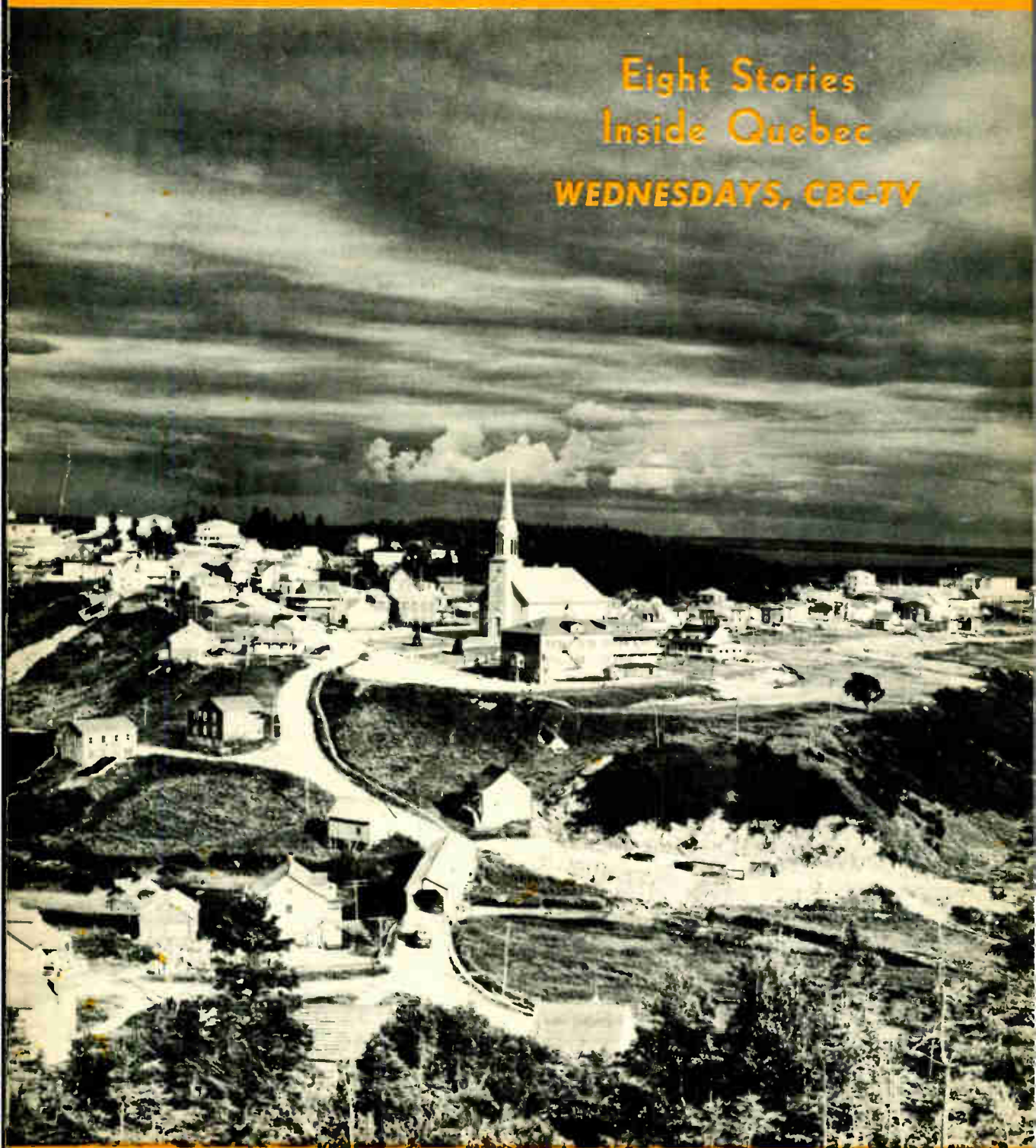

WITH THE Canadian National Telecommunications landline soon to be completed down to Inuvik, CBC radio station CHAK (CBC's most northerly station) will be connected to the National English Radio Network by means of the Mountain Feed. (The Feed will pass through Yellowknife and the Mackenzie Network which have, for some time, been connected to "the outside.") Up to the present, CHAK (inside the Arctic Circle), has been dependent upon the receipt of CBC network programs in tape-recorded form, air-shipped by the Northern Service production unit in Montreal, and upon off-air relay of the Northern Service's shortwave broadcasts for news, commentaries, and other topical CBC programming. The date on which CHAK will be connected to program circuits to the south is not yet firm.

A LARGE proportion of Canadian drivers are ignorant of many of the vital elements of expressway driving and only one out of five knows the correct procedures for self-protection in a crash.

Four out of five Canadian drivers say they believe that the federal government should both set and enforce safety standards in the design and manufacture of cars.

And nearly four out of five say they favor safety features included as standard equipment at no increase in price, but instead of style changes or convenience features.

These are some of the highlights from a study of a national sample of licensed Canadian drivers, conducted by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's Research Department as a contribution to the CBC-TV program, *The Canadian Drivers Test*. The program was carried on both English and French networks recently. Copies of the study are available from CBC Head Office, Information Services, Ottawa.

