

News from Advertising Avenue
About Radio and Television . . .
Accounts, Stations and People

THE CAAA HAS INITIATED a quarterly newsletter to carry word of current news and developments in Association affairs to members and other interested parties. In the first, September, issue of the four-page bulletin, it states that the 45 member agencies of CAAA placed \$279,000-000 worth of advertising in 1963, representing 85 per cent of all national advertising placed by Canadian agencies.

"A CONFLICT IN BASIC ADVERTISING philosophy" has brought about Goodis, Goldberg, Soren Ltd.'s resignation of the Hazel Bishop of Canada Ltd. account, which had been with the agency just over three months.

J. H. Tait, vice-president of the company here, says several agencies are being considered and an appointment will be announced shortly. The account includes advertising for Lanolin Plus products and Hazel Bishop cosmetics.

FIRST "NATIONAL" CONSUMER account for Tames Advertising Agency Ltd. is the Berlitz School of Languages Canada Ltd., formerly handled by McCann-Erickson (Canada) Ltd. A ten-week local campaign is presently in progress in Toronto, with advertisements in the *Globe and Mail*, radio spots on CBL, and TV commercials in production for airing on CBLT, all with a "fun" approach. Berlitz general director A.J. Schardl says the "fun" approach is working and after one week there were more inquiries in one day than in an average week previously.

Tentative plans are to extend the campaign to cover some or all of the five Berlitz branch areas (Toronto, Montreal, Ottawa, Hamilton and Vancouver) early next year. The account is supervised by agency president John Tames, and account executive is vice-president Maurice Chazottes, who will edit a special Berlitz newsmagazine to be distributed throughout North America and supported partly by funds from U.S. ad budget.

AFTER FIVE YEARS WITH McCONNELL, Eastman & Co. Ltd., O. J. Reynolds, media manager, purchasing, is leaving the agency the end of next month. Mrs. Reynolds' next media buy will be daily newspapers, in the birth announcements column.

COVERAGE OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES in Tokyo next month is fully booked on CBC-TV, which has exclusive Canadian rights for television reportage. Two reports will be carried on *Telescope*, October 16 and 23, sponsored by General Motors Products of Canada Ltd. through MacLaren Advertising Co. Ltd. The sponsors of *Red River Jamboree* and *Front Page Challenge* will sponsor the Olympic reports that pre-empt these shows on October 14 and 20 respectively. *Jamboree* sponsors are Chrysler Canada Ltd. through Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn Inc., and Beecham Products Ltd. through MacLaren Advertising Co. Ltd.; and *Challenge* is sponsored by Peter Jackson Tobacco Ltd. through Vickers & Benson Ltd., Montreal, and General Foods Ltd. through Young & Rubicam Ltd.

Three one-minute spots in eleven special half-hour reports have been sold on the CBC's eight o-and-o's by National Selective Sales, to Industrial Acceptance Corporation Ltd. through Vickers & Benson Ltd., Montreal (two spots in each program), and Simoniz Co. Ltd. through Dancer-Fitzgerald-Sample, New York (one spot in each report).

Coverage may utilize the new satellite, Syncom III.

SOVIET AFFAIRS EXPERT David Levy takes the newly-created post of CBC correspondent in Moscow in mid-October, and will report in both English and French to both the CBC radio and TV networks from the USSR and possibly from some of Eastern Europe.

Levy's wide and varied career includes a period as a copywriter with Ogilvy, Benson & Mather (Canada) Ltd., the position of copy chief with McKim Advertising Ltd. in Vancouver, and a year and a half as associate editor of *Marketing*. For the past year or so, he has been managing editor of *Saturday Night*.

As a freelance broadcaster, Levy has appeared on many CBC radio and TV news and public affairs programs, and as a freelance journalist his articles have appeared in *Canadian Business, Executive, The Financial Post*, and daily newspapers. He is presently writing a book from material gathered on a trip to the USSR last year.



