Scheduled for the four-day event are technical and video exhibits, ANARC club displays, internationally-known speakers, and more! Radio stations and manufacturers will sponsor receptions, and there will be an international broadcasters forum. A banquet and swap meet will round out the activities.

## 1-900-CALL GLENN

Tom Kennedy and Glenn Hauser are launching a new 24-hour service for DXers, DX-Daily: The Shortwave Information Line. Updated every day, callers can get about four minutes worth of tips, daily programming on SW stations and the latest schedule for "World of Radio." Each message will begin with a preview of the information that will follow, allowing listeners to choose whether to stay on the line or hang up. The cost is 95¢ per

W8BI/8 will usually be operating in the general and novice phone and CW portions (as band conditions dictate) to allow as many as

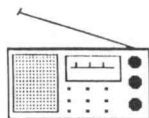

## BOOK FOR R-5000 OWNERS

I recently received a copy of *The Kenwood R-5000 Communications Receiver User's Handbook* by David M. Corney, WB2FCR. This 34-page guide contains information that looks helpful to users of the R-5000. The first chapter details modifications of scanning, memory channels and BCB sensitivity. Installing filters, a voice synthesis unit and a

VHF converter are covered next. A detailed section on remote control use and modification rounds out the text. Appendices list Kenwood addresses and phone numbers as well as software titles for remote control of the receiver. ## LAST MINUTE NEWS

from *Buffalo Creek Valley DX Note*, 4/1/94

These items just in...

- Management at Radio Moscow, tired of leasing its own transmitters out for everybody else's programming, has recently received a license from the FCC to build four 500 kW shortwave transmitters in the heart of the US! This relay station will be located 12 miles southeast of Paducah, Kentucky and will be used for the Uzbek and Tamil services exclusively.
- A new 1-900 phone service has been set up for lonely DXers looking for a mate that understands getting up at 4:30 a.m. to listen to static. Call 1-900-LUVASWL to meet that special someone!
- It has been determined that the ill-fated revolution attempt in the tropical island nation of Kuuwamatu was the work of a radical, left-wing DX club. Members of the Honolulu-based SYKODX were found to be masterminding the plot to divide the peaceful empire into 47 separate nations. "We were going to put a transmitter on each island, thus creating almost fifty new radio countries! We

would have been heroes in the DX world!" stated the president of the club just before his sentencing.

- Our Euro/Asia correspondent Antonio Fábula has just reported that a joint agreement has been signed by Radio Cairo, RAI and Radio Pyongyang. They will be sharing their vast expertise in a major conference to be held in Rome next month. RC technical engineers will present "High Quality Audio," followed by RAI's panel discussion, "Exciting, Personality-Based Programming." The delegation from the DPR o' K will conclude the session with "Humor on the Air."
- Finally, this time of year always seems to bring about surprising format changes, and April '94 is no exception. As hinted at earlier in the year, Deutsche Welle is cancelling its news and culture programs in favor of a satellite feed of the all-sports WSCR, 820 AM in Chicago. It seems that listeners worldwide were clamoring for 24-hour coverage of the Chicago Cub shortstop controversy and Michael Jordan's attempt to make the ChiSox. Go figure...

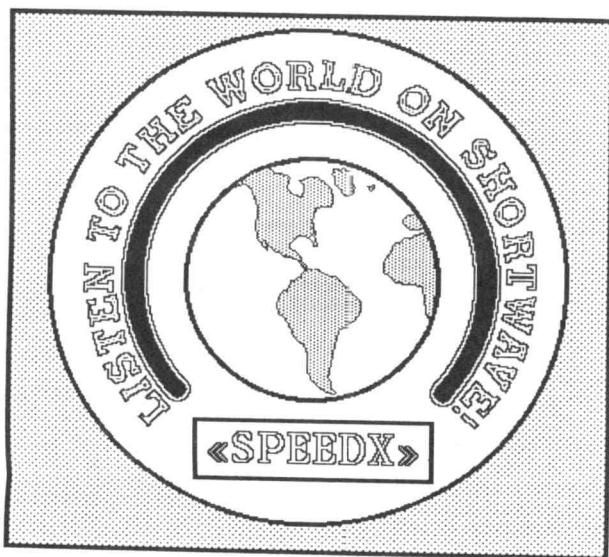

## Africa

**Angola** - Clandestine, A Voz da Resistencia do Galo Negro, is testing a new frequency; 11,850 kHz for use during its regular 1050-1400 UTC broadcasts. (BBCM via World of Radio #734 - 2/24)

