Radio 1 Decline Continues **As Local Stations Gain**

LONDON - BBC Radio 1 received what it hopes will be its last disappointing ratings on May 1, one week after launching its new programme schedule and up-beat advertising campaign "Radio 1 As It

According to the latest Rajar/RSL audience research, the station has lost another half a million listeners since the start of the year.

Radio 1's market share (weekly reach multiplied by listening hours) dropped from 11.3% in the last quarter of 1994 to 10.8% in the first quarter of 1995. Local stations appear to be the main beneficiaries, with local commercial radio increasing its share from 38% to 38.5%, and local/ regional BBC stations up from 10.2% to 10.7%.

However, the BBC managed to quash commercial radio's marginal lead established for the first time in the previous round with a 48.7%

share compared to commercial radio's 48.4%. But the figure for commercial radio excludes Talk Radio UK's 0.9% share as the station was only on-air for the latter part of the research period.

The biggest regional success is ACE Heart FM, which has almost doubled its audience share.

The figures are a blow to Radio 1's management, who had hoped that the national station's audience loss was gradually slowing down. However, the lost listeners recorded in this quarter (495.000) were well over twice those recorded in the last Rajar sur-

Sue Farr, head of marketing and publicity at BBC Network Radio, says that she believes the fall was due to

"intensive and negative speculation surrounding Wright's departure which further undermined confidence in the station."

She also blames the unsettling effect of other recent changes to Radio 1's daytime schedule. However, Farr says that the BBC remains confident that Radio 1 can soon stop the decline, especially with the capture of Chris Evans.

"We believe that the impact of most of the planned changes are largely behind us, and that we will enjoy an audience stabilisation over time.

Industry highlights this week

■ UNITED KINGDOM

BBC Runs 12-Hour DJ Mix Show

BBC Radio 1 broadcast a 12hour live mix show on May 8. A line-up of four DJs, including club celebrities Danny Rampling and Pete Tong, played a set which advanced from pop-dance to progressive house during the course of the day. The Bank Holiday Monday show continued the station's involvement in the UK dance scene. Radio 1 already broadcasts a weekly Saturday night show which lures prominent DJs like Amsterdam's Dimitri into the studio to play two-hour sets. In cooperation with rave promoters Cream, the Essential Mix Show has also taken to the road this spring. The final date for the Essential Selection parties is May 27 and enlists the talents of Rampling, Tong and rave pioneer Paul Oakenfold.

■ GERMANY

Vangelis Sets Sales Record Greek composer and multiinstrumentalist Vangelis has scored a triple platinum hit in Germany with the single Conquest Of Paradise. With more than 1.5 million copies sold, the record is the best-selling single in Germany since 1976. Demand for the song was boosted by boxing champion Henry Maske who adopted the song as his theme melody during fights in autumn 1994. Vangelis is signed to East West Records Germany, which secured a deal with Maske earlier this year. Maske has also selected the tracks for the Power & Glory compilation series for East West, the first of which has already reached gold status with sales of 250.000 copies.

HOLLAND

Alabianca Benelux, Warner Basart Co-Exploit Flying's Publishing

Alabianca Benelux and Warner Basart have closed a joint venture to exploit the publishing catalogue of Italian dance indie Flying Records for the Benelux region. Meanwhile, Yvo Kaatman has joined Alabianca's record company as promotions and product manager.

■ FRANCE

Young, De Palmas Star In NRJ Free Concerts Paul Young and French Chrysalis act De Palmasvoted best upcoming male artist during the Victoires de la Musique—will give a series of 25 free concerts this spring. Sponsored by drinks manufacturer Ricard and EHR net NRJ, the concerts will be held between May 5 and June 10. The concerts are organised by Ricard S.A. Live Music, an association which has been created to produce free concerts with what is believed to be Europe's largest mobile stage. James Brown will replace Young in the cities of Avignon, Toulon, Marseille and Montpellier.

■ SPAIN

M-80 Gives Listeners Chance To Live Rent-Free Cadena SER's formula/gold oldies net M-80 Serie Oro has launched a listener draw in which the station will pay the winner's rent or mortgage for one month. Listeners have to ring a special number to enter the weekly draw. The initiative, which lasts for four weeks until the end of May, is part of the programme "Levantate Y Anda" (Get Up And Walk), presented by Jordi Casoliva. M-80, which has a daily audience of around 500.000, has staged a number of unusual campaigns in recent months. These include the collection of signatures opposing the removal of the giant Osborne brandy metal bulls dotted around the Spanish landscape, and the sharing out of 80.000 kisses on St Valentine's Day.

Cafe, Bar Owners Angry At Authors Rights Payments

Half a million people have signed a petition backing the Spanish Federation of Restaurants, Cafes and Bars (FER) in a bitter row with the performing rights society SGAE. The 200.000-strong FER is angered by the payment of an authors' rights levy paid by any establishment which has a television or radio to entertain the public. FER says the payment of just Pta 1.600 (app. US\$13) a month-which brings SGAE a total of Pta3.8 billion a year-is "unjust and a legal monstrosity." The organisation is to present the petition to parliament in the hope that the 1987 Law of Intellectual Property can be changed. However, the SGAE says the levy is not a tax but the salary of authors who live from the exploitation of their works.

Sveriges Radio Looks To Sponsors For Extra Funds

STOCKHOLM - Increased commercial sponsorship of programmes aired on Sveriges Radio (SR) could replace funding lost due to government cutbacks.

Following the introduction of a tough austerity budget by the country's social democratic government (Music & Media, January 21), SR is currently finalising plans to cut its finances by 11% with the board due to announce details in June.

However, while examining where the cutbacks should be made, the station has been considering increasing its income by raising the number of programmes backed by sponsors.

At present sponsorship of broadcasts is allowed, although in practice it is confined to large sporting events and cannot be used for SR's own programmes. One problem with sponsor announcements has been that they stand out so strongly on the otherwise commercial-free public service channels.

Many in the industry fear

that by accepting commercials SR will blur the distinction between itself and the new private stations, and questions remain over how much money can realistically be raised by doing so.

However, the idea has been welcomed by the former head of SR's music and youth channel P3 Lisa Söderberg who is now in charge of the radio news service.

"Sponsorship can not make a really big difference, but it certainly can make a contribution," Söderberg explained at a conference organised by the advertising industry magazine Resumé.

She also warned that the "cheeseslicer" approach to cutbacks in SR, in which little bits are shaved off budgets here and there, would not work. More fundamental changes are needed which could well entail the loss of up to 250 jobs. However, she said that SR's leadership would not be putting forward any plans to privatise P3.

Survey Underlines Latest Irish Trends

Dublin - The recent problems experienced by Dublin commercial station FM104 have been reflected in the latest Joint National Listenership Research (JNLR) figures.

While leading Dublin commercial Classic Hits 98FM held its own in the city with an unchanged reach figure of 29%, FM104's figure dropped from 19% to 18%.

FM104 has threatened legal action against the JNLR as the station claims its true market share was not reflected in the last annual survey published in January. FM104 MD Dermot Hanrahan has said the figures did not take into account changes in programming schedules (Music & Media, April 29).

The latest JNLR interim survey covers the six-month period from October 1994 to March 1995. It is drawn purely from research samples in Dublin and Cork and is based on "listened yesterday" information only.

The figures show that, in Dublin, national pubcaster 2FM has increased it listenership by two percentage points since the last interim figures were released for the period July to December 1994.

Significantly, 2FM's good figures look even better in their target audience of 20 to 44 year-olds with a daily reach of 38%, an increase of 4% and three points ahead of its nearest commercial rival, Classic Hits 98FM.

Enterprise Radio Buys Out Swansea Sound

LONDON - Enterprise Radio, the radio division of Eastern Counties Newspapers, has taken over the South Wales independent local radio station Swansea Sound.

On air since 1975, Swansea Sound was one of the few commercial radio stations left in the UK which was not part of a major radio group. It recently regained both its AM and FM licences unopposed.

"Swansea Sound has a considerable heritage," says Ian Davies, managing director of Enterprise Radio. "But in

recent years it hasn't performed as well as it should, and has been sounding rather tired."

Davies adds that, later on

Swansea Sound was one of the few commercial radio stations left in the UK which was not part of a major radio group.

this year, Swansea Sound will split its frequencies and offer different programming on AM and FM. The station currently simulcasts on both.

"The existing station will, very broadly, be transferred to AM and will continue to carry the Swansea Sound name. A new FM service will feature a format designed to get back the younger audience, which the station has lost in recent years."

Davies has given assurances that Welsh-language programmes, which Swansea Sound currently broadcasts every evening, will be maintained, albeit mostly on the AM service.

Although Enterprise Radio has holdings in several UK radio stations, the Swansea Sound takeover is the first time that the company has secured a majority shareholding.

