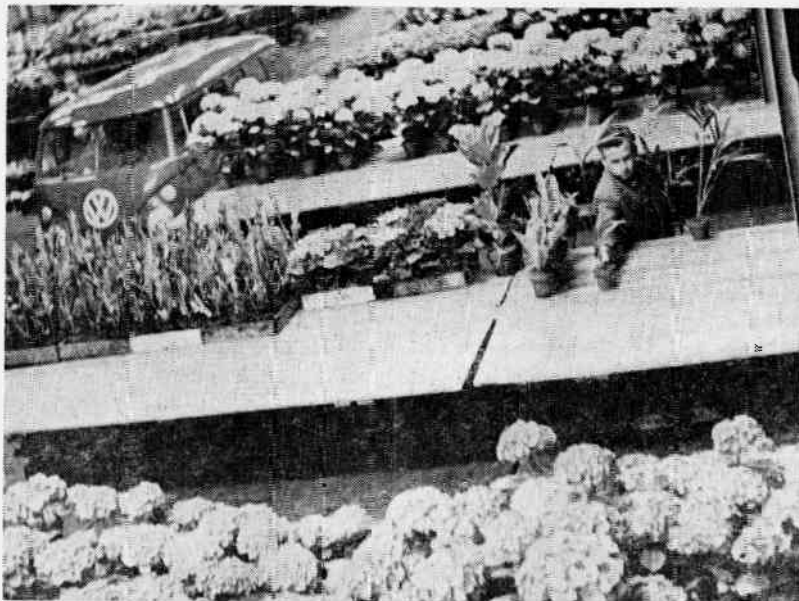
"WORDS CAN scarcely describe the beauty of the Dutch countryside when the flowers are at their peak. No matter which direction we looked during the flower blooming season in the Lisse and Hillegon areas, the landscape was a panorama of color," says Lionel Moore, Prairie Regional Supervisor of Farm Broadcasts, in describing his visit to The Netherlands last May.

Moore and cameraman Steve Solilo spent several days in that country, filming some of the scenes for a special program on the Dutch flower and bulb-growing industry to be seen on the Prairie edition of CBC-TV's *Country Calendar*, Easter Sunday at 1:30 p.m.

The industry is divided into two branches: one concentrates on the production of bulbs for local sale and export; the other is devoted to the growing and selling of potted plants and cut flowers.

The traditional method of transportation, by canal barge, still is used by growers both for bringing in supplies of fertilizer and for taking the production to the auction halls to be sold.

"The auction hall we filmed for *Country Calendar* had six rings devoted to the sale of cut flowers and plants," says Moore. "The method of sale is (as you might expect) the Dutch auction." The scene in the auction hall is breathtaking as millions of blooms are assembled at 5:00 a.m. in readiness for the start of bidding. Buyers representing customers from all of Europe and some from North America are at stands around the rings, each with a button before him for signalling his bids. The lot

to be sold is brought into the ring, and a large, clock-like meter starts indicating ever-decreasing prices. When the price is right for a particular buyer, he presses the button before him, and the flowers are his.

Neil Van Zanten, a third-generation bulb grower, showed the CBC film crew around his 125-acre bulb farm at Hillegon for *Country Calendar*. All transportation on the farm is by barge through the intricate canal system that crisscrosses the fields. Mr. Van Zanten has his own scientific advisors developing new varieties and working on projects to improve bulb storage and shipping techniques. His firm exports bulbs to Canada, the United States and most European countries. During the fall shipping season Canadian plant product inspectors work closely with exporters like Van Zanten to ensure that quality standards are maintained on all bulbs shipped to this country.

THE EASTER REBELLION, which led eventually to the formation of the Irish Republic, broke out on April 24th, 1916, and lasted less than a week before it was suppressed. About 1,500 men and women of the Republican Army took over key points throughout Dublin on Easter Monday, and an Irish Republic was proclaimed from the stronghold established by Padraic Henry Pearse and 200 of his men, the General Post Office.

At first the rebels were jeered by most of their countrymen, and Dubliners viewed the rising as something of an entertainment. As events progressed, however, it turned into a tragedy, with hundreds dead and wounded. By April 29th the rebellion was a failure.

Fifty years later, Lyal Brown visited Dublin to talk with people who remember the street fights of the Rebellion. Their recollections are heard Sunday at 10:30 p.m. on CBC radio's *Project '66*.

