Swiss Private Radios Are Ready For Advertisers

Research Unveils Penetration Figures

Private Broadcasting was introduced in Switzerland late 1983. Until now, no reliable or definitive statistics on the popularity of the various stations, private or government-owned, have been available.

Research studies published by the Swiss Broadcasting Association (SRG) and the Private Association for Media Research (WEMF) have arrived at incompatible conclusions. The result: the consumer industries have been reluctant to book commercial space as offered by the private broadcasters. The government-owned DRS programmes still carry no



French Tape Levy Evokes Mixed Reactions

Since the end of September, blank tapes have cost more in France, as a result of legislation passed in the summer which provided for a royalty of two francs an hour of audiocassette playing time and three francs for videotapes (with VAT included).

The levy, applied to help protect the rights of authors and composers hard hit by the proliferation of private copying, is already creating serious misgivings within the blank tape

Gaston Borgoltz, president of BASF, says the introduction of the levy will almost certainly result in a decline in sales. He says the Swedish experience is a prime example, where the levy (smaller than in France) is operating and sales have declined for

Superchannel Schedule Shaping Up

Early details of the programming schedules of Superchannel, the British satellite TV operation aimed at the pan-European market, are filtering through to the industry, though the company itself insists nothing has been finalised - not even the anticipated launch-date of mid to late January 1987 for its 24-hours service.

But insiders say the schedule which will be presented to advertisers and their agencies will include a three-hour breakfast show starting at 7 a.m. It's said the original idea of commissioning the programme from Music Box has been set aside for the time

From 10 a.m. there is expected to be an hour of soap opera material, then an hour of pop music, followed by news and more soap programming. There will be tea-time children's shows, followed by archive material from the BBC and ITV through to midnight, after which there will be through-the-night pop music.

She has been a regular guest in our New Talent columns, the young Swedish rock singer Tone Norum. Both her two singles, Can't You Stay and Stranded have been extensively tipped in this section (see issue 47 of last year resp. issue 17 of this year) and with both singles passing the gold status in Sweden and her debut album One Of A Kind recently released, everything is set for a European crossover. The album will be out in a lot of European countries and was produced by Joey Tempest, the lead vocalist of the well-known Swedish hardrock band Europe who also has written all the songs on the album (see for seperate editorial on this band page 8).



Her position will be taken over by Mitch Vanelli at the new CRI office in London. Jenny's final assignment had been a worthy one: setting up the European promotour for Europe. They will be appearing on t.v. shows in Germany (Formel Eins), Holland (Countdown), Belgium, France, & Spain and will stay in London for a while to do a video for their follow-up single "Rock the Night". It will most probably be a concept video, probably mixed with live footage. A major European concert tour is in the works for January March next year.





While Madonna stays for the second week at the top of the European karfralay Top 50 with True Blue, Berlin storm their way into the top. Thanks to sudden interest in the UK, the Take My Breath Away single gets another boost in Airplay points and the single moves with a bullet from 6 to 2 in its seventh week. In the meantime, the US band releases their new album through Phonogram on November 3 entitled Count To Three And Pray, featuring guitar contributions by Dave Gilmour and Ted Nugent.

The highest entry is for Manhattan band Glass Tiger whose Don't Fonger me (Withen 1 m Gon-) enters straight in at 25 in the Airplay Top 50. The single is already top 10 in America and is produced and co-written by Jim Vallance. Second best entry for the Lou Receivish Alloways The Sun. Third best entry comes from 1600 Celdod whose This 1s The Moral Calling enters at 34 straight in The single is produced by The Brothers Of Doom (Dawe Stewart ablum "Deep 1 in The Heart Of Nowhere," to be released November 28. The production of the album was done by Rupert Hine with the exception of two tracks by Dawe Stewart: the aforementioned single and the track 'Love Like A Rocket'.

While Cutting Crew's (I Just) Died In Your Arms is starting to break on the continent (and is firmly planted in the European Airplay at 28) the band already has its second single in the UK entitled I've Been In Lowe Before. Unfortunately this single does not continue the immediate commercial impact of the debut and is a rather insipid attempt to repeat the formula of the first one.

