



MEMBERS CORNER



Joseph Gibson...Little Rock, Arkansas

Joseph is a relatively new member of SPEEDX, but he certainly isn't new to shortwave listening. He began listening in 1938, and what a list of equipment he's used since then. Take a look!

1938: Either an Atwater Kent or Philco with shortwave circuitry operated by a switch in the lower left hand corner of the radio front panel. Antenna was a random length of wire run around baseboard of living room. Heard several stations including Germany with broadcasts of speeches by Hitler.

1942: Entered USAAF and listened to shortwave on radios in various planes on air base (in U.S.) where stationed. Antennas were those installed on planes. Listened to Lord Ha Ha, Aris Sally and Tokyo Rose - what a trio!

1945-1963: Discharged from service. Used personally built receivers purchased from Lafayette Radio and Heathkit - receivers worked fair to good. In 1957 or '58 purchased a portable receiver (multi-band) by Panasonic which worked great.

1964: Acquired a surplus U.S. Navy receiver with which I began serious listening and asking for verifications. Used a long wire antenna installed in a "V" configuration and sloped at about 5 degrees.

1968: Purchased and assembled a Heathkit GC-1A receiver. Used it with great results using antennas of various configurations: 120' long wire, V-shaped and sloped and a delta on a sloped horizontal plane.

1969-1983: Used GC-1A and kept my hand on shortwave and tried my hand at DXing the standard AM broadcast band. Had some success with verification of stations in the U.S. and Canada. Heard several Central American and Caribbean stations but no verifications.

1983: Purchased a Realistic DX-302 and have had wonderful success in logging in stations from the world but have done no reports for verifications.

1974-present: Since I was travelling all over the U.S. working for the Government, used the whip antenna that came with the receiver or a hybrid whip constructed from a telescoping automobile antenna with a coil obtained from Lafayette Radio inserted into whip 2" above ball swivel joint at antenna base and mounted just below ceiling of listening post.

1989: Kenwood R5000 which was placed in operation in late January 1990 as it was a Christmas gift from my XYL.

1988-present: Have purchased from Grove Enterprises the Power Ant III and Minituner 3 along with Ant-6. Also have purchased Grove's Tun-4 Minituner plus an Ant-9. Both Ant-6 and Ant-9 along with Tun-4 were installed in January during the remodeling of my listening post. Also will be installing a Teac Model Auto-Reverse Stereo Tape Deck for recording programs along with time signals of WWV. Further, a Realistic stereo frequency equalizer will be installed.

Joseph, it sounds like you've had a long and interesting "career" in this hobby. Thank you so much for sending in this mini-history. Many of the items you've used over the years certainly bring back some old memories. The best of luck to you and hope you enjoy your membership in SPEEDX.

GREAT CIRCLE NAVIGATION

Greg Fischer of Wisconsin sent in a formula which "computes the great circle distance between two points and the initial heading from the first, given the latitude and longitude of the source (L_1, λ_1) and destination (L_2, λ_2). You can use either the WRTH or a good atlas for determining the latitude/longitude of the various transmitter sites and well as your receiving site.

If you are mathematically inclined, give it a shot and see how you do...

The result of the equation (D) is in nautical miles...

$$D = 60 \cos^{-1} [\sin L_1 \sin L_2 + \cos L_1 \cos L_2 \cos (\lambda_2 - \lambda_1)]$$

The results of the next two equations (H_i) is equal to initial heading...

$$H = \left[\frac{\sin L_2 - \sin L_1 \cos (D/60)}{\cos^{-1} \sin (D/60) \cos L_1} \right]$$


$$H_i = \begin{cases} H & ; \sin(\lambda_2 - \lambda_1) < 0 \\ 360 - H; \sin(\lambda_2 - \lambda_1) \geq 0 \end{cases}$$

Notes:

1. Southern latitudes and eastern longitudes must be entered as negative numbers.
2. Truncation and round off errors occur when the source and destination are very close together (1 mile or less).
3. Do not use coordinates located at diametrically opposite sides of the earth.
4. Do not use latitudes of +90 or -90 degrees
5. Do not try to compute initial heading along a line of longitude ($L_1 = L_2$).

