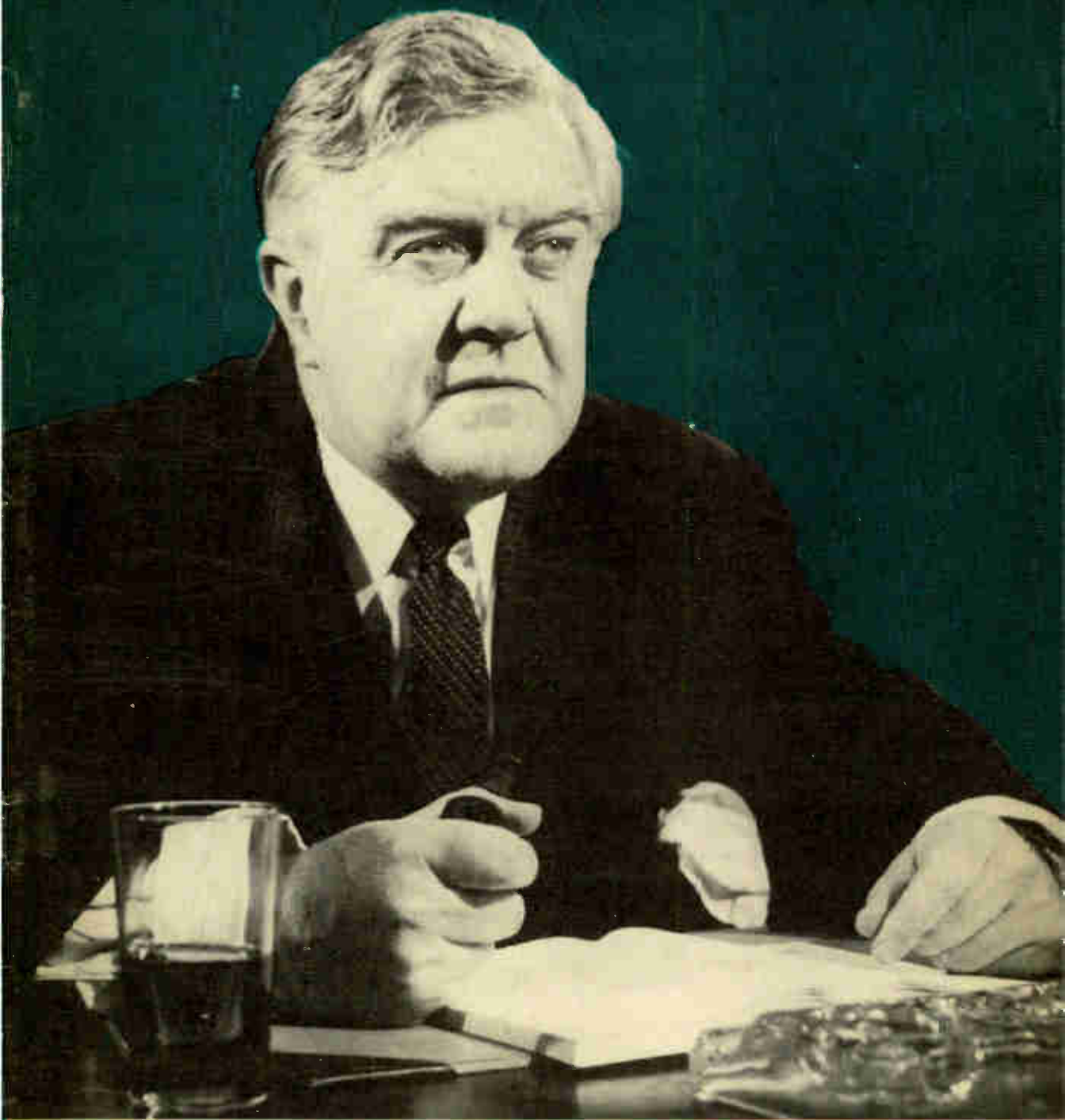

Phil Reimer

THE WORLD'S top golfers, competing for the richest prize of any tournament — \$200,000 — will play August 19th - 22nd in the World Golf Championship at Pleasant Valley Golf and Country Club, Sutton, Massachusetts. Phil Reimer, CBC Winnipeg sportscaster, will cover the tournament for CBC radio. Each morning at 7:35 a.m. he will be heard on CBW, starting Wednesday, August 18th with a pre-tourney warm up. He will broadcast highlights of the play direct from the tournament on *Saturday Sports Date*, August 21st on all stations. And between rounds he will talk with Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, Gary Player, Canada's top Pro George Knudson of Winnipeg, and other noted players; these interviews will be recorded for future presentation on *Prairie Sports Final*, Saturdays at 7:05 p.m. on prairie stations.

COLORED TELEVISION is the next big project being undertaken by the CBC. President Alphonse Ouimet has announced that, following announcement of the Government's interim policy on color television, the CBC has set an on-air target date of January 1st, 1967 for the start of limited color programming.

An early step in carrying out the project, the most ambitious since the CBC introduced television service in 1952, was the appointment of a TV color co-ordinator. He is Harold Wright, who will act as liaison between all groups

involved in the switch to color telecasting, and co-ordinate the planning and implementation of projects involved in the change-over.