While Falso nelesses his fourth album 'Emotonal' this week (again a production by Bolland & Bolland), his laset single, Coming Home (Jeanny Fur 7), already cautiously enters the bottom ranks of the Airpiley Pos Un the album contains new songs like Kamikaze Cappa, a tribute to the renowned war photographer Robert Cappa as well as songs like The Kits Of Kaithleen Turner, Les Nouveaux Riches and Cooboya, Ada Indians. Meanwhile Falco is in the middle of a big German tour to prove what he considers to be "The Sound Of Musik: Falco will be supported by a ten-piece band including support dum Fur Cress.

The man who puts so much funny writing into

his songtitles is back with a new one: Anotherloverholenyohead is already the fourth single from Prince's 'Parade' album and a good contender for an entry in the Airplay Top 50 next week.

It was 19 years ago that Georgle Pame had his last no. 1 his in the UK with Ballad Of Bornie And Clyde.' Apart from his duet with Alan Price in 1971 (Rosetta'), he has kept a low profile and recently was brought back to the attention by the Matt Balanco cover of his very first '64 single 'Yeh' Yeh'. But now he is back with a new single entitled Samba, an infectious version of Gilberto Gil's classic song 'Toda Minitan Baina'. Produced by the famous Stock/Aitken/Waterman team, Georgie wrote new English lyrics for this record.

The Mission is a band signed to Phonogram UK whose debut for that label, Stay With Me, is already a hit in England and with its swaying guitars, a real good chorus and the somewhat doomed yocals should be out on the continent soon.

In the Euro crossover section there are two very strong singles this week. First of all Abba's Agnetha Faltskog is duetting with Ola Hakansson from Secret Service in The Way You Are, a ballad with definite international hit potential. Out on Sonet!

Nadieh is a Dutch singer who debuts on the Dutch Polydor label. The Right To Change is a slick and smoothly produced single that sounds amazingly mature for such a new, young artist.

Will 1987 Be Year Of CD Turning Point?

As 1986 draws to a close, with record compact disc players will be in use companies everywhere extolling the compact disc for the vital role it has played in arresting the decline in sales of recorded music, there are still some key questions to be answered before CD can be heralded as a comprehensive replacement for vinvl records and

prerecorded cassettes. At the NARM Convention in Los Angeles last March, Jan Timmer, president of PolyGram, and undisputed champion of the compact disc, said in his keynote address: "CD will become the world's favourite audio/video carrier, the heart of the home entertainment system of the

He said that, by 1990, 60 million

throughout the world, compared with today's global population of 200 million conventional record players. Timmer sees CD as the ultimate multinurpose carrier for both audio and video, for both entertainment and education

At the time he made these predictions, he was of course aware of the threat of DAT (Digital Audio Tape) and he urged the industry to do all it

Philips/Polygram Form New Company EIM To Spearhead Software

has been formed, based in London, by compact disc pioneers Philips and PolyGram to spearhead the pan-European development of software for the new Compact Disc Interactive (CD-I) system.

Byron Turner, formerly a top executive with Activision in Europe, is president of the new operation, which is a counterpart to American Interactive Media Inc. (AIM), CD-1 is a powerful new media standard that simultaneously integrates audio, visual and text-data functions in a real-time interactive format.

EIM's mandate is to ensure quality software is available from trading partners for the massive launch of CD-1 hardware planned by Philips in 1987. "Rapid sales growth of hardware units is foreseen," says EIM, "and we must have software to keep pace."



CD Programming - Worthwhile Or Futile?

European Programmers Still Have Mixed Feelings

Reactions to compact disc programming in Europe vary widely from country to country and within each country from presenter to presenter. However, the current boom in CD retailing is rapidly bringing the discs into demand by radio programmers, if only to satisfy the wishes of the listeners.

Many deciays point out that the absence of surface noise makes CD's an enviable commodity over records, but as they all agree expense has up to now been one of the main detrimental factors as regards CD programming. Very few record companies supply the radio stations with compact discs and it would be unfair to limit the CD programmes to the occasional CD trickling in because of limited selection, so that most presenters find they have to buy the products themselves.

