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Two New Channels For Tele Danmark

COPENHAGEN - Tele Danmark, the 51% state-owned telecom company, has announced it will start its own nationwide radio channel on October 1, and a second channel in early 1997.

Programming will be broadcast via satellite and cable radio/TV distribution, a Tele Danmark monopoly. "The new station will have younger listeners as a target market, the up-to-35 age group. The other channel, scheduled to begin early next year, will have a more adult audience of 35-55 year olds. Both stations will be music and entertainment channels," says Glenn Lau Rentius, MD of the company behind the stations. Danish multi-media group Egmont sold Uptown Radio to station MD Lau Rentius earlier this year.

CLT Victorious In Stockholm

STOCKHOLM - London based CLT UK Radio has claimed a victory for its stations in Stockholm after the latest official listener survey by RUAB. The survey shows that for the first time, CLT-owned station Bandit 105.5 has overtaken NRJ, the local market leader, among the 15-34 year old audience.

The change comes in the critical average quarter-hour measurement, which shows an average of how much of the audience is listening to any stations in any quarter-hour from 06:00 to 18:00. It is this measurement which is the basis for price setting within broadcast media.

The French-owned NRJ has led the field since commercial radio was first measured in 1993, but now Bandit has edged ahead. In overall listening figures, NRJ remains the biggest commercial station in Stockholm, although its audience has fallen from 14.3% in the previous survey to 11.4% now. Bandit's share remains at a steady 5.2%.

The quarter-hour figure is significant and Peter Waak, CLT's managing director in Sweden, is delighted. "It's magnificent," he says. "We've tripled our ratings in nine months, and that's before we launch a marketing campaign for our new morning show."

Bandit began life as an American-style college rock station, with DJ's broadcasting in English and playing anything from Manic Street Preachers to Pink Floyd. This spring however, after buying out the station, CLT decided to drop the English language presentation on the basis of audi-

ence research. However, Peter Waak doesn't see that as the main reason for the upturn.

"It's more the changes in music policy," he says. "We're now playing much more new music. Bandit has moved from AOR to a modern rock station. We've got our positioning crystal clear. It's new stuff, with an attitude." Waak is convinced that finding the right niche is crucial for survival in Stockholm, which with 16 stations, ten of them commercial, fighting over an audience of 1.5 million, is recognised as one of the most competitive in Europe

Across the country the overall radio audience fell by 1.6%, not unusual for summer figures.

Sovory Savours Early Success

Amsterdam - The name "Sovory" isn't widely well known at the moment, but that's about to change. This talented 'soul man', who writes and produces his own mixture of rock, funk and R&B, will be supporting Sheryl Crow on her forthcoming European tour. Eric Clapton has already bestowed Sovory with generous praise and A&M has made him a worldwide priority. His recent string of high powered showcases in Scandinavia, Holland, Germany and the UK left a trail of impressed local PolyGram staff members. 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Euro-dance Needs New Dawn

Between The Lines

The one area in which the Continental European music industry has managed to beat the Anglo-Americans at their own game has been dance music. Mainland Europe has succeeded in producing a continuous parade of producers and artists who are not only successful on the Continent but also make inroads in the UK market and, if we're lucky, the US too.

The music on offer has been able to cross hurdles at radio too-yesterday's European dance music has become the mainstream pop of today. A further testament to the current success of

Euro-dance is the forthcoming Amsterdam Dance Event, a new international industry forum created by Dutch music foundation Conamus (see story this page).

But what is Euro-dance's future? As our senior writer Christian Lorenz writes on page 13 in his "Made In Germany" dance pop feature, "Sales success still refers to variations on the much maligned he-raps-she-sings formula of Euro-dance."

And that is exactly where the problem lies. Isn't the genre busy biting its own tail with its endless variations on the same theme? Isn't the "boy raps the verses, girl sings the chous" formula ready for rejuvenation?

The current Euro-dance scene appeals to a young, singlesbuying audience, but the older-age bracket is not yet catered for. Also, there is still a lack of artists with long-term careers who are able to build solid album sales. Europe shouldn't just be known for its pop dance stable-it should also be setting new trends. Although there are new developments in European dance that create substantial sales (the "dream house" movement headed by Robert Miles, for instance), they aren't yet capable of creating the kind of stir generated by the UK's trip hop and jungle sub-genres.

It's time for European dance producers and labels to start building long-term careers. The dance community should be right up there with other mainland European acts such as Zucchero, Pausini and Ramazzotti that were recently honoured with an IFPI Platinum Europe award. It's time to build the next 2 Unlimited.

Ten Days Of Record Prizes The annual Dutch 10-Day Record Event ("Platen 10-Daagse") is starting September 25. Consumers purchasing soundcarriers for Dfl 39.95 (app. US\$ 23.5) will be getting a free premium CD The Best Live. The 14-track sampler features live recordings from Queen, Elton John, Eros Ramazzotti, Crowded House and Oasis. Through the CD tickets can be won for live concerts by some of the featured artists as well as Sting, Tina Turner and the Cranberries. Organising body the CPG expects to sell some 650.000 CDs. The Platen 10-Daagse kicks off a longer 10-week generic retail campaign in Holland with the introduction of special free coupons, supported by an extensive media campaign.

■ UNITED KINGDOM

Radio Gets Best Response New research shows that radio advertising is more effective than its TV counterpart when it comes to direct response commercials. Findings from a study conducted by the Direct Response Radio Research consortium (whose members include the Direct Marketing Association, GWR, Classic FM and British Telecom) shows that the response rate to such ads on radio is 0.35%, compared to 0.25% for TV. 40 seconds and 10 seconds were found to be the most effective spot lengths, and the majority of listener responses came within five minutes of a commercial being transmitted, with efficiency increasing the more frequently the commercial was aired. The research also found that the listeners' response level peaks between 18:00 and 20:00.

IBC Visitors, Exhibitors Up

Topics cover the whole spectrum of the dance music business from A&R, distribution and promotion to breaking acts in foreign markets. Territories under special scrutiny are the UK, Germany, Holland, Belgium and the US.

Key industry figures such as Strictly Rhythm label manager Europe Phil Cheeseman and R&S Records MD Renaat Vandepapeliere will reveal their vision of the future of dance music during the three day event. International top DJs including Jellybean Benitez are expected to share their insights into current trends with the participants of the event in a dedicated DJ panel.

Event manager Maria Jiménez describes the aim of the conference as "to find out how the dance world will develop, grow and progress and to determine what our individual roles in that process


While an overt radio presence is never evident at IBC, many stands feature products either partially or entirely devoted to radio's engineering, audio and transmission needs.

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RMC Prepares For Profits

PARIS - Full-service station RMC is planning to return to profitability within the next three years following a drastic restructuring plan, cost-saving measures and a more dynamic scheduling programme.

RMC administrator Georges Vanderchmitt says he expects losses in the region of Ffr100 million (app. US\$19.2 million) this year, but thanks to a Ffr 200 million restructuring plan he foresees that RMC will break even before the end of the decade.

"This has been a very important restructuring, probably the most important in the history of the station", said Vanderchmitt. "We have changed working habits, introduced new priorities and redefined our schedule. This mod-

ernisation is part of a strategy to show that even in a difficult situation, a group like ours can develop with a full-service station and thematic networks —Radio Nostalgie and Montmartre FM."

