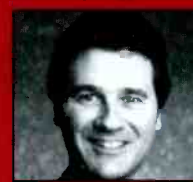

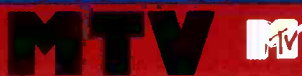

"Y107" New Alternative To KROQ

"Mainstream Modern Rock" Triopoly Hits SoCal

On Wednesday, March 27, Odyssey Communications flipped the format of triopoly KMAX Pasadena/KAXX Ventura/KBAX Fallbrook from Sports/Talk to "Mainstream Modern Rock." All three stations broadcast on 107.1, just a tad to the right of heritage Alternative powerhouse KROQ 106.7.

According to Odyssey Pres./CEO Mike Kakoyiannis, "The format change is part of Odyssey's overall strategy to identify and develop under-performing properties in major-market areas and position them for revenue and cash flow growth."

Odyssey VP Programming Steve Blatter will program the stations as it goes through its jock-less launch, which should last for "at least a few weeks." "The New Y107, Southern California's Modern Rock" is expected to have new call letters in the near future. "Y107 is a work in progress and will evolve over the next few months," states Blatter, who was previously PD at Odyssey's Alternative WRGX Westchester County, NY.

The story so far: The three stations, previously owned by John Douglas, of-

fered an unusual combination of Tom Joyner's morning show with Sports/Talk the rest of the day. Among the gabfest moderators were The Fabulous Sports Babe, Pete Rose and former Raider football player Bob Golic. Suddenly, on Monday (25), afternoon personality Joe McDonnell announced that the station would flip at midnight to "some kind of Metal format." In reality, beginning that midnight and running throughout Tuesday, the station aired construction sounds. The new format signed on the next day.

In a press release, Y107 notes that it will target 20-34-year-old Modern Rock listeners with music and presentation that are "uniquely designed for the non-teen music listener." Claiming its format was shaped by two large-scale research studies, it differentiated itself from the competition by noting that it "won't be too loud or obscure for our target audience...will play Mainstream Modern Rock...is not a Heavy Metal or Classic Rock...is not a quirky or avant garde station...is not a sleepy A/C...or a Classic Rock station

that happens to play Modern Rock."

However, judging by its opening day music mix, finding a unique pigeonhole will likely be easier said than done. They played hits by The Smashing Pumpkins, Green Day, Offspring, Pearl Jam, Collective Soul, Everclear, Oingo Boingo, Dave Matthews Band, Talking Heads, Violent Femmes, Ammonia, Alanis Morissette and Bush. Most, if not all, of these artists can already be heard on KROQ, KLOS, KSCA and KLSX (on weekends).

Apparently, Odyssey hopes that by covering Southern California from three sticks in outlying areas, it can capture a healthy piece of the huge metro. (It was tried once before by Alternative Rave station "Mars FM," which had sticks in Orange County and the Huntington Beach. It didn't last long.) Nevertheless, it seems that the braintrust behind Y107 is quite aware of the challenge and is willing to go head-on against the 800-pound gorilla programmed by Kevin Weatherly. Some of its promos cite KROQ by name and refer to itself as the "Nor-So-World Famous Y107."

Polydor USA Expands Promo Muscle

Adds Jeff Davis And Bruce McDonald As National Directors

As part of a major move to expand its American base of operations, the newly rechristened Polydor USA label appointed Jeff Davis and Bruce McDonald National Directors of Promotion.

"I was very lucky to score Bruce and Jeff," states VP Promotion/Marketing Dave Darus. "Bruce was a pioneer in Alternative radio. Both he and Jeff have extensive backgrounds in radio and records."

McDonald began his career on the on-air staff of WFNX Boston, where he rose to APD before becoming Label Manager of Link Records and, after that, was founder of his own indie label. Last year, he was named PD of WHTG Asbury Park. "I'm thrilled to be with Polydor and the great A&M crew," he notes. "At Polydor, we have major label resources with the hungry indie attitude."

Davis comes to the label from Interscope, where he spent five years as Director of Regional Promotion. Before that, he was an air talent for several Midwest radio stations and was Group PD for Communications Properties out of Dubuque, IA. "With the Director of Polydor's A&R and being able to work in the national area, the whole feeling here is very exciting," Davis says.

In the new configuration, sporting the Polydor logo with "USA" added, all Atlas talent, such as the Badlees and

Figdish, will now be moved into the Polydor roster. "The Polydor name has been associated with many great artists over the years, from Eric Clapton to James Brown," states Polydor USA President Nick Gatfield. "This is a tradition the new-look Polydor USA, with the building of a first-rate promotion team, intends to continue. We are gearing up for Polydor USA to become a major player in the industry."

