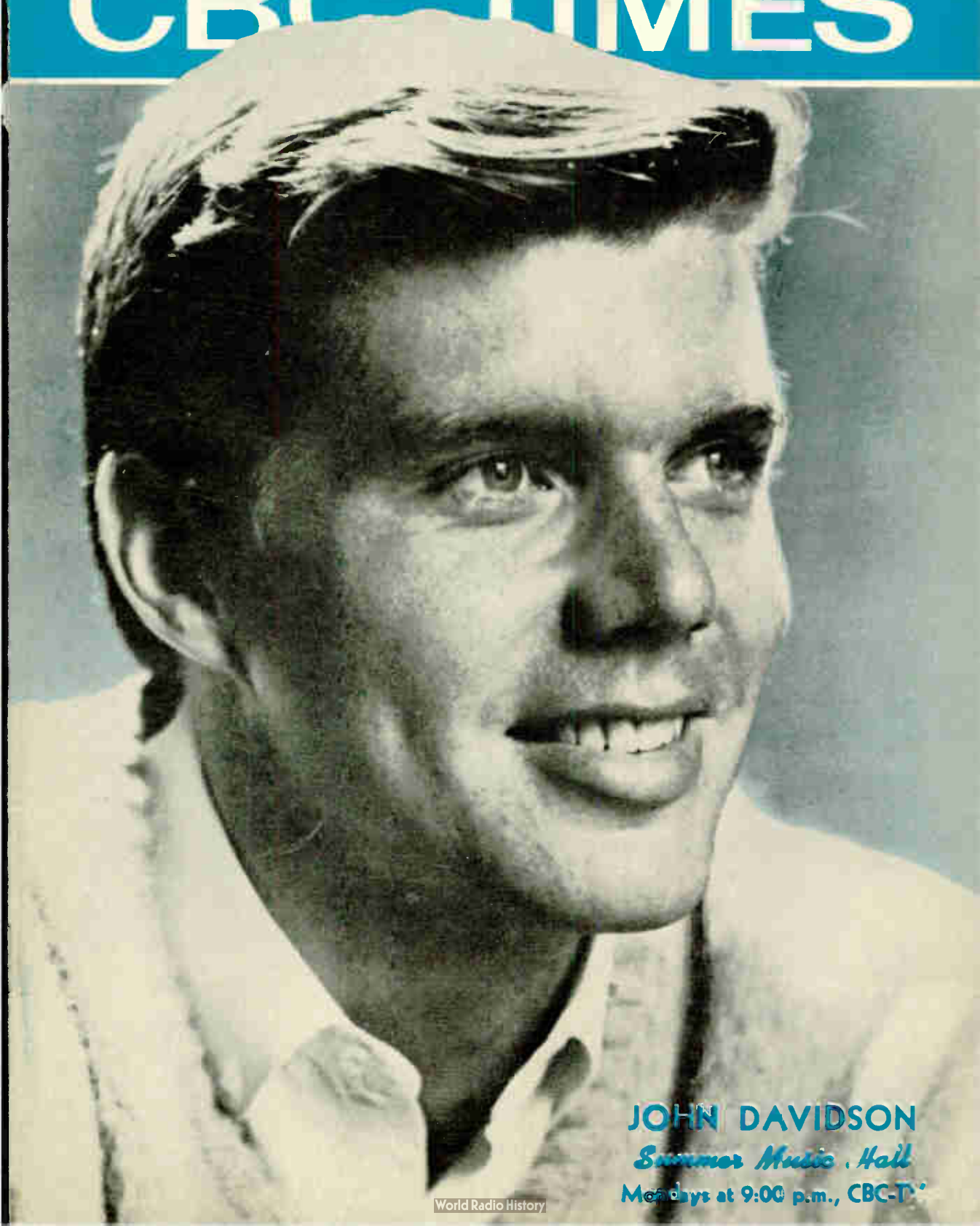

LIGHT MUSIC by Canadian composers will make up the next four programs on radio's *Winnipeg Pops Concert*, Fridays at 7:30 p.m. "Some extraordinarily good music is included in the series," says producer Tom Taylor, "some of it little known to the general public." The CBC Winnipeg Orchestra is, as usual, under the baton of Eric Wild.