General results of the survey indicate a fairly widespread lack of knowledge of some of the basic "rules of the road," and of the proper steps that should be taken by drivers to minimize driving hazards.

At noon on Tuesday, August 2nd, the Hidy Trio, consisting of violinist Mata Hidy, cellist Klara Benjamin and pianist Chester Duncan will play the *Trio in D minor, op. 49*, by Mendelssohn; *Trio - Movement in B flat*, by Beethoven; and *Trio*, by Gordon Jacob.

The last concert in the series, on August 4th at 8:30 p.m. in the East Gymnasium, will feature the renowned Canadian contralto Maureen Forrester, the statuesque artist who has skyrocketed to fame since her New York debut in 1956. A favorite of symphony orchestra conductors, she has appeared under the baton of such eminent maestri as Bruno Walter, Herbert von Karajan, Otto Klemperer, George Szell, Leonard Bernstein, Eugene Ormandy, Josef Krips and Igor Markevitch.

Miss Forrester's travels have taken her to Australia, Israel, the Soviet Union and she tours Europe each season. A tall, strikingly handsome blonde, Maureen Forrester is in private life the wife of Eugene Kash, prominent young Canadian violinist and conductor. Her program of August 4th will consist of music for voice by Handel, Purcell, Schumann, Poulenc and Robert Fleming.

Great Societies and Quiet Revolutions – an examination of the North American way of life

BEHIND THE INCREASING ABUNDANCE and power in the great industrial society of North America, where ordinary people enjoy a freedom and luxury beyond the wildest dreams of their grandparents, one would expect to find happiness. Instead, our vast continent is riddled with discontent and restlessness. Old values have crumbled, as our jails, psychiatric clinics, literature and art illustrate. Goals are easily reached, but they give little real satisfaction. Cities are turning into ugly, snarling monsters of concrete. Once verdant, charming rural areas are stripped of green and bulldozed into monotony. Individuals fear that they are becoming ciphers—science is moving ahead so fast that they are left away behind, panting and uncomprehending.

Man begins to ask himself whether he is really necessary in all this growth and movement. Many feel the answer is no, particularly in the social groups for whom abundance and education are still dreams, who have no beauty in their lives, and are shut out from full participation in the North American

way of life in great pockets of want and ignorance which to other nations may seem incongruous on a continent that boasts of its freedoms and two-car-family affluence.

To get at the roots of some of these social problems in the U.S. and try to solve them, President Johnson has set up programs aimed at achieving what he has called The Great Society, concerned with enhancing the condition of man, by asking how good? rather

than how much?, by concerning the quality of American lives rather than the quantity of possessions. This philosophy and the influence it is having on political and social thought and action in Canada, will be explored at the 35th annual Couchiching Conference, to be held at Geneva Park, Lake Couchiching, about 60 miles north of Toronto, from July 30th to August 6th.

Special reference will be made to the war on poverty, and its political implications at federal and local levels, education and re-training, regional development, the role of government in relation to science and the arts, beautification of landscape, conservation schemes, civil rights, old age pensions, health and welfare, and the place of business and labor in these fields. Discussions will involve distinguished guest speakers from Canada, the U.S. and Britain, and hundreds of people from all walks of life who will attend the conference, which is a joint project of the Canadian Institute on Public Affairs and the CBC.

Producers of the daily radio report programs are Raoul Engel and Joe Toff; Andrew Simon will produce the two-hour "open-line" program from Montreal. The moderator of all the radio programs will be Professor Donald Gordon, of Waterloo University. In the "open-line" broadcast, he will be dealing with three groups: the guest speakers at the (Please turn to page 25)

THE WORLD CUP SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP



THE BIGGEST, most popular sports attraction in the world is the World Cup Soccer Tournament, being held this year in England. The championships are held every four years under the direction of the Federation Internationale de Football Association (F.I.F.A.). This year, sixteen countries have taken part. There have been 32 matches played on eight English grounds on 12 days during the period from July 11th to the 30th (however, at press time of this issue of the CBC TIMES the finalists are unknown). The quarter-finals will have been played on Saturday, July 23rd, the semi-finals on Monday and Tuesday, July 25th and 26th, the match to decide 3rd and 4th places on Thursday the 28th, and the final on Saturday, July 30th. The final will be played at the Empire Stadium, Wembley. CBC-TV viewers will be able to watch this exciting match when it is presented on the network on this date via the Early Bird Satellite. Also on the CBC radio network the game may be heard at 9:00 a.m. in Manitoba; 8:00 a.m. in Saskatchewan; and 7:00 a.m. in Alberta.

THE DOLLAR POOR

*A study of the problems
facing those out of reach
of abundance and wealth . . .*

THE DRIVE TOWARDS the Great Society in the United States had its origins in the Kennedy administration. The late president had read a book, *The Other America*, by the young sociologist Michael Harrington, which deeply impressed him about the plight of America's poor. A report on this problem which Kennedy had called for was handed to him only a few days before his death. The day after Kennedy's assassination the substance of that report formed part of the briefing given President Johnson when he entered the White House. Since then the President has devoted much of his energies to a program of help for the poor. Poverty, along with civil rights, has become the most widely discussed of the domestic issues.

