PAUL MAYO - As a founding member of SPEEDX, it's difficult for me to ask you for your vote, but here are some reasons why you should vote for me.

Qualifications:

I think the prime qualification for any candidate is activity. What have you done for SPEEDX, its members and associates?

As most of you know, my prime interest in our hobby concerns Utility DXing. Since its inception, two years ago, I've edited the "Utility Chaser's Corner" for SPEEDX. During this time I have authored, together with Steve Handler, the "Utility DXer's Handbook" and the soon to be published "World Utility DX Handbook." A major portion of the money earned from these publications and others goes for the HAP program and future projects of SPEEDXTRAS. I have also authored various feature articles appearing in SPEEDX and have served on the ANARC and SPEEDX country list committees.

Ideas:

I think most of the candidates have similar ideas as mine. These include more novice oriented material, features, construction projects, an unique awards program, and where economically feasible, the publication of SPEEDX twice a month.

In any case, whether or not you cast your vote for me, do indeed vote because that's why you are a full member.

GENE MOSER- One of the most important benefits of Full Membership in SPEEDX is the right to vote. That one privilege gives you the opportunity to elect those you feel would serve your club best. This year three seats on the Board of Directors fall vacant. It is my hope you will find me worthy to fill one of those vacancies.

Like most of those running, I have not held an office of this stature before. I do feel that the plans and suggestions I would make will be practical, and to the betterment of SPEEDX. However, I don't intend to do all the "talking". A mutual exchange of ideas will be necessary to keep SPEEDX the growing club we have.

If you elect me to one of the Directors positions, I want your suggestions. By knowing your wishes, we will serve you better. Your vote for me will be considered a trust. One I will do my best to uphold. Thank you.

OLIVER ELLSWORTH - First I wish to thank all those that placed my name in nomination to fill one of three positions on the Board of Directors.

Now for my qualifications, and why you should vote for me. I have been a member of SPEEDX since September 1971. Shortly thereafter due to my initiative, I was appointed Secretary and Assistant Publisher. Recently I was appointed Assistant Managing Editor. I am currently active in these positions and devote many hours in the interest of SPEEDX. To enumerate my various duties (which begins at the mailing of one issue on through to the mailing of the next issue) are too numerous to list here.

A vote for me will give you a voice in SPEEDX.

ARTHUR S. GETZEL--If I was a conventional person running for the office of Board of Director, I would make promises to you--the membership that I couldn't possibly keep. What I will promise you is that I have the capability to hold such a high office. I have been an editor in another major club for two years; and some of you know about the excellent work I did in that club. But more important is the fact that I know how a club as SPEEDX should be run. I know the inner mechanics of the way a club is run. I intimately know about editing and publishing a club bulletin, and my standards are high.

And then I have one more attribute. This attribute is the belief that a club should not stand still or be a copier of other clubs. But a club, and you know I am talking about SPEEDX, should be innovative and go forward in progress. This is the philosophy I would carry into the office of BOD. Thank you for your consideration and I hope you will vote for me.

JACK WHITE - I thank those responsible for placing my name in nomination, and further apologize for not having notified Headquarters that I would not be a candidate for the BOD. Having held a similar position in another organization a while back, I am aware of the demands such a job can place upon one's time....particularly if the thing is to be done properly. My personal circumstances do not presently permit the assumption of any additional responsibilities requiring expenditure of time....I just don't have it. Therefore, I request that my name be withdrawn from consideration.

However, as long as I have the floor, I'll take the opportunity to urge you to exercise your privilege to vote, and further ask that you weigh each candidate carefully in terms of what you feel is best for SPEEDX.....your club. Thanks again, and 73.

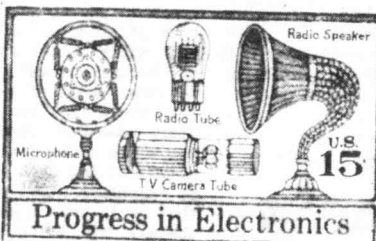

The SOAP BOX

A DIVISION OF "DX MONTAGE"

In what may well have been one of his last official acts before becoming an international shortwave personality, SPEEDKer Serge Neumann penned these thoughts in response to March's "SOAP BOX" item re the role of satellites in broadcasting and DXing:

"The thrust of international broadcasting has, since its inception, been a tool for political philosophies. This intent will not likely change - unless we change..."

