



# RDP music stations France wants to face sell-off threat

LISBON - Portugal's centre-right opposition party, the PSD, will consider privatising public broadcaster

RDP's CHR network Antena 3 ANTENA classical

station RDP Antena 2 if it wins the country's general election on March 16-17.

News of the party's plans have been obtained exclusively by M&M from sources close to both the PSD and RDP. It is also understood that once it had sold the two music stations off, a PSD government would form a more cost-effective, statefunded media network out of the country's remaining public radio stations and TV channels.

PSD spokesman Leonor Silveira da Silva would not publicly confirm the plans, but says: "We have

made our position clear that some kind of re-structuring and reform will have to be carried out to make RDP profitable." He adds that

the proposals could affect "one or more of the public radio stations," although "we are still in the process of negotiations."

The PSD is currently ahead of ruling PS party in the latest opinion polls, but even if the PS wins the elections to retain power, it seems likely that a widespread administrative and financial restructuring of Portugal's public radio and TV continued on page 25

# Alizée makes British breakthrough

Paris — Conventional wisdom has it that French-language songs don't sell in the UK. Nor do French female vocalists. So, put the two together and what do you get? The answer is a number seven hit record for Polydor and its 17year-old chanteuse Alizée.

The young artist's single Moi...Lolita has already sold over 1.3 million copies in France, gone double platinum in Belgium and gold in the Netherlands, Germany and Switzerland. But its sexual undertones were thought to problematic for the UK market, where the track was released on February 11. In the video for the song, Alizée is seen taking her underage sister into a nightclub—a scene which Polydor edited for British consumption.



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# Uptront

A few weeks ago, Vivendi Universal chairman Jean-Marie Messier stunned the French intelligentsia by declaring that "cultural exception is dead." Instead, he promoted a new value of "cultural diversity."

Cultural exception was a concept formulated in France in order to counter the US free-trade stance during the GATT negotiations a few years ago. In a nutshell, it proposes that so-called cultural goods are not merchandise, and therefore schemes like France's or Germany's subsidies of their film industries are justified.

When Messier said this era had come to an end, he was coming, of course, from a particular perspective—his company is one of the pillars of Hollywood, and Universal Music is the world's largest record company. Critics argue that Messier is not exactly in the best position to be the world's champion of cultural diversity—and as a producer and distributor of cultural goods, he is more concerned about EBITDA than diversity.

As our front page story shows, this theme of diversity is gaining pace in France. While it may not be surprising that the subject has its origins in a country which can indulge itself in debates over the sex of angels, France is

also a place where there is still appetite for intellectual discourse, a respect for culture and a thirst for diversity as opposed to uniformity. This current debate reflects one of the most important challenges facing politicians as well as corporations and individuals—how to ensure that in a world becoming ever more global, individual cultures can still have a voice.

In a world where anti-globalisation movements seem to be gaining increasing acceptance, it is certainly not a minor issue and is one that should concern us all, not only Monsieur Messier.

• Elsewhere in the magazine this week, you'll read that Adam White, international editor in chief of M&M's sister publication Billboard and vice president of the Billboard Music Group, is leaving the company to join Universal Music International as VP of communications. Adam has been closely involved with Music & Media for

the past 10 years, and particularly since the magazine moved to London five years ago. All of us at M&M know how much we owe him professionally-not least for the stimulating discussions we had. We are also losing a friend, and he will be missed. But, that said, he can be assured that we will do all we can to give him a hard time in his new position. Bon voyage!

# OCR starts Spanish dance radio wave

MADRID — Spain's Onda Cero Radio group (OCR) has kick-started a dance radio revolution in Spain with the launch of Dance FM in Madrid on March 1.

The launch of the Madrid station will be swiftly followed by the opening of other Dance FM outlets elsewhere in Spain, while the country's largest radio group, SER, is preparing to launch its own national dance radio network under the Maxima FM moniker.

According to station director Fernando Aleman, Dance FM differs from the capital's existing rhythmic

outlet Flash FM in that it will be far less mainstream.

"Until now, no national radio network has offered specialist dance music, but that is

set to change in Spain," says Aleman.

"Our [music] product will come from small specialist labels from all over Spain and Europe.

Aleman reveals that Dance FM will not be a uniform national network, since "each city and zone in Spain has its own dance tastes, and each station will reflect those tastes.

The COPE executive does not regard SER's new network as a direct competitor for Dance FM, however. "We're not worried about Maxima FM because it is certain to be as commercial as most Cadena SER music stations," he says.

 OCR's 44-station CHR network Europa FM and 70-station AC chain Onda Cero Música are expected to be re-named and relaunched soon, although the new network's music format is still unknown.

# Sony Music brings Holland, Belgium together

HILVERSUM — Sony Music is eradicating national borders in the Benelux region by further integrating its Belgian and Dutch operations under a single president.

"Our challenge is to operate as one single region and it's quite a complex task," explains former senior VP in the region Patrick Decam, who has been elevated to the newly-created position of president, Sony Music Benelux. "In Belgium you have two separate markets and three languages and in Holland you have a market with its own dynam-

Decam continues to report to Sony Music Europe president Paul Burger, and will be in charge of Sony Music's combined Dutch and Belgian companies.

The two companies will now operate with one single head of sales, finance and business affairs and a single Holland-based strategic marketing department. There will also be a single classical operation for the region. Belgium will retain its own marketing and promotion staff, as well as a sales force taking care of the key accounts.

Decam has created a single A&R

unit for the region, headed by Koen van Bockstal, previously managing director of Sony Music Belgium. He takes on the newly-created position of VP A&R, Sony Music Benelux, reporting to Decam.

"This is a good move for us because we will now be able to operate as

a region and be more coherent in our signing policy—for example, we will avoid the duplication of signing similar types of acts in each country," explains Decam.

Decam says he wants the Benelux region to play its full part within Sony in developing acts with European, if not global, potential and also in breaking acts from other European countries.

Additionally, he is keen to have the two countries working in sync as far as the release of key international product is concerned. He says this

> strategy was implemented with success with Shakira, for whom radio airplay was obtained in both countries simultaneously, including in the French-speaking part of Belgium, which traditionally follows French release patterns.

> "I want to set up jointtiming on key projects,"

confirms Decam. "This is even more crucial with local repertoire. If we succeed with a Dutch or a Belgian act, we can claim success in not only one, but two territories, which puts us in a better position if we want to build an international career for

COPENHAGEN - Morten Friis and Uffe Savery were the first artists to receive an accolade at this year's Danish Music Awards and the pairbetter known as Universal act Safri Duo (pictured)returned to the podium six more times during the evening to collect a recordbreaking seven awards.

"I'm excited about Safri winning so many awards," savs Universal Denmark MD Jens-Otto Paludan. "But I have to say the event really helped sell the industry. Standards were high all around and it was a fantastic platform for music. Kudos to all involved. It worked.

Around one million viewers, nearly 20% of the total population, tuned into TV2 to see the show, which took place at the sold-out 7,000-



seat Copenhagen Forum on March 2.

EMI's Kylie Minogue headlined the line-up of live performers, who also included

Westlife, Lisa Nilsson and, inevitably, Safri Duo.

EMI's Saybia took Best Rock Album for the act's eponymous set, while BMG grabbed the Best Female and Best Male Artist awards with Marie Frank and Thomas Helmig, who also got the Best Songwriting award. Edel received the Best Newcomer and Best Pop Album awards for its signing Christian.

# Portugal records poor sales in 2001

LISBON — The Portuguese music market saw a 20% year-on-year fall in sales in 2001 to euros 96.67 million, in what is being seen as the worst year for the sector in recent memory.

Figures released by the local labels' body AFP show that sales of full-price CDs dropped 7.8% compared with last year. Budget CDs were down 40%, while music videos and DVDs fell 50.8%.

The figures also reveal that the Portuguese market experienced one of the worst Christmases in over 10 years, with total CD sales down by 20% on last vear.

"Christmas was very bad— for several reasons," says

David Ferreira, managing director of EMI/Valentim. "Sell-through figures for the combined market had been deteriorating for many months; it took longer than expected to recover from the



September 11 shock, and we had a government crisis and the prime minister's resignation in mid- December."

Carlos Pinto, managing director of Sony Music Portugal, adds: "The last quarter of 2001 was the worst we can remember in the industry for many years. From what we know of January and February the market is continuing to drop, although we've had successes with Maria Carey and Michael Jackson.'

