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Mixed Reactions To Benelux TV

The news that Cable Music Eurone has found the necessary loophole in the Dutch law to put forward serious plans for a commercial satellite television channel in the Netherlands (see front page), has come as a surprise to the Dutch media and industry. It comes just months after announcing the launch of Cable 1, the European commercial satellite radio, which is also the brainwave of Willem Van Kooten and Ad Van Ossendriiver.

Although welcoming the new development, Lex Harding, Veronica Programme Director Radio & Television and long-time advocator of commercial TV, says: "It breaks my heart that no official broadcasting organisation managed to come up with this project."

# TV South **Profits**

London -Television South has reported pre-tax profits for the year to October 1987 51% up at £ 21.8M. Advertising revenues rose 16.8% to £ 143M, against an industry-wide average rise of 13.2% and income from programme sales rose more than a third to £ 20.8M.

Covering the affluent south of England, TVS moves up to fourth place in the league table of UK independent television companies, with a near 11% advertising market share. Chief Executive James Gatward says he is "extremely pleased" with the results, adding that TVS has now begun successful diversification into other television related areas.

# Rock Stations Must Carry News, Warns IBA

las Hurd gave the go-ahead to split frequency broadcasting on January 12. In future both BBC and ILR local radios will be able to offer completely separate services on FM to those on medium wave. This opens up the airwaves to a host of FM rock stations, giving existing ILRs a significant head start over new entrants. "At the moment we're urging caution on our members on plans for separate FM stations", admits Brian West, Director of the IR Companies' Association AIRC.

Capital Radio, which currently operates a CFM split frequency service on Sundays, would like to expand CFM into a full separate station. "I think any sort of good radio station does carry news," says Capital's Programme Controller Richard Park.

# Ramsay To Sell Off UK Stake

The Paul Ramsay Group, major 1 Australian investors in UK ILR. has announced its intention to sell off its radio interests. These include a 45% stake in national sales company Broadcast Marketing Services, 24% of Capital Radio and shares in Metro, Essex, Chiltern plus holdings in two other stations

The value of the Ramsay interests is calculated at about £ 12M, about half of which is accounted for by the Capital shares

Ramsay's decision to sell now follows an extremely good year for ILR financially, when UK radio shares are particularly strong. There is speculation that the

government may limit foreign holdings in British radio to 20 or 25%. The real reason for the sale however, is thought to be that Ramsay has been frustrated in its efforts to create a 'golden triangle' out of its investments in the London grouping of Capital, Chiltern and Essex. Chiltern have been particularly hostile to the Ramsay influence within the

Among parties said to be interested in acquiring the interests are Virgin Communications and the Lancashire multi-millionaire Owen Oyston. The IBA will almost certainly insist on a British buyer or buyers for the shares.

But expansion is not the next step for DDD. "Our greatest possible mistake would be to enlarge beyond the seven or eight employees we have now," said Galanti. "I see a lot of people who started like me, mostly interested in music production, and now they don't have the time to listen to records because they are so financially involved."

But Galanti believes that Italian law is strangling much of the music industry. "As we are the music creators it would be logical for us to become record companies and earn money from radio. TV, concerts and records. Not so. Under the present law we are not

"We pick up young, inexperienced kids wanting to sing, teach them the business, invest huge sums in them then someone else comes along and makes more money out of them by selling concerts, publicity and so on. An old law - devised to take care of some clique attitudes in opera circles - is hurting our business and something should be done." he finished.

# **New Satellite Radios** On Air

Hilversum - Two new commercial satellite radio stations are now on air in the Netherlands, having found ways of skirting the Dutch media legislation forbidding advertisements. Cable One. using the old RTL slogan, 'The Station Of The Stars', was first heard on Glasgow's cable system in Scotland and has now conquered Berlin, Amsterdam and

Rotterdam. But the Dutch DJs on Cable One must use English on air as the station is registered in the UK to avoid restrictive Dutch legislation, "Actually we've developed a sort of 'Hitperanto'," says the well-known Dutch publisher Willem van Kooten who is behind the enterprise.

The second new launch is Radio 10, so far only available on the cable networks of small cities like Zwolle and Rijswijk, but spokesman Peter Jelgersma thinks this will soon change and Rotterdam is already doing test transmissions. "We made a very quick

start and many cable systems don't know we exist yet," he said. Radio 10 claim they have

found a loophole in the law which allows them to speak Dutch and broadcast Dutch language commercials by exploiting the subtle difference between commercial radio stations and radio financed through commercial ventures.