Wim van Putten, a deejay and producer at Dutch TROS radio is a strong advocate of the compact disc. He was the first in Europe to have a CD programme, making him both a national and international trendsetter The programme began in December 1982, three months before the general introduction and consequent acceptance of the CD in Holland. Van Putten has a one hour album programme on Thursdays, during which he plays two tracks from on average seven new albums. In order to test the viability and superiority over vinyl, Van Putten put his listeners to the test with the Phil Collins produced Frida solo alburn entitled "There's Something Going On". Extracts from both the digitally recorded compact disc and digitally recorded album were played and 90% of the reactions were correct. This result, says Van Putten, was "sensational, especially in light of the fact that most people do not have optimal reception".

Van Putten compiles his own programme and stresses that he is not dependant on record companies; all compact discs are bought by his station, through import channels if necessary, and he tries to acquire as many premiers as possible.

"The radio listener seems to detect the difference and be truly appreciative of the quality of the CD.".

The growing dedication of programmers to CD product was outlined by Tony Hale, head of music at UK's Capital Radio, who also put his listeners to a test to estimate the improvement in quality of CD programming. Capital's Micky Horn has a one hour programme weekly, produced by Hale: they presented their listeners with a quiz in which six tracks were played in a row, one of which was from a compact disc and as with the TROS programme, 90% of the people

chose the correct track. However, Hale pointed out that the overall quality of CDs varies enormously; any DDD (digitally recorded, digitally mixed and digitally mastered) CD would have perfect sounding with no hiss whatsoever, whereas AAD, those recorded in an analogue studio were liable to maximize imperfections so that vinyl could well be superior to an AAD disc. Comments Hale: "With the right combination of technology, compact discs are both more eclectic and unconstrained and we have proved their overall superiority". He gave as an example of a particularly successful CD the New Age orchestral piece by Steven Caudele, entitled 'Wine Dark Sea', where the CD format great-

and we usually have to buy them ourselves. I don't think the listeners can genuinely hear the difference on the radio but people definitely respond when they hear that they are being played a compact disc; they feel they are being spoiled". Stations that make their audience aware of CD content on the air naturally create a higher demand for the product by the public.

"However", adds Holtmann, "one of the most useful factors of the CD is that they present a chance to have rereleases such as old Stones albums and Motown LP's represented on compact disc".

Very much in agreement with these views is Achim Hebgen, producer at SWF in Baden Baden, Germany, who has been playing CDs for around three years, so that CD programming is now very much a daily routine within SWF. Once a month a specific CD programme entitled 'Forum Im Zweiten' is broadcast by Hebgen featuring all kinds of music from New Age, jazz, rock and pop. "In order for the compact discs to be meritable", says Hebgen, "they must have an extra special something about them, such as exceptionally good production. When this is the case, I believe CDs do indeed set new standards of recording, such as Kip Hanrahen's 'Conjure' or the Mahavishnu Orchestra recordings."

BBC Radio One's Dorcen Davis pointed out that: "The transmission on FM is obviously a definite contributory factor to the success of the CD." The BBC's policy is therefore, since they are almost exclusively on AM (apart from John Peel's FM show), to limit themselves to CD specials on national holidays. They are for example broadcasting a three hour compact disc special on January 1st to


from CD superiority. Monique Le Marcis, head of programmes RTI. France, says that it is mainly the classical tracks within her station, which are broadcast on CDs, though she points out that an increasing number of international songs are now being played from CDs.

"Compact discs are both more eclectic and unconstrained and we have proved their overall superiority.'

