FINAL CALL: BOD NOMINATIONS

BOARD OF DIRECTORS NEWS

The BOD recently changed an unwritten policy that had existed for several years. That policy required everything in the "Round Robin" - the system used to conduct Board business because of the geographical distance between Directors - to be kept strictly confidential. In the opinion of the current BOD, since the "Round Robin" is the official monthly meeting of SPEEDX, and since the SPEEDX Constitution has established the organization as a democratic one, the details of those "meetings" should be available to the membership. There are, of course, certain "in-progress" discussions which Directors can still request to have kept confidential until they are more fully developed, but for the most part, it is the intention of the BOD to regularly print details of discussions, motions, and votes in UP FRONT. We also hope that by keeping you better informed, you will feel free to write to us with your comments and concerns. This is your club, SPEEDXers, let us know what's on your mind!

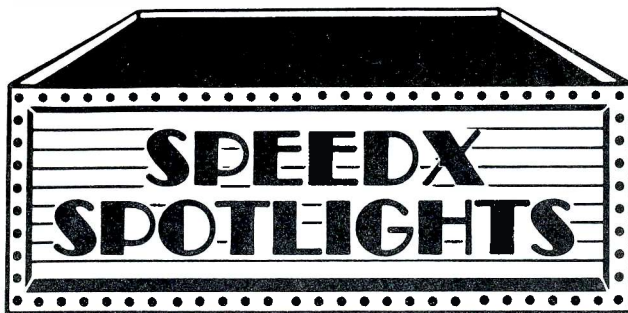
So here are the current items that have been or are being discussed by your Board of Directors:

1) **SPEEDXGRAM Rate Changes:** A discussion has been going on for several months over changing the subscription rate for the 'GRAM for people who are not members of the club. There are only a few such subscribers, and we are happy to have them, but to allow them to subscribe at the same rate as regular members does not seem fair to those members. A new rate has not been set, but the current proposal would add a surcharge to non-members.

2) **Local Chapters:** The BOD has informally chosen the Local Chapters project to be the next major undertaking for the club. President John Trautschold and Business Manager Jack Sanderson are coordinating the plans and details, and more info should be available soon. Also take note of several column editors who have been advertising their willingness to organize local chapters in their areas.

3) **SID/Reporting Codes:** There has been some feedback from a few members and staffers concerning the accuracy and usefulness of the SID reporting codes currently used in the logging columns. This doesn't need to be a year-long debate; that was taken care of in the late 1970's in the pages of DX Montage. But perhaps a reevaluation should be undertaken. A suggestion was made that a committee of staffers and members be organized to do this reevaluation, possibly including a review of the abbreviations list. Such a committee would be open to any and all suggestions from the membership, but the debate would

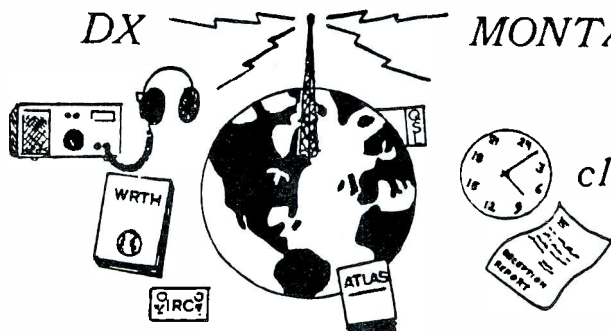

One other note: if my memory serves me correct, I believe John Cereghin is celebrating his 2nd anniversary as W/H editor, and BM Jack Sanderson is one year at the helm. Congrats, gents. Now, onward to this month's column.....

