and in the end Dan proves to be not quite so bad, after all.

"That Certain Woman." (2) Feb. 9, 11:15. 1937. This plot-boiler reads like "The Romance of Helen Trent." **Bette Davis** marries a gangster at sixteen (she, not the hood) . . . he dies . . . she goes to work as a secty . . . boss falls for her . . . she marries wastrel . . . father opposes . . . she leaves wastrel . . . has child . . . wastrel remarries . . . new wife hurt in auto accident . . . wastrel finds Bette . . . and child . . . gets custody . . . wife dies (injured one) . . . they are reunited . . . Bette and wastrel, that is. With Henry, for those of you who are Fonda him.

"G Man." (2) Feb. 8, Midnight. Golly whiz, fellow.

"Frozen Ghost." (5) Feb. 11, 9:30. This is a chiller about a spook who has a haunting accident and has to have an emergency apparition. He nearly dies, but they give him ectoplasm and the scare will barely show.

A sightless child who swims like the champion she is, thanks to the help of film star Esther Williams, will be part of the unusual show on February 9, on ABC-TV's "You Asked For It."

The segment was filmed at the Hollywood location of the Nursery School for Visually Handicapped Children where all the children attending there are under six years.

Miss Williams' interest in the school dates back to a benefit she attended eight years ago to raise funds for the school which receives no aid from local Community Chest drives.

At that time most doctors seemed to agree that to put a blind or visually impaired child into a swimming pool would prove to be a frightening and hopeless situation.

Esther disagreed and promptly adopted the school as her own personal charity.

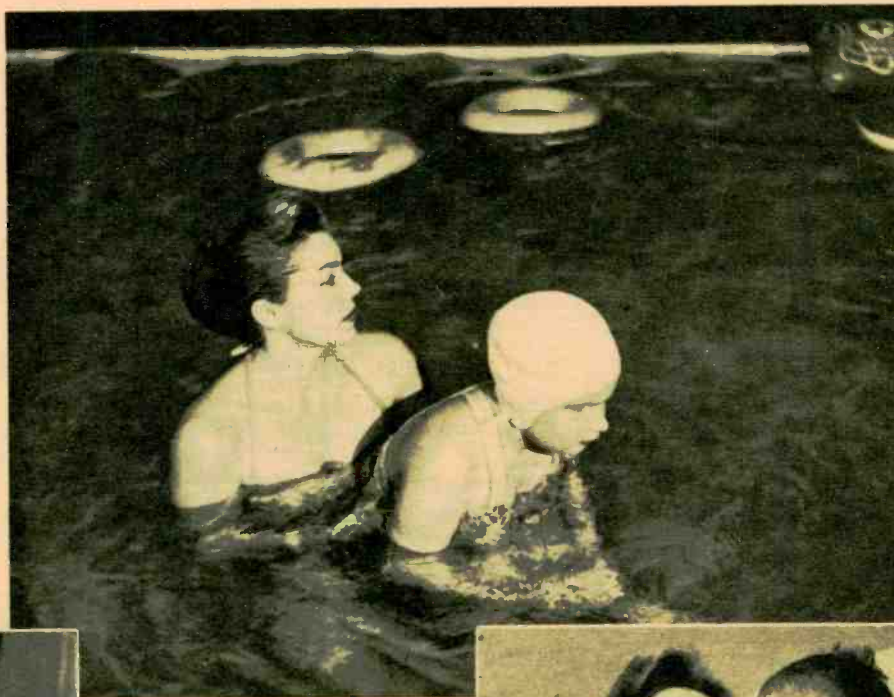
Today the changes in ideas and the school itself attest to Miss Williams' vitality.

The school sports two completely equipped swimming pools, the gift of the film star for 22 resident children who come from as far away as Mexico.

On weekends nearly all of these youngsters go home to their families to resume the normal thread of family life, thanks to the combined efforts of the Nursery School for Visually Handicapped children and a swimming star who cared . . . Miss Esther Williams!

