You go to a dance and hear a guitar screaming, more singing than was say, 12 months ago. You don't really take that much notice, you just realise music is improving fast, but there is a reason for all this. ERIC CLAPTON, lead guitarist for the Cream, god, to nearly every guitarist digging the scene. At the risk of everybody thinking I'm a pig, I'll say Jimi Hendrix couldn't tie up the shoe laces of Eric Clapton as far as real, gutsy, funky guitar-playing goes, and so do many thousand Englishmen who voted Eric the top guitarist in the world.

Eric first found fame in the dreary old

Yardbirds (Yuk). He was so hung up in the Birdyards that he blew his cool and joined the Powerhouse. With the Powerhouse, Eric did a too much track with Stevie Winwood "I Wanna Know". From the Powerhouse he moved to John Mayall's Blues Breakers and put out the best white blues LP I've ever heard. Too much for the mind. English Melody Maker had an ideal group poll and the music picked the ideal group as Eric Clapton, lead guitar; Stevie Winwood, vocals; Jack Bruce, brass player; Ginger Baker as drummer and Brian Auger as organist.

Ginger Baker was with Graham Bond, and Jack Bruce had left Bond and was

with Manfred Mann, they thought the group would be too much so they asked Eric to leave Mayall and join them and the Cream was born.

Music critics said of the Cream: the best group musically in the world. Since then they have improved 500%. What more can you say about three guys who are the best of their kind in the world? Eric Clapton is so exciting, every time I listen to his singing guitar I get goose bumps. I could write 300 pages about Eric and I'm warming up, but I won't—instead, I'll just say Eric is the best. You'd better believe it!

The group had several hit records to their credit and a promising future, but right at the peak of their success the star member, Stevie Winwood split, to form his own group. Why?