Numerous stations, which up to now have been hesitant and have been watching the progress of CDs are now beginning to commit themselves to the new technology. Per Helger Berg, music programmer at Radio One in Oslo, feels that there is a strong need for music programmes to combine actual information on CD hardware. He is therefore inaugurating this week a one hour show, which will both play music and reveal the latest research on CD equipment

Likewise Southern Sound Radio in Brighton is about to begin a Saturday evening three hour show, says Lewis Borg Cardona, the head of music: "I don't personally think the listeners will hear the difference, but it makes the station sound better from the very fact that we will programme compact discs. However CDs may not have a chance in the long run. Eventually they will be superseded by digital tape; the Japanese digital tape revolution is under wraps at the moment, but it is very much in the pipeline. I think that CDs could well go the way of 8 track cartridges, which were originally very popular but which have now died a death


Despite such reservations, the fact remains that CD is the best quality product currently on the market and is establishing itself firmly as a programmers tool, with the added impetus that the radio listener seems to be truly appreciative of their quality.

the possibility of putting the brakers on DAT in order to allow the CD system to establish itself beyond the point of no return. It is quite certain that penetration of the CD system, varying from 7% in Japan to 2% or 3% in European countries, to less than half a percent in the United States, is not as et sufficient to make Timmer's NARM prediction achieve fulfilment.

And with players still costing between \$ 200- \$ 600, and software scarce and expensive, plus the possibility that the system will be superseded by digital audio tape, the CD community still has much consumer resistance and indecisiveness to overcome

There is, however, good news for the CD industry, news that could give a tremendous boost to an already buoyant CD market. After months of stalling, the Electronic Industry Association of Japan (EIAJ) has agreed to discuss timing of the introduction of DAT with the IFPI. A meeting is set for Vancouver, Canada, in December.

This is encouraging news for the CD advocates because at present there is no possibility of high-speed duplication onto digital audio tape, which means that all DAT software to come onto the market, if it were launched now, could only be used for private

The second item of good news relates to the cost of software. It has long been the complaint of the hardware manufacturers that, while they have done everything to bring their prices down, the cost of software, far from falling, has actually increased, a function of the shortage of supply.

Certainly record companies have been slow to move into CD manufacture, largely because of initial uncertainty as to the popularity of the system and partly because of the substantial investment involved. Thus, although more and more manufacturing facilities are in the process of construction, the failure of CD supply to meet demand is likely to continue for some time and this means that prices will remain high.

However, research and development in the field of CD manufacture is expected very soon to permit economies not only of scale in producing CDs, but also as a result of the simplification of the manufacturing

When the first Dutch CD manufacturing facility, DOCdisc, goes on be able to reduce pressing time per CD from 25 seconds to one second. Furthermore, the company asserts that no clean room is necessary for their system of CD production. Cheaper and faster manufacturing processes will be crucial in bringing CD prices down to a more acceptable level. However, it should be stated that Philips, creators of CD technology, have expressed scepticism over the

DOCdisc claims. Nevertheless it is certain that in the short term ways will be found to bring down the price of a CD in order that the system can have the best possible chance of totally superseding the black vinyl disc.

With the investment money now pouring into CD manufacturing facilities, fourteen are scheduled to come into operation in the US, another ten in Europe, three more in Japan and ten in the rest of the world, there will be increasing commitment and competi-

tion to bring CD prices down. Another important stimulus for the consumer will be the prospect of having more and more of his or her favourite records available on CD. It is a fact that even when analogue master tapes are transferred to compact disc the quality and range of the recording is often significantly better than is attainable on the best vinyl pressing.

Despite the fact that both hardware and software are still more expensive in Europe than in the US (notwithstanding the fact that America was

something of a Johnny-come-lately on the CD scene), European software sales are expected to top 42 million units this year, compared with last year's 15 million. CD player sales in Europe will be in excess of three

PolyGram projections are that global sales of compact discs will hit the 1.2 billion mark by 1995. Another potential fillip to the mass acceptability of CD is the broadening of the range of available repertoire. A major step forward in this connection has been the announcement that the Reprise recordings of Frank Sinatra are to be available on CD. Also due for transfer to the laser-read medium are the English Decca recordings of the Rolling Stones and ultimately all the rich

repertoire of the Beatles. These will be moneyspinning additions to the 9,000-plus CD titles already on the market

The CD revolution in Europe has been most potent, naturally, in Eurone's largest record market. West Germany. Sales of compact disc in Germany will top 10 million units this year and 50 million by 1990. The revenue from CD sales in West Germany this year will represent 15% of industry turnover. Sales of CD hardware are expected to reach 400,000

In the UK, CD sales have risen from 300,000 units in 1983 to around six million this year, or 11% of indus-

French CD sales this year are projected at 5.5 million (1.4 million in 1985). Italy has been relatively slow in accepting the CD system with sales last year of 1.1 million units, while sales in Holland for 1986 will be in excess of five million units. Sales in Austria are likely to top the half million mark this year and Switzerland, one of the most affluent of the European markets, will have bought a phenomenal four million CDs by the end of this year.