Another New Publication is Coming! Jack Sanderson has informed us that the latest supplement to the SRGU is going to the presses and should be available soon. Approximately 81 pages, it includes a new section on Maritime & additions to Commercial Aeronautical, USCG and Basics sections. Cost will be in the neighborhood of \$4.50 First Class Nam and about \$6.00 air mail printed matter to the rest of the world. The 1985 Dayton Hamvention: by Michael Schulsinger: To a hardcore electronics hobbyist, an April trip to the annual Dayton Hamvention was like a 3-day-pass to heaven. Though originally intended to serve the Amateur Radio community, the Hamvention has expanded over the years to include something for nearly everyone in non-professional electronics, and over 25,000 people bought admission tickets in 1985.

Most SW receivers on the market today, from the Sony economy models, to the Japan Radio professionals, were offered by many of the 200 vendors, often at a discount. NOAA Weather Service and the Space Studies Institute maintained information booths, though the CIA chose not to return for technician recruiting this year. The outdoor flea market, now at 1500 spaces, was the high-tech equivalent of a Middle East bazaar, with everything from old military technical manuals to the latest 64k and 256k RAM chips. By Sunday afternoon, when sellers must load what goods they still have back into their trucks, prices for large, heavy items can become very, very negotiable.

The hottest thing at this year's Hamvention was probably packet radio, permits radio amateurs to communicate via their personal computers through an inexpensive hardware/software interface. Heathkit claimed that their 1st packet radio production run, expected to sell over a 90-day period, sold out just 14 days after introduction.

The highlight for SW listeners was the Sunday morning SWL forum, sponsored by the Miami Valley DX Club and hosted by Brad Lovett. As you might

expect at a gathering of Amateurs, emphasis was on utilities. Fred Osterman discussed and compared baudot and ASCII radioteletype, Telex over radio and the various means of receiving them. Bob Grove touched on available publications, new general coverage receivers above 30 MHz, proper interpretation of FCC rules and wrapped everything up with some interesting frequencies to listen to.

The 35th annual Dayton Hamvention is tentatively scheduled for April 25-27, 1986, but motel room reservations are now being accepted. Write to Dayton Hamvention Housing, 1880 Kettering Tower, Dayton, OH 45423, with your room requirements. Advance ticket sales do not begin until January 1, 1986, so consult amateur radio magazines early next year for the price & mailing address. (Thanks, Michael, for your annual report. ds.)

DXM Time Capsule: Three years ago, in June, 1982, the following stories were making headlines... In response to "Argentine Annie" the British Defense Ministry inaugurated "Radio Atlantico del Sur." Broadcasting from Ascension, typical programming included play-by-plays of bombing raids in the Falklands, and were intended to demoralize the Argentine troops... The clandestine "La Voz de Alpha 66," which transmitted from three Miami sites, was raided by the FCC... and finally, 1982 was the year when U.S. Government officials announced the plans for Radio Marti.

The Polish Solidarity Movement: A video transmitter from Solidarity's daring underground was smuggled to the roof of a Warsaw building recently & flashed the message "Solidarity Survives!" onto the TV screens of Polish viewers of the government-controlled evening news. This and other embarrassing penetrations of government radio and TV throughout Poland show that the most active underground movement in history against a communist regime is making a mockery of Warsaw's claim to control every aspect of Polish life.

Portable transmitters, both video and radio, fit into a small attache case and are capable of sending a steady signal for four minutes on frequencies used by government TV and radio. Solidarity activists, facing the risk of jail or worse if they get caught with the transmitters, have worked out an ingenious safeguard: A transmitter is placed in a high building, the antenna stuck out a window. The broadcast begins with the touch of a button, and the operator leaves. When the police arrive, the 4-minute broadcast has run its course, getting word through to tens of thousands of viewers.

There is also a weekly average of no less than 1,000 pages of government-banned, underground material, which is sent to Radio Free Europe, & that must represent only a fraction of the total. Solidarity activists taped the entire trial of the secret police in the murder of the Catholic priest Jerzy Popieluszko. Radio Free Europe broadcast all of it back to Poland. What gives the Radio its unique and immense value is not the broadcast of major public events in Poland but of the unknown, clandestine events. WOU Signs Off For Good: Mariners trying to reach out a touch someone via SSB-VHF from 200 miles or so off New England's coast won't be using WOU's for further communications. That's because New England Telephone Co. decided to shut down the 40-year-old station's Green Harbor, MA transmitter & receivers located at Narragansett, RI; Southwest Harbor, ME, and at Provincetown and Gloucester, MA.