FESTIVAL is repeating this week the powerful BBC-TV reconstruction of the last battle fought on British soil. *Culloden*, first telecast on CBC-TV last December, is a slice of British history served up raw and bloody, with none of the facts glossed over to make them more palatable. It shows the slaughter of the Highlanders, who, in 1746, made a last stand on Culloden Moor in their bid to restore

Prince Charles Edward of the House of Stuart to the British throne.

Culloden was the first big success of a young BBC producer, Peter Watkins, who has since left the Corporation following a dispute over another documentary he made called *The War Game*. Watkins' talent was first recognized by the Canadian film critic of the London *Evening Standard*, Milton Shulman,

who saw a short film made by Watkins on the Hungarian Revolution of 1956. Like *Culloden* this was a reconstruction of an actual event filmed as if newsreel cameras were on the spot. Of *The War Game*, which has now become something of a *cause célèbre* in Britain, the film critic Kenneth Tynan said, "I suspect that it may be the most important film ever made," and described it as a "masterpiece."

Watkins' technique in all three films has been "documentary" in the best sense of the word. He uses no professional actors, stages all the action outside the studio, and induces in the viewer a feeling of participation in the event. In the making of *Culloden* he used the descendants of the Highlanders who died in the battle and its savage aftermath, the people of Inverness who are shop-keepers, plumbers, teachers and housewives living near the moor. "I got half a dozen excellent Highlanders from the aluminum works in Kinlochleven," says Watkins. "They had never been in front of a

FOUR OF THE most promising young newcomers on the Canadian entertainment scene team up for an hour of songs, dances and sketches on CBC-TV's *Show of the Week* on Monday, April 11th. Needs Now . . .

A teenage coffee house
in a church basement
is visited Sunday by
CBC-TV's HERITAGE.

TRADITIONALLY the church has been the focal point of the small community; not only a place of worship, but also a centre for much of the community's secular activities. In Richmond Hill, Ont., one church in particular (St. Mary's Anglican) has responded to the needs of the community by providing a place where young people can meet and relax and just be themselves without adult interference. Three years ago Richmond Hill had no such place. The local teenagers had to choose between hanging around hamburger joints or driving to Toronto.

Today, any teenager who wants to hear rock 'n' roll in the atmosphere of a coffee house goes to St. Mary's, where the church basement has been transformed into "The

Fragments." This is a coffee house run by the teenagers themselves, non-denominational and everybody welcome. It was started three years ago by the Rector of St. Mary's, the Reverend J. O'Neil, and his curate, the Reverend D. Bone. They leave the teenagers pretty much alone but drop in on them now and then for a coffee and a chat, not with the idea of converting anyone. "We've steered away from this," says Mr. O'Neil. "We have a need to serve the young community around here and I think they have a need to find a place to get together. Religion is about life. This is what we're here for. I think if we can help this generation to see that it isn't all square and it isn't all what they think it is, sort of

Problems Facing India



IN THE mid-1950's Philip Deane spent two years in India as foreign correspondent for the London *Observer*. One of his children was born there and together with his wife Molly he wrote *The Childish Brides*, which vividly portrayed modern India.

Tuesday, April 12th, as host of CBC-TV's *The Public Eye*, he narrates a film by Mogens Gander which looks at some of the problems facing India today. *The Public Eye* film crew spent three weeks last February in Calcutta, New Delhi, and villages near Bombay.

While it is the Central Government of India that controls the big cities, the powerful caste system is still the most potent factor in rural India. Out of a total population of more than 470,000,000, 82 per cent of the people live in the countryside, and much of India's present trouble may be attributed to her caste system.

Research for this program was carried out by Julian Janvrin, and the film is edited by Alan Wargon. Richard Nielsen is the producer.