No retail prices for CD software or hardware in Russia have yet been announced

Sweden's CD Plant Plans Steady Expansion

CD Plant, Scandinavia's second compact disc factory, is located at Malmoe in the South of Sweden. The factory came on stream in the beginning of July and started its second working shift at the end of August. Due to high demand, the company plans to start a third shift this month. The annual capacity for 1987 will be approximately 5-6 million compact discs, to be increased to 10-12 million during 1988.

From early '87 the company will, together with Toolex Alpha, have a Philips Optical Disc mastering facility within the premises, together with tape editing and PO editing operating. CD Plant will then be able to offer a thereby eliminating the risk of delay in delivery as they will be in full control of the whole process.

CD Plant hopes to expand abroad for an increased market but they say it will take at least ten years before the whole of Scandinavia (population 20 million) can use the number of discs being produced at the facility. Ben Hedenberg, CD Plant's president, says: "The tradition in Scandinavia is that the pressing plants are independent and therefore the industry always works for both the major and the independent companies. We will naturally follow that tradition."

Koch Records Undertake Overall In House Production

Koch Records GmbH, an Austrian-West German self contained entreprise, publicly appounced its successful entry into the Compact Disc production and manufacture in April of this year

From the recording of the digital mastertages relative to the conversion of delivered tapes into digital-tapes. the moulding production of matrixes via injection, steaming, lacker coding for protection and all electronical quality controls up to label printing and packing, are all 'in-house' undertakings

Eighty percent of the entire CD production falls to the share of third party commissions that are brought in on a worldwide basis, and the remaining 20 % are productions by Koch Records that are released as CD's. Koch Digitaldisc operates currently with four moulding-presses.

Franz Koch, the founder of the company, plans the yearly production of 1987 to be around three million five hundred (3.5 million) units. Comments Haakon Brenner, international manager: "Plant expansion and a three shift 24 hours round the clock operation will enable Koch Digitaldisc to accept further third party commissions in the future.



Record Co's Consider CD Distribution To Radio Stations

With CD capacity growing and prices possibly decreasing, European marketing directors may rethink their policy of not providing promo CD's to radio programmers. Both the vastly improved revenue the compact discs are bringing in, and the superiority of the exciting new medium, have made CD's one of the most marketable products ever. Their potential as a promotional tool has already been realised and experimented with by several record companies and some majors are expressing the belief that the compact disc will slowly become an integral part of radio programming.

The initial problem of a shortfall caused by ever growing demands for software in excess of manufacturing capacity, now seems to be alleviated according to most majors. Rick Blaskey, vice president European Marketing RCA, says that production has caught up with demand at RCA, and comments: "The difficulty was knowing how well certain artists were going to do. We frequently have to plan and subsequently order six months up front, so that we just needed the time and experience to gauge the necessary quantities." Jochen Kraus, deputy managing director Ariola Munich, says that since the opening of their own factory, they are now well able to meet full demands. These demands will increase still further over the Christmas period but Kraus is confident that they will suffer no shortfall. CBS have no difficulty in delivering the required quota of CD's; they receive all their material from CBS/Sony in Japan and do the repackaging in Holland.

However EMI admits that the production of compact disses within the company is frightningly short of demand, according to David Hughes, director of strategic marketing EMI UK. "But by March of next year we expect to remedy the situation. The problem was that EMI lagged behind somewhat as regards accepting the medium. We were late in deciding to build factories but we now have two of our own, a plant in Swindon in the UK. and one in the US."