Accent opinion in local news

WINNIPEG BROADCASTERS are beginning to win a place for themselves as opinion-makers in Manitoba. They sensed that the two daily papers, which pontificate mainly on national and international affairs, were doing rather poorly as far as the local scene is concerned, so they moved into the opening.

Ev Dutton, at CKRC, does a mature and interesting job with three one-minute shots daily called *Pulse Opinion Monitor*. Ev's been around newsrooms for a long time and handles himself well in the controversial field. He probably comes closest to what Carlyle Allison of the BBG, seems to mean when he talks radio journalism, than most other broadcasters attempting the same thing.

CJAY-TV has entered the opinion field, too, with a brief but provocative feature called *Stew's View*, ably handled by Stew MacPherson. This feature runs three times a day, but has been going only three months—a bit too early to know how deep it will bite. MacPherson has a facility for gentle irony and my guess would be that his following will grow. He has lots of experience—he's the originator of the *Twenty Questions* program that made him Mr. Radio in England.

Allan Bready probably did more to pioneer opinion broadcasting in Winnipeg than anyone else. A smooth and persuasive writer, he built up a large following while at CJOB. It was a common experience, when controversy was in the air, to hear people ask, "Did you listen to what Bready said about it?" Bready moved over to CJQM, however, when that station opened, and his influence on provincial affairs faded, due to the smaller audience, though he's doing a standout job there, too, and in greater depth.

GPS Puts the Program in Radio Programming

LONDON LIFE INSURANCE is using Winnipeg as a test market, and if its campaign on CJOB-CKRC-CKY pays off, ought to be an important broadcast advertiser across Canada, and might start a trend toward heavy use of radio by important institutional advertisers. Hoover Vacuum Company is giving radio a whirl again in Winnipeg, with dealer-interview spots on CJOB.

TO "KEEP ANNOUNCERS AWARE there are people out there", CJOB management has installed closed-circuit TV in the announcing booths, so, through the monitor, they can scan Winnipeg traffic, weather conditions, and other activity along Portage Avenue. Ron Krochuk, the station's promotion man, thinks this is the first time it has been done in Canada. He says they've already noticed the announcers sound more personal in their work than they did when isolated from the outside. They get the feel of the city and it's reflected in what they read as well as in their ad-libs.

KCND-TV, THE AMERICAN station on Manitoba's border, beamed at Winnipeg audiences, is starting an all-out drive to increase its share of the hard-fought-for ratings. It has engaged Mac MacFarlane, a well-known freelancer, to beat the drums. Bob Armstrong, the station's Rep, (Radtel International Ltd.) was in Winnipeg to help tee-off the new push. *Million Dollar Movies* will form a big part of their bid, but perhaps more important is the new relay system almost completed to assure a consistent signal, lack of which has been plaguing them even since the January power increase.

Editorial

Time for privates to answer back

The wheels of bureaucracy, like the mills of the gods, grind slow, especially at the time of writing this article, because the Halifax hearings of the Board of Broadcast Governors are over, and applicants and others who are so vitally concerned with their outcome are facing the interminable waiting period between adjournment and the Board's recommendations.

This is only a trivial problem which has to be borne by broadcasters and others who are compelled to approach the regulatory tribunal before they may start in the broadcasting business or effect some improvement in the business they have already started.

The Board is maintained at public expense, but the applicants themselves have to pay personally for transporting themselves and their aides to the appointed place - this time it was Halifax - in order to get the recommendation for approval they are after.

Then comes another waiting period, while the minister broods over the BBG's recommendation. So anxiety will continue until the final decision is delivered.

This in no sense reflects upon or impugns the actions of the members of the BBG, who are simply carrying out the instructions contained in the Broadcasting Act. What it does very emphatically do though is make yet another effort to point up the incongruities contained in this act, which was designed to further the broadcast medium, but only impedes it.

At least as incongruous as anything in this befuddled picture is the question of affiliation with the CBC networks.