Rediffusion, the British member of *Intertel*, has contributed two documentary films to the international television organization, showing the two faces of America. The first, *Edge of Abundance*, was telecast on CBC-TV last year and dealt with the great material wealth of the country. The second, *The Dollar Poor* (to be telecast this Wednesday night), examines the

people and some of the places out of reach of this wealth. The executive producer of both films, Cyril Bennett, says: "We have attempted these themes, the contrasts of poverty and abundance, for two reasons. They are, firstly, the most fundamental problems which confront the United States. Secondly, they are likely to have a direct relevance to the peoples of a great many other countries."

The Dollar Poor was filmed in West Virginia, Kentucky, California, Illinois, and Indiana. "Our object," says script-writer Paul Johnson, "was not only to present the various aspects of U.S. poverty, but to describe how the Federal and local administration are tackling it. In Washington we found a tremendous awareness of the problem and a determination, at all levels in the administration, to give it high priority in their efforts.

"At a local level, too, we met scores of dedicated men and women — many of them only in their twenties — working for a great variety of government agencies: in social

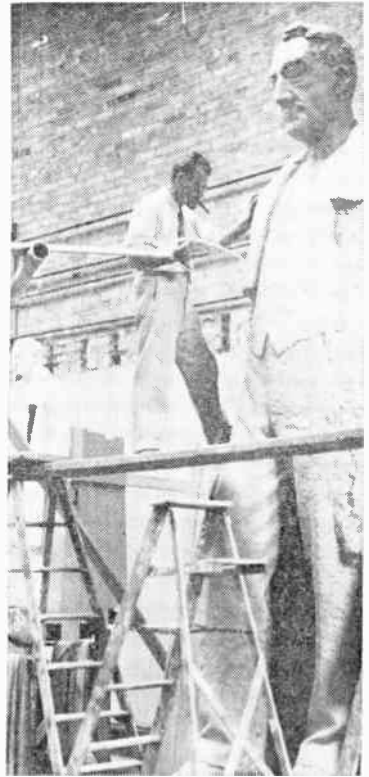

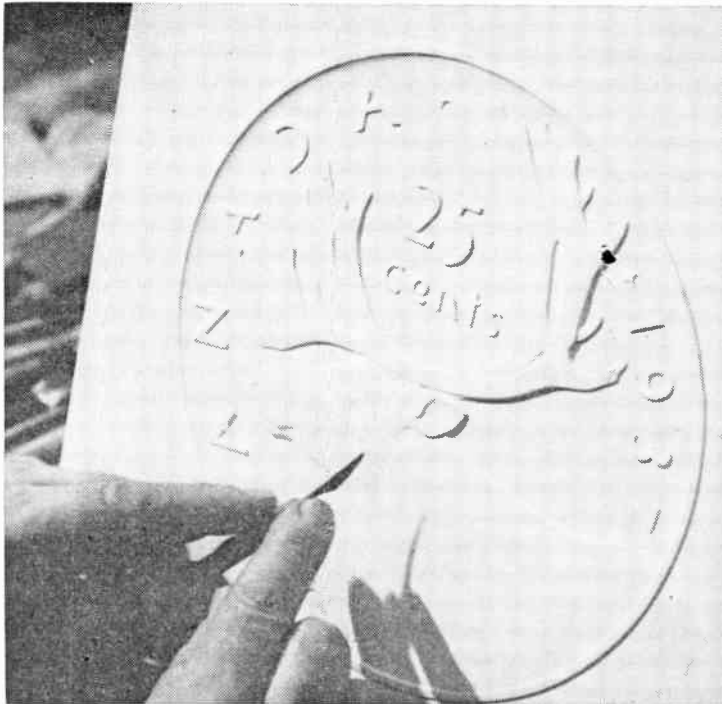
DURING HIS LIFETIME the Canadian sculptor Emanuel Otto Hahn had the wry satisfaction of seeing a part of his work go into almost every home in the country, although probably few people outside art circles recognized his name. From the mid '30s, when he was commissioned to design the Canadian jubilee dollar of 1935, up to the time of his death a few years ago, Hahn created designs for coins of various denominations, many of which are still in circulation. Aside from his academic work, which has a permanent place in the National Gallery of Canada, he also designed a number of stamps, most of which reflected his love of the North country.

Hahn came to Canada from Germany in 1888, when he was seven years old. He received his training at the Central Ontario School of Art and Design (now the Ontario College of Art) and after post-graduate studies in Stuttgart was appointed a member of the staff. Later he became head of the department of sculpture, remaining there until his retirement in 1951. One of his brothers, Gustav Hahn, became head of the department of Interior Design at OCA.