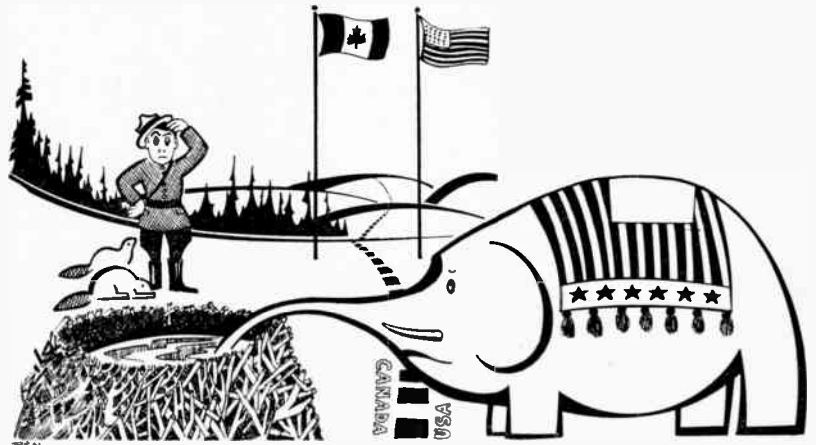

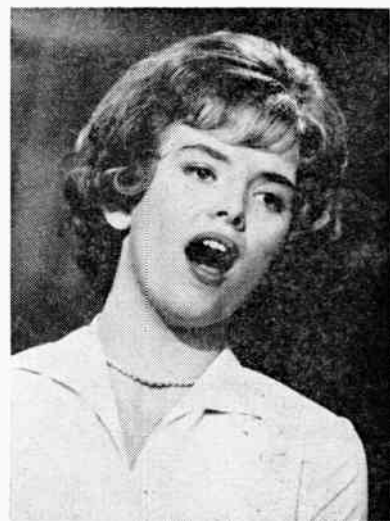

Fought in 1746 on Culloden Moor, near Inverness, Scotland, it pitted 5,000 Highlanders, the Jacobites under Bonnie Prince Charlie, against the Duke of Cumberland's English forces, 9,000 strong. The Jacobites, making a last vain attempt to restore the Royal Stuarts to the thrones of England, Ireland and Scotland, met with devastating defeat. Written and produced by Peter Watkins, the film has a cast of non-professional actors drawn from the area where two centuries ago the battle was fought. After its first Canadian showing on *Festival* last December, Culloden won critics' and viewers' acclaim across the country.

Part 2 — Monique Leyrac—Winner at Sopot. Montreal's fabulous Monique Leyrac is featured in this musical cameo, singing the song with which she won the top award at an international song festival in Sopot, Poland last summer. The song, *Mon Pays*, by Montreal composer-singer, Gilles Vigneault, also won a first prize as the best original song in the festival. Making her debut on CBC-TV she also sings *L'Hiver, Tout mais pas ca*, and *Try to Remember*. André Gagnon conducts a 24-piece orchestra. Host is Jacques Gauthier.

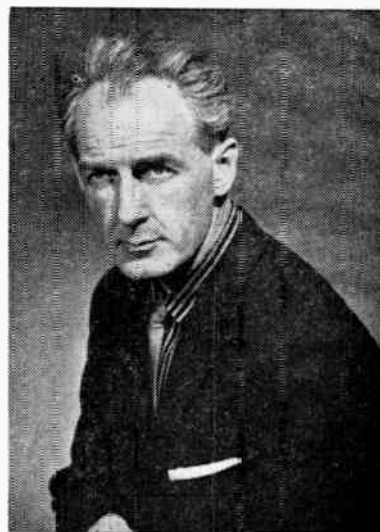

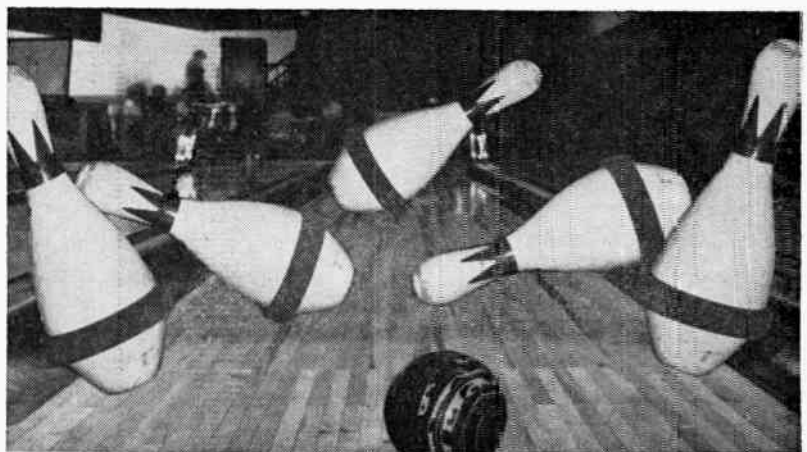

CAST: Faust—tenor Nicolai Gedda; Mephistopheles—bass Cesare Siepi; Marguerite—soprano Jean Fenn. Conducted by Georges Pretre.

Act I. Faust's study. In despair at completely solving the secrets of science, Faust is about to take poison, but desists on hearing Easter carols. However, he calls on Satan, who shows him a vision of Marguerite, whereupon the old man sells Satan his soul in exchange for transformation into a young man.

