



DO make sure that your stylus (or "needle") is not worn.

Usually your ear will tell you, but if in doubt, change a sapphire once every two months if you play discs peetty regularly, Better still, invest in a diamond stylus. It is dearer institially, but it lasts much longer. Billy care?




