ENTERS UK

Europa, the satellite television channel created by five European public service broadcasting organizations, became available in the U.K. as from July 1st. By year's end, it is predicted, around 150,000 homes in Britain will be taking the service:

The European broadcasters involved are NOS (Netherlands), ARD (West Germany), RTE (Ireland), RAI (Italy) and RTP (Portugal). Europa is set to transfer to the European Space Agency's experimental satellite Olympus when it is launched some time late 1987.

GEMA FIGURES REVEAL UPTURN

Foreign Income Lagging Behind

by Wolfgang Spahr

West German copyright society GEMA collected some £160 million in 1985, an upturn of 5.1% on the previous year and a reflection of the way the German record industry has recovered from at least three years of decline.

Sales of disks and pre-recorded tapes were up 10.1% in value terms in Germany last year. Though the first quarter this year was disappointing, the upward trend is expected to continue through past Christmas.

Of GEMA's successful 1985 returns, soundcarrier sales accounted for 35.6% of the total, radio/television for 27.5% and performances for 10.4%. The VCR hardware levy in Germany accounted for 2% of the amount.

However, the balance of payments situation with the rest of the world is still not impressive. Foreign earnings of GEMA members accounted for just

NMS 7 Explores Euro-Market

1986 has seen a steady and confident growth of continental European talent crossing borders. Germany has kept its traditional role as supplier of European hits, followed by Italy and Austria

Although a common European Music Market as such does not exist yet, and will probably, due to cultural differences; never be completely established, all signs tend in the same direction: the phenomenon of Eurocrossover is becoming widespread. Partly due to the advent of European satellite services like Music Box and Sky Channel, the exploitation possibilities for local companies increased and in fact many of them have established considerable interest after having their video clips shown on one of these satellite channels.

At the moment the European media situation is in a constant state of change with private radios mush-rooming and new European satellites scheduled to be launched in '87. The

5-piece Swedish pop act with their follow-up to 'Let Us Dance A Little Bit More', one of our Euro-Crossover pick-ups this summer and currently getting good radio reactions in France at the moment (licensed on Vogue). 'When The Night' is a winsome pop tune backed up with some fine melodic arrangements (issue 1). Single entered French and German charts.

Stephan Eicher - Two People In A Room (WEA) G-A-S.

publ. Electric Unicorn, tel. (Switzerland) 1-2411911. Master owner: WEA for GAS countries; PolyGram rest of Europe

25 year old Swiss based multi-instrumentalist with a well-arranged pop song featuring Eicher's slightly romantic voice. Eicher debuted in the band which had a good hit with "Eisbeer" in GAS. Album just entered the Swiss charts this week and a major campaign in '86 for the rest of Europe will follow. Watch out for a strong new talent (issue 1).

Single is now breaking into the French market (through Barclay).

Aina - Any Kind Of Love (Polydor) Norway

publ. Terrytunes/Myjha. Master owner; contact Fred Engh at Polydor, 2-37295.

Good looking 21 year-old Norwegian in a production by renowed producer Mike Vernon (Fleetwood Mac/Level 42). Pop/rock ditty backed by good vocals and styleful arrangements (a.o. Pete Wingfield on keyboards). From the LP Target Practice on which Mark King (Level 42) and Paul Young's Royal Family are amongst the session musicians (issue 8).

Phonogram International picked up the rights for the whole of Europe.

Bruce And Bongo - Geil (Rush Records) Germany

publ.and master owner: contact Brian Varter at Rush, tel.:2101-60040.

Disco rap with nonsense lyrics ('everybody geil, Boris Becker is geil', etc.) Two crazy Englishmen living in Berlin who intend to offend nobody with the title ("Geil" is a rather an dubious word in some languages) but are just very c(h)orny. First reactions on German radio are very encouraging and the record is licensed for Greece, but free for the rest of Europe. Echt Geil! (issue 9).

Whole of Europe went complety geil: No. 1 in Germany (4 weeks in a row) and Austria, Top 10 in Switzerland and Top 20 in Denmark, Italy, France and Benelux! Just out in the UK through EMI Columbia, At the very moment the band is on a UK promo tour (a.o. appearances for Sky/Music Box).

Gemini - Just Like That (Polar) Sweden publ. Manuscript. Master owner: Polar, tel 8-215333.

Duo consisting of the brother and sister Karin and Anders Glenmark, the backing singers for the Chess musical. For this record the co-operation with Abba's Bjorn Ulvaes and Benny Andersson is continued and the result is a medium-paced ballad (written by Ulvaes and Andersson) that has all the qualities to chart; chrystal-clear vocals, an easy and very comfortable production with a sense of sophistication that is hard to match. A formula top 40 song (issue 11).

Out on Polydor Int.; a hit in the Benelux and good airplay in the rest of Europe (notably UK).