On the plus side, the performance of local repertoire propped up a falling market. Local act GNR shipped some 10,000 units of their album Camaralenta, while Gregorian chantmasters Divinius (pictured) entered M&M's European Top 100 Albums chart last week with Sucessos Portugueses Em Gregoriano (OK Visions). Samba compilation album Canta Bahia (Vidisco) was also a strong seller in 2001, shifting 120,000 units.

# completed Italia Network-HDP deal

MILAN — Italian media group Sole 24 has finally sold its CHR/Dance network Radio Italia Network to the HDP Group for euros 46 million.

As part of the deal, Sole 24 has also sold local radio syndication company CNR and sales house AGR to It retains news/talk station Radio 24, however.

The completion of the aquisition follows several months of speculation. Rumours first began to circulate last year that HDPwhich comprises the Rizzoli

publishing group-was to make an offer to the Sole 24 group for Italia Network.

But HDP and other interested parties appeared to be pipped at the post when the publishing Mondadori group, owned by prime minister Silvio Berlusconi, made a better offer for the assets (M&M, December 15, 2001).

Negotiations were, however, abandoned during the due diligence phase and HDP came back into the frame (M&M, January 19). At euros 46 million, HDP's offer is lower than that made by Mondadori group, which was reported as being "somewhere between

50 and 60 million euros."

It remains to be seen what HDP will do with its acquisitions. It has been widely reported that the group, whose publishing include interests national daily newspaper Corriere della Sera and the sports daily La Gazzetta dello Sport, was planning to transform Radio Italia Network into an all-sports station. But, as Italia Network's managing-director Giorgio Bacco tells M&M, "I think they [HDP] gave up this idea when they realised that our two million daily listeners were worth holding on to.'

POP IDOL WILL YOUNG SETS UK RECORD



LONDON — The debut RCA single by Will Young (pictured), the winner of the ITV TV talent series Pop Idol, has achieved the highest ever first-week sales for a single in the UK. Evergreen/Anything Is Possible sold 1.1 million copies between its February 25 street date and midnight on March 2,

according to the Official UK Charts Company. It sold more units in its first week than every other single in the territory combined. The single is already the 58th best-selling single in UK chart history. The best-selling UK single ever remains Elton John's Candle in the Wind 1997.

### CADENA SER INCREASES REVENUES

MADRID - Spain's biggest commercial radio group, Cadena SER, recorded revenues of euros 186.1 million in 2001, an increase of 1.3% on the previous year. The increase comes despite recent figures from InfoAdex showing a fall (by 2.4%) in overall radio advertising revenue in Spain in 2001. The news from SER also comes despite a 17.2% fall in net profits of parent company Grupo Prisa compared to 2000. SER owns four of Spain's five most popular music radio networks-Los 40 Principales (CHR), Cadena DIAL (Latino), M-80 (AC/Gold), and Radiolé (national music)—as well as news/talk flagship Cadena SER.

## GUBAIDULINA, MAKEBA TO RECEIVE POLAR PRIZES

STOCKHOLM - Russian composer Sofia Gubaidulina and South African singer Miriam Makeba have been named as the recipients of this year's Polar Music Prize, to be presented on May 27 in Stockholm. The event's organiser, the Royal Swedish Academy of Music, says both artists were "denied the right of public expression by their respective governments and political systems, and their open opposition led to oppression, censorship, and harassment." Gubaidulina and Makeba will each be presented with Skr 1 million (euros 110,160). Last year's recipients included Burt Bacharach and Robert Moog.



**UK** COMMUNITY STATIONS LAUNCH

LONDON - The three radio stations which have been granted one-year FM licences by the UK's Radio Authority (RA) as ten years on part of its Access Radio pilot scheme have all taken to the

air. They are multi-cultural community broadcaster Bradford Community Radio in Bradford, Yorkshire; Christian station Cross Rhythms City Radio in Stokeon-Trent, Staffordshire; and Angel Community Radio in Havant, Hampshire which will target the over-60s. "These three stations represent a pioneering experiment in not-for-profit radio," says RA chairman Richard Hooper. "If successful, it could lead to a new tier of stations across the UK, finding new ways of harnessing the medium to serve local communities."

# CARTER TO MAKE REAL RADIO IN YORKSHIRE

LONDON — GMG Radio has appointed Andy Carter (pictured) as programme controller for Real Radio, its new regional AC/talk station in Yorkshire, which launches on March 25. Carter was formerly regional director (north) of Radio Investments and managing director of York Hot AC station Minster FM. The presenter line-up on Real Radio in Yorkshire



includes former BRMB/Birmingham and The Pulse/Bradford presenter Brendan Kearney at breakfast, and Dave Sander on afternoon drive. Former Liverpool football star Emlyn Hughes will host a weeknight sports phone-in. The Real Radio brand is already present on GMG's other AC/talk stations in south Wales and central Scotland.



# EMI continues reorganisation ON THE BEAT

LONDON - The on-going restructuring of EMI Recorded Music around Europe has reached Greece, the Benelux territories and eastern Europe.

In the latter region, EMI Recorded Music Continental Europe chairman and CEO Emmanuel de Buretel (pictured) has terminated the company's regional structure.

Instead, the MDs in the

Czech Republic (Vladimir Kocandrle). Hungary (Judit Sekeres), Poland (Piotr Kabaj) and Turkey (Umit Guner) will all report directly to de Buretel, meaning that Joe

Govaerts, president and CEO of Eastern Europe since 1996, is leaving the company he joined in 1973.

Berlin-based Alex Kasparov, VP of international marketing, will continue to co-ordinate Eastern European marketing for the time being.

Similarly, in the Benelux territories, de Buretel is cutting out the regional level of management with the creation of separate Dutch and Belgian units. Former Virgin Benelux MD Dick Stolk is expected to leave the company.

Current EMI Netherlands managing director Neil van Hoff will become

MD of the newlyformed EMI Recorded Music Netherlands, which will be home to the former Dutch Virgin and EMI operations. Three creative will be units

formed: EMI/Capitol (which will also include local label Dino), Virgin/Labels and EMI Marketing. All three units will work with the same back-office. Further lay-offs are expected in the A&R and sales divisions.

Meanwhile, a past head of Virgin in the Benelux region is also parting company with EMI. Dirk de Vries, who set up Virgin Records affiliates in Holland and Belgium in 1982, and who was a Brusselsbased VP of EMI, had been working on various international projects on behalf of the major since 1996.

In Greece, the new EMI structure sees the chairman of Capitol Records Greece (formerly Minos-EMI), Makis Matsas, elevated to the position of president, EMI Recorded Music Greece. Reporting to Matsas will be Miltos Karadsas, MD of Capitol Records Greece who joined the company last January, and Yiannis Petridis, MD of Virgin Records Greece.

### SPAIN CALLS FOR DIGITAL RADIO SUBSIDY

MADRID — Spain's Digital Radio Forum is calling on the government to subsidise the cost of digital radio receivers. Forum chairman Rafael Perez de Puerto says that, although this year 50% of Spain's 40 million population will enjoy digital radio coverage, the high price of radio sets—about euros 600 each—means that very few people own sets. The forum has also installed Maria Jesus Chao, director of public broadcaster RNE, as its new chairperson.

### NRJ APPLIES FOR DIGITAL TV CHANNELS

PARIS — The NRJ Group has applied to French broadcasting authority the CSA for three channels on the country's new digital TV platform, expected to be in place by 2003. NRJ Group made a proposal for three free-to-air channels for its music radio brands: NRJ (CHR); Nostalgie (Gold); and Chérie FM (Soft AC). Between them, the new NRJ channels plan to target a wide age range, with Nostalgie and Chérie FM more closely resembling their corresponding radio stations. Other candidates for the TV licences include media group Lagardère Active and existing music and entertainment channel M6. The deadline for applications is March 22

### WHITE LEAVES BILLBOARD FOR UMI

LONDON - Adam White (pictured), VP of Billboard Music Group and the London-based international editor-in-chief of M&M's sister publication Billboard, is moving to Universal Music International (UMI) as VP of communications, effective April 2. Based in London, White will report to UMI chairman/CEO Jorgen Larsen and will work closely with Universal Music Group's LA-based

senior VP of corporate communications Bob Bernstein. Says Larsen: "I am convinced that Adam will be able to play a major role in formulating and executing the strategies necessary for transforming our company to fit into our future business environment." White suc-

### **DUTCH EDISONS AWARDED**

HILVERSUM — Frank Boeijen (V2) won Best Dutch Male, Mathilde Santing (Sony Music) Best Dutch Female and Johan (Excelsior) Best Dutch Group at this year's Edison Music Awards held in Amsterdam on February 27. All the awards were voted for by music industry professionals, except two—Kylie Minogue's Can't Get you Out Of My Head (Parlophone) for Best Single and Kane's So Glad You Made It (BMG) for Best Album-which were voted for by the public. The Dutch Export prize went to schlager artist Jan Smit (Mercury). Artists performing on the night included Shakira, Simple Minds and Jewel.

