BBC RADIO PRIVATISATION DEBATED

Peacock Report Leaks

Proposals that BBC's Radio One and Radio Two networks should be sold off to the private sector have triggered a fierce debate among UK broadcasting and commercial interests, even though the Peacock Committee report which contains them will not be published until next month.

The report was delivered to the British government June 3rd and deals with alternative ways to fund the BBC. Mrs Thatcher and her cabinet believe the Corporation's television and radio services, currently paid for by users' license fees, should be at least part-financed by advertising revenue, and well-publicised leaks suggest the privatisation of Radios One and Two will be high on the agenda.

Media analysts say such a move could net the BBC anything between 50 million and 200 million pounds, while advertising revenue for the two networks could reach 75 million pounds within a few years. Pop-based Radio One is expected to be particularly attractive to advertisers. It is the cheapest of the Corporation's four radio services to run, accounting for only 8% of total radio costs, but also by far the most popular, accounting for 40% of BBC Radio audiences with a high proportion of young and/or male listeners.

However, many questions remain unanswered. The first is what exactly would be sold. Newspaper reports quote one BBC manager as saying: "What would we be supposed to be selling? Bricks and mortar? Hardly, the channels all exist under one roof. Stars and staff? Not ours to dispose of. When you come down to it all that would be up for grabs are frequencies. And they are the property of the government."

Even if the radio frequencies, which are admittedly a scarce and valuable resource, were to be sold off, sceptics go on, what would prevent the BBC dividing up the long wave, medium wave and VHF frequencies used by Radios Three and simply growing two new services to replace the ones taken

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CLIP BAN HITS UK COMMERCIAL TV

BBC Cleared At Present

The British record industry's ban on the supply of video clips to tv broad-casters pending agreement on payments has started to affect programming output, with some shows reening still shots over music tracks, and early morning service TV-AM telling viewers no clips will be shown for the foreseeable future.

Only the commercial ITV and Channel Four stations have been hit. Trade body BPI has lifted the embargo on BBC TV on the grounds that realistic negotiations are now in train, with further meetings planned. Reportedly the BBC has offered to pay around 75 pounds per clip per screening, though this falls far short of the rumoured 500 pounds the BPI has set as an initial bargaining position.

Since the ban was introduced May 31st, Channel Four's new "The Chart Show" has been the main pop strand affected. The programme went out June 6th as normal, prompting a telex from the BPI to Channel Four warning against the use of videos containing music controlled by Phonographic Performance Limited. The show's independent producer, Keith MacMillan, has said he is responsible for rights clearances and complained about lack of consultation from the BPI, but the trade body says its argument is with broadcasters themselves. BPI legal adviser Patrick Isherwood adds: "We made it clear we were more than happy to talk to him if he had a sensible proposal to put, but this was not forthcoming by the May 31st deadline.

"The Chart Show" also revealed splits among the BRI's member record companies on the issue, with IRS supplying one clip and saying that it would resign from the industry body because of its disagreement with BPI policy, and Island Records featured in no fewer than four clips. At press time managing director Clive Banks was unavailable for comment. Other clips used are believed either to have been in the programme's possession and used without permission, or to have found their way to it from other, non-record company sources.

Mega Stars Lined Up __ & ?

UK's The Tube is planning an exclusive programme to be called "Eurotube" which will be transmitted live on July 5th from 19.30 to 00.30 hours. The following countries will broadcast: UK (Channel 4), France (A2), Belgium (RTBF), Denmark (DR), Holland (NOS), Norway (NRK), Sweden (SVT), Switzerland (3 separate language channels: SRG, SSR, TSI), Finland (YLE), Germany

(NDR - North Germany only) and Ireland (RTE).

The programme is also being offered to other EBU members in Spain, Greece and Italy, and also to East European countries. Italian cable tv company Video Music (a non-EBU member) will also be given the opportunity to transmit one month later if the Italian EBU members

If there's one record that is heating up the European airwaves, it is Wham!'s farewell single The Edge Of Heaven. It is the most obvious add-on for European radio and this confident and sunny poptune zooms right into the European Airplay Top 50 at 18. Wait for an entry in the Hot 100 Singles next week.

Another well reported single is the new Prince single, Mountains. This rather unusual dance track (though with a hypnotic and seductive feel) is the second best entry in the European Airplay Top 50 this week. This entry is even a bit higher than the position that the Kiss single had three months ago (entering at 32).