THE SEVEN LOS ANGELES TV stations may compete spiritedly here in the city, but atop Mt. Wilson where all their transmitters are clustered there's a "happy family" attitude among the 90 TV employees. Being isolated probably has a great deal to do with this feeling. Though most of the engineers and other workers make the daily trip (which takes about 45 minutes each way), there are times when the 5700-foot mountain is snowed in. The men must be self sufficient with their own water supply, food, and other living necessities not to mention their own equipment "spares," own generators and other elements vital to keeping our seven channels on the air.

THOUGH I'VE MADE SEVERAL trips to Mt. Wilson, my most recent one (last week) was especially enjoyable because of KABC-TV's Chief Station Engineer, **John Stagnaro**. When he picked me up at the foot of Angeles Crest Highway he laughingly remarked, "They don't know we exist until the picture goes off the air or I run the budget into the red!" Before we started our ascent he telephoned the transmitter, then explained that checking the other end of the line was now a routine precaution exercised ever since the fatal accident when one of the engineers skidded off the road and lay injured for a long period of time. "We allow two hours for a one-way trip," Stagnaro explained. "This takes care of delays for car trouble. If the car does not check in by then, we send out search parties." Now and then someone forgets to call back when a trip has been completed. This causes concern and often hauls John out of his bed to make a series of check-up calls. Apparently he doesn't mind too much because he realizes the check system is being put to a test.

IT WAS DRIZZLING WHEN WE arrived at mountain top, hence disappointing in that the full array of towers could not be glimpsed. Though other stations would welcome a TV visitor, it seemed better, weather being what it was, to

confine activities to the Channel 7 operations. Here in a compact steel and concrete building housing close to \$1,500,000 in equipment there were two engineers on duty (FCC requirements). They were working one of the three daily shifts, involving FM part of the time as well as TV. At high noon it was interesting to see the engineers put KABC-FM on the air. Asked how they managed to monitor the FM and TV sounds simultaneously, one of the men quipped, "TV is our bread and butter, so we play it louder!"

IN SLICK GREY STEEL CABINETS is stacked the maze of tubes, wires, pipes and other intricacies comprising transmitter equipment — four water cooled tubes are used, each costing \$2400. A rectifier tube carries 7500 volts, enough to finish a man. Stagnaro explained it was habit always to keep one hand in his pocket when opening any of the cabinet doors. A veteran of radio and with Channel 7 since 1949, John has gone through all the growing pains and problems, apologizes for a desk littered with tubes and other parts which have given out. No significant piece is thrown out until cause of its breakdown is discovered and careful check is kept on the lifetime of each through a card index system. KABC's new transmitter, begun in 1955, is still subject to ever-changing details, but it is so well equipped that it has its color facilities — "the best," according to Stagnaro.

ELECTRICAL BILL FOR A TRANSMITTER like 7 mounts to approximately \$1000 monthly. At this mile-high location nature sometimes chips in with her own special brand of fireworks when it is not uncommon for the transmitter to be struck by lightning seven or eight times within an hour.

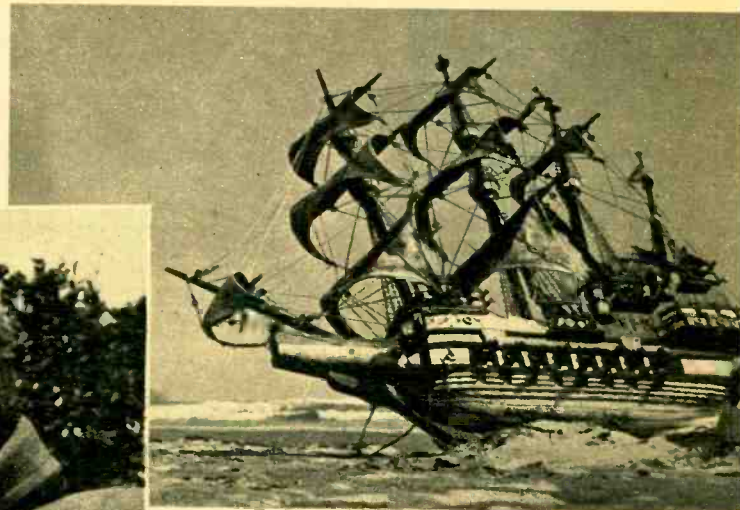

On February 19 The Shirley Temple Storybook presents "The Nightingale," for Screen Gems — NBC-TV and in this show is a lovely Chinese girl by the name of Lisa Lu. She is a most unorthodox actress in several respects — one being that in her days off from work she has a job in cancer research.