Mr. Wright joined the Corporation in 1943 as a radio broadcast operator in Toronto, and became the first TV technical instructor in 1951 at the training centre in Toronto. In 1954, he was attached to engineering headquarters in Toronto as supervisor of technical instruction, before being transferred to engineering headquarters in Montreal in 1956.

From 1957 to 1960, Mr. Wright served on the special management committee on TV practices and procedures at Head Office, Ottawa. Since then he has held the position of operations liaison officer.

CANADA'S BIGGEST fair, the Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto, will provide background color for several network radio and television programs in the next few weeks.

Elwood Glover's *Luncheon Date*, on some 35 stations across Canada each weekday afternoon, will feature interviews with famous and interesting people associated with the CNE, from August 20th to September 6th.

On CBC radio, programs originating from the stage of the Queen Elizabeth Theatre at the CNE for broadcast at later dates include: *Carl Tapscott Singers* (Sundays, 6:30 p.m.); *The Tommy Hunter Show* (returning soon after a summer holiday); *Dixieland Downbeat* (also to return soon); and *The Alex Read Show* (Tuesdays and Thursdays at 1:15 p.m.).

THE GREATEST cycling race in the world for amateurs will be seen in a special 90-minute program of highlights Sunday, August 15th at 5:30 p.m. on CBWFT Winnipeg.

The *Tour du St-Laurent cycliste*, second only to the professional *Tour de France* in the cycling world, is run over a 1,500-mile course from Matane in Quebec's Gaspé peninsula, down the south bank of the St. Lawrence to Montreal, then back along the north bank to Quebec City. This year, among innovations are two time trials, one for individual racers, the other for teams.

Another new feature is the *Villes-Sprint*, a series of town primes similar to those in the famous European tours. Several of these sprints are planned for each stage, adding considerably to the excitement.

European teams in the race are Belgium, France, Holland, Italy, Britain, Spain, Czechoslovakia and Poland. On the Canadian team are Aurillio Battelo and Giacomo Fegat of Montreal, Joe Jones of Toronto and Jean Garon of Quebec City. Independent Canadian racers are Clifford Neyelli of Port Alberni, B.C., and Gary DeJong of Calgary, winner of the Red River cycling race last June.

The race is run over 15 days, from July 25th to August 8th.

R. S. LAMBERT:

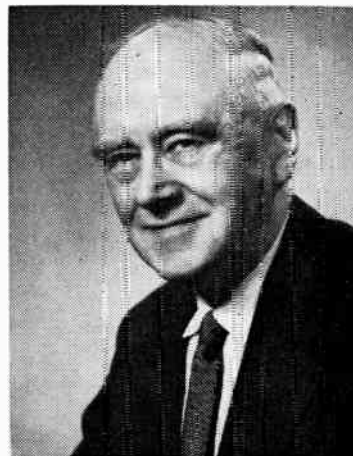
Curator of Unusual Facts

An interest in psychic phenomena led this distinguished writer and educator to create his program heard Mondays at 1:45 p.m. on CBC radio

IF YOU are among the many who delight in the discovery of strange, sometimes overlooked or neglected facts of history that come under the heading of "incredible but true," then you may wish to make the acquaintance of R. S. Lambert, who shares this enthusiasm. He is the man behind the weekly radio program *Curio Shop*, which explores little-known events of the past — such as the last fatal duel in Canada — that have an air of mystery about them. You may have a vague

recollection of some of the stories Mr. Lambert delves into — perhaps a name or a date rings a bell — but most of the accounts will probably come as a surprise to you.

History and mysterious occurrences that come within the realm of the supernatural have long been among R. S. Lambert's many and varied interests. Now retired, he is a prolific writer whose career in journalism, education, and broadcasting stretches back over half a century to the period of the First World War.



At that time he was sub-editor of the *Economist*, in London, England, and served for the last two years of the war in the Red Cross.

A classical scholar, educated at Repton School and Wadham College, Oxford, Lambert spent the post-war decade in the field of education,