Act II. Before the city gate. Students sing, as it is a Festival day. Valentin arrives and gazes upon his sister's picture. Siebel promises to protect Valentin's sister while the soldier is in the field. Mephistopheles, mingling with the students, prophesies to Siebel that never again will he carry a bouquet to Marguerite, as all the flowers he touches will fade. Valentin with his friends attacks the jeering Mephistopheles, but the Fiend draws a magic circle around himself that fends off their weapons. The people return and dance. Faust offers his arm as escort to the blushing Marguerite, but is refused.

Act III. Marguerite's garden. Siebel picks a bouquet for Marguerite, but the flowers fade. Then he dips his hands into holy water, and through this expedient is able to place this offering at Marguerite's door. Faust and Mephistopheles appear, and the latter leaves a casket of jewels at Marguerite's door, then departs with Faust. When Marguerite discovers the jewels, she is dazzled by them and in delight adorns herself. Martha appears, then Faust with Mephistopheles. Faust declares his love to Marguerite, and she loses her heart to him.

Act IV. A street. The soldiers return from war. Valentin enters his house. Mephisto arrives with Faust and scoffingly serenades Marguerite. Valentin rushes out of the house and is stabbed by Faust in a duel which ensues. The people assemble in excitement. Marguerite sorrowfully bends over the dying Valentin, who curses her as a wanton.

Act V. The Walpurgis revel, and Mephisto takes Faust to join them, but when Marguerite's image appears, Faust orders Satan to convey him to his beloved. (This scene may be omitted).

Change of scene: Marguerite in prison, having become insane. Faust, trying to save her, recalls to her the scenes of their love and joy. She finally repulses him and submits to the judgment of God. Faust flees with Satan, Marguerite dies, and the angels bear her to heaven.

Strindberg Drama of Conflict

UNHAPPY August Strindberg, the greatest and most prolific author Sweden has produced, was one of the strangest personalities in all literature, a mad genius who felt forced to castigate all that he loved best, including himself. Born in Stockholm in 1849, to a bankrupt shipping agent and a barmaid, he grew up timid and inarticulate, unloved and neglected in a large family noted for its tumultuous disorder and religious fanaticism. He developed an inferiority complex and persecution mania which haunted him all his life. His nervous temperament and the world around him were in constant, stormy conflict.

He was sent to Uppsala University for a time, but he left and held a variety of jobs — teacher, doctor's assistant, small-part actor, painter, art and drama critic, journalist, telegrapher, editor. When he

was 20 he suddenly had the urge to write a drama, and when he had begun it, felt extraordinary relief, "as if a long pain were over, an abscess lanced at last." But his brutally beautiful writing earned him barely enough to live on so, in 1874, he obtained an appointment as assistant librarian at the Royal Library in Stockholm, where he quickly learned enough Chinese to catalogue the Chinese manuscripts.

In 1877 he met Siri von Essen, Baroness Wrangel, who divorced her husband to marry him. For 14 years she was the subject of his mingled sadism and masochism as his first period of genuine insanity developed. They lived mostly abroad, and he turned out a steady stream of savagely tender novels, articles, essays, plays, stories, poems, that were largely autobiographical and confessional, and made him famous. He divorced his wife and married again, this time a young Austrian journalist, but he turned against her and that marriage failed, too. He went to live in Paris alone, deciding to give up the writing in which he had been "flaying his friends and offering their skins for sale, and using his own wife as a rabbit for vivisection." He turned to the study of science and nature in his search for truth, delving into every sort of occultism and demonology — even trying to make gold by alchemy.

Eventually, after wandering around Europe for a time, he returned to Sweden, an old man with "a scared and crumpled face," who called himself "the second illumination." Friends nursed him back to health and he began to write once more. He even married — a young actress — but was divorced three years later. He founded his own theatre to produce his plays, but it failed — he felt it was retribution for his earlier loose living — so he returned to journalism to support himself. He even became engaged to an 18-

year-old girl, but she broke it off.

Strindberg died of cancer in 1912, but before that, ironically, those he had scourged and exoriated the most had forgiven their "vengeful giant," and his last birthday was a national celebration, at which this lonely old explorer of the human heart sneered and refused to enjoy.

His last play, *The Great Highway*, written in 1909, which tells of the unending conflict in himself between the heights of heaven and the precious, though soiled, vales of earth, will be presented on radio's *CBC Stage* on Easter Sunday. Production is by a fellow Swede of distinction, Esse W. Ljungh.

