Just what does 1975 have in store for the DXer? Well, for openers there will be monthly reports of new relay outlets for Trans-World Radio and Deutsche Welle, as well as a resurrection of the BBC-Christmas Island story....things we'll still be hearing when 1976 rolls around. The travelling Billy Graham shortwave station rumor will surface again mentioning at least two previously unmentioned sites plus the ubiquitous Hawaiian tales. Several persons will report hearing McMurdo...I will, again, not be one of them...but I will be the first SWL in Oakdale to verify BBC-Sackville and RCI-Daventry simultaneously. And how about the Frequency Recommendation Committee suggesting that WWV move off 5.0 MHz to uncover Nepal. Of course, a minimum of fifty new and somewhat localized DX clubs will be formed...forty-seven of which immediately conduct a shortwave station popularity poll...none of which will be won by Tirana...but all of which will be publicized on "Sweden Calling DXers".... Hey, this outlook isn't foolproof...but when I speak, E.F. Hutton listens!

YOU'RE NOT LIKELY TO HEAR IT ON RADIO GRENADA, BUT...Grenadians are surprised that we only drink eggnog around the holiday season. Grenada is known as the "Spice Island" because it claims to supply one third of the world's spices. That's a big boast for one skinny, 21-mile long island where everyone seems involved in growing its chief crop...NUTMEG. According to a Boston Globe item forwarded by Ken Compton, the aroma of nutmeg fills the air there year 'round and eggnog, liberally laced with the spice, is sipped more commonly than Coke...regardless of the season. Rum, distilled both commercially and in many a home, is something you mix into this, as into most drinks. Beginning to sound like a SCADS gathering to you? Year-end holidays on Grenada are celebrated with plenty of music and dance...but the drink is "sorrel", a spicy concoction made from a local red berry. No doubt, much like d'Adolf's locally prepared "Micronesia Punch". The holiday delicacies, however, are apples and grapes imported from the United States. The article contends that the idea of mixing West Indian eggnog with West Indian rum was first popularized in colonial era America...not, as popular Stateside legend insists, at a convention of BCB DXers in Vancouver just a few years ago...

ACORNS FROM OAKDALE: Ever notice when a drunk spills a drink...it's never his he spills...

DARWIN DISASTER DOWN-UNDER: The Christmas cyclone which struck Australian Northern Territory disabled Radio Australia's peninsula transmitter array at Darwin. At presstime RA officials knew there was damage to the aerials but did not know to what extent. The disaster also crippled the ABC's 8DR medium wave outlet, whose transmitter was lost, but the studio remained intact. They did retain the services of an emergency generator, however. So important to communications for the northern peoples, Station 8DR received immediate assistance from both Radio Australia and Australian Post Office facilities. A line was arranged from Darwin by micro-wave net via Mt. Isa to Townsville, then Brisbane, down to Sydney, over to Seymour, and then up to Shepparton. From there the programming was transmitted by 50KW to the Northern Territory where it was received at the National Emergency Center station. From that site the signal was rebroadcast to listeners in Darwin on the normal 650 KHz frequency of 8DR...assistance will continue until it's possible to put 8DR-Darwin on the air in normal fashion. While Radio Australia does have listeners in the Northern Territory, of course, they do not rely on RA for service information. Meanwhile, the broadcasts normally transmitted via shortwave from Darwin are going out from the RA Shepparton complex at reduced power...

The U.S. Postal Service will introduce new International Reply Coupons on 1 January, 1975...The UPU adopted a proposal which, in part, provides for a new coupon which differs from the one currently in use... Effective January 1st the new IRC will go on sale throughout the country at the 26¢ per coupon...only the new coupon will be sold as of the first of the new year. The new IRCs issued by foreign countries will be exchanged in the U.S. for stamps worth 18¢ for each coupon. The USPS has elected to postmark all IRCs at the time of sale in the lower left circle, the space reserved for the postmark of the issuing country. The old style coupons issued by foreign countries will be honored for 18¢ exchange in the U.S. through 1976.....

