Super Channel **Fate Undecided** by Cathy Inglis Although the press has been

buzzing with the news that Super Channel is up for sale, both interested parties, Sky Channel and Television Broadcasting Company (TBC), are keeping a low profile. Any deal involving Sky would take the form of a merger, while TBC would bid for a majority stake in the channel.

A Sky spokesperson confirmed they were originally approached by Super Channel with various proposals several months ago. The argument in favour of a merger is that it would create a single outlet for the still minimal pan-European advertising market. Michael Green, Chair-

man of TBC (a consortium involving Carlton Communications, London Weekend TV. Saatchi & Saatchi, and Dixons' retail chain). denies that TBC is interested in buying Super Channel. "It sounds a great story, but unfortunately it doesn't happen to be true," says Green although he does admit to having had talks with Richard Hooper, Super Channel's Managing Director.

talking about various possibilities and one option is to stay as we are now. We have been approached by a number of firms and we have ourselves approached some German publishers. Our decision is dictated by whatever is best for the company." Hooper denies Super's

reported losses of £ 74 million and says the channel has invested only £ 45 million. Since Sky and Super spend around £ 20 million a year and the pan-European advertising market amounts, says Hooper, to £ 22 million, this suggests that a total of around £ 18 million is lost each year.

Super Channel undisputably shoulders the biggest losses. Ted Turner is also believed to have expressed an interest in a stake of Super Channel. The media giant, who is known to be keen on the European market, pub-

licly put in an offer last September, but this was rejected.

Star Sat On Satellite

by Peter Woernle Munich - Star Sat Radio, the first

German satellite station accessible throughout Europe via ECS Satellite (see M&M issue 11) went on air on March 23.

In Munich and on the German cable networks, the station can be received terrestrially for 10 hours a day. Star Sat's founder Jo Luders expects to reach five million listeners by the middle of the year and hopes that national and international advertising income will be able cover his monthly costs of DM 300.000 within the next three to four months.

* * * The controversial Dutch singer/ entertainer Robert Long's latest LP, Hartstocht (Passion), caused quite a commotion with EMI in Germany because of the photos of semi-nude people on its cover. The company felt this would meet with some resistence from the trade. Helmut Fest, Joint MD of the company, explained: "It's not a moral issue. We have no interest in censorship, we just felt the album is so good that the trade should not be resistant to the product because of the packaging." * * * Over in the UK, Home Secretary Douglas Hurd has agreed to a request for a meeting with the ITV Association which represents the 15 commercial TV channels. Top of the agenda is likely to be the government proposal to auction their franchises in 1992.

* * * It now seems certain that Jorg Eiben Von Hertelll, currently Int. Mark./A&R Mgr. at Metronome, will be joining Chrysalis in Germany as A&R Mgr. He will work with MD Albert Slendebroek; the two used to work together at Phonogram in Germany.

A new GM is expected at BMG France following Claude Brunet's departure in January for an eight month sabbatical.

* * La Cinq, the private French TV channel owned by press tycoon, Robert Hersant, has created a new subsidiary, Cine Cinq, to produce feature films. The company's President is Philippe Ramond, GM of La Cinq, and the new Mgr. is Pierre Heros, La Cinq is already committed to the co-production of eight films with an investment of FFr 37 million.

* * Jack White's record company White Records has extended its distribution contract with BMG/Ariola in Munich: the companies have already been working together for 17 years.

National FM **Appeal Rejected**

London - The government is sticking to its planned allocation of channels for national commercial radio despite intensive lobbying by independent radio stations and the Virgin Broadcast company.

Two AM channels on medium wave (MW) and one FM channel will be available to national commercial radio (NCR). Potential bidders for NCR wanted two FM and one AM channels.

Junior Home Office Minister Timothy Renton told the Voice Of The Listener conference: "We have decided that the BBC should retain four VHF (FM) networks even though those interested in NCR have made it absolutely clear they wanted more VHF".

The news comes as a big disappointment to NCR enthusiasts, and potential bidders, as FM listening in the UK continues a rapid expansion.

station "kept its promises". But public service radio "will not be an obligation on commercial stations", according to Renton

During the conference, Renton was challenged by IBA Head of Radio Programming Paul Brown on the figures he had quoted for the likely running costs of the new radio authority. The government claims a new body, costing about £ 1.5 million annually, would be cheaper than the current IBA setup. Brown pointed out that when the IBA's transmitting costs were deducted the cost would be about the same.