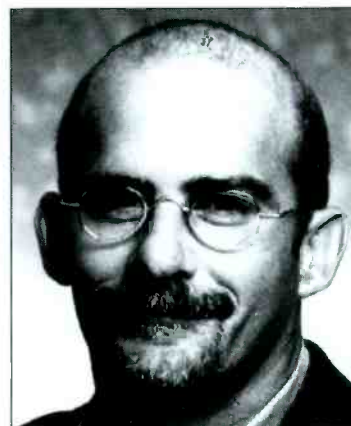
Jason Whittington To Head Geffen's Sales Dept.

I am a little pissed off today. (Wow, now *there's* a news flash!) More than a little pissed off, actually. As my good friend Sammy Alfano, would say, "Bud, I'm gettin' hot!"

There are too many people playing golf. And it's making it difficult for the rest of us who are serious about the game.

This thing is out of control. Finding a tee time in Los Angeles is about as difficult as getting a murder conviction. It happens, but not often enough. It got so bad that I had to join a country club. Now I don't have anything against country clubs as a whole, but it just doesn't seem right to me to pay thousands of dollars as an initiation fee just for the privilege of paying an additional \$300 a month that allows me to pay another \$10 to play a round of golf. That's unless I bring a guest. Then you can tack on another \$100 bill. Of course, I do share the same feelings as Groucho. I'm not sure I want to belong to a club that would have me as a member.

Over the past few years, golf has become such an "in" thing that everyone is teeing it up. Or trying to. And this is pissing me off.

I couldn't get a tee time at my own club last Wednesday. I had to fly to Phoenix to play with Scott Shannon. And after flying to Arizona, renting a car and paying the green fees, it was still cheaper than if I had tried to play in Los Angeles.

Millions are playing golf. What's wrong with these people? Don't they have jobs?

It wasn't long ago that Steve Smith (publisher of *The Network Group*) and a few of his friends started the T.J. Martell Golf Tournament. I think the first outing had only three groups. Now, hundreds line up for a tournament that has to designate two different shotgun starts to accommodate everyone.

Damn you people! What happened to tennis?

Don't get me wrong. I have nothing against people in our business who play golf seriously. There's nothing more pleasurable than an enjoyable round with your peers. Golf with a group who enjoy and know the game is wonderful. But it's you once-in-a-blue-moon hobbyists who really shank my drive.

Look, if you must play, there are certain things you must know before making a complete fool out of yourself and pissing off the rest of us.

If you're going to play the game, observe the following suggestions:

Take some lessons: If you're going to play the game, damn it, learn how. If you don't know how, don't cause the rest of us pain with your presence. I'm not saying you've got to shoot par, but if all you can do is roll the ball off the tee, don't come to the golf course. You won't have fun and you'll make the rest of us miserable. A few lessons and a few more trips to the driving range will make you and the rest of us much happier in the long run.

Keep up with the pace: Nobody can master the game of golf. It humbles all of us. If you can't play well or you're having a bad day, that's understandable. But keep your partners in mind. If you hit a few bad shots on a hole, pick up the flipping ball. Move ahead to the rest of the group and try

again. If you still screw up, take your ball and drop it on the green. Don't make everyone wait while you goof around. You'll bring your lousy attitude to the rest of the foursome.

Take your time: This may sound in conflict with the previous suggestion, but it isn't. You should play your game consistently and promptly so as not to hold up the group, but you must realize that golf takes time. A round will last between four and five hours. Don't try and rush to finish so you can return for a meeting. If you're going to play, take the afternoon off. Relax and enjoy it.

Do not bullshit when it's your time to hit: You have more than enough time during a round to talk to your partners about everything. Do this when you're in the cart or walking up the fairway.

Don't tell a story on the tee when everyone is waiting. Shut up and hit it.

Do not bore the group with a glowing rendition of your last shot: Nobody cares. We're all concentrating on our next shot. Don't expound upon the virtues of a shot that was "pin high" when it was also 50 yards left of the green.

Don't give tips to others unless you're asked: Nothing is worse than someone who doesn't know the game to be giving advice to another novice. Shut up. Or better yet, both of you go take a lesson.

Learn how to count: If you're going to play the game seriously, keep score. If not, don't count. But if you do count, be accurate. The other members of your group know how many times you swung...particularly if there's money on the line. I've often impressed newcomers by recounting every stroke of every member of a foursome after the game was over. I learned to play with thieves in the South. My father taught me to count everyone's strokes before he let me touch a club. All serious players do the same. Don't claim a score and have to be corrected. It's embarrassing to everyone. Plus, we'll think you're a cheat when you may have made an honest mistake. Count them all or don't count at all. This is not to be confused with the famous Gary Bird line, "Just gimme a six." If you're out of the hole and want to slide by without ruining your entire game, that statement is okay. You're telling everyone you screwed up, but you're not trying to screw them out of anything.

On the green, don't walk in someone else's line or putt out of turn: It just proves what we knew already, that you're a selfish son-of-a-bitch who cares about nothing except yourself. Mark your ball, stand to the side and wait your turn. And shut up. If your advice is needed, we'll ask.

Don't talk about how well you played the last time out: We don't care. Besides, we don't believe you.