DEUTSCHE WELLE POSTSCRIPT: The following article from one of eastern Connecticut's dailies is carried as a follow-up to the Jackie Masek correspondence and the Europe-Africa Roundup item, both appearing in the December issue of the SPEDIX bulletin...A threat or a promise?

Voice of Germany To Cease

Norwich Bulletin, Friday, November 29, 1974

BONN (UPI) — The government-sponsored Voice of Germany radio station will end its 10-year-old program of broadcasting West German news in English to North America by Jan. 1.

The abolition of the program will leave East Germany's Radio Berlin International as the sole German station still bearing English-language broadcasts to the United States.

Konstanz Schmoelder, head of the Voice's North American department, is upset over cancellation of the program.

"The ostensible reason is that there is a lack of listeners, but according to a U.S. survey there are 2.5 million Americans who listen to shortwave broadcast for political content," Schmoelder said.

Deutsche Welle, as the voice is of-

ficially called, is a government-financed radio station that broadcasts political, cultural and economic news from West Germany in German and in 33 other languages around the world.

The decision to close the U.S. English language service was made by the station's general manager, Walter Steigener.

A British Broadcasting Corp., James Monahan, advised the station after studying its operations that there were not enough Deutsche Welle listeners to justify broadcasting to the United States in English.

"Monahan obviously has no real idea of the American communications market," Schmoelder said.

East Germany already broadcasts more than 10 hours of English-language programs to the United States and an

additional five hours in German.

"The irony of it is that while East Germany," having established diplomatic ties with Washington, is increasing its information activities in the States, West Germany is cutting them down," one of the station's American broadcasters said.

"There is a chance that our department can be saved if there is enough of a public reaction against the decision, but this is the only chance," Schmoelder said.

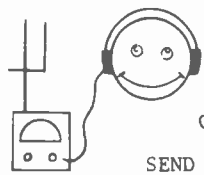
"I don't know what the reaction will be in the United States on the official level, whether political figures will react to it as an unfriendly act," he said.

"But I know our audience in North America will be very disappointed and we will get many letters of complaint."

THE BRITISH RETREAT, THE FRENCH STRIKE: Most of us are aware of the shake-up of yet another European broadcasting organization, the Office de Radiodiffusion-Télévision Française. While it cannot have much impact on the ORTF's already minimal English language schedule, it concerned the news journalists in Paris sufficiently enough to cause them to call a strike, according to one of two stories forwarded by Serge Neumann, a bit of a newsman himself. The newsmen have been striking to get back jobs for 261 journalists who will be jobless in the ORTF reorganization. The second item, datelined London, announces Britain's ten-year plan to thin its air, land, and sea forces. The plan marks a new retreat from global commitments the government finds too costly. These cuts mainly will affect Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Malta, and Cyprus.... All are regarded as outposts of a bygone empire....Mention of these specific areas will probably cause speculation that this might also result in reduction of BBC expenditures on overseas relay bases or, in some cases, a closing of operations of broadcasting centers altogether...How about Tebrau...subject of cessation or relocation rumor for some time...or the limassol transmitter?

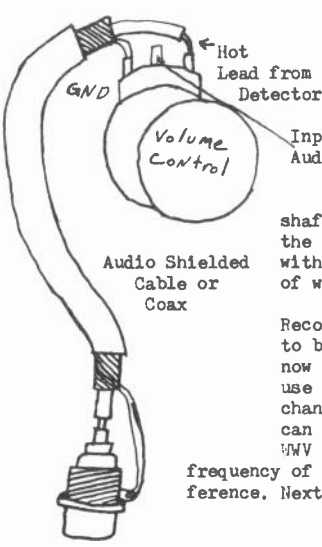
"MAYDAY MAYDAY MAYDAY This is the #3%&* (garbled) Lee, the #3%&* Lee. Hit a rock. @#%& (fade, QRN)."
"ATTENTION The leftist government of Col. Kling has just been overthrown. The new government will be lead by our new president, Mr. Spock."
"Hello listeners, this is the Voice of Nibi-Nibi signing on in the 60 meter band."