Trance Dance - Do The Dance (CBS) Sweden

publ. and master owner: contact George Reispass at CBS, tel. 8-980250.

Infectious percussion-driven pop by a multi-national foursome. Youthful hedonism in a colourful Modern Romance-type of production (done by the son of Motorhead's Lemmy, Paul Inder) (issue 17). Clip was shown several times on Sky Trax and Music Box and the band is still one of CBS' priority acts.

Bo Katzman Gang - Working On The Galley (EMI) Switzerland publ. Musik Music, master owner: EMI, contact Teddy Meier, tel. 1-4910010; tlx. 822150.

Very popular Swiss quartet who are receiving heavy airplay and entered the Swiss charts last week at 25. Hard Rock intro moves into an Opus-like pop single with a good timey chorus. Single deserves to be released by EMI all over Europe. Germany has already committed itself to release the single and the upcoming album ('Katz-people') around autumn this year. An instant pop radio add that has huge potential to cross over (issue 24). Single still building. Other EMI companies should release now: the ideal summer hit!

Hubert Kah - Limousine (Blow-Up/Intercord) Germany Publ. Moon On You (Miau Musik). Master owner: Intercord, tel. 711470050

German singer who used to have hits in Germany like 'Rosemarie' and 'Engel 07' (on Polydor). With help of Sandra producer Michael Cretu (and co-producer Armand Volker) and sessions musicicans like Curt Cress, Kah comes up with his most commercial effort as of yet. Accessible and danceable pop disco plus a catchy chorus effectively backed by a female choir. From the LP 'Tensongs' (issue 25). Single entered the German charts straight in at 24 and is currently at 28. Very good airplay; other European

territories should consider a release.

Not particularly new talent, as this English singer already had a huge hit in 1969 with Where Do You Go To My Lovely, an evergreen all over the world and still being played in various golden oldie programmes. Now 17 years later he is back and hasn't lost anything of his impact. Inspired by the 25th anniversary of Hemingway's death, the song will definitely appeal to a lot of age groups, especially the over 40s. Strong reactions on German radio at the moment and Sarstedt will do four German tv shows in June (issue 22) Artist just concluded a succesful promo tour in Germany. LP will be recorded in September (by Frank Jansen and Johan Daansen). Interest from Mega Denmark.

Richenel - L'Esclave Endormi (Megadisc) Holland

publ. Allo Musique/Roadster Music. Master owner: contact Rik Urmel at Megadisc, tel. 20-642223. Dutch indie Megadisc with the first release of Amsterdam body artist Richenel, who plays, both in visual and lyrics, with the man/woman image. This is a colourful and exotic production against which the tormented, opera-like vocals appear to full advantage. Too eccentric for Top 40 programmers, but a must for those on the look out for something different. UK indie 4AD will release this product. Master and publ. is available on the Continent excl. Benelux (issue 2).

A very commercial single, aiming at the mainstream Top 40 market. Strong vocals in a synthesizerdominated production. A sound evoking comparisons with Abba, which isn't surprising since the son of Abba's Benny Andersson, Peter Gronvall, produces and writes most of the songs for SOM and nearly plays all the instruments. SOM is one of the 3 acts that Alpha has for the Swedish finals for the Eurovision Song Contest. If they win, they could take Europe by storm (issue 4). CNR signed for Holland.

Video Kids - Satellite (Break Records) Holland

The/follow-up to the highly successful 'Woodpeckers From Space' (selling over 1.3 million copies all around the world, but failing to make impact in its home country). Lots of hip hop vocal effects against a driving and infectious synthi-beat. A guaranteed hit (issue 7).

Dingo - The House Without A Name (Bang Trax) Finland

English translation of the song 'Autiotalo', a huge success for this extremely popular Finnish 5-piece band on which we already wrote several times. They have it all: good looks, self-penned material and a mention in the Finnish issue of the Guiness Book Of Records for sales figures of over 170,000 copies of their 2nd album (making it the best selling LP ever in Finland). This accessible pop single with a strong beat, will be reaeased through Sonet in Scandinavia and the UK. Watch out! (issue 9).

Paris Biz - Black And Blue (Really Blue) (Mekano Records) Sweden

There are quite some good singles around to heat up your playlist. What's the Color Of Money is the cogent question posed by Hollywood Beyond, a new signing for WEA UK. This act is a pen-name for the Birmingham piano-player Mark Rodgers. Produced by Pet Shop Boys' producer, Stephen Hague, the single is a peculiar mix of pop styles from folk to middle-eastern influences, backed up by a military drum, along the lines of Talking Heads' Road To Nowhere. An auspicious debut.

As a taster for her forthcoming album Destiny, Chaka Khan releases her new single Love Of A Lifetime this week. The song was specially written for her by Green Gartside and David Gamson of Scritti Politti. A sophisticated hot funker and with its flip floppy guitars and the solid synthesizer bass lines it will surely pick up lots of attention.