# Stations trial indie music database

BRUSSELS — Sender Freies Berlin in Germany, Flash Radio in Greece and Norwegian public broadcaster NRK are among the initial participants in a scheme to allow radio stations and webcasters access to a database of independent music.

The European Commission has approved a twoyear project, dubbed Emu-Cast, which will ultimately give the radio stations and webcasters online access to an encrypted database of 200,000 tracks from independent labels from across Europe, removing the need for stations to have their own large music libraries.

The EC's Information

Society in Luxembourg has agreed to commit 50% of the funding needed for the project, which sources say could cost a total of three million euros.

"The project will use the best of our technology to enable radio stations to easily tap into music from across Europe," says Gavin Robertson (pictured),

managing director of consortium partner "This will Musicindie. enhance radio program-

ming, boosting European music and benefiting consumers."

Robertson says much of the content will be of the world music genre. Musicindie,

# Change in quotas agreed for NRJ, RFM

PARIS — The NRJ (CHR) and RFM (AC) networks have received approval from France's broadcasting authority the CSA to alter their French-language music and new talent quotas.

NRJ has increased its quota of French-language music from 35% to 40%, while reducing its new talent quota from 25% to 20%.

"There is not enough new talent to make up one quarter of our music programming," claims NRJ president Max Guazzini. "This is why we preferred to go with 40% instead of 35% [of French-language acts]. There will be times where

we will be at 25%, at 35% [for new talent]. It doesn't really change anything, except that now we have more room for manoeuvre."

NRJ's changes reflect the ability of stations to make certain choices about their music output within the seven year-old quota regime, a change introquota duced in 2000.

"When we opted to play 25% talent, we thought that there wouldn't be any prob-lem," says Guazzini. "The problem is that as soon as an artist has grown, they're no longer counted as new talent. The definition of new talent is very restrictive.'

RFM has, on the other hand, opted to lower its

French-language quota from 60% to 50%, in return for raising its new talent quota from 10% to 20%.

RFM's change in quotas is a result of the shifting of its format from Gold to AC last November, following the arrival of Christophe Sabot as managing director of Europe 2 and RFM.

However, RFM programme director Alain Quarré is cautious about the role new talent will play: "When it comes to French music, we play artists like Goldman and Cabrel. We are open to new music, but it is not our mission to develop talent since we are targetting an adult

# An adult future for Jammin' Oldies?

Four years ago, Rhythmic Gold—or so-called "Jammin' Oldies"—became one of the fastest-growing formats in US radio history. Unfortunately for those who put it on their stations, it also proved to be one of the fastest to burn, leading to suggestions that it was merely a "fad" format. But, reports *Dana Hall*, salvation could now be at hand for those stations in shape of an evolution into Adult R&B.

# MONITOR.

ith so many stations leaving the format, some might say Jammin' Oldies is dead. But in the same way that the US disco stations of the late '70s evolved into the first "urban contemporary" stations, several Jammin' Oldies outlets have segued to a more currentdriven Adult R&B format, among them Clear Channel's WTJM (Jammin' 105.1) in New York and KHHT (Hot 92.3) in Los Angeles, Saga's WJMR in Milwaukee, and Syncom's KMJK in Kansas City.

KMJK's Greg Love joined the Kansas station when it debuted as a Jammin' Oldies outlet and eventually became the programme director who engineered its move into Adult R&B. He explains that Jammin' Oldies "just got old. When listeners first hear those classic records, they say, 'Oh, wow.' The second time they hear them, it's 'I love this song.' But by the third, fourth, and fifth time they hear that song in one week, the song has lost its 'wow' appeal. Very quickly after the initial impact of these stations, PDs started to see their quarter-hour [ratings] diminish, book after book. They had reached their peak within a year and began to fall fast."

In New York, WTJM managing director Wayne Mayo agrees. "The [Jammin' Oldies] format was built only on dance records that crossed over to top 40. And the span of years was too narrow," he says. "While a traditional oldies station usually pulls music from a 30-year period, Jammin' Oldies was only taking the top rhythmic records from maybe [the past] 10-15 years. That made the music burn out very fast."

# Novelty wares off

Lauri Jones, recently named programme director of Milwaukee's WJMR, says, "The Jammin' Oldies format was a novelty to begin with, and that novelty wore off very quickly. In [my] previous market [of Minneapolis], the Jammin' Oldies format lasted less than a year. After the initial appeal to listeners, they eventually drift back to their P1 station, making the Jammin' Oldies station a second or

third choice."

New KHHT programme director Michelle Santosousso notes that in its previous guise as Jammin Oldies station KCMG (Mega 100.3), the station had maintained consistent numbers, even after a frequency move.

But the change to Adult R&B "was a natural evolution," she says. "Mega was doing very well as a rhythmic oldies. But we started to see a change

We didn't want to lose that, and in fact, [we] wanted to grow that audience even larger. I don't really look at us as a new station; we are simply growing the audience we already had. It's an audience that tends to be more loyal as well."

Love says that in Kansas City, "we were definitely targeting the general market as a Jammin' Oldies. But we did have a core black listenership. To me, it made sense to build from there by keeping that core rather than flipping to a whole new format. Now we are super-serving that audience."

### Relaunch versus evolution

While in Los Angles KHHT became a whole new station when it moved to Adult R&B last year—complete with new call letters, identifier, and a new on-air line-up—other Jammin' Oldies stations have made more gradual changes in staff and imaging.

WJMR, for example, added the syndicated Tom Joyner show in mornings and ran an outdoor ad campaign inviting listeners to tune in to "the new sound of Jammin' 98.3," listing many of the artists that can now be heard on the station.

Jones says that "once I arrived [at WJMR], I changed the positioner from 'today's R&B and classic soul' to 'today's R&B and old-school.' I feel the younger audience

current things to talk about. It gives them the opportunity to be creative and topical. As an R&B oldies outlet, you play the same artists over and over, many of which are no longer working in the business. So you quickly run out of things to say. Whereas [with] an artist like Mariah Carey, there's something new and interesting every day. Adding current music has actually lit a fire under the jocks, and now they are more excited and involved in preparing for their shows."

### New music

As for how many current songs these new Adult R&B outlets are playing and whether they're going to break new music, the answers vary.

Mayo says the gradual addition of currents began last June. "We started by putting in about five to six current records, which meant you heard about one current song an hour. When we did our research, we found that African-American women love their classic soul, but they also like Maxwell and Ginuwine and those types of artists. So it made sense to start adding them in. We find that if an artist has a sound that is reminiscent of the past, it goes over much better." Mayo adds that "because we are in New York, we can also get away with songs by Mary J. Blige or Usher, simply because of their history in the market. And there are three other R&B outlets in the market that can warm those records up for us."

KMJK's Love notes that the Jammin' Oldies format also had to deal with currents, if only because "the Isley Brothers, the Temptations, and Barry White were coming out with current projects. These were core artists for us, but as Jammin' Oldies we couldn't play new records, yet our audience wanted to hear them."

Perhaps the biggest difference between these stations now and the Jammin' Oldies format they once were is tempo—one reason that many uptempo Jammin' Oldies stations ignored most of Adult R&B's best-testing oldies. But programmers unanimously say tempo doesn't matter. "The owners used to be so bent on keeping the tempo up," Love says. "Now it's not a factor at all."

Jones adds, "We do a Quiet Storm show every night from 7 p.m. to midnight, so we're obviously not tempo-driven. In fact, the slower we are, the happier I am. It's just not as much an issue with the listeners."

Santosousso agrees. "It goes back to the old adage, 'A hit is a hit.' If it's a hit ballad, then play it," she says. "My goal is not to try to keep the station's tempo up. My goal is to play great music."

in the music and [in the] radio industry as a whole. The rhythmic and crossover formats had splintered, with crossover becoming predominantly hip-hop. That left a whole group of records and artists who were not really getting the exposure to a wide audience on radio like they should—artists like Maxwell and Aaliyah. While you could go to the big crossover stations and hear a lot of rap and some R&B, there was no place to go to hear a mixture of current R&B and old-school geared to an older audience."