Vanderchmitt says his short term goal is to jump from a 3.5% audience share to 4% and be "the undisputed leader in the south". He expects Nostalgie to increase its current 5.2% status and Montmartre, which targets the 50-65 age group, to reach 2%. "Altogether, the stations of the group must reach a national audience of 11%."

Part of this strategy is to reaffirm the nature and identity of the RMC as a full-service station with a mix of news and entertainment programming and a strong grip in southern France, according to scheduling director Jean-Pierre Foucault. "We are relaunching the schedule because the product must be at the heart of our strategy," says Vanderchmitt.

The reshaping of the schedule has also strongly affected RMC's musical policy which music programmer Catherine Costa says has been "fully redesigned" to make more room for music.

Contact Collaborates

BRUSSELS - The collaboration between Radio Contact Eupen and former Radio International in Elsenborn, now reformed as Radio Contact Eifel is the first step towards a fully fledged private radio network in the German speaking area of Belgium.

Radio Contact's programmes also cross the German border where the signal is processed on the cable network in Wurselen.

"Thanks to a rock-oriented EHR format we have no competitors here," explains Radio Contact Eupen MD Andre Goebels, "and the current collaboration makes us the only private station broadcasting both in the north and south of the German speaking region."

Goebels says that the current one KW antenna power expands the station's potential audience in Holland and Germany. "But we are limited to one KW, not only by the regional legislation, but also because we cause frequency interference in Holland. Radio Contact Eifel now broadcasts on 60W and we plan to boost it to 500W," says Goebels, adding that he is currently negotiating to sign up two other stations to the new network. The regional government is planning a review of the current media law which will allow privates both more antenna power as well as access to the cable net-

"The upgrading of the existing radio legislation is set for the end of this year and we have submitted a proposal to the radio council" says a spokesman for media minister Karl Heinz Lamberts. "The decree includes networks in our region as individual stations cannot serve the whole region. Networks will exist under certain conditions, one being that affiliates must maintain their local mission by producing a number of hours themselves."

Local Station Off Air

FREIBURG - German Telekom switched off the link between Radio Dreyeckland's Freiburg headquarters and a local transmitter on September 15 as transmission fees for the past ten months are still outstanding.

The costs refer to the transmission of the station's Freiburg programme for local broadcast in the neighbouring community of Schopfheim. Radio Dreyeckland MD Michael Menzel is positive that state media authority LfK is liable to cover the full transmission costs of DM 21.200 (app. US\$13.000) according to state media law.

A temporary injunction against LfK as requested by Radio Dreyeckland was dismissed by the administrative court in Stuttgart on August 20. Menzel has taken the case to the court of appeal and expects a

decision by the end of September. LfK president Eugen Volz points out that the LfK will continue to subsidise the actual local broadcast. The bone of contention is that Dreyeckland broadcasts the same programme from two transmitters. "Statewide, non-commercial broadcasting chains are clearly not desirable in the eyes of the legislation," says Volz. "An independent production of local programmes by Radio Dreyeckland in Schopfheim on the other hand would justify subsidies."

LfK legal adviser Angela Frank explains that a local programme does not have to be extensive to be recognised by LfK. "It would be sufficient for the station to produce and broadcast certain parts of the programme locally," says Frank. "Repeats of local contributions throughout the programme are a possible way to economise operations in Schopfheim."

This Is The World Calling...

International broadcasters are facing major upheaval as they attempt to adapt to the post-Cold War environment and grapple with the radical changes in broadcast delivery methods. With changes at both the BBC World Service and Radio France International high on the news agenda in recent months, Andy Sennitt takes a look at the current state of Europe's external radio services.

HE '90s have witnessed significant changes in the pattern of international broadcasting in Europe. One station, Radio Berlin International, disappeared altogether along with the German Democratic Republic. US-backed Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty have had their budgets slashed and their headquarters moved. Other stations in Eastern Europe have cut back on their output as the realities of operating in a marketeconomy begin to bite.

Meanwhile, many international broadcasters in western Europe have also had to reassess their role as the justification for their continued public funding has increasingly been questioned by politicians. Services aimed at listeners abroad are easy targets for financial savings, since the cuts do not affect the people whose votes keep the politicians in office.


TV Competition

In parallel with this reassessment of their raison d'être, the international broadcasters are also facing other challenges: listeners, especially in other European countries, are much more sophisticated than they were, even as recently as 10 years ago. A wider choice of domestic radio and satellite TV is providing much stiffer competition for listeners. Simply informing potential listeners of an international station's existence is quite a challenge... radio and TV listings magazines rarely mention international broadcasts, and the stations cannot afford to advertise in their target areas.

Many international broadcasters, especially those in the former Eastern bloc, have also had to improve their programming. The old style of reading

press reviews and political commentaries in a bored voice simply isn't taken seriously by people who have just seen CNN's live pictures of a US bombing raid on downtown Baghdad. To compete, international stations now need a distinctive identity. For example, Belgium's Radio Vlaanderen International, with a relatively weak signal in many parts of the world, succeeds in attracting a small but loyal audience with its informal style and a strong emphasis on personalities. With an onair team of just four people, their voices are instantly recognizable to RVI lis-

teners. Radio Netherlands has developed a reputation for award-winning documentary programmes. Radio France International is known for its excellent news programming, especially in its coverage of Africa.

Continuous Presence

A major problem for international broadcasters is that, with a few exceptions such as BBC World Service and Radio France International, they do not have a continuous presence on the dial. Smaller stations may only broadcast in English for half an hour a day, repeated at various times to maximise the audience. Stations which use shortwave also have to change frequencies often, occasionally at short notice. None of this makes it easy for potential listeners to find them and tune in regularly.

International stations have tried to raise their profile in several ways, with varying degrees of success. These days, broadcasting from one European country to another on shortwave is no longer sufficient to reach the whole target audience. There simply aren't as many potential shortwave listeners available. People who once used shortwave as their primary means of staying in touch with international events are now likely to have satellite TV. Another problem is technical: shortwave is simply not suitable for broadcasting over very short distances of a few hundred kilometres. People who might once have accepted fading and interference to get information are no longer prepared to do so.

Swiss Radio International (SRI) was the first international broadcaster in

Europe to take the bold decision to abandon shortwave as its primary means programme delivery within the continent. By hiring two mono audio transponders on the Astra satellite, SRI has a couple of channels available 24 hours a day, which permits it to deliver programming with a much better technical quality, repeated more frequently. Even so, informal research carried out by the World Radio TV Handbook suggests that the audience for these services is still very small. Many people who have an Astra system are not even aware that they can receive radio services as well as TV channels. The official policy of Astra operating company SES is that it is up to the

individual radio stations to do their own publicity— but the international broadcasters don't have the budget for

A different approach to solving the audibility problem has been taken by the World Radio Network, run by some ex-BBC World Service personnel. WRN rents audio transponders from Astra, and sells blocks of airtime to individual international stations. Most stations take 30 minutes or one hour a day, and a service has been set up using a different satellite covering North America. WRN has supplemented these with an audio service on the Internet, which permits stations to reach millions of potential listeners without the need for major capital investment. However, so far WRN's services are only available to stations with programming in English. A German language version has been mooted, but as yet has not come to fruition.