Jelgersma: "Radio 10 is officially a foreign venture, it's founded by the Italian station which broadcasts under the same name to Milan. SR-MALMOE Sweden Kalle Oldby, DJ/Producer of live radio shows.

Eldkvarn is the name of my favourite group and as you can probably see by their name, they won't hit the big time in the rest of Europe. I mean, our language isn't the most popular to sing in! # Successful Debut For ScanSat

The pressing of a little red button was all that it took to start Scandinavia's first commercial TV channel. But the Scandinavians had waited over 30 years for the event to occur.

ost of the publicity sur-rounding ScanSat has concentrated on the fact that it is a commercial channel; something that is generally illegal in Scandinavia. The channel's backers, Kinnevik, got around this by basing the station in London and claiming 'satellite status' (like Sky and Super) - although it cannot be seen anywhwere but Scandinavia and is very obviously aimed at the Scandinavian market, broadcasting mainly in the Scandinavian languages. ScanSat/TV 3 made its debut on

New Year's Eve; two years of planning has resulted in a TV channel with headquarters in London (broadcasting facilities) and offices in Stockholm, Oslo and Copenhagen. With an annual budget of SKr 130 million and a total staff of 40, ScanSat plans to produce 42 hours of programming a week for broadcast to 750.000 households in Denmark,

Norwegian government refused ScanSat broadcasting permission because commercial television is not allowed in Norway (although the satellites such as Sky and Super can beam in). However, last month the Minister Of Culture. Hallvard Bakke, inevitably, bowed to public pressure and allowed ScanSat onto the Norwegian cable network.

The financing behind this media venture comes from the Swedish holding company Kinnevik. ScanSat's Managing Director is 45-year-old Jan Steinmann, an experienced TV man. Steinmann began his career on the publicowned Swedish Television in the 60s and went on to spend some years as a producer for the TV Sweden and Norway. At first, the | branch of Mark McCormack's |

has also worked as the European agent for fellow Swede, tennis star Biorn Borg.

Talking about his position at ScanSat/TV 3, Steinmann says: "I had a clear image of what the final aim of ScanSat should be when I took this job. I want to be closely involved in the programming as I'm a keen TV viewer. But I would rather watch TV in the UK or the States. Swedish Television has the skill to make interesting programmes but there are too many serious talk programmes".

Steinmann is based in London and visits Stockholm for about five days every month to check things out, but thinks it is important to be close to "where the action is", which means spending a lot of time in the studio at (with a staff of 18) Hawley Crescent, north London.

Steinmann: "I am sure Scan-Sat is only the start of a boom for commercial TV in Scandinavia. I am certain that there are lots of interested spectators who are just waiting for the results of our launch. I think that we will have national commercial TV in Sweden and Norway in 1992 and Denmark has already started.

ScanSat had good reviews

promotion empire. Steinmann | following its launch; its family orientated blend of movies, cartoons, soap operas and AOR shows has met with positive reactions, ScanSat broadcasts 20% of its own material, the rest is mainly of British or American origin.

As far as music programming is concerned, ScanSat's profile is towards broad-minded pop shows with well-known musicians that appeal to the whole family. February's schedule includes 'Blues Session' with Phil Collins, Eric Clapton and BB King; 'John Farnham Live In Melbourne'; and Al Jarreau, Regular shows include 'Max Headroom' and The Tracy Ullman Show'.

But while the programming department (Head Of Programming is Goran Sellgren) seems to be on target, the advertising office is not; bookings are well below budget at the moment. Advertising is scheduled for six minutes each hour, with ads on everything but alcohol, tobacco and medicine allowed. The current advertising rate at ScanSat is SKr 40.000 per minute.

But Jan Steinmann is far from discouraged: "Kinnevik has allowed us five to seven years to be profitable, and we have a good thing to offer, so why should we

# Future Looks Bright For Norwegian Pop

breakthrough certainly seems to have made an impact on Norway's pop scene. Most well-known record companies have snapped up quite a few 'home acts' in 1987 and are getting ready to launch them. Because Norway does not usually have much success on the international music scene, the Norwegian promotors and artists spend lots of money and time polishing up their act before trying to breakthrough into the European charts. How difficult is it for a European band to break through and what happens after that? M&M spoke to the record companies about their plans for 1988.