However, Ian Davies says that the company is looking to acquire control of one or two more stations where it already has investments. Stations in which Enterprise Radio currently has a stake include Kiss 102/Manchester, JFM/London and Surrey and North-East Hampshire broadcasting.

Chieftains Continue US Tour Success In Europe

DUBLIN - Still in the middle of a European tour, traditional Irish folk band the Chieftains put in a performance at the 1995 World Music Awards in Monte Carlo on May 3.

The special appearance in front of 800 million TV view-

ers in more than 90 countries marks another stage in the Chieftains' long career.

The band has played on albums by Mick Jagger, Elvis Costello and Paul McCartney. On the cur-

rent album Long Black Veil they have called in a few old favours. Contemporary pop personalities like the Rolling Stones, Sting and Sinead O'Connor wrap their vocal chords around the Chieftains' sparsely-arranged folk ballads.

"We asked people to join us in the studio," says Paddy

Moloney, founding band member and Uileann pipe (bagpipe) player. "Many artists look for inspiration in Irish traditional music." Over the years, the Chieftains have proven to be open minded to pop, rock and country music.

Founded in 1962, the Chieftains have performed

with the current line-up since 1978. Sponsored by Irish brewer Guinness, the European tour takes the band to 25 cities in 10 countries and finishes on 29 June at the Roskilde Festival in Denmark. None of the guest stars on Long Black Veil are present on stage during the tour.

AER Looks To The Future, Creates Five Point Plan

PARIS - The Association of European Radio (AER), which groups together 4.500 private stations across Europe, held its general assembly in Paris last month, under the aegis of the president of French Senate René Monory.

The meeting—attended by some 30 radio executives including association president Benoit Sillard, also president of Fun Radio—laid down a series of five key issues to be tackled in the future.

The first of these was author's rights. Association of Independent Radio Companies (UK) director Brian West and president of the Spanish commercial radio association AERC Alfonso Ruiz de Assin have been assigned to draft a white paper "on the dangers of new legislation linked to digital transmission" together with the European Broadcasting Union and

the NAB. The paper will be presented to the European Commission (EC), the legislative arm of the European Union.

The AER will also concentrate on new technologies, the second of its key issues, and will present to the EC a definition of the business of a broadcaster in light of these advancements.

The third key issue discussed at the April 20 meeting was advertising. The AER pledged to fight for an end to the limitation of products banned from advertising.

The AER will also call upon the EC to come up with a directive "on the balance between financing and access to frequencies in private and public radio;" its fourth objective.

As part of its fifth and final key issue, the association will warn the EC on the risks of issuing a directive on competition and anti-concentration within the broadcasting field.

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EMI Renews Benelux Team

BRUSSELS - EMI Benelux has appointed Erwin Goegebeur as marketing director in a further step to "smooth" the co-ordination between its activities in Belgium and Holland.

Goegebeur will oversee the marketing operations in the two countries and will be based in Holland half of the time, taking over from Maarten Steinkamp who has left to join BMG Holland.

"It is important to stress that we are not creating a Beneluxcompany," says EMI Belgium MD Dirk de Clippeleir, "as both Belgium and Holland will keep their own marketing departments and structure."

He says that this will allow EMI to work out better promotion plans. One facet of this will be to combine radio and TV marketing for both territories.

Goegebeur's appointment is the company's third for the combined Belgian/Dutch operations. He follows Dominique Frantzen, sales director for Belgium and the Netherlands, and Lut Behiels, classical marketing manager Belgium and the Netherlands.



The Crusade For A Credible Eurovision

With Ireland hosting the Eurovision Song Contest for the third time this year following three consecutive wins, other countries are fighting even harder to produce a song to take them to victory on May 13. However, with the biggest hit to come out of last year's edition being the interval act Riverdance by Bill Whelan, serious questions have been raised about the relevance of the contest itself. UK music veteran Jonathan King is determined to restore the credibility of the event, with more chart-worthy music and more European recognition. Dermott Hayes reports.



ONATHAN KING wants Britain to win this year's 40th Eurovision Song Contest so he can take it by the scruff of the neck and make it the plat-

form for exciting new talent he has always believed it can be.

"I have enormous faith in good music," he told Music & Media. "I tried to encourage a wider amount of people to consider it as a means for the exposure of new product."

King took over Britain's "Song for Europe" this year intending to put his ideas into practice. "We ended up with eight acts and the show was a great triumph of British songwriting. It is the first year in living memory that five out of eight of the songs charted."

But is there really a way to change the Eurovision Song Contest, by now a venerable institution and in its 40th year? For some countries the Eurovision Song Contest is everything it is cracked up to be.

For others, it is an annual television and radio event which draws more entertainment for the often nailbiting and sometimes hilarious voting patterns that conclude the show.

But whatever its current format, could it be entrusted to someone whose taste for hit-making pop songs has given us *Everyone's Gone To The Moon* and *Una Paloma Blanca*?

More Emphasis On Songwriting

This year Britain's "Song for Europe" put the emphasis on young songwriting and writers. Fledgling bands and groups were encouraged to put themselves and their music forward. "We wanted to show them the value of all that exposure in a major market and on prime time TV," says King.

And what would he do with Eurovision if he laid hands on it? "The first thing I would do is allow countries to choose what language they want to sing in. The next thing I would do is open up the use of new technology [to allow greater flexibility]. There are some very strict limitations in place at the moment. Then," he concludes, "I'd promote Eurovision in Europe."

Simply put, King would like to have all the viewers and listeners of Eurovi-

sion, the high point of the European Broadcasting Union's popular entertainment programming, take the Con-

test seriously as the greatest platform for the very best music in Europe, without allowing it to lose its fun and humour.

The Expensive Honour Of Being Host

It's a tall order. Ireland has won the contest more times than any other country, with six wins to date, the last three were consecutive. The honour of hosting an unprecedented three contests in a row falls to Ireland this year.

Hosting the Eurovision Song Contest is a massive year-long task and can take a substantial bite out of a national TV organization's annual production budget. Last year when Charlie McGettigan and Paul Harrington won the third contest in a row for Ireland, the cheers were almost smothered by the grinding of RTE executives' teeth.

Three wins in a row may be a flattering statement about Irish songwriting and performing. It could also be a sad comment on the standard of entries from other countries.

Few major international careers, with the glaring exception of Abba, have been launched on the strength of a Eurovision win. Instead most of the

artists relax into an up-market and pan-European cabaret circuit.

In the past even the interval act has been known to gain more international kudos than the winner. Hothouse Flowers launched their career with a Eurovision interval performance and last year's Riverdance spectacular of music and dancing became one of the biggest ever selling singles in Ireland and went on to become a British chart success.

Riverdance has since inspired a full CD of music from Bill Whelan's original composition as well as a hit song, music and dance stage show.

"Although I have always been a great admirer of Hothouse

Flowers and Riverdance, it became a hit in Britain because I kept saying it would be," King says, "it is iniquitous that the best music should be left for the interval."



A Return To Home Entertainment

This year's Eurovision producer, John McHugh, plans a return to Eurovision's traditional values of home entertain-

"Because of the success of Riverdance last year there's been a lot of emphasis put on what we'll do to follow it, but the point is we don't want to 'follow' it," says McHugh. "We want to get people concentrating on the songs again and the voting.

This year RTE has commissioned

pianist Micheal O'Suilleabhain to compose a work for the interval and the performance will involve the RTE Concert Orchestra, a host of traditional Irish musicians, a collection of contemporary and traditional singers including Brian Kennedy and Clannad's Maire Ni Bhraonain and the monks of Glenstal Abbey in Co Limerick. Rumours of the possible involvement of Sinead O'Connor have been vigorously denied. At one stage there was even talk of a Boyzone appearance.

Britain's "Song for Europe" entries cast a wide net and included everything from the wiggling pop of Samantha Fox to the urban rap music of

Love City Groove, the name of the eventual winning act and their song.

Time To Recognise Real Hits

King believes if a song is a hit it will win, despite the frequently raised spectre of countries voting with a national bias and the persistent notion that a winning Eurovision song is a phenomenon with its own pedigree. It may last the pace at Eurovision but in the cold, harsh commercial light of radio airplay, it rarely lasts the pace.

King concedes a rap song may present a challenge to Eurovision's traditional values but the song, he says, is capable of winning. In his own inimitable fashion, he is willing the English

entry to victory because a win for an English rap song would provide him with the ideal ammunition to put his ideas into practice.

Eurovision audiences for TV and radio could amount to over 200 million. This year there were 23 entries, and. while some nations like Italy have no entry, there are candidates from Slovenia, Russia, Bosnia Herzegovena and Croatia.

Once more. biggest TV and radio audience in Europe for one single entertainment event will tune in to see the 23 countries battle it out for the coveted prize. But as the cost and the spectacle increases the avenues for awards have narrowed. There is a growing suspicion Eurovision exists purely for itself. The songs are tailor-made for Eurovision audiences and have little

relevance outside the annual contest.