Radio Nacional de Angola is monitored on 9,720.2 kHz at 0650 UTC with African music and an identification at 0705 UTC. (Tony Orr, VA, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 3/5)

**Burundi** - La Voix de la Revolution is being heard in North America with a good signal on 6,139.8(v) kHz at approximately 0300 UTC with a station identification in French and choral music. (Tony Ward, Ontario, via ODXA "DX Ontario" - 3/94)

Radio Burundi appears to be off the air. Radio Burundi had been operating on a frequency of 6,140 kHz. (BBCMS Summary of World Broadcasting #6 - 2/11 via NASWA Journal - 3/94)

**Cameroon** - Radio Garoua has reactivated on 5,010 kHz. Try listening at about 0600 UTC. (Tony Orr, VA, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

**Chad** - Radio Nationale, heard on 4,904.5 kHz, is opening later than before. Now heard with sign on at 0455 UTC. (DSWCI Shortwave News via World of Radio #734 - 2/24) Radio Nationale has been heard signing on late at 0455 UTC. The published sign on time is 0403 UTC (Peterson, Palandra Shortwave News - 2/94 via NASWA Journal - 3/94)

Radio Tchad Libre, a clandestine broadcaster, has been heard on 5,902(v) kHz at 0504 UTC with music and a station identification in French. (Ron Kaneko, Canada, via ODXA "DX Ontario" via Monitoring Times - 3/94)

**Equatorial Guinea** - Radio Africa is being heard daily here in North America from 0500 UTC sign on until 0730. Frequency used is 7,190.26 kHz. (Ernie Behr, Ontario, via World of Radio #734 - 2/24)

**Ethiopia** - Voice of Ethiopia is heard on 9,560 kHz at 1459 UTC with an interval signal followed by English. There is considerable interference from Radio Jordan when they sign on at 1500 UTC. (Brian Alexander, PA, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

**Liberia** - ELBC signs on at 0655 UTC nightly with the national anthem, station identifications and religious programming in English. 7,275 kHz is the frequency used. (Brian Alexander, PA, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

**Sahara** - Clandestine broadcaster, Radio of the Democratic Arab Saharan Republic, has been heard on a new frequency - 11,320 kHz - at 1930 UTC in Arabic and from 0000 in Spanish. This station used to be on 11,520 kHz. (Tony Orr, and Hans Johnson via HCJB DX Party Line via Monitoring Times - 3/94)

**Zaire** - Radio Candip is active on 5,066.3 kHz. Sign on is at 0300 UTC. (Hans Johanson via NASWA Journal via ODXA "DX Ontario" - 3/94)

**Zambia** - Radio Zambia has been popping up quite regularly in North American loggings these days. Broadcasts in vernaculars on 4,909.8 kHz can be heard from 0245 UTC to approximately 2210. The English service is heard on 7,234 kHz from 0300 UTC to approximately 2200. (Hans Johnson, NASWA Journal - 3/94) The service in vernaculars carries an English news bulletin at 1800 UTC. (Bue, Shortwave Bulletin #1243 - 2/2 via NASWA Journal - 3/94)

## Asia & The Pacific

**Afghanistan** - Radio Afghanistan is still off shortwave. The only frequency currently heard is on medium wave at 1278 kHz. English is broadcast at 1720-1735 UTC on that frequency. (Andrew Sennitt, Netherlands, via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 2/24)

**Australia** - Radio Australia is to begin using a new array of five curtain antennas recently constructed at Shepparton. The following changes in the English language schedule will occur when the new antennas are put into use: 0100-0630 UTC on 13,605 kHz; 1200-1600 UTC on 5,995 kHz. The latter frequency may be fairly well heard in North America. (Radio Netherlands Media Network - 2/24)

**Bahrain** - Radio Bahrain is being heard on 9,745 kHz with sign on at 2100 UTC followed by station identification and news in Arabic. (Bob Padula, Australia via Radio Netherlands Media Network - 3/3) I have heard this broadcast a few hours earlier in the day on rare occasions. It always turns up on 9,746 kHz. (ed)

**India** - AIR Port Blair is reported to be using 7,170 kHz from 0230 to 0400 UTC. This frequency apparently replaces 7,180 kHz. The change in frequencies is being made because of interference from AIR Bhopal on the old frequency. (OZDX - 1&2/94 via NASWA "Journal" - 3/94)