Six of the pieces in the series have been recorded on four track stereo as a joint venture of the CBC International Service and RCA Victor. This is the first time that the recently developed four-track recording system has been used in Canada.

Compositions performed on the first program, Friday, July 8th, are by Calixa Lavallee, J. J. Gagnier, John Beckwith, Robert Fleming and Murray Adaskin.

Calixa Lavallee is remembered today chiefly as composer of *O Canada*. He was born in Vercheres, Que., in 1842, and died in Boston in 1891. Although he received his early musical training in Montreal, he spent the greater part of his life in the United States. For a time he was artistic director of the New York Grand Opera House, and later he studied in Paris under Boieldieu. Still later, he became associated with various American conservatories; at one point, from 1875 to 1880, he returned to live in Montreal, where his remains now rest, having been transferred there from Boston in 1933. His composition performed on the program, *The Bridal Rose Overture*, is one of his few orchestra works still in existence; a symphony and two suites have been lost.

Dr. J. J. Gagnier, like Lavallee, was born in Montreal, but he lived there throughout his life, from 1885 to 1949. Among his many musical activities: he was founder of the new Montreal Symphony and of the Montreal Little Symphony; he was captain and director of the Grenadier Guards Band from 1913 to his death; and he conducted numerous other bands and choral

groups, from the time he was 18 years of age. The composition selected for the program is *Journey*.

John Beckwith, born in Victoria in 1927, studied on scholarship at the Royal Conservatory, Toronto, graduating in 1947 with the highest marks of the year. In 1948 his *Five Lyrics of the Tang Dynasty* won for him a Capac award and later the same year he wrote a set of seven pieces for piano duet, on commission from the Toronto Forest Hill Community Centre. His *Music for Dancing* is performed by the CBC Winnipeg Orchestra.

Robert Fleming, a native of Prince Albert, studied in England, in Saskatoon (with Lyell Gustin) and at the Royal Conservatory, Toronto. In 1946 he joined the staff of the National Film Board and today he is its musical director. As well as composing for films, he has written considerable music of other forms, including ballets. The

work performed is *Ballet Introduction*.

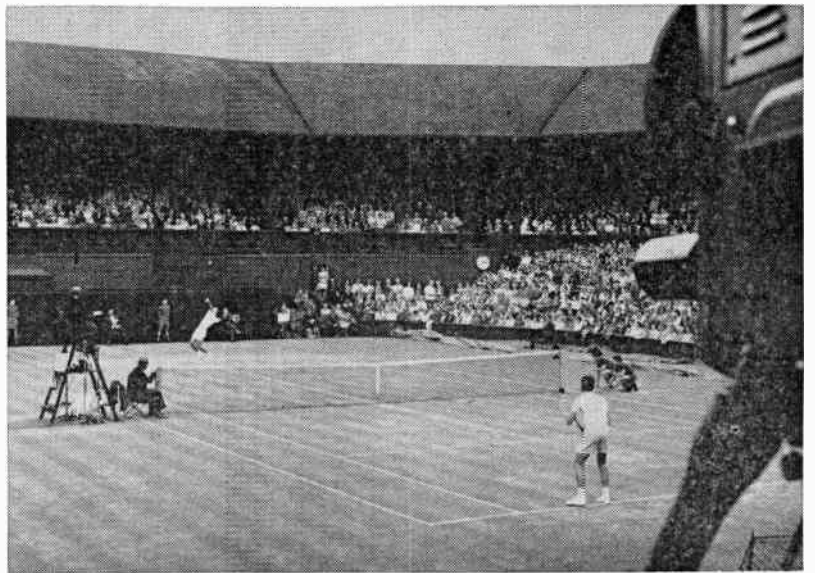
Murray Adaskin, fifth composer represented on the first broadcast, is head of the music department of the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon. His *March No. 2*, selected for performance, was written for his brother when he was preparing and presenting a series of concerts for school children.

July 15th: Clarence Lucas, Guillaume Couture, Claude Champagne and Lorne Betts.
July 22nd: Oskar Morawetz, Joseph Vézina and Kelsey Jones.

July 29th: Robert Turner, Leo Smith and Francois Morel.