Fishermen, commercial sailors and yachtsmen seeking weather information and notices to mariners will now listen to NMF, a 10 kW Coast Guard facility based in Marshfield, MA. "We talked to the Coast Guard, and the FCC requested the Coast Guard to increase the number of notices to mariners & weather broadcasts," said New England Telephone's Tom Baines. "They agreed to do that." Baines said that New England Tel was losing \$200,000 a year as customers turned to other communications systems. Fishing fleet offices use their own radio systems to advise fishermen at sea of prices and other information, while the fishermen used CB to contact each other at sea.

Most offshore vessels now carry programmable VHF radios that can pick up the phone company's High Seas Frequencies, but expensive gear is needed for the MARASAT hookups. The new service requires a radiofax system with radio, or a fax machine if a SSB unit is already installed. It would enable boat owners to receive current information and current forecasts.

Two broadcasts over NMF (0930 UTC on 3242.5 kHz and at 2130 on 7530) will provide weather for mariners. An oceanographic analysis, showing such

information as Gulf Stream movement, temperatures and warm and cold water eddies, is now broadcast Monday through Friday, with its maps based on information from a weather satellite. (Edited from an article carried in a recent issue of "Offshore" magazine, and sent in to DXM by M.J. Stutterheim-NY.)

Justice Won't Block Test of Submarine Radio: A Supreme Court Justice refused to block the Navy from building facilities for testing a new way of communicating with submarines. Associate Justice John Paul Stevens, without comment, turned down an emergency request by Wisconsin and a Michigan county that said electromagnetic radiation could hurt people.

The idea of project ELF is to allow communication with submarines 300 to 400 feet below the water's surface through extremely low frequency radio transmissions. Submarines now must come close to the surface or send up an antenna to pick up radio signals, increasing the chance of detection. The local officials, who say the plans are illegal because there has been no study on environmental impact, prevailed in a Federal trial court but an appeals court in June allowed the Navy to resume construction. (Via Ruth Hesch-NY)

Three U.K. Radio Pirates Launching Seaborne Stations: The crowded international waters off the Thames estuary east of London, home to Britain's seaborne pirate radio stations, look set to become even more crowded, as three more illegal broadcasters signal their intention to begin transmitting later this year. Already anchored off the eastern coast are Laser 558, the American-backed pop music station, and the established pirate broadcaster, Radio Caroline, which celebrated its 21st birthday this year. The biggest of the three potential newcomers is Wonderful Radio London International, backed by American money from Texas-based Marketing Communication Counselors.

Radio London's backers say they intend to use a 50 kW transmitter, enabling them to reach a potential audience of 110,000,000 from England to Denmark. Talks are underway, the company says, to sign up international advertisers. The station will broadcast pop music during the day and gospel music at night, with a launch potentially within the next six months.

The two other pirate stations, which will operate from the same ship, plan to debut in June. One station will transmit golden oldies, the other country & western. Even more pirate ships could put to sea when community radio (low powered stations) comes into being later this year. There is no guarantee that any of Britain's 70-odd land-based pirates will receive licenses under the CR scheme, and some have indicated their intention to begin seaborne broadcasting as a result.

Pirates, whether on sea or on land, are immune from the standards imposed on local commercial radio stations in this country. (Our friend, Tom Sable-NY was kind enough to pass this along to DXM. ds.)

Better BBC Audio, via Jeff Elson-MD: The BBC announced on their Waveguide program of May 9th that they are now using a new audio processing system, called "Optimod." The new system is supposed to result in much better audio for voice programs, and in particular should improve the crowd noise audio surges for sporting event programs. They also stated that music transmissions should also be improved. They are requesting reports of listeners as to any improvements noticed. According to Waveguide, improvement should be most noticeable when signals are weak. (Now, if Radio Cairo can get a similar setup, we'll be in business, hi! ds.)