RRI Jambi (Sumatera) was heard on 4,925 kHz at 1200 UTC with regional music and the "Song of the Coconut Islands" interval signal. (Charles Washburn, ME, via HCJB DX Party Line - 3/5)

RRI Sibloga has been extending its transmissions a bit. It is now being heard signing off at 1607 UTC. That is considerably later than the published sign off of 1515 UTC. The frequency used by RRI Sibloga is 5,256.5 kHz. (NASWA "Journal" - 3/94)

**Iran** - The Voice of the Islamic Republic of Iran has changed frequencies for its 0030 UTC English broadcast to North America. 9,022 kHz has been replaced by 7,170.4. (Ed Rauch, NJ, via World of Radio #736- 3/10)

**Turkey** - Turkish Police Radio is on 7,370 kHz at 0550 UTC. (Robert Ross, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

**Vanuatu** - Radio Vanuatu's shortwave broadcast schedule has been cut back a bit. The broadcaster is currently operating on 3,945 kHz from 1900 to 2300 UTC; on 7,260 kHz from 2200 to 0700 UTC and from 0600 to 1115 (1000 on Sunday) UTC. **Turkmenistan** - Radio Ashkhabad is broadcasting in English on 5,015 kHz, Monday through Thursday, from 1905 to 1910 UTC. (World of Radio via WDXC "Contact" - 1/94)

**Uzbekistan** - Radio Tashkent is heard in English on 6,025 kHz at 1342 UTC. This transmission is parallel to 9,540 kHz. **Hungary** - Radio Budapest changed to a format of half-hour broadcasts for its English service, effective March 27, 1994. Radio Budapest will now broadcast to North America from 0100 to 0130 UTC and from 0230 to 0300 UTC on 5,970, 9,835, 11,910 and 15,220 kHz, and to Europe from 1900 to 1930 UTC and from 2100 to 2130 UTC on 6,110, 7,220, 9,835 and 11,910 kHz. **Italy** - In an effort to provide stronger signals to Central and South America, RAI has entered into a relay arrangement with the BBC, and is now broadcasting via that broadcaster's facility on Ascension Island. **Malta** - Voice of the Mediterranean has English at 0600 UTC on 9,765 kHz. (Radio Vlaanderen International Radio World - 2/19 via Ralph Famularo, Japan)

**French Guiana** - Swiss Radio International intends to have its relay facility in French Guiana operational by June of 1994. (Swiss Shortwave Merry-Go-Round via World of Radio #735 - 3/3) The relay will be used to provide better signals to Central America and western North America. (Larry Nebron, Shortwave Echo, via George Thurmond via World of Radio #735 - 3/3)

**Honduras** - Radio Copan International has replaced its old, 100 watt transmitter with a 1 kW one, and the results are beginning to show up in reports to publications like this one. Listen to 15,675 kHz. (Monitoring Times - 3/94) I noticed a Dutch listener who called Radio Netherlands Media Network to report hearing Radio Copan International, weak but clear, at about 2000 UTC. (ed)

**Peru** - Radio Centenera has been heard broadcasting in Spanish on 6,544.54 kHz from 0000-0500 UTC. There is no reference of this station in reference materials - it may be a new clandestine. (Dave Valko, PA, via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

Radio La Hora has change its frequency from 4,858 kHz to 4,855.2 kHz. (Hans Johnson, NASWA Journal - 3/94)

Radio Los Andes has reactivated. The station can now be heard on 4,750 kHz; down from its old frequency of 4,775 kHz. (Jakobsson Shortwave Bulletin #1243 - 2/2 via NASWA Journal - 3/94)

**Suriname** - Radio Apintie is on 4,990.9 kHz from 0123 to 0444 UTC sign off with pop music. (Robert Ross, Ontario, via Fine Tuning via HCJB DX Party Line - 2/26)

**United States** - WEWN plans to use 9,370 kHz from 2200 to 2400 UTC beginning in March. This frequency is also being used by Radio For Peace International. (World of Radio #735 - 3/3)

Monitor Radio International has switched to 9,344 kHz from 7,510 kHz for its broadcast from WSHB at 2200 UTC. (Jim Moats, OH, via World of Radio #735 - 3/3)

**Uruguay** - Radio Nacional is now inactive. The station had been broadcasting on 6,033.8 kHz. (World of Radio #735 - 3/3)

able to you.