"This is a job that I took because I needed it," Lisa says quietly. She speaks softly, like the whispering of a breeze. She is so very shy that you almost have to coax the words out of her.

"I have worked before too — on the Honolulu Advertiser as a reporter for the Chinese Community," Lisa went on. "But it is acting I want most. I have wanted to act since I was a little girl, but my parents didn't want me to take up this career. They thought I should be a banker. So at the university I majored in banking but also studied voice."

Lisa later married but her husband, who is stationed in Monterey also disapproved of her acting so he remains in Monterey with their two daughters, Han-Chi (which means Most Precious Jade),³ and Han-Yi, 2 (which means Peace). In English their names are, respectively, Lucia and Loretta. Lisa and her husband made this arrangement in order for her to see what she could accomplish as an actress but they see each other as often as possible.

So far Lisa has done very well, for in addition to "The Nightingale," she has appeared on Telephone Time, Flying Tiger pilot, Gale Storm Show, and Schlitz Playhouse.

"My boss at the research department is most understanding," Lisa said. "He lets me make up the time I lose by working on pictures."

Research work isn't new to Lisa since she worked in a hospital in Honolulu for two and a half years.

Lisa was born in Peiping but left China to come to Honolulu when she was fifteen. Her father was in the Chinese Diplomatic Service until his death during the Chinese-Japanese war. Prior to his death, the family lived in Shanghai most of the time and went through several very severe bombings. Lisa knows full well what war means.

When Lisa left Honolulu to come here to the States she enrolled at the Pasadena Community Playhouse where an agent saw her in "Lady Precious Stream" and signed her. This got her an agent and her first picture.

"I'm still studying dramatics now," Lisa said. "I go to night classes after my work. I'm at the laboratory from eight to five and from seven to 10 I'm in class twice a week. The rest of my evenings I spend going to the movies, watching TV, or reading plays. I seldom go to bed early since I like to stay up late. I also enjoy cooking when I have any time to myself — things like Peking Duck and Chiang-Yu Chicken."

Lisa is very much the Chinese in the food she eats, in the clothes she wears, and in her philosophies. Her modesty is a direct result of her training as a little girl.

"Chinese girls are taught to be very modest," she smiled. "If they are told they are beautiful, they always say, 'No, it is not so. We are not.' Here in America, girls seem to enjoy being told they're beautiful.

"We also are taught in our homes to show respect for our elders, and most of us practice the teachings of Confucius. It is a different life from here — but in its way a rich one."

Out of all the shows Lisa has done she particularly enjoyed the Shirley Temple assignment. As a child she was a great fan of Shirley's pictures and working closely with her was a real thrill. Be sure to keep a close eye on Lisa Lu. She is a truly fascinating person — as well as a fine actress.

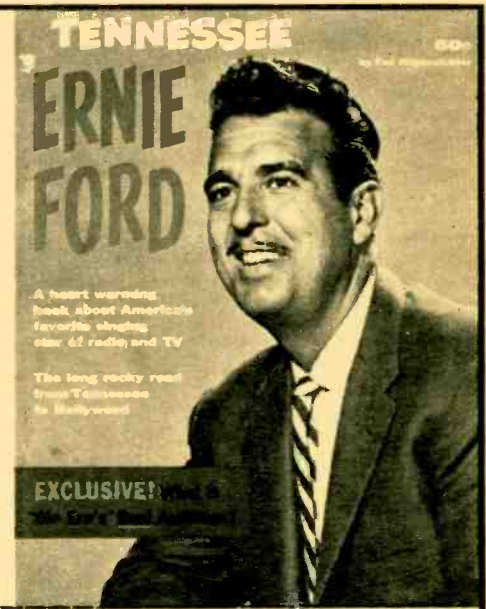

SKIPPER FRANK'S SCAM-O-GRAM

Hi:

