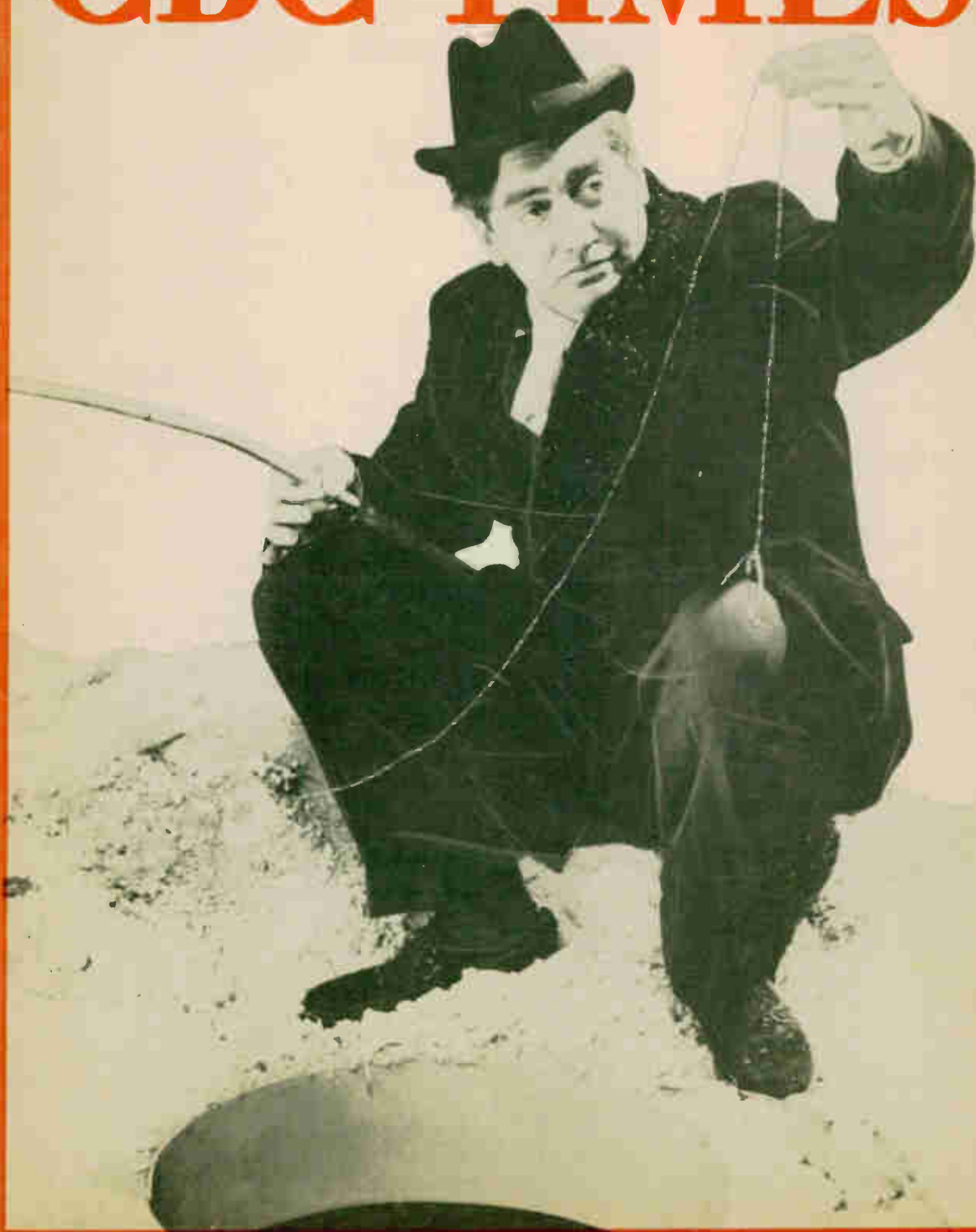

BOY WITH PART—English actor Martin Stephens, a 13-year-old who has played the title role in the West End production of *Oliver* (the hit British musical based on Dickens' *Oliver Twist*), will star in a CBC-TV production on Festival this fall. He arrived in Toronto recently to start rehearsals for *A Book With Chapters In It*, the story of a boy growing up. Eric Till is the producer.

Young Stephens, who also has a lengthy list of film credits, played Miles in the recent movie, *The Innocents*, based on Henry James' *The Turn of the Screw*, and another of his more recent films was the science-fiction shocker, *Village of the Damned*.