That is a condition Jonathan King would like to see changed. Perhaps he may get the chance next year. But first the British have to win



The Belgian Media Maze

With a population of 10 million, Belgium is a small member of the European Union with a healthy music industry and the highest cable penetration in Europe. However, with three administrative regions (Flanders, Wallonia and Brussels), three languages and two legislatory systems, the country often proves to be a maze of difficulties for foreign companies looking to invest in the country's media industry. No other European country can boast so many ministers per km². Marc Maes reports.



OU could well describe Belgium as a concentration of talent for export," believes Patrick Decam, MD of Sony Music Entertain-

ment, while colleague Dirk de Vries, Brussels-based VP at EMI International, points to the speed with which things can happen in the Belgian music industry. "Belgium is one of Europe's most intriguing markets, where a lot can happen very quickly."

Belgium's music industry is healthy, but with the three regions subject to two different legislatory systems, foreign investors and companies hoping to tap into the country's thriving media industries often find themselves baffled by red tape and contradictory regulations.

For both local and international companies hoping to exploit the buoyant atmosphere, the divided nature of the country means duplicate expenses and two-tier campaigns. As a consequence, Decam points out that "artists like Zap Mama, 2 Unlimited or Nicholas Lens (Flamma Flamma) sell more abroad than here."

Two-Tier Marketing Policies Waste Money

"Companies regularly have to duplicate their marketing and promotion costs to cover the whole country," he says, "and even have to apply different tactics in north and south. We had to do that with Bruce Springsteen's *Greatest Hits* to increase sales in the French community."

At EMI/Virgin de Vries explains how sales for Axelle Red's debut album Sans Plus Attendre went. "The bulk of the sales were made one year after its release, and the French-speaking areas of the country only reacted in the last step of the campaign.

"That is a perfect example of Belgium as a two-speed market. But I think a lot of it has to do with the economical situation in the French community, and the fact that the Flemish are more open and optimistic than the French."

Furthermore, he believes the current differences may widen with a revival in cultural awareness. "Many people are now becoming more aware of

their cultural identity," says de Vries. In the last five years the launch of TV-station VTM has helped to reduce the Dutch influence in the media in Flanders. Meanwhile, in the south, the French community is also becoming more independent from France.

With the best cable penetration of Europe, Belgium is heavily exposed to foreign media including MTV European, MCM, and TV from France, Holland and Germany, and, in terms of internationalism, the country can be seen as an example of what Europe will become in a few year's time.

However, points out media consultant Lucy Rozenbaum, "While Belgium is *one* member of the EU, the main problem is that when you ask one question, you very often get *two* answers. That's the main problem for foreign



investors, who arrive expecting to have to cope with two or three languages, but think that is the only difficulty they will face."

Network Ban Puts Off Advertisers

IP Radio marketing manager Denis Masquelier has to deal daily with radio in both the north and south of the country, and is constantly faced with the contrasts between the two communities. "Private stations are market leaders in the south, despite the fact that the public broadcaster RTBF started taking advertising in 1991. They are



well organised; they offer good product and listening comfort."

However, since the "anti-network-decree" passed in Flanders in 1990 private stations in the north have been suffering, deprived of stereo signal, satellite transmissions or networking facilities.

"I do believe that a more liberal and just legislation in the north would have an advantageous effect on advertising

rates," he says. "Today's advertisers have no alternative but to book their national campaigns with the BRTN—at excessive rates."

Foreign media buyers coming to IP Network International perceive the small Belgian market as far more complex than the bigger European territories, he says. "And this drama has been going on for years now! New legislation would allow IP Radio to boost its opera-

tions in the north."

According to Christian De Bève, MD of the 17-station NRJ Belgique (as well as two NRJ-stations and one Nostalgie outlet in Alsace), "The split legislation is becoming a major problem. Radio is

progressing very rapidly, while legislation is very sluggish to react. Audiences are taken hostage and, especially in Flanders, small radio operations are being pushed away."

The two regions also have different cultural problems, says Rozenbaum. The French community has a very strong neighbour (France) and speaks one of the world's leading languages. Meanwhile, the Flemish belong to a minority culture in terms of population.

Industry Awaits New Legislation

Masquelier hopes that the forthcoming elections on May 21 will increase the role of liberals in

21 will increase the role of liberals in the coalition government, and lead to changes in the Flemish mediascape. He would like to see a freedom-of-radio clause join the laws defending freedom of speech and freedom of press.

"Meanwhile, stations are standing by waiting for the law to be relaxed. All former Radio Contact affiliates in the north have retained their pre-1991 profile," he says, adding that "there is probably room for another Fun-type of station in Flanders."

De Bève, meanwhile points to the optimum size of Belgium as a potential breeding ground for great radio. "Despite the regional differences, the country is just the right size to allow format radio to stay close to its listeners. Stations are also very close to each other here."

As government processes are advancing slowly, bringing legislative change nearer, media experts are confident that solutions will be possible. Rozenbaum points out that that split legislation is not unique to Belgium. "In Germany, the audiovisual legislation is also regulated by the individual Bundesländer; a station which has access to the cable in the north will not necessarily have the same facilities in Bavaria.

"I'm convinced that, on a certain level, the two language communities do communicate. Take, for example, the EBU-regulations on FM frequencies. Those frequencies are granted to Belgium as a single country, leaving the fieldwork to the regional governments. So they do talk..."


While she recommends all potential foreign investors to "study the Belgian mediascape carefully and to get advice from skilled professionals," De Beve advocates the launch of a national radio-body—rather than the four or five groups who currently claim to represent stations. "This would give the government skilled spokespartners in the media debates."

Tempest Changes Totally Under The Influence Of Music

STOCKHOLM - Interpret the lyrics to album track Under The Influence a little differently, and relate them to its singer Joev Tempest, and you get his declaration of intent: "Maybe you give up everything; you got to prove you're right when they say you're not." Only a few would have believed this was the former

Europe mainstay when they first heard the leadoff single A Place To Call Home of his same-titled solo debut album on Polar. The Final Countdown of pretty boy hard rock has ended, we're now witnessing the launch of a career as a bona fide singer/songwriter. May we ask you to listen without prejudice....?

Grunge has killed off more traditional hard rock, as we know. But in who earnestness. expected this? Tempest's musical development is fully parallel to Bon

Jovi's, the big survivors of the class of '86. Away the perm hairdoes, the spandex trousers, the attitude problems and the loudmouth rock. As soon as you hear the single, you get the idea you're listening to Tom Petty's "Lost Tapes" or a previously unreleased Todd Snider song.

2/Radiomafia/Helsinki among the first EHR stations to add the fully restyled Swedish artist. Primetime show presenter Harri Hakanen, hard rocker through and through, was pleasantly surprised by Tempest's drastic musical change. "It doesn't remind me of Europe at all, which is a good thing. Repeating the Europe sound would have been commercial suicide. Radio-wise A Place To Call Home has the right sort of predictability about it. For some reason the Swedes and Norwegians are very good at this well-produced Americanstyled pop rock. The guy is obviously very comfortable with the genre.'

Mr. Tempest himself agrees with Hakanen's statement about the confident change of musical direction. "During the last years with Europe I felt that I

wanted to learn more about music," recalls Tempest. "When you grow up as a teenager you just listen to the same kind of music all the time. I had a hunger for music, I to listen started to singer/songwriters and more traditional music. Also, felt myself changing. I grew up and wanted to break away from being in an '80s rock band.'

The principal drive behind the album was a desire to come straight with his new musical direction. "It was impor-

tant for me to be honest in what I was doing. So I couldn't do grunge, and certainly not '80s rock anymore. I prefer to listen to Jackson Browne or Tom Petty.'

The question is, are fans from the Europe days going to buy this? "I hope some of the Europe fans have developed with me," counters Tempest. "Maybe I'll also reach new listeners, who are more into what I do now and weren't into Europe so much. That would give me great pleasure. But I have a lot of patience. This is for the long term; I learned with Europe you should never pin everything on one album."

Similar words are echoed by Sven Sturm, A&R manager at Polydor Germany, Polar's joint venture partner in this specific project. "We strongly believe we have to build this up carefully. Joey is going to stay in this musical area. He's too old to be a curly boy with make up, shaking his hips on stage amidst exploding fireworks. In only the first week out we sold 10.000 copies, which we see as very promising."

Still the main problem will be getting the demographic right. Who are the potential buyers and what kind of stations are going to play Tempest?

