





Levi Smith is a very ancient and very obscure blues shouter from the Deep South of the United States. Nobody cares about him any more. Probably nobody ever did care much about him in the past. Certainly nobody is likely to care about him at all in the future.

The answer is, we're not. Well not really. We're talking this time about Levi Smith's Clefs, a very different kettle of fish, and they have nothing to do with Levi Smith at Except that they pinched his name for their own group. Not that he minds. Not that we know that he doesn't mind. But then he's a very ancient and very obscure old blues shouter, so what the heck? He probably doesn't mind.

The Levi Smith's Clefs, on the other hand.

certainly are not ancient, and they're very far from obscure. They're a big jumbly jumping hysterical bundle of sensational soul sound. They're burning straight up the Australian popularity charts like a cat with vodka

on its tongue. They've got a great sound and they've got Inez Amaya on their front line vocal, and that's the story of their success. What else

could a group want? They don't have to go begging for praise. "Harold", said Graham Geddes of the Catcher. "thinks the Levis are a gas, and that's the truth". All this went on when our grandparents were kids, and all these facts can be found in the more outspoken social history books which deal with this period. So you see, Lloyd, there are no new moral standards at all. In fact, moral standards amongst the younger generation today are much higher than in the

Dear Michelle

There's a lot in what you say, but we must remember that those poor people you mentioned were living in the most appalling and primitive conditions. They hardly had a penny to their names, and who knows what any of us might be forced to do under such circum-

But what I really meant in that article, Michelle was that many of our moral values are changing. It's quite true that just as many young men and women in earlier days have for example, slept with one another without being married.

The important difference today is that a lot of adults are speaking up for a NEW morality, a new set of rules to guide people in living And a los of teenagers are thinking things out for themselves, and choosing new values rather than the ones which have traditionally been handed down. There IS a new morality, because morality is not what people DO but what they consider to be RIGHT or WRONG Your grandparents (and Shakespeare's grandparents, for that matter) may have done exactly the same thing in the hay as many young people today do in the backseat in the drive-in, but their moral beliefs were probably quite different.

That is why it is very important to understand that there IS a moral revolution under way It's particularly important that older people realise this. Because these values have become "respectable," we have to face the fact that some people are going to act quite honestly and sincerely in ways which many other folk consider to be "immoral." In such cases, people are just going to have to be tolerant of one another's beliefs about morals. in the same way people of different religious faiths have learned to be tolerant rather than persecuting each other (as they did a few centuries ago) in "Holy Wars"!