"WINGS" ON LOCATION—Location filming for *The Wings of Night*, a serial dramatization of the Thomas Raddall novel, began August 20 in Sheet Harbour, N.S. The TV serial, in eight episodes, will be telecast on CBC-TV next spring.

Producer Ronald Weyman, a camera crew and cast will work on outdoor sequences in other Nova Scotia locations as well, including Liverpool, where author Raddall lives.

Actors involved include the male leads, James Doohan and Jeremy Wilkin, the female lead, Irena Mayeska, six-year-old Charity

Haines, and Eric Clavering, Michael Zenon, Joe Austin and Laddie Dennis.

THE COLOURFUL ERA of silent movies—from 1903 to 1927—will be recalled in a special hour-long documentary program, entitled *Hollywood: The Golden Years*.

Actor-dancer and movie star Gene Kelly is narrator, both on and off camera, for the special program which will be seen Thursday, September 13, on the CBC-TV network. *Hollywood: The Golden Years* was first seen on the network in November, 1961.

The star-studded program shows memorable scenes from such classic silent motion pictures as *The Great Train Robbery*, *Perils of Pauline* serials, *The Gold Rush*, *The Birth of a Nation*, *The Ten Commandments*, *Ben Hur*, *The Sheik*, *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* and others, and includes the coming of the sound track in 1927 with Al Jolson's *The Jazz Singer*.

Among the stars of silent movies, shown in some of their best-known films, are Pearl White, Mary Pickford, Douglas Fairbanks, Sr., Rudolph Valentino, John and Lionel Barrymore, Harold Lloyd, Buster Keaton, Lillian and Dorothy Gish, Gloria Swanson, Greta Garbo, William S. Hart, Marie Dressler, Charlie Chaplin and Will Rogers.

Also shown are the off-screen antics of such pre-sound stars as Douglas Fairbanks, Sr., Mary Pickford, Charlie Chaplin and Gloria Swanson along with silent Swedish commercials for a bakery featuring a young girl named Garbo.

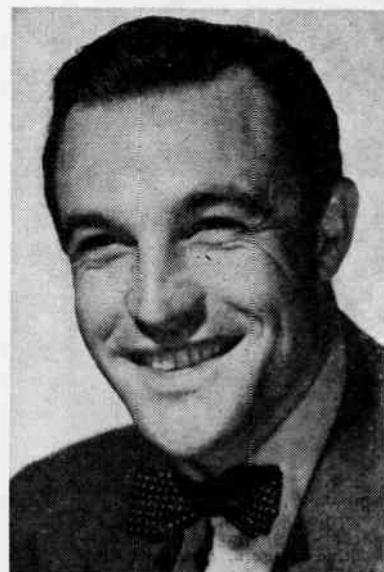
In addition to seeing the stars and great producers and directors of early films, viewers also are taken behind the cameras for a look at the business side of the industry.

Much of the 4,400 feet of film used in this documentary was not seen on the screen for many decades and a great part of it is owned by private collectors.

Peggy Neville

Multi-Talented Singing Star

In late November, 1961, a svelte, young singer named Peggy Neville appeared with Juliette on "Our Pet's" regular network TV social. Viewers across Canada who missed the guest's introduction took a long appreciative look and consulted their small-screen memory cells. "Where have I seen her before?" was the burning question. The answer came quickly: In different dress, singing far different material the 21-year-old vocalist had actually done her regular weekly network stint on CBC-TV's "Red River Jamboree" from Winnipeg just two hours earlier.

The change of venue, style and instrumentation was not new to Peggy Neville—and obviously not difficult. This multi-talented Winnipeg native is equally at home with a western ballad, a sultry torch song, or excerpt from a Broadway musical. Variety has truly been the spice and keynote of Peggy's professional life.

The singing Nevilles—Peggy and real-life sister Barbara—began entertaining in their early teens at community dances and on amateur talent shows. The girls landed radio offers from both private sta-



tions and the CBC. Their local television debut on "First Nighter" . . . then came network appearances on "Talent Caravan," "The

Show That Jack Built" and "Music Makers '58." For CBC Winnipeg's New Year's Frolic to usher in 1959 Peggy did her first television performance as a single. Sister Barbara married and moved to Toronto . . . Peggy was on her own as a popular music stylist.

