SWISS WELCOME PRIVATE RADIO But Rural Stations Struggle To Survive

Swiss audiences generally welcome the country's new private radio stations as an alternative to government-controlled programming, but operators in rural areas face an uphill struggle for survival.

These are the preliminary findings of a series of research studies on the impact of private broadcasting in Switzerland.

BRITISH TALENT TRAVELS THE WORLD **BPI** Campaign Boosts Sales

The big British pop talent invasion of the world's best-seller charts really started early in 1983 and it has gained momentum ever since. The year 1984 was spectacularly successful for U.K. music product, specially in the U.S., but last year proved even more profitable.

And there are no signs of any falling-off of that popularity in this first guarter of 1986. Record companies chiefs, from the majors to the "minors", are only too happy to reel off lists of new acts, already signed to recording deals and just waiting for that initial break.

The British charts, with roughly two of every three entries "made in Britain", reflect the wide range of musical styles helping create what is today a industry worth, from all sources, some £ 1.5 billion in revenue each year.

While it is true that in the U.S. charts there are clear signs of fightback by American artists and productions, there are usually around 15-16 British records in the top 50 singles. And research shows that to be a higher percentage in the States than when the Beatles spearheaded the first British "invasion" two decades ago.

It's not only the singers, musicians and songwriters which are involved in boosting British music (continued on page 10)





Shane MacGowan of The Pogues - Stiff

The 6-piece London-Irish band, The Pogues are shrouded in controversy and curious contrasts. Their well-established reputation as a bunch of boozers cannot be disputed. They enjoy promoting their self-image as a rowdy group of reprobates and their affinity with after-hours pub humour and the low-life is to say the least radical.

Their music is without a doubt traditionally-based Irish music and their spiritual mentors are the old Irish favourites, The Dubliners. Yet combined with their Irish sentiments is a Punk-like speed and a jarring conglomeration of drums, bass, whisstle, banjo and accordeon. They have rejected pop and come up with their own unique style and indeed their own trend in lyrics. Their second LP, Rum, Sodomy & The Lash (whose title is revealing of the contents) is made up of lyrics which can only be described as a collection of outspoken scenes of debauched life couched in far

from subtle words.

However the fact that the album was produced by Eivis Costello endows it with a considerable amount of credibility and it is only fair to say that Pogue writer, Shane Mc Gowan, has the ability to come up with some very amusing and strikingly visual scenes.

The Pogues are embarking on a tour of the States this month and it seems that that it is live that the Pogues are best-loved.

BPI chairman Maurice Oberstein adds: "It's good to see the entire industry mobilized in the cause of creating a better environment in which to market all of our artistic endeavours."



round the world. The country's record and video producers have proved as good as any in the world and better than most.

Deke Arlon, manager of Sheena Easton and producer of the British Record Industry Awards television show which was beamed round the world to an audience estimated over 150 million, says: "The musical talent we have in Britain is extraordinary. The entire world loves the way we write and sing."

And he points out that British talent is particularly strong among male solo singers, an area traditionally dominated by the Americans. He reckons one in three number one records charted worldwide last year was written or



sung by Britons. And that includes 11 of the 24 chart-topping singles in the U.S. and four of 13 of the number one albums there in 1985.

This year is when the British record industry launches its own generic promotion campaign. That is to say, all BPI companies will contribute to an advertising push to emphasize the value of British pop music and get more people back into the record stores.

It is taking as its main slogan "Life Sounds Better Than Music" and includes a costly but effective television commercial. But sales are on the up-and-up in Britain, despite profitability being so badly affected by home taping.

Statistics only just completed by the British Phonographic Industry show that the success stories in British recorded music sales last year were for cassettes, up 22.3% to 55.4 million units sold from 45.3 million in 1984. And Compact Discs were up by a staggering 244.4%, topping the three million unit sales comfortably and so living up to the industry's highest expectations. Singles were down 4.2% to73.8 million units, LP's down by 2% to 53 million compared with 1984.

