Philips To Sell PolyGram Shares

20% of the shares of the Philips owned subsidiary PolyGram will be sold to investors. The Dutch electronics firm has owned all the 80 million shares in PolyGram since this year, but wants to offer 15 million on several stock markets.

It is roughly estimated that the Philips shares could yield \$18 apiece, bringing the total proceeds of Philips' interest in PolyGram to approximately a £149 million. Of the 15 million shares, 10.5 million will be offered to a syndicate of US underwriters and 4.5 million to a syndicate of international underwriters outside the US. PolyGram was founded in 1962 when the recorded music

Dutch Figures

Amsterdam - Dutch collecting society BUMA/STEMRA reports that performance income for 1986 was 3% up on the previous year at Dfl 60.1 miliion (approx. £17.9 million) but mechanical earnings were more than 7% down at Dfl 74.3 million.

BUMA, the performing rights wing of the society, collected Df 35.7 million from live performances, Dfl 9.3 million from cable/satellite broadcasts, 7.1 million from radio, 6.3 million from tv and 1.7 million from films.

German Figures Look Good

Hamburg - After sharp falls in sales during the early 80s, the West German record industry has achieved another upturn for the first half of 1987. Official trade figures show 58.1 million alburns, CDs and cassettes sold, an increase of 16.2% from last

year. CD volume rose 90% to 8.6 million units and cassettes 19% to 23.7. Even traditional LPs showed a small rise to 25.8 million. However, singles sales continued to decline, with sales dropping 13%, to 20 million units.

Austin expects start-up costs to be around £16.6 million over the first five years, with initial broadcast scheduled for October 1988.

Broadcaster In Japan Hits Back

by Mark Hagan Director of Radio Monde, Tokyo I would like to reply to an article that appeared in M&M's September 12 issue 'European Radio - A Place In The Sun?' by Edwin Riddell. Mr Riddell's credibility was totally shaken near the end of the feature when he stated: "Today's European radio broadcaster looks neryously to the experience of

Japan. There, saturation of the airwaves has produced average daily listening of not much more than half-an-hour and a reach of less than 30%." I have been a professional

broadcaster throughout Japan for some 15 years and I can state quite unequivically that the airways here are nowhere near saturated. Tokyo, reportedly the world's largest city, has one commercial FM station (along with the government cultural station). This is true for every major city in Japan.

The Japanese are very resistant to change and the PTT in Japan is extremely reluctant to unleash its 'unsaturated' fre-

quencies on anything like the scale in Europe today. Indeed, it is grudgingly allowing only one new station per district over the next 10-20 years. Cable systems, mainly CATV, are in their infancy and satellite reception practically non-existent, being controlled exclusively by NHK, the government facility.

Mr Riddell is right in that radio listening is at the very low end of the scale in Japan. However, this is due mainly to the lack of available choice for the listener and an antiquated style of programming - a situation that gave explosive birth to 'self programming': The Walkman!

Formated music shows are something the modern Japanese listener is aware of and seeks. Consequently, the military AM radio here boasts almost as large an audience as the local FM station.

I urge European broadcasters not to look to the Japanese experience, nervously or otherwise. Even with the somewhat chaotic situation prevailing, European radio has an excitement and electricity about it and, from my view, one hell of a future.


Although the address was stern. Lewis ended on a confident note: "Together, BBC Radio 1 and the British record industry will continue to maintain the unique position of British music in the world."



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
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

AIR Studios - George Martin's **Leading Creation**

Established And Respected From The UK To The Caribbean

by Janet Angus

here cannot be many people in the music business who do not know about AIR Studios, both in London and on the Caribbean island of Montserrat. One of the world's leading recording facilities, the studio complex at AIR London houses four 'state-of-the-art' recording studios as well as the recently opened studio five MIDI programming/recording studio. AIR's founders are, if anything, even more well known than the studios themselves. The facility opened officially in 1970 when the London recording scene was very much dominated by the record companies such as EMI's Abbey Road. Four record producers, George Martin, John Burgess, Roger Greenaway and Peter Sullivan, decided to team up and put together their own recording studios which they called Associated Independent Producers (AIR).

The complex is situated right in rooms designed by Shearer, the the heart of central London: overlooking Oxford Circus in a building which started life in 1926 as a department store. Its most attractive feature to potential studio designers was the fact that it had a banquet hall which nowadays houses both studios one and two. The floor was already three foot lower than the rest of the rooms in the complex, enabling probably the simplest installation of isolated recording rooms to have taken place in this capital city.

Ouite apart from traffic noise, the London underground has caused often insurmountable problems for the scores of studios which have mushroomed in this part of the city. The isolation required is astronomical both in its bulk and in its cost. To stumble upon a property which lends itself to this type of isolated installation was a godsend.

Studio designer Ken Shearer was the first to design the rooms and, although knowledge of acoustics and studio design has changed considerably during the last 17 years, Shearer's designs have, to a large extent, managed to survive or be adapted to current trends.