If I have your attention now, I'd like to ask how long it would take to start recording from your receiver when you intercept an important transmission. What brings this to mind is the Mayday on the first line. I heard this two weeks ago, and called the local Coast Guard. No one else heard this, and after a single transmission, nothing more was heard. If this was for real, I was the only one with a chance to save the people involved. If I had been able to start a tape recorder fast enough, I might have been able to pull a location out of the static. What I did receive was of no value except to alert them.

Many, perhaps most, communications receivers now available have an audio output suitable for connection to a recorder. If you have a recorder, there's not much reason not to leave it connected and loaded with blank tape, ready for use at a moments notice. Some DXers have a recorder going whenever they are listening, just in case. You can never tell when you will hear a news bcst, a DX tip or an address you want to capture complete.

For quality recording, you should have a direct connection between the radio and the recorder, not place the microphone in front of the speaker. Likewise, the recorder accessory cables that clip onto the speaker terminals are not a good idea. They are prone to fall off, and they are disabled if you plug in headphones. Much better is to use the low level audio output provided, or add one yourself. (This is labeled Detector Out on some receivers.) If your recorder has a line, or auxiliary input, this should be used in place of the mike input.

To add an output jack, first remove the radio from it's case. NOTE: Do NOT try to connect an AC/DC radio to other equipment, except as instructed in the owner's manual. To do so presents a shock hazard to the operator, and possible damage to the radio or recorder. Drill or find a suitable hole on the chassis or case. Best connectors for this are phono jacks, which mount in $\frac{1}{8}$ " dia. holes. If you don't want to drill a hole in your radio, you may be able to mount the connector in a vent hole with large washers, or you may instead hang a shielded cable out the rear of the radio, and mount a cable type female jack on it.



Interconnect the phono jack and the volume control pot as shown in the illustration. The ground side of the pot will be the side that has black wires, or the braid of shielded cables going to it. The center lug of the pot goes to the audio amp, and is not used for this modification. The lug identification shown in the picture is a Input to rear view, and will be correct for controls that Audio Amp give increasing volume with clockwise rotation.

It's a little more confusing if your receiver has concentric controls, two pots mounted with the rear pot shaft passing through the middle of the front pot. Just remember the front on the radio (which is usually volume) is connected with the rear shaft. Be sure to remove all solder splashes, bits of wire, and metal filings before replacing the case.

Recorders which have automatic record level adjustment are much to be preferred over those that don't. Most inexpensive cassettes now have this feature. If you have a stereo recorder, you can use a "Y" adapter to put the receiver audio into both recorder channels, for a slightly better signal when played back, or you can record two different receivers at the same time; perhaps WWV on one channel so you have time references, or a parallel frequency of the desired station for protection against fading or interference. 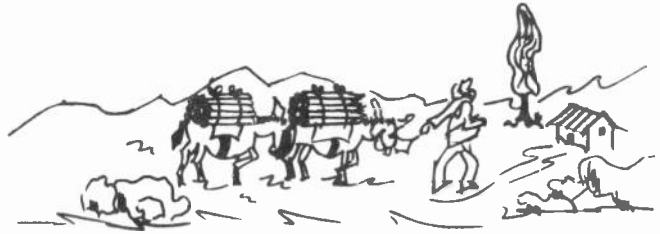

C.R.E. ECUADOR'S SPORTS SPECIALIST

Mention C.R.E. to an Ecuadorian and you'll most likely soon find yourself involved in a lengthy discussion of sports of all kinds. This is because Guayaquil based C.R.E. has established itself as one of Ecuador's most popular stations by utilizing a programming format built almost entirely around extensive coverage of sports events. Soccer, of course, gets top billing but baseball, basketball, boxing, horse racing, and that Ecuadorian favorite, auto racing, also get in-depth coverage. It is no wonder Ecuadorians know "Donde hay deportes alli esta C.R.E.";