In the summer of 1959 CBC Winnipeg was earmarked to come up with a seasonal network replacement for "Country Hoedown." "Red River Jamboree" went into production with Peggy filling the female vocalist slot. The show proved so popular that it gained a network niche of its own and Peggy settled into the homespun atmosphere like a seasoned trouper. She still finds working in the happy-go-lucky western air of "Red River Jamboree" "very relaxing and enjoyable."

Her fans believe that Peggy's easy style and versatility would make her a "natural" for almost any musical presentation. The Juliette appearance would seem to bear them out.

Apart from her singing career the 5'7" honey blonde has done extensive modelling work for two large Winnipeg agencies and is an avid sports hobbyist. Peggy's variety of outside interests matches her professional adaptability and proficiency—she likes to do a lot of things—and do them well.

The Real World of Woman

ARE WOMEN discriminated against in business, education and the professions? Are many married women bored and lonely in the midst of family and affluence? Should a girl's education differ from that of a boy's? What is expected of a woman in today's society? These are some of the questions to be discussed during *The Real World of Woman*, a con-

ference sponsored by the CBC, to be held at Hart House, University of Toronto, from September 6 to 9. In three plenary sessions and 16 workshop groups, 480 delegates from nine provinces, representing national women's organizations, professional groups, labour, home, church, government and industry will examine the woman's role in the rapidly changing society of today.

"Many broadcasts, magazine articles and speeches deal with the dilemma of today's woman," says Helen James, CBC supervisor of women's programs and head of the advisory committee on conference planning, "but none of them can hope to deal with more than one small aspect. At this conference, in three full days of discussion, we hope to cover a larger territory, to make it easier for people to see the question as a whole." Enlarging on the "dilemma" of modern woman, Miss James points out that "much advertising and some writing pictures her as the paragon of perfection—not only in the home, but in the community as well—and all without any apparent effort. When she falls short of this ideal, she tends to feel guilty. Also, it is becoming necessary and fashionable for some women with families to go out to work, and the working mother may feel guilty for fear she's neglecting her family. Today's woman seems to feel guilty no matter what's expected of her. This is partly because she's not really aware of what's happening to her in society. We want to expose some of these facts, to help explain some of the dilemmas common to all Canadian women."

The conference, organized by the women's programs section of CBC's public affairs department with the assistance of 18 national organizations, has met with enthusiastic response from women's groups and individuals across the country. When registration was closed in July, there was a waiting list of about 50 applicants, and Hart House theatre, scene of the plenary sessions, will be filled to capacity. Many of the applicants learned of the conference through a special CBC television program, *The Best Thing in the World*, shown last June to introduce the event. Following the program, CBC planners received hundreds of letters, some requesting enrolment in the conference and others commenting on views expressed in the telecast. Wrote one viewer: "I suspect that women are one natural resource we haven't fully developed." Said another: "I believe this is a most important subject, at least on a par with politics and racial discrimination."

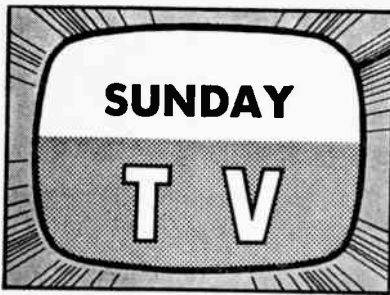

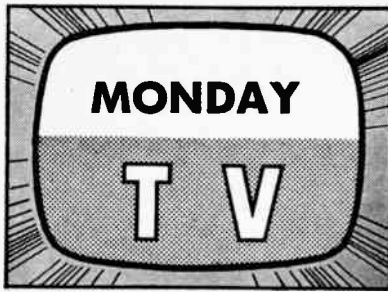

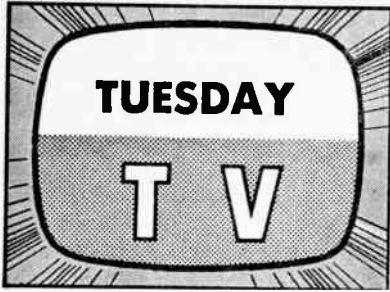
Award Winning Film on Summer Magazine

Percy Saltzman is guest host this week on CBC-TV's *Summer Magazine* (Sunday, September 2), introducing two films obtained from the National Film Board.

