SECOND GOLD, FIRST LP, PALLADIUM SUMMER REVUE SET

FRANK FIELD has qualified for his second Gold Disc. Sales of "Lovesick Blues" have passed the million mark. His starring appearance in this year's London Palladium summer revue is confirmed. Next week, Field's first LP will be released here.

It has taken "Lovesick Blues" 14 weeks to reach the golden million sales mark—three longer than "I Remember You," which did much better in America. The "Lovesick" total is made up by more than 800,000 copies sold in Britain, over 150,000 in America, plus sales from other countries. The disc is currently in the Top Ten of Australasia and Sweden.

Field's first Gold Disc was presented at his birthday party at EMI House on November 30. No plans have yet been made for the second presentation. Sales of "Remember" approach two million and Frank is expected to get a second trophy for this disc.

Field's booking as a main attraction of the London Palladium's 1963 resident revue exclusively foreclosed in last week's NME, has now been confirmed. So has his first co-writer, Arthur Hovner.

The production opens about Friday, May 10, in conjunction with Kenny Ball's Jazzmen to a marriage featured among the supporting attractions.

It is probable that the production will be approved, but the terms could not be agreed. The production will probably run through until the next possible season.

Frank's first LP, "I Remember You," is now set for release by Columbia on February 1. It includes two numbers written by Field—"Lovesick" and "I Just Can't Lose the Blues."

There is one other new song, "I've Got That Sad and Lonely Feeling," but remaining tracks are oldies, some little-known.

They are "Just One Heart Beat," "I'm a Fool to Care," "The Widom of A Fool," and "A Little Bit of Heaven."

Frank's new company, featuring "Before This Day Ends" and "In the Arms of My Love," has a list of four numbers—yet, old and new songs.

The first dates were "Telstar" and "Ain't That the Way" in this week's NME (Chart) and "Telstar" and "Ain't That the Way" in the previous issue. The second title was written by group member Gene Bellini. The double release is believed unprecedented.

"Telstar" was a double release, by Billboard and Cashbox. From New York Nat Hentoff was quoted as saying "Globeetrotter was to have been released in the U.S. in the company with Wind." There were objections to this from the Tornados.

"When the Tornados' LP was released, two West Coast disc-jockeys began to push 'Redd' The Wind." One of the tracks—and it was released at a single.

If it works as if the group has hit with "Redd The Wind" on the West Coast, and Globeetrotter on the Chicago area, "Telstar" alone were up to 257,800 last week.

Cliff Richard dates changed

THREE dates on Cliff Richard's new album "Cliff Richard's Greatest Hits" have been changed. The full length album from the last two days of the tour was shown in the NME (Chart) 29.

They now appear at Kingston A.C. (March 29) and at Walford, Gunning, Avening, confirming a February 29 date. The following day, instead of Walford, is now at Walford, Gunning, Avening. The new venue on April 6.