As expected, many stations added the new David Bowie single to their playlists and the Undergound single is third best entry at 35. It is the single from Jim Henson's new movie Labyrinth and for the soundtrack of that film Bowie wrote, produced and sung five new songs (other artists appearing on the OST include Chaka Khan, Cissy Houston and Luther Vandross- the gospel choir on the Underground single).

It is hard to think of a single not appearing on a soundtrack or forming the theme to a new movie. The examples are abundant and the latest include Sam Cooke's Wonderful World (apart from the Levi 501 adds, it also appeared in Witness), Rod Stewart's Love Touch (Legal Eagles). Queen's A Kind Of Magic and their latest Friends Will Be Friends (Highlander), the two singles of Prince (Under A Cherry Moon), Bowie's Absolute Beginners. More recent examples include the new Billy Joel single Modern Woman (Ruthless People)and Michael McDonald's Sweet Freedom, not yet out in Europe but the theme from the forthcoming film Running Scared. Films and music mutually benefit each other, although the relation is not always that clear for the audience (most of the tracks aren't even being played in the movie, only

during the credits).

Touch single moves in its third week from 57 to 10 and could, in turn, be very close to Gabriel's Sledgehammer (currently at 2 in the Hot 100), next week.

One of our tips for Euro-crossover is the Spanish singer Miguel Bose, who just signed an exclusive long term world-wide contract with WEA International. The debut album for that label is entitled Salamandra, recorded in Italy and about to be released all over the world. Bose was and still is extremely popular in Spain, Mexico and South America and apart from a successful recording career, Bose has also appeared in both Spanish and Italian film productions. Nena is a commercial, sultry pop/disco production that

might will do well in Europe.

Euro-vision winner Sandra Kim makes an enormous jump this week with her innocent Jaime La Vie moving from 46 to 19. This is remarkable as the single as of yet does not appear in the Airplay Top 50 (although bubbling under). European dj's seem to be not so keen on the single, although the audiences in Germany, France, Benelux, Austria, Switzerland, Sweden, Denmark and Portugal definitely think different.

There are 2 versions of P. Machinery in the Hot 100 at the moment, one by Propaganda at 69 and one version by P4F (Propaganda Four Frankie) entitled P. Machinery medley with Relax (new at 88), out on the Italian label Ibiza.



MAGIC TOUCH

Despite all the solo projects by Phil Collins and Mike Rutherford, Genesis as a group sounds tighter than ever on their 16th album Invisible Touch. Sales are building up tremendously in the major European markets and an entry in the Hot 100 can be expected next week. The album is full of good hooks and in some pieces the band returnes to their early 70's symphonic base. The album will probably attract most radio play with the festive Tonight Tonight Tonight (in an edited version the best candidate for the follow up to the Invisible Touch single), the impressive Land Of Confusion, the moody ballads In Too Deep and Throwing It All Away and the identifiable Artything She Does. Watch out for mass appeal.

Queen is another formation from the 70's that after many solo projects re-groups. Lots of activities for the band; a European Tour (the band will perform on a huge stage with a very impressive light show), they wrote the music for the Russel Mulcahy movie Highlander (starring Christopher "Greystoke" Lambert and Sean Connery) and ofcourse the new album A Kind Of Magic. The band has another world breaking record: this LP enters the Hot 100 at 7 which is the biggest album entry ever in the history of M&M (Stones had the former record with Dirty Works entering straight in at 11). Apart from the singles, One Vision, A Kind Of Magic and the new one Friends Will Be Friends, the band's repertoire draws on a diverse background. From the emotional ballad One Year Of Love (we nearly forgot what a good singer Freddie Mercury actually is!), the epic and heavy orchestrated Who Wants To Live Forever, solid muscular rock in Gimme The Prize and pop accessibility in Pain Is So Close To Pleasure (although the title suggests something different).

Music For The Miracle is a ten-track compilation hits album, where well-known artists such as Wham!, Bruce Springsteen, Sade, Hall & Oates, Paul Young, and record companies, publishers etc, waive the royalties to help support the T.J. Martell Foundation for Leukemia and Cancer research. A commercial sampler with in fact the same inpact as the joint EMI/Virgin and

CBS/WEA samplers.