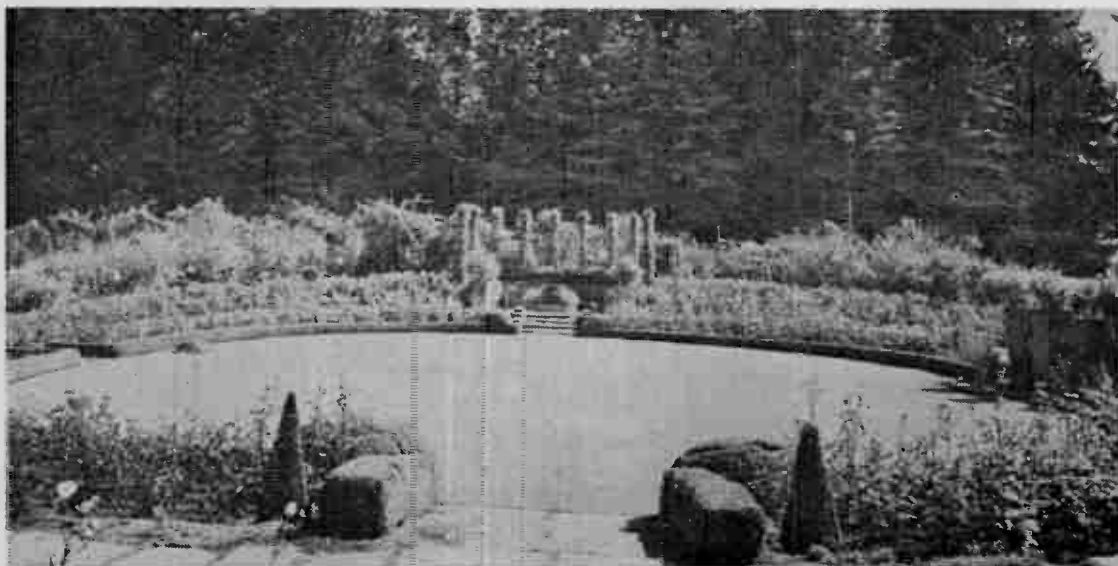

Outstanding beauty by day . . .

THE BUTCHART GARDENS, located 11 miles north of Victoria on the coast of Vancouver Island, attract thousands of visitors every year, and have been called Victoria's biggest tourist attraction. The gardens were begun in 1909 by Robert and Jenny Butchart, in an abandoned 2½-acre limestone quarry from which cement-magnate Butchart had made his fortune. Today they spread over 25 acres and contain many thousands of different varieties of plants. Some of them were personally collected by the Butcharts during their extensive travels, and seeds from the

garden have been shipped to the far corners of the world.

The original quarry, 60 feet deep, now is a sunken garden that forms the centrepiece for the large expanse of formal gardens, lawns, copses, pools, fountains, and waterfalls. It has been described as "a willow pattern in a deep china bowl," and the comparison is apt, for the Gardens have lent their name to china-ware floral patterns.

This Saturday (August 14th, at 6:00 p.m.) CBC tv's *Countrytime* will take viewers on a filmed tour of the famed Butchart Gardens.

A Matter of Choice

For some, retirement is a resented forced idleness with which they can barely cope. Others find it a welcome reward after a busy life. Retired persons speak their views Sunday, August 15th on CBC tv

DORA COLSON, Earl Taylor, and Les Dun all work for the British Columbia Hydro Authority in Vancouver. They have something else in common: This spring they all reached their 65th birthdays, and must retire — whether they want to or not.

School teacher Frances Padgett has also reached 65 and must retire. She doesn't mind at all; she is looking forward to having more time of her own. On the other hand an ex-school teacher, Charles Carpenter, who retired in 1960, still resents the fact that he is no longer wanted, and feels that his many years of teaching experience could and should be made use of by society.

This week CBC tv's *Camera West* series studies retirement, a subject that is becoming ever more important to more people as life expectancies increase and retirement ages are reduced. In preparing the program, entitled *A Matter of Choice*, producer Stanley Fox interviewed many people who had retired or were about to retire; from these he selected six who represent many of the attitudes and problems that come with retirement. He found that many had been planning for the step for years; they anticipated no difficulties in keeping themselves constructively occupied and interested in the world around them. Others had not prepared themselves in any way; they discovered that, after they had closed up the office desk for the last time, they were confronted by a monotonous series of empty, uneventful days without point or interest.

H. B. Mills, another of those interviewed on the program, finds no problem in filling his time. Now in his 80s, he is an active committee worker, has a busy social life, and dedicates his extra leisure time to, in his words, "improving the lot of my fellow men."

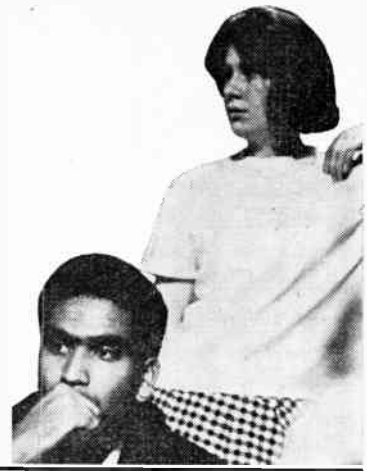
The city of Victoria, with its mild temperatures and pleasant pace of living, is a favorite goal for those who are retired. The city has a large number of retired persons, from all parts of Canada, among its citizens. Thus it's not surprising that one of the most successful clubs for retired people — the Silver Threads Club — is located there. The club's executive director, Catherine Horne, is interviewed on Sunday's program, and explains how the organization keeps its members interested and participating, two vital factors in the club's success.



Intertel:

Is the Color Bar Now the Rule in Britain?

A special report on racial discrimination in
Great Britain is seen Monday, August 16th on CBC tv



BRITAIN NOW has a colored population of about 1,000,000, approximately two per cent of the total population. This new element in Britain's social structure, which emerged in the early 1950s, is made up of roughly two halves — Asians, and Caribbean Negroes, with a scattering of African Negroes interspersed. While each of these two main groups share common experiences in Britain and have the same motives in emigrating there from their homelands, they are quite distinct from each other and have little else in common.

All of these immigrants left their own countries to escape poverty and seek the means of a better life. Most were drawn to large cities and to the industrial centres of Britain where job prospects are highest, and all found after a while that their presence was being increasingly resented. Congregated in large numbers in already overcrowded areas lacking adequate housing facilities, colored immigrants found what they least expected in Britain — racial prejudice, both open and covert.