DAYTON HAMVENTION REPORT

The 39th Dayton Hamvention was held the weekend of April 27-29, 1990. The site, by longstanding tradition, was Hara Arena, at the northern edge of Dayton, Ohio. The 1990 Hamvention was attended by roughly 30,000 hams, computer hobbyists, shortwave listeners and scanner enthusiasts, who paid the \$12 admission fee to spend up to three days at the exhibition and flea market.

The Association of North American Radio Club's (ANARC) table was staffed by Dave Marshall of the All Ohio Scanner Club and by Bob Horvitz, who recently resigned as Executive Secretary of ANARC. It provided attendees with basic information about ANARC, brochures supplied by ANARC member clubs and schedules from several shortwave broadcasters.

A new broadcaster on the Hamvention scene

this year was the Christian Science Monitor network. A representative of WCSN in Scotts Corners, Maine told me that the Monitor desired Hamvention space this year, but none was available. The Christian Science stations began a do-it-yourself QSL policy similar to Radio Canada's a few weeks ago, and WCSN brought examples of their new QSL cards, schedules and stickers for visitors to the ANARC table.

George Wood of Sweden Calling DXers dropped by on Saturday, and Jonathan Marks of Radio Netherland's Media Network also spent the weekend in Dayton. Voice of America personnel in attendance included Dr. Kim Andrew Elliott, VOA's one-man audience research department, and John Vodenik from VOA's Bethany Relay Station.

The Listener's Forum was held at noon on Saturday, a change from the Sunday morning tradition that caused several regulars to miss the session. Still, about 90 people attended the forum, which began with a discussion of increasing pressures on the radio spectrum by journalist Benn Cobb. New wireless telephone systems beyond cellular, high definition television and digital audio broadcasting all promise to keep the pressure on the FCC to more effectively manage the RF spectrum. Jonathan Marks and George Wood then gave presentations on changes expected at Radio Netherlands and Radio Sweden.

Notably absent this year was Grove Enterprise, who's Monitoring Times Convention is scheduled for October 5-7 in Knoxville, Tennessee. And something seems to have delayed some new ICOM radios which were expected to be shown this weekend.

Next year will be the 40th anniversary Hamvention, and the Dayton Amateur Radio Association promises to make that one even more special. Take a moment now to mark the last weekend in April on your 1991 calendar "Dayton Hamvention".

HAROLD'S TIDBITS

from: *Harold Langlois - Florida*

From the *St. Petersburg Times*, March 15, 1990: Wu'er Kaixi, a leader of the Chinese pro-democracy movement, is joining a French media-financed effort to operate a pirate radio station from a ship off the Chinese coast, an

associate said Tuesday. Wu'er, who gained world fame for confronting Prime Minister Li Peng before last June's Tiananmen Square massacre, has dropped out of Harvard University, disconnected his telephone and given up his Cambridge apartment, the associate said. Wu'er had been a prominent spokesman for the pro-democracy movement in exile.

And from the *Citrus County Chronical*, March 11, 1990: Entertainer Yves Montand and Chinese student leader Wu'er Kaixi christened a 1,200-ton boat that will transmit pro-democracy radio broadcasts into China from international waters.

The 262-foot boat, formerly a British oceanographic vessel, was renamed Goddess of Democracy after the statue erected by Chinese students in Beijing's Tiananmen Square last year before their protest movement was crushed.

The boat christened Friday is to set sail next week from La Rochelle, a port in the center of France's Atlantic Coast, and is expected to begin its broadcasts by the end of April. It is equipped with two radio studios and a television studio.

The project is sponsored by the French magazine *Actuel*, with assistance from news publications in several other countries. The budget for the operation is \$1.4 million.

Finally, from *Citrus Country Chronical*, April 10, 1990: Radio broadcasters are increasingly worried that Cuba will retaliate for the U.S. propaganda channel "TV Marti," especially since a warning shot three weeks ago that was heard as far away as Utah.


Radio station operators at this week's National Association of Broadcasters convention have done much talking about TV Marti and the threat that Cuba might jam U.S. radio broadcasts in retaliation.

It is widely believed that Cuba has radio transmitters 20 times the strength of the strongest U.S. AM stations.

Broadcasters also fear that the TV Marti transmissions might disrupt Florida TV stations - chiefly in Tampa, where a station already broadcasts on channel 13, the same used by TV Marti.