PolyGram director of promotions of continental European repertoire Jan Abbink warns of preconception problems in the media field. "On both the EHR and ACE format we encounter serious obstruction. For the first it's mainly a credibility problem. It will be important to convince them that Joey is now totally different from Europe. ACE formats also have to be assured the album is not too

With a funny anecdote Tempest's manager Thomas Johansson of EMA-Telstar illustrates his belief that everything will turn out fine eventually. "Joev and I went to a gig of Radiohead in Stockholm which I promoted, and two 16-year old girls came up to him. One of them asked him for a autograph for her boyfriend, who was playing Joey's album all the time. In the past it would have been the boys who would ask him for a signature for their girlfriends, because of his fabulous looks. If that doesn't show the difference between then and now, I don't know what would. In my eyes Joey has it all to become the first grown-up European rock star, one like the US have got so many of-Springsteen, Petty, you name them.

Jonas Hildeland, A&R manager at the Polar side of the record deal isn't afraid of demographic problems either. "Here in Sweden we have managed to reverse the trend. When we first announced that we had signed Joey, we got lots of sceptical reactions. Every question mark around the start of this project has been straightened out by producer Dan Sundquist though. Our hard work and commitment couldn't be better rewarded than by the chart entry at number 7."

In the same week (18) the single went to number 7 of M&M's Border Breakers chart too. Radio FFN/Isernhagen (Germany) head of music Frank Eichner was co-responsible for that achievement. "This kind of singer/songwriter material—made on wooden instruments-might be an anti-wave to rave and over-technical productions. It's a fine pop rock song, and I'm curious to see if it will work.

The next single We Come Alive is again a three-chord rocker with a high singalong quotient. Hildeland is determined not to go with the obvious rock ballad right away. "Take it as our statement. We have to portray him as another singer who has abandoned the high notes and all that spiel.'

Tempest himself hopes people will dig deep into the album to give it some longevity. "I start from scratch again. Even if I'm at number 80 I would be happy. It's so great to be able to start all over again. I'm not pretending to prolong Europe. This is straight from the heart. Maybe in the future I'll be doing something with Europe again, but now I want to something that's honest to me. I'd love to play with Counting Crows at some stage, that's more what I do now.'

Johansson expects a European concert tour not to take place before the autumn. "With 50 songs ready to pick from, material isn't the problem, but we first want to have a base before we go out on the road. With Europe he did such big shows from Tokyo to Bombay and Rio for 50.000 people. Now it will be a 'little' more

Italian Bluesman Pino Daniele Goes Back To Pop Songs

LONDON - Neapolitan bluesman Pino Daniele has released an ace album with which to consolidate his growing popularity in Europe. Non Calpestare I Fiori Nel Deserto ("Don't Tread On The Flowers In The Desert") on CGD-East West is a collection of strong melodic songs which also demonstrates the artist's unique voice and guitar virtuosity.

Daniele has been one of Italy's most innovative musicians for more than a decade, releasing over a dozen albums fusing traditional Neapolitan music with jazz, blues and modern pop influences. His new album also draws on rap, with Italian rapper Jovanotti co-writing and performing on two songs, Stress and Un Deserto Di Parole ("A Desert Of Words").

On previous releases, Daniele has collaborated with jazz musicians Chick Corea and Wayne Shorter, while Jimmy Earl plays bass and Manu Katché plays drums on his latest release. Jazz influences remain on Daniele's new album, but the artist acknowledges that this latest collection of songs marks a return to strong, easily recognisable melodies.

The first single release Io Per Lei ("Me For You") is a sure radio hit with its immediate sing-a-long melodic hook, simple guitar refrain and Daniele's sweet

falsetto vocals. The album released at the end of immediately reached the number 1 position in the FIMI/ Nielsen album chart and has remained at the top for four weeks selling 250,000 copies so far, with the single being playlisted on practically all major national and regional networks.

"It's a great radio hit," comments Grant Benson, music director at Bergamo-based EHR network RTL 102.5 Hit Radio. "Daniele has such a large fan base in Italy that anything he does is immediately a great success. However, this single is a dream for radio programmers with a very catchy hook, which can stand repeated plays without becoming boring.

Luciano Linzi, marketing director at CGD-East West says that Pino Daniele, who is currently touring Italy, is considering European dates for this summer. "He has so far concentrated on Italy," says Linzi. "However, some dates

Germany and Switzerland with Eros Ramazzotti last Jovanotti year whetted his appetite to reach a wider audience. He is very popular among other artists and record company professionals in Europe. Also, there was a very good response from audiences at the concerts. Hopefully we can fix

European dates for some time this year."

Daniele's productions for Italian Warner affiliate CGD have been originally released in Germany on the East West label. The artist's last two albums are handled through East West's import division TIS. CD's for the German market are still manufactured in Germany but bear the original CGD label. TIS product manager Jürgen Tiessen names low sales volumes for Italian adult-orientated product as the main reason for East West's decision.

The market for Italian language rock and pop is fairly quiet at the moment, comments Tiessen.

Daniele's new album is full of radio friendly tracks, including the duet Se Mi Vuoi ("If You Want Me"), a delicious ballad with Irene Grandi, one of Italy's up and coming performers. Un Angolo Di Cielo ("A Corner Of Heaven") has a pleasing reggae lilt, and Fumo Nero ("Black Smoke") is a classic Daniele piece with a racey bassline, blues organ, mediterranean guitar and oriental flourishes.

"Love is the principle theme of the album," said Daniele in an article he wrote for the daily newspaper La Republica. "I start with classical Neapolitan style, and through different ethnic musics, including blues, I look to create new forms of communications. The contamination of Italian melody with other cultures is the expression of modern city life.

LITFIBA

Spirito - EMI a/r/ehr PRODUCER: Rick Parashar/Litfiba Scandalously overlooked by the pan-European media mob, the Italian pop rockers have now hired Rik Parashar for the production job. For those who don't know what that means: he's the same guy behind the bulldozer sound of Pearl Jam's 1991 debut Ten. It's going too far to speak of Italian-language grunge, but Eddie Vedder's spirit is certainly audible through tracks like Lo Spectacolo and Spirito. Talk about the Seattle connotations on the German college circuit, and a surprise album hit is a realistic prospect. It happened to Spain's Héroes Del Silencio, so why not to them?

Big Star and the Stones must be among Wilco's favourites, as you can discern on I Must Be High and Casino Queen respectively. Songwriter is lead vocalist Jeff Tweedy who makes the same impression as a "lazy bastard" as J. Mascis or Evan Dando. Straightforward country outlets which normally wouldn't touch such material, should try the tearjerker I Thought I Held You like they did with the Jayhawks's Blue.

Latin Breaks Language Barriers

Music from Latin America is enjoying an unprecedented resurgence in popularity that seems able to leap geographic as well as linguistic borders.

ATIN American is increasingly imprecise name for a culture spread across two continents and a multitude of Caribbean islands. New York, Miami and Los Angeles are now as much a part of Latin America as Havana or Rio. The assortment of musical styles engendered by this eclectic mix of European and African influences is staggering. But it is just this proximity of diverse cultural currents that gives Latin music its vitality and makes it so influential on popular music.

Although a number of independent European labels—Bella-phon, Mango, Piranha, World Circuit, Globestyle—release some Latin product, and majors like PolyGram and EMI with their Verve World and Hemisphere imprints have decided to exploit the often abundant riches of their affiliated labels' local catalogues. The natural gateway into Europe for most new Latin music- with the exception of Brazilian-has traditionally been, and remains, Spain.

Juan Luis Guerra, who has sold upwards of seven million records worldwide, is a case in point. Nacho Scola, founder and ex-director of Karen Records

distributed worldwide by BMG), introduced singer/songwriter from the Dominican Republic to Spanish audiences in 1989. At the time, Guerra and his band of fifteen years 4:40, enjoyed some local renown outside his native island. Scola recalls, "His success is owed A well-calculated risk first of all to the high

quality of his music, and secondly to the painstaking work we did with few resources. It was a matter of a thousand grains of sand slowly building up. The media only started to pay attention when his first concerts sold out weeks ahead of

Gloria Estefan (Sony)

At first they got only local radio airplay. But as momentum built, Radio Minuto (now M-80), a Spanish net headed at the time by Sinfo Radio director Jorge de Anton, jumped in, and the music-and name-of Juan Luis Guerra started becoming known in Spain. The album Bachata Rosa was the breakthrough, and it started to catch on in the rest of Europe, primarily in Portugal and, more significantly, in Holland. The album went on to sell some five million copies worldwide, making the Dominican artist the most important Latin artist of the decade.

"Juan Luis Guerra has undoubtedly helped open the market for Latin American music," affirms BMG Ariola Spain international label manager Antonio Garcia-Oñate. "Although he is viewed more as an original artist than as a representative of a particular style, in this case merengue. Nevertheless, these days when companies receive tapes of Latin artists they are more apt to pay attention."