Ronald Pokatiloff is offering a Commodore 64 computer program for International Broadcast listeners. Within the program is the first comprehensive schedule of actual programs in prime time (2300-0700) to North America. The cassette is available for just \$15 from Ronald at the following address: 2661 Sheridan Rd, Zion, IL 60099.....

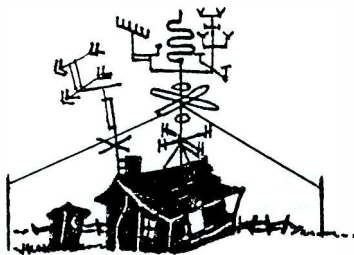

Since I wrote the April column and mentioned my reluctance to recommend any particular supplier, I have come across a couple products and suppliers that will just have to be mentioned. As much as the products, the generous cooperation shown by the suppliers is worthy of mention and the membership has a right to know about reputable, cooperative suppliers. So, this month a big TNX goes out to Bob Grove of Grove Enterprises, (& editor of Monitoring Times) 140 Dogbranch Road Brasstown, NC 28902, and Fred Osterman of Universal SW Radio 1280 Aida Drive Reynoldsburg Ohio 43068. Both went well out of their way to help me. The separate stories follow.

Part of my job as editor of this column is to keep up to date on antenna-related accessories, their performance and the prices. I have previously called the SST T-1 tuner the best I've ever used. Unfortunately, they have gone out of business and the tuner is no longer available. I had heard some good things about the Grove Mini-Tuners, the Tun-3 being the present model, but I wasn't too impressed with the \$54 price tag. Then, I noticed in the Grove catalog that it had been marked down to \$39 (plus \$2 for UPS or \$5 for USPS delivery). I wrote to Bob, and after being assured that the price would remain in effect I asked him if he felt confident enough about this preselector/tuner to let me have a loaner for side by side tests with the T-1. He did, and UPS delivered the Tun-3 a couple weeks later. The results on the SW bands were remarkable. With a 100-foot longwire the Tun-3 equalled the performance of the T-1 on the low bands and beat it by a mile on the higher bands. I did not test it on the BCB or below. Coverage is from 100 Khz to 30 Mhz. Very high "Q" (and image-rejection) is developed in the interesting circuit, with two limited-range coils in each of the 4 Range positions. A .365 variable capacitor acts as a fine-tuner. I found it useful to put 10 marks around the Tune knob, for resettability on each band. Finding the peak for any frequency is easy, as the S-meter really jumps up when you hit it. Ease of operation is a big plus. The whole 2-30 Mhz range is covered in just two switch positions. There are also Bypass and Ground positions. It is a compact, good-looking unit (black and grey) and is in my opinion an excellent value for the money. It's image-rejection qualities are almost unbelievable. I had told Bob that if it could totally eliminate the very strong Cuban station image at 4880 on my Panasonic, he had a winner. No other tuner had ever been able to do that. It did, with ease, and I bought the unit. For absolutely best reception, a half wavelength of wire is recommended, but experiments also showed that it would greatly help a much shorter length of wire. One note about getting your settings for ANY tuner: do it on the weakest stn you can find, on a band that's "in". Tuning the NOISE on a band that is not in can give false readings.

Modern receivers with get PET front ends need all the static buildup protection that they can get. The best bargain in the new gas-discharge protection units is probably the Alpha-Delta LT-2. I saw that Universal carried the unit at the competitive price of \$19.95 plus \$2.75 S&H. I had used one with a coax lead-in but was not sure if it was suitable for use with a singlewire lead-in, and wrote to Fred Osterman about it. He went to Alpha Delta with the question, they ran tests with a LW, and came back with the answer: Yes, 100% effective. Fred even agreed with my suggestion that he start including hookup directions for use with a LW with each unit, and is doing so already. Thanks, Fred!