One of the films, entitled "*Universe*" will be making its first appearance on North American TV and takes the viewer on a voyage into space reaching beyond the moon and sun into other galaxies beyond the range of the most powerful telescope. Made in 1960, the film has won several awards including a diploma of merit at the Edinburgh Film Festival, and the Jury's Prize at the Cannes Film Festival. Co-directed by Roman Kroiter and Clin Low, the production has a musical score by Eldon Rathburn and commentary written by Stanley Jackson and spoken by Dr. Donald MacRae, professor of astronomy at the University of Toronto. It tells the story of the heavens and the men who study them. The film

begins with Dr. MacRae preparing the 74-inch scope at the David Dunlap Observatory near Toronto for a night's observation of the heavens. Through accurate scale models, lighting and animation, it carries the viewer on a realistic tour into the infinite blackness dotted with far-flung galaxies. After viewing the film Dr. John F. Heard, director of the Dunlop Observatory, told friends he found it hard to believe that after 25 years in the day to day business of astronomy he could have been so carried away emotionally. In creating the effects of realism National Film Board experts had to solve many unusual problems in making the detailed models and lighting them properly, creating the appearance of dense gases and filming superimpositions. Their product is so realistic that it is difficult to be sure where photographs of the stars give way to imitations.

Sharing the program with this impressive film is another NFB production entitled, *The Settler*, which recounts the story of settling of the Abitibi area in Northern Quebec and shows how the wilderness was subdued over many years and gave way to farms and modern communities.

Her Excellency, Madame Vanier will officially open the conference at the first plenary session, Thursday evening, September 6. Dr. Mirra Komarovsky, professor of sociology at Barnard College, Columbia University, will deliver the keynote address, and Eugene Hallman, CBC vice-president of programming, will chair the opening meeting. It was Mr. Hallman who conceived the idea of the conference, points out Miss James. "Women's programming has increased to such an extent in the past 10 years," she says, "that Mr. Hallman felt the time was ripe for a conference of this sort. We

agreed, and so did the women we consulted across Canada."

About 25 men are expected to attend the conference, including psychiatrists, educators and sociologists, some of whom will participate as speakers and panel members in the various sessions. "The Real World of Woman will be as much about men as women," says Helen Carscallen, a CBC program organizer who is serving as chairman of the conference program committee. "Whatever the problems of women, they are bound to affect their husbands." Dr. Komarovsky concurs with this view. The present-day standards towards women are a "veritable crazy-quilt of contradictions," she states. "Social changes have disturbed one type of equi-

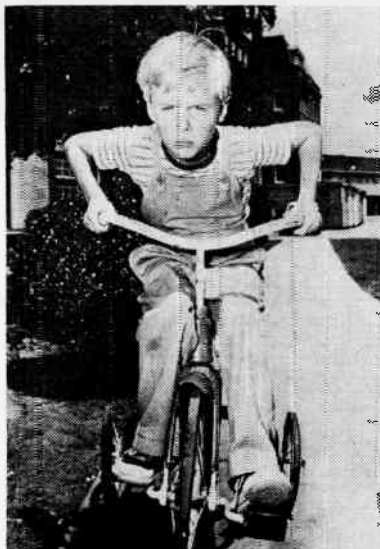

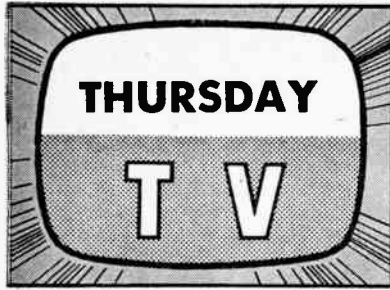

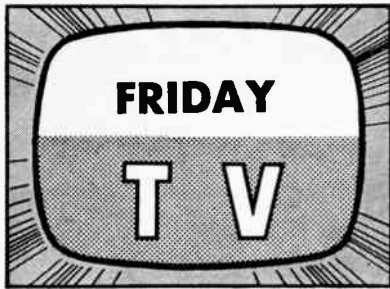

However, not all clubs that enter the final month of the regular schedule on top, finish that way, and you can rest assured that there are ball players wearing flannels other than those of the Dodgers or Yankees, who would like to see just such a situation develop. About the only club that has really been shunted to the sidelines at this stage is the New York Mets . . . but there are also others whose chances are not very promising. Two clubs in the American League that still have a shot at the pennant are the Chicago White Sox and Detroit Tigers, current occupants of fourth and fifth place. And these two teams will be performing in front of the television cameras Saturday afternoon in the "Baseball Game of the Week."

However, if either of these two teams hope to catch the Yankees it will take an all-out drive during the month of September. On paper the Tigers have the personnel, but on the field they've had their problems, particularly with the second division teams. The Tigers have the pitching, although it has been shaky at times, and we must add that the injury to Frank Lary hasn't helped the mound staff. At the plate the "bengals" can dish up the long ball from the bats of Rocky Colavito, Norm Cash and Al Kaline.