# Danmarks Radio's Top 20 Takes Off...

"Entertainment is the keyword," says Leif Wivelsted, presenter and researcher of Danmarks Radio's new LP chart show, 'Top 20', which went on air last month. "The management of Danmarks Radio has finally realised that charts are popular radiowise. It has now been 10 years since the station aired a chart show and from the day it stopped. I have been a campaigner for its return. The competition from local radios is now bringing the top 20 back to Danmarks Radio, and that makes me very happy."

Manager of Metronome: "Even though we welcome the top 20 on Danmarks Radio, we do see some problems with this chart. First of all, you must realise that a certain 'nursing' of the 100 shops which produce sales figures is possible. I am also sad to see that there are

Director of Mega Records, agrees. Both he and Bennike are worried about the unsatisfactory singles sales in Denmark and have been taking action to boost these; Metronome is even dropping singles prices (see M&M issue 3). Wennick: "A company like Mega Records depends on singles sales, we don't have big names like the Bee Gees or The Beatles, we are out in the field all the time searching for new artists and hits on independent labels, and we could really use a singles top 20."

Lene Bausager, Promotion Assistant at RCA Records in Copenhagen: "Of course we welcome the return of the chart on national radio and hope to see our records on the top spots."

But the chart's presenter, Leif Wivelsted, is very satisfied with the fact that Danmarks Radio is doing an albums chart: "That gives the programme a certain variety, because you have the possibility of choosing from about 10 different tracks, no one thinks it is good fun to listen to the same 20 tracks week after week - which could be the case on a Danish singles chart because the sales figures change slowly; not at all like in the UK for example. We want this chart show to become an event, not just a countdown, everyone can do that; that is why we are putting different ingredients into the two hours."

Although all the record companies seem to think it is high time the state radio re-introduced a chart, most people agree that this chart will not have the same power as it did 10 years ago when there was no competition from the local radios.

# Finnish Pop Aims At The International Market

Scandinavian country whose pop and rock artists have not really made it internationally which has led to a sort of national frustration within the industry. The only notable success Finland achieved in the music world was in 1965 when it gave the world a new dance craze, Letkajenka (Letkis), followed by a score of potential acts. such as Wigwam, Tasavallan Presidentti, Piirpauke and Hanoi Rocks some 10 to 15 years later.

S o what is the problem? Well, it seems that the Finns are afraid of taking risks. They also need more contacts, more self-confidence, more danceable music and some major hits along the lines of Abba and A-Ha.

Finland's forte is rock, sung and played with Nordic vigour. There are no language difficulties, no true geographical barriers nor lack of fighting spirit (known in Finland as 'sisu').

Here are some names to watch, Gringos Locos (a M&M New Talent tip), a Helsinki-based heavy boogie band, is the first Finnish act to be signed by a major international record company for worldwide distribution -Phonogram Int. The LP. Gringos Locos, will be released throughout Europe in February, with a release in the UK in March. Poly-Gram's Vice President A&R. Gibson Kemp: "Gringos Locos"



# "Super Channel - Growth Beyond Expectations"

pan-European satellite television channel. celebrates its first birthday on January 30 knowing that it has quickly caught up with its older rival, Sky Channel, In only twelve months 24-hour Super Channel has come a long way and when its Managing Director spoke to M&M he was in a buoyant and celebratory mood.

n January 30 1987, Super Channel, which is owned by 14 of the UK's 15 ITV companies, inherited Music Box's audience with connections in 6.4 million homes and although the new channel suffered some initial teething problems, such as blackouts in the UK and disagreements with actors' union Equity over performance rights, the station has since grown - even beyond the expectations of the management. One further hiccup occured in August last year when cost-saving measures caused a reduction in Super Channel's commitment to Music Box, and the loss of several jobs. Even joint Managing Director Charles Levinson stepped down.

In one year Super Channel's network has grown from the initial 6.4 million homes in 14 countries to 9.6 in 15 countries. Says

Our advertising revenue has grown at 40% compound and I am confident that we will be breaking even in a couple of years time.



Richard Hooper, Managing Director Super Channe Last July, PETAR (Pan-Euro-

pean Television Audience Research) conducted a survey which showed that Sky was watched by 9.24 million compared to Super's 5.67 million. But Hooper is confident that this year's PETAR ratings will show the two channels very much on the same level. According to Hooper, the latest survey conducted by Dutch NOS STER (Dutch Broadcasting Advertisers' body) showed Sky and Super on a ratio of 5/4 and vet another survey in Austria by Tele Kabel Vienna showed the younger channel ahead of its older counterpart.