To some stations, especially in television, network affiliation is a highly desirable perquisite. In radio especially, the admittedly unsponsorable programs dispensed to affiliates by the CBC, are a grave detriment, in that the nature of the programs makes them by-pass the majority and appeal only to minority groups. Carrying them on a commercial station is out-and-out suicide from an audience-building (and therefore advertising-selling) standpoint.

The private station affiliates of both CBC's radio and television networks considerably outnumber the CBC owned-and-operated outlets, and

are therefore *absolutely essential* to the existence of the networks. Yet they are paid an extremely low rate for the commercial time they contribute and nothing at all for the non-commercial programs which they are *compelled* to carry. Also, control of the whole operation is vested in the CBC.

(It must be said, in all fairness, that there are occasional affiliates' meetings at which the government body "discusses" the programming and other plans it has already decided to put into operation.)

Through the Board of Broadcast Governors, the CBC demands both affiliation and disaffiliation where it suits its purpose. In the case of Edmonton television for example, it let CFRN-TV build an audience for several years, only to have the public body take over this audience and the frequency when it decided the time was ripe for it to open its own station in that city.



Private broadcasters have submitted to this dictatorial treatment - backed it is true by the broadcasting regulations - while they have been building their businesses to the best of their ability. But their businesses are built now, and the time has come for the one-way-street signs to be taken down, and for the privates to start doing a bit of dictating themselves.




In any business transaction or set of transactions, the prime need is for agreement between the contracting parties. This means the buyer dictates the terms on which he is willing to buy and the seller writes in the conditions of sale.

So far the CBC has done all the talking, forcing its wishes upon the private affiliates it needs so badly, and even on the government itself when it feels so disposed.

Right now change is in the air, change which will certainly bring about amendments to the Broadcasting Act if not its entire rewriting. This time is overdue, and this time we hope the private industry will reverse its usual procedure, stick its hat firmly back on its head and simply tell the CBC, the BBG and the authorities in general, on just what terms it is willing to do business with *them*.

Anglo-French Question

POLL TESTS STATION IDENTIFICATION

"QUEBEC, OUI; OTTAWA, NON" is the title of an hour-long special produced by NBC-TV News about the "potential civil war brewing between French and British Canadians". The show will be telecast in color on NBC-TV network stations Sunday, September 27 at 4.30 pm EDT.

"The hour will reflect the increasingly nationalistic attitudes of the French Canadians, who believe they have been repressed in economic, educational and social areas by the dominant British Canadians," says an NBC press release. The program "shows how the national Canadian government has begun mollifying nationalistic sentiment in Quebec, while at the same time endeavoring to pacify hardline British Canadian sentiment which sees no need for reforms."

An NBC News unit headed by producer Stuart Schulberg and correspondents Elie Abel and Robert MacNeil spent several weeks in Quebec and Ottawa, after which Schulberg said that although the tinnies in Canada are not as well publicized as those in various Latin American countries, he feels the possibilities for upheaval here are just as great.

"*Quebec, Oui; Ottawa, Non* is an attempt to familiarize the American public with the issues that seriously divide the peoples of Canada," says NBC's press department.

Color Television

CLIENT - AGENCY - PRODUCER TEAM FOR CANADA'S 1st COLOR COMMERCIAL

WITH THE FUTURE OF COLOR TV in Canada as up in the air as Syncom III at the moment, a pioneering client, agency and production house are proceeding with production of what is believed to be the first full-scale color television commercial made in Canada by and for Canadians.

The commercial is for Canada Packers Ltd.'s Maple Leaf bacon, being produced at Robert Lawrence Productions for Cockfield, Brown & Co. Ltd. "It's beautiful, really beautiful," says Brian Hawkins, assistant manager of the broadcast services department of Cockfield Brown. "When a color close-up of the bacon frying filled the screen at a screening of the rushes, it activated the saliva glands of everyone in the room. The increase in appetite appeal is amazing."

The color commercial is part of a pool of 16 black and white commercials in production, so that it is difficult to assess exactly how much more time and attention has gone into the color production, but it has involved very detailed drawings, a color storyboard, very careful attention to the colors used for props, costumes and make-up, even to the point of specially dying flowers for one scene.