The works recorded are: *Bridal Rose Overture*, by Calixa Lavallee; *Journey*, by J. J. Gagnier; *Overture to As You Like It*, by Clarence Lucas; *Reverie Opus 2*, by Guillaume Couture; *Perfumed Breezes Waltz*, by Joseph Vézina, and *Summer Idyll*, by Leo Smith.

THIS SATURDAY NIGHT, July 2nd, on CBC-TV at 7:00, *12 For Summer* presents the *Ken Colman Show*, featuring the popular young Vancouver night club and TV singer, actor and disk jockey, with special guests Patty Surbey and Gillian Russell, both of whom have appeared on *Music Hop* and *The Bill Kenny Show*. Musical accompaniment is provided by trumpeter Bobby Hales and his big band.

Colman sings *Almost in My Arms, What Now, My Love, While We're Young, My Talking Dog, Napoleon* (which he recorded last

year with a major record company) and *You're Going to Hear from Me*, and he joins Gillian and Patty in a medley of old favorites and pop tunes.

Also on Saturday night, at 6:30, viewers will be able to see the debut of *Summer Sounds '66*, a weekly series offering variety from various parts of Canada. CAROLE THOMPSON is a young, third-year student at the Vancouver School of Art. A portrait of Carole as she embarks on her fourth and final year at the school will be presented this Sunday on CBC-TV as the first of four programs in the series *Camera West*.

Sub-titled *Carole*, it was filmed on location in the city, partly at the school and partly at the studio Carole rents in downtown Vancouver and the Bohemian milieu she inhabits. "The students' slightly Bohemian life," says scriptwriter Dave Brock, "seems singularly free of the current youthful sick cults and poses . . . they enjoy work and despise most of the faddish beats. In the main, the film consists of pictures, to be looked at for their own sake without attempting to prove anything sociologically or to prove anything else. It celebrates some aspects of the present life of Carole, and some aspects of her environment."

Carole was photographed by John Seale and directed by Gene Lawrence, of CBC Vancouver.

The three other programs in the *Camera West* series are very different essays. One examines the West End area of Vancouver, with its striking contrasts in architecture and people; another explores the subject of creativity in children; and the final program, adapted from a prize-winning radio documentary by Len Chapple, recalls the sinking of the *Lusitania* in the First World War.

Next week (July 10th) producer Ain Soodor and cameraman Doug McKay present their impressions of one of the oldest parts of Van-



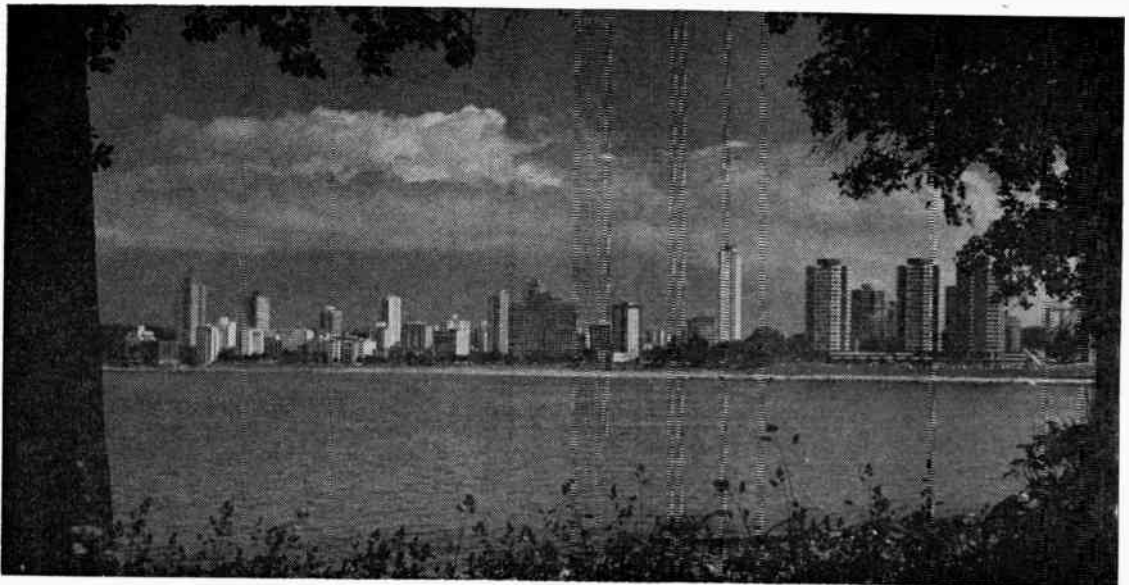

A concert on FESTIVAL, Wednesday at 9:30 p.m., features outstanding performers in works by Schumann and Mendelssohn.