The move from oldies to current-driven music hasn't been the only change at these stations. In many cases, the biggest difference has been a change in target demo. While most are still targeting a 25-plus audience, most are now concentrating on the African-American listener. Jones says, "The listenership before was probably 70% white/30% black as a Jammin' Oldies station. Now, that has completely flipped the other way."

Mayo says, "We always had an African-American base, even though it was not really recognised.

uses the term 'old-school' more so than 'classic soul.' And it fits better. We'd play TLC's *Creep*, and while that might be old-school, it certainly isn't classic soul."

Love's changes at KMJK in Kansas also included new imaging. "As soon as we started to play more currents, I felt we need to get rid of any old-school terminology and phrasing. We had to bring it up to a contemporary presentation," he says. "I position all of the current music at talk breaks so that the jocks have

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
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
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
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# Jazz is mixing it up in the north

hen it comes to jazz, Scandinavia is more than ever five separate countries with five separate identities. As early as 1923 The Reykjavik Jazzband brought the new syncopated music to Iceland. By the 30s jazz was installed in all five northern countries. Starting in the late 1950s both Sweden and Denmark became the second home to many well-known American jazz musicians, from Dexter Gordon and Ben Webster to Don Cherry and Dewey Redman, who found in Stockholm and Copenhagen a more congenial ambience in which to live and work than their native USA.

Two principle events—separated in time by more than 20 years-signaled the discovery for the jazz world at large of Scandinavia's erstwhile hidden musical talent. The first was a legendary concert by the Swedish All Stars at the 1949 Paris Jazz Festival. The performance brought the house down, and elicited astonishment from musicians, critics and public alike. The band included clarinetist Putte Wickman and altoist Arne Domérus, both still performing and recording more than 50 years later. Swedish jazz has never looked back.

### **European sound**

The second event was the release, in the early autumn of 1970, of Afric Pepperbird on Manfred Eicher's brand new ECM label. The album featured saxophonist Jan Garbarek, guitarist Terje Rypdal, bassist Arild Andersen and drummer Jon Christensen, all young musicians from Norway. Not only did this and subsequent albums from the label establish a new and specifically European jazz sound, but all four players went on to record many more sessions with Eicher, and Scandinavia quickly became the foremost source for progressive, accessible jazz outside the US for the next two decades.

Thirty years later Scandinavia retains a leading voice in progressive jazz, with Garbarek as popular and exploratory as ever, and many internationally known acts, including Finland's Edward Vesala and Trio Töykeät, Denmark's Copenhagen Art Ensemble, John Tchicai and Niels Doky, Sweden's Esbjörn Svensson Trio, Bobo Stenson, and Mats Gustafsson, and big bands such as Finland's daring UMO Jazz Orchestra and the veteran Danish Radio Jazz Orchestra.

European jazz's cutting edge is perhaps best exemplified by the so-called "Oslo sound", a hybrid of acoustic jazz and electronica pioneered by trumpeter Nils Petter Molvaer and keyboardist Bugge Wesseltoft, among others, and which has focused the jazz world's attention on the Norwegian capital.

"The jazz scene in Norway is growing richer and richer in many respects," affirms national public Despite having a long-standing association with jazz music which stretches back some 80 years, Scandinavia continues to look for new ways to explore the genre, in terms of marketing as well as artistic endeavour. broadcaster NRK 2's jazz programme editor Erling Wicklund. "The whole history of jazz is represented by live bands in Norway today. New musicians are taking up traditional jazz, a younger generation of post-bop players is taking up the Coltrane tradition, and there are experimental musicians developing new styles and pushing the frontiers.'

### Oslo scene

The Oslo sound, heard on labels like Curling Legs and Jazzland [see page 12] was forged in the studios and clubs of Oslo over a period of at least a decade. New Conception Of Jazz, Wesseltoft's breakthrough, which he Jazzland to appeared in 1996. Molvaer's Khmer came out on ECM in 1997 and sold more than 100,000 copies. Ideas for both albums had been brewing for years, however, with collaborations among musicians, engineers and DJs a result of the unique Oslo jazz scene and crucial support from the likes of the forward-looking Voss Inter-national Jazz Festival. Clubs like Blå (Blue) nurtured the new music, though Oslo lacks a venue devoted exclusively to jazz. That very lack could have been what ultimately favoured the mingling of electronica and jazz in the city.

# Creative harmony

Says webcaster and producer of jazz projects at NRK David Fishel, "This wasn't just some smooth jazz played over samples and a drum loop. The DJs and musicians mixed not only musically but socially as well, and what developed from these encounters was a truly sophisticated, creative harmony."

With more than 100 jazz recordings released in Norway in 2001, not all are honed to the electro-acoustic style, of course. The most popular jazz record of the year-and of the last 20 years, in fact-was an all acoustic affair from extraordinary vocalist Silje Nergaard. At First Light, the follow-up to her also popular Port Of Call, went straight to number one on the Norwegian pop charts, and has shipped 70,000 units there, according

to Yngue Naess, head of A&R at Universal Music Norway. Not since guitarist Jon Eberson's Jive Talking in 1980 has a jazz album enjoyed similar sales (Eberson has just released his own latest effort on Jazzland). Nergaard's album was released internationally (on Emarcy) in mid-February, and the singer will begin a full European tour in April, taking her pop-inflected jazz to more than half-a-dozen countries, with six or seven gigs in Germany alone. The CD also nominated for Spellemannprisen, Norway's equivalent of the Grammy.

Acoustic jazz took Curling Legs by surprise, also. The label, celebrating its 10th anniversary this year, had issued two Wesseltoft albums in the past. "The combination of techno and jazz is very hot," concedes co-founder Knut Værnes, "but our best seller last year was the totally acoustic Come Shine from the group of the same name, which features the vocals of Live Maria Roggen." One good reason for that success was the tireless touring of the group. "Touring is essential," says Værnes. "It was easier to tour in the past, and to draw attention to our releases in general. Now it's a lot more competitive."

# **Boutique labels**

Demand for venues is high, and with jazz management nearly non-existent, most bands must manage themselves. Luckily, local jazz idioms such as those being developed in Scandinavia and other parts of Europe are gaining in popularity, and, according to Værnes, there is less interest in American jazz these days. Where in the past, New York was the destination most desired by jazz musicians, "Players now go to Germany, France or the UK to play."


Even so, Asia remains the label's most important territory outside the home market. This is true of most other Scandinavian indies as well. Other European countries have their own labels featuring local acts, so entering those markets is difficult. The Internet has helped promote Curling Legs abroad to a degree, and direct sales from the label's website now occur throughout the world.

The rise of home recording throughout Scandinavia as a result of the advent of reasonably-priced domestic digital studio technology, is responsible for a glut of boutique labels and artist-released CDs which complicates the retail panorama. Ironically, one effect of this abundance of recordings is that lower unit sales force real independents to release more material in the hopes of achieving better than average sales for as many albums as possible, thus alleviating the losses on the balance of releases. A number of label executives affirmed that though CDs which actually do well are few and far between, those that do sell, sell well. As Lars Samuelson, producer for

Swedish indie Four Leaf Clover, points out, jazz generally has a long shelf life, so jazz sales are rarely reflected with the immediacy that pop music sales are

Sweden, with twice the population of Norway, had the same number of jazz releases-about 110-last year, according to the Swedish Jazz Federation, up slightly from previous years. The Federation lists some 1,500 registered jazz musicians, of which 400 are professional. Samuelson, whose company releases from five to ten CDs annually, feels the Swedish scene is at an interesting juncture, with a younger generation of players mixing with veteran musicians. But he also sees a decline in

jazz at retail. A variety of styles, and a majority of first albums by younger artists, are his proposed antidotes to the situation.

## Forward looking

If not causing as much of a stir as Oslo at the moment, Stockholm's lively club scene hosts some of Europe's most forward looking jazz, from popular vocalist Viktoria Tolstov to the free improvisation of the Aaly Trio and the melodic but progressive jazz of the Esbjörn Svensson Trio. Columbia have released an album by the latter group, called Somehwere Else Before, which compiles tracks from their last two Swedish releases for Diesel, Good Morning Susie Soho and From Gagarin's Point Of View.