Total value of records and prerecorded tapes in Britain last year, at trade prices, was £ 375,1 million, which is 14% up on 1984. Through all that promising sales action, CBS emerged as top record company, in both singles and aloum (continued on page 19) Hipsway - Phonogram



Brilliant - WEA

The band built up a good name and reputation in the dance circuit and released a number of independant singles before signing up to WEA UK. The sound they put on their first official release was confident and classy enough to evoke good reactions in Europe: the band's interpretation of the James Brown classic It's A Man's Man's Man's World. A definite floor filler with a Scritti Politti-like arrangement that wouldn't shame the Godfather Of Soul.

Brilliant is a typical 80's band, that combines a strong visual presence with a musical style that leans on funk, beatbox and poppy harmonies. Brilliant's band members, Youth, Dune Montana and Jimmy Cauty seem to have clear conceptions on the musi-

cal course to take. While Jimmy designs the sleeve and is responsible for all visuals, Dune does the styling of the band. Founding member Youth (once a part of Killing Joke) is involved in numerous projects outside the band. Recently he worked with Kate Bush on her new album, scored and recorded music for a fashion show in Tokyo and is also involved in producing an avant-garde dance group in New York. The band is in the middle of a UK promo-tour including interviews for Sky Channel and Music Box, to promote their new single Love Is War, a catchy and clever hybrid of pop-disco and reggae styles. The band is in the middle of mixing their new alburn entitled The End Of The World, slated for an April release.






Latin Quarter - Rockin' Horse/Arista

March 1986 sees Latin Quarter in the middle of a punishing 30-date European tour, but the results have made it more than worthwhile - their single Radio Africa recently made the UK top twenty, their debut album Modern Times has sold more than 70,000 copies in Germany alone, and there is every sign that this success will be repeated around the world in the coming months.

Formed in 1981 around the songwriting partnership of Steve Skaith and Mike Jones, Latin Quarter are now an 8-piece band.

Arista international mahager Claire King notes that "although they have been termed a 'political' band because they sing about serious issues, Latin Quarter are essentially a 'songs' band. Their music is very diverse - the only common denominator being a potent lyric, supported by a strong rhythm and subtle melodies."

That this combination works is confirmed by the tremendous audience response at their live shows. RCA/Ariola international director Chris Stone adds: "We recognise the importance of concentrating on developing our newer artists to the point where they can follow in the footsteps of Arista's Whitney Houston and RCA's Mr. Mister, who have broken out of their home markets into the international spotlight. We believe that Latin Quarter and the Blow Monkeys are poised to make the breakthrough."

Paul James - Riviera 104 Paul James is music director of the English language radio station, Riviera 104, based in San Remo; Italv.

"Riviera 104 is broadcast from the Italian side but can be received up to 180 km along the coast, from San Remo through Monaco reaching as far as Saint Tropez. In fact about 95% of our listeners are from the French side. We estimate that there are about 100.000 English speaking residents living on the Riviera with the addition of 5. million tourists throughout the year which is why we felt there was a need for an English language radio station down here.

Riviera 104 plays high quality music round the clock. Our music is aimed at the 25-50 plus age bracket. 50% of our output comes from our library of records from the 1950's to 1983 and the remainder is recent and current hits. We use a number of charts to form our playlist including ones from the US, England, Europe and Eurotipsheet.

Our music has to be exclusively in the English language but there are a couple of Italian artists we feature regularly. Mike Francis who does very good cover versions (a beautiful one recently of I'm Not In Love) and who has a popular LP out called Features. Blue Camera is another popular group here, much in the Sade vein, cafe/cocktail type of music. One very good track of their's is Golden War".

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

MARTYN'S CULT STATUS

After two weeks Talk Talk are up to no. 12 in the Hot 100 and it looks likely they will hit Top 10 next week. Another strong moving album for ELO, their Balance Of Power moves from 32 to 25 in its third week.

Supported by the two hit singles, American act Cock Robin enter the Hot 100 at 60 this week and the next entry is for Swiss Double whose album Blue is new in England this week and is also charted in Italy and Austria.