CBC-TV's *Festival* ends the season with an hour-long concert from Montreal, featuring a glittering array of performers (Wednesday night, July 6th, 9:30). The program was telecast originally on the French network.

It consists of *Spanish Love Songs* by Schumann, sung by soprano Pierrette Alarie, contralto Maureen Forrester, tenor Leopold

Simoneau; and baritone John Boyden; and *Concerto for Two Pianos*, composed by Mendelssohn when he was only 13, and performed by the American duo-pianists Arthur Gold and Robert Fizdale, in the intimate style of its 1822 première, in a private drawing-room before a few invited friends. The orchestra is conducted by Alexander Brott.

Diary of a Restless River

20/20 views the history of flooding on the Red River Sunday at 5:30 p.m. on CBC-TV. This year's successful efforts to combat flooding are viewed, and the Greater Winnipeg Floodway, a permanent solution, is seen in the latter stages of construction.

THE RED runs north from spring into winter. As the new season creeps up from below the United States border and thaws the mounds of winter snow and runs the rivulets into streams and tributaries the northern ice of Manitoba still chokes the mouth.

The history of the Red is the history of flooding in the spring.

We remember the 1950 flood and what it can do to a community. The army troops, the Red Cross workers, the volunteers who all pitched in to combat the rising river with more than a million sandbags, many flown in from other communities around the world. The evacuations—more than 160,000 Winnipeg residents

Costing more than one million dollars, the ranch consists of 72 sections of land; 26 sections are deeded land and the balance leased land. It is divided in 27 separate pastures by 154 miles of fences. The co-op

consists of 117 members. Cameras show one cattle drive in particular. The herd consists of 700 to 1,000 cattle, on the road for three days.

Bright Summer Ahead for Young TV Viewers

A NUMBER of television series designed especially for children and teenagers begin this week on the network, some of them old favorites (*Vacation Time* and *Time for Adventure*), and some of them brand new. Also starting this week, the popular series *Forest Rangers* (currently seen Saturdays) gets a double exposure on the network with a separate series of adventures to be seen Fridays at 5:00 p.m., beginning July 8th.

The new series making their debuts this week include two from Australia, *Dave's Place* and *Country Style*, and one from Britain, *Summer Camp*. There is also a series of films from the National Film Board, entitled *Outlook*, which, though not specifically aimed at young people, will have several films of interest to teenagers.

Time for Adventure (Sundays at 4:00 p.m.) begins its third season on the network with a selection of films from the Children's Film Foundation, a British organization that produces carefully supervised adventure films. Each of the programs in the series is complete in itself, with no continuing characters or story-lines. The first adventure is entitled *Heights of Danger*, a motor racing yarn about a family who own a small garage. The father enters the Alpine Rally in the hopes of winning and improving his business, but a prosperous competitor has his eye on the garage and tries to wreck the father's car.

Vacation Time (Monday through Friday at 4:00 p.m.) is a network production, now entering its fourth season, to which CBC's regional centres

(St. John's, Halifax, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Winnipeg, Edmonton and Vancouver) will contribute their own programs for children.

The first program, on Monday, comes from Winnipeg and Edmonton, and sets the pattern for future shows from this region. Winnipeg hosts Ken Dunstan and Reg Gibson will tour the town of Beausejour, describing its history and famous landmarks to their young audience. In his role of a strolling troubadour of the West, Reg Gibson will entertain the townspeople and children with a song. The second half-hour, hosted by outdoorsman and professional guide Keith McColl, presents tips for youngsters on exploring, conservation, wild life, things to make