Scandinavia benefits from extensive public support for jazz through a number of government and private organisations. The Swedish Concert Institute's label Caprice features a 7-volume series of multiple CD sets tracing the entire history of Swedish jazz. Public radio P2 presents frequent live performances from clubs and festivals throughout the country. And Nordjazz, an umbrella association of major Scandinavian jazz interest groups, works to access pan-Nordic and European Union cultural funds for cross-frontier jazz projects and artist exchanges.

The Finnish Jazz Federation was founded in 1966, the same year as the huge Pori Jazz Festival, which dedicates a large part of its programme to domestic artists, though some musicians complain that they rarely appear on the main stage. One indication of the growth in popularity of jazz in the country is that as late as 1980 there were only three jazz festivals in Finland—currently there are more than 30, including four in the far northern province of Lapland. Local authorities discovered that they could attract hordes of jazz fans to places like Kaanos during the frigid and largely sunless winters, thus reviving depressed economies and filling normally empty hotel rooms.

# Highlights of recent Scandinavian releases

Silje Nergaard—At First Light (Emarcy)

The follow-up to the wonderful Port of Call, and an immediate hit in Norway where it quickly went Platinum, Nergaard's second Emarcy outing is, if anything, even more assured than the first. Again produced by the singer with guitarist Georg Wadenuis and featuring her usual trio, the album offers a winning collection of pop-inflected jazz in a style reminiscent of Michael Franks. Nine of the 12 songs are by Nergaard, including the superb title track. Her voice, by turns ingenuous and knowing, is always melodic and convincing. Her material is engaging, on both originals and her impeccable choice of pop tunes, including a memorable and moving version of Stevie Wonder's Blame It On The Sun. Nice small-group horn arrangements abound, aided by the presence of German trumpeter Till Bronner among others, while pianist Tord Gustavsen offers some inspired soloing. This excellent album is a convincing calling-card for her budding international career.

Thomas Agergaard/Oknok Kongo—Spirit And Facts Anker/Crispell/Mazur—Poetic Justice (both on Dacapo)

Two very different sessions, both demanding and stimulating in their own way, that explore the possibilities and limits of group improvisation. The intriguingly named Agergaard disc features a septet composed of four horns and a rhythm section featuring guitarist Niclas Knudsen. Though at first the group's playing seems abstract and anything but swinging, but as things develop echoes of New Orleans waver into focus, and drummer Martin Maretti Andersen's fills recall the marches which were a source for early jazz. Harlem Jukebox is kinetic post-bop while Flute Fantasy enters Dolphy territory.

The highly accomplished and provocative latter trio are made up of American pianist Marilyn Crispell, saxophonist Lotte Anker (leader of the innovative Copenhagen Art

Ensemble) and percussionist extraordinaire Marilyn Mazur (Miles Davis alumnus and winner of Denmark's prestigious Jazzpar prize last year). Their sound builds on free improvisation, but of a lyrical and sensuous kind, underlined by Crispell's commanding, classically inspired pianism. Delicate, meditative passages like Japanese Gong Piece alternate with more clarion exchanges, and finally the listener simply surrenders to three wonderfully adept virtuosos balancing at the very edge of jazz.

Kurt Järnberg-Make A Bet (Four Leaf Clover Records)

An exciting, seamless, straightahead quartet session with fine arrangements by the two principals, Järnberg and pianist Thomas Jutterström. Compositional duties-ranging from ballads to bossa nova-are divided between the two as well. The leader plays every horn from trumpet to trombone to flugelhorn, without forgetting the tuba-like and rarely heard euphonium. On tunes like the soulful To Chet, he displays an uncommon ability to coax wonderful sounds from these recalcitrant instruments. While it's true that the future of jazz lies in pushing the limits and incorporating new sounds, there's something to be said for those who reelaborate what's already been laid down, preserving and presenting the essential characteristics which lie at the heart of any enterprise. This may be jazz in a classic mode, but it's anything but antiquarian, and reminds us that swing is still the soul of jazz.

Solveig Slettahjell—Slow Motion Orchestra Come Shine—Come Shine (both on Curling Legs)

Slow Motion Orchestra is one of the best vocal debuts in recent memory. Slettahjell's voice is as soulful and seductive as they come, while her treatment of songs is never less than emotionally engaging. Few of her contemporaries have dared to approach standards with the originality and daring of this soon-to-be celebrated Norwegian singer, who combines utter command of her art with a vocal charisma not heard since Diana Krall's emergence nearly a decade ago. The band which accompanies her here, fronted by Sjur Miljeteig on trumpet and Morten Qvenild on piano, is often inspired as well, and on iconoclastic and thoroughly modern versions of My Heart Belongs To Daddy and others, they lend the perfect stylistic foil to Slettahjell's smouldering but smart delivery. Very recommended.


Come Shine, which boasts the fresh and beguiling voice of Live Maria Roggen, also tackles standards, but this group's agenda seems entirely post-modern in both delivery and intent. A playful tension between subversion and authenticity permeates this appealing set from one of Norway's most popular acts, with musical sparks ignited by pianist Erlend Skomsvoll and drummer Håkon Mjåset Johansen, which keeps the sound one step ahead of tradition and the listener always on the verge of surprise, as in the very hip You Don't Know What Love Is.

Esbjörn Svensson Trio-Good Morning Susie Soho/From Gagarin's Point Of View (Diesel)

Progressive jazz that's full of ideas, that has some of rock's energy and spirit, that sounds on occasion like adventurous musicians exploring new territory, on others as if they are happy tramping around the back garden. The Esbjörn Svensson Trio have a talent for lyrical, melodic tunes, and the confidence to try a variety of musical tricks to see where it will lead them. A virtue of these two albums is their cohesiveness, given their eclectic approach and the influences they display. Even with the subtle electronics which crop up from time to time, the music's overall feel is acoustic but driving. That vivid musical momentum makes EST one of the most creative and dynamic outfits in European jazz today.

goes to one band: the UMO Jazz Orchestra, one of the world's best, most innovative large groups. To put this in perspective, Norway's Norsk Jazzforum—a private organisation funded by the government-counts no fewer than 60 big bands among its



members, and 30%-40% of its budget is earmarked for concert and tour support for its members. So it's no wonder that many within the Finnish jazz community grumble about excessive privilege for the UMO, however respected the band is musically.

Federation executive manager Timo Vähäsilta praises Finland's jazz education, centred on the Sibelius Academy and the Pop and Jazz Conservatory, but compares his country's system of public support unfavourably with that of Denmark and the rest of Scandinavia where venues, for instance, receive financial support to help defray the costs of programming jazz events.

# Jazz education

Copenhagen-based Dacapo Records is an example of the kind of support mentioned by Vähäsilta. Founded by the Danish Music Council In 1989, the acclaimed label, distributed worldwide by HNH, which also distributes the ubiquitous budget classical label Naxos, focuses on the experimental side of Danish jazz, recording challenging works which would otherwise find few outlets. MD Henrik Rørdam, like his colleagues throughout Scandinavia, extols recent advances in jazz education. "The recent strong development of new talent coming from schools like The Academy Of Jazz and Rhythmic Music is something entirely new in Denmark.

But this regional Scandinavian renaissance masks some serious problems. A plethora of young well educated players is hitting the streets eager to make a contribution to the local jazz scenes in Oslo, Stockholm, Copenhagen or Helsinki, but when they arrive they learn that there are few venues, a limited public, scant financial support, and plenty of competition for space in record stores mostly indifferent to jazz.

One answer, of course, is to attempt to forge alliances with the culture at large, the way that Oslo's musicians are doing, or that Manfred Eicher and his coterie of young players did 30 years ago. # Jazzland leads the way

f you're looking for a nutshell to wrap the Oslo sound in, Jazzland would be it," says independent jazz programmer/producer David Fishel, referring to the iconoclastic. innovative label founded by Norwegian keyboardist Bugge Wesseltoft five years ago.

The imprint embodies the ambient soundscapes, deep house rhythms and eclectic electronics fused to acoustic jazz, known variously as the Oslo sound, nu-jazz or electro-acoustic that was pioneered by Wesseltoft and fellow sound explorer Nils Petter Molvaer during the mid to late '90s. Other trailblazers amid Norway's thriving jazz underground include guitarist Eivind Aarset, whose Electronique Noir was Jazzland's second release, and vocalist Sidsel Endresen, whose haunting style has graced a number of Norway's cuttingedge new music projects.

### Powerful roster

Launched to release Wesseltoft's own first solo project, New Conception Of Jazz, Jazzland was directly inspired by legendary Cologne-based label ECM, which featured a powerful roster of highly individual Scandinavian players who vastly expanded the language of jazz over the next three decades, and in the process helped create a strong musical identity for younger Scandinavian musicians to emulate.