The German Charts - Threatened By The Human Factor?

he next hour is full of ner-vous chatter and hopeful speculation but one topic reigns supreme - where are the company releases in the latest chart? At about 18.00 hours the speculation comes to an end as the chatter of the telex machine abruptly captures everybody's attention. This week's chart, carefully calculated by Media Control in Baden Baden, has arrived. It could prompt the pop of a cork from a bottle of champagne or the firing of the legendary gun that some poor marketing department has put to its figurative head

Although almost everybody in the recording industry worldwide has some valid criticism about what the chart represents and how it is compiled, nobody will deny its importance as a marketing mechanism. Chart position can determine a record's exposure and whether the more cautious record dealers even stock it. As a result, many countries, especially the UK and the US, are regularly rocked by chart

manipulation scandals. Although chart manipulation has occasionally been suspected in Germany, its general reputation is very good. Germany's Crossover Hopes For 1988

The following four pages are a selection of artists chosen by the major record companies for their potential to break outside Germany.

PHILLIP BOA & THE VOODOOCLUB Polydor

Initially Phillip Boa and his band could not get the record company recognition they felt they deserved so they put out records themselves on the Ja-Music label. The first relaxe was *Most Boring World* which met with almost unanimous praise for its new sound and underlying concept. Their first album *Philster* went to no. 1 in the German independent charts and staved there for several months; even



the normally reserved English press liked it so an English version was released.

The release of their second LP and a highly successful tour consolidated their growing reputation as a truly innovative band and in 1987 they signed a major deal with Polydor. The result of this new liaison was *Copperfield* - a record full of passion, strangeness, wit and charm, produced by John Leckie (who previously produced for Pink Floyd, Simple Minds and The Woodentops). It is their bid for worldwide recognition. There are so few genuine eccentrics left in the world of entertainment these days, or at least so few that lift with mainstream culture, that people like Boa are almost essential to the overall maintenance of standards.

INGA & ANETE HUMPE WEA

B etween them, Inga & Anete Humpe have quite a impressive track record that dates back to the late Tos. Inga was singing with Noon Babies while Anete sang, composed and played keyboards with Ideal, another German success story. When both bands split up at the end of I982 the two sisters began working together for the first time. Inga singing and Anete producing. The result was a single, *Im Sauseschritt*, that earned a gold record.

In 1983 they started recording, with Gareth Jones producing, and these sessions yielded the rough demos for their first album. This was released in March 1985 to widespread critical acclaim and until November 1987 they moved from studio to studio working on demos for their eagerly awaited follow-up LP, Swimming With Sharks. Such a high level of expectation creates its own special pressures but the girls have come through with a great record. The style is modern, sophisticated instrumentation and arrangement combined with two of the most original and characteristic voices in contemрогагу рор. 🎆

ROXANNE Intercord

It is not often that you find a hard rock band with a sense of humour. Roxanne seem to possess an element of the irreverence that made Van Halen such an international success. As their first single shows they are more diverse than many of their one-dimensional contemporaries. Covering Wild Cherry's *Play That Funky Music* was a good move.

The band met at school in Riverside, just up the coast from Los Angeles. They were brought together by a mutual love of groups like Led



Zeppelin, Aerosmith and Deep Purple. The first demo received almost immediate attention on local radio while the band were making a reputation for themselves as a live act helped by David Brown's classic rock voice. You could be forgiven for thinking, on first hearing, that the selftitled dobut ablem suffers from an identity crisis, fluctuating as it does between heavy metal, poprock and funk. But in times like these, originality is a welcome breath of fresh air and there will always be room for a mix of styles. Tracks like *Sweet Maria*, *Do It All and Carl Stogo*

ven Vath (stage name Off) grew up near Frankfurt, the son of East German refugees. After school he started training to be an artistic metalworker but the course failed to hold his attention so he set off for the Mediterranean where he worked in a bar until he had decided that what he wanted from life was to be a musician, making soundtracks for a metropolis audience, music that is aggressive but at the same time positive. He has already achieved some European recognition, his first LP, Organisation For Fun, and the two singles taken from it, Electric Salsa and Harry Aber Jetzt, have been setting feet tapping in London, Paris and Amsterdam. It is a simple, uncomplicated record, packed with polished pop songs, a little bit like Depeche Mode's material when Vince Clarke was still in the band. They possess a similar finesse and unremitting chart-oriented directness to bands like Johnny Hates Jazz and Brother Beyond. This is not to say that they are all lightweight froth and no substance as tracks like Gallileo and The Age Of Industry show a certain depth to back up their chart ambitions.