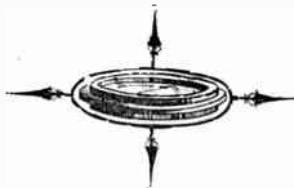

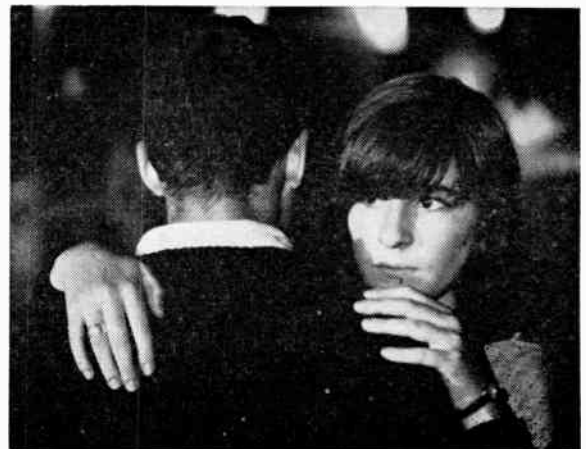

forced to leave their homes — and, of course, the mass evacuations from the hospitals and homes for the aged which lay within reaches of the rampaging river.

But we remember also that this was not a unique moment in the history of the river . . . only a moment in our own personal history. There were floods before 1950. In 1921 people sandbagged their community and back in 1897 a steamboat sailed down the main street of the border town of Emerson. Again this year the river threatened, but we found ourselves ready—ready to prepare, to defend, to fight. And now as we approach the completion of the Floodway, that giant canal that by-passes Winnipeg, we realize that we have probably seen the final flood in the Red River Valley.

On Sunday, July 3rd, "20/20" visits the Red River Valley for a look at this year's flood threat and a nostalgic glimpse of the great floods over the years, including the memorable 1950 flood. Rare film of the 1921 Winnipeg Flood is included in the program, along with highlights from on-the-spot broadcasts during the 1950 disaster.

The Diary of a Restless River was produced at CBC Winnipeg by Ron Bashford and written by Mort Forer, with original music by Bob McMullin.