C.R.E. began operations on September 1, 1940 and has gained in popularity ever since. The key, no doubt, to its success is its sportscasting team which includes many of Ecuador's most skilled announcers and knowledgeable commentators. Ricardo Chacón, perhaps better known as the widely respected "Don Richard", heads the veteran team which also includes Walter Espinel Jaramillo, editor of the widely read column "Mundo Deportivo", José "Tucho" Guerrero, a baseball expert, Danilo González Puga, with 16 years experience calling horse races, and Tito Velarde, recognized by the Ecuadorian Boxing Association as one of the leading authorities on the rules of boxing. As the station pennant boasts "La experiencia no es un accidente".

Technically C.R.E. employs both its own transmitters and those of its affiliated stations to air its sports coverage. Power is 5 kilowatts, soon to be increased to 10 kw, on 1050 kilohertz and 5 kilowatts on 4765 short-wave. Furthermore, for major sports events, C.R.E. feeds the Radio Cadena Nacional network whose outlet in Quito is another well known sports broadcaster, Emisora Gran Colombia. This linkup was also used when C.R.E. originated Ecuadorian coverage of this year's World Cup soccer matches in Germany.

C.R.E. is widely noted with strong signals throughout North America on its 60 meter band outlet. Although the station operates from 1045 to 0400 GMT daily, the best time to listen seems to be around 0200-0400 GMT. C.R.E., despite a slight lapse, may be considered an excellent verifier. Pop music and news are usually noted in those rare instances when they aren't broadcasting some sporting event. The next time you tune their way remember that your're tuned to Ecuador's sports specialist.

LATIN POTPOURRI

The DX season has barely begun but already it is promising to be a another banner year. Seems like new stations are popping up all over and many rare or seldom heard stations are checking in with surprising regularity. I wouldn't get too far from that radio if I were you.

In the new station category, and we seem to be having quite a few of those lately too, we have TGTZ Radio Tesulután which has begun operations on 4835 kilohertz. Programming is musical-cultural-educational and includes much typical Guatemalan marimba music. Your editor, thanks to a tip from Al Miller, notes this newcomer with poor to fair reception with the best reception noted around the stations 0300 GMT sign-off.

Also noted this month is the 25 mb outlet of Radio Clarín. Mike Mahoney advises logging the news program Clarín Informativo on 11700 khz around 2200 GMT. According to a recent Sweden Calling Dxers program, this outlet will operate for 10 hours a day. Observations by ye ole editor would seem to indicate this will be for daylight operations only.

Jack Jones advised it was only a fluke when he logged Mexico's Radio Mil. Then, as if to make a liar of himself he goes on to log that elusive Honduran, La Voz de Occidente. Well Jack, you've got us all drooling but, what are you going to do for an encore?

Well, on to the loggings. But, before I go I do want to extend my special thanks to Don Moore for submitting the material on which the article on C.R.E. is based. In addition, I want to wish each and every one of you the very best of DX in this new year 1975. Remember, all times are GMT, dates are given in the month/day format, and reception conditions are noted in the SIO code.

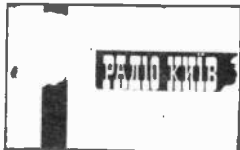

PERU TO NATIONALIZE COMMUNICATIONS COMPANIES!

On December 14, 1974 President Juan Velasco's military regime announced the nationalization of all privately owned international radiotelephone, radiotelegraph, and text terminals effective March 1st, 1975.

The companies to be nationalized include-Cables West Coast Co., (a Cable & Wireless Ltd subsidiary) and All American Cables & Radio, (a subsidiary of International Telephone & Telegraph-ITT). After March 1st, all communications will be handled by ENTEL, the State communications agency. Part of the Telegraph will be run by the Peruvian Post & Telegraph Company. Several years back, Velasco took over another ITT subsidiary, the Peruvian Telephone Company, the Swedish-owned National Telephone Company, and the Swiss owned South Telephonic Company.