BMG itself just released

singer/songwriter Carlos Varela's Como Los Peces, somewhat unusual in that he is one of Cuba's most popular younger artists, inheritor of the "nueva trova" pioneered by Milanés and Pablo Rodríguez, but remains unissued on the island itself, and is signed directly to the Spanish multinational. Garcia-Oñate also points out the growing popularity of Mexican rock formations like Maldita Vecindad and Caifanes.


Young Mexican Talent

Maná is another Mexican group which the world will soon hear more

about, having sold more than two million units of their last CD. They perform a song the upcoming soundtrack album of Francis Ford Coppola's "Mi Familia," which includes tracks by Los Lobos and Juan Luis Guerra among others. Their version of Fool In The Rain appeared on the recent Led Zeppelin tribute

Their new album, When Angels Cry, has just been released on Warner.

Luis Miguel is Warner's other Mexican star. Only 24 years old, he already has ten albums to his name, has won a Grammy (for a duet with Sheena Easton), has seen singles from one of his albums dominate the #1 spot on Billboard's "Hot Latin Tracks" for more than a year, and his CD Romance, a collection of classic boleros, has sold nearly five million copies worldwide. A second collection has gone pLatinum (100.000 copies) in Spain. He seems poised for crossover to non-Latin markets.

Stars Pay Off

Gloria Estefan has sold almost a million copies in Spain alone of her Spanish-language Mi Tierra for Sony. The recording, along with Linda Ronstadt's two recent Spanish language albums Canciones De Mi Padre and Más Canciones, testify to the increasing importance of the Latin marketand to the increased willingness of non-Latin consumers to overlook questions of language in favor of a particular artist.

From the perspective of record companies these were risky projects. Both paid off. Ruben Blades is another Latin artist with tremendous crossover power ever since his landmark 1984 album Ruscando America broke both music and language barriers. Tras La Tormenta (After The Storm) is his new disc made together with modern salsa pioneer Colon. Perhaps the artist with the greatest potential to snatch the crown away from Juan Luis Guerra is Columbian neo-cumbia star Carlos Vives. His PolyGram CD Clasicos De La Provincia is a scintilLating blend of native cumbia rhythms with elements of pop, reggae, and jazz which manages the rare feat of sounding both authentic and modern at the same time. It was released in Spain last year, and went triple pLatinum, although the artist was little known on this side of the Atlantic at the time.

Mercury marketing and A&R director Avelino Esparza outlines the label's strategy. "We made a large initial investment by bringing the band's 21 musicians and technicians over to do showcases. Several concerts, interviews, some television coverage, a single, and support from Spanish music net Cadena Dial, served to establish his credibility and quality. We followed up by advertising. He ended up attracting a very broadbased audience, and [EHR net] 40 Principales is considering support for his new album to be released in August and preceded by a tour." Meanwhile Clasicos will be issued in Scandanavia

Latin Hits Europe

Several Spanish indies specialise in licensing Latin material for the local market and in some cases for Fonomusic, Europe. responsible for Columbia's huge Discos Fuentes catalogue and Cuba's Artex among others, is one of the largest. Carlos Borrallo of

Bat Discos, based in Madrid, who handles New York salsa label RMM locally, thinks that many Latin artists have further sales potential outside of Spain, and points to singer India, whose album Dicen Que Soy is charting in several Latin markets, and whose crossover aptitude was demonstrated when she appeared alongside fellow RMM artists Celia Cruz, Oscar D'Leon and Tito Puente at a scorching showcase at this year's MIDEM.

Barcelona-based DiscMedi holds three wild cards in its play for a piece of the Latin market in Europe: a non-exclusive distribution deal with US label Qbadisc; exclusive European rights to the treasure chest of Cuban music in the archives of the Institute of Cuban Radio and Television; and Spanish rights for PM Records, the label set up by Pablo Milanés to handle releases for his private music foundation, whose first foreign office opened in Madrid last year. This means DiscMedi has the Cuban side of things just about sewn up, from historic recordings of Benny Moré or the Orchesta Aragon, to modern classics like Lazaro Ros or Pablo Milanés himself, and even the hottest contemporary sounds like Adalberto Y Su Son or NG La

The popularity of world music in general has helped Latin music find a place in the market that it didn't have before," claims Inma Grass, director of promotion for Latin music label Manzana, which handles several of the most important Latin imprints including Combo, Guajiro and the legendary Fania. catalogue consists of more than 250 titles, including the majority of Celia Cruz, Ruben Blades and the group known as "the university of salsa," the Gran Combo De Puerto Rico. The company is based in the Canary Islands, the European capital of salsa, and is in the process of mounting a small network of Latin music stations there, with plans to include Madrid in the near future.






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

THE REHEARSAL'S OVER - BE PART OF THE DRAMA

Four out of the 10 best-selling albums in the US in 1994 were by alternative rock artists. The Counting Crows, Green Day, Stone Temple Pilots and Offspring together accounted for 13 million albums sold. In the first three months of 1995, Green Day's "Dookie" and Offspring's "Smash" went top 10 in Austria, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Holland, Sweden and Switzerland. As the most US-oriented rock scene in Europe, Germany proved to be the biggest export market for alternative acts. Have alternative rockers adapted a conventional hit formula or does the mainstream audience crave a harder sound? Christian Lorenz reports.

HE TERM alternative suggests that there is a status quo that new rock bands could revolt against. Did we actually have any mainstream rock in the late '80s and early '90s? According to Oliver Sittel, label manager for American Recordings at BMG Ariola in Hamburg, mainstream rock music was practically extinct by 1990. "Rock music in the classical sense disappeared from the market during the '80s," says Sittel.

The few successful mainstream rock acts in the late '80s survived by adapting elements of pop and dance music. Sittel remarks, "Look at Bon Jovi, for instance. They became more of a pop act with every record they released." Billy Idol on the other hand strayed from his rock roots using sequencer basslines and drum machines straight out of '80s disco

music to update his songs," says Sittel.

The breeding ground for new talent in the rock scene survived in two niches: heavy metal and the vast independent sector. Metal acts like Metallica and Slayer built considerable followings while the US underground kept punk rock alive and the UK independents flirted with '60s and '70s rock.

US acts like Hüsker Dü and Black Flag which were firmly rooted in the punk scene began to veer more and more towards a "conventional" sound. These bands' credibility with their peers revived interest in classic rock. All of a sudden rock was cool again. The guitar solo, long hair and

wah wah pedals were all rehabilitated by 1987. When the grunge scene exploded into a worldwide trend in the early '90s, bands like the Meat Puppets, Mudhoney and Soul Asylum had already been playing rock music with an alternative edge for years.

When Nirvana hit the charts worldwide with their second album Nevermind in 1991, rock crossed back over into the mainstream market. Nirvana also established the first true rock hit single of the '90s with Smells Like Teen Spirit. Other acts emerged from the US underground due to the newly-awakened interest in rock music. Even though they constitute todays' main rock market, they are still labeled "alternative" thanks to their original background.

Hinrich Stürken, product manager Geffen at MCA Music Germany, thinks that "the label

alternative is actually fairly stupid." Stürken feels that the term fails to describe the diversity and potential of contemporary rock styles. "Rock as an alternative to what? The current trend? What if you are the new trend?" The time has come to admit that yesterday's alternative acts have become the mainstream rock stars of today.

Who Buys Alternative Rock?

A young audience bored with mainstream pop has developed a taste for harder music over the past four years. At the same time, original underground artists have refined their music," says Epitaph Europe MD Jay Ziskrout. In the long run these two trends "might pass like ships in the night," speculates Ziskrout. At the moment they seem set for full-on collision, though.

Alternative rock combines a

traditional rock line-up of electric guitars, bass and drums with a contemporary interpretation of the rock image of the late '60s and early '70s. The music is handmade, physical and spells lust for life in the fast lane.

But despite its flirtation with rock culture's roots, alternative rock is no simple revival movement. Artists wear the same clothes as their peers in the audience. Skatewear and wear-inspired garb has largely replaced the classic leather and denim look. The artists look like they've just been the hauled in from street. They fit the gap between pop acts and

ACE artists which widened in the mid to late '80s.

Acts like U2 which played to 16-20 year-olds in 1980 matured, and the age of their target audience shifted upwards. Original fans grew older and the average age of new fans rose due to the bands' more grown-up attitude towards music. Mainstream pop marketing on the other hand targeted an ever younger market. Pop acts like Take That or Boyzone are marketed to an 8-14 age group. The commercial success of Euro dance has further increased the music industry's attention for the younger end of the market. With pop acts geared towards prepubescent audiences and established entertainers catering to a 25+ age group, the new rockers woo the long neglected classic core audience for high octane music.

Stürken estimates that alternative rock's audience lies mainly in the 17-25 age group. "When fans grow older they are more likely to fall out of the group of active consumers." Matthias Fricke, product manager for alternative rock at Warner Music Germany agrees with Stürken. "Longer established acts like Mudhoney or Dinosaur attract a 25+ audience. The kids between 15-20 go for the funk/ metal crossover style.