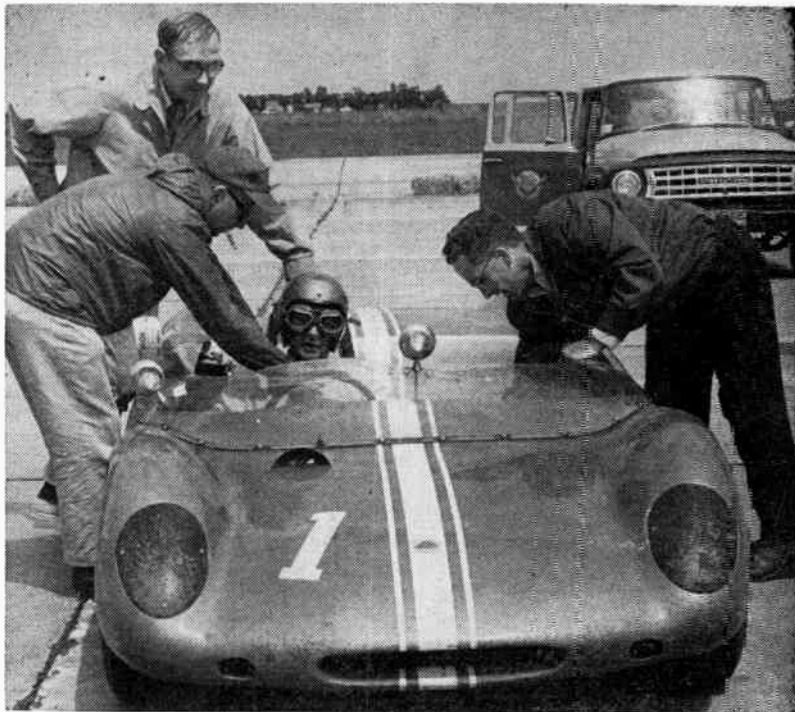

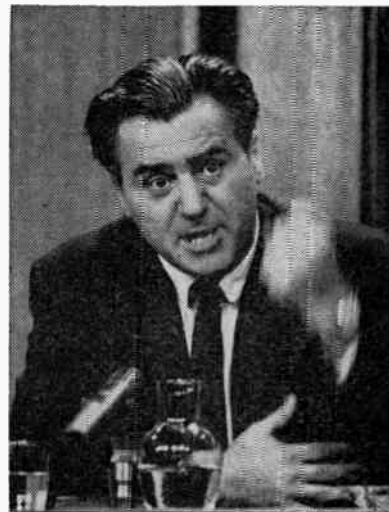

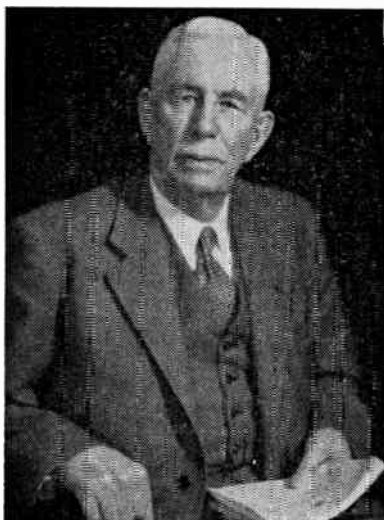

OFFICIALLY, of course, there are only three Estates of the Realm, the powers that handle the administration of affairs. In Britain they are the Lords Spiritual, the Lords Temporal, and the Commons. But there's another Estate, unofficial but powerful, and Edmund Burke, the great 18th-century statesman, once acknowledged its strength when, referring to the Reporter's Gallery in the British House of Commons, he said "Yonder sits the Fourth Estate, more important than them all."

Dragon or ministering angel as it can be, press writing is an ephemeral thing, and first-class

bits of journalism, samples of wit and humor, and brilliant flashes of logic and wisdom are often lost in the helter-skelter pursuit of something new. But many of these gems are timeless, or fascinating as era curiosities. Some of the best of them will be resurrected when *The Fourth Estate* returns to radio for another series on Monday night, July 4th, with production by John Reeves.

It begins with a program prepared by George Robertson about A. J. Liebling's *Wayward Press* column which ran for years in the *New Yorker*, and in which, with tremendous, undiminished

IT'S REMARKABLE that Jean Giraudoux, who gave us such theatrical magic as *The Madwoman of Chaillot*, *Amphitruon '38* and *Judith*, and is considered by many as one of the greatest French writers since Racine, didn't give a thought to having a literary career for many years, and didn't discover that playwriting was his most elastic means of expression until he was 46. Not all the admirers of his writing on this side of the Atlantic realize, perhaps, that he was equally well known as a diplomat, and was director of propaganda in the Vichy government when he died in 1944.

He was an elegant person, a bit of a dandy, but also adept at sports, and though aggressive on the playing field, was, elsewhere, a reserved and subtly ironic observer of life. The son of a civil engineer, he planned to become a professor, but first decided to see something of the world outside France. His roaming, mostly penniless and frequently on foot, took him to many places, including Canada and the U.S., where he picked up what jobs he could, from washing dishes to teaching French at Harvard. When he returned to France and was appointed vice-consul in the French ministry of foreign affairs, he began to write fiction, but this was interrupted by service in the First World War, during which he was cited for bravery three times. Afterwards he continued parallel careers of writing and diplomacy, but didn't discover his talent for drama until 1928. "He had a special eloquence," said actor-producer Louis Jouvet, "that sacred gift of speech which differentiates the writer of the theatre and sets him alone and apart from the journeyman

dramatist as elect and predestined."

Judith, which appeared in 1932, is *Cohen's Choice* for CBC *Tuesday Night*, July 5th, at 8:08. John Bethune has adapted it for radio. It's an argument between public truth and private reality, in the making of a saint. Giraudoux called it a tragedy, but modern critics feel that it is more of a black comedy. Based on the Apocryphal story, it tells of Judith, fairest and purest of all of Israel's daughters, who is sent from her besieged city to captivate and slay the Assyrian enemy commander, Holofernes. She is a charming worldly girl, reared in luxury but exemplary in her conduct, and it is felt that in saving her nation by murdering Holofernes, a saint will be borne. Judith is the last to doubt her qualifications to become a moment in history but she begins to question the true reason for her chastity. She realizes she really doesn't know herself as well as she thought she did. In the enemy camp, will she go to Holofernes' bed because she has been ordained to — or because she secretly wants to?