"The concept of direct satellite transmissions has abundance of merit. Yet while we have the technical capacity for such types of transmissions, we do not possess the tolerance to accept their messages. This has been evidenced by the fact that certain world power seek to establish rules whereby satellites could be destroyed by the offended government(s)..."

"Where would this idea leave Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty theorists who conjecture on the use of satellites for international broadcasting purposes? It seems that the notion of international broadcasting satellites for non-propaganda purposes and the idea of use of satellites by RFE and RL are clearly contradictory..."

"At this point, it must be maintained that the world's governments are not ready for this kind of interchange of ideas. When and IF that ever occurs, then at that point we can start to consider a major effect on our hobby..."

Radio Japan Offers A Free Tour of Japan



Radio Japan, in cooperation with the Japan Air Lines, offers a free sight-seeing tour of Japan this autumn to three winners of a writing contest on the theme of "Radio Japan and I". For your composition you may freely write of how you first started to listen to NHK broadcasts, their efficiency, personal episodes and your general impressions in 500 words. Please send your entries by July 15, 1973, the deadline for the contest. Winners will be announced September this year over Radio Japan. Include your name, address, sex, age and occupation and send all entries to Radio Japan, NHK, 2-2-3 Uchisaiwai-cho, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo, Japan. We welcome all participants who will be presented with a token gift for entering the contest.

The winner will bear round trip travelling expenses between his home and airport where a Japan Air Lines plane would be available.

Western Massachusetts DXer Ron Lanoue has forwarded the adjacent advertisement clipped from the 7 May edition of the New York Times and has offered the following comments thereon:

"...although I'm sure the contest info will be helpful...it is the advertisement itself which interests me the most. This is the first time I have ever seen any ad for an SW station anywhere besides in "hobby" publications...and was wondering if anyone else had ever seen anything like this..."

"...the sad fact is that despite exponentially growing sales of multi-band radios our activity ranks somewhere between 15th Century Ukrainian folk music and window shade collecting as far as number of followers goes; by any measure the number of people who regularly tune to SW in the U.S. has declined over the past thirty or so years and is now limited mainly to a hard core of DXers and a multitude of kids who play with their radios for a year or two then go on to "better things"..."

"...the number of receivers available insists that there is a vast potential SW audience out there somewhere which would be stimulated to use their receivers if they knew their radio's potential. Ads such as that of NHK could perform an essential function in letting people know that SW is more than something to switch by on the way from AM to FM..."

Ron continues by suggesting that SPEEDXers seriously consider sending copies of the ad along to various SW broadcasters, perhaps encouraging the latter to consider commencement of advertising campaigns, if not in newspapers, then in special interest magazines...not just electronics periodicals, but possibilities like Holiday or National Geographic.

In conclusion Ron states, "Any substantial campaign would not only help the individual broadcaster, but the hobby as a whole..."

REPORT OF 1973 MEETING OF THE EUROPEAN DX COUNCIL (EDXC)

Serge C.P. Neumann of the Netherlands, recently attended the European DX Council at Oslo, Norway and has sent to SPEEDX and other Shortwave Clubs in North America the following report:

Though the temperatures were a little cool, the atmosphere of the 7th - annual meeting of the European DX Council (EDXC), Europes conterpart to the Association of North American Radio Clubs (ANARC), was warm and cordial.

More than 6 radio stations representatives, and 30 club leaders and administrators from 8 nations participated in the two days of round-table discussions June 10th and 11th at Oslo, Norway.