New at 79 is the Scottish singer John Martyn with his latest Island album Piece By Piece. Martyn is the kind of artist who keeps releasing one album after the other (this is already his 16th) and every time one tends to think his cult status is in serious danger of exploding. Somehow this never happened and nobody seems to know why. On every album quality always prevailed and we are inclined to state that this one is nearly as good as the quintessential Grace And Danger of 1980. Martyn knows how to create a very personal and intimate atmosphere like nobody else, as best exemplified in tracks like Angeline, Who Believes In Angels and Piece By Piece.

New at 84 is the new Rainbow album Finyl Vinyl, live recordings between '78 and '84. Apart from the previously unreleased studio track Bad Girl, the album features 14 tracks, a.o. Difficult To Cure, Long Live Rock 'N' Roll, Spotlight Kid and Miss Mistreated.

Jackson Browne enters in the lower part of the Hot 100 with his new album Lives In The Balance. Apart from the single For America there is more radio material that you should

consider, Candy is a nice catchy rocker and Lawless Avenue is very impressive too.


The Zummos are a married couple from America who have come up with an album for A&M entitled Modern Marriage The duo consists of Vinnie and Janice Zummo and the first is Joe Jackson's guitar player since the Body And Soul album. The album was also coproduced by Joe Jackson and features a style that can best be described as unassuming 'sophisto pop'. Pleasant tunes with a cheerful and light-weighted production. Recommended are An Obsession, Please Stop Dancing, Modern Marriage and Fool For You.


Jermaine Jackson's second solo album for Arista will definitely gain foothold in the adult Top 40 market. All tracks tend to mainstream although some of the ballads are a bit too sweet for our tastes (e.g. Lonely Won't Leave Me Alone). An exellent production with commerial appeal. The duet with Whitney Houston, If You Say My Eyes Are Beautiful will attract lots of attention and further noteworthy tracks are Do You Remember Me and Voices In The Dark.

Watch out for Janet Jackson who has a strong album out on A&M called Control. It was produced by ex-Time members Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis (Cherrelle, SOS Band and now producing the new album for Human League). What Have You Done For Me Lately is the track we love the most with its smooth, solid and punchy rhythms, one that could definitely cross over to the popcharts. And what a good vocalist she is! Her undercooled voice against addictive rhythms in the title track, Sheila E -like vocals in You Can Be Mine

sections in special statistics based on chart placings.

Managing director of CBS in the U.K. is Paul Russell and he accepts that the tremendous status of British pop and rock talent, also the size and prestige of the market, does put enormous pressure on the London-based operation of a multinational.

But he adds: "It means we are given a very large a&r budget simply because of the international success of British acts. Unless you're stuck with a very odd kind of act, if you can make it work in the U.K., you can bet your bottom dollar it will do well around the world."

Russell knows his talent. He picks out King to become really big internationally through this year, and a couple of lesser-known acts he rates highly are Prefab Sprout and Drum Theatre. The The is maybe a weird name for a group, but they are hotly tipped to make the grade internationally inside a year. In fact this band made a debut album three years ago and has only just completed a second. The group A-Ha has becoma

the first Norwegian band to make the international big-time. But there are many who think that a British video really did the trick for the trio. Steve Barron, one of a dozen truly world-class video directors based in London, used a technique called rotoscope for this awardwinning video. It involved an animator making traces of live action from projections of the actual film.

But there's no doubt that British video clip direction techniques have helped push British pop productions into the charts around the world.






Gene Loves Jezebel - Beggars Banquet

Katarina Strupinska, newly appointed RCA international manager says of the group: "They are one of the most exciting acts, both live and on record, that has emerged from the UK in a long while and we are ready to give them all the support they deserva."

writer from Southend signed solo to Polydor in '85 and before his first single release 11th April, he has already created a buzz through the music circles. 





Record company CBS Holland and the CBS European pressing plant are linking as co-sponsors of the 29th annual world amateur baseball championships, held this year for the first time in Holland (July 19 - August 2). Their joint injection of 150,000 guilders will mainly go to the promotional side of the venture, notably provision of posters, brochures and program-

The main sponsor is Coca-Cola, and other Dutch companies such as Philips and Heineken are involved. CBS sponsorship has previously covered the annual international amateur baseball week in Haarlem and has given financial support to various European baseball championships over the years.

