BEE GEES SENSATION!

Who can fill the gap left by the Beatles and the Stones!

Now that these two top groups have stopped appearing on stage, England and the rest of the pop-world is looking for the next BIG group . . . and it looks like the Bee Gees are it! They have just won the Most Promising New Group Award in England, and their new disc, "World", is half-way to the top spot after only one week!

BUT, the boys themselves are STILL NOT HAPPY ABOUT THEIR TREATMENT IN AUSTRALIA!

Barry Gibb complained in an interview last week that the Bee Gees left Australia "without one word of press". So before we go on, let us put our case to Barry on this one.

Go-Set Vol. 1 No. 39 featured the Bee Gees on the front page, and page 3. Go-Set awarded "Spicks and Specks" Best Australian Record for 1966. Go-Set printed a letter from the Bee Gees' father, Hughie Gibb (Vol. 2 No. 4), explaining to all Go-Set readers that the Bee Gees "purposely kept things quiet because there has been so much rubbish written about people going here and there and nobody moving".

Hughie wrote again to thank Go-Set for the "Spicks and Specks" award, and to ask that Go-Sets be sent to the boys "to keep in touch with the happenings at home".

So we can only guess that Barry was referring to some OTHER paper; Go-Set has always recognised the immense talent of the Bee Gees, and this week you will find the FULL STORY of their amazing London success on page 3, and a brand new PIN-UP of the boys on page 11!

In fact we are pleased to say that this week, the Bee Gees have hit No. 1 on the Go-Set National Top 40. This is the first time since the very successful "Spicks and Specks".

"BEE GEES NEXT TO BEATLES"

Last Sunday, November 27, at London's Saville Theatre, the Bee Gees proved their brilliance to the world, and got the full treatment in return - hysterical fans, fainting, screaming, rushing the stage and waving their arms at the footlights. The normally sedate Saville has rarely seen scenes like this before.

The atmosphere was electric, and it intensified even further when the comper told us the crowd from the first show, were so knocked out they were still dancing in the street outside.

Straight on into "Every Christian Lion-Hearted Man", then a short piece of "You Keep Me Hanging On", "Hi Heel Sneakers", "Words", and "Gilbert Green".

Wild applause greeted "To Love Somebody" and the Creams "Strange Brew".

The screams and hysterics started as the curtain was raised to reveal five, shadowy Bee Gees in darkness, while the thirty-piece orchestra broke into the haunting strains of "New York Mining Disaster".

Then it was to the finale - beautiful "Massachusetts", with full orchestral backing. This was the cue for the audience to let loose. They rose as one and rushed for their idols, and the group finished to ecstatic screams and applause.

Throughout the show, the Bee Gees displayed their talent in full. Superb guitar work from Vince Melouney, Maurice on fitting organ, and of course the impeccable vocals from the Gibb brothers.

The New Musical Express (English Pop Paper) likened their performance to the Beatles.

"Listening and watching them, specially doing their own material, you can't help be reminded of the early Beatles. But that is meant to be praise not criticism, for they are no copyists and have enough originality and talent of their own to silence any detractors. And there can be no doubt that they will be big, because they are talented, and largely because they fill the gap left by the progression and the advancing remoteness of the Beatles and the Stones."

The Bee Gees have conquered. With a riotous reception, reminiscent of early Beatle concerts, and boundless world wide praise, the Bee Gees are tops and they are there to stay.