Beyond the shared aims and humiliations suffered, the Asians and Negroes in Britain differ widely in their attitudes, their culture, their mode of life, and even their ambitions. The Asians — Indians and Pakistanis — as a whole do not plan to spend the rest of their lives in Britain. The money they earn is sent home — several million dollars a year — and they are prepared to accept jobs that the English refuse. In Pakistan, where the average annual income is about \$60, few of the men can support their families. By coming to Britain, the married men can increase their wages twelvefold. Among the Pakistani immigrants, only 10 per cent are women and almost all of these are married. In Britain they preserve their own customs and dress and their traditional home-life. Generally, Pakistanis do not complain of racial discrimination.

West Indians in similar situations do accuse the British of having a color bar. Their goals are different. They plan their future in Britain, feel British, and expect to be treated as British. Forty per cent of the West Indians who emigrate to Britain are women and in contrast to the Asian group, which has few children, there are many Negro children now growing up in Britain. To control the inflow of these immigrants, in 1962 the Conservative Government passed a Commonwealth Immigration Act, which curtailed the numbers of colored immigrants entering Britain. Previ-

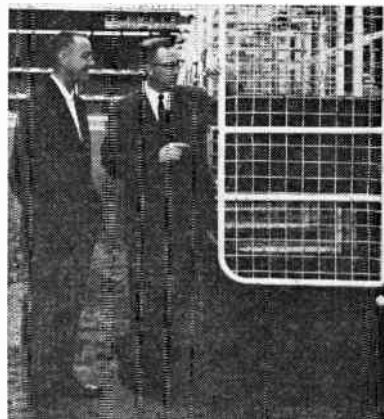

associated as lecturer and tutor with the University of Sheffield and the University of London. In 1927 he joined the British Broadcasting Corporation as head of the Adult Education Section and later was a founder of the BBC's literary weekly, the *Listener*, which he edited for nearly 10 years. His experience with the BBC provided material for a critical study of British broadcasting, published in 1940, *Ariel and All His Quality*.

Shortly before the Second World War, he came to Canada and in 1940 was named education advisor to the CBC. Three years later he was appointed supervisor of educational broadcasts and remained with CBC until his retirement in 1961. He was seconded in 1956 to the meeting of experts for the establishment of an international centre of educational, scien-

tific and cultural films for television convened in Paris by UNESCO.

Among his many published works are: *The Adventure of Canadian Painting* (1947), *Franklin of the Arctic* (1949), for which he received the Governor-General's (Juvenile) Medal for 1949, *The Fortunate Traveller* (1951), *North for Adventure* (1952), *They Went Exploring* (1954), and *Exploring the Supernatural* (1955).

In connection with the last-named, Lambert's interest in psychic phenomena dates from a personal experience in his youth, when he encountered poltergeistic disturbance within his family circle — vases and statuettes would disintegrate without being touched. Lambert was with the late Harry Price, founder of the University of London Council for Pyschical Investigation, on several expeditions of psychic investigations, including one at Britain's famous Borley Rectory. A few years ago he investigated Toronto's Mackenzie House for a television program reporting on psychic phenomena said to occur there.

Diary of an Angling Guide

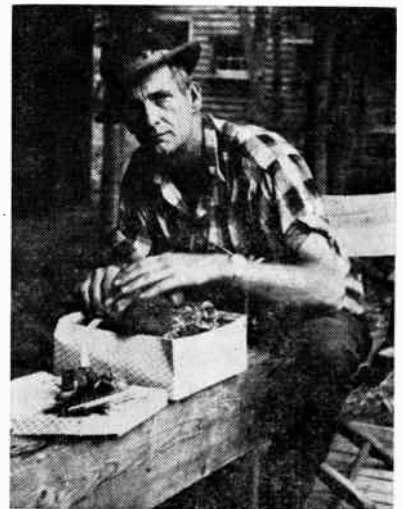
IN TERMS of mileage, New Brunswick's Miramichi river isn't worth boasting about. Canada has three or four dozen others that make it look like a brook. But if you're a fisherman looking for a fight with Atlantic Salmon, the Miramichi is the place to go; it's one of the best rivers in the western hemisphere for this sport. Fishermen come from all over the world to fish the Miramichi, and few go home disappointed.

Small it may be, but the Miramichi is no less tough than most of its big sisters. On the upper stretches of the river, from Half Moon Cove to Boiestown, there's a 55-mile run through barely accessible wilderness, little changed today from the time when Indians freely roamed there. To fish this run you need to be a skilled canoeist and you need the help of an expert guide: Somebody like Fred Clowater.

Fred was born and raised near the Miramichi and knows the river and surrounding countryside intimately. From spring through fall he makes his living as guide for fishermen and hunters during the open seasons.

On the Half Moon run, the guide heads the list of vital, basic requirements. When the water is high and the rapids boil, only the surest of experts can safely navigate that stretch. When the water level drops, exposing sand bars and rocks, only the professional guide can avert sudden disaster. Fred Clowater knows every rock along the way. He's had over 30 years experience snaking his way through. When he takes a party on the Half Moon run he's not only guide but doctor, cook, mentor, and fine craftsman able to fashion the most cunning lures.