Super Channel is the first pan-European channel to have experimented with the sub-titling in English of a foreign programme. 'Zeg 's Aaa', a popular Dutch series, is broadcast in the original language with sub-titles, and says Hooper, the experiment has so far proved encouraging. A similar German experiment will start in March. Although this could alienate audiences not familiar with Dutch or German, Hooper points out that Holland and West Germany are the channel's two biggest markets.

The possibility of multisound tracks is not discounted though Super Channel will stick to its policy of keeping the majority of programmes in English -'the lingua franca of people | mes, along with sports program- | achieve their ambitions.

Hooper's philosophy for building up the channel is decentively simple. "Our short term

strategy involves success in Europe. For this we must acquire affordable, high quality programmes. Our priorities are better programmes and better promotion - this is what will yield revenue. Also high on the list of priorities are discussions with BSB and Astra, as are constraints with advertising regulations, in Holland and Sweden in particular.

We also still have to get the permission to enter a couple more European cities. We will be in Berne at the end of this month and we are of course still battling to get into Brussels. It is totally ludicrous that we are discriminated against in the capital of Europe.

In order to overcome such frustrating issues, the satellite channel executives meet up every two to three months in an association known as PET (Pan-European Television), headed by Jim Styles, Managing Director Sky

Performing rights are one of the key topics discussed at these PET meetings. "We pay these to cable operators in each country whereas cable operators pay the terrestrial channels. This is blunt discrimination in Treaty of Rome terms, but I'm sure that in less than two or three years the cable operators will have to pay all performing rights."

Whereas Sky labels itself as a general family entertainment channel. Super aims for a slightly higher profile. "We go for business people and decision makers," says Hooper. Market research conducted by PETAR showed that on a monthly viewing basis 44% of all senior and professional managerial executives watched the station between | Forecasts'. 22.00-24.00 hours. 
A number of Super Channel's programmes are now sponsored. Although a relatively new form of communication on European television, sponsorship has proved 'more lucrative than we originally thought', says Hooper. Dick Van Der Graaf, Director of Publicity and Promotion Europe and General Manager The Netherlands, explained to M&M the philosophy behind Super Channel's search for sponsors. "We have to persuade the companies that the image of the company and brand awareness can be just as effectively portraved by means of sponsorship. It is simply an easier threshold to advertising, as well as being a long-term investment and a different way of communicating.

Super Channel opens and closes the sponsored programmes with a mention of the client. The sponsor's message thus has a strong visual impact on the viewer as well as associating the sponsor with the image of the particular programme or event. To date more than 10 sponsorship deals have been closed including the Philips sponsored 'Super Quiz', the 'Pepsi Live' show with videos and guest appearances, the 'Gillette Soccer Scene', 'Monday Night Football Night With Tovota' and the 'Goodyear Weather

The Super Channel team is small yet keen and dynamic. What they have achieved is no mean feat. They bluntly admit they are in the business of making money out of audiences, and it seems that by following their simming and good promotion, they look set on the right path to

Invited media and record company executives agreed on one point: this band is too good to go unnoticed by European audiences any longer.

hereas in the album Kick had charted at no. 6 and the LP's first single, Need You Tonight, had climbed to the no. 2 position, Europe hesitated. But not for long.

In France the controversial The Original Sin, banned in South Africa for its anti-apartheid lyrics, hit Top 5 but it created an image that did not fit the band. They are not a dance pop band whose music is primarily aimed at the disco.

However 1988 has so far seen

Hot 100 at 70 with good positions in the UK, Germany, Belgium and Holland. The LP's first single, Need You Tonight, is top 10 in Holland, while the follow-up, New Sensation, is heading for top 20 in the UK, INXS - at last a true

The band is about to start the second leg of a big European tour, kicking off in Glasgow on February 5 (see tour dates in this issue). To fully appreciate the band and their music a live concert is essential. With their energetic brand of rock 'n roll and funk, the dry-bone, attacking guitar chords, the punctuated breaks and frontman Michael Hutchence's Jagger-ish mannerisms. the band really communicates with the audience.

"I always had the feeling that

one has got to see us live to realise who we are. Then it all fits. Listening to one album is not enough," says Kirk Pengilly, INXS' guitarist and saxophonist. "I think it is to Chris Thomas' credit (the producer of Kick), that the album has this 'basic' feel - it clearly reproduces our live sound. Earlier albums, like Shabooh Shoobah, were difficult to play live, due to their keyboards-orientated style.