Taking its cue from ECM, Jazzland began defining its own sound from the start, described by Wesseltoft as "pulsating rhythmic music and acoustic improvisation". The visual aesthetic of the label also owes something to the German label, whose refined, minimalist album covers created a unique, trademark style, which Jazzland has updated with graphics inspired by industrial advertising and digital typography. The label's striking design is by sax player and Kornstad Trio leader Håkon Kornstad.

The influence of ECM goes deeper, however, as many leading lights of the Oslo scene-including Wesseltoft and Sidsel Endresenhave recorded for the label in the past, Endresen under her own name, and Wesseltoft with such ECM veterans as Jan Garbarek, Christensen and Arild Andersen. He has also played regularly with guitarist Terje Rypdal.

Wesseltoft's intuition that launching a label would be the best way to promote his music paid off immediately. New Conception Of Jazz went on to shift upwards of 40,000 copies throughout Europe, and won a prestigious Spellemannprisen, Norway's answer to the Grammy. "Although we didn't invent this style of music,' Wesseltoft reflects, "Oslo was quite early in exploring this kind of mix, because we had close relations with the electronic part of the music business. There were several clubs where jazz musicians and those from the electronic environment mixed and even played together. So the vibe was quite strong from the start.'

The intimate nature of the music panorama in Norway also contributed to the evolution of the Oslo sound. "The music scene is quite small so musicians tend to play together," says Jazzland MD Sten Nilsen, "There are no separate jazz and pop environments, they merge

and overlap. That broadens everyone's horizons and makes the Norwegian music scene especially interesting." Adds Wesseltoft: "I think I personally know every jazz musician in Norway.

Another important factor is the high level of music education in Norway, as throughout Scandinavia. The Special

Jazz Studies course at the Trøndelag Music Conservatory in Trondheim is especially important in this respect, providing a similar service as the Berklee School of Music in Boston does for American jazz. Many of the key players in Norway's new sound studied there, and groups like Urban Connection, Mingus Ah Um, Come Shine and Jazzland's Kornstad Trio emerged from the milieu around the school.

But no matter how fertile the soil at home is, touring abroad is still the goal of most aspiring musicians. Being distributed by a major label has made a huge difference in the label roster's opportunities to play outside of Norway.

As Nilsen-who was Polygram Norway label manager before moving to Jazzland—explains, the imprint was picked up early for worldwide distribution Universal through the classics and jazz division in London. While it's up to local affiliates whether or not they release a particular album, some 25-30 territories follow the Norwegian release of Jazzland product within six months, accord-

ing to Nilsen. France and Germany, with their relatively developed jazz markets, are currently key territories. "The best thing a small label can do to survive is tour, and tour a lot," Nilsen notes. "Some of our acts have been in certain countries 20, 30, even 40 times. France is most interested in exploring new styles. The club network is very good, perfect for someone who wants to bring a band to a new country. Bugge has played about 70-80 concerts in France over the last two-and-a-half years."

Universal Norway A&R director Yngue Naess concurs. "In pop music you have videos and radio airplay, which you don't have with this repertoire, so you have to play to an audience." Norway's festival circuit is

especially friendly to domestic acts, and both Molde—the country's major festival—and the smaller Voss International Jazz Festival near Bergen have been significant forces, via commissions for new work, in the development of the new jazz in Norway. "All these artists have played at both the newer and more traditional festivals," asserts Naess. Wesseltoft and vocalist Endresen will perform

together at Voss this spring to present their new album, their third together.

Though major distribution is obviously a boon, it's not all good news. When a release coincides with the campaign for a priority artist like Diana Krall, relates Nilsen, other projects can fall between the cracks. Also, major labels have a vari-

ety of distribution agreements with retail chains and independent record stores, so while large chains are likely to carry indie product, smaller outlets often don't. Which is why Jazzland plans to create a web shop on its Internet site.

### International profile

**Bugge Wesseltoft** 

Jazzland's international profile grew rapidly as clubland began cueing the label's acts and the media picked up on what was happening in Oslo. The New York Times qualified Eivind Aarset's *Electronique Noire* as one of the best "post-Miles" albums ever, Herbie Hancock name-checked the Oslo scene as an influence on his latest opus Future 2 Future, and label tracks have been picked up by chillout compilation series Café del Mar. The label's acts have club cred as well as jazz audience esteem.

One of the imprint's most adventurous outings is the Mari Boine remix album Eight Seasons, featuring re-castings of the Sami singer's evocative world fusion by the likes of Jah Wobble, Bill Laswell and Nils Petter Molvaer. But it would be a mistake to limit the label to electronic jazz, as such nu-acoustic bands as Atomic and the Kornstad Trio are taking the label in a new direction. Says Nilsen, "Jazz is absolutely more popular than when we began five years ago. The live scene is very good. Audiences are enthusiastic, and are also showing interest in the new acoustic and experimental jazz."

Wesseltoft's aim for the future is to try to keep to the label's allimportant profile, while not remaining closed to new tendencies. "There's an upcoming generation of younger players returning to the acoustic format and working with free-jazz elements inherited from the '60s," Wesseltoft concedes. "So this is a new tendency for the label as well. But even these groups have collaborated with the electronic scene, so that's an important link. I'm excited to see how it will be received."

# Chant goes up for Edel in Europe

An album with Gregorian-type versions of Deep Purple's Child In Time, Pink Floyd's Wish You Were Here and Phil Collins' In The Air Tonight has become one of the unexpected pan-European successes this season. It has also provided a much

needed global seller to its distribu-

tor Edel

Reminiscent of Enigma, Gregorian consists of a 12-strong British choir dressed in ancient monk robes interpreting pop songs as Gregorian chants. "I did the first album of Enigma 12 years ago and I thought the time was right now to do something in that direction again," says German producer Frank Peterson and project mastermind, whose credits include Sarah Brightman. "I just did it because it is my own musical style. I don't ask who buys this music until the product is finished and

Released before Christmas, the album Gregorian-Masters Of Chant Volume Two achieved gold

status in five European countries (Germany, Belgium, Hungary, France, Portugal) and platinum status in Finland. "To reach this success, we focused a lot on marketing," explains Juergen Otterstein, CEO OK Visions, who co-ordinated the release of the project alongside Edel companies in Europe. According to Otterstein, the two albums of the series have sold a combined two million units in

Gregorian is marketed by OK Visions and has a Europe-wide licensing deal with Edel. Otterstein says that as this project was unlikely to receive huge airplay, marketing focused on TV advertising and TV specials. "Without the airplay at radio stations,

we went a different way with TV-specials from Spain and Ireland and appearances of Gregorian on different TV-shows," explains Otterstein. "Also very important was in-store listening. Wherever the songs were played in record stores, we got a very direct feedback and rising sales."

Stephane Girard, Edel France MD, confirms air-

play proved to be non-existent. What delivered instant sales was having the tracks on listening posts throughout France in retail chain FNAC. "It's a project which does not have natural visibility so we had to get directly to the consumers," says Girard. In France, Girard tailored the record with the Gregorian versions of two tracks, Desireless'

Voyage and Mylene Voyage Farmer's Rever.

"We chose songs which had been hits in France but also had international potential," says Girard who adds the euros one million TV advertising campaign before Christmas focused on the song itself, supported by a lavish video shot with a euros 100,000 budget. "As it was obvious we would get no radio support, we had to find other ways to reach record buyers," says Girard. Voyage Voyage has been picked as the second single to be released in Germany.

Otterstein just signed a deal with Universal Music's classical label Decca for the American market and the first

album will be released at the end of April. "Edel doesn't have the infrastructure to push this act in the US, but of course it is also important for them that the product is released in this important market, so I am really glad we arranged this compromise," says Otterstein, who also worked as a consultant for Edel's chief executive Michael Haentjes.

# Allstars shine bright

In 1999, the UK indie/dance outfit Lofidelity Allstars debut How To Operate With A Broken Mind was the highest charting album (number one) from a UK act in the States on Billboard's Heatseekers chart. Supported by the success of the single Battleflag, it has since gone on to sell almost half a million copies.