The best British soul single to appear for a very long time is from the black trio View From The Hill with their debut single No Conversation for EMI (although it is a re-recording; it originally appeared on Survival Records). With its warm and mellow vocals, the modest but styleful arrangements and the fine sax-solo of Island artists Courtney Pine, the single is a recommended must for every Euro dj. Add it now!

Please also consider the new singles by Jack Bruce, In Tua Nua and The Bangles. Jack Bruce, the bass-player in the 60's formation Cream, has recorded a new version of that band's 5 successfull song I Feel Free. The original version was a hit in 1966 and the new version will be used as the theme tune of a major television advertising campaign to launch the new Renault 21 car. Bangles re-released their Going Down To Liverpool single written by Kimberley Crew of Katrina & The Waves and containing that famous sentence 'Hey where are you going with that UB40 in your hand?' If there is any room left on your playlist consider the 7-piece Irish band In Tua Nua who released their debut single for Virgin entitled Seven Into The Sea. Fronted by lead vocalist Leslie Dowdell, the group combines epic Irish Rock with instrumentation and accessible interesting melodies

UB40 have a new single out entitled Sing Our

Own Song, an anti-Apartheid single featuring a.o. Ruby Turner and Jaki Graham on backing vocals. The chorus features the ANC slogan 'Amandla Awethu' meaning 'power is ours'. One week after its release it is already the highest entry in the European Airplay Top 50 this week, entering at 30.

Other new additions to the Airplay Top 50 for DeBarge, Limahl (a re-entry), Sly Fox, Katrina & The Waves and Art Of Noise. Wham! remain on top of the European Airplay for the second week and also in the Hot 100 they make an enormous jump from 10 to 3 this week. It is Madonna who is already for 7 consecutive weeks at the top of the Hot 100 Singles with Live To Tell. This makes her, together with Survivor's Burning Heart, the longest no. 1 runner of 1986.

Staying in that same Hot 100 Singles, Bananarama make a good move (5-8) and new in the Top 10 is On My Own by Patti Labelle & Michael McDonald (10-21). There are good moves for Samantha Fox (15-18), Modern Talking (16-20), Dr. & The Medics (17-37) Madonna (18-24) and Eurythmics (20-52).

Of the Eurocrossover productions the Italian medley P Machinery mixed with Frankie's Relax is the best selling one and with good positions in Germany and France the single shoots up in the Hot 100 (25-35).

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

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

TRUE REVENGE

Rock is the best Revenge... That is at least the motto for Eurythmics' fifth studio album for RCA. A hard driving rock sound dominates most of the tracks. Preceded by the excellent single When Tomorrow Comes (a typical sleeper; it grows after each play) the duo continues their fast-pulsating rock slant in tracks like In This Town, Missionary Man and Let's Go!, of which especially the latter 2 with their J. Geils-like harmonica parts are obvious single stand outs. And further recommended tracks like The Miracle Of Love, a rather conventional but emotional ballad, the resentful Thorn In My Side and the dreamy I Remember You (with its Beatles-esque orchestration) make Annie Lennox and Dave Stewart the elite of today's pop music. A definite retail burner and expect a high entry in the Hot 100 next week.

And it will be a crowded Hot 100 as Warner Brothers officially released Madonna's latest alburn True Blue last week (June 30). Produced by ex-boyfriend Stephen Bray and Patrick Leonard, Madonna explores new musical pathways as exemplified in True Blue, a lovely sixties pop tune with a touch of Motown, the Spanish / Mexican leanings in La Isla Bonita or the festive calypso feel in Love Makes The World Go Round. Other tunes like Jimmy Jimmy (a seemingly innocent poppy track), the dance-floor hit Open Your Heart (on which husband Sean Penn will make his debut as video director) will make it happen: another album full of hits that is sure to crack the Hot 100 next week. Read next week's M&M for a detailed report on WEA's European marketing campaign on this lp.

Swiss harpist Andreas Vollenweider releases his fourth album for CBS entitled Down

To The Moon, the follow-up to the highly successful lp's Behind The Gardens, Caverna Magica and White Winds. Although Vollenweider always emphases the acoustics, his use of electronics, albeit hardly perceptible, add up to a richly textured album with delicate harmonies and layer-upon-layer melodies. Apart from the general pop market this outing will easily tie in with the upcoming New Age market.

Lovely miss Randy Crawford is back with a new album for Warner Brothers entitled Abstract Emotions. With the help of Reggie Lucas (of Madonna's first album), the Nightingale of pop offers a balanced set of relaxed midtempo material and smooth ballads. With her unmistakable and distinctive voice Crawford knows how to impress in tracks like Betcha, Can't Stand The Pain, Gettin' Away With Murder and Don't Wanna Be Normal (which already appeared on the US-only OST Wildcats). Also check out the demure ballad Almaz.