The next time that you get that "nuthin' to do" feeling try these static electricity experiments. After you have practiced them by yourself you will want to show them to your friends as they have a magic-like effect. All you need is a comb and a piece of warm wool. Make sure the comb is thoroughly dry and rub it briskly with the wool cloth to charge it with static electricity. In this state the comb will pick up scraps of paper, attract a floating balloon, etc. The following tricks and stunts all make use of the charged comb:

1. Salt is mixed with pepper. To separate grains, run the charged comb through the mixture. Only the pepper adheres to the comb. To make it more showey, sprinkle the grains of pepper on the surface of a pile of salt. Conceal the charged comb in your hand and pass your hand over the pile. The pepper seems to vanish.

2. Balance a nickel on edge, and a paper match across the nickel. Cover coin and match with an inverted glass. To make match fall off nickel without touching the glass, hold the charged comb just outside the glass. A thimble can be used instead of a coin and a scrap of paper instead of the match.

3. You can use this principle to perform a miniature Hindu rope trick. Get a light piece of silk thread about six inches long. Hold the thread by one end and pass the charged comb over it. You can cause the thread to stand erect and follow the movements of the comb as it is moved back and forth, and in circles several inches over the thread.

A hard rubber comb or any small plastic rod is best for all of the tricks. A wool sock works fine for the rubbing cloth. All of the stunts work best in a dry atmosphere and will not work well on a rainy or humid day. If your hair is dry you can charge the comb by running the comb briskly through your tresses.

"On my Happy Homes program I stress the importance of doing something for the family. Don't save your best entertaining efforts for friends and acquaintances. For Valentine's Day, for instance, why not make it a day of expression of love for the family? Make little cakes in the shape of hearts and frost them with red. Serve ice cream with heart centers and decorate the table with lovely red carnations. February is a wonderful month for family fun — Valentine's Day, Washington's Birthday and Lincoln's. Red is the predominant color for February, with blue and white, of course, for the birthdays."

Norma, whose creed is "Let there be peace, and let it begin with me," is a true friend of the family in whatever

predicament it finds itself. She is available by phone from ten in the morning until four in the afternoon to answer all questions on recipes, party-planning, etiquette and travel. The calls come in all day and stacks of mail are opened and answered by Norma and her assistant, Margaret Lasky. The only requirement for an answer is that the questioner send a stamp for a reply. Before Christmas they were receiving mail at the rate of 2,000 letters a week requesting holiday menus—some of them to be sent to Iowa and Kansas and some as far away as Juneau, Alaska, and Puerto Rico.

Norma even has a male audience—the men who listen to her while driving in their cars and go home at night and tell their wives, "Norma said." The wives then call in to ask questions as to exactly what she did say. Sometimes the men call her—usually during the summer when they want information about barbecuing.

Cooking patterns have changed since the days when Norma used to conduct

a cooking school at Barker Bros. and women came in droves to learn the newest methods. One thing which has not changed much is that women still serve creamed chicken or chicken a la king for luncheons. Norma deplors this—there are so many other interesting dishes that can be prepared. "The chef at the Beverly Hilton tells me that they never serve creamed chicken," Norma commented. Another hint for hostesses from the Beverly Hilton chef is to use fresh fruit for salads—a variety of fruits attractively cut and garnished makes an ideal entree for a woman's luncheon when so many people today are on diets.