THORN EMI TO MARKET DISH AERIALS

Thorn EMI's tv and video hardware subsidiary Ferguson is to start selling satellite receiving dishes this month in the UK, at prices ranging from 1,400 to 1,800 pounds.

The decision follows market research findings indicating that up to 75% of British householders are keen to try satellite tv provided the cost is under 15 pounds a month. Currently only around 2,000 UK homes have dish antennae installed, but Ferguson says the market is gaining momentum and that in two years time there could be 30,000 homes equipped to receive satellite transmissions.

Dishes will range in size from 1.2 metres to 1.8 metres, the larger sizes being needed in the North of England. Ferguson is not producing the reception packages itself, claiming that manufacturing capacity is fully taken up by other products. Instead it will buy them from British company Satellite TV Antenna Systems, which itself uses imported dishes and largely Japanese electronics.

Ferguson will not offer rental, at least in the short term, but another Thorn EMI subsidiary, the High Street tv rental chain DER, has been doing so for some months now, using Japanese equipment from NEC. However, Thorn EMI says there are no immediate plans for DER to switch to Fergusonsupplied hardware.

the length of the clip and the area of dissemination. Basis of the fee is roughly the same as that agreed with the Belgian state television operations, RTB and BRT.

Alongside the announcement of the in-principle Belgian deal, two firm agreements covering videoclip use in Switzerland and Italy were revealed. This means that the only remaining major countries in which no payment is made to record companies for videoclip use are the UK, Australia, Spain and Portugal.

In Italy, the AFI, national group of the IFPI, has tied up a deal with the 24-hour music channel, Videomusic. The programmer will pay 1.25 million lire (roughly £ 590 sterling or \$ 830) for the use of a music video for two to three months. The exact time will be determined by arrangement with the record company involved in each case. Videomusic will also pay 2% of its income from advertising and subscriptions to the AFI for videoclip use. This money will be distributed on the basis of the number of transmissions of each videoclip. The Italian deal runs from two

years as from January 1st this year. And in Switzerland, agreement

has been reached with broadcasters by the Swiss national IFPI group. The terms in this territory are that the television stations will pay 150 Swiss francs (about \$ 79 or around \$ 56,50 sterling) for the German-speaking population which has 1.5 million households.

The fee is the same for the French-speaking population, which covers half-a-million house-holds, and is 100 Swiss francs (about \$ 54 or £ 38.50 sterling) for the Italian-language population (some 94,000 households).

After the first transmission, the station will have free use of the video for six weeks. This, the IFPI estimates, will involve an average of two or three further transmissions.

However, if the experience of the first half-year of the agreement shows a much greater level of repeats, then this clause may have to be amended. After six weeks, any further use of the clip will be paid for at 50% of the original rate.

abolished the state's monopoly on broadcasting for a provisional five year period, around 30 private stations have started up. But while those operating in urban areas have rapidly acquired substantial audiences and sound financial bases, the 10 kilometre limit on broadcasting range has meant that stations in the countryside are already experiencing severe financial strains.

The 1983 Decree provided for government-commissioned research into the impact and popularity of private broadcasting, and several studies have been made including one by private organisation AG fur Werbemittelforschung and another, more favourable to state-controlled programming, by the Swiss Radio and TV Association.

Since 1984 a University of

Zurich working party commissioned by the Federal government has been evaluating the economic, social, political and media implications of the free broadcasting environment, with special regard to programming differences between the private and state-sponsored sectors.

According to this working party, private local stations play an important role in stimulating the cultural environment in their reception areas, although programme quality tends to reflect the level of financial resources available. Not all the expectations expressed in the Decree have so far been met, the working party goes on, but by and large the Swiss public now sees private broadcasting as an interesting and welcome addition to the total range of radio programming on offer.