CLANDESTINE NOTES: A Ship, and a Failed Mission

Esta es Radioemisora Tarabuco, desde Tarabuco, Departamento de Chuquisaca, Bolivia." (This is near Sucre, in the southwestern part of the country.) Daniel Camporini and Gabriel Ivan Barrera first noted a station here last September, but it has been only recently that Daniel was able to catch the ID; Tarabuco's signal was tough even for our excellent DX-friends in Buenos Aires, so good luck, y'all! 

IN WHICH LANGUAGE WAS THAT ID?

La Voz de Atitlán broadcasts in Tzutuhuil, the local Indian language of the area. One of their on the half hour ID's ran:

Te, Ge, De, Ese, rztojbal tnamit Atitlán, nismaja champ
dos mil trescientos noventa kilociclos en ciento veinte
metros.

I've underlined the Tzutuhuil words. Perhaps I should have underlined Atitlán. It's an Indian name that became Spanish in the church name, Santiago de Atitlán, and returned to the Indian language as the name of the lake area.

I have only a few lines of Tzutuhuil text available, but a quick analysis suggests that "rztojbal" is voice, "tnamit" is coming from, "nismaja" is heard, and "champ" is a grammatical prefix indicating a location.

The form, however, is not Spanish, but that of the American radio stations of the 30's.

This mixture of languages is characteristic of most Indian-language radio and reflects the history of the area. Although the Mayan pictographs are expressive they are certainly not phonetic, so the Spanish superimposed their alfabet on the spoken language. The numbers leave room for a bit of speculation. Perhaps it was only by momentum that the Spanish numbers came into Tzutuhuil, or perhaps the Tzutuhuil, as so many "primitives" (including our modern computers!) did, used the binary system. The ID format would seem to have arrived with American electronics.

Fortunately for the DXer, the net result is an ID that can be easily recognized and takes only a bit of elementary Spanish to be translated into something definite enough for a report.

This week is census week in Mexico, and this time it's a massive operation designed to cover even the most remote areas. Already released information on the questions indicate an interest in educational level, religion, and indigenous languages, the sort of thing decisions on new radio stations are based on. More than a year ago, Radio Educacion started designing programs for nonexistent stations

Those of you, and I know I'm not alone in this, that enjoy Cuban music, loud Cuban music on and on through the night, should tune Radio Rebelde on 3385 kHz. I think it's a feeder for their local outlets as the audio seems boosted and clipped more than that on 5025 kHz. But the programs are music, all music with a minimum of announcements, and only a short news flash on the hour. It's a type of jamming, the sort of program that people turn on and leave on instead of listening to foreign propaganda. Radio Marti, still too formal, and still adhering to program blocks for specific audiences, could learn a bit by listening.

From this distance, the VOA arguement appears to have missed the point for most Central American governments have turned to TV and FM for controlled communication and the common man in those economically depressed areas, after spending it all on TV, has no interest in shortwave, the VOA's medium. Those that can and do seek the news on SW tune to the far more numerous and better signals from the American religious stations. Most are "friendlier stations" and I've yet to receive more than an impersonal computer printout from the VOA. Oh yes, you can phone, but when you express the local phonerates to terms of a day's wages, it produces a "select audience". The reality, which no bureaucrat seems ready to accept, is that the VOA is a very small American voice both in terms of outlets and in kilowatts.

Bits of speculation for DXers

Will Panama's new government desire an international voice enough to create a new radio country for shortwave?

What will Nicaragua do? A direct takeover of "La Voz" wouldn't satisfy the 14 divergent political parties that form the present colition.

Will the change in political geography bring about a reshuffle in the clandestines?

I don't think I mentioned it, I intended to but then I'm not that well organized, but Huayacocotls has been connected with LADA (direct dialing). If you're one of the "select audience" who reports by phone, their number, after Mexico, is 775-80067. Hours are when they're on the air, 6:00 to 9:00 mornings and 3:00 to 7:00 afternoons, local time except Sundays. But no collect calls, they're fighting to stay alive in a campasino economy.

This season's storms, and the time required for emergency repairs have affected the national power distribution. Even the Mexico City stations drop off the air for short periods.