Stürken names Sonic Youth as an example of the relation between sales and an ageing fan base. After dissecting rock into barest noise blasts in their experimental 1982-'85 phase, the New York act re-created rock music with a modern edge on its 1986 album EVOL. The act has fast become one of the main institutions in the alternative US scene and has served as inspiration and mentor to a whole host of bands. Stürken says, "They have been on the scene for such a long time that a large share of their original fans are in their 30s now and even sec-

ond generation fans hit their late 20s." This is mirrored in album sales, says Stürken. "Their 1992 album Dirty did really well but the 1994 release Experimental Jet Set Trash sold considerably less.

"If you're between eight and 14 you dig that Euro dance stuff on Viva," says BMG Ariola's Sittel. "When you hit puberty you become more critical of your surroundings." Sittel names 14-18

year-olds as the core target group for alternative rock. "Life is not just partying and today's rock bands tell it straight into your face. They write lyrics teenagers can identify with.

Do Some Styles Do **Better Than Others?**

Not all exponents of the vast alternative scene in the US are equally successful on the other side of the Atlantic. Sittel admits that "The more folky alternative singer/songwriter approach is not that popular in Germany.

R.E.M. is the only folk-oriented alternative act to cross over into the mainstream market to date. Founded in 1980, the band established itself on the mainstream

pop scene with the hit single Loosing Religion from their 1991 album Out Of Time. However, acts with a similar brand of Byrds and Neil Young-inspired folk like the Jayhawks, Pete Droge, Matthew Sweet or

Wilco have not profited from R.E.M.'s pioneering work. major record company cannot simply create trends," says Warner Music Germany's senior marketing executive Alexander Maurus. Fricke agrees, "It's the kids between 15 and 25 who buy records and start trends.'

And the kids want hard stuff. Stage diving has become a common phenomenon in European venues. More obviously sportive than good old-fashioned pogoing or slamdancing, it provides a valve for aggression and an unrivaled adrenaline kick. Contemporary punk rock or metal/funk crossover acts have brought excitement back into music. It's physical and it's fun.

fresh influences to the ageing rock scene. Where the original '60s rockers turned to black R&B and white country music for inspiration, their '90s successors have been raised on hip hop and punk

Crossover and punk are the biggest selling styles in Germany, alternative rock's largest market outside the US. "The scene in Germany is different from the US. There is no segregation between black and white music. Hip hop, metal and punk appeal to the same kids," explains Sittel.

The crowds who come together in Germany's large number of rock venues want to party. Crossover acts like Rage Against The Machine (Epic/Sony) have had greater success in Germany than in their native US. And the most popular domestic alternative acts are crossover bands like Mr. Ed Jumps The Gun (EMI Electrola) and the H-Blockx (Sing Sing/BMG Ariola).

German newcomer Jumps The Gun entered the European Top 100 Albums with its debut Boom! Boom! at 62 in week 10 and stayed in the chart for seven weeks. Swedish crossover act Clawfinger (MVG/Warner) can compete in popularity and album sales with most current alternative US acts. Their 1995 album Use Your Brain entered the European Top 100 at number 20 in week 15 and rose to 16 within three weeks

Clawfinger has sold more than 200.000 copies of Use Your Brain in Germany alone. "Crossover fans don't mind where a band comes from," says Warner Music product manager Bernd Rathjen. "Punk is still more USoriented," Rathjen feels, and

quotes sales of 4-5.000 copies for Swedish punk band Sator's album Stereo. Sator might sound like the real thing, but they cannot offer the image associated with the current punk wave. "Punk has become a West Coast thing," says Sittel. In 1995 punk is firmly associated in Europe with an idealised West Coast lifestyle of skating, surfing and hanging out.

Green Day (Warner Music), Offspring (Epitaph), NOFX (Epitaph) and Bad Religion (Dragnet/Sony) are the main exponents at the punk end of the alternative rock spectrum. Punk in 1995 goes back to the first punk rock wave of 1976-'77. It's the rock 'n' roll of Johnny Thunders' Heartbreakers, the Adverts and the Ramones which lives on in today's power chords.

What Makes A Rock Hit?

More than any other genre in the alternative rock scene, punk has developed into a hit machine. "It's fast and hard, but if you listen closely you hear that it's actually pop material arranged in a clever

US independent Epitaph is one of the biggest winners in the alternative rock boom. The label was founded by **Brett Gurewitz** who learned the ins and outs of the underground market as guitarist of punk band Bad Religion. A committed A&R policy meant that the

label stood behind punk rock during times when today's trend was still a far cry away. Thus acts like NOFX, Pennywise and Offspring had a chance to develop their style. "Imitation is not creation," says Ziskrout. "Ultimately hits come from artists who have the freedom to do what they like.

NOFX bassman Fat Mike admits "that we play a lot better now than seven years ago." Only an independent label can offer the terms a band needs to develop, according to Fat Mike. On Epitaph the band was a success with album sales of 200.000 in the US. "If you're signed to a major, your visibility is much higher. To pay back expectations and capital invested in your act you have to sell at least a million albums.'

Epitaph's belief in punk rock has finally paid off. "European album sales of Epitaph artists excluding Offspring have risen 400% in 1994," according to Ziskrout. "We are not trying to feed the punk frenzy," he declares. "Our aim is to improve appreciation for our artists in Europe regardless of their musical style.

Artistic freedom and time to develop only partially

explain the sudden move towards songwriting which crosses over effortlessly into the pop charts. For Sittel the musical development which led to punk hits like Offspring's Self Esteem or Green Day's Basket Case is ultimate-

ly caused by market forces. "It's a matter of survival in the music market," says Sittel. With the increasing number of bands in the alternative sector in the late '80s, "competition for gigs and CD sales got hotter." Sittel goes on to say that "bands simply had to become more professional to carve out their niche in the market."

Sales Without Airplay

The main medium for alternative rock is the album format. Album tracks hardly stand a chance of gaining exposure in the European radio landscape. In the US, you promote an album track to college radio stations. If it is successful it, will be picked up by commercial continues on page 21




According to Fricke, these bands already appeal to a mainstream pop audience in the US. "In the '80s the top rock acts were U2 and Simple Minds. Today you have Green Day or Weezer.

Green Day's current album Dookie sold approximately five million copies worldwide. In Germany alone, 200.000 copies went over the counter. Offspring rivals Green Day in worldwide album sales. Their latest offering Smash is currently among the top ten albums in Austria (#8), Denmark (#9), Finland (#3), Germany (#7) and Switzerland (#8). This is a remarkable success for an album released on an independent label and distributed entirely by independent distributors.

alternative rock stations. And finally, after the track has proven popular with a wider audience, rock format stations will pick it up and increase chances crossover success. Warner Music's Fricke points out that the basis of this system, the college radio, is missing in Europe. "Acts that have been established through radio in the US face a tough time over here," says Fricke. "This explains partially why crossover acts with strong dance elements are so popular in Germany. They can be developed over the club circuit."

Fricke compares the present airplay situation in Germany to the late '50s. "It's just like the rock 'n' roll days all over again. While German radio stations played German language MOR the kids would go out and buy Elvis.

The German radio landscape has another peculiarity which is rooted in the early days of rock 'n' "There is a definite north/south divide in German radio," says Sittel. "The south is the traditional rock market, the north is more pop-oriented." Sittel links this to the distribution of allied forces radio after World War II. The US forces were catered to

and privates forced rock off the playlists in the early '90s. Cologne pubcaster WDR. which organised the Rockpalast festivals televised all over Europe in the '80s, has early shed most of its programmes on its WDR1 channel by now. WDR1 officials name dropping listener figures as the reason for the format change. Now WDR1 plans to make inroads into private competitor Radio FFN's EHR audience.

EHR and ACE dominating are German radio in 1995. Risk aversion makes programmers stick with proven acts. "It's hard to break a new act," says

Maurus. "Programmers seem to prefer spinning the third single culled from an established artist's

the third R.E.M. single in Germany, our French leagues are still working the first one, and the UK is already through the whole album.

In the absence of airplay, alternative rock's best promotion channel is the club circuit. Germany has a tight infrastructure of rock clubs, live venues and festival sites. Again, the scene was originally built on the fast dollar of American GIs. "Many clubs and all the big concert promoters could rely on the GIs as a guaranteed audience. says Sittel. "There was this vast target group which already knew all those acts from

back home." Sittel estimates that members of the US forces and their families accounted for a good third of the audience at big festivals like Monsters Of Rock.

Alternative rock profits from the absence of competition in the live music market. According to Fricke "there are no real live pop gigs anymore. Pop acts do showcases paid by the record company. If they get big they come back and play the stadiums." Punk and crossover acts put excitement back into live music and provide an alternative to the local disco.