Class Of '55 is a tribute and homecoming to the city of Memphis where the rock 'n roll legends Carl Perkins, Jerry Lee Lewis, Roy Orbison and Johnny Cash grouped together in the famous Sun Recording Studio. All of them produced their first hits for producer Sam Phillips and created a new style of music that was called Rockabilly back in the fifties. A remarkable track is Big Train (From Memphis), a 7-minute joyful tribute to the city where it all began, written by John Fogerty and backed up by many famous additional musicians like the Judds, June Carter, the late great Ricky Nelson, Fogerty and Dave Edmunds.



French 4-channel TDF-1, the Luxembourg-based 16-channel tv-satellite Astra, the recently established merge of Music Box and Superchannel, the multi-lingual tv-channel Europa TV, the European DBS satellites, all make the possibilities for promoting European talent a less tedious task than before.

There is a challenging task ahead for European programmers; in the coming years the European media picture will drastically change and the fate of Euro-talent is closely connected with that change.

Although England rules the waves when it comes to breaking talent across the Atlantic, continental European productions are definitely on their way for equal success. The example of Falco's Rock Me Amadeus hitting the top of the Billboard Hot 100 and passing platinum status in the US

use or more depending on negotiations with specific companies.

The French situation is perhaps the most complex, with a basic rate of 9.6 dollars per million inhabitants per clip per screening but varying rates for the Canal Plus, La Cinq and TV6 private channels. Canal Plus charged between 105 dollars and 263 dollars per clip per screening up until the end of June this year, depending on the number of broadcasts paid for, but now levies a simple 197 dollar per clip per screening fee which will rise by 10% increments as subscriber numbers grow beyond agreed thresholds. La Cinq and TV6 also operate sliding fees which rise at three month intervals. The former currently charges 88 dollars per clip per screening, the latter

UK TAPE LEVY BATTLE TURNING SOUR

Britain's blank tape manufacturers have bought a series of controversial full-page advertisements in "The Times" newspaper in a late bid to stop the government going ahead with plans for a home-taping levy.

The main point of the advertisements is to put across a public image of the record industry as wealthy but greedy. One headline goes: "Poor to pay rich £12 million". That is a reference to the annual amount expected to be raised by imposition of a 10% levy on blank tape prices. It goes on: "Oppose the tape levy; it's a gift to the greedy".

In another ad, home taping is described as "a harmless activity", while record company executives are pictured "the fat cats of music", or "the moguls of music". Members of the public who are against the idea of a levy are invited to contact the Tape Manufacturers' Group, which placed the ads. Those who do are sent a brochure headed: "Wrong in principle, unworkable in practice: why the government should say no to home taping levy".

It all reflects the bitterness in the battle between the two sides, record industry and blank tape firms. The British Phonographic Industry (BPI) has taken legal advice on the advertising campaign, believing parts of it could be proved libellous. And representatives of music industry groups, including the BPI and the Musicians' Unions, plus copyright societies, are working on a counter action, possibly a jointly financed promotion.

Members of the Tape Manufacturers' Group are: Agfa, BASF, Memorex, Maxell, TDK, 3M, Panasonic, JVC, Sony, Fuji and Kodak. There is a collective fear in the group that the proposed audio tape levy could one day be used to impose a similar levy on blank video tapes. TMG won't say what budget they are working to for their campaign, but it is certainly well over the £100,000 mark.

According to the advertising agency hired by TMG, the intention is "to create such a general stink that Members of Parliament will not possibly be able to pass the levy bill when it gets its first reading in the next session of Parliament".

terest than we had expected". Mike Haas of BCI Consultants and Astra satellite sales chief Marcus Bicknell were both satisfied with the contact they made. Howard Mullinack from Orban Associates of San Francisco said: "About 15-20% of the people I met were from outside Germany, many from Belgium but also Sweden, Austria, Israel, even the UK. We're here to show the Europeans how to broadcast more effectively and competitively, and we're satisfied."

In addition to the exhibition, 'Broadcast '86' produced a series of panel discussions which lived up to expectations, showcasing the view of many of the German-speaking market's media heavyweights, such as Gerd Bacher of Austrian Radio, Bertelsmann director Manfred Lahnstein and ZDF-TV boss Dieter Stolte. Concluded RFB's Demarest: "At the moment, the Germans are talking a loid about the media but they're not doing much." That seemed to characterize the new 'Broadcast '86' fair.

NEW ELECTRIC ON FM

Jean-Pierre D'Amico, formerly of NRJ, has formed a new radio station on the FM wavelength in Paris. Called Electric, the radio will feature music, sports and news. The musical input will consist of current hits alternating with hits from the last 10 years and the hitparade will be composed entirely of new singles. Electric is partially financed by the world-wide construction firm Bouygues.