With British music in the American charts all but drying up, the UK industry will be watching the stateside progress of the Lo-Fi's follow-up; Don't Be Afraid Of Love (released February 25 in Europe via Skint and Sony Music's SINE network) with interest. Preceded in January by the single Sleeping Faster, the new material has already won friends at UK radio especially; BBC Radio 1 (CHR), Kiss 100 (Dance) and BBC Radio London (Full Service). BBC Radio London Sean Rowley says, "It's a really uplifting album that works on every level". BBC Radio 1 DJ Mary-Ann Hobbs claims closing track Dark Is Easy is, "One of the first truly heart stopping pieces of music in the 21st Century.'

The Low Fidelity Allstars' success is all the more remarkable considering former vocalist Dave Randall (aka The Wrekked Train) left on the eve of their first major tour. "It's been good for us-our success happened straight after he left, so it gave us the confidence to carry on," says Lo-Fi member Martin Whiteman The new album, written largely while on tour in the US, features vocals from the remainder of the band and three collaborators including Bootsy Collins (On The Pier) and Afghan Whigs frontman Greg Dulli (Somebody Needs You).

Damien Harris, Skint Records label head believes the new album is "more accomplished and musically satisfying' then it's predecessor and should suite the US market. "The Seattle-based radio station that broke Battleflag has already given the album track *Feel What I Feel* 50 plays," he says.

Harris expects some European territories to be "hard work", and that the Lo-Fi's popularity depends strongly on the live performances. "We will be targeting the summer festivals as the band are now an amazing live experience." Having just completed a UK tour they hit America and Australia in March then on to Holland and Belgium in April before playing Barcelona's Prima Vera Festival in May.

"That whole year was an amazing experience, but I think the highlight was playing live on Howard Stern's radio show surrounded by dancing bikini-clad models," says Whiteman.

### BIG DEAL

Kontor Records roster includes ATB, Scooter, Starsplash and Jan Wayne while Digidance, one of Holland's most emblematic club labels, has Klubbheads, DJ Jean, DJ BoozyWoozy and DJ Jurgen. First fruits of this new collaboration are the imminent release of DJ BoozyWoozy's Party Affair and Klubbheads' Let The Party Begin in Germany plus Jan Wayne feat. Lana's Total Eclipse Of The Heart and The Underdog Project's Saturday Night In Benelux.

# **ERIC'S ALRIGHT**

His debut EP, which included the excellent pop-inflected house track Alright, showed Swedish songwriter/producer Eric S was a cut above the average. With the release of latest single You Are Somebody! Blue Collar Workers Of America featuring the voice of Martha Jean (Playground/Sweden), he has produced a classic of the genre. With its dry, semi-spoken vocals and relentless, riffy funk touches, YAS! is an instant classic that ought to cause big ripples on the

dancefloor this summer. On the Radio Edit the music is tight, focused and brassy while, amongst the four club mixes, the 12" mix is good, if a little workmanlike. The two standouts are the sublime, subtle re-reading by F Com artist Ludovic Llorca and the jazzy, viciously funky John Storm 'N' Da Kid Mix.

# **DIVAS DELIVER**

D-Vas (Dome/UK) by d'influence features a clutch of stunning vocal performances from Sarah Anne Webb, Shola Ama, Romina Johnson, Ultra Nate and a thoroughly re-invigorated Dee C Lee alongside newcomers Montenegro and Dyanna Fearon (the latter is the neice of Galaxy's Phil). Opener Show Me Love sets the tone with the characteristically rich, deep, d'influence sound providing a lush backdrop to the lead single. This I Promise featuring Shola Ama is somewhat muted but undeniably commercial while the laidback All I Need, sung by Belle Montenegro, also exudes chart potential. Cellos married to a lazy house beat form the backdrop for a cover of the Gladys Knight classic Taste Of Bitter Love where Romina Johnson and the group come over all Crusadersish. By any standards this is a toweringly ambitious, beautifully realised project.

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

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# DANCE BEAT

The weekly dance chart comment by Harald Roth

In an unusual move, Belgian Junior Jack's *Thrill Me* (PIAS) returns to the top spot of the European Dance Traxx chart for a second, nonconsecutive week. It's the first time a record has returned to the top since Chicane's *Don't Give Up* (Xtravaganza) nearly two years ago.

Thrill Me again lost some ground with club DJs around Europe but scored on the sales front in the UK and Ireland. However, as specialist sales in Britain generally only experience a one-week peak, it is expected that it will lose momentum again next week.

Meanwhile, Italian production DB Boulevard's *Point Of View* (Airplane!/Illustrious) moves up from nine to four this week, and is number three on the Movers list, thanks to new support coming from France, The Netherlands, Denmark and Poland, where Sony Music has licensed the track.

Another Sony track, Puretone's Addicted To Bass, is one of two new additions to the top 10. Licensed from Australian indie Festival (Festival Mushroom Group) and sub-licensed to UK indie Gut Records, it has debuted on charts throughout Scandinavia and climbs from 14 to 10 this week.

However, the biggest overall gainer, as well as the biggest gainer on the clubplay listing, comes from Germany's ATB, whose You're Not Alone (Kontor) moves from 44 to nine in only its second week on the chart. The climb is based on an excellent performance in its native Germany, and while it's not yet available elsewhere, import copies have already made an impact on the Belgian Dance chart.

Speaking of Belgium, one of the hottest tracks on the general sales charts there at the moment is Mad'House's *Like A Prayer*, licensed to local indie company ARS. The cut is this week's highest new entry on the Dance Traxx chart at number 57. Apparently, there are licences for some territories still available...

Finally, Italian signing Pink Coffee's cover of Pink Floyd's *Another Brick In The Wall* (909 Records) is one to watch, and is the fifth highest of this week's nine new entries into the top

M&M's weekly airplay analysis column



So, Shakira (pictured) has finally made it. With her fiery Latino tune Wherever Whenever (Epic), the Columbian superstar has danced her way to the very top of the European Radio Top 50, overtaking Alanis Morissette, who drops to number two with Hands Clean (Maverick/Warner Bros.) after five weeks at the top of the pile.

Canadian Singer/songwriter Celine Dion is back to greet spring with fresh new material. Her single A New Day Has Come (Epic) jumps from 13 to seven, topping the Most Added listing. Radio programmers in some 19 different European countries deemed the track worth playlisting this week.

Another artist making a significant move upwards is US pop princess Britney Spears, whose new single I'm Not A Girl, Not Yet A Woman (Jive) rises from 47 to 33. The track also features on her movie debut Crossroads. The film is about three teenage girls embarking on a road trip across America, also symbolising their crossing into adult life.

Aside from the change at the top, there's relatively little movement on the Top 50 this week, with just one new entry. As predicted last week, Sheryl Crow comes in at 48 with Soak Up The Sun (A&M), the first single to be released from her forthcoming album C'Mon, C'Mon. Soak Up The Sun is an energetic track, featuring backing vocals by Liz Phair. Jim Sampson, music editor at CHR station Bayern 3 in Munich notes that "again, she's rocking for the crossover audience, so we started playing it as soon as we had it, which was actually before the official radio date because the track was on a radio sampler from Motor Music."

Crow will be playing showcase in association with Bayern 3 in Munich on March 25, one of just two showcase dates in Europe (the other is in London on March 20). "We are looking forward to Sheryl's visit," enthuses Sampson. "She's been a core artist for nine years, and very few radio stations can claim that. We've been playing her since Run Baby Run.

Alicia Keys (pictured) not only won a remarkable five US Grammy awards last week, she is also enjoying an impressive presence on the European Radio Top 50 at the moment, with two singles on the chart. Her new



track, the ballad A Woman's Worth, climbs from 12 to 10, while the already-classic Fallin' has re-entered the chart at 50. Jim Sampson believes that the three Grammy awards specifically for Fallin' has given the track a renewed airplay momentum. But he also likes the new Keys single. "It's one of the best songs on the album," he says, "although we've not really been powering it, as we're looking for more uptempo songs as the weather starts to get warmer and sunnier.'

avoiding playing "We are [Moi...Lolita] before 7pm because it's prime time for very young viewers [and] it does contain potential dangers in terms of imitative behaviour," says Hans Hagman, VP of music programming, MTV Networks Europe. "Without pushing it too far, in the current climate of paedophilia everyone has to take responsibility.'

Eddie Ruffett, A&R manager at Universal Music International (UMI), says: "In Europe, there wasn't a problem; the UK media is child-abuse obsessed. We made people read the lyrics. They explain that this is not what it's about."

Moi...Lolita was written and produced by veteran performer Mylène Farmer and composer Laurent Boutonnat, who also wrote the Alizée album, Gourmandises, which to date has sold over 800,000 copies in France and was released in the UK on February 25.