This years meeting took place at Radio Norway, and was co-hosted by Ole Johan Eriksen of the program "DX Radio Norway", and Tore Nilsen of the DX Listeners Club of Norway. The list of participants read like a European "Who's Who" in the shortwave hobby. (Among those attending were: Wolfgang Scheunemann, EDXC Secretary General; Wouter St. Franken, BDXC; Michael Bethge, WWDXC; Arne Skoog from Radio Sweden; Claes W. Englund, DX Allian- sen; Björn Fjaestad, DX Allianen; Bengt Dalhammar of Sweden - former EDXC Secretary General; Torbjörn Einarsson of Sweden and landlist expert; Jukka Kivi, Finish DX Association; Anker Peterson, DSWCI; Noel Green, DSWCI and chairman Frequency Registration Committee; Carol Feil, President DSWCI; Jens M. Frost, WRTH Denmark; Tor-Henrik Ekblom, DSCWI and WRTH; Erik Jacob- sen, Cimbrer DX Club; Malcom Peddar, WDXC; Clive J. Jenkins, MWC and WDXC; John A. McCarra, WDXC; Mr. & Mrs. Reg Kennedy of BBC WS and BBC Radio Club; Edward Startz, formerly with Radio Nederland's Happy Station; Jim Vasten- houd of RN; Bernd Kriszio of WWDXC; Gerd Klawitter, WWDXC; Gunter Langweige of West Germany; Tore B. Vik, DX Listeners Club and DLF; Svenn Martinson of DXLC; G. Thiele of DW; and others)

The meetings were officially opened at 1100 local time by Secretary General Wolfgang Scheunemann (who was also elected conference chairman for the open- ing session). He led off with a development report that criticized the EDXC Represnetatives for not doing enough for the EDXC and that some of them do- ing a disservice to both their clubs and the EDXC by not being more active. In all, Scheunemann felt the EDXC has, despite some strong criticism recent- ly, made some significant gains and achievements.

Reports by the various EDXC committees followed, which demonstrated that the EDXC committees HAD made some progress. The Frequency Registration com- mittee, headed by Noel Green, is assisting broadcasters out-side of Europe find usable frequency for their English transmissions to Europe in the per- iod of 1700-2100 GMT. The EDXC is interested in expanding this service to other stations, but it is taking time to establish a credible monitoring system.

The Propagation Research Committee filed a concise report, indicating, among other things, that a band survey for the 60 and 90 meter bands would be issued later this summer, This item should be of considerable interest to North American Listeners as well.

After Lunch at the world-famous Frognerpark in Oslo, the discussions contin- ued. This time, the EDXC quickly tackled the problem of copyright in club magazines, and a draft version of a copyright statement was written. It will now be sent to the member clubs for ratification. (This statement may also be suitable for North American clubs to utilize under the ANARC banner).

Discussions relating to EDXC's role as publisher of reprints and suitable items for the listener ensued through most of the first afternoon. It was generally concluded that the role of the EDXC is one of providing informat- ion to clubs first, and then to listeners who may want information specif- ically through the EDXC.

The EDXC also moved against attempting to assist European broadcasters in planning for the 1974 medium/long-wave conference. This was termed to be

continued-

(at present), out of the scope of EDXC capabilities.

The second day began with a discussion on the matter of a common "Country List" for all EDXC countries. Through some negotiations by Secretary Schuenemann, the factions have agreed to settle the minor differences, and that a new "Landlist" will be presented in finalized form by October 1st. The list is totally comprehensive, and may be worth-while for North American clubs to use. The fact that the landlist discussions went so quickly reflects that perhaps the EDXC member clubs are no longer interested in arguing over what-type of "Who's list" to use, just that they want a list.

The EDXC has also motioned to discuss further, and seek out a potential chairman, for the Handicapped Aid Program of the EDXC. Unlike the North-American HAP program, which is not channeled through ANARC, the HAP will for the time being, be a body of the EDXC.

The post of Deputy Secretary General will now be studied by Claes W. Englund, former EDXC Secretary General and legal expert. Additionally, Claes Englund is studying how a system of national EDXC representatives can be employed while still working within the frame-work of representation by club. A proposal to revert back to the method of representation by country rather than club, was tabled and would be discussed again at next years meeting.

The EDXC has tentatively chosen London as the site for next year's EDXC meeting. Tentatively, the BBC and World Radio Club would be the co-hosts. It was also agreed that the annual meeting of the EDXC should be fixed at Whitsun (holiday), so that additional time would be allowed to travel to and from the meeting location.

A theme of interest to North American listeners was the complaint that until recently, the EDXC was completely in the dark about the activities of ANARC. Now that Al Reynolds has taken over, the lines of communication have been re-opened, and that the EDXC is anxious to work with ANARC in any way possible.