Another Strindberg play, *The Father*, adapted by Howard Griffin, will be produced on radio's *Midweek Theatre* in May.

ON EASTER SATURDAY at 1:10 p.m., the radio series *Agenda* will concentrate on plans for the Centennial.

The first part of the program will be about the Canadian Inter-Faith Conference, the coming together of 28 religious beliefs for the purpose of planning religious participation in the 1967 observances. Recently the Conference commissioned a Centennial hymn. The words, in both English and French, are to be written by Robert Choquette, the Canadian Consul-General in Bordeaux, France. The music is to be composed by Dr. Healey Willan of Toronto, who, though only 14 years short of his own centennial, is as musically creative as ever.

The second part of the program concerns the Centennial project of the Canadian Council of Churches: *Canada Books For 1966-67*. The books, to be published this month, are for all age groups. Their theme is the contribution of the Church to the development of Canada.

ments in our history," he said. "This can be as important as exporting wheat or oil or anything else."

Later, when the Throne Speech was debated at the beginning of this year, the Minister of Northern Affairs and National Resources, Arthur Laing, urged a go-slow policy regarding the sale of water to the United States. Canada, he said, has about 30 per cent of the world's fresh water supply and it is the nation's greatest natural resource.

The United States has been concerned for some time now about its own supplies of water. The problem there is twofold — not only the shortage of existing supplies, but also pollution of rivers and streams that are proving costly to purify for human consumption. A fairly conservative estimate puts the cost at 40 billion dollars over 10 years to clean up U.S. waters. A simpler solution, to many Americans, is the import of Canadian water.

Last week CBC-TV's *The Sixties* examined the problem of pollution

of lakes and rivers in North America. This week host Charles Lynch narrates the second part of the program, which deals with the thorny question of exporting our water. Among the guests commenting on the issue will be: Hon. Jean-Luc Pepin, Minister of Mines and Technical Surveys; Hon. J. N. Turner, Minister Without Portfolio; Hon. E. Davie Fulton; Senator Frank E. Moss. (Dem. Utah); Stewart Udall, Secretary of the Interior; and R. P. Kelly of the Ralph M. Parsons Co. of Los Angeles, who explains the North American Water and Power Alliance plan. This plan is a multi-billion dollar proposal for the diversion of northern rivers flowing through Alaska and northern Canada in order to irrigate and bring fresh water to the cities of the Canadian prairies, the Western United States, and northern Mexico.

Another scheme is the Great Replenishment and Northern Development (GRAND) Canal Plan, which will be explained by Sudbury engineer Thomas W. Kierans. GRAND proposes damming the waters of the rivers flowing into James Bay then pumping them

over high ground so that they will flow south to replenish the Great Lakes.

The International Joint Commission, which is responsible for the international waters that serve both Canada and the United States, is represented on the program by Arnold D. P. Heeney, former ambassador to Washington and now Canadian co-chairman of the Commission, and Governor Welsh, former Governor of Indiana and now American co-chairman of the Commission. Hon. E. Davie Fulton, recently elected chairman of the Conservative party's caucus committee on energy and resources, and one of the negotiators of the Columbia River Treaty, and Christian de Laet secretary general of the Canadian Council of Resource Ministers, will also be interviewed.

This edition of *The Sixties* is produced and directed by Cameron Graham, written by Chris Young, editor of the *Ottawa Citizen*, and edited by Jim Williams. Canadian and American Music

INSTRUMENTAL music by Howard Hanson, director of the famed Eastman School of Music in Rochester for many years, and an outstanding exponent and champion of modern American music, and by Samuel Barber, a composer of extraordinary charm and refinement along traditional lines, will be heard on *CBC Tuesday Night* at 11:05 p.m. Glen Morley conducts the CBC Vancouver Chamber Orchestra, and the featured artist is organist Hugh McLean.

The program includes *Concerto for Organ, Harp and Strings* (1943) by Hanson, and *Toccata Festiva for Organ, Trumpet, Timpani and Strings* (1960) by Barber.

Hanson is a native of Wahoo, Nebraska, who, at 28, became the first director of the new Eastman School. Barber, born in West Chester, Pennsylvania, is one of the few composers who are also trained singers—he studied voice at the Curtis Institute, Philadelphia.