Several days earlier, Chile nationalized all of ITT's interests in the radiotelephone communications companies in Chile! (via Sunday Daily News Dec.15-Mike Agner)

There has been a growing trend of nationalizing US run & owned companies in Central & South America. A sport more popular than football, nationalization has had the effect of reducing the chances of QSLing those countries PTP outlets. It may be wise to QSL Tropical Radio Companies outlets in both Panama and Honduras, before they to become nationalized. Tropical Radio Companies outlet in Nicaragua went to Satellite several years back and now uses shortwave once a month for a test of their emergency backup system. (Tropical Radio Corporation was the Tropical Radio Telegraph Company which changed it's name. It is owned by the United Fruit Company.)

NAM-USNAVCOMSTA-Norfolk 5865 kHz sent duplicated letter with no data due to 'National Security' in 2 weeks. (Schilde, Germany) It is interesting to note that most QSLs to US and Canadian DXers have full data, but overseas listeners receive the 'National Security' letter.

If you do not use the forms please be sure to include all the info indicated on the forms that you possibly can: Country, Freq, Call, Station Name, City, Language, Type of Broadcast, Sex of vm, SIC, Date, and please include your name and state like this: Handler-IL or Compton-MA at the end of each logging.

2-If you're not using the report forms please try to use regular weight paper. Onion skin is too easily crumpled, torn or lost after it is cut into strips for sorting.

3-Leave at least 1/4" (double line-space if typed) between your loggings.

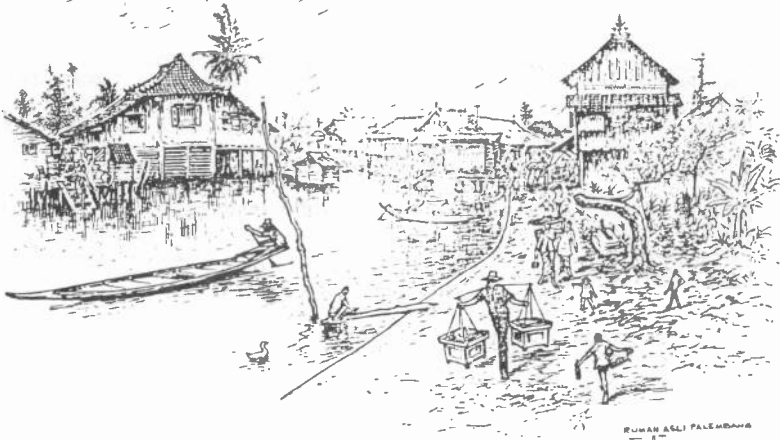

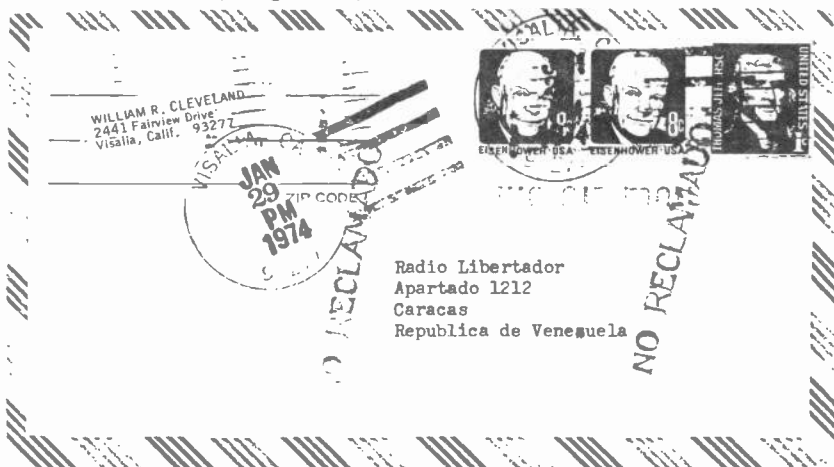

Checking back thru SPEEDX for the last two years, I see no one has reported a QSL from this particular station. Since it isn't that hard to hear (3245 khz) and some of you habla espanol, there must have been at least a few worth reports in that length of time if sent to the correct address. Along the same line, H.L. Chadbourne suggests a friendly message expressing interest in the country and a few pictures of your town and you at your rig. Try it--they may like it. After all, the name of the game is FRIENDSHIP.