One station which has undergone major re-structuring in the '90s is Radio Netherlands (RN). In the past few years RN has seen its output reduced from eight languages to five, resulting in around 70 job losses in Hilversum. RN has now adopted a multipronged strategy of programme delivery. A shortwave service in English to Europe has been retained, albeit at lunchtime when many potential listeners are unavailable. Announcements stating that the station was considering dropping this shortwave service caused floods of protest from around Europe.

Superpower Transmitter

To reach the UK effectively in the evening hours, medium wave is seen as a better option. Radio Netherlands has been trying for many years to get access to one of the Dutch domestic transmitters for this purpose, but the domestic broadcasters have been unwilling to give them up. So as an experiment, a few years ago RN started renting airtime on a superpower transmitter in Kaliningrad, Russia.

Reception in the UK was adequate, but the frequency was adjacent to a new Dutch commercial broadcaster, thus causing problems for some listeners in southern England. A better solution has now been found, and at the end of March RN moved its mediumwave service to the high power transmitter of RTL on 1440kHz, which used to carry Radio Luxembourg's English service. This has proved very successful.

Besides the mediumwave service, Radio Netherlands also rents two transponders on the Astra satellite, and takes two hours a day of airtime via the World Radio Network. This summer, it also experimented with a satellite TV service for the first time. So far, the station has not decided to embrace DAB, primarily because there are as yet no affordable DAB receivers. As a public broadcaster, RN has to be able to demonstrate that there is an audience for everything it does.

Another part of the strategy adopted by Radio Netherlands is programme placement on local stations. This is most widely developed in Latin America, where local broadcasters relay RN's Spanish service output in whole or part. The satellite feed used for this purpose already existed in order to carry programming to RN's shortwave relay station in the Netherlands Antilles, so minimal capital investment was needed.


Co-Productions

Finally, RN has been experimenting with co-productions involving public broadcasters in other European countries. One example is a series of programmes about Europe's minority languages. Working with BBC Radio Scotland, the two stations provided each other with material about Friesian and Gaelic respectively. Each station packaged the material to suit its own audience. This role is one which Radio Netherlands is keen to develop, enabling the station's output to reach a wider audience without the need for listeners to tune away from their local station.

Programme content on Radio Netherlands is language and target dependent, explains RN's director of

programmes Jonathan Marks. In India, for instance, Radio Netherlands reaches an audience of 18-35 year olds. "The English language programmes use of a lot of fast-paced jingles to appeal to a young educated audience interested in world affairs—Asian and European information in particular. The same is true of the listener profile in Latin America. Radio Netherlands uses a snappy style that blends in with the local stations in the region."

Programmes in Dutch to targets outside Europe are designed as news briefings, covering events in Europe over the last 24 hours and Dutch developments in particular. The service to Europe was recently revised to appeal to two groups, explains Marks.


"During the winter months many thousands of retired Dutch people go to Spain and southern France to escape the wet winters in The Netherlands. Radio Netherlands provides a service

for this group, direct via shortwave, via the Astra satellite system and via local FM stations such as Radio Benidorm."

The other Group RN aims at, says Marks, are the shorter-term Dutch holiday makers. "Each year, around 5.2 million Dutch leave the country on holiday. During the summer months, Radio Netherlands provides a service giving the latest news and weather, plus coverage of major sports events such as Dutch football and the Tour de France cycle race. The latest figures show an audience of around 1.7 million.



Improved satellite reception plus a better targeted programme means that Radio Netherlands reaches more of its nationals in Europe than most other external services on the continent".

Some stations, such as Belgium's Radio Vlaanderen International, have decided to continue using shortwave for worldwide coverage, but has no plans to replace its ageing transmitters. It is are hoping that it will be able to keep its existing equipment operating until such time as it is surplus to requirements. Unlike some stations, which have either built overseas relay stations or take airtime on the transmitters of another shortwave station closer to the target area, RVI tries to cover the whole world from its three shortwave transmitters in Belgium. This means RVI's signals are often weaker and less reliable than their more fortunate competitors. However, within Europe RVI does have the advantage of access to a local mediumwave transmit-

ter for evening coverage, and also uses the Astra satellite.

One international broadcaster, Radio Austria International, has just started a DAB service. RAI's representative told a conference of international broadcasters in Amsterdam that as a small station, RAI knows it cannot compete in range of programming with the large broadcasters, but that by being first to embrace DAB it hopes to establish a niche market. Meanwhile. RAI has no plans to reduce its shortwave output in the foreseeable future.

The multiplicity of ways in which the different broadcasters around Europe are delivering their programmes in 1996 reflects the absence of a clear trend towards one dominant medium. Radio is still a long way behind TV in terms of analogue satellite delivery, and it is quite possible that some stations will eventually make the leap from shortwave to DAB without the intermediate step of analogue. This assumes that affordable DAB receivers will come onto the market and sell in significant numbers. Until that happens, few international broadcasters will be able to justify DAB.

As for shortwave, the consensus at last year's Towards 2000 conference for international broadcasters was that most countries will continue to use shortwave for at least another 20-30 years. It may be technically possible to abandon shortwave much sooner, but such a move would also mean broadcasters abandoning the listeners in most need of their services: those in the Third World with inadequate local media. Few public service broadcasters would willingly put technical convenience ahead of genuine need. Their challenge will be to make sure that the politicians on whom they rely for funding share the same altruistic motives towards people who will never vote for them.

RFI: Excellence In News

The new international order born from the collapse of the Berlin wall can count among its casualties all the international radio services created by most Western countries in order to counterbalance local propaganda and extend the influence of the "free world".

Radio France International (RFI) was, along with the BBC World Service, Deutsche Welle and Voice of America, one of the key players in this war of the airwaves. Created after the second World War, the service has established itself through the years a leading presence in Africa, and its news reports were heavily followed in eastern European countries, particularly Poland, during the Soviet era

According to the new president of RFI, Jean-Paul Cluzel, the end of the cold war doesn't mean that these services should stop operating. But they must refocus their priorities and redefine their content.

"With the change of regimes in Eastern Europe, and in South and Latin America, the role of international radio services has become less obvious," he says. "These countries have increasingly developed their own media tools, which have become more and more diversified, reliable and pluralist. Local media usually covers the local political scene very well. Therefore, our function as international services, which was to deliver news that wasn't biased or partial, is no longer relevant. Listeners find what they need locally and we can't compete with local outlets on local news.

This new situation has forced all the international broadcasters to take a close look at what they can offer that is not available locally.

Cluzel says his analysis of the situation has led him in one precise direction. Says Cluzel, "Our belief, which I think is shared both by the BBC and Deutsche Welle, is that we have one asset—the quality of our news coverage. This is what will cause listeners to tune in to our programmes. It is only through an excellence in news that we will guarantee our future. Our strength is our capacity to deliver international coverage with a global perspective. We have 250 Paris-based journalists, 130 of which are of foreign origin, and a very dense network of correspondents around the world. Few organisations can equal this powerful network.

Based on this belief, Cluzel has decided to drastically change the look of RFI's traditional schedule. This month, RFI's full-service output will divide into three separate services. RFI 1 (broadcast on shortwave and satellite) will be an allnews service in French, with news bulletins interspersed with maga-

zines and talk-shows. RFI 2 will offer syndicated programmes to local broadcasters in local languages, while RFI 3, a music-only service centered on French with an emphasis on world music, will be available only as a satellite-delivered service.