The suggested selling off of Radio 1 and 2 has already created tremendous controversy. The committee thinks BBC Radio should concentrate on providing healthy public service broadcasting on Radio 3 and 4.

Also suggested is a £10 car radio licence - and the linking of the BBC radio/tv licence to the retail price index for the next 10 years.

Other points include: the establishment of a new body to create and finance cultural television programmes that might not otherwise be produced in the free market; programme makers should not face censorship or interference other than that required by existing law of Britain; potential saving by setting up a single transmitter body should be checked out, for at present the BBC and the Independent Broadcasting Authority are responsible for their own transmitters and transmission.

Another controversial point is the recommendation that existing broad-casting organizations should be required to take a minimum percentage of their programmes from independent producers, the quota rising steadily until it hit a minimum of 40% in 10 years.

The next phase in the Peacock Committe saga is debate, and probably a great deal of it, in Parliament.

(worldwide the single and the album Falco III reached 24 golden and platinum awards) is a clear example of this trend.

This outstanding success should be seen not just as a one-off situation but it will definitely open the way for similar inroads into the North American marketplace by German-speaking acts. That's the view of Teldec's, Germany, managing director Thomas Stein, after returning from a US visit with Falco and the singer's manager Horst Bork.

Stein said he had assurances that the American market is open to German-originated product, though placing overseas product there is no easier. "The Americans are so busy with the large amount of their own domestic product that it needs really exceptional recordings to establish a European artist there. But Falco's success has proved the Americans are even prepared to accept German language lyrics, provided the sound and rhythm are exciting. These qualities are more important to the record buyers than the lyrics."

1986 proved to be a successful year for other continental European productions hitting the American charts including Norwegian A-Ha (with two singles hitting the Hot 100; The Sun Always Shines On TV and Take On Me), Italian singer Baltimora, Austrian act Opus with Live Is Life, Dutch female trio Mai Tai and Spanish production Magazine 60 with Don Quichotte.

From the very beginning Music & Media has kept a close eye on the development of continental European talent. The weekly New Talent page presents new releases with international cross-over potential and M&M introduced singles by A-Ha, Jennifer Rush, Baltimora, Opus, Falco, Sandy Marton, Double, Sandra, Modern Talking and many others to the International Music Trade long before they became major international hits. This year's New Music Seminar (NMS), this year held for the 7th time in New York, will highlight the growing importance of the European Music Market in several of its international panels.

On page 10 and 11 in this issue the interested reader can find an overview of the most successful New Talent tips of 1986. Since the inception of this column last year, many European record companies have reported using it extensively with subsequent rewarding results. M&M intends to maintain a careful look at the up-coming European talents and as such it is a major source for new talents.

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PEACOCK REPORT CAUSES GOVERNMENT SPLIT

Independent TV's Up For Auction?

The Peacock Committee, set up to look into the financing of British radio/television broadcasting, has reportedly caused a government top-level split by some of its recommendations which, as widely forecast, include the selling off of Radio 1 and 2, the BBC music networks.

But it is the suggestion that all 15 independent television franchises should be put up for auction when the next franchise round is due in 1988 that has prompted Douglas Hurd, the Home Secretary and responsible for broadcasting policy, to urge the rejection of several Peacock recommendations.

The committee's report aims, in a three-phase process, to take broad-casting completely into the free market by the end of the century. That would mean that individual television programmes can be bought by

consumers

In the first phase the BBC continues with the licence fee as main source of funding and would not be required to take advertising on television. In the second "chapter", depending on technological developments, whole channels would be transmitted in such a way that only viewers subscribing to the service would receive a picture. In essence, viewers would buy a channel of programmes in the way they buy a series of stories in a magazine.

And the third phase, suggests Peacock, would be when the consumer is able to buy individual programmes with a form of "computerised credit card.". By then, says the committee, there would be a free market of programmes and broadcasting would be liberated.

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BROADCAST '86 KICKS OFF TO MIXED RESPONSES

German Trade Fair Attracts 4,000 Participants

Frankfurt- Broadcast '86, Germany's first trade fair for the electronic media, opened in Frankfurt to a mixed response from participants. Most major manufacturers and the giant state-chartered stations stayed away. Some smaller firms and many service companies were satisfied, however. Up to 5,000 visitors had been expected, with 140 companies represented at 90 stands.