The White Sox have been a scrappy type of team this season, not noted for the long ball, but winning games with the solid single, hit and run, and fine fielding defensive play. (Please turn to page 19)

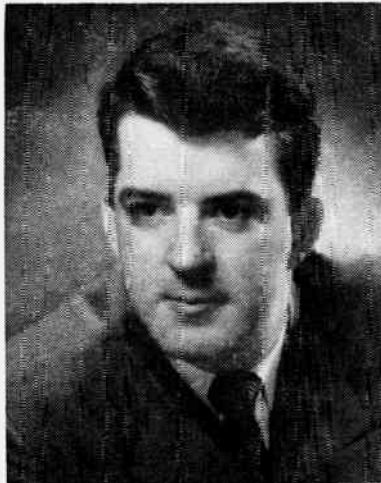

brium without as yet replacing it with another. Men as well as women are victims of the confusion."

A nation-wide audience will be able to benefit from the speeches and discussions of the conference through a number of CBC radio and television programs to be broadcast before, during, and after the event. "Some of the plenary sessions will be broadcast at the time of the conference," says Miss Carscallen, "but, more than that, we hope to get program ideas from the workshop discussions—ordinary people expressing their views on today's woman and her problems. Some of the women attending may be invited to expand their views on programs during the coming months." Two special hour-long programs dealing with the conference will be seen on the CBC television network: *The Real World of Woman*, Thursday, September 6; and *A Woman's Education*, Sunday, September 9, at 4:30 p.m. On radio, seven individual programs will be devoted to the event. Background to the conference will be given on *Trans-Canada Matinee*, Thursday, September 6, and an hour-long broadcast from the opening plenary session will be presented that same evening. On Friday, September 7, *Matinee* will

broadcast part of the group discussion at the plenary session, and on Friday evening a *Workshop Report* will be carried on the network. A similar program, *Workshop Highlights*, will be broadcast Saturday, September 8, and on Sunday, September 9, in the *Special Speaker* period Dr. Henry David, president of the New School for Social Research, New York, will give some of his impressions of the conference. The final broadcast from the conference will be heard on *Matinee*, Monday, September 10. Entitled *The World Ahead*, this broadcast will present excerpts from the final plenary session, recorded the previous afternoon.

Among those taking part in the conference, as speakers, workshop chairmen, panelists or consultants, will be: Dr. Brock Chisholm, former director of the World Health Organization; Miss Bryna Ball, director, National Manpower Council; Charles Lynch, chief of the Southam News Services; Miss Marion Royce, director, women's bureau, Department of Labour, Ottawa; Mme. Jeanne Sauvé, Montreal radio and television commentator; Dr. Frank Vallee, associate professor of sociology, McMaster University; Dr. Nathan Epstein, of McGill University; and Dr. Henry David, who will deliver the concluding summary of the conference.