What it's like along the Mira-

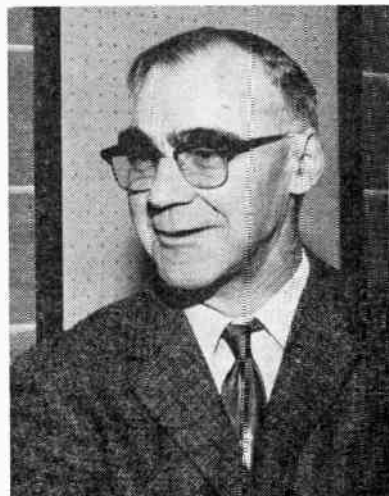

Outspoken, Parsnip-Loving Artist

BACK ON March 26th of this year, CBC tv's *Telescope* presented an illuminating filmed visit with Harold Town, a volatile and very successful Canadian painter, sculptor, muralist, print-maker, and costume designer. Viewers who missed that first showing will have another opportunity to see the program when it is repeated on *Telescope*, Friday, August 20th, at 9:30 p.m., under its original title, *About Town*.

Many an artist whose private world has been invaded by motion-picture cameras and microphones, has found himself suddenly tongue-tied, making it painfully obvious that he is able to express himself freely only in his work. Not so Mr. Town. He relishes a verbal exchange and speaks fluently and imaginatively, if often extravagantly.

Whether his medium be artistic creation, speech, or the written word, however, Town continues to make the Canadian way of life one of his favorite subjects — or perhaps targets would be a better word.

In the preface of his *Enigmas*—a series of satirical drawings reproduced in a limited bound edition of 175 copies, selling at \$150 per copy — he observes, among other things, that a person is given a bounty for shooting wolves which are important to the balance of nature, but nothing for "potting" a land speculator devoted to unbalancing nature; he also says that we invented hockey in Canada but are now incapable of icing an Olympic team that could beat the Egyptians.



His drawn *Enigmas* are just as vitriolic, portraying doctors on roller skates and children as fat little pigs; domineering women are pictured as athletes kicking a head instead of a ball; one drawing shows a wild-looking nude woman about to pin a tail on the bare derrière of a man wearing a bowler hat who is locked in stocks and fishes from a fishbowl held by a clown on a ladder.

Such Town expressions would have caused quite

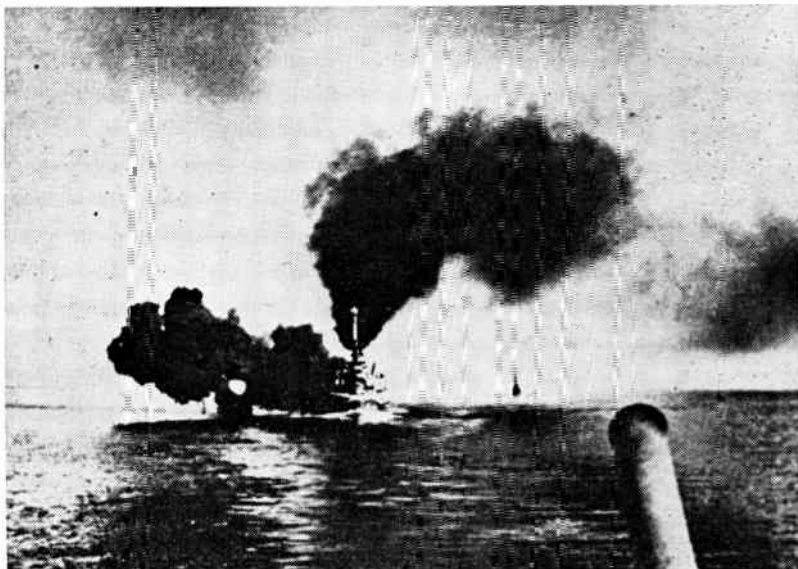

The Battle of 'The Great War'

PUTTING TOGETHER the BBC tv series *The Great War* resembled a military operation itself. "Operation Great War" began two years ago, when producers Tony Essex and Gordon Watkins took over a three-story house in London and began filling it with technicians, writers, and researchers—including, on loan from the CBC, associate producer Ed Rollins and film editor Myrtle Virgo. Appeals went out to the world for documentation of various aspects of the war: films, photographs, wartime orders and maps, letters. The response was overwhelming, and material flowed into the headquarters in a steady stream.

The letters—more than 50,000 were received and read — ranged from 172 hand-written pages down to a blunt, 13-word statement from a rifleman who fought at Ypres: "Nothing vivid happened. It was just hold onto what you have got." Eyewitnesses to wartime events were tracked down all over the world by teams of researchers (Canadian research was done by Elizabeth Day of CBC) and ultimately 300 people were filmed re-

calling their personal memories. The man who drove the first tank into France was traced, and he recalled asking directions of a British Army corporal whom he encountered in a shattered street. Quite independently, other researchers simultaneously turned up the corporal.

Every foot of film sent in was carefully scrutinized. "Some of it was in appalling condition," recalls Editor Barry Toovey. "Sometimes it was so bad we couldn't unroll it. It came in old Oxo tins, and in packing cases; in tiny little tight rolls, and in enormous quantities. Sometimes there was identification with it, more often there was none."