Among the works Hahn executed for the City of Toronto are the memorials to Edward Hanlan, which stands in Exhibition Park at the CNE, and Sir Adam Beck, located on University Avenue. In the National Gallery he is represented by a bronze statuette, *The Indian Scout*, and in the Art Gallery

of Toronto by a bust, also bronze, of his wife, Elizabeth Wyn Wood. The late Mrs. Hahn was equally famous as a sculptor and is also represented in the National Gallery. Of the portraits each created, the best-known are Hahn's bust of the explorer Viljalmar Stefansson and Elizabeth Wyn Wood's of Premier Leslie M. Frost.

A study of Hahn and his work will be presented this week on CBC-TV's *20/20*. Richard Knowles, producer of this series, is a graduate of the Ontario College of Art who studied under Hahn. *Diary of a Sculptor* has therefore been directed by him with an artist's appreciation of his subject. Special research for this program was carried out by J. M. Reynolds.

World Cup Soccer Championship

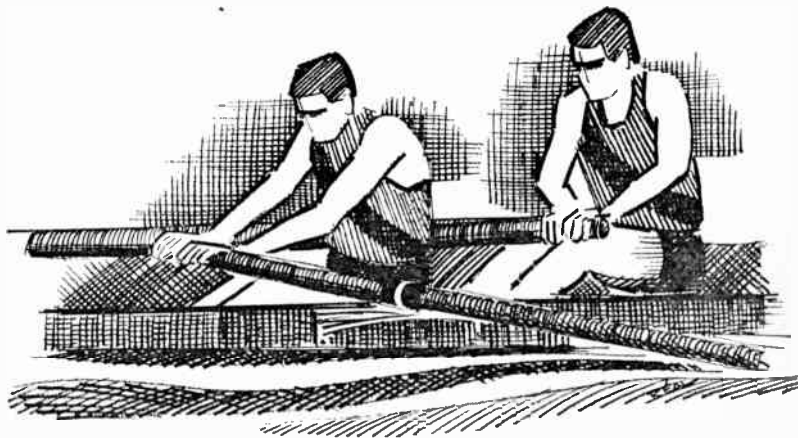

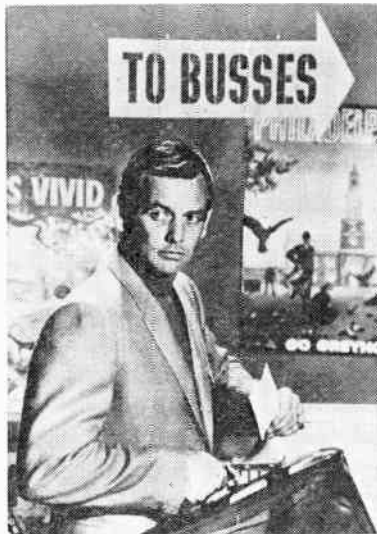

Between Two Worlds . . .

A study of Montreal's Jewish community

SOMEONE ONCE SAID that the most important thing about the Jewish community of Montreal was that it would continue to exist even if the French and English communities disappeared. It has its own clubs, institutions, social events, health services, and cultural activities. Though the Jewish community in Montreal is the largest in Canada, its more than 100,000 members make up only about one-twentieth of the city's population. But its importance is out of all proportion to its size, both to Montreal and to the country as a whole. Members of the community occupy a great many of the highest posts in the learned professions in the city, they dominate its garment industry (Canada's largest), and they spread their leavening vigor through almost every area of the city's life, French as well as English.

The Montreal Jewish community's development as a strong, independent unit, and the problems being posed by a growing trend toward assimilation will be examined on this week's edition of the series *Eight Stories Inside Quebec* (Wednesday, August 3rd, 10:30 p.m.) in a program entitled *Between Two Worlds*. It is written by C. J. Newman and directed by Felix Lazarus. Paul Wright is the executive producer of the series.

The first Jews arrived in Montreal in the middle of the 18th century, and they came mainly

from Spain and Portugal. But the bulk of the community came from central and eastern Europe in the years before the First World War, driven out by pogroms in Russia, Poland, and other countries. From their ghettos in Europe, they came to Montreal and at first crowded into a small area, almost duplicating the conditions they had left behind. They lived close together and close to their institutions—the Hebrew schools and synagogues, the Jewish Public Library, the Immigrant Aid Society. From their intensely communal life sprang the numerous organizations—religious, political, instruc-

tional, charitable—which remain a striking feature of the community today.

As the years passed, much of this changed. The Jews worked hard and prospered; they educated their children to move up the social and economic scale; they began to feel less defensive about the world around them. They began to move to the suburbs.

"The community's biggest difficulty," says script-writer Newman, "is keeping itself intact. More and more people are drifting away from it. The inter-marriage rate, for instance, is steadily increasing. Approximately 18 per cent of the Jews getting married in Montreal are choosing partners from outside the Jewish religion." Eventually, he points out, the community might disappear, as has happened to Jewish groups in other places.

"Today, Jews live in every part of the city, and there's no such thing as a Jewish ghetto," he adds. "The community has also succeeded in almost completely eliminating its working class ranks.

Between Two Worlds will go inside Jewish Montreal, tracing its development from the ghetto of the 19th century to the suburbs of today, and examining the functions of institutions such as the Canadian Jewish Congress. Among those expressing their views on the program are Jacob Zipper, a writer, and principal of Peretz School; Saul Hayes, executive vice-president of the Canadian Jewish Congress; and Mervyn Butovsky, assistant professor of English at Sir George Williams University.