The last feature of *CBC Tuesday Night*, at 11:30 p.m., will be a program of Canadian music by Samuel Dolin, well-known teacher of piano and theory at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, and by one of his most promising pupils, Ann Southam, a member of the Southam publishing family. It will be presented by violinist David Zafer, a member of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and pianist George Brough. They will play Dolin's *Sonata for Violin and Piano*, and Miss Southam's *A Rhapsodic Interlude*.

Occasionally Miss Southam gives a piano concert, but most of her time is devoted to composing. This is the second of her works to be broadcast by the CBC.

The now-disbanded CBC Symphony Orchestra recorded and gave first performances of several Dolin works, including his *Serenade for Strings*, dedicated to the memory of Albert Whitehead, voice teacher at the Royal Conservatory, To-

ronto, which was selected by the Olympic Committee for performance by Finnish Radio during the 1952 Olympiad in Finland.

Cohen Interviews Stephen Spender

A FEW months ago Stephen Spender, 57-year-old poet and critic, became the first Englishman ever to be appointed poetry consultant at the Library of Congress in Washington, where his big, white-thatched figure turns up from time to time at an elegant office to advise and encourage American poets with winsome, gentle eloquence. During his year in North America Spender is getting about the country quite a bit as university lecturer. When his itinerary brought him to Toronto in January, critic Nathan Cohen recorded an interview with him which will be heard on *CBC Tuesday Night* at 9:10 p.m.

As a poet Spender was most prolific in the 1930s, protesting against the social and economic redundancy of the British Establishment. In 1953 he and Melvin J. Lasky founded the outspoken monthly journal of liberal opinion, *Encounter*. Spender resigned the co-editorship recently so he could have more time for writing. He plans to get back to poetry, and to write a book about some of the differences between being American and being English.

"Like most writers and intellectuals," he says, "I have not really done anything interesting except my books (which were interesting to me while I was writing them). All the other things are gestures toward the life of action as rake, hero, martyr, coward, saint, sinner, ignoramus, scholar, I might have lived if I had been able to live at all."

Now it's 'Instant Armies'

IN THIS AGE of "instant" everything, time and distance are no longer considered major problems. For instance: last year, the United States demonstrated just how short a period of time was needed to "hot" up the cold war by delivering to Germany from the U.S. Mid-west, a completely equipped army composed of several battalions inside the space of eight days.

In February, CBC Halifax producer Paddy Gregg had the opportunity to examine this latest addition to world order when he joined the Canadian Battalion assigned to Allied Command Group Mobile Force, the 1st Battalion Black Watch, for exercise "Winter Express" in North Norway.

In a program titled *Kilts and Earmuffs*, Paddy describes the complexities and trappings of the modern mobile army, on *Between Ourselves*, Wednesday, April 13th, at 8:00 p.m. on radio.

Beginning at Camp Gagetown in New Brunswick, where the 1st Battalion Black Watch is stationed, Gregg joined the more than 1,000

servicemen who, by Hercules aircraft and RCN Transport vessel, were delivered in Northern Norway — 20 miles north of the Arctic Circle — inside of a week.

Throughout exercise "Winter Express," Gregg followed the troops, their tactics and their equipment in the beginning days of the month-long mock battle; a battle complete with possible realism, as the U.S.S.R. border is well within the rambling range of the fast-moving troops.

Also taking part in the exercise were detachments from the Norwegian, British, Italian and American armed forces.

On Part Two of this Halifax-produced *Between Ourselves* program, some compositions in the style of the Hebridean Islanders will be heard.

Composed and written by Dr.

W. G. Henderson, a bacteriologist at Dalhousie University, the selections provide an interesting and startling contrast to the accepted norms of present-day representation of ethnic music. Soprano Jean Marshall and harpist Phyllis Ensher will perform the works.

Distinguished Artists:

American Opera Star Royce Reaves in Recital

AMERICAN OPERA, oratorio and concert bass-baritone Royce Reaves, who has been singing mostly in Europe in the last three years, will be the *Distinguished Artist* in recital on radio Wednesday night, April 13th, at 10:30. He will sing *Lord, What Is Man?* by Purcell, arranged by Britten, and six songs by Richard Strauss. His accompanist is Mario Bernardi.

Earlier this season Reaves sang the role of John the Baptist in a Canadian Opera Company production of *Salome* in Toronto. He made his debut as Mephistopheles in *Faust*, at the age of 20. Now he has 50 operatic roles in his repertoire.

Born in Pekin, Illinois, he studied acting, piano and violin at the University of Memphis and in New York. Since 1963 he has been leading bass-baritone in Linz, Austria, and Lübeck, Germany.