On the subject of co-operation, the EDXC motioned to study further the possibility of creating a shortwave station popularity poll conducted on a semi-professional basis with ANARC. It was the feeling of those broadcasters present that the number of popularity polls has increased, while their effectiveness has decreased. The popularity poll as it would be undertaken by the EDXC (and hopefully ANARC), would attempt to provide some qualitative rather than just vague quantitative results. It was expressed that present methods of station "popularity" had so many inequities, as to invalidate any possible useful interpretation.

With the last annual meeting, the EDXC has proven that it is and can be a viable force influencing both the hobbyists through their clubs and broadcasters. But the EDXC realizes that it isn't just a matter of influence, but cooperation with and work for these people. The results of the last conference clearly indicate that the critics of the EDXC can not call the organization one that can't come to decisions. The EDXC made many this last meeting - all good ones.

This comprehensive and timely report will go to the 1973 ANARC convention via SPEEDX. SPEEDXers where-ever you are, I hope you plan to go too.

As expected, the somewhat provocative remarks concerning countries lists that were extended in last month's column brought response....although the occasional vehement or flat-out irate rebuttal for which we were fully prepared failed to materialize. A total of 31 replies were received, including those from the chairmen of two other organization's Country List/Award Committees.

Roughly one-fifth (6 out of the 31) favored "countries lists" as the basis for an awards program—as opposed to any other scheme that has yet been applied. However, each of these were willing to concede major deficiencies in using "countries verified" as an accurate and fair means of determining career "Xability". This particular school of thought can perhaps be best summed up by selecting remarks offered by Don Jensen, an internationally recognized authority on SWling and chairman of NASWAs countries list committee. In essence Don says that counting countries as is presently done is far from being truly fair, but considering all of the many aspects, it's probably the best of a poor lot of alternatives. He could very well be right!!!

The other approximate four-fifths, while favoring some other form of scoring, cannot be easily lumped into a category....particularly when it comes to the suggestions offered as to possible alternatives!!! Almost all in this group prefaced their remarks with "Maybe I'm nuts, but it seems to me...." (or some similar psychological self-evaluation), and then continued on to the details of one or two of a whole host of inventive, imaginative, sadistic, ingenious, diabolical, or just plain unusual schemes ever uncorked. Gentlemen, we salute you!!! Some real food for thought has emerged, and not one of the writers has been considered as being a prime candidate for a rubber room.

With this little survey now out of the way, where do we go from here? Apparently, there is support for a "career awards program" on a basis not too unlike several of those presently offered in other organizations. If indeed, further investigation reveals that Don Jensen's evaluation is correct, then it would seem logical for SPEEDX to develop an awards program based upon "countries verified" or something not too far afield from that criteria. However, it should be pointed out that some effort in this direction has been taken in the past, and has been shelved and re-shelved several times for lack of really strong support. This is further borne out by the fact that even the strongest advocate of a countries list replying to our little survey declined to offer his services toward setting up a program (this latter comment is designed to stimulate a "volunteer" or two, so be forewarned if offering additional discussion on the topic).

On the other hand, we have all those "nutty" suggestions alluded to above...and many would easily lend themselves (perhaps even better) to "short-term" affairs covering a month or so, or maybe a winter season. These might give everybody a chance to participate in one or more limited duration "fun-type" thing geared to his own particular field of interest, degree of skill, or just plain old luck. In other words, something upon which a friendly side-bet could be placed occasionally (if the participants were so inclined and SPEEDX was in no way involved) that would not require a lifetime to collect. Properly inscribed "awards" could be prepared and issued by SPEEDX denoting the particular achievement whatever it might turn out to be. These short-term programs would then be separate from, and in addition to, any other "career awards" program that might also be forthcoming.

To give an idea of what to expect in this latter category, try the following samples on for size:

"First African, Asian, European (or whatever) logged and verified in 197h"
(categories for "under 10 KW", "under 5 KW", etc).

"Last African, Asian, European (or whatever) logged and verified in 1973"
(same categories as above). (we said some were "diabolical").