Malcolm Atkin is studio manager today: "There were a lot fewer people out there building what you wanted in those days and you had to do it yourself. Every room in the complex is totally isolated from the rest of the building. Of the original

recording rooms were very finely tuned and the control room less so. The fashion throughout the 70s was for the rooms to be deader and deader until the 1980 when live sounds became the vogue. So we stripped off all the padding and bass absorbers when we rebuilt studio one, and it was an instant success?

The studios originally had a very heavy bias towards film work. Cretu's Productions - The Post Romantic Influence

The Benefits Of Digital by Cathy Inglis

r hen it comes to music, Rumanian born Michael Cretu is a polished all rounder whose career embraces everything from singing and performing on keyboard to songwriting, engineering and producing. Cretu's first venture into production began nine years ago when he worked on an album for Peter Cornelius, an Austrian singer who was very successful at the time in Germany. He then produced for popular German group Hubert Kah with whom he is still involved; their latest Cretu-produced single, Military Drum is currently in the Billboard charts at no. 23 and has been released in most European territories. Kah will begin to record a new album in Cretu's own studios in a couple of weeks time. The Rumanian artist then joined the group known as Moti Special becoming backing vocalist, keyboard

It was however the worldwide success of Sandra which brought him international respect as a producer. Cretu began by producing and engineering Sandra's first album, and has produced her subsequent two, the last of which is released this week in Germany, followed by the rest of Europe soon after. (Sandra's second album, Mirrors, has sold well over 300.000 worldwide, whilst her Maria Magdalena single sold 700.00

Michael Cretu had his own studio built in his home seven vears ago. This started as a small operation with a 24-track desk which soon grew to 48 and finally 64 track. In addition Cretu owns a 32-track digital Atari and 12 reverb units including Lexicon, Yamaha and AMS.

Nothing Like The Sun - Moody And Meaningful Sting Delivers A Masterpiece

othing Like The Sun is the enigmatic title of the new album by Sting which however becomes clearer when you look up Shakespeare's sonnet 130 from which it comes (we leave that up to you!). The album, Sting's second solo studio effort, will put him on the forefront of the music scene again, arousing lots of deserving media attention as the new material is truly staggering. It received a rave review in M&M last week and the LPs' first single We'll Be Together, released a week prior to the alburn, is already picking up good reactions.

album 'Dream Of The Blue Turtles' was enormously succesful and critically acclaimed. Sting found himself standing between two fires, as both rock and jazz purists objected to elements of the 'other' style being mixed with 'their' respective sound. While the album delivered hits like 'Russians' and 'Love Is The Seventh Wave', it showed that Sting was still searching for a true direction. He found it, and the public loved it. The 1986 live album 'Bring On the Night' had less media and sales impact, as is usual with live albums, but the new studio album, with both its superb content and Sting's stellar status, may well gain album-of-the-year appraisal right from the start.

However, the record company is not passively waiting for things to happen spontaneously, Posters, displays, streamers, counterboxes and sweatshirts designed by Sting himself are part of A&M's extensive, teaser-like campaign. The album cover is also designed by Sting and features useful and interesting sleeve notes on each of the 12 tracks written by the artist. His comment for example on They Dance Alone is indispensible: without reading it one would not fully experience the deep melancholy of this song about the Chilean 'Gueca' dance which is used as symbolic protest against the "disappearances" in that country. The comment on Little Wing, a Jimi Hendrix composition (and the only song on the alburn not written by Sting) is also worth reading. In this

But now what it is all about: the music! Although Nothing Like The Sun is fairly R&B based. Sting continues to incorporate into his own carefully shaded style, several non-mainstream idioms such as latin, jazz and to some extent folk and the familiar reggae. The combination of poetic and meaninoful lyrics, the overall melancholic feel of the music, Sting's straight, slightly haunting voice and the moody, transparent, jazzy instrumentations combine to express the feelings of a man touched by what he perceives, with a refreshing, intriguing and innovative sound. Although it does not come across as a musical statement as such, it is definitely a musical adventure an adventure which may have started with the 'Turtles' album, but which now is bearing the fruits of maturity. The participants of the LP make up an interesting list. Apart from the basic line-up (including Branford Marsalis on saxophone and Kenny Kirkland on keyboards as on the two previous albums), backing vocals are supplied by Dolette McDonald, Janice Pendarvis. Vesta Williams and Rene Gaver. Guest musicians include Gil Evans and his orchestra. Police companion Andy Summers, Mark Knopfler, Eric Clapton and Ruben Blades, the latter performing the 'Gueca' solo in They Dance Alone. Best tracks include the irresistibly swinging Rock Stea-

dv, the jazzy and intriguing Englishman In New York (an excellent single candidate). the stunning Fragile with Sting on Spanish guitar, the guiet, atmospheric Sister Moon and the above mentioned They Dance Alone.

Whereas the 'Turtles' LP was a landmark in Sting's recording career and 'Bring On The Night' a document of his 1985 tour, 'Nothing Like The Sun' is primarily a masterniece

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
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