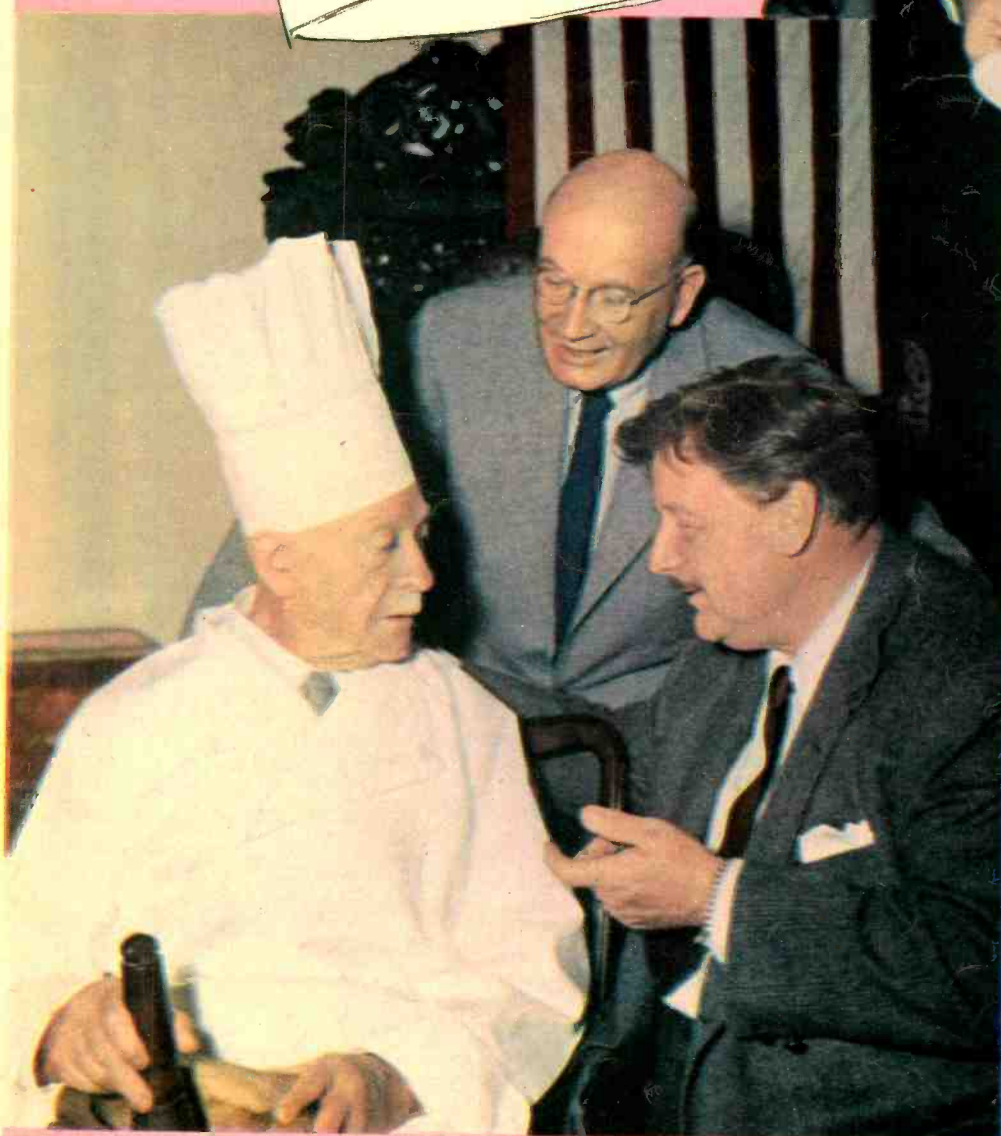
One of the interesting features of Norma's program are the interviews with visiting celebrities. Book publishers alert Norma to the schedules of writers who are here on a lecture tour or making appearances at book departments and she is able to arrange for a chat with them on Happy Homes.

280 Miles To A Long Swim

SWIMMING 280 miles of the Colorado River where it flows through the Grand Canyon is one way to become a television producer — at any rate that's the way John Daggett, producer of KHJ-TV's *Open Road* did it. In fact, he did it twice.

John's films of the 'Big Swim' were shown on Jack Douglas' "I Search For Adventure" and films of the second trip made up a "High Road To Danger" segment. "It's a heck of a thing to be proud of," John said, "but then again, nobody else has been able to do it and six have died in the attempt." John also made films on such subjects as shark hunting, rock climbing and survival at sea in an open boat. In each, he took the leading role and in each case was able to overcome the danger in which he placed himself. Through the friends he made while in the process of marketing these films, John was signed to produce the filmed segments of "Let's Play Golf," the series which stars Joe Kirkwood, Jr.