When she discovers that the cruel monster she has been sent to seduce is actually a most civilized and tender lover, she falls in love with him. Her tribal loyalty is strong enough to assure his death by her hand, but she kills him for love, not for hatred. When the Israelites call her a heroine, she scornfully tries to make them realize the truth, but an angel appears to remind Judith that he was watching over her, that the whole episode was God's will, so she decides that motives aren't all that important, and perhaps she'll be a saint after all!—*June Graham.*

affection tempered by bursts of anger and passion, he urged newspapers to live up to their great responsibilities. He was a versatile man, with wide interests including food, saloons, characters of both sexes, liberty, French life and letters, politics, New York, boxing, racing, low life, high life, and of course the Press. And one of the things that made his writings so stimulating was his habit of coloring an article on one subject with references to some of his other in-

terests—boxing lore turned up in his writing about food or politics, erudite references crept into an article about low life. His observations were accurate, biased, pristinely bare and never dull. Liebling wrote more than a dozen books, was one of the best-informed war correspondents in the Second World War, and was awarded the French Legion of Honor.

The second program, prepared by Henry Comor and subtitled *Women at Work*, considers the work of some of the most interesting women columnists. In the July 18th program, *An Unholy Trio*, Tony Kilgallen recalls some of the best work of Mark Twain, Bob Edwards and Toronto's Richard J. Needham. The following Monday, July 25th, Bruce Kidd takes a look at some student criticisms of university lectures, under the title of *The Anti-Calendar*.

On August 1st George Whalley has some fun with what he calls *The Great Anglo-American Love-Hate Caper*. He reads extracts from articles about Britain in the *New Yorker*, and about the U.S. in *Punch*. Then on August 8th Robert Fulford considers the writing of some foreign correspondents, under the title of *A Sense of Place, A Sense of Identity*.

Aubrey Menen, son of an Indian father and an Irish mother, was discovered by H. G. Wells, and ever since has been delighting us with his lively wit and irony, in plays, books, short stories, and articles in *Holiday*, the *New Yorker* and other publications. *An Aubrey Menen Reader* prepared by Ian Thorne will be presented on August 15th.

The following week James Bannerman considers our *Progress Backwards* as he reads from some fascinating technological writing of the past about the laying of the trans-Atlantic cable in 1858; the latest advances in passenger flight in 1916; the start of commercial TV in North America in 1940; the first radar bounced off the moon in 1945.

On August 29th Ronald Hambleton takes a look at journalism by famous statesmen such as Jan Smuts, Eamon DeValera, Teddy Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, W. E. Gladstone, Joseph Howe and Sir Wilfred Laurier.

Alan King recalls some clandestine journalism on September 5th, in connection with the Irish Rebellion, the German occupation of France in the Second World War, and more recent activities in South Africa.

On September 12th Scott Young reads from some journalism knocking down sacred cows and taking a poke at pomposity, under the title of *Out-From-Under Rug-Pullers*.

Some of the scoffing, irreverent and unforgettable reporting of H. L. Mencken in the 1920s will be recalled by John Bethune on September 19th. And the final program will involve the compiling of an ideal newspaper from favorite editorials, sports, financial and other news stories.

Another John Reeves series, *The Feminine Touch*, beginning on Monday, July 4th, at 1:45 p.m., offers a weekly anthology of writings by women—fiction and non-fiction, verse and prose, read by Nonnie Griffin.

many stately old homes. Most of them have gone now to make way for towering apartment and office buildings, glass and concrete complexes juxtaposed with the few remaining once-grand mansions. As a desirable place to live, the West End is attracting young bachelors and career girls because of its proximity to the beaches and the ski slopes of the north shore mountains, and the wide range of restaurants, night clubs, and department stores available.

Like the old and the new buildings side by side, these young people provide a study in contrasts with the long-established residents of the West End.

For all age groups there is a delightful series called *Mad Movies* (Mondays and Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m.), in which British comedian Bob Monkhouse introduces film clips from some of the classics of the silent screen. The first program, subtitled *Danger! Madmen at Work!*, shows Pearl White in peril and Richard Talmadge dashing to the rescue, in a sequence illustrating suspense in silent movies. Special effects and stunts are illustrated by "The Three Fatties" wrecking a two-storey house. The Wednesday program has another Pearl White episode and a sequence from the classic short by Harry Langdon, *His Marriage Wow*. Later programs will feature Charlie Chaplin, Stan Laurel, Wallace Beery and Gloria Swanson, Ben Turpin, and Buster Keaton.

both the subject and the manner of presenting it.