AFRTS - THE NEWS Carl Huffaker, Mexico

The recent Mexican disaster found me tuned to AFRTS. I had my other receivers tuned to FM and the UTE's, but I was, once again, convinced that the US networks provide the best coverage of foreign news.

The first reports were a bit confused by American concepts. It took time to recognize the unique gas distribution system in the city, and more time to realize that the residential neighborhood was a "barrio" of closely packed, highly inflammable shacks, but after the initial reports, the reporting was up-to-the-minute and accurate. An interesting confusion is that, even two days later, the US reports refer to relief centers in nearby churches. One of these, the Basilica of Guadalupe, is a plaza and complex designed to handle over 50,000 pilgrims at a time, a magnitude that the offhand reference scarcely indicates. Also, much to the credit of the Mexicans, was the brief announcement over local radio that Emergency Plan No XXX was in effect. I doubt that many people knew what the plan was, but the Army, Police, Red Cross, and Pemex moved rapidly into efficient operation. The North American is more concerned with numbers and statistics than is his Latin neighbor and the reports of official figures often reflected this. (I remember, during the war, that I sometimes felt that the effort spent in deriving completely accurate casualty figures could have been better spent elsewhere.)

Could the DXer tuned to local radio ~~now~~ derive a better picture of the actual situation? I doubt it. He could only, as I did, fit local color into the overall view provided by the US networks. He could, if he were familiar with the culture, make minor corrections of the errors caused by terminology and emphasis. But the basic factual information would best come from US news sources.

I've pointed out some discrepancies in the cultural translation by the news services. These are minor compared to less knowledgeable efforts by amateurs. Recently the Voice of Nicaragua broadcast an anti-American, US produced tape. It was a mixture of English, Spanish, and some not-very-literal translations. To show the friendship between the Nicaraguans and the Americans who were there to witness the invasion, they included a cut of the conversation between one of the teachers and a Nicaraguan lady building a bomb shelter. The lady referred to the visiting Americans as gringos -- and their fighting words in any Latin-American war. The cut on the little children singing a game-song about Regan translated "kill the #3###". The Nicaraguan produced/broadcasts are somewhat more deligent but do give more dignity to the "enemy" indicating a higher skill level in intercultural translation on the part of the Latins.

These same problems of translation exist in other parts of the world, Africa, Europe, the Near East, and Asia. Perhaps this explains the regional specialization of many DXers. Even to understand the English broadcasts, one must learn another cultural language. It comes with time and practice, and having achieved fluency, one can embellish and add to the news programs. But for all the world, or any part of the world, hour after hour, and day after day, the fast, accurate reporting of the American networks is basic and unequalled.

ICF-4910 Grant Sharman, CA

Grant was kind enough to send Tips N' Topics a photocopy of the operating instructions for the Sony ICF-4910. It has 7 shortwave broadcast bands (49,41,31,25.19,16' & 13 meter) plus AM and FM. The 5 3/4 x 3 x 1 inch set weighs less than 8 1/2 oz. It is powered by two AA batteries and has a jack so auto battery or power adapter can be used. A two position tone control allows the listener to adjust for music or speech for increased audio frequency response. The telescopic antenna is used for both FM & SW while the built in ferrite serves for AM. This unit is great for traveling and has a safety switch. Dual conversion circuit reduces co-channel QRM. Very attractive set.

RADIO FREE EUROPE RECEIVES STATIC Ruth Hesch, NY
In a special report to the New York Times on January 17, 1985, Bernard Gwertzman wrote about the U.S. State Department's apology to the Polish Government. The latter had protested a RFE broadcast of January 5th implying Poland was like Nazi Germany and the Prime Minister Wojciech Jaruzelski similar to Hitler. It was part of a regular program for Polish youth and was a satire not to be taken seriously.

The regular complaints Poland has made in the past about RFE's broadcasts to that country and others in Eastern Europe had been brushed aside.