It was a very busy and hectic week on European radio with the new singles out by David Bowie, Rolling Stones and Culture Club. All 3 records are unquestionable smashes and immediate add-ons for most of our correspondents. The airplay on the new Bowie single Absolute Beginners even surpassed that of the Stones and Bowle has highest entry at 23 this week

The Stones are new at 27 with the Bob & Earl classic from 1963, Harlem Shuffle and although the Rolling Stones are not known for their trend setting function the last couple of years, their new single is a straight forward danceable r&b cracker.

It took some time but one of England's brightest new talents, Simply Red, finally got the airplay they deserve on Jericho, the 4th single from their debut album. The jazz-funkateers are closely followed by Culture Club whose new single Move Away enters at 37.

Following a Top 10 hit in the US, Mike & The Mechanics are now picking up consider-able airplay in Europe as well. For many stations it is an easy record to fit in the current for-mats and it looks likely that *Silent Running* is Mike Rutherford's first hit outside his involvement with Genesis.

We have a couple of Euro-Crossover selections for you this week. After 2 consecutive hits with Maria Magdalena and In The Heat Of The Night, German singer Sandra comes up with her third single entitled Hey Little Girl (Virgin). The sound is poppier than ever and somehow it reminds us of one other very big hit of the past (who will help us out?!). The single is supported by a full drama video clip which leans very much on Nicolas Roeg's occult thriller Don't Look Now.

Produced by Claudio Cecchetto the Italian artist Sandy Marton has a hit in Germany and Spain at the moment but the single could, we think, make impact in other countries as well. More mainstream pop comes from the German formation Bad Boys Blue whose Kisses And Tears is very much in the Modern Talking vein: a nice and pleasant tune that could be the follow up to last year's You're A Woman that spent 18 weeks on the Hot 100, reached a highest position of 24 and crossed over to 8 different European countries.

The last contender for crossover comes from the German indie Rush Records that releases the funny disco rap Geil (for more details see issue of last week. New Talent section).

Euro-Crossover productions are doing very well lately in the US. Austrian rapper Falco has a good selling album (Falco 3) and single (Rock Me Amadeus- already Top 10!) while Italian artist Baltimora has a Top 20 hit with Tarzan Boy

Watch out for the new Howard Jones single No One is To Blame to enter the airplay charts next week. The song is originally from the Dream Into Action album and Phil Collins produced the new version together with Hugh Padgham and can also be heard on drums and backing vocals.

After Nu Shooz, Atlantic launches a second black dance act ready to cross the Atlantic and to contaminate the club scene in Europe: Aleem featuring Leroy Burgess. The track Love's On Fire is a disco r&b track with sharp and punchy rhythms. Watch out!

Thomas Dolby and Ryuichi Sakamoto combine their forces into a single for 10 Records entitled Fieldwork. It is an intriguing collage of avantgarde electronics and Dolby's inclination towards commercial synthi-pop.

UNITED KINGDOM

After 6 weeks in the charts Diana Ross has reached no 1. Her Chain Reaction replaces Billy Ocean who drops one place and is in turn followed by the incredibly successful Sigue Sigue Sputnik. Their heavy publicity has paid off: after entering the charts last week at 7 their Love Missile F1-11 is already in third place. Good moves this week for Bangles with their soda pop single, Manic Monday (4-10), Frank Sinatra's re-release New York, New York (10-28), Whistle's Just Buggin' (14-34), Jim Diamond's Hi Ho Silver (16-37) and Mike & The Mechanics' Silent Running (25-39). Highest new entry this week for Prince with Kiss in at 27, followed by Irish-London band The Pogues with London Girl (38), Slouxsie & The Banshees and Pet Shop Boys. The English charts this week have the unusual fact of having several new entries at identical positions due to equal points. There are thus 3 no. 54's, 2.85's and 2.99's.

GERMANY

Modern Talking have done it again! Not one of their single releases has flopped so far and the popular German duo collected their 4th nö. 1 single in a row this week. They are followed by two German spoken acts, Falco and Muenchener Freiheit. Depeche Mode's *Stripped* has entered the top 10 at no 5 from 23 and there are other good moves for Sheila E. (16-24) and Sophia George's *Girlie Girlie* (21-41). Highest new entry this week is Alisha with the Madonna-like *Baby Talk* in at 33 after which come Matt Bianco (40). Paul Hardcastle and ELO. Airplay-wise Sandra's newly released single *Little Girl* is bubbling under as are The Damned, Prince and Nena.