Such adventures as John has undertaken on his own, of course, are not the subject matter for *Open Road*. John, and his wife, Virginia, try to make each show into a film vacation guide, depicting places that are available to the average family on a week-end trip or a two week vacation. An explanation is made of the automobile route taken together with photographic descriptions of interesting stopping places along the way. John and Virginia thoroughly explore the landmarks and recreational facilities available in the

locale and also delve into the past history and current activities of the area.

Producing a show like *Open Road* seems like the ideal life for a young couple like John and Virginia—and it is. Between the two of them, they produce, direct, write, star in and narrate the whole show. Most of the photographic efforts fall to John while the writing and the necessary research to 'background' the narration comes under the heading, "Virginia's work."

"It's a lot of work to put out a new show every week," John explained, "but we have a lot of fun doing it. Both of us like the out-door life and we spend almost as much time camping out when we're filming a show as we do in hotels. Being on the road so much," John added with a grin, "is actually a blessing in another way—all of our expenses are deductible."

Speaking of money, John always takes the time and trouble to point out exactly what such trips as shown on the show might cost an average family. The living facilities of each locale are made clear and the Daggett's come up with suggested routes, stop over places and ideas for family fun along the way.

Since the *Open Road* only covers those places that can be reached easily from Los Angeles, John was asked whether he thought that he would ever run out of places to visit and photograph. "We haven't even scratched the surface," he replied, "the show just recently saw its 400th program (which also happened to be the 40th that I had produced) and still there are many, many exciting places to visit in Western America. Of course," John added, "it has happened that we have re-visited a locale—sometimes by request—to cover a new aspect of the location that would be of special interest to our viewers."

As an aside, after discussing John's swim down the Colorado, John added that he tried to talk Virginia into taking the trip with him the second time. "It would be a great way for her to get her feet wet," he said, "she can't swim!"

JOHN BROMFIELD has moments when he wonders who he really is. Ever since he took on his chores as the Sheriff of Cochise, his life has been confusing, to say the least.

"I didn't realize at all what effect this series would have on my life," the brawny star remarked. "I knew it would keep me a lot busier than I was used to being, although I had done over 25 feature pictures, but I wasn't prepared for the reaction of the people whom I met on my personal appearance tours.

"Perhaps the most surprising thing was that so many people didn't consider me an actor playing a part—but instead thought of me really as Sheriff of Cochise. This is partly explained by the fact that the series is set in modern times. Also, there is, of course, the real Sheriff—Jack Howard. So I get confused with the real product. I even get hundreds of letters each week addressed to the Sheriff which are sent to Arizona where they are later forwarded to me. Eastern tourists also come to the County just to get cards and letters stamped with the Cochise stamp.

"On my tours I've made several speeches and one I made in a city in Missouri had a strange effect. I was speaking on traffic enforcement and how speed killed so many people. Up to then, Missouri had had no speed

law. Ten minutes after my speech, a speed law was enacted.

"Being Sheriff of Cochise County has its responsibilities—that's for sure. I have to be careful of what I do and say. I have to live like a peace officer—and that really makes you watch your step."

John isn't the kind who likes to lead an exciting, cocktail-party kind of life, though, so he doesn't have to worry about behavior. He's happily married to dancer Larri Thomas, who was the Goldwyn Girl in 1956. She is a Quaker and doesn't drink or smoke.

Married Life

"I was in South America making a picture, before the TV series began," John remarked, "and so I sent for Larri to meet me there so we could get married. We had been going together for over a year, consequently it wasn't any sudden decision. We were finally married on the S.S. Argentina 12 miles out at sea. The 12 miles were necessary since I wanted to be married under American jurisdiction. You should have seen our marriage license—it was so big and even

had longitude and latitude marks on it.

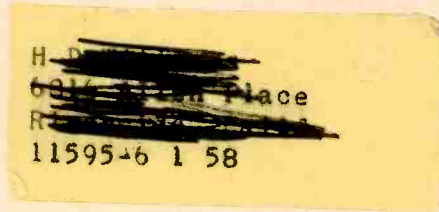
"Actually, Larri and I haven't much in common as far as interests go. As I told her before we were married, I love to take off and go hunting and fishing. I go whenever I have any spare time.