"With RFI 1 and RFI 2, our goal is to give a thorough and global vision of the world, as an independent source of news," explains Cluzel. "This way, we can be faithful to our mission, which is to present the best of French society and the diversity of the world. And our local partners can build a complete schedule by mixing RF1 1 and/or RFI 2 with RFI 3."

Cluzel says his goal is to deliver ingredients from which local broadcasters can make their own recipe.



To be even more efficient, Cluzel says material can be delivered in local languages, with short

news pieces that can be easily fit into general news programmes. "We aim to be a sort of audio news agency for local


stations," he says.

RFI has also embarked upon a major development strategy in the main regions of the world to be granted air space on local FM frequencies. The president of RFI Jean-Paul Cluzel says being on FM gives RFI the opportunity to be competitive "on equal terms with local broadcasters". So far, RFI is available on FM 24 hours a day in 25 cities around the world, and in parts of 35 other cities.

Cluzel says the fate of the main international services is tied. Their success will be based on their capacity to take into account the geopolitical changes around the world and deliver programmes that complement local programming.

But he doesn't see the other services as competitors. Cluzel ranks RFI as probably the third largest international service after the BBC World Service and Voice Of America, and on par with Deutsche Welle—but for him, the competition is on every market with local TV channels, press and radio stations.

"There are no longer protected regions," observes Cluzel, referring mainly to Africa, where RFI is traditionally strong. "In each and every country, we are fighting with local media outlets. Competition is everywhere. We are now part of a competitive world and have to operate according to the rules of the radio business. What will count is quality programming, and our capacity to sell it abroad. It might not be the last chance for international services to survive, but it's probably one of our last chances."

2Wicky - Columbia ehr/a/r PRODUCERS: Hoover This excellent single from Belgian band Hoover (which made it to Stealing Beauty OST of Bertolucci's new film) sounds like a classic the moment you hear it. This trip hoppy track with female vocals and a twangy guitar riff contains samples from Burt Bacharach's Walk On By, making it slightly reminiscent of Urge Overkill's Neil Diamond cover for the Pulp Fiction OST.

SUSANNA HOFFS

All I Want - London ehr/r/a/ace PRODUCER: Jack Joseph Puig Hoffs is back with a great version of Ian Broudie's composition, which should not automatically have her brandished as ACE material. This mid-tempo ballad has gritty guitars, beautiful harmonies and dramatic string arrangements. Her composition Those Days Are Over is floatier, dreamier west coast pop with a psychedelic Mazzy Star touch, an approach she continues with her subdued folky version of Donovan's Catch The Wind.

DEUS

Little Arithmetics - Island a/r/ace PRODUCER: Eric Drew Feldman
This first single from their new album is extremely radiofriendly. It's basis is a jazzy drum shuffle, up-beat background vocals and cheesy organs. Only the guitars show signs of wanting to break out of the easy listening mold, but they never do. You could actually play this on the ACE format.



Sacrebleu - Yellow PRODUCER: Dimitri



It gets interesting when he starts blending the lounge sound with trip hop beats in *Reveries*. The dance beats pick up in *Dirty Larry*, which has a *Mission Impossible* kind of radio appeal.

Bad As I Wanna B - Elektra PRODUCERS: Jermaine Dupri, MC Lyte This fly girl can get pretty nasty, but she has dosed her current single Keep On, Keepin' On with a silk sleek dose of R&B vocals. The Darrell Delite remix features even lusher vocals, but the beats are more stripped down, not exactly radio material. The other radio candidate is the sexy Two Seater, which is even a smoother mix of rap and R&B, not surprisingly produced by R. Kelly. The overall tone of the album is darker. doing what rap does best, reporting about the current state of the black communities. The chilling tales of Busta Rhymes come to mind. Best tracks in this vein are the skeptic Druglord Superstar and the kaleidoscopic Zodiac.

Sovory Picks Up Sheryl Crow Support Slot


AMSTERDAM - Blending funk, soul and

rock with the discipline of a classically trained musician has earned young singer/song-writer Sovory the praise of Eric Clapton. The artist formally known as God saw him perform in Los Angeles and consequently called the A&M office to say that "Sovory is the best new artist I've heard in years." Clapton is not the only one who enthuses about this new artists, as Sovory was asked to support Sheryl Crow's upcoming European tour.

Live performances are the key to Sovory, who enhances his gospel fuelled Otis Redding-like intensity with aggressive rock guitars. "I

really go for the energy exchange," he comments on his recent series of European showcases. "First impressions will last. You never know who's in the audience." He doesn't know for a fact Clapton saw his House of Blues show: "there are conflicting stories circulating." But with A&M making him a major worldwide priority, he is backed by more than one man's opinion. As head of international marketing Dennis Ploug explains, "We all think he can become a mega star, including the local offices. We got the reactions we wanted from

Scandinavia, Germany, Holland and the UK, because he's such an amazing performer. Germany especially is going



for it in a big way. He stole the show at their sales convention and they want him for promotion for a whole week."

Adding Flavour To Programming

The first single from the self-titled album is *Did You Mean What You Said*, a powerful soul ballad with plenty of rock grit, which has already picked up airplay in Poland, Switzerland and Denmark. Polydor Denmark initiated a successful cross-promotion campaign with

Copenhagen-based EHR station The Voice, which played the single daily and gave away tickets for the showcase. Head

of music Eik Frederiksen explains why he stuck his neck out for a relative newcomer. "Before researching an artist, we sometimes want to try them out. We were first station Scandinavia to play Alanis Morissette or Deep Blue Something. This way you can give your programming a little flavour, instead of doing it like a robot." What persuaded Frederikson to put Sovory into the spotlight is the fact that it's "great radio music. It's a good mixture of soul, blues and rock, the kind of music that will touch people and it's well-produced.

You could play it after Eric Clapton, but it's not really suitable to play after Spice Girls."

As PolyGram Denmark product manager Kjeld Stefansen comments "radio is really important now. With that kind of catchy pop and soul crossover, you can go anywhere. You could start with a young target audience and then move on to the adult-oriented market. His live performance is more edgy compared to the radio-friendly album. Right now, we won't exploit the live side." Italian product manager Giuseppina

Bianchi reports enthusiastic reactions from national network Radio Deejay. "The radio programmers just resumed their work. Usually the supply of new singles to them stops in August, but thanks to the sampler in Music & Media [issue 34], Radio Deejay put Sovory immediately on the playlist. After playing it for two weeks, the station started getting quite a lot of phone calls from listeners. Usually, Radio Deejay is considered to be a trendsetter, so hopefully other stations will follow."

Fashion Victim?

As Dennis Ploug points out, phase two is to promote Sovory in Southern Europe. Bianchi is currently setting up a showcase for him. "We're hoping to organise something for the fashion week in Milan, when a lot of parties will take place. At the moment, there is an unconfirmed acoustic performance scheduled for Sovory." Meanwhile, Sovory himself is not exactly twiddling his thumbs. "I've written 300 songs so far and I've just signed a 50/50 co-publishing deal with EMI Publishing. But I'm not focused on money, I want to be making my music in twenty years time."