"Most miles per watt for the month of _____" (categories for SWBC, ute, AM, SSB, CW, etc).

When the mind wanders over all the various possibilities for "short-term" awards, a new perspective emerges....one that permits a number of meaningful certificates, but not limited to the single purpose of amassing a career score. To get the ball rolling, SPEEDXTRAS will kick off one of the more paranoid schemes next month....anyone who received at least one QSL during the year of 1972 has just about as good a chance as anybody else of walking off with a prize!!!!!! (Skill is in no way a factor....It's pure luck and nothing else).

Two years ago we spoke of "adding new dimensions to SWling". Gene Koser's report on Rancho Los Amigos must then be the most rewarding birthday present of SPEEDX's second anniversary. We are proud to have provided the springboard for HAP above all else.

PREPARING A SPANISH LANGUAGE RECEPTION REPORT

When reporting to Latin American stations, you can create a favorable impression and thus improve your chances of getting a reply by writing your reports in Spanish. And, believe it or not, you can write a passable letter even if you don't know a single word of Spanish simply by following the easy procedures described below. Follow these steps and you will be able to compile a report that can be understood in any Spanish-speaking country in the world.

FORM LETTERS

Lets start by choosing one of the many Spanish language form letters that are available. SPEEDXTRAS, 780 NW Wallula Ave., Gresham, OR, 97030 offers such a form free to SPEEDX contributors while yet another preprinted job is available from Gilfer Associates, Inc., Box 239, Park Ridge, NJ. Frankly speaking, I tend to avoid preprinted forms unless supplied by the station itself. Instead, I prefer to start each report from scratch modeling it on the form shown on the next page. Why not do your own thing? Take the best parts of several different forms and make up your own. Or, if you must, use one of the above. Regardless, however, you must still fill it in and to that chore we now direct our attention.

DATE, TIME, AND FREQUENCY

First comes the easy part, filling in the date, time and frequency. But be careful you don't confuse your reader. Write the month out and use the day, month, year system. The fourth of July, for example, should be reported 4 julio 1973. For reference, the other months are

When reporting time, use the 24 hour system to avoid confusion. In addition, you should use local time wherever possible with Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) a second choice. Local time may be identified by placing the name of the country after the words "hora de". Thus 10:21 p.m. in Venezuela becomes

hora de Venezuela 2221 horas

Often you can obtain local time from time checks given by the station but, chances are you will have to calculate it. An excellent aid in this regard is "World Time in All Countries" chart in the front of the World Radio and TV Handbook. This chart gives the difference between GMT and local time for each country of the world. Simply convert your local time to GMT and then to the local time in the country desired. Don't forget, however, that winter in the Northern Hemisphere is summer in the Southern Hemisphere and vice versa.

SAMPLE FORM LETTER

Frequencies are by far the easiest to report. Simply write down the number. You may use the abbreviations kcs and khz if you prefer or write out kilohertz and kilociclos. Either one will be understood.

RECEPTION QUALITY

When reporting reception quality, don't assume your reader is familiar with SINPO, SIO, or other internationally accepted codes. Convert your numerical code into simple one word descriptions using the table below. To a reader unfamiliar with the aforementioned codes, the picture of reception quality thus presented is far more graphic and descriptive.

Add notes where appropriate to supplement your observations and note interfering stations, the type of station doing the interfering, and the location of the interfering station relative to the station being reported. A typical note might be

interference from +5 khz or interferencia desde +5khz

or this comment on overall merit

readable without difficulty or claro sin dificultad.

These greatly enhance your report of reception quality and really mark the difference between a good report and a mediocre one. Take the time to add these extra touches, you'll be glad you did.

PROGRAM DETAILS

Now we turn our attention to the most difficult part for DXers who are not familiar with the Spanish language, namely the reporting of program details. Actually, this is a lot easier than you might think if you keep a few things in mind.

Many DXers simply list their details using one or two word descriptions. This is an easy way out but, unfortunately, also shows how few really good details you have to offer. Try writing short paragraphs about what you heard. This stretches your details and creates a much better impression. You can also list your details as before but, with an introductory paragraph before them, the harsh spartan impact of the list is softened.