Another musical highlight this week is the *Symphony Hall* broadcast by the BBC Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Leopold Stokowski, on Thursday, April 14th, at 9:00 p.m. The soloist will be Gloria Lane, mezzo-soprano. The program includes *El Amor Brujo* by Falla, and *Symphony No. 8* by Vaughan-Williams.

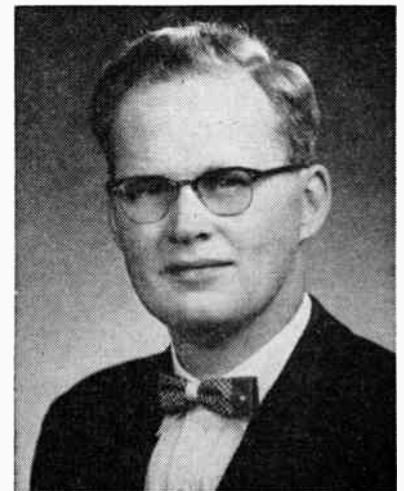

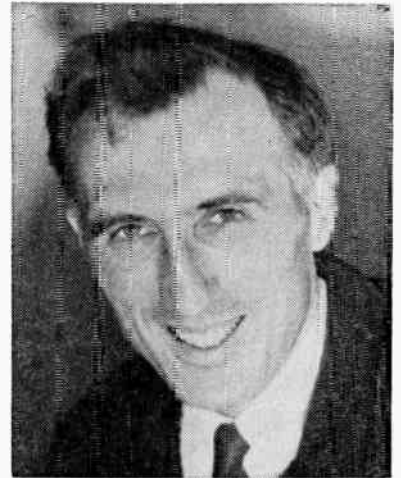
They Live in the Present

ROUGHLY 50 miles north of Paris, near Compiègne, lies the small village of Trosly. Here Dr. Jean Vanier, one of the four sons of the Governor General of Canada, is carrying out an unusual program of help for some of France's mentally retarded young adults.

In the summer of 1964, Dr. Vanier and some of his friends purchased a house at Trosly and set up the first of a projected number of homes (called L'Arche) for retarded young people. In France, where three per cent of the population comes under the heading of "mentally handicapped," it is customary for the retarded, on reaching the age of 20, to be discharged from special institutions where they are brought up and consigned to asylums for the insane. L'Arche, explains Dr. Vanier, means simply The Ark, or more fully The Ark of Noah. The Ark in this case exists to save the mentally retarded from being deluged by the bewildering technicalities of the world today.

"The mentally handicapped," says Dr. Vanier, "have great difficulty in adapting to the technical and administrative complexity of the modern world. They're God's children, too — perhaps the last innocents."

Dr. Vanier's interest in helping the less fortunate goes back much further than the founding of L'Arche. In 1950, when he was only 22, he resigned his commission as a Lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Navy (serving as an executive officer aboard the carrier HMCS *Magnificent*) "for religious reasons." For the next 10 years he immersed himself in theological studies, travelled, and lectured in philosophy at St. Michael's College, University of Toronto. Since the founding of L'Arche he has returned to Toronto from time to time to lecture at St. Michael's and to address the Canadian Theological Students' Conference. A few months after the first house at Trosly was pur-

chased, he told students at the conference that "in order to fathom the mystery of Christianity, we must become poor in spirit, lowly and humble," and went on to say, "How can Christ make his abode in us if we are too attached to ourselves? The profound mystery of Christ is the calling of love."

This is the spirit that moves all who work at L'Arche, where small groups of the mentally retarded can receive the kind of care and understanding which large institutions, housing 1,000 or more patients, are unable to supply. Although Dr. Vanier receives aid from the French Government there is still much work to be done and more help is needed to expand facilities. He hopes one day to see a number of places like L'Arche throughout France and other countries. Similar schemes are being tried out in England and Switzerland.

Thursday at 7:30 p.m. on radio's *Soundings*, Dr. Vanier will be heard talking about L'Arche in a program entitled *They Live in the Present*, a documentary on his work that was prepared in London by freelance broadcaster Barbara Green. It is produced by Ray de Boer. Program organizer for *Soundings* is Margaret Lyons.

THIS WEEK'S PERSONALITY: *John Vernon*

Left Broadway For CBC-TV Role as Coroner

JOHN VERNON, the husky Regina-born actor, left a Broadway hit play recently to star in a CBC-TV drama, *Tell Them the Streets Are Dancing*, telecast on *Bob Hope Theatre*, March 9th.