Peter Andre Moves On



LONDON - Working with the teen media without getting stereotyped is notoriously difficult, but it's starting to look as though Peter Andre might have cracked it. It takes more than a niche following to scale the heights his debut single Mysterious Girl has reached. The fact that he looks like a muscular male model has helped put him on teen magazine covers before his record was even released in some territories, but Mushroom Records is convinced that his success is mainly due to radio. As Andre himself observes, "It has been an ultimate goal to cross over to all age groups, and radio has been a major contributor.'

Mushroom international marketing director Nina Frykberg agrees. Airplay and sales chart positions in the UK, Germany, Holland, Italy, Austria, Ireland, Switzerland and Scandinavia prove her point.

Now comes the tricky bit of moving

on. Frykberg explains that in the UK, Mushroom decided to delete the platinum *Mysterious Girl* in the interests of Andre's long term development. "I'm sure we'd still be top 20 now, but that's not the point. We're building a career, not trying to make money off a single," she says.





...And The (Euro)Beat Goes On

Call it Euro-dance, happy rave or whatever, commercial dance music still reigns on the Continent after the best part of five years.

Often declared dead by its critics, dance pop "Made In Germany" enjoys considerable popularity abroad. Christian Lorenz reports.

INCE Music & Media's
April 1995 report on commercial dance music made in Germany, hip hop has pushed Euro-dance from top slots in the European pop charts—but the genre is still going

From the Fugees (Columbia) to unlikely chart candidates such as Bone Thugs-N-Harmony (Ruthless/Epic), smooth hip hop tracks are top sellers in 1996. Compliments to Warner Music Germany marketing director Bernd Dopp and EMI Electrola director A&R/marketing Marco Quirini for predicting the hip hop trend back in April 1995.

Jungle briefly reared its head when it employed conventional vocals on Goldie's Timeless (Metalheadz/ Virgin) but quickly disappeared into commercial insignificance again. Warner Music label manager Downbeat Norbert Rudnitzky was right when he predicted that complex rhythms and lack of traditional melodies will bar jungle tracks from the pop charts. Consequently, Downbeat's latest signing is Birmingham's dub/house pioneer act Rockers HiFi.

Unlike the situation in the UK, the house revival has not made significant inroads into other European markets yet. Sales success still refers to variations on the much maligned he-raps-she-sings formula of Euro-dance. Culture Beat (Dancepool/ Columbia), Mr. President (Club Culture/Warner) and newcomer Captain Jack (EMI Electrola) enjoy considerable success in Music & Media's European charts. They are followed closely by happy rave acts like Scooter (ClubTools/Edel) and U96 (Motor).

It is noteworthy that labels established during the early days of the dance craze continue to be the key players in the commercial dance market. None of the five new dance labels featured in the April 1995 report has had a major hit up to now. Discore (Virgin), Kosmodrom (Polydor), Monkee Bizz (East West), Randy (WEA) and Suburban (Motor) have yet to catch the attention of the record buying public. Nevertheless, new labels keep sprouting up.

Launching A New Label

How is a new dance label established on the market? **Bela Cox**, label manager of Epic's new dance imprint Epidrome, maps out a step-by-step approach. "For the first six months we will focus on getting progressive dance music like house and garage into the clubs and work closely with club DJs. After these six months of groundwork I would like to see our first crossover track entering the pop charts."

Cox seems to have the industry background necessary to launch a dance label. He has just left Logic Records after three years as A&R man. Prior to joining Logic he worked with key techno DJ/producer Sven Väth as A&R man at Väth's Harthouse label. Logic has been successful in transforming hit singles into steady album sales. Label stars Snap sold between 16-17 million albums worldwide says Cox. He believes that this is the key to survival for any beginning dance label. "My aim for the next business year is to pick one new act and start developing it into an album act.'

In the long run albums will account for 20% of Epidrome's releases, if everything goes according to Cox's plan. The new label will not directly compete with Sony Music's established Dancepool imprint which is now part of the Columbia division. While Dancepool focuses on domestic signings, "Epidrome will keep an eye on what's happening in the UK and the US," comments Cox. He estimates that up to 80% of the label's releases will be licensed from abroad.

Sales for Epidrome's first handful of releases by format will average some 3.000 vinyl 12" and 2-3.000 CD singles, he estimates. Major radio stations included in the Media Control single chart panel will be plugged by Epic radio promoters. In the long run, Epidrome plans to set up its own promotion department to service specialist dance stations and programmes.

Crossing Borders

While Epidrome looks across the channel for new talent, the established competition fares well by exporting German dance acts abroad. Mr. President, Culture Beat and Captain Jack are accomplished pop acts who offer the whole package of music, show and fun.

"Positive personal vibes of the performing artists are essential for the success of any commercial dance act," says Warner Music Germany international exploitation manager Pamela Harz. "Street wear and leisure activities* apparently know no borders. Musical tastes, on the

other hand, can differ considerably."

Warner banks on live performances to promote an act like Mr. President abroad. Harz does not think much of re-mixing tracks specifically for export. "The artists and producers aim at a high standard of production from the start. We then offer a handful of mixes on each single to cater to a variety of tastes. The key is to get your act on stage."

Live gigs and TV appearances are usually preceded by radio promotion to set the ball rolling. Warner's promotion campaign for Mr. President in Hungary shows how compact a successful marketing plan can be. In week 23 Warner released the single Coco Jambo. "One week later we released the album We See The Same Sun and flew the group in for a week of live performances, TV shows and autograph sessions at major retailers." In week 25 We See The Same Sun reached number 1 in the Hungarian album charts.

The prominence of Finland as a market for commercial dance music from Germany is not accidental. "The German music TV station Viva is apparently able to break records in Finland," observes Sony Music Germany international exploitation

manager Ian Graham. "Finnish kids don't understand the VJs but the music seems to go down well."

Viva promotion manager Martina Bedzent confirms that the station can be received in Finland via Eutelsat. She adds, "Unfortunately we have no indication of audience (continues on page 14)



Surprise Entry

Canada is a bit of a surprise entry but it works well for Culture Beat. Graham says, "The Canadian dance market is very similar to our domestic market. It's weird, you can walk into the dance department of any Canadian record store and you feel beamed straight back into Frankfurt.

The Canadian fascination with Euro-dance has begun to spread into the US. "Euro-dance features strongly in clubs and radio stations in the border region with Canada," says Graham. "Chicago and Buffalo are prominent markets. But there are big enclaves in Texas and Miami as well.

Euro-dance has to fight a number of prejudices in the US market. It is still considered as plastic pop and perceived as music for gay discos. Dance music is linked with mating rituals, and the fast Euro-beats have their own attraction in this context.' says Graham. "I hear that Culture Beat's 1993 hit Mr. Vain is still the most popular soundtrack in New York strip clubs.

While initial resistance in the US appears to be wearing down, the UK remains a hit-or-miss affair for Euro-dance. "BBC Radio 1 is quite simply the gate into the UK market," explains Graham. "If you don't make Radio 1 with your track you can forget it.

The market for commercial dance music rotates around singles and compilations. That makes it very fast. "To survive in this environment you have to discover and market new acts on a continuous basis. believes Graham. Artists like Scatman John (Iceberg/BMG) or E-Rotic (Intercord) appear out of the blue with novelty dance hits. Following up the initial success is more difficult.