Fast Facts: June 30th sees the release of the new Eurythunics album Revenge, featurng 10 new tracks including their latest single When Tomorrow Comes. The release of the new LP will be celebrated by a worldwide presentation by satellite beamed from L.A. Beginning of July the new album of Madonna, True Blue, will be released, including a.o Pappa Don't Preach (the new single) and an ode to James Cagney White Heat. Around that same period the farewell double album of Wham! will be released. It includes the hits and tracks that were released on the 7" double pack (The Edge Of Heaven, Battle Station, Where Did Your Heart Go and Wham! Rap '86). Rod Stewart's new album is entitled Every Beat Of My Heart, produced by Bob Ezrin and with guest appearances from Bryan Adams and Dick Wagner.

Ask your local EMI representive for a copy of eanne Mas' latest album Femme D'Aujourd'hui. The Spanish born singer with the French nationality (but currently livimg in Italy) has a huge hit at the moment in France & Belgium with En Rouge Et Noir. But there's more on her LP which you might like. Try Geisha, a solid disco production with rocky overtones, or the moody Idealic.

WORLDWIDE PUSH FOR **ACTS IN MONTREUX**

IMMC Staged Unique Promo Opportunities

Unique promotional activities took place during the IMMC and Golden Rose in Montreux last month. Apart from performing in the worldwide telecast, the 38 superstars present also seized the opportunity to do a string of international television and radio interviews, press conferences and informal meetings with the media. During the 5 day event no less than 632 artist interviews were coordinated by Dutch based European marketing and promotion firm, the Flying Dutchman, in conjunction with the various record labels.

A number of major European broadcasters built special studio stands at the conference center with prominent presence from MTV and Westwood One, MuchMusic Canada, Deejay Television and Videomusic Italy, BBC, Sky Channel and Music Box UK, Teen/Formel Eins Germany. IMMC prepared various locations for interview sessions by other radio and tv teams including a 16-monitor video wall, 7 soundproof radio studios and a specially built television studio. Other sessions took place backstage at the Montreux Casino as weil as at various scenic outdoor locations. Commenting on these facilities, Dominique Farran of RTL Radio France said: "It was an ideal situation

to be able to do interviews at IMMC. The artists were relaxed, very available and willing to cooperate. The locations and settings were fantastic for TV, which made everyone feel so much better than having to do inter-

Music Box's director of programmes and productions Mike Hollingsworth added: "We took full advantage of the IMMC and we feel it was very much 'our sort of show""

views in a hotel room".

Fritz Egner of Bayerischen Rundfunk Germany also conducted a direct broadcast from Montreux. "Not only were we able to do a lot of taped interviews, hut also, thanks to IMMC, we had some great artists, such as Genesis and Billy Ocean in our live show".

RCA International staged a special Eurythmics press conference while Virgin presented a pre-listening session and press party for the new Genesis album "Invisible Touch" which was attended by over 500 international programmers. Queen invited everyone for a special boat party on Geneva lake. PolyGram International welcomed their artists including INXS, Big Country and Animotion in their special stand.

Commented Jan Abbink, general manager of the Flying Dutchman: "Although at times chaotic it was a



unique experience with artists and media companies working day and night to get as many interviews done as possible. Artists were getting up at unusual early times to make the BBC Breakfast Show and made extensive use of the music-in-media market place at IMMC to promote their product." Most interviews were done by RCA's Five Star and Blow Monkeys, Phonogram's Animotion and INXS, MCA's Ready For The World and Colonel Abrams, Virgin's OMD, Sandra and Genesis, EMI's Belouis Some, Chrysalis' Paul Hardcastle and Art Of Noise, Polydor's Double, CBS' Cock Robin and Zomba's Billy Ocean. "In general", continued Abbink, "the international record community made good use of the dual opportunity with only a few acts not willing to participate. Most record companies have indicated they want to have even more presence next year and a number of US and European programmers plan to build special studio sets in order to also record lip sync television performances."

TV Promo Ensures Stardom

Carefully orchestrated use of television as a promotional tool, plus marketing strategies tailored to suit the needs of each individual country, has resulted in a remarkable pan-European success for Cock Robin, a US group signed to CBS but still barely known in their home country.

The band's first single "When

Your Heart Is Weak" went top 10 in France, Germany and Spain. The next release, "The Promise You Made", went number one (and gold) in Holland and top 10 in Germany. And the third, "Thought You Were

On My Side", is selling fast round Europe.

The group has sold more than a million singles in total worldwide outside the US, and 300,000 albums (nearing 400,000) outside their own country. The "Cock Robin" album went top 10 in Italy and Germany, and more recently has figured in the Swedish and Norwegian listings. It took that much longer, but, Promise You Made" finally made the British chart.