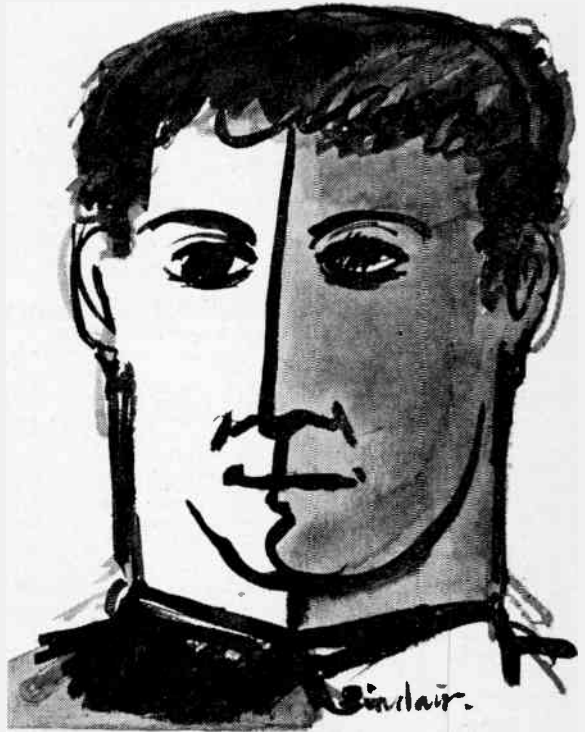
Black Like Me

A unique report on what it's like to be a Negro living in the Deep South of the U.S. will be presented this week on CBC radio's Four's Company. The report is unique because it's written by a white man—a reporter who posed as a Negro with complete success and lived for five weeks in the South travelling through Louisiana, Mississippi, and neighbouring states. The reporter was John Howard Griffin, a native Texan, who by means of hormone treatments was able to alter his pigmentation, temporarily changing his normal tanned colouring to a deep black. He was accepted as one of them by Negroes everywhere he went and was able to gain great insight into the attitudes and problems of the Southern Negro. After his five-week experiment in understanding, Griffin put his findings into a book entitled *Black Like Me*, adapted for radio by Alan King, and broadcast on Saturday, September 1.

Griffin's ordeal—for that is what it proved to be—began November 7, 1959. When having completed the medical progress that changed the colour of his skin, he set out secretly to begin his life as a Negro. Why did he do it? It was partly the almost instinctive compulsion of a newspaperman to search out a story to satisfy a deep curiosity, but it was also more than that. Griffin spoke of it in this way:

"For years the idea haunted me . . . if a white man became a Negro in the Deep South, what adjustments would he have to make? What is it like to experience discrimination based on skin colour, something over which no one has control? How else except by becoming a Negro could a white man hope to learn the truth? Though we lived side by side throughout the South, communication between the two races had simply ceased to exist. The only way I could see to bridge the gap between us was to become a Negro. I decided I would do this."

In the following weeks Griffin regretted that decision many times when the strain of living a double life, and enduring unceasing humiliations and frustrations gnawed his nerves to breaking point. But he clung to his sanity and to his resolve and gradually he came to know the reasons for the Negroes' outlook on life. More important, he thought that he began to experience the emotions of the Negro and to understand his deep-seated resentment.



"The Negro's day to day living," he wrote, "is a reminder of his inferior status. He doesn't become calloused to the polite rebuffs when he seeks better employment and hears himself referred to as a Nigger or Coon, or has to bypass available restrooms or eating facilities to find one specified for him. Each new reminder strikes at the raw spot . . . deepens the wound. The Negro's only salvation from complete despair lies in his belief that these things are not directed against him personally but against his race. But at the time of rebuff he cannot rationalize. It gives him a view of the white man that the white man can never understand. As a group the whites arrange life so that it destroys the Negro's sense of personal value, degrades his human dignity and deadens the fibres of his being."

During his weeks of research Griffin found much that was bad . . . arrogance, vindictiveness, degradation . . . but also some good. For example, the stirrings of new sympathetic approaches to the race

Bringing CBC Radio to the Northland

ONE OF THE great technical feats in North American communications is the maintenance and expansion of the CBC's radio service to Canada's northland.

Year by year, CBC and private broadcasters are extending the power and number of their transmitters until today the national radio service is within the reach of 97 per cent of the Canadian population. But as the unserved areas diminish, the task of closing the gap becomes an increasing challenge.

The last major region of the nation to lack adequate radio coverage was the Canadian North, a vast area of some 2,000,000 square miles, peopled by fewer than 75,000.

The CBC throughout the years has concentrated its effort towards servicing the region, but because of the high cost of broadcasting to such a small and sparsely scattered audience, the Corporation had to limit its efforts to a weekly program of personal messages for isolated residents in the Arctic. *The Northern Messenger*, carrying personal messages to Eskimos and Indians, Mounties and missionaries, from Mould Bay to Pond Inlet, was begun in 1933 and is still active as the oldest continuous radio program in the CBC's schedule.

Four years ago, with special funds voted by Parliament, the CBC was able to undertake improvement and expansion of its service in and to the North. Now a new plan for northern listeners is under study.

The aims of the new service are twofold. First, the construction of a powerful shortwave station in southern Canada to beam a full daily program to the entire North, and second, the establishment of

small standard-band radio stations in those northern communities which are large enough to warrant such a service.

It is only by shortwave radio that the entire Canadian North can be served. The community stations envisaged will cover roughly half of the population of the Yukon and Northwest Territories. Those northern residents presently without service are those who need it most. They live in remote settlements across the entire region and additional thousands of potential shortwave listeners live in the northern areas of the provinces. Few of Canada's 11,000 Eskimos live in the major settlements that are served by community stations and, at present, they are addressed in their native language only by Radio Greenland.