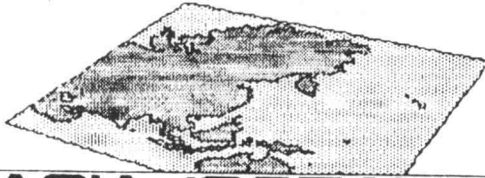
If you have access to a computer and modem, the ANARC BBS is a great  
place to start. Current schedules for dozens of broadcasters can be found  
here, as well as general information on shortwave. Since the board is  
connected to a number of other boards, you can literally send messages  
world-wide. Looking to buy or sell equipment? Need information on anten-  
nas, scanners, etc? Just post a note in the message section. SPEEDX has  
its' own section, and if you want to post those last-minute catches there,  
I'll get them. Users who contribute towards the board's maintenance fund  
have unlimited access to a large selection of downloadable files, such as  
propagation programs, antenna plans, QSL filers and the like. You can  
reach the ANARC BBS at (913) 345-1978.

Both hams and DXers will enjoy the ANARC Shortwave net, which meets  
every Sunday at 1400 UTC on 7240 lsb. Usually at least 10-12 hams are on  
the net each week, sharing news and loggings of note, both shortwave broad-  
cast and utility. A phone number is given out each week for non-hams, so  
that they can get their own items read on the air.

The Committee to Preserve Radio Verifications also enjoys the support  
of ANARC. The CRPV exists to preserve QSLs for the benefit of future SWLs,  
and seeks collections from those no longer active in the hobby that might  
otherwise be discarded: For more information, send a SASE to Jerry Berg,  
38 Eastern Ave, Lexington MA 02173.

The ANARC Government Affairs Committee monitors government actions and  
regulations of interest to the radio hobby. By staying on top of proposed  
actions the committee allows listeners the chance to have a say before the

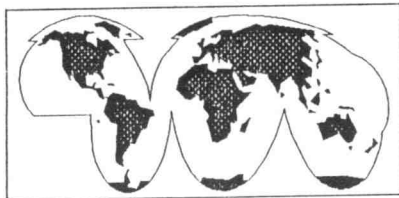



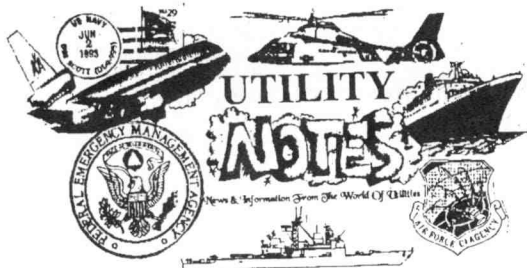

## UN Operation Sharpguard Update

Operation Sharp Guard (NATO/WEU maritime enforcement of economic sanctions against the former Yugoslavia via ships in the Adriatic Sea continues with ships and aircraft operating in CCF 440. The following nations/ships are now involved: Canadian: HMCS Iroquois (DDH-280)-class Destroyer, Protector-class Multi-Purpose Underway Replenishment Ship HMCS Preserver (AOR-510). French Navy: FS Cassard (D-614)-class Guided Missile Destroyer, FS D'Estienne d'Orves (F-781)-class Frigate. German Navy: FGS Lutjens (D-185)-class Guided Missile Destroyer, Bremen-class Frigate FGS Augsburg (F-213). Hellenic (Greek) Navy: Frigate HS Aegeon (F-130). Italian Navy: Maestrale-class Frigate ITS Aliseo (F-574), lead ship of ITS Alpino (F-580)-class Frigate, and lead ship of ITS Lupo (F-564)-class Frigate. Royal Dutch Navy: Kortenaer-class Frigate HNLMS Van Kinsbergen (F 809), lead ship of the HNLMS Jacob Van Heemskerck (F-812)-class Guided Missile Frigate. Royal Norwegian Navy: Olso-class Frigate KNM Narvik (F-304). Portuguese Navy: Vasco da Gama-class Frigate NRP Corte Real (F-332). Spanish Navy: Baleares-class Frigate SPS Cataluna (F-73), lead ship of the SPS Santa Maria (F-81)-class Frigate. Turkish Navy: Yavuz-class Frigate TCG Turгут Reis (F-241). Royal Navy: Sheffield-class Guided Missile Destroyer HMS Birmingham (D-86). Cornwall-class Frigate HMS Chatham (F-87). U.S. Navy: Spruance-class Destroyer USS Comte De Grasse (DD 974), Leahy-class Guided Missile Cruiser USS Dale (CG-19). Not assigned but currently operating with: Ticonderoga-class Aegis Guided Missile Cruiser USS Vicksburg (CG 69).