A State Department official stated that this particular broadcast had not been approved by Washington and agreed it was "in very poor taste and was indeed offensive."

Alan Romberg, a State Department spokesman issued a statement on January 16th that "Although RFE receives funds from the U.S. Congress, it is not a U.S. Government agency nor is it subject to editorial censorship by the U.S. Government."

In the early 1950s R.L. and R.F.E. were started by the C.I.A. R.L. beams its programs to the Soviet Union and R.F.E. to Eastern Europe, both specializing in news and commentaries about internal developments in the Communist world.

Congress formed a Board for International Broadcasting overseeing these two stations after the C.I.A. connection was made known. The members of this board are selected by the White House.

THE WORLD IS YOURS Ruth Hesch, NY
Do you remember when you became interested in SWling? Were you confused, overwhelmed by the technology, terms and the vastness of the subject? Now there is available a 63 page inexpensive paperback book that should be in the hand and read before the beginner in the hobby pushes the "on" button of the receiver. It leads the reader gently into the subject in easy to understand, non-technical terms, progresses logically and maintains interest.

It begins with what can be heard, how signals are transmitted, buying the first receiver, the antenna and additional equipment. It continues with the explanation of UTC, interval signals, a brief description of the shortwave bands, sunspots and how they affect reception, QSLs and reception reports are discussed. Also mentioned are AM DXing, time stations, amateur radio, long wave, pirates, CB and telephones. Sources of more information are given as ANARC clubs, ANARC Convention, WRTH, Confidential Frequency List, the Radio Amateurs' Handbook and DX programs. There is a chapter on sports programs. It contains a glossary with easy to understand explanations, the Morse Code, and a sample log sheet. All of this and more is in "The World Is Yours" by Samuel R. 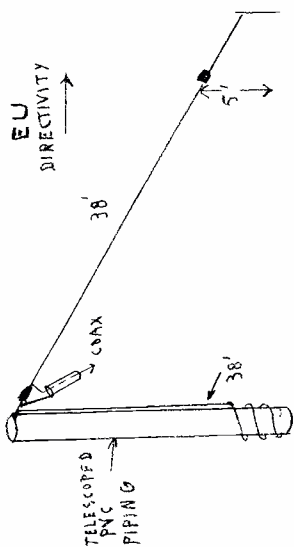
WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN SW RADIOS David Claytor, MI
An informative article on selecting the right receiver appeared in the Ann Arbor News on April 17, 1985 which was taken from Changing Times Magazine. TNT will attempt to print this article in the near future but in the meantime, those thinking about getting another receiver may want to look this article up. It is entitled... What to Look for in Shortwave Radios.

QUARTER-WAVE SLOPER Edward Moll, PA

A new antenna here is a quarter-wave sloper for the 49M band --- mainly to enjoy the programming and music from Austrian Radio ORF. The sloper has some good low-angle directivity in the direction of the slope and requires about half the real estate as a dipole. Mast is of telescoped PVC piping with one leg of the sloper taped to the mast. At the very bottom it is wound around the mast to use up the 36 foot length of the vertical leg. The far end of the sloping leg should be about 5 feet over ground.

Antenna also does well on 41 and 60 meters although performance is peaked on 49M. Remember in the low sunspot years these bands will be active ones --- note even now that EU's are poor on 31 many nights. This sloper also has directivity to Europe on 16, 19 and 25 ---- not superior gain but not bad either and it cuts out some of the regional hash.

Today Austria ORF has started operation on 6000 with higher power (50 kW) 2000-2300 and 0500-0700. I'm hearing them weakly at 2001.

TIP TO AVOID INTERMOD ON DX-400 Phillip Dampier, NY

The DX-400 is a great receiver although it suffers from one major drawback, intermodulation, especially when the QTH is near a local MW station. I have found that if you use a patch cord between the receiver & tape recorder, it must be well shielded. An ordinary patch cord will provide a means for radio stations, intermod and other hash to feed into the audio often covering up what you intend to record.