GALAPAGOS

Born in North Korea and educated in the South and in the United States, Dr. Kim joined the Department of Political Science at York University in 1963 and has contributed to various journals on international affairs.

welfare, housing, re-development, industrial retraining, child care, and relief work. We met also many social workers employed by private or charitable organizations. None of them made any attempt to hide the evils of poverty in America—on the contrary, they were anxious that we should see everything. Talking to them, we were impressed by two things: their tremendous enthusiasm and, secondly, their frustration in the face of local and federal laws which seemed rooted in the *laissez-faire* attitudes of the 19th century.

"There is no doubt, we found, that America is making a serious attempt to eradicate the shame of poverty. But there is equally no doubt that it will not succeed

in this task until American society is brought to change its attitudes about the nature of poverty and the relationship between work, moral virtue, and worldly success."

About one-fifth of the entire population of the United States is officially classified as "poor" (an income of \$3,000 a year or less for a family). Why should this be so when the country as a whole enjoys unprecedented prosperity? To answer this and get at the root causes of the problem this *Intertel* production focuses on four major factors. The first is the collapse of traditional industries, particularly mining. The coal industry in the Appalachian Mountains has declined and many thousands of miners are totally unemployed, with no prospect of getting work in the area. Oliver Mason, who lives in a shack with no roof, and Codell Gibson, who has 10 children to feed, are two of the unemployed interviewed on the program.

Another factor is the mechanization of agriculture, which has had the effect of slashing the labor force by over two-fifths since the war. Millions of people in the Southern States, especially Florida and California, have been thrown out of work. Most were unskilled hand-pickers, now replaced by huge spider-like machines. The few who remain in the industry get only seasonal employment and (at the time this film was made) were not entitled to federal minimum wages or unemployment benefits.

Finally, there is the problem of the aged poor. The old form the biggest single element in America's poverty problem. Their lot varies from state to state—the aged in California, for instance, have organized a political pressure-group and are comparatively well-off. In other states the old age pension is scarcely enough to save them from destitution.

try. To participate in Friday's live broadcast, callers in prairie provinces are to phone this Montreal number: 866-8578. The topics to be discussed on the "open-line" program will be decided just prior to air-time.

The subject for discussion at the Conference on Tuesday, August 2nd, is the U.S. Appalachia Project, a Great Society federal and state program to relieve poverty in a vast area stretching from Lake Erie to the deep south, with a population almost as great as Canada's. On Sunday night, July 30th, at 10:00, as an introduction to this topic, CBC-TV will present an hour-long documentary program filmed around Whitesburg in eastern Kentucky, where the project is underway, with millions being spent on roads, industries and other projects to stimulate the Appalachian economy. Titled *All's Right with the World*, the film was produced by Robert Patchell, with Warner Troyer as host. It includes some astonishing scenes of snake-handling and mesmeric chanting at a Baptist fundamentalist gathering, filmed under difficult circumstances at night; moving scenes of children being examined at a clinic for the underprivileged, and of countryside and towns blotched by great dumps of old cars and other refuse, which, if all the projected plans work out, will become a tidy, attractive area that will give its inhabitants a sense of pride and hope for the future, as well as a feeling of responsibility for its continued care.

On Sunday night, August 7th, at 10:00, TV will present another special program—*Great Societies and Quiet Revolutions*—a report on the Couchiching Conference, also produced by Robert Patchell. Writer-editor for the program is Professor Paul Fox of the University of Toronto. The Conference will also be covered on the CBC's French-language radio and TV networks.

Special speakers at the Conference from the U.S. and Britain will include Dr. K. Price of

Harvard University, president-elect of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and author of *The Scientific Estate*; Bayard Rustin, director of the A. Philip Randolph Institute, who assisted Martin Luther King in the Montgomery bus protest, organized the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom in 1964, and the first school boycott in New York City; John Sweeney, federal co-chairman of the Appalachian Regional Commission, Washington; Sandford Kravitz, director of research, demonstration and training, Office of Economic Opportunity, Washington; Eric Moonman, British Labor M.P. and professor of management science, Manchester University; Tom Gish, editor of the *Whitesburg Eagle*, Whitesburg, Kentucky, who has been engaged in Great Society programs at the local level.

Among the Canadian speakers will be the Hon. Jean-Jacques Bertrand, Minister of Education, Province of Quebec; Dr. Jean Sutherland Boggs, new director of the National Gallery in Ottawa; Professor George Grant of McMaster University, and author of *Lament for a Nation*; the Hon. Maurice Lamontagne, M.P., the Hon. Jean Marchand, Minister of Citizenship and Immigration; Eamon Park, assistant to the national director, United Steelworkers of America; R. A. J. Phillips, director of the Special Planning Secretariat of the Privy Council Office in Ottawa, responsible for the Canadian anti-poverty program; Robert Sauvé, general secretary of the Confédération des Syndicats Nationaux, Montreal; and the Hon. G. I. Smith, Minister of Finance and Economics, Province of Nova Scotia.