Although the exhibit hail clearly was not bustling with business most of the time, Rolph-Harvey Pulina of the Frankurt Fair Co. said 4,000 showed up. "Considering the short time in which this first fair was put together, we were extremely satisfied. We will continue in 1988, rotating the Montreux fair on a bi-annual basis." Organizer promises of "Europe's Counterpart To America's NAB" were not

fulfilled. "The name 'Broadcast '86' promised a lot more than was delivered", commented Ludolf von Angern of Ampex, a firm which showed up only after being offered a free stand. Like Bosch, Sony and many others, he says Ampex opted for this fall's Photokina in Cologne instead. "Many feel that with Brighton and Montreux, there is no need for a new fair", said Von Angern. NAB veteran Rick Demarest of Radio Free Europe noted: "Nobody went to sell anything, just to exhibit and talk. Most STNA stands just handed out catalogues. Except for Otari, the Japanese weren't there, nor were Studer or AKG". He termed the opening party a "disaster".

Much more enthusiastic was Barbara Dickmann of Bertelsmann's UFA Radio, who reported "much more in-

POSSIBILITIES GERMAN CABLES UNDERDEVELOPED

Only 500,000 households in West Germany can receive the nation's new private television programmes via cable, though a total 4.7 million homes can theoretically be linked.

Since there is no federal media law in Germany, and the individual states can decide who will be permitted to watch the private programmes, they are not being fed automatically into the postal cable net covering the whole federal republic. This problem should be solved by the end of the year but even so the estimated break-even point for private programme suppliers is said to be five million households.

Owners of older television sets, lacking the necessary additional gadgetry, can't receive the private tv output anyway.

The number of programme suppliers and the volume of programmes available is decreasing, but the prospects for programmes broadcast are comparatively good. This could prove the overnight salvation for private television suppliers. According to a survey by the postal authorities, virtually every city with 100,000 or more population still has one or more empty channels, so that conservative estimates are that eight million households could be reached by aerial links.

Local city stations with low power availability could cover the city and immediate area, but private programmes of several hours' duration would be too expensive for them. Now it is seen that a collaboration of local and network suppliers could, for example, lead to a two-hour local programme to fit within a 12-hour network programme.

RTL-Plus and SAT-I are energetically preparing for this situation by concluding deals with local daily newspapers. Technically some cities could start broadcasting in 1987. Currently there are four Germanlanguage network programmes in the country, three foreign-language network programmes and eight local suppliers.

According to a joint statement from Tyne Tees and the BPI, the agreement marks a new and harmonious relationship between the two parties. It permits unlimited use of videos on Tyne Tees programmes for Channel Four and ITV (network and regional). The agreement will last until 30th April 1987 and the sum involved is being disclosed by neither side.

Tyne Tees television said today (July Ist): "The agreement is as good as any currently operating in the field of UK broadcasting. The BPI has stated its appreciation of Tyne Tees television's initiative and are as delighted as we are that the deadlock has been

Andrea Wonfor, director of programmes commented: "Everybody gains from this agreement - Tyne Tees, the music industry and above all, the viewer. We are glad to have been able to conclude an agreement which safeguards our music interest and keeps ITV in the forefront of popular music".

Patrick Isherwood, BPI legal adviser said today: "The most important thing we wished to establish was the principle of payment and this has been done. Also, the actual level of payment has in some way to reflect the value we place in our product: and although we did not expect in one year to achieve everything we sought, this agreement goes a long way to meeting our negotiating figure.

GEMA now has almost 18,000 members, with 1,688 new ones registering in 1985, and publishers comprise just over 10% of the membership.

The society is to launch a "Made In Germany" campaign in a bid to promote national repertoire, with details and documentation on some 1,500 successful home-produced songs and works going to radio stations nationwide. It's aimed particularly as "the new generation of programme planners", says Josef Bamberger, UFA publishing chief, who is organizing the campaign.

But a continuing problem for GEMA is that its long-running battle with IFPI over mechanical royalty levels is unlikely to be ended this year The record industry has already paid £30 million into a blocked account pending settlement. A Sumpreme Court hearing is set for November 27, but there's no real prospect of a prompt decision.

EUROPE REACHING COMMON CLIP POLICY

Overview On Video Payments

by Nick Robertshaw

According to IFPI's latest update on music video tariffs, almost all major European markets now have agreements in place. West Germany has the highest rates, at 410 dollars per screening for clips up to four minutes in length, and 614 dollars for those between four and ten minutes. Extract up to 45 seconds for hitparade type programmes cost 38.5 dollars. The lowest rates, reflecting population size, are those in Ireland, where a first screening costs 65 dollars and subsequent screenings 44 dollars, and in Switzerland, where charges are 48.3

dollars per clip per screening in Italian-speaking regions and 72.5 dollars in French- or German-speaking areas

Among Scandinavian countries, Norway charges 198 dollars per clip but permits unlimited screening, Sweden charges 130 dollars per clip for a single screening and a bargain 196 dollars for two screenings, Finland charges 114 dollars per clip for a first screening and 57 dollars for each subsequent showing, and Denmark 36 dollars per minute per screening, with private channel Weekend charging only 3.6 dollars per minute.