Most of the film required special processing, including "stretching" to eliminate the jerkiness. This was done by laboriously printing every second frame twice, thus bringing the 16-frames-per-second film up to the modern standard speed of 24 frames-per-second. All the film was catalogued, duplicate negatives made, and working prints were given to the individual producers and editors. The writers, all

New Writers' Program on Radio

AS AN experiment, the Public Affairs department of CBC radio launched a drive two years ago to seek out fresh literary talent among young Canadians. Headed by Program Organizer Robert McCormack, a contest was arranged having two categories — poetry and short stories — with a prize of \$500 for the best entry in each category. The judges were McCormack, Robert Fulford of the *Toronto Star* and *Maclean's*, and Eli Mandel, professor of English at the University of Manitoba.

So successful was this contest that in order to cope with the large number of entries, the original closing date was extended a further four weeks. The judges were delighted with the generally high standard of the entries. "It has been heartening reading through the bulk of first-quality material received," said McCormack at the time. "In the next generation, Can-

ada is going to have some good — very good — writers."

Early this year it was announced that the contest would be repeated, because of "The overwhelming response to CBC radio's short story and poetry contest in 1963 and the success of the broadcast series based on it," said McCormack.

The 1965 contest closed on May 31st and 12 of the best entries have been selected for a new series of radio broadcasts which begin this week. The judges will choose, from the works broadcast, the short story and poem to be awarded prizes. All material broadcast in the series is purchased from authors at the standard rate.

This year's panel of judges, chaired by Robert McCormack, includes Hugh L. Hood, an associate professor of the English Studies

ously the only requirement for entry was status as a citizen of the British Commonwealth; now, they must have sponsors, a firm offer of employment, and a home awaiting them before then can be admitted.

The conflict among Britons themselves over the issue of color is illustrated by the attitudes of two men, Fenner Brockway, a former Labour M.P., and Ronald Bell, a Conservative M.P. Every year for the past 10 years, Brockway has introduced a bill that has three sections relating to the color problem. He explains, "The first section would make discrimination on the grounds of color, race, or religion illegal in public places. The second would make it illegal to include any clause in the lease of a house or flat which was refusing accommodation on the grounds of race or color. The third section would make the incitement of hatred or contempt on the grounds of race or color illegal."

Such proposals are alien, some believe, to the British way of life. As Bell puts it, "I've been a warm opposer of that for many years, for a number of reasons. I'll give you just the main ones. First of all, in Britain we've never had laws forbidding particular social attitudes.

This would be a new departure. It would arouse intense hostilities throughout Britain, making Fenner Brockway's views on color problems orthodox and everything else illegal. I don't think anyone should be so certain of where the truth lies in this sort of matter that he should canonize his opinions into the law of the country." To which Brockway replies: "You might just as well say you mustn't have a law against murder because that would be a recognition of murder."

Phillip Mason, of the Institute of Race Relations in Britain, describes the general situation thus: "Color discrimination in Great Britain doesn't express itself very openly. This is partly because of the British habit of sweeping everything under the carpet — this is a very long-standing British custom sometimes called 'statesmanship'."

Race relations in Britain reached their nadir during the 1964 general election at a place called Smethwick, near Birmingham, when prejudice was made a political issue that helped unseat the Labour candidate, Patrick Gordon Walker. Smethwick was a Labour stronghold and Gordon Walker had held the Smethwick seat in the Commons for 19 years. A former Commonwealth Secretary, Gordon Walker was tipped as the next Secret-

ary of State for Foreign Affairs in a Labor administration. Smethwick had 5,000 colored immigrants out of a total population of 69,000, enough to be made political capital of. When the returns were in, Gordon Walker polled 14,916 votes and his Conservative opponent, Peter Griffiths, 16,690.

Smethwick gained world-wide notoriety, and the events there forced a reappraisal of the long-cherished notion of Britain's traditional fair-mindedness. Did Smethwick, in fact, represent most British towns with a high population of colored immigrants? To find out, the U.S. members of Intertel (Westinghouse Broadcasting Co. Inc., and National Educational Television) sent a production crew to Smethwick and other centres in Britain to report on racial conditions there. This week (Monday, August 16th, at 7.30 p.m.) CBC tv presents their findings in the program, *This Question of Color*. Included in the program, which follows newly arrived immigrants to Britain on job-hunting and house-hunting expeditions, are interviews with Patrick Gordon Walker, Fenner Brockway, and Ronald Bell, as well as with many of the immigrants and British people.

Help for Desolate Women

Otherwise friendless women in Toronto have a place to go where they are accepted as they are. CHRISTIAN FRONTIERS reports on Street Haven Tuesdays, August 17th and 24th

IN MANY of Canada's big cities several agencies exist to help alcoholics, the down-and-outs, drug addicts, and ex-inmates of prisons looking for a fresh start. The city of Toronto has a wide variety of such agencies, ranging from the Salvation Army to the Scott Mission and the Elizabeth Fry Society.