The marketing of compact discs is tackled from differing angles in the different record companies. At Poly-Gram, the undisputed pioneers of the compact disc, Adrian Berwick, marketing manager Phonogram UK, says:

lowed up the experiment by promoting Daryl Hall's Dreamtime via a CD single.

The involvement of the media in

promoting the medium as well as the artist was exemplified by the Hornsby experiment, and although few record companies are as yet distributing CD's to the radio stations, many of them would consider it in the future if prices showed a marked drop. EMI's David Hughes says: "CD's should and most likely will become an integral part of radio programming. Unfortunately, the BBC is mainly on AM and CD's are in that case a worthless luxury. But it's good PR for the station itself if they publicise the fact that they are programming CD's and it's of course good for the medium also."

Conversely Ariola's Kraus remarks that as long as the tracks are also available on an analogue album, his company would not consider sending out CD's, unless the product were ever available on CD only.

The one fact that all the record companies agreed upon was that the CD had rekindled interest in those who had stopped buying music. As Poly Gram's adrian Bervick sumarised it: "The CD offers the fidelity available on albums, the portability of the cassette, but in addition the compactability for which it is unique." People are always attracted to perfection and for the next few years at least it is the most perfect new medium it.

Poly-Gram for example recently sent a test pressing through their plant in Hannover of the latest Elton John CD. 'Leather Jackets' to their affiliates around the world. Similarly, at RCA, Blaskey explained: "Earlier this year in April, we heard a totally unknown act, whose music was not the current vogue. Realising its potential, we sent a CD of the recording to the key media people around the world. We strongly believed that this unconventional step was worth it so that the new artist could not escape the notice of the programmers." The artist in question was Bruce Hornsby, and RCA fol-

WEA Launches CD Stars Campaign

The first European co-ordinated marketing effort was a Compact Disc Campaign under the banner "adventures In Modern Trends" early 1984. The objective was to enhance awareness for dealers and consumers throughout Europe of the WEA repertoire available on CD. Ever since them problems of supply hindered aggre-

sive marketing posture. In September of this year the WEA affiliates around Europe combined forces yet again and launched "WEA Stars On CD" on the basis of sufficient supply across the catalogue. The strategy was formulated centrally in spring and carefully planned for a big launch at the end of August. Comments Jurgen Otterstein, marketing director WEA Europe: "We mutually agreed on the visual concept and the prime objectives, as we all believe in the principle of avoiding a situation whereby we have 12 different engines in Europe steaming off in different directions. We have obtained sufficient capacities to warrent such a

major drive in order to broaden the catalogue sales in Europe." The timing goes along with the celebration of opening the first compact disc plant of

Warner Communications in Alsdorf. The campaign comprised of instore merchandising items such as acrylic counter bins, 2 million CDsize catalogues, 3 different posters, point of sales items and wallpaper for decoration. Catalogues were also inserted in back catalogue CD's and clocks of acrylic were made available to dealers as incentives. The in-store campaign was backed up by consumer advertising emphasising the "CD On Stars" concept. "The success of the campaign suggested that we should continue with another marketing push for spring!", continued Otterstein. "This time it will focus on re-issues of

"This time it will focus on re-issues of WEA back catalogue. This follows a dramatic exercise to make more back catalogue available next year. This will become a major if not prime objective for our marketing plans in '87."

Philips/Du Pont Join Forces

PDO is an international 50/50 joint venture between Philips, of the Netherlands, and the Du Pont de Nemours Company, of Delaware, USA. Operational since early 1986, the company develops, manufactures that of cassettes to 30 percent. PDO and markets optical media for the audio, video and data markets. It aims to capture a major share of the worldwide optical disc market, which is expected to exceed 4 billion US dollars by 1990. The company is, and expects to remain, the world's largest supplier of CD's for pre-recorded music.

Research and development within PDO takes place in development centres in Eindhoven, the Netherlands, and near Wilmington, Delaware. USA. So far, compact discs are being manufactured in the former PolyGram CD factory in Hanover, West Germany. "Laservision" video discs are produced in Blackburn, England.