FRANCE

Sting has moved up 3 notches to reach no. 1 and his *Russians* is followed by two local acts Jean-Luc LaHaye and 3eme Sexe. Les *Restos Du Coeur*, the charity single masterminded by French comedian Coluche in order to bring in money to feed France's homeless ('Restos' being colloquial for réstaurants) has shot up the charts to 8 from 42. It is performed by an impressive line-up of artists including Jean-Jacques Goldman. Renaud's Miss Maggie is climbing equally fast (15-43). Also moving well are Gold's Capitaine Abandonne, Murielle Dacq's Tropique (21-30) and Den Harrow's Bad-Boy (29-47). Ken Lazlo has highest new entry with Tonight (one of our New Talent tips!) in at 37 followed by the children's song Les Bisoux Des Bisounours (meaning the kisses of the kissy teddy bears!) sung by Stephanie et Les Enfants De Bondy.

HOLLAND

While Billy Ocean and Survivor remain best selling singles in Holland, Madonna's Borderline is a serious contender and she is this week no. 3 (from 5). US act Cock Robin are very popular in Germany and Holland and in the latter they move into top 10 this week (6-15). Good moves for Andrea (8-13), Full Force (10-19) and Falco (12-29). Highest new entry for the re-released Conga by Miami Sound Machine.

BELGIUM

With the two Rocky IV songs on top it is clear that CBS (who distribute Scotti Brothers) has the best selling singles in Belgium at the moment. Other successful CBS singles include Cock Robin's When Your Heart is Weak (19-22) and Full Force (new at 36). The Italian Baby Records production Andrea (in Belgium picked up by Polydor) is at 3 and the new Modern Talking single jumps to 4 (from 12). Good moves for French rock act Telephone with Le Jour S'est Leve, Alisha, Madonna (Borderline) and Renaud with his controversial sona Miss Maogie.

ITALY

As anticipated last week Matia Bazar tops the Italian chart with the beautifully arranged Ti. Senio. Drum Theatre, the kaleidoscopic sextet from England, move up to no. 2 and their Eldorado is followed on its heels by the San Remo winner of this year, Eros Ramazzotti. His Adesso Tu (Now You) jumps in its second week from 21 to 3 and is destined for the top. Swiss act Double moved up to 4 (from 7) and new in the top 10 are Sting, Mr. Mister and Survivor.

SWITZERLAND

The biggest move in the Swiss charts is for Billy Ocean (5-15) and he has also the best played single in Switzerland. Although Fälco still tops the Swiss charts (already for 7 weeks in a row) the airplay on Jeanny went down considerably (13th best played single). Because of Falco's dominance, the Pet Shop Boys, although having a very good selling single, have not succeeded in becoming no. 1. West End Girls is already in its fourth week stuck at no. 2.

PORTUGAL

Etton John's Nikita remains the best selling single followed by Lionel Richie and Mödern Talking's Cheri Cheri Lady. The popularity of Feargal Sharkey rises. His A Good Heart is new in the top 10 this week.

DENMARK

A fairly static top 10 this week though Modern Talking is creeping up (4-8) as is local product Bjorn Tidmand with Tre Hvide Duer (8-13). C.C. Catch and Billy Ocean are also moving their way up the charts.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA

Although there are no official charts in Czechoslovakia, the state-owned record company Supraphon compiles a monthly list. Local artist Dalibor Janda has the best selling single with 'Hurricane' (already for the 5th month in a row). At 2, last year's greatest discovery, the thirteen year old Darinka in her duet with the European pop veteran Karel Gott. The song is entitled Zvonky Stesti ('Beils Of Happiness') and kept the top position for 24 weeks. The German version of the song (Fang Das Licht) by the same artists, is now in the German and Austrian charts (resp. 15 and 11). The charts of the 15 most important dj's in the country have the local heavy metal band Natural as the no. 1 with Ja Na To Mam (I Can Manage) and another Dalibor Janda single, Ostrovy ('Islands') as the no. 2. On the 3rd place we find the Czechoslovak alternative of the Live Aid project called The Best Present and this is a recording of 52 singers cooperating (report by Petr Belohlavek).