Take Captain Jack for instance. Rapper Franky Gee and singer Liza Da Costa entered the pop charts flirting with a military image. The image is based on Franky being the tough army guy pulling loads of pretty girls," says EMI Electrola international marketing manager Anja Bauermann. She points out that this image is inflated to cartoon status, rather than appealing to serious military nuts. "We have identified Captain Jack's core target group as 10-15 year-old boys." What will happen if the novelty of the cartoon hero wears off with the act's second album?

Musically speaking, Captain Jack is backed up by producer Udo Niebergall, who is a seasoned veteran of the Euro-dance scene. According to Bauermann the real asset of Gee and Da Costa are their performer qualities. "Both are disciplined top performers with great potential. They are not limited to this particular image." A second album is scheduled for release next spring. "We already have a number of ideas for the future development of Captain Jack," reveals Bauermann. "But it is too early to disclose more details yet.

Even an established album artist might need the occasional facelift. "Two and a half years ago Culture Beat sold millions," says Graham. "Since then we had to lower our sights somewhat." Devastated by the death of original producer and Thorsten Fenslau in writer November 1993, the group's phenomenal career stalled.

This spring Dancepool employees from all over Europe met to analyse the situation. "The result was that Culture Beat was perceived as oldfashioned in most markets," reveals Graham. "We decided to pursue a more aggressive style of presentation using more modern mixes and arty videos.

Even the right image and a top 10 hit do not guarantee survival. Any project with the ambition to become a true album act has to be present in the media with a constant string of hits. Continuity is important. "Developing dance album acts is a challenge," says Graham. "You need at least three strong singles on any album, or else people will just buy the hit compilations.

The First Techno Ballad

Not exactly Euro-dance but commercially extremely successful, Scooter has developed from straightforward rave tracks with cheerful commands like "move your ass" to more melodydriven pop songs over the past two years. Producer Jens Thele announces that the group's third album Wicked will even feature "the world's first techno ballad." The album will be released on October 16 and contains two contributions by pop songwriter Nosie Katzmann.

Scooter's standing abroad differs considerably from its happy hardcore image at home. "In Germany we have been pushed into the pop dance corner by the media," explains Thele. "Abroad we have much more credibility because we go through different distribution channels." If Scooter had signed with a major label this might never have happened. "Edel can pick different distribution partners in every European territory," says Thele. "This means we can pick the most suitable partners for particular releases."

In Ireland ClubTools is distributed by EuRock in Dublin. When Scooter released the second single Move Your Ass in January 1995 the group landed an instant import hit in Ireland. "For the Irish dance scene we were completely underground, only available on expensive 12" vinyl imports," recalls Thele. "Pretty soon this massive hype started in Ireland, which was largely based on our import status.'

Move Your Ass was eventually awarded platinum (5.000 copies sold) on the strength of vinyl imports alone. Scooter developed a close relationship with its Irish fanbase which resulted in a special version of *Back In The UK* distributed by EuRock under the title *Back In Ireland*.

Scooter's Irish fame spread over Northern Ireland into Scotland but did not make it much further south. "The beats people dance to in the north are faster than in the rest of England," explains Thele.

Edel regional manager Annika Meyer-Willkomm says that beats per minute (BPM) determine the possible export markets for commercial dance music. Scooter's slowest number to date, I'm Raving, clocks in around 139 BPM. "That's too fast for Spain, Italy and most parts of Scandinavia," says Meyer-Willkomm. "Especially Sweden and Denmark look more to the UK for musical influences." Maybe the techno ballad will turn out to be the right format to conquer these markets for Euro-dance.

What Happens Next?


Commercial dance music has come to a temporary lull. It's still popular but the genre has lost a lot of it's original zest. Now it's time to map out the future course of development and put innovation back into the genre.

Maria Jiménez, general manager of the Amsterdam Dance Event observes, "Euro-dance is not real club music any more, it's more suited to live performances." Taking place on October 17-19, the Amsterdam Dance Event highlights current trends in the European club scene. Only one showcase out of some 20 confirmed parties and appearances is dedicated to commercial dance music. The emphasis of the event lies on house, with guests like Jellybean Benitez, Rollo and Sister Bliss.

But in the long term it can only be in the interest of Euro-dance to get away from its dance roots. It widens the audience for the genre since active nightclubbers are still a minority. The future of commercial dance music lies in adopting even more conventional pop mannerisms with just enough new elements borrowed from the dance scene to make the resulting product interesting.


Samples, more BPM and different sounds—innovation still trickles into pop music on a continuous basis. "There is a fine line between the clubs and the pop charts," says Jiménez. "Thanks to Euro-dance the mind frame of pop buyers has expanded. It is much easier nowadays for a dance track to cross over into the mainstream."

Are we putting future earnings on a shaky base here? Albums are the bread and butter of the pop industry. Most players in the commercial dance market realise that the development of album acts in this genre is difficult. Some good, old-fashioned songwriting might help. After all, Euro-dance and its derivatives are bought by normal pop consumers. Goodbye to novelty hits and welcome the techno ballad.



Jazz Cauldron's Bubbling

While new jazz labels have been launched by indies and two majors have recently incorporated their jazz and classic divisions, this autumn witnesses expanding horizons and a plethora of new releases. Terry Berne samples the banquet.

WO new jazz labels have been launched recently by leading independents. Koch International entered the rapidly expanding jazz market with Koch Jazz. Focusing on regional stars both in the US, where the label is based, and in Europe, the company's first releases include Cleveland native and saxophonist Ernie Krivda, Chicago pianist Kelly Brand, Los Angeles saxophonist Eskovitz, UK pianist John Donaldson, as well as guitarist Jarek Smietana and trumpet player Tomasz Stanko from Poland. The company will also licence previously released but currently unavailable material by artists such as Bobby Previte, Herb Ellis, Dave McKenna and John Handy.

Island Jamaica Jazz was launched this spring to showcase the jazz side of the Caribbean island famed as the birthplace of reggae. Both initial releases feature pioneers of Jamaican instrumental music with deep-rooted Guitarist jazz origins. Ernest Ranglin, with Below The Bassline and keyboard player Monty Alexander with Yard Movement hope to move the two traditions closer together. Island UK A&R director Trevor Wyatt, who helped produce both albums says, "The idea for the Ranglin sessions was to replace the reggae drummer with a jazz drummer and the electric bass with a string bass, in order to capture both the jazz and the reggae vibe of a handful of Jamaican classics like the great Satta Massagana." Alexander takes the opposite tack on his CD, playing jazz lines over an all-Jamaican rhythm section. The label hopes to offer three or four albums a year, with wellknown reggae saxophonist Dean Frazer next up.