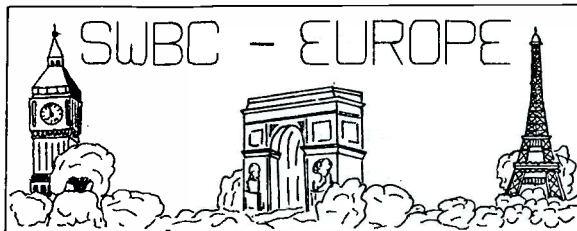

ALBANIA Albanian Radio carried the announcement of Enver Hoxha's death at 1000 on 4/11. Further announcements were carried mainly at scheduled news bulletin times. These were interspersed with funeral music. The radio signed off as scheduled at about 2050.

On 4/12 and subsequent days, the Albanian Radio domestic service continued to sign on and off as scheduled (0250 and 2050 approx.) and announcements were made at scheduled news bulletin times, with solemn classical music in between. A relay of the funeral proceedings took place from 0755-1117 on 4/15.

The Radio Tirana external service was not noted to have departed from its regular transmission schedule, although programming was devoted to material on the death of Enver Hoxha. (4/18)

BULGARIA This year, Radio Sofia has been broadcasting its external service programs one hour earlier according to GMT since 3/31. In previous years, external service programs had been unaffected by the local change to summer time. (4/11)

U.S.S.R. A Radio Moscow printed schedule shows that the 1900-2000 English service for listeners in Great Britain and Ireland would be broadcast on 15.10, 13.70, 11.82, 9.76, 9.60, 9.55 and 7.32 MHz from 5/5.

On 5/1, the All-Union Radio domestic services carried a special reportage from the May Day parade in Red Square, Moscow. At 0515, all the Orbita versions of the First Program linked up with the European USSR's First Program. They were joined by the Mayak service at 0550 when the live reportage in Russian from Red Square began. It was observed until 0730 on some 64 shortwave channels between 5.9 and 21.66 MHz, including those channels beamed to Soviet seamen and compatriots abroad.

The Radio Moscow World Service carried an English language report from the Red Square. It was heard on some 39 shortwave channels from 0545-0641. The French language Radio Moscow International service stayed on the air after its scheduled signoff at 0600 and broadcast its own commentary from the Red Square from 0545-0625. It was heard on some 22 shortwave channels. RMI finally closed down at 0700. (5/2)