Student views will be presented by representatives of the Canadian Political Youth Council, the Young Democrats, and the Young Republicans of the United States, the Student Union for Peace Action, and related organizations in the U.S.

THE FOURTH ESTATE

PUNCH AND THE NEW YORKER—TWO VIEWS

IN VIEW OF THE FACT that last week's program on the radio series *The Fourth Estate* was made up of articles by university students writing in campus newspapers, both British and North American, it seemed only fair to producer John Reeves to hear this week from a professor—George Whalley of the department of English, Queen's University. Professor Whalley has chosen selections from the two great journals *Punch* and the *New Yorker* to show how contemporary writers in Britain and the United States view each other's country and the contrast in the humorous styles employed.

There are five pieces: from the *New Yorker* a poem by R. P. Lister entitled *Great Britain* (Great Britain is a piece of land/ Shaped something like an amper-sand/ And lying, to a large extent/ Between the Kyle of Tongue and Kent), and a report on Hyde Park called *A Free Speech*, by Strowan Robertson; and from *Punch* a satire by Alan Coren entitled *The Man Who*

Ran for President, and an article, *Where to Catch a Wahoo*, by H. F. Ellis. The fifth selection comes from the *Reporter* and is an article on travelling by car in Britain entitled *When the Cows Come Home*, by Derek Morgan.

Robertson's *A Free Speech* sets the scene in Hyde Park with: ". . . the lawns . . . were choked with Englishmen turned to the sun. They proved they were English by removing their shoes — not their shirts, not even their socks, just their shoes — and by furious public daylight necking with their girls. . . . 'That German,' H.M. the Queen, was getting it from a Welsh republican. The Devil was getting it from an Irish Jesuit. The Americans were also getting theirs from the Pan-African Union. . . ."

The Man Who Ran For President is a mordant piece of writing that mocks the U.S. political scene and The American Way of Life, and takes a passing swipe at Horatio Alger. *Where to Catch a Wahoo* is an Englishman's view of what the United States has to offer in exchange for Britain's "quaintness" as a tourist attraction. Mostly, this writer feels, what the U.S. has to offer "is unquestionably the bizarre."

Britain's quaintness, when it expresses itself as the highways and byways of the countryside can infuriate an American visitor.

"All over England today," writes Derek Morgan in *When the Cows Come Home*, "the road you are driving on is likely at the very next bend to turn into a fantasy of retrogressive spirals that presumably commemorate some heavy summer's evening centuries ago, when a drover, full of cider and free of cars, reeled helplessly after his churning herd, while even his dog got fed up with it and sat down to sulk."

The drivers in England are not much better either, according to Morgan: "The average English driver learned to drive some time after his reflexes had slowed. There is none of that instinctive nonsense about him. He has approached the business of driving his little car with the cautious solemnity of an elderly nun exploring comparative religion. . . . As often as not he will wear driving gloves, and sometimes a hat with a little feather in it. He has not realized that in interior heating, his little car is considerably more advanced than his house, and in winter he will sit behind his wheel, sweating heavily, dressed as if for a stroll to the North Pole."

John Drainie and Barry Morse read the selections. The program is introduced by Harry Mannis. It is heard Monday night at 8:03 p.m.

RADIO DRAMA

Esse W. Ljungh discusses the future of radio drama in Canada

IF YOU'VE NOTICED that CBC radio plays are presented with very little background or

mood music these days, it's because Esse W. Ljungh, network supervisor of radio drama, believes that "people can't carry the two sounds of music and voice any more. TV has trained them for the eye, and they're using sign language to communicate in their daily lives. But on radio the words are the thing, and they should be presented as succinctly and clearly as possible, with few other sounds to detract from complete understanding of the dialogue. In the beginning was the word — and don't think we've changed. The idea drama is still far better on radio."

Ljungh says he's "especially interested in the grass roots literary repertoire, folk legends and

myths, which grew out of the people themselves. Everybody loves to hear a story. It's basic, told in sparse language easily memorized in passing from father to son, from troubador to modern raconteur. But too often we're compelled to just listen and stare and we get bored because there's so little really dramatic material around to excite our imaginations. Ideas and events that are actually happening write a better script than fiction, and I wish more playwrights would realize this.

"It's terribly hard to guide a writer who asks what he should write about. I tell him that if he has something important he

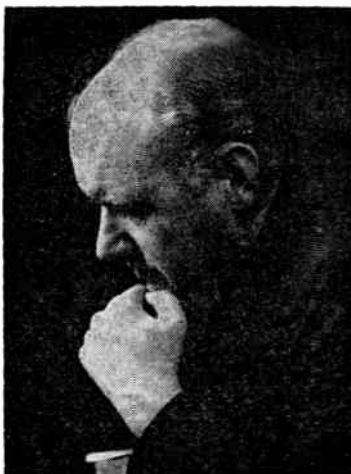

The Stratford Music Festival on CBC Tuesday Night

ONE OF THE HIGHLIGHTS of *CBC Tuesday Night* this week will be a concert from the Stratford (Ont.) Music Festival, recorded the previous Sunday afternoon in the Festival Theatre. The conductor will be Elmer Iseler, permanent conductor of Toronto's Festival Singers and the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir. An interview with Mr. Iseler will be broadcast at 10:35 p.m., followed at 10:50 by the concert, which comprises music by Bach and Stravinsky; Stravinsky's Mass (1948); Bach's Cantata No. 4, 'Christ lag in Todesbanden'; and Stravinsky's Chorale Variations on Bach's "Von Himmel hoch". The participants will be Mary Morrison, soprano; Patricia Rideout, contralto; Albert Greer, tenor; Maurice Brown, bass; The National Festival Orchestra, and the Festival Singers of Toronto.