MUSIC GROWS AS GERMAN LEISURE ACTIVITY

New Trade Fair Highlight This Interest

The boom in music-making as a leisure time activity in West Germany, a development reflected in most European territories, has led to a new trade fair, "Musica", by the Hamburg Congress Centre. It's to be sponsored by the International Music Center, Vienna, the German Phono Academy, the Hamburg State Music Committee, and the Hamburg College of Music & Dramatic Art.

Though it is mainly for the musical instrument industry, its overall range is wide, taking in records, videos, music accessories, sheet music, music business management, performing rights and concert/tour promotion.

Says Mike von Winterfeldt, president of International Music & Video Consultants, which handles the event: "Interest in music right through Europe has never been greater. In Germany, for example, there are 7.35 million active musicians, amateur and professional, and the annual turnover of the music industry in all its aspects is around \$8 billion, which is equivalent to 1.6% of Germany's gross national product."

The fair is set for late 1987, November 12-15 Incorporated will be the presentation of the annual awards of the German record industry.

COCK ROBIN

Lisa Kramer, CBS international product manager in New York, said the Pan-European success, hopefully with Japan and Australia to follow, was a triumph of corporate teamwork and really did emphasize that Europe could be seen as one entity, not a collection of countries.

In fact, Cock Robin (four members, with two singers sharing lead, Peter Kingsbery and Anna LaCazio), played an opening set on the Bryan Adams concert at Madison Square Garden, and people at CBS were surprised at the great reception it got from an audience obviously geared for the Canadian's heavy rock style.

DUTCH FILMNET IN JEOPARDY

Filmnet, the first and so far the only Dutch pay TV company has given the pink slip to 50 of its 60 employees, including a.o. the managing director, Peter Woodward. The 50 employees are furious at the decision and they will be fighting a lawsuit to defend their case.

The reason behind this sudden move is directly linked to the ownership of Filmnet. Until last week 40% of the shares were owned by VNU, which have since been sold to Esselte, the Scandinavian multi-media company. Esselte previously partially owned a further 40% with the United Dutch Film Company under the management of Rob Houwer, and the remainder belongs to UIP, the American film company. The shares should change hands as from July 1st and

Filmnet would then be an almost non-Dutch company with Esselte owning nearly 80% of the shares.

The situation arose from a disagreement between VNU and Esselte, regarding the long term policy, the financial situation and the programming, especially as regards soft porno, which VNU was strongly against.

As a consequence Filmnet has undergone a total re-organisation. A spokesman says that they believe that Esselte will dismember Filmnet in Holland and set up a pay TV in Scandinavia. Filmnet started in March '85 and 15 months later has only 50,000 subscribers, whereas 300,000 are needed to break-even. For the present, the situation therefore remains in limbo.

HUNGARY GETS SKY

A First For The East In TV

by Peter Jones

Hungary is to become the first East European country to receive programmes from a Western satellite television network, though reception at first will be limited to hotels in Budapest and other major centres.

Sky Channel is the UK company involved and negotiations were completed last week in Budapest with the Hungarian authorities. The post office there will install the equipment needed to receive the scrambled television signal. It's expected that programmes will be received in Hungary well before the end of the year.

Until this deal, Hungarian hotels, and similar centres, have mainly provided domestic television for guests. But it now seems certain that ordinary Hungarian householders will be able to subscribe and pick up

Western programmes on community aerial systems.

Sky Channel see the development as "most important", specially as it opens up a way for other East European countries to improve television services for Western guests.

Hungary has emerged as the only East European country which hasn't objected to the likely beaming of televison signals into its territory.

Many East Germans and some Czechoslovakians receive West German and Austrian television, but their governments regret and resent the availability of such programming. And Poland bans its citizens from erecting "dishes" to receive transmissions from West Germany and France.

EURO MUSIC DAY FIGHTS PIRACY

Nana Mouskouri, Belgian singers Will Tura and Adamo and producer George Martin were among music personalities recruited in support of European Music Day in Strassbourg, June II.

The event was organized jointly by IFPI and the International Federations of Musicians & Actors, and devised to show the important role of the music industry in the cultural and economic life of Europe. It was also used to explain to Members of the European Parliament the challenges and problems facing the industry.

Through the day parliamentarians met leading industry figures and artists, with live performances by Dutch group Flairck and by members of Eurojazz, the European youth jazz orchestra. A press conference drew attention to the critical home taping

problem and the need for a royalty to compensate copyright owners for unauthorized private duplication of their works.