To these was added a few months ago a new and slightly different centre called Street Haven. Founded by a nurse from the Don Jail staff, Peggy Ann Walpole, and Mrs. Emily Carling and Kay Catania, Street Haven opened last March in what was formerly the beverage room of a hotel in the downtown area. Street Haven is a non-denominational refuge for women who are drug addicts, prostitutes, lesbians, shop-lifters or just drifters. To these people Street Haven offers comfort and hope, with no questions asked. It is a place where those just out of prison can go for a rest and a cup of coffee, where they can bathe and iron a dress, and relax and just be themselves.

The advisory board of Street Haven includes Rabbi David Monson, Rev. Frank Stone, Patrick Hart, Q.C., Rev. David Busby, and Alderman June Marks. Also associated with the centre is the man who founded New York's famous Village Haven, Rev. Daniel Egan (who last week was interviewed about his work, on tv's *Compass* series). Father Egan has been working with the kind of people who seek help at the Haven for over 15 years, and is known as "The Junkie Priest." Unlike the Toronto centre, which is a meeting place, the New York Haven provided accommodation for girls,

about 10,000 a year. "We can't estimate how many we've helped," he says, "The definition of help itself is very relative. Help for some is a place to sit down tonight and to be accepted for what they are. We keep women in jail for months, and what do we do when they get out? We reject them."

This may be part of the explanation of why approximately 80 per cent of such people are re-convicted; nevertheless, Street Haven is still open to them. There are no sure results. "For every 10 that go back," Father Egan says, "I might save one. Our goals are limited. We think in terms of immediate need. Even if a girl is given six weeks' reprieve from her old ways, even if she remains steady only

two weeks and we know she'll slip, at least it's a beginning."

A special two-part radio program on the work of Street Haven and the people who contribute to its operation will be presented this week and next on the series *Christian Frontiers* (Tuesdays, August 17th and 24th).

Prepared by Phyllis Duncan, this documentary broadcast includes interviews with Father Egan, Peggy Ann Walpole, Mr. Busby, and S. J. Holmes, M.D., D. Psych., director of the Narcotic Addiction Unit of the Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Research Foundation (Province of Ontario).

TO NON-DEVOTEES it may be strictly corn, but to its millions of faithful fans in Canada and the United States, country and western music (popularly known as C & W) is the sweetest sound this side of Paradise, and they follow its stars and songs with ardor.

Detractors of C & W may sneer that its lyrics are sometimes chokingly sentimental and its melodies often lugubriously banal, but if such critics are honest they have to admit that C & W whoop-and-holler numbers at least offer a healthy contrast to the nocturnal hysteria of some other prevalent forms of popular music.

Regardless of its qualitative rating, however, there's no denying country music's commercial success. In fact, hearing a C & W star rendering a specialty like *Boo-hoo-hoo-hoo* recalls the gag about a much ridiculed but highly successful performer who responded to criticism by saying that he "cried all the way to the bank."

It has been estimated that C & W continues to flourish to the tune of \$100 million a year, with a network of more than 2,000 stations, in the United States alone, airing its product. The industry's capital is Nashville, Tenn., where 21 recording studios generally have 30 per cent of the current top C & W hits to their credit. The city also boasts the No. 1 C & W program, *Grand Ole Opry*—which has been going strong for 40 years and still packs them in each Saturday night — and the No. 1 annual C & W event, the Country Music Festival. Each year, hundreds of performers and droves of devotees make the pilgrimage to the Nashville spectacular, and leading U.S. and Canadian publications send reporters to get the low-down on the hoe-down.

This summer, CBC radio is aboard the C & W hay-wagon with a one-hour show entitled *Country Holiday*, broadcast Saturday nights at 9.00 p.m. The broadcasts are recorded on Friday nights in Lindsay, Ontario, which has been transformed into Canada's "Little Nashville" as hundreds of towns-

people and holidayers from surrounding resort areas flock to the Academy Theatre to enjoy Canadian C & W specialists and top Nashville artists on the CBC show. So step right up, pardners, and enjoy the music and fun — country style — on CBC radio, Saturday nights.

On radio, other dramas this week include an adaptation by George Ryga of the book *The Stone Angel*, by the distinguished Canadian novelist Margaret Laurence, to be broadcast on *CBC Sunday Night* (August 15th at 8:30 p.m.). The story of an old woman and her thoughts about her life and her family, *The Stone Angel* stars Ruth Springford as Hagar Shipley, the old woman; Tommy Tweed as Jason Currie, her father; John Drainie as Brampton Shipley, her husband; and Frank Perry as John, her younger son. Others in the cast include: John Scott as Marvin, her oldest son; James Peddie as Steven, her grandson; and Peg Dixon as her daughter-in-law. *The Stone Angel* is produced for the *CBC Sunday Night* series under the direction of Esse W. Ljungh.