Now, to vent my frustrations with Jaime Cabezablanca's monthly refrain and Steve d'Adolf's view that we should be able to at least identify Russian, Georgian or Armenian (3/73, p.21), QSL REPORTS fights back. For your titillation or exacerbation, as the case may be, a sign of the times may appear as space permits. LANGUAGE TEACHERS FOCUS ON SHORTWAVE MEDIUM

Part I: By Dr. Richard E. Wood

The Grand Ballroom of the Denver Hilton was the scene for the presentation on November 30th, of "Radio in Foreign Language Teaching", at the joint annual Meeting of the American Council of the Teaching of Foreign Languages American Association of Teachers of French, and American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese.

The session, attended by well over one hundred professors in the field of language instruction from all parts of the US, at high school, college and university levels, was the culmination of three years' activities of the Language by Radio Interest Group, an affiliate of ACTFL. The session was chaired by Professor Alan Garfinkel of Purdue University, whose Ph.D. dissertation focused on the creation of radio programs as a Spanish teaching technique.

There were four speakers, representing both high school and university levels and several languages of specialization.

Smith, Chairman of the Department of Foreign Languages at West Chester State College, Pennsylvania, offered an illustrated slide presentation outlining the prime requirements in the selection, purchase, operation, and maintenance of an adequate shortwave receiver. He emphasized the importance of avoiding gimmickry, unnecessary bands, fancy but use-less controls, multiple but unconnected transistors, and other features which simply distract the user of shortwave equipment from the major international broadcast bands and the two basics of selectivity and sensitivity. Smith emphasized that the basics of shortwave broadcast technology have not changed for thirty years. Half the panel members themselves used receiving equipment dating from the 1940's. Not only does it have a life-time of use, but a substantial careful investment will procure a receiver with high resale value. Smith displayed slides of band surveys, equipment catalogs, and some popular receivers.

The second speaker, SPEEDX member Richard Schwartz of Dover, Delaware High School, spoke on the role of shortwave radio as an educational technique. The language is authentic, the message direct and immediate, the content of news broadcasts already largely familiar to the alert student, thus enabling him to work on the linguistic medium in which the news is presented, the target language. He illustrated this with a recording of the Deutsche Welle news and interval signal.

Another SPEEDX member, Dr. Richard E. Wood, Chairman of the Department of Languages and International Studies at Adelphi University, Garden City, New York, then spoke on the choice of frequencies and listening times for different languages, with especial attention to French, Spanish, German and Russians. He distributed a handout giving times and frequencies for these as well as other languages.

RADIO NEDERLAND

VISITED

A leisurely car trip taking a little less than two hours brought us from Antwerp, Belgium to Hilversum. It was an early July afternoon when my wife Marika, her girl friend Renie and I walked into the impressive building which houses Radio Nederland Wereldomroep. Situated alongside a countryroad leading from Hilversum to Bussum the concrete multistory building with lots of picture windows allows the visitor a beautiful view of the lush green surroundings.