LIFE SOUNDS BETTER TO UK MUSIC !! BPI Generic Campaign Gets Promo Boost By MGMM

The British Phonographic Industry has brought in Brian Grant of MGMM, one of the world's leading promo directors, to mastermind the tv commercials for its first ever generic campaign on behalf of recorded music.

According to the Yellowhammer advertizing agency handling the BPI campaign, a pop promo company was chosen partly because of its understanding of the music industry, but also because it would be best used to working under the twin constraints of limited time and limited money. "Only a promo company could have organized themselves auickly enough," says Yellowhammer's Alan Page. "They are used to working to tight budgets and turning work round quickly."

In fact Grant had just under three weeks to produce two finished commercials. The first, shot on location in the Bahamas, features a shipwrecked mariner listening on a fortuitously washedup ghettoblaster to what turns out to be "Desert Island Discs" The second, starring Hugh Cornwell of the Stranglers as an exhausted executive relaxing to the sounds of music, is set in a luxurious London apartment.

The ads, which also feature the BPI's new "Note Man" generic logo and the line "Life Sounds Better To Music", will be tested in one major UK tv region initially. Their impact will be assessed by research organization BMRB before any decision is taken to roll the campaign out nationwide.

According to the BPI the overall campaign is aimed primarily at lapsed record buyers, and at those customers whose frequency of purchase might be increased under the right stimulus. Rob Dickins, chairman WEA Records UK and also chairman of the BPI promotion and campaign committee, says: "The aim is to get the record buyer who has stopped going to the shops and that means an older than teenage group. Instead of the latter, it is destined more for the 20 to 28 year olds, but we are also (continued on page 10)



Sigue Sigue Sputnik Parlophone

Some call them the most outrageous band in the universe, others dismiss it as one big media hype. Fact is though, no matter if you love them or loathe them they are the talk of the town. For an unsigned band they picked up the most extensive media coverage since the days of the Sex Pistols. It has taken the band 4 years to find the right line-up and to chrystalise the right concept; not to mention the fact they didn't even know how to play when they first grouped together. Last October the band signed a mega-deal with EMI and their first single entitled Love Missile F1-11 was released February 17th. Exactly 7 days later the Giorgio Moroder-produced single entered the English charts at 7, which is the highest debuting single for a new act since Young Ones' Neil entered the English charts in 1984 at no. 5 with the Traffic-cover Hole In My Shoe. John Cavanagh, EMI's director of international marketing states: "We are shooting at the top and looking for a no. 1! Initial reactions from our licensees are sensational and the record will be out everywhere."

It is obvious SSS isn't just a new band with a couple of good songs and a couple of musicians. What counts however, is the concept with a capital C. Everything, from video production to visual image is pre-conceived and controlled by the group. The band knows exactly what they are doing and they are convinced they will take over the world. Fronted by ex-Generation X member Tony James, the band took their name from a Moskow street gang and combine all the elements of rock 'n' roll from the last decades and transforms it into a totally new and exciting conception of rock in roll, whose influence will be felt into the 21st century. The Apache rockers create a visual style, that is a mixture of cuit 50's trash movies mixed with futuristic elements of movies like Mad Max, A Clockwork Orange and Blade Runner, resulting in a sort of apocalyptic pop to shatter today's conceptions of pop music.

As Tony James explains: "Our music sounds like a helicopter exploding in slowmotion, like Elvis Presley crashing the space shuttle into the Empire State Building."

Commenting on the band's explicit imagery, John Cavanagh adds: "Maybe the video runs the risk of being banned, but to keep everybody happy all the time, is practically impossible. Imagery is an integral part of today's pop music and the good thing about this band is, you can't ignore them."