No one involved in the production of the color commercial has had actual experience in color TV before, but "in the final analysis, color commercials will have to be produced here, so we felt we might as well all learn together now," Hawkins said. The agency has been watching the color fields closely for some time, and RLP director of photography, Fritz Spiess, CSC, is experienced in color filming.

Color Complexities

Technically, color production demands extra attention to such things as lighting, which must be brighter because color film is not as sensitive as black and white. Artistically, the additional scope more than compensates for the additional problems in such areas as color coordination.

"Complications arise when the commercial must be compatible, for showing both in color and in black and white," says Spiess, which is the case in the commercial in production now. It will be shown regularly on black and white TV in Canada, and plans are to colorcast the commercial on WGR Buffalo.

Booking the color commercial is almost as complex as producing it.

The Buffalo station is not equipped to originate color transmissions, and therefore the commercial must be transmitted from New York in a participating program and broadcast from Buffalo while other network stations block that minute with local commercials.

The agency and client, however, are anxious to get the color commercial on the air. "It's one thing to look at it in the screening room, and another thing to see it through the system," says Hawkins. "We want to see it on the air."

Ready For Research

The commercial will also be used for research. Manager of the research department at Cockfield Brown, Jo Marney, conducted research into color TV in general during the color broadcasts on the closed circuit network at the Canadian National Exhibition (*Broadcaster*, September 3). For more specific information, she will follow up by screening the Maple Leaf bacon color commercial for a group of 25 or so women, using the agency's own studio facilities.

The group will view the color commercial and a black and white commercial on a TV set in a comfortable setting, and research questions will be designed to elicit comparison between the two in such areas as appetite appeal. In addition to gathering general reactions to color and an interest scale on color versus b&w, Miss Marney plans to divide the group into those who have seen color TV and those who haven't, and compare the reactions of the two groups.

"The novelty factor may influence the reaction of those who've never seen color TV, and those who are accustomed to it may be more critical," she says. "If the quality impresses people who are familiar with color, we really have something."

They have something in any case — the distinction of being first in color TV commercials in Canada, a distinction which has not been won without battle scars. Hawkins is keeping a diary on the perils of production in color.

Press-Radio-TV Day

CAN WE AFFORD CBC PERFECTION?

PRESS, RADIO AND TV DAY at the Canadian National Exhibition August 28 featured a luncheon address by E. L. 'Ernie' Bushnell, president of CJOH-TV Ottawa, to an audience of some 300 executives in these communications fields.

In his speech, Bushnell said his main concern about the CBC is that it has become extravagant. He praised the quality of CBC programming, but wondered whether the country can afford so much perfection at so high a cost.

The solution to the rising costs is not to dig deeper into the public purse or for the Corporation to pursue more advertising revenue, he said. He did not agree with BBG Chairman Andrew Stewart's view that the CBC should be commercial-free, but suggested that a limit be placed on the amount of advertising accepted by the Corporation and that an independent body should have the power to investigate its advertising rate structure.

Bushnell also advocated a ten-year charter for the CBC, giving it a set budget within which to operate, and said that Parliament should define the Corporation's mandate.

The CBC's mandate is to carry on a national broadcasting service, he said, "but surely it's high time Parliament should decide what the constituent parts of the service are

to be and how much public money is to be spent for what."

Press Criticism

Parliamentary press coverage came under some fire from Bushnell, who said that while wire service reporting is usually accurate, reports of one event by different Press Gallery reporters often appear to be dealing with different subjects. He also criticized reporters who work on CBC programs and write speeches for politicians on the side.

"How can any reporter serve three masters and get paid by each of them?" he asked. A report tabled in the Commons last month listed 40 Press Gallery members who made appearances on CBC news shows.

While radio and TV occasionally deserve to get their collective and individual bottoms spanked, Bushnell admitted, he urged newspapers to hire and keep "better qualified" radio-TV critics, and asked critics to get all the facts first and assemble them in a manner that would not make either the broadcasters or the press "look like a bunch of nincompoops."