The new shortwave station is still under study, but a limited shortwave service was started towards the end of 1960 when the transmitters of the CBC's International Service at Sackville, New Brunswick, were put on a northern beam for seven hours a day. These broadcasts to the North followed a year of test transmissions. The present daily shortwave transmissions are in two parts: a 45-minute program of news in French and English aimed at the Eastern Arctic; and a six-hour schedule of news and features for the Central and Western Arctic regions. The transmissions are heard in six time zones across the North, in two frequencies, 9.585 and 11.72 megacycles.

Although most of the programs are relayed from the CBC's trans-Canada Network and include such

topical programs as *Project '62*, *Capital Report* and *Nation's Business* in addition to talks, drama, light music and variety fare, the nightly Northern Shortwave Service also presents several programs specially prepared for northern listeners. *Northern News Bulletins*, combining national and international news with coverage of events in the North, are presented three times each night. They are followed by sports scores and a summary of weather conditions across the top of the continent prepared for the CBC by the Arctic Forecast Office in Edmonton.

Other shortwave features during the regular season include *Points North* (Saturdays and Sundays) and a quarter-hour of interviews and stories recorded at northern points, and *Northern Newsletter* (Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays) in which a Canadian Press correspondent reviews the week's events in Ottawa affecting the North. On Monday, Wednesday and Friday the shortwave service presents an Eskimo-language program, *Uqausi*, prepared and announced by the CBC's first Eskimo producer, Miss Ann Padlo.

In the fall of 1958 CBC started to take over the low-powered standard-band community radio stations which already existed in the North. Those in Whitehorse, Churchill and Goose Bay were in a healthy state, supported by the Armed Services and maintained technically by them. The station in Yellowknife thrived on volunteer efforts and a subsidy from the Town Council, but the others maintained a precarious existence with voluntary operators and public donations.

CBC regional stations have now been set up at 13 communities in the North. Eight of these stations: Whitehorse in the Yukon Territory, Inuvik, Yellowknife, Hay River, Goose Bay in Labrador, have studios and a local staff.

It was on November 26, 1960, that CBC's first station north of the Arctic Circle went on the air at Inuvik, 35 miles northeast of Aklavik on the eastern channel of the MacKenzie. The remaining five stations are unmanned relay transmitters at Fort Nelson in British Columbia, and Dawson City, Mayo, Elsa and Watson Lake, all in the Yukon Territory. Three more low-power repeater transmitters have

been installed at Uranium City, Sask., Haines Junction, Y.T., and Cassiar, B.C. The regional stations range in power from 1,000 watts at Inuvik to 40 watts at Watson Lake.

Between sign-on at 7:00 a.m. and sign-off at midnight, there are religious broadcasts, women's commentaries, community announcements and local weather reports (at Churchill it's the "wind-chill" and not the temperature that interests the listeners). No northern station has gone without its Saturday night NHL broadcast. An important feature in the schedules of the stations in the Northwest Territories is *Gather Round*, a Saturday afternoon request program conducted in Chipewyan, at Hay River in Slavee and at Fort Smith in Dogrib.

At the studio locations, a high percentage of local programs are produced. These range from the daily Yukon Regional News at Whitehorse to the efforts of the Eskimo Drama Group at Frobisher Bay. Land-lines, which enable CBC radio programs to be transmitted instantaneously from coast to coast in southern Canada, have been missing in northern Canada. The new CBC community stations have therefore depended on tapes and "off-air" relays for their programs. With the exception of Whitehorse, which is linked by land-line to Edmonton, the northern stations pick up their news and topical programs from CBC transmitters at Lacombe, Alberta; Watrous, Saskatchewan; and Sackville, New Brunswick. Network features totalling 70 hours a week are recorded in Montreal and the tapes are flown to the North on regular airline flights.

After their use on CBC stations these tapes are made available to broadcasting services operated at other remote locations in the North by Armed Forces and various mining companies. In this way CBC programs are heard by listeners at Alert, the northernmost settlement in Canada, only 400 miles from the North Pole, Resolute Bay on Cornwallis Island, Gunnar and Eldorado Mines in Northern Saskatchewan, Port Radium on Great Bear Lake and Schefferville in Quebec.

Communication facilities in the North are being improved rapidly. The land-line from Edmonton to Whitehorse has been extended to Dawson City and within two years there will be telephone circuits to Yellowknife, Fort Smith and Hay River. With the landline will come the possibility of direct connections to CBC's southern networks.

problem on Dec. 15, 1959. His project concluded, he boarded a plane for his home town in Texas.