Simplicity is the key word. Most of us use very complex sentence structures when we speak and write. This is the result of many years of education and practice. When it comes to another language, however, we are like children learning to read and write, members of the Dick and Jane set. If you consciously make an effort to write simple sentences using the vocabulary available in the list at the end of this article you will be amazed at what you can accomplish.

Write your sentence in English first, then translate it word for word. If you find you have made your sentence too complex, rewrite it. This will take some practice at first but you'll soon get the hang of it. Take this paragraph, for example

Your good music called my attention to your station. I heard several songs in this musical program. Then, I heard a commercial for Branly Martel and one for Casa Electrica. After the commercials I listened to the news read by your announcer. Unfortunately, severe interference appeared and I was not able to understand this newscast. During this time, I noted the following details.

Now, let's convert a few of the sentences into Spanish. The first is quite easy

SU BUENA MÚSICA LLAMÓ MI ATENCIÓN A SU EMISORA.
Your good music called my attention to your station.

You see, word for word. Easy wasn't it. Now, let's try the second one.

ÓÍ VARIAS CANCIONES EN ESTE PROGRAMA MUSICAL.
I heard several songs in this musical program.

Note two things. First the pronoun "I" is a part of the verb in Spanish as are the other subject pronouns. There is no need to translate them as we shall see in the next sentence again. Secondly, note that the adjective "musical" follows the noun. Descriptive adjectives normally follow the noun in Spanish while limiting adjectives, like good, bad, his, your, and numerals, normally precede the noun. Now, the third sentence which, like the first, is a simple word for word translation.

UÍEGO ÓÍ UN COMERCIAL POR BRANDY MARTEL Y UNO POR CASA ELÉCTRICA
Then, I heard a commercial for Brandy Martel and one for Casa Electrica.

Ok, now it is your turn. Take the last three sentences and translate them. Check your answers with the solutions below. You see, it was easy wasn't it. Make a few mistakes?? Don't worry!! Your reader will understand you even if the word order is a little mixed up. The most important thing is that you will be addressing your reader in his language, an act which cannot help but create a favorable impression.

A CONFESSION

Yes, my fellow DXer, there is more to the Spanish language than what is presented herein. You will, no doubt, find the vocabulary list all too insufficient. An English-Spanish dictionary will help here and several good ones are available in paperback. Fawcett's "Worldwide Spanish Dictionary", available at most paperback bookstores, is a good example and includes some useful phrases and verb conjugations.

In addition, you will find this approach takes considerable time at first. Don't give up, however, as your speed will increase as you become more familiar with the vocabulary and learn to write those simple sentences. In the end, you will find your extra effort well worth it as those Latin American QSLs come rolling in.

This then is one DXers approach to compiling a Spanish language reception report. In future columns we will discuss ways of personalizing your forms to improve them even further. By all means try at least one report using this technique. Give it a whirl. And, don't forget to report all those great veries to the QSL section of SPEEDX.

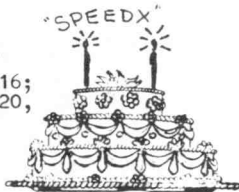

Before I do anything else I would like to thank Steve d'Adolf for the wonderful job he has done for SPEDX and hope that if he isn't back into the thick of things in the future, that he at least has the best of luck. Also, a belated welcome to Don Johnson, immediately following on most of these pages.

Some reminders, etc., before I get into the Europe/Africa news portion of the Roundup. When reporting to Europe/Africa or any other SWBC logging section, it is extremely helpful if you use regular letter size paper (apprx. 8½ X 11), write or type on only one side, minimal double-spacing between items, and it is extremely helpful to set up each item

in a manner like you see it printed above. However, the best bet is to use SPEEDX's printed reporting forms which really make the job easier for the editors. You can get a supply, for the time being, from the SPEEDX P.O. Box for an SASE. For you new members to SPEEDX and/or first time reporters, coming soon is a New Member's Packet that will include sample reporting forms, list of standard abbreviations in SPEEDX, plus how to report. This should be coming out shortly. Watch for some word on this.

Last, but not least, let us not forget that this month marks the second anniversary of SPEEDX. Let's hope for many more happy ones as SPEEDX grows bigger and bigger. Now on to some news.