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From Obscurity To **Stardom - The Quick Way**

Newcomers are breaking into the German music market like never before. Totally unknown artists have become best sellers in the past few months. Artists like Schweizer, Inker & Hamilton, Rainbirds and Mandy Winter have sold well while established artists have been unable to keep up with them. The Rainbirds, for instance, have sold 300.000 copies of their debut album.

T here has been an explosion of creativity on the record market according to WEA Managing Director Manfred Zumkeller. German hit producers have reached an international standard and are developing a talent for pushing Anglo-American imports off the top of the charts. Zumkeller: "A new generation of producers have managed to stop their new artists from copying their idols and have convinced them to present themselves with German lyrics and international professionalism."

Zumkeller points out that (at press time) 11 of the top 40 hits were German-originated. This is a spectacular increase on last year. 





As an example of CBS's promo policy he points to the German group Munchener Freiheit. "It took four LPs and 12 singles before they finally broke through. Their latest LP has now sold 400.000 copies and we have done a version with English lyrics, titled Romancing In The Dark. The single from the album, Play It Cool, is also doing well in Holland, Sweden, Norway and Greece.

"Our policy is always to establish local new acts in Germany first. MOR artist Ute Lemper sold 100.000 LPs here before we started to introduce her to the international market. ing Directors is that of TV pop show 'Formel Eins', which all three agree is vital for the promotion of new talent.

Lange says Virgin has a very selective promo policy: "We have a very small artists' roster (about nine artists) so that we can concentrate on each of them. We also don't want to flood the market. All the artists we have signed in the last six years have been newcomers or virtually so. Singer/ songwriter Klaus Hoffman, for

example, was selling around 5.000 LPs before he signed with

man has already sold 25.000 copies after seven months of promotion and we are not giving up. Considering that he is now filling 1.500-2.000 seat venues on his present tour, we reckon he could actually sell about 100.000. This is a typical example of our promo policy.

"Also, we don't have people out on the road, we let new talent come to us. We receive lots of demos and have a close contact with managers and publishers. We actually turn down a lot of good products as we prefer to concentrate our efforts on a few."

He predicts that producer Michael Cretu and vocalist Tissy Thiers, will do well this year. Their single premiered recently on 'Formel Eins' and an LP is scheduled for release in mid-April.

Peter Bruhning, Teldec's Product Manager says his company "is currently moving into the heavy metal/hard rock market, a sector we haven't concentrated on for a long time. We recently signed two local bands, Caro and Kingdom, which we think can compete in terms of quality with international and major local artists. We have two heavy metal specialists on our staff who really know this area and we expect these groups' new albums to be a success. We have hundreds of artists on our roster of which about half are new talent."



Van der Wal, ex-Chrysalis Label Manager at BMG/Ariola Holland, started Chrysalis Holland as a separate unit on October I last year together with Carola Wassink, Press Manager, and Leonie Bauer, Promotion Manager. Within a month the hits started to pour in. Icehouse's Crazy was the label's first Top 10 hit, followed by Jellybean's The Real Thing. And then something remarkable happened.

Dutch NOS DJ Frits Spits played a track of unusual length six and a half minutes - in his daily primetime show 'De Avondspits'. Not only was the song unusually long but the slow and brooding melody, featuring O'Connor's unique vocals, was strikingly different.

Van Der Wal: "The response to one play of Troy was amazing. The next day we were flooded with requests from retailers." Spits continued to play the track and eventually the single went Top 5 and the LP, The Lion And The Cobra, hit Top 3. The ratio of sales to original radio play was incredibly high.

After breaking the Troy single the Dutch Chrysalis branch continued its trendsetting function with hits from Paul Carrack (Don't Shed A Tear) and the Scottish folk duo The Proclaimers (Letter From America). Since October I there has been a Chrysalis record in the Dutch Top 40 chart every week.