The Broadway hit is *The Royal Hunt of the Sun*, in which Vernon played a leading role, with the production's Canadian star Christopher Plummer.

The CBC-TV drama that lured John Vernon back to Toronto was the pilot of a projected 10-week, one-hour series (for next season) about a big-city chief coroner called Wojcek. He would play the coroner role in the series, as he did in the pilot production.

Vernon's career in Canada has been gaining momentum in the past few seasons. His stage work with the Stratford Festival, the Crest Theatre and the Manitoba Theatre Centre has been worked into an already-busy life in television and films. In the earlier days of TV, he did some 65 roles in such film series as *Cannonball*, *The Last of the Mohicans*, *Tugboat Annie* and *RCMP*, and more recently has appeared in the Toronto-produced series (ASP Productions) *The Forest Rangers*.

He has been seen frequently in National Film Board productions, and played the "heavy" in the now-famous NFB feature, *Nobody Waved Goodbye*.

But the bulk of Vernon's roles have been in CBC-TV dramas, about 70 parts on series like *GM Presents*, *Playdate*, *The Serial*, *Show of the Week*, and *Festival*.

Earlier this season, he starred with American actress Colleen Dewhurst in *Festival's A Cheap Bunch of Nice Flowers*, and it was from this that his Broadway opportunity came.

"George C. Scott, who is Miss Dewhurst's ex-husband, saw the *Festival* production and after wards recommended me for the

part in *The Royal Hunt of the Sun*," he relates. "George was to have done the Broadway role himself, but had other commitments."

His CBC-TV drama roles have run the gamut from the ex-convict hero of Morley Callaghan's *More Joy in Heaven* (dramatized on *The Serial*) to the aged Lord Burleigh in a *Festival* production of Maxwell Anderson's *Mary of Scotland*, taped recently but still to be telecast.

John Vernon's early training for an acting career included courses at the Banff School of Fine Arts, followed by two years of study on scholarship at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London, England, where he went when he was 20.

After graduation from RADA, Vernon stayed on in England working in repertory and the West End. He returned to Canada during the 1954-55 season, settling in Toronto.

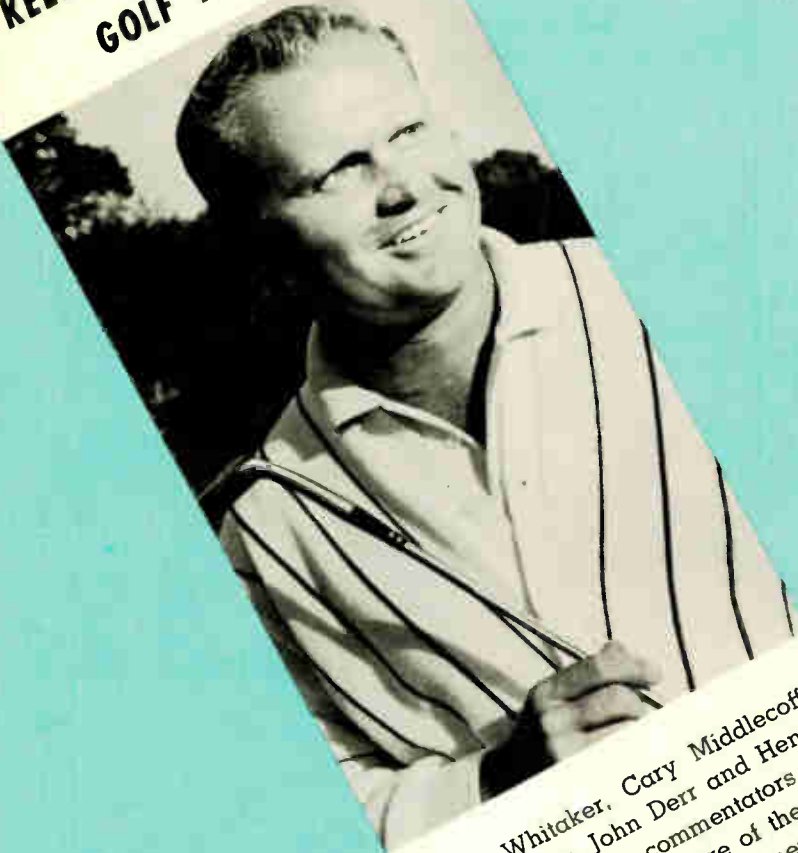