Gillian Kinnersley-Hill, marketing manager for international repertoire at UMI, says the company began to think it could chart the single in the UK following its rapid cross-territory success in Germany, Holland, Russia and Israel. "The consensus was if they can do it, with a French-language single, it can work here too," she says. "The quality of the production and the videos is a good reason why the repertoire travels. It's also about the nature of the song, it's very catchy.'

"It was just a question of waiting for the right time—we had to have success in other territories before we could take it to the UK," agrees Ruffett, who stresses that radio played little part in breaking the record. "We got BBC Radio 2 [AC] reasonably early, and BRMB [CHR] in Birmingham, but radio was never really part of the plan-we thought we had to get a hit without it. Basically, what has made it is a great club story, [music TV channell The Box, the press and key TV shows."

MTV's Hagman believes the ongoing success of French electronica has helped educate British palates toward Gallic music. "With the wave of French electronica last year, people in the UK are looking more closely [at French music]," he believes.

Kinnersley-Hill points out that "it's the first time a French-language track has entered the UK chart since 1988-it's a landmark for French music."

The second single, L'Alizée, also in French, has already gone to radio in Germany, Holland, Belgium and Switzerland.

adoption of a "code of good practice" between broadcasters and record labels. Sources say that the proposed new body is reminiscent of Musiques France Plus, an organisation set up in the mid-1990s to facilitate the dialogue between radio stations and the music industry following the country's adoption of French-language airplay quotas.

The report suggests using the embryonic structure of the Observatoire de la Musique project to serve as a source of data for the industry, where information is collected, monitored and analysed in a more thorough manner.

Says Baptiste: "Data [collected at the moment] is not very dependable. There is no methodology generally accepted by everyone to measure playlists, or to look at the relationships between the programming of tracks on the radio and advertising

The report claims there is a lack of "musical diversity" on French

radio, despite a "rich and varied" commercial music scene. It says the number of artists broadcast on French radio has been cut by half since 1995, while the number of weekly rotations for individual tracks has increased massively.

Says Baptiste: "There has been such a reduction in the musical diversity of tracks programmed, yet there hasn't been a reduction in tracks released, or in the number of

new artists being released."

He adds: "[The term] musical diversity must be taken in the artistic and cultural sense: diversity of authors, singers and styles. I believe it is a problem for the entire industry, but obviously it is more crucial for independent companies. It is important for the public to have a wide choice, and that all musical styles and artists can be heard."

In addition to the current radio scene, Baptiste also describes music programming on TV as an "urgent" problem, since entertainment chan-

nels such as M6 have reduced their programming in the past few years. "Music programming on TV has been severely diminished," he says. "It's a situation that we consider to be very worrying; there is practically no more music on TV, other than several specialist channels which do their job very well, such as MTV and those of the MCM group.'

Meanwhile, Tasca has asked Jean-Marie Cavada, president of public broadcaster Radio France, to outline the network's strategy with regard to music programming, also encouraging public TV group France Télévisions to work with music professionals with the aim of increasing the amount of music programming

# FNAC supports independent labels in manifesto for musical diversity

PARIS — France's leading music retail chain FNAC has joined forces with independent labels' body UPFI to promote musical diversity in the marketplace.

The two have released a "manifesto" voicing their mutual dissatisfaction with the current state of the French music market.

And in order to aid independent labels-which it believes helps promote diversity in the market—FNAC says it will focus on a higher in-store profile for indie acts, including increasing the number of listening posts dedicated to non-majorlabel music product.

"It is has been FNAC's long-standing mission [to support independent labels]," says Christophe Cuvillier, managing director of FNAC stores. This is also the result of an observation we have shared with UPFI on the evolution of the market, regarding the higher and higher concentration


a very small number of companies," says Marc Thonon, managing director of indie label Atmosphériques and a member of UPFI. economic model that these

companies impose on the market leads to a standardisation of the criteria for the production and the distribution of cultural goods. This concentration goes against musical diversity

The themes of concentration and

diversity are among those highlighted by UPFI in its own manifesto released at the beginning of the year. Among the threats to diversity, Thonon mentions the rise in marketing expenditures, which tends to favour mass-market products, the fact that music is more and more a loss-leader for the wider entertainment industry, and the creation of the two dominant music online platforms, MusicNet and Pressplay.

As part of its support scheme for indies, FNAC will release a monthly compilation featuring 10 tracks from various independent labels. The first album, released on March 2, is retailing for just four euros. Albums by the artists featured on the sampler CD are also being sold with a discount VAT rate of 5.5%, reflecting the VAT rate normally levied on cultural goods such as books and films. Not considered a cultural product, music product normally carries a 19.6% VAT charge.

The government—which recently defeated in a vote of noconfidence after losing nearly all its seats in local elections—has already said that, if it cannot privatise them, it will close one or more of the public TV channels belonging to debt-ridden public TV broadcaster RTP within two years.

The first signs of possible changes in the public radio sector appeared last November when the director of programming at commercial station Radio Comercial, Luis Montez, was invited to take the helm of RDP Antena 3. Montez re-launched the network under the banner "More Portuguese Music" in a bid to bolster its audience.

Any privatisation of RDP's music stations is unlikely to be welcomed by the country's record labels. "It will be bad news if we lose a public service youth radio station, which can offer alternatives to the play-itsafe programming we've got on most of the other commercial stations," comments EMI Portugal MD David Ferreira.

"We're in a wait-and-see position, but for us the political side is irrelevant," says Sony Music Portugal managing director Carlos Pinto. What we want are radio stations that work with the music industry and not against it."

Simoes adds: "All the political parties are talking about this and we've already seen changes at Antena 3. In our view it should not be a government priority at the moment. What we need is more transparency.'

Commenting on the possible privatisation moves, RDP president José Manuel Nunes says that "unlike the state-run TV channels, which are in debt to the tune of 1,000 million euros, we have had a profitable balance sheet for six years. In our opinion, this is a smokescreen policy to justify privatisation and it shows a certain lack of knowledge, since the universal public service we provide attracts up to 30% of young people to Antena 3.

Reflecting the industry-wide downturn in revenues, pan-European advertising broadcasting giant RTL Group suffered a 35% decline in profits last year. Adjusted group EBITA for the year ending December 31, 2001 fell to euros 361 million, down from euros 555m in 2000. Radio profits were down by a massive 65.3%—in a statement, RTL blames the fall on the weaker advertising market in its core market of France and lower audiences fort its flagship full-service station in France, RTL.

German anti-trust authorities have cleared the acquisition of Koch Group's European recorded music and music publishing operations by Universal Music International (M&M, March 2). Universal Music Germany chairman/CEO Tim Renner told a Universal marketing conference in Berlin that the integration of Koch will take up to four months.

With three awards to their name, Popstars act No Angels (pictured) were among the big winners at Germany's Echo Awards on March 7, scooping the awards for Best Rock/Pop Band and Best Pop Single. The group's label Polydor won the



award for Best Marketing Effort. Berlin's Seeed took home Best Newcomer, while Best Artist was Sarah Connor. Their smash single Dream Of You helped garner Schiller & Heppner the Dance award, while rapper Samy Deluxe won the Hip Hop category with his eponymous album.

Meanwhile, U2 left Ireland's Meteors Awards show on March 4 with a total of seven awards out of 21 categories. They included Best Rock Group, Best Rock Album for All That You Can't Leave Behind and Best Rock Single for Walk On.

As part of the sweeping changes at EMI in the Benelux region (see story, page 5), sources are reporting that EMI Belgium managing director Erwin Goegebeur is set to be named as MD of EMI Recorded Music Belgium.

In Italy, following Adrian Berwick's recent promotion to president and CEO of BMG Ricordi, the company has announced that Andrea Segnanini is to become general manager of operations. Segnanini, who joined BMG Italy in 1995 and was involved in its acquisition of Ricordi, will have responsibility for legal affairs, business affairs, human resources, information systems and general services.

One of the UK's most experienced radio programmers, John Dash, is back in business-he's been appointed programme controller at Scottish Radio Holdings' south coast of England AC/talk station, Wave 105. His previous programming gigs include Galaxy 101/Bristol and Key 103/Manchester.

Veronica Television is returning to the airwaves of Holland via an evening slot on Dutch music TV channel TMF-it had previously been broadcasting on The Box.

And finally, Alicia Keys is holding her next UK press conference at the Houses of Parliament. After winning five US Grammies, we ask, has power gone to her head?