Ian Thomas, IFPI director general, said European Music Day was conceived "to bring home the cultural and economic importance to Europe of an industry on which 400,000 jobs depend. We want to ensure that European Parliament members understand how such problems as piracy, counterfeiting and home taping threaten the very future of Europe's Music."



GEMA SPONSORING PUBLISHERS

GEMA, the West German authors/ composers society, is offering its publisher members special low-interest loans to finance their businesses while mechanical royalty payments stay frozen because of GEMA's ongoing dispute with the German record industry organization.

Around \$42 million is currently held in escrow pending a settlement of the dispute, and this provides a massive headache for German publishers starved of ready cash for investment.

The German record industry insists GEMA is unreasonable in its demands. But Prof. Dr. Erich Schulze, head of GEMA says the society's position is dictated by the need to act in the best interests not only of its domestic members but also of its sister foreign societies.

He asks: "Why would the originators of the music be content with a smaller share of the income than those involved in production and distribution?" And GEMA members are also losing out in the private radio sector where many independent broadcasters decline to pay performance royalties, claiming that GE-MA's tariffs are too high.

Schulze admits GEMA is the "odd man out" in Europe in not having a mechanical royalty agreement with the record industry and accept that a solution of the problem could be a single collecting society for the whole of Europe.

"But," he notes, "this, of course, can't be achieved until there is a pan-European harmonization of copyright protection and royalty rates."

decline to show the programme.

Malcolm Gerrie, executive producer of The Tube and head of young people's programmes Tyne Tees Television, says that the importance of European music is growing and should be available to all. 'It is interesting that America is no longer the ultimate strong-hold of the charts and I was fascinated to meet the MTV guys at Montreux recently to discover just how keen my American colleagues are on the European scene."

Gerrie states that there is a need for the UK to be more aware of what is going on in Europe. Furthermore he adds that an antidote to the Eurovision song contest is needed as the contest, though serving a useful function, is not representative of the music scene in Europe. "We intend to show people that other kinds of music

exist and if the event is successful we would like to hold it abroad as a yearly event, featuring the best of music from the UK and abroad".

The following bands for live performance from Newcastle have been booked: Simply Red, Pet Shop Boys, Yello, Arcadia, The Leather Nun, Zodiac Mindwarp, Five Star, Mantronix, Fat Boys, Zapp and Sigue Sigue Sputnik. Also under consideration are: Psychedelic Furs, The The, Doctor And The Medics and Sandie Shaw. There will be live inserts from Wembley Stadium featuring Rod Stewart, Feargal Sharkey and Blow Monkeys.

The programme will have exclusive film footage of Eurythmics performing in L.A., an Elton John interview and profile, Simple Minds from the Ahoy in Rotterdam and Dire Straits from Wembley. Packages designed to show the best of European bands will be compiled specially for the occasion.

Another major imponderable is the likely effect on the existing commercial radio sector. Combined ILR (Independent Local Radio) advertising revenue last year was 73 million pounds, shared between nearly 50 ILR stations many of which are already in financial difficulties. Even the advertising industry admits that extra spending is unlikely to exceed 20 million pounds in the first year after Radios One and Two go commercial, so any substantial switch of advertising spend to those two stations could well mean the death knell for large part of the independent radio

Finally there is the political context to consider. The government has encouraged the notion that the British public wants to see advertising on BBC TV and Radio, but many researchers and pressure groups dispute whether this is actually the case. In the run-up to a general election Tory leaders will not want to in-

troduce any changes that might be unpopular with voters. Moreover, the opposition Labour Party has warned that one of its first moves if elected would be to return a privatised Radio One and Two to the BBC.

Management companies are one possibility, but the BPI says that even where artists or their managers might have some rights over the use of video clips they are unlikely to control broadcast rights in the sound recording.

Some leading tv rock shows are currently off air for the summer, but the BPI is now monitoring clip use across the whole UK broadcasting output. Independent tv companies have pledged to carry on as normal, but insiders believe the ITCA, representing commercial tv contractors, has accepted that some payment must be made and is prepared to negotiate.

PAN-EUROPEAN TV CAMPAIGN ON AC/DC

WEA Launches Look-a-Like Competition

USA fans are in for a major surprise during AC/DC's Madison Square concert in September when AC/DC's Angus Young will be joined by a number of look-a-likes. WEA Europe has initiated a major European marketing plot to promote AC/DC's album, Who Made Who. It revolves around the video single of the same name which features a machine "manufacturing" Angus Youngs . The video features literally dozens of Angus Youngs dressed in the famous green school boys uniform playing the guitar and performing the same movements as Angus.