Norway's Jazz Plugged In

After switching from commercial radio to public and back again in the past year or so, Oslo's "Jazz Scene," produced by David Fishel, has set its sites on a major cyber audience with an Internet web site utilising RealAudio technology, and transmission from no less than four broadcasting points. The site, which can be accessed at http://nettvik.no/jazzscene contains a varied menu of jazz-related pages with animation, down-loadable sound files and databases. Information is available on the programme's past and up-coming shows, including playlists, interview guests, album reviews (contributed by a rotating roster of guest critics) and a local events calendar. A

"links" page puts you in touch with a host of other jazz-related Internet sites such as labels, artist home pages, Jazz On-Line and the like. Song requests can be made directly to "Jazz Scene" from the 2.000-album database. The weekly programme can be heard on Oslo's Radio 1 and Classic FM, as well as on Radio Nettverk via satellite all over Norway (and the world if you have Intelsat), "Jazz Scene" can also be heard courtesy of the Internet world-

Dreyfus Flies High

Dreyfus Jazz, just entering its fifth year, is celebrating unprecedented sales of several of its recent releases, as well as a sweep of the jazz awards at the 1996 NAIRD convention in May. The label won Best Contemporary Jazz Recording for Roy Haynes' Te-Vou and Best Mainstream Recording for the Mingus Big Band's Gunslinging Birds. According to label founder Francis Dreyfus, the double Michel Petrucciani CD Au Théatre Des Champs Elysées has sold some 60.000 copies in Europe and south-east Asia alone, while of the two Marcus Miller releases on the label, the first has sold above 80.000 in Europe, and the second is nearing sales of 75.000. These albums received Jazz Award sales certification in Germany last year. Also, initial orders for Flamingo, the new Petrucciani CD featuring Stephane

Grappelli stand above 58.000, reports Dreyfus.

"We don't really know what percentage of the market jazz represents." he says, because a majority of both labels and outlets are independent and don't show up in survevs. But it's much bigger than is generally thought. Sales like ours prove that."

He attributes that success to several factors. Aggressive promoof marketing and publicity experience gained bers.aol.com/Jlackritz/jazz. from pop music, is

undoubtedly the label's specialty. "Our goal is to find the right artists, and let them know from the start that we are going to invest an ample budget in them, not only on the production of a disc, but on promotion as well, so that a release becomes a media event just as with a pop album. That's why exclusivity is important to us.

The label has also followed a stra-

tegy of signing artists that play different instruments, which allows them to create special line-ups with label mates, both live and on disc, attracting both media and consumer attention. Dreyfus recently signed jazz violinist Didier Lockwood, whose label debut, Story Board, will be out in early November. "We want to create a company spirit, like Blue Note had in the 50s," he concludes.

Majors Re-Group

PolyGram did it at the beginning of this year. Now RCA is following suit. PolyGram merged its jazz department, including leading label Verve, with its classical division, forming PolyGram

Europe-wide (which should spur interest in the excellent OST), and the sultry, jazzy Red Hot + Rio about to hit the sidewalk, Verve is gearing up for a warmer than usual autumn. How about Sting and Jobim? Or George Michael and Astrud Gilberto? Both duos appear on the new Red Hot project (last seen on Impulse's Red Hot & Cool), whose first single will be Crystal Waters singing The Boy From Ipanema. Verve will also release Van Morrison and Ben Sidran's tribute to Mose Allison, Tell Me Something, with a little help from friend Mose. The guitar trio of Paco de Lucia, Al DiMeola and John McLaughlin is also expected, as is the latest Joe Henderson

PopKomm's Message

At this year's PopKomm Jazz Area no less than 13 companies were present including, apart from major labels, Alex Merck Music, Intuition, In-Akustik, Biber, Bellaphon and Motor Music. The area, featuring a stage for acoustic performances, was an initiative of the Jazz Marketing and Vertrieb, a platform consisting of 19 major and independent labels within the German industry organization the BPW. The group is also responsible for the Jazz Trend Charts published by Der Musik-Markt and the Jazz Award for

Classics and Jazz. Now BMG's extensive line of jazz labels, which includes the newly reactivated RCA Victor catalogue, as well as Telarc and Bluebird, will be administered by BMG Classics, which acquired UK classical indie Conifer earlier this year. Its new reissue series, which puts emphasis on quality re-mastering, packaging, ses-





Breakin' & Entering

A weekly Eurochart analysis by Machgiel Bakker



R.E.M.

Things have gone very fast for R.E.M. Debuting last week at number 9, now the US superstars' long-await-ed album is already at number 1, and the jump gave the group a Sales Breaker award in the process. Europe's best-selling album, New Adventures In Hi-Fi is presently number 1 in no less than seven European markets (including the UK), number 2 in

Sweden and Germany plus an additional six other chart positions.

It marks the band's third number 1 album following 1991's Out Of Time and Monster from 1994. Another very successful album for the band was Automatic For The People that reached number 2 in the Top

R.E.M.'s move to number 1 puts an end to the five-week chart reign of Alanis Morissette's Jagged Little Pill. Nevertheless, that album is still on a roll as attests it's number 2 position after a remarkable 54-week chart run.

 $\it Jagged\ Little\ Pill$ is no doubt the most successful debut album of the '90s. With three million sales in Europe (12 million in the US), it is still charted in all European territories contributing to the chart (17), including a top 10 placing in 15. Despite that success, Jagged Little Pill is currently not the longest-charting album: that honour goes to the four-million selling D'Eux by Celine Dion, now positioned at 46 after 75 weeks of consecutive chart success. Following in second place, in terms of chart endurance, is Michael Jackson's HIStory. In an unusual move of numerical consistency, the album is at number 66 from last week's position 66 with a total of 66 weeks. The album is bound to improve on its weeks-on-chart number, following the artist's current European tour.

More US dominance in the top 100 comes from ZZ Top which books

the highest entry of the week with Rhythmeen, the group's second album for RCA. The album is a new entry in seven European markets, including a number 9 position in Germany.

In the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles, the Spice Girls remain at the top slot for the third week, with consolidated positions in 13 territories and a number 1 in six—Germany, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Norway, Sweden and Denmark.





Row Over Radio's Party Pieces

LONDON - Virgin Radio is unhappy at a Radio Authority directive which will require all national commercial radio stations to carry party political broadcasts (PPBs) in the months approaching the UK's general election.

Along with fellow national privates Classic FM and Talk Radio, the music-lead ACE/rock outlet is being ordered to broadcast a total of seven and two-and-a-half minute PPBs in the months before the next general election, which is expected to be called in the spring or summer of 1997. The legal requirement

for national commercial radio to air PPBs is enshrined in the 1990 Broadcasting Act, and is now being enforced by the Radio Authority.

Virgin Radio's head of press Elly Smith explains, "There are two issues we are not happy about. Firstly, it's unfair that not all radio stations have to carry these broadcasts. Two-and-a-half minutes is a long time on the radio, and it will be a real turn-off for our listeners. It seems particularly unjust that BBC Radio 1 is not required to carry the broadcasts, especially as they are supposed to be a public service." Smith adds, We are also unhappy about the requirement to carry broadcasts from regional parties [Plaid Cymru and the Scottish Nationalist Partyl, which will not be of interest to listeners in other parts of the country.

Smith admits that Virgin is resigned to the fact that it has a legal requirement to carry the PPBs. She hopes, however,

that the political parties will make some attempt to produce broadcasts that will appeal to a younger audience. "It would be nice to think that they could use their creativity to design broadcasts that will fit in with our programmes.

Radio Authority spokesperson Julie McCatty says that the regulator's request to national stations to broadcast PPBs (which had not been rigidly enforced until now) was made following lobbying by the political parties, and because of the imminence of a general election. Says McCatty, "We think its encouraging [for the status of commercial radiol that political parties have taken such an interest in this matter." The 1990 Broadcasting Bill states that, as part of the terms of their licences, national commercial operators have an obligation to broadcast PPBs, and the act tasks the Radio Authority with the responsibility of ensuring stations broadcast the required amount of PPBs.