Austria's tariffs are 156 dollars per clip per screening up to four minutes and 234 dollars between four and ten minutes, while broadcasters in Belgium are charged a flat 91 dollars per clip per screening.

Under the terms of a two-year agreement effective since the beginning of 1986 Holland charges a sliding scale of between 36 dollars and 160 dollars per clip depending on lenght. 30% and 70% discounts are allowed for first and second broadcasts by the same company, and a 50% discount for repeats after two weeks, regardless of the broadcaster. Italy operates a tariff of 175 dollars for first screenings and 187 dollars for each screening thereafter applicable to all clips up to 10 minutes in length, and the private Grupo Berlusconi pays the same under a 12 month deal. Round-The-Clock music service video music pays 730 dollars per clip for three months continued on page 26

ASTRA THREATENS TDF-1

Frankfurt- In what is seen as a major and direct competition to the French four-language channel TDF-I, Marcus Bicknell, commercial director of the Luxembourg based company Societe Europeene des Satellites (SES), presented his views on the Astra satellite at the recently held Broadcast fair in Frankfurt last week (June 26).

Bicknell was one of the panellists on a session on the development of private radios in Germany. Other participants included a.o Helmut Thoma of RTL Plus, Marie-Luise Grosse-Peclum of Sky Channel, Manfred Lahnstein of Bertelsmann and Juergen Doetz of SATI.

"Other than the French satellite TDF-I, we are not dependant on any political decisions and on top of that we have sixteen channels to offer on which several companies have already shown considerable interest." Swedish company Scansat is one of the interested parties and recently the media magnate Robert Maxwell has shown interest in using the medium-power satellite as well (probably due to the

political problems surrounding TDF-1, Maxwell has given up hope of ever using the DBS satellite).

"Astra can be picked up by using a 85 cm dish (costing not more than the price of a video recorder), and the cross-shaped footprint covers at least 70% of the European population", says Bicknell. He said he was hoping for an audience of twenty million in two to three years.

SES is a private company set-up last year March by eleven European shareholders including different Luxembourg and German banks plus some Scandinavian companies including Kirkbi A.S., the owner of Lego. SES only exploits the satellite and provides the technology, the programming is up to the interested clients who should pay five million dollars a year, on a five year contract.

The failure of the Ariane launch last month, does not have any serious repercussions for SES as the company is negociating for an earlier slot next year.

CABLE INCREASE IN PARIS

Paris- At a recent press conference held here, Bernard Pons, President of Paris-Cable, the local exploitation society and Michel Penon, director general, declared that within the next few months cable would be a reality for Parisians. As from first October 30,000 households are expected to be able to receive fifteen channels on cable t.v. This figure is expected to grow to 80,000 by the beginning of 1987 and to multiply steadily after that.

For a fee of only 140 francs, the Parisians will be receiving amongst other channels TFI, A2, FR3, TV5, Canal J, Superchannel and Europa.

Pons and Penon are currently actively involved in a publicity campaign to encourage the advent of the cable system stating as some of the advantages: multiplication of programmes, quality of sound and picture and the basic simplicity of the system. The Paris cable society hopes to have recouped their finances after six years.

Launched in October last year, Europa claims it is carried in 3.3 million homes through Europe, including some I.4 million in Holland. In Portugal, the channel is being re-broadcast on the country's second national channel.

It seems certain that Britain's cable television companies, small though they are in number at this stage, will take the Europa channel, which basically concentrates on sports programmes, news and current affairs. Coming soon from Europa is a business programme with a full Pan-European content.

Apart from Madonna, there is another lady who is doing very well in her second week; Samantha Fox's new single Do Ya Do Ya shoots up from 24 to 12. Other good moves for Midnight Star (17-29) and The Real Roxanne (18-31).

GERMANY /

Already 4 weeks at no.1, Modern Talking's Atlantis is Calling, this week followed by Lessons In Love by Level 42. Nu Shooz creep up to 4 (coming from 7) and Wham!'s The Edge Of Heaven is dying to enter the top 10 next week (13-68!). M&M New Talent tip Limousine by Hubert Kah moves up again (21-28) and after the UK, Benelux, Sweden, Finland and Ireland, now also Germany wants to know what it's like to be 'On Your Own': LaBelle's duet with McDonald is highest entry this week at 23. Other entries for Dr. & The Medics (29), Eurythmics (43), Pet Shop Boys with Opportunities (44), DAF (54) with their version of Voulez Vous Coucher Avec Moi and Austrian Erste Algemeine Verunsicherung (56) with their new single Heisse Nachte In Palermo.

On the albums front Rod Stewart has highest entry at 25 and other entries for Big Country's The Seer (46), Patti Labelle (55), OST Labyrinth (57) and Andreas Vollenweider with his new album Down To The Moon (64).