The producer is Richard Coulter.

Stravinsky's Mass, first performed in Milan in October, 1948, is scored for mixed chorus (with solo passages from time to time) and a double wind quintet of oboes, English horn, trumpets and trombones.

The Chorale Variations were completed early in 1956. The work is an arrangement by Stravinsky of Bach's set of variations

on the Christmas hymn tune, Von Himmel hoch; but Stravinsky has adapted Bach to such a degree that the work amounts to 're-composition' rather than mere 'arrangement'. There are five variations, each with its own distinctive 'color' and mood, and the chorus fills a background role — softly singing the chorale tune in unison for the most part. The Stravinsky authority, Robert Craft, says, "By assigning the chorale melody to voices in unison, by giving the variations a text, the work becomes a kind of concerto with voices, or cantata, similar to Christ lag in Todesbanden, in which several verses vary the same chorale theme."

The last-mentioned work will complete the Stratford concert. Like the Variations, the Cantata No. 4 consists of a set of variations — in this case, seven — single chorale melody. Though adapted by Luther, the tune can be traced back to a medieval German song, Christ ist erstanden, and even before that to a Gregorian Easter chant, Victimae Paschali.

Christian Frontiers

A BBC SERIES ON

The Art of the Preacher

ON THE FIVE TUESDAYS of August, *Christian Frontiers* (7:30 p.m., radio) is presenting *The Art of the Preacher*, a BBC series on the styles and stylists of English church rhetoric from

the 16th to the 19th centuries. During this period, writes George MacBeth, producer of the series, "sermons were used by English preachers as a vehicle for intense catharsis of emotion, detailed logical explosion, exalted flights of lyricism, and homely music-hall humor. Very few of the notes available to the dramatist or letter-writer, the critic or the politician, were left untouched by the great exponents of pulpit oratory . . . The English language underwent a flexible development through the hands—and the lips

of a long line of religious talkers."

The series begins with readings from the sermons of Hugh Latimer, the 16th century parson, and brings out some of the political and religious factors in the sermons which made Latimer's the most persuasive public voice in the pulpit at that time.

The second program (August 9th) consists of selections from the sermons of Lancelot Andrewes and John Donne, 17th century preachers. T. S. Eliot has described Andrewes as one of the greatest stylists of his or any age; Donne, the celebrated poet, was only 18 years younger than Andrewes, but, as John Chandos, who compiled this series, points out, "No greater contrast could be imagined between the character and history of these two men, equally famous in their own day for the same kind of accomplishment."

wants to say about the world and the people he lives among, to go ahead, and see how many new ideas and impulses he can contribute to man's greater understanding of man. In an affluent society too few people are concerned with setting things down and thinking them out. There's no real freedom and time for study and evaluating and coming up with new ideas. Yesterday's artist was more willing to sacrifice for his profession. Today he thinks he's great and the world owes him a living. Self-criticism and examination is something he's forgotten how to do. We're not honest enough with each other, either. We prefer to cover up the true picture in the mirror. The result is often shallow writing, shallow performances. The painter and sculptor have freed themselves a lot more than the drama people have.

"But I think writers are doing a lot more reflecting these days than they used to, though they're faced with the fact they can't comment on things fast enough. Events are moving too quickly. Old, comfortable conclusions are challenged left and right in an era when people are debating about when the moment of death occurs and when the possibility of babies one day, coming in envelopes, is no longer absurd. It's so hard for a writer to communicate an idea before it becomes obsolete, and new or shocking ideas have their sharp edges rubbed off so quickly.

Death of a Salesman is now a classic. So are the early *avant-garde* plays such as *Waiting for Godot*, which is regarded now as purely religious experience. They don't shock us today.

"One of the big problems we have to contend with is that there's not enough contact between the radio listener and those of us who plan programs. If it were closer we'd have a better chance of satisfying our audiences. On the Sunday afternoon *Stage* series I want to offer people storytelling they won't get anywhere else in Canada. We may not have many great playwrights here, but so what? We have a lot of people contributing to the establishment of a Canadian literature, honestly, simply, directly, trying to come to grips with things Canadian, and eventually we hope to interest them in using their storytelling techniques in another form—playwriting. You can take the writings of Hugh Garner, W. O. Mitchell, Margaret Laurence, for instance, and translate it almost directly from the book page to the script. If, through the *Stage* series we can stir listeners to go to a library or book shop and ask for the books

we've introduced them to, we'll feel we've contributed something worthwhile.