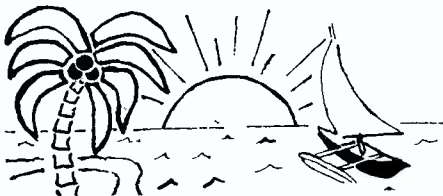

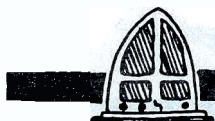

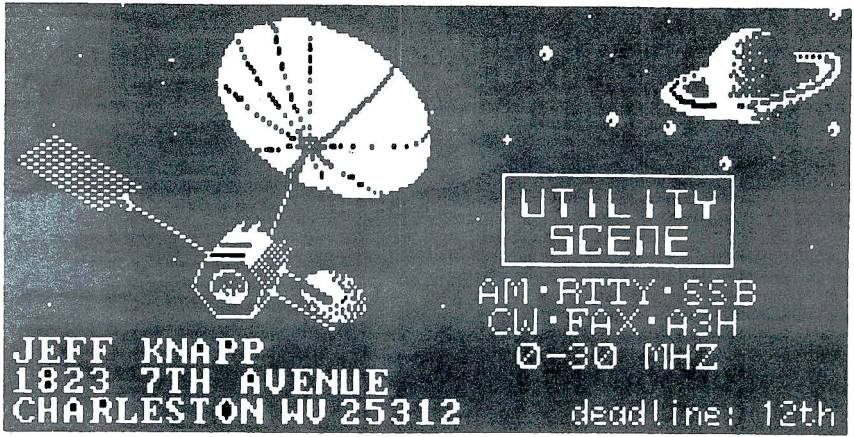

4) SPEEDX Constitution Revisions: Business Manager Jack Sanderson, with suggestions from the remainder of the BOD, came up with a revised version of the SPEEDX Constitution. This revision included changes to reflect the current club situation and additional job descriptions. The revised version was necessary because of changes in club policies, operations and staff positions during the fourteen years since the original document was adopted. For example, the jobs of Publisher and Publicity Chairman, while established by the Board of Directors, were not actually listed in the Constitution, and as such, the exact duties of each were sometimes not clear. The new Constitution would clear up those questions. Actually, the reference to a "new" Constitution is inaccurate, because what it really is is the old Constitution with a number of rewordings and additions. As established in the existing Constitution, the BOD has the sole power to adopt and revise a Constitution. A resolution has been proposed by Tom Kephart to adopt the revised version of the Constitution. This resolution is being voted on in the current Round Robin.

5) Honorary Full Members: A resolution honoring a number of SPEEDXers with lifetime Honorary Full Memberships for their outstanding contributions to the club was proposed by Tom Kephart. The names are being kept confidential until the results of voting on the resolution are known. These members, as Honorary Full Members, would still have to pay annual dues, but would not have to contribute to the magazine in order to maintain voting rights and other Full Member benefits.

Results of the voting on the two resolutions described above should be available for the July issue of SPEEDX.

HELP FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

A couple of months back in UP FRONT we had a request for information that might help visually impaired SPEEDXers to more fully use the magazine. I am pleased to say that the response was great, and the suggestions follow:

"Just a note to let you know that portions of SPEEDX are now

available to the visually handicapped through our organization [DX Radio Network]. We are currently transcribing most articles, and comments, and also some good DX catches and the like. We do not read logs unless they are different from the ordinary because of tape space.

These are available to the visually handicapped for a required yearly donation of any amount. Foreign residents are required to pay postage costs.

If anyone out there knows a visually handicapped person or is in fact handicapped, simply drop us a postal card to be added to the mailing list. Please no braille letters. Cassettes are acceptable though."

I can rest it on SPEEDX with the pages open and slide it up and down as desired... works very well, on all sizes of lettering in SPEEDX."

"Dear Tom and members:

I am sorry to have to report that SPEEDX lost a member and I lost a friend recently. Old timers in the club may recall Russ Mappin. He once told me he had been with SPEEDX since the club started. Well, Russ passed away a little over a month ago. He was in his mid-eighties.

Russ and I shared many happy hours together, mostly in his upstairs DX den in the Mappings' home on West Garland here in Spokane. He was a collector, in his later years, of antique radios, and was especially proud of several E.H. Scott models from the 30's and 40's, and a McMurdo-Silver "Masterpiece". Russ would buy his antique radios wherever he could find them and lovingly restore them to working order. I well remember on Scott "Philharmonic" with 30 tubes, a speaker that must have been 16 inches in diameter, and an enormous cabinet of beautiful hardwood. All above-chassis components were completely shielded and Russ had re-chromed the entire chassis, cans and all. This was his favorite, and I can tell you firsthand that

reception was unbelievable - especially on BCB! I well remember one midwinter day around noon that Russ called up all excited to say he was listening to WHD-1040, Des Moines, Iowa on the Philharmonic. Middy, mind you; and Des Moines is probably 1200 air miles and two sizeable mountain ranges from Spokane! I dialed it in on the best receiver I had and only got noise.

Russ had been a radio buff since the dawn of the 1930s if not earlier. He had QSL cards from as early as 1932 and from stations whose names would be remembered only by those select few "senior" DXers who began before WW II.

My friendship with Russ goes back to 1973. I think it befits the memory of the man best that, more important than his tenure, ability, and acquisitions in the radio field, Russ was a top-notch human being: a man of God, and a gentleman. I feel privileged to have counted him as a friend."