In the audio field, industry demand for discs presently far exceeds capacity. According to the industry analysts, compact audio discs will comprise about half the pre-recorded audio entertainment market by 1990. Today, this figure is about 4 percent. Records and cassettes are the media of


choice today, each representing about 48 percent of the market. Compact discs will attack both fields, so the share of records is expected to drop by 1990 to 20 percent of the market and will then have annual sales in this field of about 11S dollars 500 million

Comments Hans Gout, director of marketing: "To meet this rapidly growing, world-wide demand, the Hanover-plant, the world's largest, is producing more than 50 million CD's annually. Further, a CD-Audio manufacturing plant is now being built in Kines Mountain, North-Carolina (USA), near Charlotte. This plant is expected to begin to operate by the end of this year and will also grow towards an annual capacity of approximately 50 million CD's"

A few months ago, PDO announced that it will participate in a new company to be established in Italy. The other shareholders of that company are the Italian companies Stet and Philips Italy. It is envisaged that this company will come to an annual production of 15 million discs. PDO has the firm intention to expand its total CD-Audio capacity to more than 200 million discs annually.





COSMOPOLITAN POP

It took Billy Idol quite some time to finish his new album Whiplash Smile and his investments and dedication to the project have certainly paid-off. Idol has a shrewd and calculated image and makes music for the eighties pop-video generation. No doubt however that the renegade of punk-pop makes his biggest breakthrough with this album full of sci-fi rock 'n roll and hi-tech, cosmopolitan pop. The production by Keith Forsey is glossy and adds the right edge to Idol's material. No direct single stand-outs, although tracks like Sweet Sixteen with its country rockabilly feel, Don't Need A Gun and Worlds Forgotten Boy are certainly contenders

Chrissie Hynde has formed a new Pretenders line up and delivers her first album, entitled So Close for two years. Since the 'Learning To Crawl' album not much has changed, the Pretenders remain a r&b band with some excursions into bluesy minor key pop. Produced by Bob Clearmountain and Jimmy Iovine, this is probably the band's most commercial album to date and the band's current brilliant single Don't Get Me Wrong will certainly spur the interest in this album. With a hard-hitting, compact and economic production and additional help from musicians like Carlos Alomar, Bernie Worrell and Simon Phillips, suggested airplay include the funky Dance. My Baby (with its good build-up), mean funky rhythms in How Much Did You Get For Your Soul and Chrissie's follow-up to 'Thin Line Between Love And Hate', Chill Factor. Also check out the raucous Room Full Of Mirrors, the classic Jimi Hendrix tune

Nik Kershaw takes all the production credits on his third MCA album Radio Musicola. The new

album displays Kershaw's talent as a commercial songwriter to its full extent and, although not directly adding new audiences, yields well crafted pop songs like What The Papers Say, Running Scared and Nobody Knows.

The last two years there is a discernable trend towards more acoustic and less artificial music. The debut album of the UK formation Martin Stephenson & The Daintees is another example although their return to the basics is a more varied one. The lp Boat To Bolivia is extremely rich in different musical styles, ranging from folk, c&w, coctail pop, Prefab Sprout-like pop (they share the same label, Kitchenware), to rockabilly and pub rock. A truly stunning debut with highlights such as Little Red Bottle (a nostalgic song in which influences from The Kinks and Dire Straits are fluently blended), the jazzy Coleen, the Leonard Cohen like Rain and the unpretentious country of Candle In The Middle.

A bit in the same vein is the debut album by the Belfast born Andy White, Rave On. White's style leans heavily on the works of Leonard Cohen, Bob Dylan and the Waterboys but with his distinctive and intriguing voice and the strong collection of songs, avoiding mere imitation. Again, quite a remarkable debut that certainly deserves your attention. Recommendations include Reality Row, I Will Wait. Things Start To Unwind and Religious Persuasion.



"At one point", added Landau, "I felt unsure about the whole project as I feared it would take something away from people's memory of the uniqueness of Sprinsteen's concert, but friends who heard some of the finished mixes assured me it would just bring back these sweet memories".

In order to lose none of Bruce's stage presence in the transfer to commercial sound carrier, high quality crome tape was used for the cassettes and the albums were produced from direct metal masters, thus eliminating several generations between master and pressed