"As far as casting goes, we've lost a lot of good performers to TV, but we've retained a lot who prefer the greater variety of characterizations in radio, such as Henry Comor, John Drainie, John Scott, Ruth Springford, Tommy Tweed, Douglas Rain, Bruno Gerussi. They don't just prefer radio because it's easier—no memory work or stage business to worry about—but because it often offers better quality of dialogue, better ideas, better characterizations.

"I really haven't any favorite productions—they've all had something I enjoyed for various reasons. It'll be a long time before I forget Orwell's 1984. And I'm tremendously happy to have had a dream of 40 years come true—producing Strindberg's *To Damascus* on *Cohen's Choice*, on *CBC Tuesday Night* in the spring. All members of the company were fully inspired. And I'll always remember a production of *Everyman* I did in Jamaica, cast with native sons and daughters with their attractive, sing-song voices. It was a real folk production, with a calypso beat to the songs, and tremendous warmth and naturalness. I did another production for the CBC last Christmas, and it was interesting, too, but completely different. Whenever I repeat a play I always cast it with new people, to get a fresh view and underline different aspects of the script. I don't want a cast to approach it with pre-set ideas. This past season has been one of the most satisfying with overall better performances and better material, much of it based on Canadian writing. We can hold our own in competition with the rest of the English-speaking world—we've retained our standards, and moved up if anything, with greater simplicity and clarity and far less gimmicks, more attention to writing and characterization than before. The future of radio drama in Canada looks pretty bright."

Allan Sangster introduces a new series, *The Music of Schubert*, each Wednesday night at 11:03 on CBC radio. In the series, Sangster will attempt to present most of Schubert's music which has been recorded.

Barry Anderson:

John Tillotson became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1691 and his sermons, noted for their simplicity and careful construction, gained wide popularity. Jeremy Taylor, who eventually became chaplain to King Charles II, has a place in English literature as one of the great classical writers. Their work is examined in the program of August 16th. By the middle of the 17th century, says Chandos, "preaching had become a polite and highly competitive social accomplishment, and if we wish to appreciate the standard by which success would be judged we must listen to Tillotson . . . whose congregations tended to behave and talk as if God were an English gentleman."

The fourth program (August 23rd) is devoted to the sermons of Jonathan Swift, Laurence Sterne, and John Wesley. Chandos observes, speaking first of Swift, "from the pulpit, this most philistine of gifted men of letters pronounced warnings appropriate to his cloth and his cynicism . . . Sterne's method was to take a simple Biblical story and fill in the picture with all kinds of intimate conjectured detail, not only external in the action but internal in the psychological prefigurations . . . The 'salvation by faith' evangelism of John Wesley was considered by the educated orthodox as, at best, an indulgent, self-regarding vulgarity and, at worst, a mischievous moral subversion of the impressionable ignorant."

The final program (August 30th) deals with orators of the Victorian era.

Here's An MP With No

SUMMER RECESS

Quentin Durgens, MP:

Dramas of Canadian political life being taped in Ottawa, Stratford . . .

OF ALL THE MANY highly praised dramas in the history of CBC television, few have received more resounding acclaim than *Mr. Member of Parliament*, a six-part teleplay seen on *The Serial* last season.

That series dealt with the coming-of-age of a young and green Member of Parliament from a small Ontario town, who went to Ottawa full of high-sounding ideals but soon discovered that politics is "the art of the possible."

Now, the star of *Mr. MP*, handsome Gordon Pinsent is to star in an entirely new and much more ambitious series—this time of ten one-hour dramas (to be seen on the CBC-TV network Tuesdays at 9.00 p.m. next fall, after the first ten drama series, *Wojeck*, has ended). In "Durgens," the young politician emerges as a more mature hero who nevertheless still retains his maverick tendency to charge in where angels fear to tread. Shooting of the first two dramas has been going on in recent weeks in the Stratford area and in CBC Toronto studios.

The series, entitled *Quentin Durgens, MP*, won't be a serial, but will consist of separate and distinct dramas centering around several continuing characters, and presenting human interest stories set against the background of the momentous events that shape a nation.

Shooting of scenes for the first two dramas, *You Take the High Road*, and *A Family Affair*, was done in the Stratford, St. Mary's

and New Hamburg area. As in *Mr. MP*, the Stratford Beacon-Herald is the imaginary "Times-Examiner" office in the mythical town of Moose Falls.

Although he was married at the end of *Mr. MP*, Durgens will be single in the new dramas. The reason, says series producer David Gardner, is that "the character has more freedom of action that way. If he were married you'd have to have too many of what I call bag-packing scenes—he'd always be packing his toothbrush, saying goodbye to his

wife, or taking her with him, and then you'd have to figure out how she would fit into the story."

Gardner and Peter Boretski (each will direct five of the teleplays) will, as was the case with *Mr. MP*, videotape both the location and studio sequences—thus providing a consistency of technical quality not achieved when location film is combined with studio tape. Currently, shooting is taking place around the Parliament Buildings in Ottawa.