Deutsche Welle Relay Station, Malta: "The relay station of Deutsche Welle on Malta is still under construction and shall finally guarantee sufficient reception quality of Deutsche Welle programmes for listeners in the Mediterranean, including the countries in North Africa as well as the Near East. Until now, one medium wave transmitter of reduced capacity is in operation; programmes of music, with announcements in English are at present broadcast on the frequency of 1570 kHz.

The entire plant will include one medium wave transmitter and three short wave transmitters of a capacity of 250 kw each. Its completion is expected for 1974"

Deutsche Welle Relay Station, Antigua: "Together with the BBC, Deutsche Welle will erect a relay station on Antigua Island in the Caribbean. As of yet no tentative date has been set for its operation. The station will consist of two short wave transmitters of 250 kw.

Merger?: "According to recent West German newspaper accounts, for financial reasons, the Brandt government is seriously considering amalgamating Radio Bremen and Saarlandischer Rundfunk at Saarbrucker with larger operations in West Germany. QSL hunters take note!"

These four new QSL cards will be coloured reproductions of paintings that appeared on the cover of RAI's booklet that comes with its quarterly program schedule. Oh yes, the word ERGASTIOPHOBIA means....the fear of work. I have it!dj

(Brooks) Please note, I have noticed that many of you have not been sending return postage to some stations. This is not a good practice. Always send rp. as these stations are doing you a favor by answering, so the least you can do is to pay postage. In the past I too have not sent some UTE stns RP but right now many UTE stns are discontinuing QSLing. Maybe postage plays NO part in their decision, but lets not give them something else to use as amo for not QSLing.
- Also something else disturbs me. In a talk with a long time Chicago Dyer he had a complaint for me. He said that the QSL NST-Northern Ireland sent

him was trimmed unevenly so as to fit in an envelope. He said that he sent the QSL back to them, telling them in a letter, if they can't do it right, don't do it at all. I find this type of thinking, in poor spirit especially for a DXer that has been around for a long time. Remember, Utility stations are doing you a favor when they send a QSL, as they don't solicit repts nor do they have to reply. Please be nice, don't demand a QSL. Also be sure when you rept to a station that you actually heard them. There have been several complaints that people have been MIS-hearing stations and then demanding they QSL. A case in fact is that of an East Coast DXer who heard New York Radio. He called RCA-NY when he could them listed in the utility handbook as NY Radio. He argued for $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour with the Chief Engineer that it was an RCA stn and the Chief Engineer said it wasn't. Well, the stn the DXer heard was the New York Radio (FAA) Aeradio Station, which IS NOT an RCA stn.

So once agin I make a plea to you UTE DXers, please be sure of what you are reporting and please be polite. The name of the Chicago DXer who wrote NST has been withheld. We have received several complaints about things he has done that have been less then propper. A recent meeting with this DXer showed that most of the complaints were justified. However, since this DXer wishes not to have his name printed in this column with respect to the NST incident, I have respected his wish.

Please remember, my deadline is the 13th at Deerfield! Send all reports wether US of Foreign as soon as possible. I have been receiving 4 pages of QSLs a month and I only have 2 pages to list them.

Another note, BRIBING station officials to QSL is quite legit. Several top knotch DXers have found that cancelled (or unused mint) stamps of the commervative variety go quite well with extracting QSLs from those rarer stations. Ye editor has found that stations prefer either Kennedy (6¢ or 13¢) Stamps or US Space Stamps. Other favorites include any COLORFUL us stamps, so save your red/brown Eisenhower and Red/White & Blue American Flag 8¢ stamps.

By the way, no matter how bad off the American dollar is, never underestimate its QSLing power. An american greenback has much lubricating power when it comes to those hard to QSL stations. I personally have never resorted to the dollar bit, but I do send stamps, post cards and My SWL card, on occasion. On reports sent out like that, I have netted about a 98% reply factor! My favorite letter, was the one from a maritime stn who is known for its reject letters. They sent me a letter which a veri stat and full data QSL. Under it they quoted the ITU rules, said that they could not in the future verify repts and thanked me for the stamps. A little kindness, goes a long long way-----73's and Good Dxing