## MILITARY

### U.S. Navy

● The lead ship of the USS Supply (AOE-6)-class Fast Combat Support Ships was commissioned Feb.26, 1994. Delivery of these ships are running about a year behind.

● The USS Saratoga (CV-60) Joint Task Group (JTG) has been on station in the Adriatic Sea. The 15 ship group will support a variety of U.S., UN and NATO missions throughout the area.

## U.S. Air Force

More force structure changes. The U.S. Air Force has announced force structure changes affecting bases in 47 states to help meet fiscal 1995 budget constraints. According to a Feb. 28 news release the biggest change will be at Fairchild AFB's 92nd Bomb Wing, which will lose its remaining 12 B-52H aircraft in mid-1994. At about the same time, the wing will become the 92nd Air Refueling Wing with the arrival of 31 KC-135R/T aircraft. The new aircraft will bring the number of KC-135s at Fairchild to 60 and complete Air Mobility Command's build of one of its core KC-135 units, the release stated.

Other major changes include:

McConnell AFB, Kan: Base 27 KC-135R/T aircraft with the 22nd Air Refueling Wing this year, bringing the number of KC-135s to 48. The Air Force announced in November that it would inactivate McConnell's 384th Bomb Group this year and move the 12 B-1B bombers to other units.

Grand Forks AFB, N.D.: Transfer 22 KC-135R aircraft to the 319th Air Refueling Wing here by midyear, bringing the number of KC-135Rs to 48. The base will lose its 16 B-1B aircraft.

McGuire AFB, N.J.: Remove 18 C-141B aircraft from the 305th Air Mobility Wing, which will also affect the Reserve associate program, later this year. The action accelerates the drawdown of the aging C-141B fleet. The Air Force announced in November that it would base 24 KC-10As at McGuire. The first 10 aircraft will arrive in midyear with the remainder to be in place by 1995.

Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz.: Transfer six EC-130E aircraft from Keesler AFB, Miss., to the 355th Wing here by midyear. The move is part of Air Combat Command's effort to consolidate EC-130s at Davis-Monthan.

McChord AFB, Wash.: Inactivate the 354th Fighter Squadron later this year and transfer the unit's 21 A/OA-10A aircraft to other units.

Langley AFB, Va.: The largest single change is the removal of 18 F-15C/D aircraft from the 1st Fighter Wing in midyear.

Grissom AFB, Ind.: Inactivate the 930th Operations Group (Reserve) and transfer the unit's 18 A/OA-10A aircraft to other units.

Mountain Home AFB, Idaho: Base six more F-15C/D aircraft later this year and six more F-15E aircraft next year with the 366th Wing.

March AFB, Calif.: End operations at the Southwest Air Defense Sector early next year and consolidate sector responsibilities at the newly established Western Air Defense Sector at McChord. The change resulted from a North American Aerospace Defense Command study.

Kirtland AFB, N.M.: Redesignate the 542nd Crew Training Wing as the 58th Special Operations Wing in April. The change is part of the Air Force's effort to preserve the heritage of its "more illustrious wings." The Air Force also announced it will not relocate the 1st Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron from Pope AFB, N.C., to Little Rock AFB, Ark., as previously announced. Air Force said the unit's training mission is more effective at Pope because of opportunities provided by the 23rd Wing and its proximity to the Army's 82nd Airborne Division.

Air Combat Command will officially name the B-2 stealth bomber "Spirit" its been announced. ACC-1, the first aircraft delivered to Whiteman AFB, Mo., in December, already bears the name "Spirit of Missouri". The second of the 20 bombers will be named the "Spirit of California" as it departs April 1 for its new home with the 509th Bomb Wing at Whiteman. As B-2s are delivered, each will be named after a state, ACC officials said.

So, will the second B-2 use ACC-2 (sounds like "ACE-2") while in flight? Planes with names like ships; I kinda like that. I can just see some great QSL possibilities there!