I was holding my breath because I had failed to call in for an appointment; this in spite of the numerous announcements made on the air, and even once in person, by Tom Meyer of Happy Station. The receptionist called the English section somewhere in the "higher regions" of the building and after a while I was invited to pick up a lobby phone. A young female voice told me that she was very sorry but that most people were on vacation and the few remaining ones were busy at recording shows. By that time I was beginning to realize how stupid it had been on my part to drive to Hilversum without getting a clearance. Nevertheless, coming from California on a maybe once in a lifetime chance to see R.N. I was not about to give up that easily. Furthermore I intended to report on my visit to my fellow SWLers and didn't cherish the idea of going back empty-handed. I pleaded my case in Dutch and before long the voice at the other end of the line surrendered and said "Miss Van Veen will come down to talk to you". I didn't have the faintest idea that the attractive slender blonde would turn out to be none less than the former Happy Station Jean, Tom Meyer's ex-production assistant. In fact it was my wife who made the discovery. Jean who is now assistant program planner and producer in the Dutch section gave us a really grand tour of the facilities.

We visited several studios located in a cluster on the ground-floor including the largest one where a few years back Tom used to present "Open House" live shows and we saw the impressive music records library. From there we entered a studio where we met The Jerry Cowan in the midst of recording a show for the transcription service of R.N. Directing the show was Joop Zuidam and technical assistance was provided by Jo Rijnsburger. The latter being also a regular "Technical Genius of the Day" on Happy Station shows. The meeting with these three gentlemen was cordial and in between takes we were able to conduct our conversation. Jean, our hostess-with-the-mostess took us then to another floor where we un-expectedly ran into a namesake of mine, Thon Raes, who amongst other responsibilities also compiles "Cue" a special informative program for Asia and Africa.

While chatting with Thon I got kind of waylaid into a small room by Mike Popham who had a special interest in the London Bridge which is now in Lake Havasu City, Arizona. Mike works for BBC but is on temporary assignment to R.N. He had somehow heard that I work for the company which had bought the

bridge in 1968 and moved it to its present location. He talked me into doing a tape-recorded interview on this subject which would be broadcast at a later date on the Friday night show "Close Up". After this, off we went again under the patient guidance of Miss Van Veen, and dropped in another studio where we witnessed the recording of an Indonesian language program. Jean introduced us to Hans Verwey, continuity assistant and Pim Wijmer, technician. Once again a lively conversation was started and Pim apparently impressed by my curiosity for technical matters tried to give me a cram course in sound recording. His equipment is first class and up to the state of the art. I imagine it must be a pleasure to work with. I could easily have spent an entire day with Pim. Hans Verwey told me that in the near future he was leaving for Bonaire where he would be taking on a tour of duty at R.N. relay station. My wife and girlfriend, in the meantime, were having a conversation of their own with Jean; the subject of which escaped me but it wouldn't have surprised me a bit if it had been about "Hubby being so fascinated with electronic gadgets". Needless to say quite a few pictures were taken as we went along.

Finally we made one more stop in a smaller studio where the news in various languages was read and fed directly over a point-to-point frequency to Bonaire and Madagascar for re-broadcast in the various programs. The technician there can, at the touch of a button, pick the best frequency available for these point-to-point transmissions even though the transmitter is miles away from the studio. This installation alone could easily be the subject of a separate article but I won't go into it here any further.

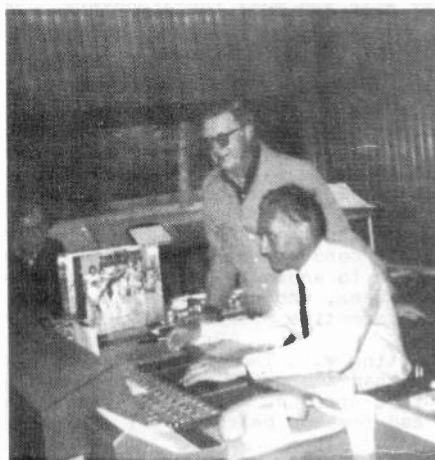

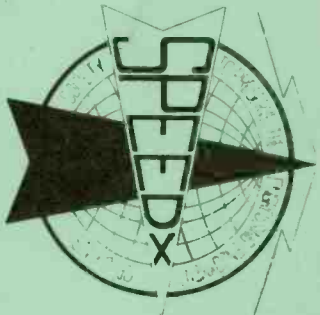