FRANCE

Female supremacy of tinues in France with three female acts topping the charts for the 5th week, headed by Stephanie who seems to be irreplaceable. She is at 1 for the 10th week and is again followed by Jeanne Mas and Sabine Paturel. Last week's highest new entry Images with Les Demons De Nuit is zooming up the charts (14-27) and also doing very well are Diana Ross' Chain Reaction (19-29), Prince's Kiss (24-32) and Jean Michel Jarre (32-45). Entries for Spagna with Easy Lady and Indochine with the follow-up to 3eme Sexe, Tes Yeux Notrs.

HOLLAND

For the 3rd week at no. 1, Janet Jackson, followed by Patti LaBelle & Michael McDonald and the fast moving single Lessons In Love by Level 42 (3-6). Wham! are celebrating their farewell fairly impressively and everywhere in Europe the single is shooting up. In Holland The Edge Of Heaven crashes top 10 (4-11). Two more newcomers in the top 10 include David Bowie (9-15) and Samantha Fox (10-14). Fast moving singles for Madonna (13-32), Venus (17-25), Sheila E.'s Holly Rock (18-29) and highest entry for Modern Talking's Atlantis Is Calling.

After the UK and Ireland, Holland is the first country to chart **Owen Paul**'s *My Favourite Waste Of Time* and with the video on good rotation on the Dutch pop programmes, the single enters at 39. The new Eurythmics' album was released in Holland last Thursday (June 26th) and the single, *When Tomorrow Comes*, is new at 35.

ITALY >

Madonna not only continues to top the Italian charts with Live To Tell, her Papa Don't Preach is also the sole new entry this week. An incredible move for Wham! whose The Edge Of Heaven shouts up to 5 from 27. Other good moves for Sandy Marton's Modern Lovers (Il-18), Modern Talking's Atlantis (I2-29), Tom Hooker's Looking For Love and Samantha Fox's Touch Me(I7-28).

SPAIN Y

Stephanie replaces Modern Talking from the top position and still at 3 comes popular local duo, Victor Manuel & Ana Belen (their LP, Para La Ternure Siempre Hay Tiempo, meaning 'There is always time for tenderness' is now for the 5th consecutive week no. 1 of the album charts). Two new additions to the top 10 for Eartha Kitt's This Is My Life and C.C. Catch's Cause You Are Young. Highest new entry for Sigue Sigue Sputnik's 21st Century Boy (21). The band is very popular in Spain at the moment, their Love Missile remained at no. 1 for 3 weeks. Other entries for Simple Minds' All The Things She Said and Simply Red with Jericho.

SWITZERLAND

For the 3rd week at no. 1 is Samantha Fox with Touch Me followed by Johnny Nash with Rock

Me Baby and Chris Norman's Midnight Lady. The fastest moving single at the moment is Bananarama's rendition of Venus shooting up the Swiss charts (5-27). Another fast mover for Gabriel's Sledgehammer and highest entry for local act 4-You with I Was Made For Loving You on Bellaphon Records. Other entries for ex-New Talent tip Working On The Galley by Bo Katzman Gang, Cock Robin's The Promise You Made and Limahl with Love In Your Eyes. Bubbling under ('Wartepositione'): Genesis, Level 42, Wham!, Sandra and Krypton with Tokyo Girl.

DENMARK V

Two football related records keep on topping the Danish charts. VM Holdet (the national Danish football team) sticks at 1 with Re-sepp-ten, a tribute to the Danish football coach Sepp ('Re-seppten' is a funny way of writing recipes). It is one of the best selling local singles ever, and sales have already exceeded 150,000. The single even entered the Swedish charts this week. At 2 Danskholdet maintain their position with Let's Fight. For this record a lot of local artist team together to do a tribute to the Danish football team.

Wham! sticks at 3, followed by Rod Stewart's Love Touch and Alphaville. The rest of the top 30 is rather static and the first entry at 24 is for A-Ha's Hunting High And Low.

SWEDEN


Europe, the Swedsh band that won a New Talent contest in 1982, and now, 3 1/2 years later they are topping both the singles and album charts with The Final Countdown. We already wrote enthusiastically about their album in issue 25 and it is about time for a European breakthrough. Samantha Fox sticks at 2 and at 3 comes the Danish formation VM Holdet who have their single Re-seppten straight in. A good mover for Italian disco duo Scotch, their Mirage single moves into top 10 (4-10). A very good move for Eurythmics (5-19) and 2nd best entry for Level 42's Lessons In Love.

Apart from Europe, Peter Gabriel, Whitney Houston, Genesis (straight in at 4) and local singer Carola occupy the top 5 of the albums chart. Second best entry for Alphaville's latest album Afternoons in Utopia new at 7.