"As long as advertisers stay conservative, private radio has to follow," believes Fricke. But if radio continues to ignore alternative rock it might alienate its next generation of listeners. "Many radio people are trapped in short

time thinking," criticises Ziskrout. However, he is confident that this will change. "The cake is too attractive. Some broadcaster will start to get in on the alternative rock market.

Do North **American Acts Lead The** Market?

"Alternative rock has established scene in the US in which artists and labels can grow and develop under optimal conditions," according to Sittel. When the full impact of the alternative rock wave hit European shores in 1994, this scene was fully developed and operational for the best part of 10 years. Europe never had this kind of alternative rock scene.

J

"Of all European countries Sweden comes closest to the US scene," remarks Sittel. "Sweden has the bands, studios and producers to come up with original material and a professional finish. If I were to handle a German act I would be interested in checking out Swedish studios." But the Swedish market is comparatively small, and apart from Germany, Swedish releases find little feedback.

Germany is a traditionally strong rock market, but the emphasis has shifted towards crossover. In the absence of exciting rock sounds in the late '80s, hip hop became a main influence on fledgling musicians and consumers alike. Contemporary US punk has won the appreciation of the crossover scene because it is perceived as the white suburban kid's equivalent to hip hop.

In the UK, US punk and the whole rock renaissance never caught on. The alternative UK scene is pop-oriented. Bands with an alternative background which made it big in the UK over the past 10 years have always been accomplished pop songwriters. The Jam and XTC, as well as contemporary chart toppers Blur and Oasis owe more to the Beatles than to hard rock pioneers MC5. English alternative acts look at rock music with an ironic distance and use elements of various rock styles to make fashion statements.

In true pop art tradition bands like Primal Scream use elements of rock music's history, blow them up out of proportion and create a supernatural icon.

by AFN, the British by BFBS. Both stations played music popular in their respective home coun-"In southern Germany you could tune into AFN and listen to rock 'n' roll, country and black R&B. In northern Germany you got British pop music," explains Sittel. "This has formed regional listening habits.

Rock slowly found its way into German-language radio in the early '70s. The GSA region's pioneering rock radio is Austria's Ö3 which started to feature beat and rock in its programme in 1967. Competition between pubcasters album rather than a newcomer's first.

nobody wanted to play them. That the band sold millions of copies in the US didn't matter to anybody," according to Maurus. He continues to say that markets have drifted apart. Radio programmers perceive consumer habits musical preferences as different from country to country. This also means that chart success in the US or UK does not have the same standing in Germany that it used to have five to six years ago.

Differences in regional marketstrategies have also contributed to this situation, according to Maurus. "When we release

The alternative scene in the UK does not revolt outrightly against mainstream pop and its institutions. Bands prefer to use the established promotion machinery for their own ends. Most alternative UK acts are highly image-conscious and hype is part of the busi-

Germany is currently the biggest European export market for both US and UK alternative artists. But sales of UK acts are much lower than for alternative rock product from the US. Juliet Howles, marketing manager alternative at BMG Ariola's international office in London, estimates that "an average alternative UK act sells about 5.000 albums in Germany." Howles names lack of airplay as the biggest problem in promoting UK acts. "Three or four years ago we had average German sales of around 7.000 albums," says Howles, and blames the drop on the increasing tightness of radio formats.

In the UK, alternative acts are

mainly promoted via print media and chart positions as well as playing live. The press hype at home often makes it difficult for bands to be taken seriously abroad. Howles feels "the attitude of the press has become extremely cynical and this does not go down well with consumers abroad.

Each week the two weeklies music main Melody Maker and New Music Express promote a new band as the the latest rage on their covers. Monthly style bibles like Facecontribute their share to the ever moving carousel of cover stars. This constant overexposure causes UK acts to undergo the unpleasant experience on the continent of having to prove they are not all-hype-nocontent.

The UK pop market is fast moving. Hit singles pop in and out of the charts in a matter of two or three weeks. "UK chart positions are not as influential as five or says 10 years ago," Howles. Warner Music's Maurus agrees, "A top ten hit in England pulls no weight in Germany anymore.' Howles explains the tarnished image of the UK charts with the fickleness of the UK market. "Everybody in Europe knows now that it is not difficult to get a record into the UK charts. How long you keep it there is what matters.

US charts still enjoy a better standing in continental European industry circles because of the sales levels they represent. On the other hand, alternative rock has a better image in

the more serious, hype-conscious continental music press. This

makes the absence of airplay for alternative UK acts much more deadly than for their US rock counterparts. The only alternative

for the bands is to "get out there and play live" says Howles. "And in this respect it is definitely an advantage to be close to the continent." For MCA's Stürken this is exactly the point that makes promotion of US acts in Europe difficult. "If they have success in the States that means they will be awfully hard to get for tours promotion over and here.

Touring in Europe is an absolute necessity "if you want to reach more than just the hardcore music buffs who read the rock magazines," according to Stürken But US recording and touring schedules mean that band management and label executives are often reluctant to fly an act over to support European promotions. Stürken feels that "frequently a band's management doesn't realise they can make big

USA) bucks in Europe.' But once they hit the stage, US rockers show that they have more live experience than their European competitors. "Touring in

North America is much tougher than over here," says BMG Ariola's Sittel. "The distances are extremely tiring and audiences expect a real show." Acts which went through this school develop an extensive live repertoire and iron stage stamina. Sittel admits, 'They're simply more professional than most of our bands.

In traditional rock markets like the US, the GSA region and Scandinavia, alternative rock has become the mainstream rock of today. For a brief period alternative rock had such an impact that it reached the passive part of the mainstream market which does not regularly buy CDs. With the increasing breadth of the alternative rock scene and the absence of one clearly propagated lead act, alternative rock now appeals to the smaller active core of the mainstream market. This group could be roughly described as 15-25 year olds who keep up with contemporary trends through the media and buy at least one or two CDs per month.

mind sold 800.000 copies. Their last studio album In Utero was released in 1993 and sold 250.000 copies so far." Stürken believes this shows that the alternative rock market has been through its boom phase. "The market is not going to grow any further," according to Stürken. "We have sold 70.000 albums each of the Counting Crowes' August And Everything After and Beck's Gold so far," says Stürken. He expects future sales for popular alternative acts to even out at similar levels.

The current punk trend fuelled by Green Day and Offspring has drawn new attention to the alternative rock scene. The main punk protagonists easily outsell any crossover act at the moment. "The punk trend will last for two to three years over here," predicts Fricke. However, in the long run crossover is tipped off by industry insiders as the most successful genre in the alternative rock

Crossover is the best selling alternative style in continental Europe. Francisco-based funk/ metal act Faith No More shows the potential of the genre with its current For album King Day...Fool For A Lifetime (Slash). The album entered the Music & Media European Top 100 Albums chart at rank 6 in the week of its release. Five weeks later it is still charted among the Top Twenty at number 12.

Clawfinger was only promoted through the club circuit. achieved album sales of more than 200.000 without a hit single, airplay, MTV or Viva rotation," says Fricke. All signs point to crossover as the long term survivor of the current alternative rock craze. Europe's teenagers want to dance and crossover provides just the right mix of street tough image and contemporary rock rhythms. Sittel is confident "a good dance beat and heavy guitars, that's exactly what you need. That's the future hit formula for alternative rock.

Breakin' & Entering

A weekly Eurochart analysis by Ramon Dahmen

It's a smurfing albums chart this week. Two albums featuring the famous Belgian cartoon characters are debuting: Smurf The House by Irene Moors (a Dutch presenter on children's TV channel Telekids) and De Smurfen, responsible for the speeded-up voices as well as the German adaptation Die Schlümpfe with Tekkno Ist Cool.

Thanks to the Telekids programmes, Dutch kids have gone crazy about the smurf characters and the first album of Moors & De Smurfs, Ga Je Mee Naar Smurfenland ("Are You Coming With Me To Smurf Country"), has already reached double platinum status with over 200.000 copies sold since its release late last year. The album contained "smurfed up" versions of famous Euro dance hits from 2 Unlimited, Twenty 4 Seven, 2 Brothers On The 4th Floor and Whigfield.

The new album is, again, a potpourri of everything's that's popular in the kiddy Eurodance scene with new versions of Rednex's *Cotton Eye Joe*, Omen's *Magic Affair*, DJ Bobo's *Everybody* and Reel

2 Real's I Like To Move It, aptly-titled 'K Heb Nieuwe Schoenen ("I Have New Shoes"). Meanwhile, the Germans have also cashed in on the craze by creating their own German-language version that, helped by the album's first single Schlumpfen Cowboy Joe (the Rednex hit), is storming up the national charts. Other foreign-language versions are planned for France, Italy, Spain and Portugal.