Perhaps best known as a short-story writer, Margaret Laurence is a Manitoban, married to an engineer whose work involves travel abroad, which has sometimes provided Miss Laurence with material for her writing. In the early 1950s she spent four years in Ghana and later went with her husband to Somaliland. She has published *This Side Jordan* (1960), *The Prophet's Camel Bell* (1963), about her travels in Somaliland, *The Tomorrow-Tamers* (1964), a collection of stories and *The Stone Angel* (1964). In the United States, her publisher, Alfred A. Knopf, last year issued three of her books simultaneously, an unprecedented honor for a Canadian writer.

a stir in his old *enfant terrible* days, but today the pendulum has swung to the other extreme. He's considered entertaining, not outrageous, more wacky than wicked, an eccentric to be indulged for the sake of his art. The truth is that the real Harold Town probably can be found somewhere between the two extremes. Certainly, the *Telescope* production presented him in much clearer perspective, picturing him in various settings: discussing his art collection in his home, working in his studio, charging through a Toronto ravine, and visiting New York's Guggenheim Museum and its little Museum of Early American Folk Art.

military experts, then viewed the assembled material and prepared their scripts.

Sound editing crews were the final recruits of all. They started work at the end of February, 1964, with the narrators — Sir Michael Redgrave, Sir Ralph Richardson, Marius Goring, and Emyln Williams. Wilfred Josephs wrote and conducted his musical score for the series, and the complete soundtracks were joined to the episodes.

The whole massive and complicated task of producing the series required great concentration and involvement from the staff. "It was just like fighting the war all over again," says Ed Rollins. "One became so involved in the material, watching the famous battles and knowing — when we saw a big push beginning—just how many of the men on the screen were about to die."

The Great War is now seen three times weekly on CBC tv: Tuesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. The episodes this week deal with the mutiny in the French Army, the American attitude to U-boat war, the *Lusitania*, and *Passchendaele*.

JACK BENNY:

Being a 'Tightwad' Made Him Rich . . . and Lovable

A 71-YEAR-OLD youngster, who admits to 39 of his years, a man who describes his eyes as "Lake Louise Blue," a master comedian and pillar of American show business, Jack Benny, continues on CBC tv during the summer on *The Jack Benny Program*, Mondays at 10:00 p.m.

The world-famous comedy star began his broadcasting career on the U.S. networks in 1932. Benny has been a headline performer longer than any other regularly active figure in television. Much of that time has been spent building a public image of himself as a lovable cheapskate, an indescribably bad violinist, and a harsh, demanding employer. Quite the opposite is true.

Those who know Benny personally consider him the greatest audience for his fellow comedians, a fairly good violinist, a generous boss, and a big tipper who worries about being considered a tightwad in real life.

Although he has long since achieved fame, fortune and position, Benny hasn't rested on his laurels. Indeed, he has become even more active in recent years. Before starting his 1964-65 season he made a whirlwind flight to Australia where he performed on television and before audiences who accorded him standing ovations.

The previous summer he headed his own stage revue which played in Toronto for two weeks and then enjoyed a successful six-week run at New York's Ziegfeld Theatre. Benny also gives many benefit violin concerts to raise money (to date he has raised more than \$3,000,000) for charity.

Though Benny long has feigned ineptness on the violin, he was considered as a child (born Benjamin Jubelsky in Waukegan, Illinois) to be somewhat a prodigy

by his music teachers. Had he not decided to go into vaudeville when he was young, Benny says he probably would have stuck it out with the violin and be playing today in some symphony orchestra. "Isaac Stern told me once," the comedian recalls, "that I still have a perfect bow arm."

As for his concerts, Benny, being Benny, kids around on stage a great deal. But when he puts bow to strings, he is serious. In 1959 the American Composers Alliance recognized Benny's efforts by presenting him its Laurel Leaf Award and a certificate citing the vast sum he has raised for the cause of good music.

The violin introduced Benny to show business. In grammar school he took a part-time job as an usher at the Barrison Theatre in Waukegan. Encouraged by his music teacher, he applied for and won a place as a violinist in the theatre orchestra. During high school days, Benny continued playing at the theatre, and also joined the school orchestra.

While in his middle teens, Benny and Cora Salisbury, the Barrison Theatre pianist, put together an act and toured vaudeville throughout Illinois and Wisconsin. Later, Benny and his violin joined Chicago pianist Lyman Woods.

The act broke up in the early days of World War I when Benny joined the Navy. He was assigned to the Great Lakes Naval Training Centre, where his talents were added to the Great Lakes Revue, a serviceman's show which toured the Midwest to raise funds for Navy Relief. This show was an important turning point in Benny's career. In it he discovered he could entertain an audience without his violin, and soon developed a comedy monologue which eventually set the style for most of his tv shows today.



He toured after the war under the professional name of Ben K. Benny. He dropped the billing because of its similarity to that of another violin-wielding comedian, Ben Bernie.

He hit upon the name by which he is known today when a sailor he had known at Great Lakes, unable to remember his name, greeted him with "Hi ya, Jack," a salutation then in vogue. It registered at once and he became Jack Benny.

Benny caught the eye of New York producers and began appearing in musicals for Earl Carroll and the Shuberts, on Broadway and on the road.

He met his future wife, Mary Livingstone, in Los Angeles, while on tour with one of these musicals.

Mary proved a good foil for Jack on his radio show which started on NBC radio in 1932 and soon became an institution throughout North America. When television started after the war, Jack made the transition easily with the main members of his cast and much the same kind of show. Mary retired from the hectic world of television after a few years, however.

Being a "tightwad" on stage has made Jack Benny one of entertainment's wealthiest men. And his talent has made life a richer experience for the millions he has entertained, and for the millions more he has helped through his charitable works.