The album cover is a shot of Angus relating to the video, and all European countries are carrying this visual instore by use of a large poster announcing the new LP, cassette and Compact Disc. The same visuals are used for a large square blow up being used both as a window display centre piece or on shop walls. The new album is being announced across Europe to dealers by sales forces and by TV presenters dressed in the Angus Young 'outfit'.

The band has a strong following of fans throughout Europe who are familiar with the Angus Young image and at concerts get carried away imitating his movements. WEA decided that this European fan base would respond greatly to a competition whereby youngsters could make videos of themselves imitating Angus. The videos emerging from these enthusiasts would make tremendous

entertainment for the TV stations running this competition. The TV stations involved are Music Box. Antenne 2 (France) and Videomusic (Italy). The hook to such a competition is as always the prize. In this case it will be the winner travelling to New York and coming out on stage for the opening number. The people in Madison Square Garden will expect and think that he is the real Angus Young and go crazy which will be an unforgettable experience for the winner. From the television stations' point of view the winner will be an interesting subject to interview on his return and relay to the fans what it is like to be up on stage in front of thousands of screaming fans.

I think it is great to see this rock band reaching new demographics. ARIANE FAILURE

DELAYS DBS

The destruction last week of a Euro-

pean Ariane rocket means that the west now has no satellite launcher

Ariane has orders worth 1 billion pounds to launch 43 satellites over the next three years. Last week's failure will delay the launch of the Australian 'Aussat-K3' satellite which had been scheduled for next month.

The long term effects of the disaster are not yet known. A report is currently being compiled to access the consequences. Chriet Titulaer, president Titulaer Produkties Holland, says delays in a number of projects are now inevitable. "There were already a number of difficulties due to the recent American tragedy at NASA and the satellite businesses are facing a double delay." He stated that

the French and German DBS satellites would most probably not be launched this year and that the amount of launches would be significantly reduced. "The risks are obviously much harder," he continued "and future projects due to inflated insurance will be harder to materialise."

Carlo Rock, public relations and marketing manager SES Luxembourg, said that as far as their own company is concerned, they believed their satellite would not suffer any set back. They have a contract to launch their Aftra satellite in April-May 1987, which is to be launched on Ariane 4, whereas the one that failed was Ariane 2. He said: 'We hope it will have no influence but we have to wait for the report to be published to be finally sure.''

GERMANY

After six weeks of dominating the German charts, Chris Norman is replaced by Modern Talking's Atlantis Is Calling. It is amazing, but all their singles (5 sofar) have gone to no. 1 in Germany. This successful duo also has the no. 1 album spot with Ready For Romance after only being charted for 2 weeks! Two newcomers into the top 10: Peter Gabriel and Van Halen who rise II and 13 notches respectively. Also shooting up the charts are Miami Sound Machine with Bad Boy (14-64) and Big Country with Look Away (23-41). Highest new entry are Genesis with Invisible Touch in at 30 and other entries for the Cure (Boys Don't Cry at 35) and Level 42 with Lessons In Love.

FRANCE

Stephanie sticks at 1 for the 7th week and is again followed by Sabine Paturel and Jeanne Mas whose album, Femme D'Aujourd'hui stands at no. 2 in the French album charts. Modern Talking's rise into the top 10 brings the number of German acts to 2 in the top 10 (together with Sandra); all the rest are French with the exception

of Whitney Houston. Climbing steadily up the charts are Madonna with Live To Tell (14-20). Cock Robin with The Promise You Made (15-21), George Michael (25-36) and M&M's Eurocrossover tip of last year Stephan Eicher with Two People In A Room (28-40). An unchanged top 3 in Spain headed by Modern Talking with Brother Louie and followed by Sigue Sigue Sputnik and Billy Ocean. New in the top 10 are Pet Shop Boys with Love Comes Quickly and Queen with A Kind Of Magic. The bi-lingual singer Miguel Bose, who was only signed to WEA International last week is doing very well, his Nena (from his latest LP Salamandra) this week rises to 14 from 20 and he has also entered the Italian charts this week. Two French acts enter, Stephanie with Irresistible and Jean Michel Jarre with Fourth Rendez-Vous. Also new are Patxi Andion with El General and Wham! with I'm Your Man.

SWITZERLAND

Chris Norman, after Modern Talking, Hansa's most successful artist, remains on the top for already five weeks, followed by Samantha Fox and Eros Ramazzotti. The Swiss PolyGram company enjoys a good week as all the three top 10 new-