The first program, this Sunday, will be "the world in our time" as the satirists see it — the war in Viet Nam, violence in the streets, sex, politics, and racial prejudice. Produced by Ross McLean, it features the Second City Revue from Chicago and such Canadian performers as Stan Daniels, Pam Hyatt, Barry Baldaro, Jean Templeton and Dave Broadfoot.

Alex Brown will produce the interview with Podhoretz, in which the writer and editor discusses the Jewish intellectual and how Jews have influenced the mainstream of American culture; Larry Zolf will produce a program tentatively called *The British Fact*, about some aspects of the Establishment of English-speaking Canada and Glenn Sarty will produce the documentary in ciné-verité technique on the *Checkmates*.

Later editions of *Compass* will include a look at a club in Vancouver where the psychedelic experience is attempted through audio-visual techniques rather than drugs. This program will be produced by Carney and Dave Ruskin. Judge John H. Sissons has been a territorial circuit-court judge for over 10 years in the Canadian North. He recently presided over the case of two Eskimos charged with non-capital murder for shooting a madwoman (mother of one of the accused). This close-up on Judge Sissons will be produced by Chuck Oberdorf.

Compass will also present an evening with 'cellist Rohan de Saram, in which Carney will use the medium of television to create a "sculpture" of man and instrument; and interviews by Patrick Watson with Alec Guinness and Charles Boyer.

Discussing the various topics that listeners have submitted in the past, Barry Morse noted "sex, death and money are certainly foremost in the listeners' minds."

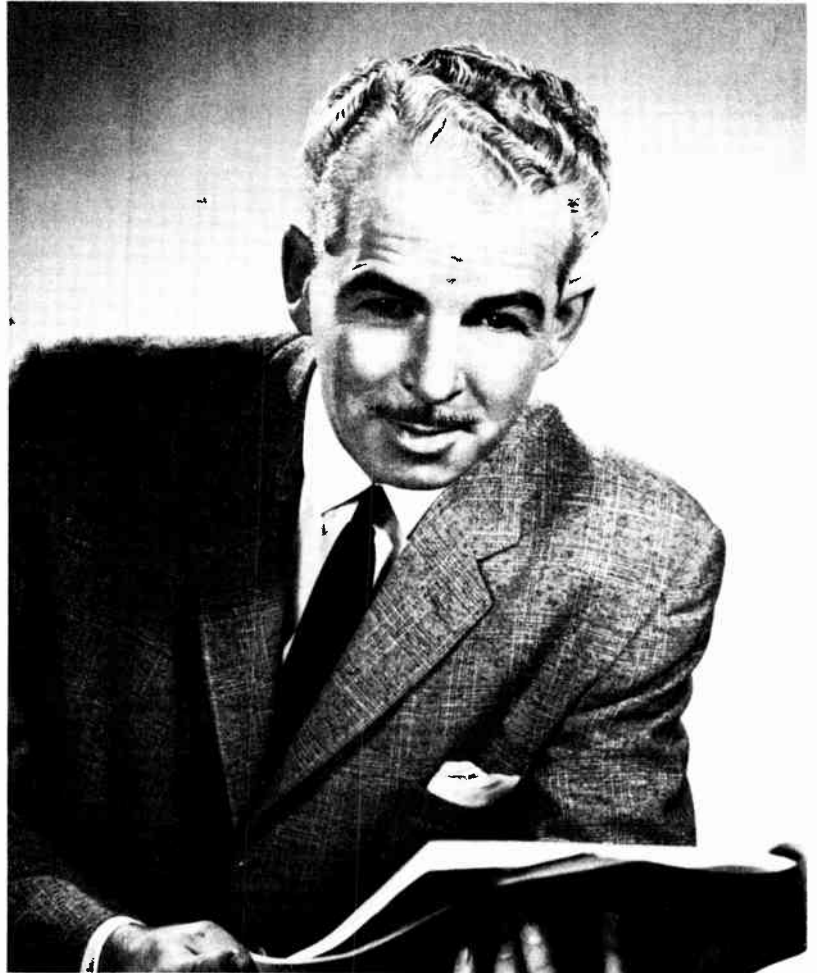