"I felt strangely sad to leave the world of the Negro after having shared it for so long," he wrote, "almost as though I were fleeing my share of his pain and heartache."

When revealed, Griffin's adventure brought on a predictable rash of newspaper stories, TV and radio interviews, magazine articles, and thousands of letters, most of them favourable. It also brought

persecution threats against him and his family and finally resulted in his leaving his home and starting life anew in another town where his children would not have to grow up under a cloud of hatred.

In his introduction to the Four's Company program, producer John Reeves cautions against temptation for the listener to point the finger of scorn. "In presenting 'Black Like Me,' we are not taking a holier than thou attitude. We don't want to imply that there are not social injustices in Canada or that we would not have the same problem if we had the same conditions. Nevertheless, injustice anywhere is anybody's business."

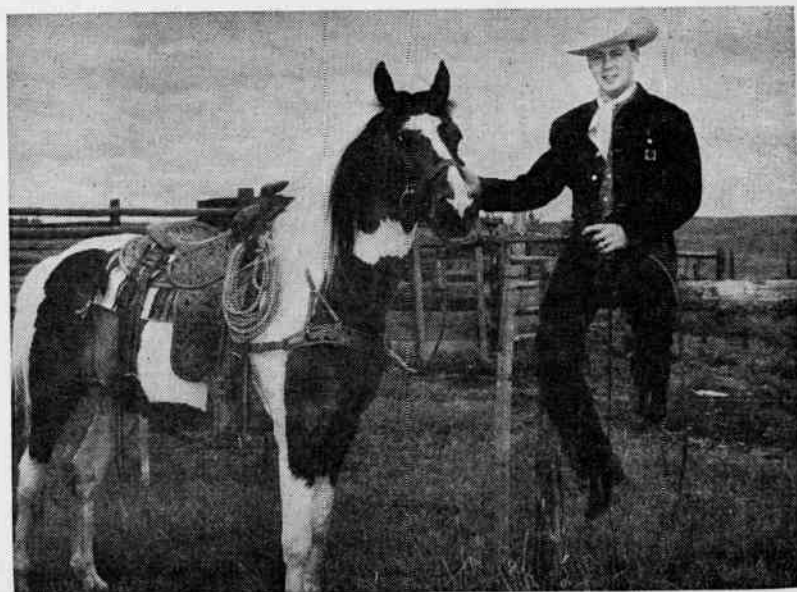

Music For Those Who Think Young



Mitch Parks can currently be heard on *Swingalong* (Tuesday afternoons on CBC-TV), and on the *Bob McMullin Show* and the *Georges LaFleche Show*, both heard on CBC radio on Mondays and Tuesdays respectively.

THE INITIALS M.P. have had at least two well known associations in Canada—Military Police and Member of Parliament. Since 1955 however, television viewers across the nation have added another—Mitch Parks.

Mitch Parks was musical director on CBWT's first network television contribution "Cabaret" in that year, and brought more than fifteen years of performing experience to this debut network musical series at the infant Winnipeg station. "Cabaret" turned out to be another successful milestone in the career of this versatile musician whose youthful appearance belies the backlog of accomplishments that mark his professional biography.

But appearance is not the only youthful attribute of Mitch Parks—as the popular soft drink commercial goes he "thinks young" and is always in the market for new musical ideas and new media for performance. Thus, when television came to the Canadian mid-west, Mitch was a natural to be getting his feet wet in the new world of home entertainment.

Mitch came to Winnipeg from his native Estevan, Saskatchewan, as a teenager and soon was playing

piano duets with Bert Pearl before Bert made it big with "The Happy Gang." Then during the forties Mitch was heard regularly with Percy Burdett in a multitude of two-piano series on the CBC network. Enjoying good company as well as good music Mitch confesses that these dual keyboard broadcasts provided some of his happiest on-air moments.

It wasn't until 1960 that Mitch again had the opportunity to merge his piano talents—this time with Winnifred Sim on the well received weekly radio stint "Rhythm and Romance." In the meantime, along with his new television obligations, Mitch had kept busy performing with a number of orchestras including The Winnipeg Symphony as either pianist or trumpeter and now his burning ambition is to assemble and lead a large orchestra.

Looking back over the years and the people he has met, Mitch is also modestly proud of the youngsters he helped along the way in his numerous roles as rehearsal pianist and vocal coach. It's a pleasure to look back with Mitch Parks and exhilarating to look forward with him—musically speaking "now it's M.P. for those who think young."