"Uptown radio will continue to operate in Copenhagen. Uptown Radio A/S, as parent of the radio station, will sell the Uptown name and some of its activities to Tele Danmark to provide programming, sales and expertise in running the stations '

The telecom company holds the majority stake in the new company, which will be placed in Tele Danmark's portfolio as Tele Danmark Radio A/S, a subsidiary of the cable TV division which provides services and equipment for local radio stations.

The announcement came as a surprise to many in the business, but newer legislation on the liberalisation of telecommunications opened the doors for the move. "I'm all for liberalisation, but the playing field must be level for all. If you're a public body, you can do what you like," says Steen Sodergreen, vice chairman of the commercial radio organisation KOMM. "Tele Danmark may have a credibility problem as it offers services to stations and competes with them at the same time. I won't do business with a company like that. Maybe they think there's more money in killing local radio than selling them equipment."

The stations will be entirely

financed by advertising revenues, and the parent says it will use the next four weeks to land ad contracts. The names of the two new stations are expected to be released next month.

"We have around 20 employees at Uptown and we will be expanding with the new channels. In the expansion we intend to recruit from staff already in place, and part of the expansion will be looking for new talent to hire." says Lau Rentius. "We're also going to produce a sound channel for Tele Danmark's TV service channel," he says.

Bellay has fully reshaped the schedule and dropped all the entertainment, games or music-only shows. Instead, the news sections have been strengthened and a series of new daytime and evening talk shows introduced.

"Europe 1 will be a talk station identified as such from start to finish," says Bellay adding that music will not be forgotten with two songs per half-hour. Bellay wants Europe 1 "to regain its position as the leading station regarding news," and is targeting a 7-10% national audience. He reckons that, "the major risk we face in the beginning is losing part of our audience. but the whole gamble is to gain an increasing audience".

Bellay dismisses the criticism that Europe 1 is no longer a full-service station. We are redefining our concept, but if we look at the CSA's definitions we still are a full-service station. Most of our programmes are news but not exclusively. Europe 1 has the guts to change. You cannot always look at the past and lament. You have to move forward before it's too late. Those who have not made it today will regret it in the future.

Spain Welcomes Arrival Of Digital Radio, Finally

MADRID - Digital radio via satellite is on its way to Spain, a year after it arrived in most of Europe. At the same time, national TV station Tele 5 has announced the imminent birth of "the first totally independent TV music programme" which will concentrate on new talent.

Astra Marketing Ibérica (AMI), the Spanish affiliate of Luxembourg-based Societé Européenne des Satelites (SES) which owns the Astra satellite system, has announced that the radio service will be in operation by the end of the year. On offer will be 106 radio channels. including 62 all-music pay channels. Astra already transmits satellite TV to Spain, but only 1.120.000 of the 11.710.000 homes with a television receive the system.

Astra Digital Radio (ADR) was introduced to most of Europe in mid-1995, and in countries such as the UK and Ireland, 30% of homes with Astra reception listen to the radio via satellite. In Spain, the source of the music digital radio

will be the US company Digital Music Express (DMX), which broadcasts via the Astra satellite system. Albert Martí, director general of AMI, said the monthly subscription will be Pta1.500 (app. US\$11.90), while the receiver-synthesiser will be available for Pta50,000. "The introduction of ADR will mean an important change in radio, converting it into a more and more selective and thematic instrument," he said.

The Tele 5 programme will be called Compact-Dyc and is to start broadcasting on October 6. The show will feature new artists with one veteran star from the past 30 years who will act as "godfather" to the young musicians. "This should be a good opportunity for new artists who are emerging at a time when Spanish music is suffering a paralysis of forms and rhythms," says a Tele 5 spokesman. "We have to give fresh blood a chance in a time of complete musical sterility, in which the industry is still living off compilation albums of music from the past 30 years.'

EHR Top 40 commentary by Pieter Kops

The hottest record on European Hit Radio this week is *Dance Into The Light*, the new single by **Phil Collins**. The radio-friendly track has managed to achieve the status of Most Added leader for the second consecutive week, as it's boosted by 34 first-time reports on the format—after 28 last week.

Dance Into The Light jumps up 25 places in one go, landing at number 8 with a 65-station roster by its side. This comprises of 15 countries with Holland, the UK and Ireland standing out as most supportive. National penetration in those territories ranges from 71% in the UK to 100% in Holland. Spain, Norway, Denmark, Austria and Switzerland form the second league, with figures between 50-67%.

In the meantime, **Spice Girls** conquers the number 1 slot on EHR, two weeks after the UK quintet did the same in the Eurochart Hot 100 Singles, where, incidentally, it hasn't left its magnificent position since. Its triumphant move on EHR has forced the **Pet Shop Boys** single to leave the throne after a two-week reign with Se A Vida É (That's The Way Life Is). Interestingly, its successor Wannabe is the first debut single to have achieved EHR number 1 status this year.

The Spice Girls' song is currently playlisted in 25 European countries, including new additions in Germany, Italy, Belgium and Slovenia. At present, its highest national penetration ratios are being


registered in Holland, Hungary, Slovenia and the Czech Republic (75-100%).

US hip hopper Nas seizes the highest new entry in the EHR Top 40 with If I Ruled The World, the melodic lead single from his otherwise strongly rap-oriented Was album It Written. The single, which features background vocals by Fugees

Nas vocals by Fugees member Lauryn, kicks off at number 36, marking the first hit for Nas on Europe's leading music radio format.

At this stage, If I Ruled The World is reported in rotation by 26 EHR stations in 12 European countries. Holland stands out as most supportive with a 83% penetration level, with Germany in second place (44%).

While Eros Ramazzotti's Stella Gemella occupies the Border Breakers top spot for the third week in a row, the mid-tempo ballad grabs the Road Runner award for the fifth time since its chart entry eight weeks ago, a highly remarkable achievement. Ramazzotti's increased support base is due to new reports from significant stations in Germany, Sweden and Norway. His single has now found its way to EHR and ACE stations of all formats in 21 countries across the board. In the EHR Top 40 it is currently positioned at number 21 and in the ACE Top 25 at number 10.

German Euro dance act No Mercy has also attracted considerable new crossover airplay this week, causing it to jump from number 7 to 4 during its eighth charting week. Where Do You Go enjoys an expanding roster in Holland, Italy and Sweden and has now obtained airplay support in 14 countries outside GSA. In the EHR Top 40, the single is currently charting at number 32, after a peak one notch higher.

Another good move in the top 10 region of the chart is performed by Brazilian, French-signed act Carrapicho. The cheerful and poppy dance track, entitled Tic, Tic Tac, leaps up from number 11 to 7 during its eighth consecutive charting week. It is propelled by new airplay in Holland, where private EHR stations Hitradio Veronica/Hilversum and Radio 538/Bussum have added it to their playlists.

The only new entry in this week's Border Breakers run-down appears at number 24. Little Boy by German techno dance act Captain Jack is the follow-up to Soldier Soldier, which

is presently positioned at number 17 during 10th its charting week, after a peak at number 10. Again produced by the act's mastermind

Udo Niebergall, the new single has crossed over to eight stations in three countries outside GSA-Holland (four stations), Belgium (two) and Poland (two).

It is the fourth single taken from Captain Jack's debut album The Mission, which is currently placed at number 54 in the European Top 100 Albums, after having peaked at number 20. Other singles spawned by the album were Drill Instructor and Captain Jack. Both tracks peaked at number 13 in Border Breakers.