The first artist to successfully exploit the Smurfs cartoon characters was Dutch singer/composer Pierre Kartner who, under the artist name of **Father Abraham**, sold an estimated 20 million copies worldwide of various foreign-language versions of his 1977 novelty tune 't Smurfenlied ("The Smurf Song").

If we move to a slightly higher age bracket we come to the phenomena of the teen acts featured in last week's column. The popularity of the genre continues this week with the Sales Breaker award going to Irish **Boyzone**. The band's *Key To My Life* rushes up the chart in its second week.

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Sports And Politics Draw Record Spanish Audiences

MADRID - Spanish radio has broken through the 20 millionaudience barrier for the first time, according to the year's first listener survey covering February-March and published by Estudio General de Medios (EGM)

But, with all newstalk stations registering considerable rises in audience, it is clear that sports and political programmes are the ones drawing the listeners, not music chan-

broadcasting director Arturo San Roman says, "It is probable that more than a million teenagers have become first-time radio listeners this year. But they are listening to the conventional nets and not the formula stations."

All four national conventional (news/talk) nets gained liswith Cadena SER falling slightly short of a record four million listeners with 3.990.000.

Most formula (music) nets lost ground, with the exception of-COPE's Cadena 100 and Onda Cero Musica. COPE increased 27.1% to 878.000, while Onda Cero Musica reversed a 1994 slump rising a spectacular 62.8% to 542.000.

Radio 1 was also encouraged, she says, by the fact that their audience profile was getting younger-this was in line with the station's strategy of appealing to youth.

The Rajar figures were also bad news for the UK's national commercial radio stations (Classic FM, Virgin Radio, and Atlantic 252), which all lost listeners. Virgin Radio, for example, dropped from a 3.9% share last quarter to a 3.5% share this.

Of the limited number of stations reporting this quarter outside London, the biggest success story was West Mid-

lands regional station Heart FM, whose soft ACE format almost doubled its audience share from 3.6% to 6.2%.

Interested parties have been given until October to reply to the Minister's longawaited Green paper. After that the government intends to publish a White Paper which will outline the government's future legislative plans for broadcasting.

The key points of the Minister's Green Paper propose:

· a new super authority to replace the existing RTE Authority and the Independent Radio and Television Authority (IRTC),

• wider powers for the Complaints Broadcasting Commission,

to identify the kind of programming that should be supported by licence fees,

the possible privatization or separation of the national pubcaster's second radio station, 2FM,

• support for public service programming on commercial radio with a special licence fee,

an independent national and international television and radio news agency.

Over 250 delegates from the private and public broadcasting sector in Ireland discussed the green paper on April 28 at the first one-day

debate on the future of radio broadcasting in Ireland.

French EHR net Skyrock has decided to drop former porn star Tabata Cash in June. Hired last season to compete with Fun radio's show "Lovin' Fun," Cash was the source of much controversy at the station, which angered broadcasting authority CSA with its fiercely liberal style. Skyrock says the split was "a mutual decision" and was not motivated by bad ratings, but by the decision to "develop this timeslot."

■ EMI To Disney?

At presstime rumours were mounting about Walt Disney acquiring the EMI Music Group for US\$5 billion. EMI's revenues this year should be more than £2.1 billion (app. US\$3.4 billion) and given the industry's yardstick valuation of two times revenues, the suggested price tag is unlikely, according to financial analysts. If the deal goes ahead it would mark the second multi-billion acquisition in a months time. Four weeks ago, MCA parent Matsushita sold 80% of MCA to Seagram for US\$5.7 billion.

Arcade Buys Independent Distribution Company WMD

PARIS - Dutch independent record company and compilation specialist Arcade Music Group has acquired the French distribution firm WMD for an undisclosed amount.

Arcade had already been using WMD's warehouse, shipping and handling facilities before the April 27 agreement. There were serious concerns a couple of weeks ago about the future of WMD when Arcade threatened not to renew its contracts with the company.

WMD began life as the distribution arm of FNAC Music,

which was taken over by the French bank Credit Lyonnais in July 1993. In mid-1994, WMD was bought by Moon Théol-whose husband owns independent distributor Media 7—together with the support of investors from the Far East.

WMD has had recent financial problems, despite a major restructuring which saw it for handling distribution Varese Sarabande, Big Cheese, Bondage and Messidor, among others. It also developed a local roster principally made up of ex-FNAC Music acts, such as Manu Dibango.

This is is the second time Arcade has bid for WMD. It lost out when FNAC was sold in 1993 as sellers opted for the "French solution." The buy-out is part of Arcade's strategy to expand in Europe. During the past years, the company has increased its artist development in France, signing acts such as Demis Roussos.

Hervé Bonnard, president of WMD, left the company last month and Théol, who acted as general manager, departed on May 2. Marco Visser, president of Arcade France has taken over as company presi-

EHR Top 40 commentary by Pieter Kops



Rod Stewart

Six new entries are incorporated in the EHR Top 40 this week. The highest is taken by rock veteran Rod Stewart, whose You're The Star enters straight at number 17. The song, which was co-written by Frankie Miller, is the lead-off single from Stewart's forthcoming provisionally called Spanner In The Works (due out in June)-the

artist's first new studio album since 1991's Vagabond Heart. When including a duet with Tina Turner (1990's It Takes Two) and his collaboration with Sting and Bryan Adams (1994's All For Love), the new single marks the 10th hit for Stewart on EHR since the launch of the chart in December 1990. He has hit number 1 twice—first with 1991's Rhythm Of My Heart (eight weeks at the top, five of which were consecutive) and three years later with All For Love, reigning for seven weeks in a row.

Stewart's new single enjoys a 43-station roster, including 16 adds. The song is playlisted in 13 European countries and finds the most fervent backing in the UK, Italy, Denmark and the GSA territories. On a 'major market' level, You're The Star already stands out as the number 5 playlisted song in the GSA and number 13 in Italy (see Major Market Airplay, page 35). A review of Stewart's single is to be found in the New Releases section, page 13.

Following last week's highest new entry in the chart, Charles & Eddie now take home M&M's weekly Radio Active award for the biggest chartpoint gain. I'm Gonna Love You (24-7-365) crashes the top 5, pausing at number 4 with an 80-station wide roster, including 27 first-time reports. This also earns it the status of Most Added leader. The single is now playlisted in 17 countries (13 last week). Its growth especially takes place in Italy and Denmark (six adds each), followed by the UK, Norway and Switzerland (three adds each). The most favourable penetration ratio is being scored in Italy, where 71% of M&M's EHR reporter roster has the track on rotation.

On The Road

Border Breakers commentary by Pieter Kops



Real McCoy

There is plenty of upward movement in the top 3 division of the Border Breakers chart this week. Both the number 1 and 2 records (by Scatman John and Corona, respectively) are awarded well-earned bullets, as they continue to gain chart points and playlist entries. And, although the margins within the top 3 remain considerable, a new contender for the top spot has come into sight-Love & Devotion by the Real McCoy. Thanks to 39 stations outside the GSA (26 last week), the new single by the German Euro dance act (formerly known as MC Sar & The Real McCoy) shoots up to number 3, standing out as the fastest mover of the week by far, judging from its enormous chart-point gain.

Apart from five stations in Germany, two in Switzerland and one in Austria, Love & Devotion is playlisted in no less than 15 countries. This week, the record is boosted by 14 adds on all formats in those territories, notably in the UK, Italy and Holland. M&M's TrackFax data shows that it is also doing a very good job on radio in Denmark, Belgium and Poland. The Real McCoy climbs to number 22 in this week's EHR Top 40 and currently charts at number 27 in the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles, after peaking at number 19 last week.

The highest new entry in Border Breakers is grabbed by EMI-Medley-signing Hanne Boel, whose Waiting In The Wings kicks off at number 15. The critically acclaimed, soulful pop singer from Denmark has 17 non-Scandinavian stations at her side. The support is especially overwhelming in Poland, where 13 stations have the track in rotation, with national public EHR outlet Polskie Radio 3/Warsaw topping the bill. Germany is next in line with three first-time reports from ACE-formatted stations, including heavy-weights such as Hundert 6/Berlin and Radio 7/Ulm. Austria joins the list with goldranked EHR Radio CD International/Vienna.

The charts on this page track the border-crossing movement of product. The Border Breakers chart ranks the 25 most successful Continental European records making airplay impact outside their country of signing (airplay achieved in the original country is

excluded from the calculations).

The second chart, Channel Crossovers, registers the airplay penetration of UK-signed artists in mainland Europe, while the third Top 25, the Atlantic Crossover chart, ranks the most successful Non-European artists according to airplay impact in

. All three charts are non-format specific. "Country Of Signing" is not necessarily an indication of where the artist comes from but, more significantly, where he/she is signed. An increasing number of national artists are signed to "foreign" labels and M&M wants to acknowledge the crossover impact of such deals.




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