## U.S. Coast Guard

● The USCG will be getting some new cutters. Contracts have been awarded for construction of the Famous Bouy Tender-class seagoing bouy tenders (WLB's). The lead ship of the class will be USCGC Juniper (WLB-201). As 16 (sometimes reported as 14) are to be built, these will be WLB-201 through WLB-217. Look for the first of these cutters to be delivered in late 1994. Contracts have also been awarded for the Famous Lighthouse Tenders-class of coastal bouy tenders (WLM's). The lead cutter will be USCGC Ida Lewis (WLM-551). The contract is for 14 (WLM-551 through WLM-565). First delivery will be mid-1995. Finally, a contract has been awarded for construction of the Polar Icebreaker USCGC Healy (WAGB-20). This on again, off again cutter will be some 15,300 tons. Look for delivery to be in 1997.

● The USCGC Alert (WMEC-630), NZVE, is under going repairs at Bethlehem Steel and will be out of action for awhile.

● The USCGC Steadfast (WMEC-623), NSTF, which had been under modernization, has been heard a number of times last month. So she's apparently back in service.

● U.S. Coast Guard monitors will also have noted by now the name change of CommSta Portsmouth, NMN, to CAMSLANT Chesapeake. A little background may be in order. The term "CommSta" refers to Communication Station. The Coast Guard has long designated "Master CommSta's" on each coast. They are the "senior" stations on the block for each coast. On the west coast, CAMSPAC (Communications Area Master Station Pacific) San Francisco, NMC, has long used its status title as the Master Station. Portsmouth has held the title of CAMSLANT (Communications Area Master Station Atlantic) but has continued the use of the title CommSta Portsmouth. Until now. Its unclear why the recent change finally came about. It is clear that for now NMN will be known as CAMSLANT Chesapeake.

## MARITIME

● The Holland-American Lines Cruiseship M/S Noordam was involved in a collision back on Nov 6th, 1993. The collision took place outside the three mile limit of the Southwest Passage of the Mississippi River. The 30,000 ton Noordam was heavily damaged after being struck by the 54,158 ton M/V Mt. Ymitos.

● The M/V Lunohods-1, a Latvian fish processing ship, sank in November after running aground in the Shetland Islands.

● China Ocean Shipping has taken delivery of its largest vessel, the Zhen He. The vessel is 900 feet long and 105 feet wide. No weight was given.

## Carrier and Window Frequencies

Some of you have written asking about "window" frequencies and carrier frequencies. It can be confusing when "window" frequencies are used for reporting. Not all radios are created equal. In SSB the easiest way to tell how accurate your "window" or displayed frequency, on your radio is, try this.

Select a popular known frequency, such as 11176.0 Khz, USAF GHFS. Tune the signal until you get good reception and clear voice. If your display reads 11175.9, for example, then your radio display is off .10 Khz. You will need to add .10 to obtain the correct frequency heard to all your receptions. My Icom R-71A starts out cold at 11175.9, gets warm and reads 11176.0, and when on for several hours, ends up reading 11176.1 Khz. So despite the drift and the original offset, all of these "window" frequencies should be reported as 11176.0 to avoid confusion.

In multi-mode reception, "carrier frequencies" are generally used for reporting. The "window" frequency you tune to where you can receive whatever mode you are listening to is not the carrier frequency. Again, select a known frequency and mode. For an example lets use ARQ or Sitor-A. I used WLO Mobile Radio's frequencies as when a ship logs in, their system responds with "WLO" followed by the channel number, for a positive ID. So if you tune channel 1215 (12586.5) and your "window" frequency reads 12585.2, your offset is 1.3 Khz to obtain the carrier frequency. Again not all radios are equal and this is dependent on the mode selected on the radio. I found out my Icom R-71A is not the same as my R-72, so I've had to go back and correct a lot of log entries. I myself am still fairly novice to multi-mode work, so if any of you seasoned vets out there can provide any other tips, advice or plain helpful hints, feel free to jump in and let me know.

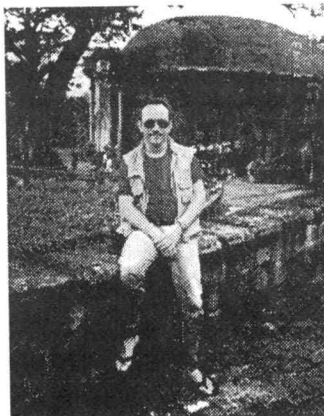