Don't get angry, yell or throw a club when you hit a bad shot: We don't care. Learn how to play the frigging game and you'll be happier.

No plaid pants: This is self-explanatory.

These are just a few of the things all of us who play the game would like the rest of you to observe. And when you read this, don't think it doesn't apply to you. If you're an idiot who insists on being a fool on the golf course, playing like a buffoon and ruining the game for the rest of us, please don't be fooled by our outwardly patient smiles.

We talk about you behind your back. ▀

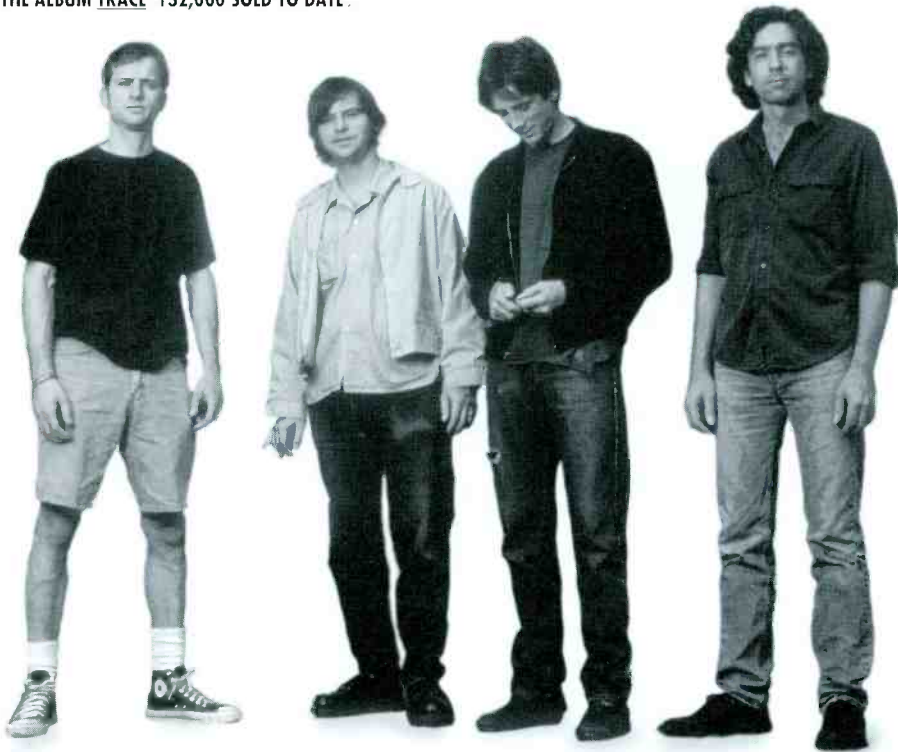

MC-1: Keeping Small-Market Top 40 Alive by Win Patton

In the fall of 1993, when so-called programming "experts" were proclaiming the death of Top 40 (especially for small-market stations), major networks were discontinuing their Top 40 services despite an affiliate base near 100...and a group of broadcasters in Fayetteville, Arkansas decided to pick up the torch to fill that void that remained.

The concept of Music Channel One (MC-1) was born while simulcasting MC-1 flagship station KMCK Fayetteville via fiber optics to the Fort Smith market on KZBB, creating "The 200,000-Watt Power Station." After successfully serving two markets, KMCK owner George Hochman realized the potential for a satellite-delivered Top 40 format. With Satellite Music Network bailing out on "The Heat" format, the time was right, so in September 1993, KMCK began offering its Top 40 programming nationwide.

The service originally began offering programming nights and weekends—times when many small-market Top 40 programmers could use a cost-effective alternative to canned sounding automation while at the time time, keeping employee costs manageable. With the demand for more programming hours from affiliates and MC-1's commitment to service, Music Channel One became the only 24-hour satellite-delivered, Top 40 network. At this point, I came on board as Operations Director to take care of daily network operations, handle morning show duties and to take over programming duties for MC-1's flagship KMCK.

To be sure, we all have to wear many hats around here. This certainly isn't a big corporation such as Cap Cities/ABC. That's a big reason why I think our service is so successful. Who better to understand the day-to-day problems of small-market Top 40 stations than a group of small-market Top 40 programmers?

Although MC-1 is a 24-hour network, the majority of affiliates utilize programming services from 7 pm to 6 am, a time when many station owners simply don't have the resources to fully staff the station. The intention of our service was never to take anybody's job, but to give as many stations as possible the opportunity to maintain a quality Top 40 product at an affordable price.

Music Channel One is now heard in 15 markets across the country, with listenership in the millions. So no matter how many times Top 40 is proclaimed dead, we'll just keep beaming those hits up to that big bird in the sky from Fayetteville, AK.

RICK MORRISON

**ELEKTRA/EEG
LOCAL PROMOTION MANAGER
DETROIT**

Rick lives up to the description of an "all-around kind-of-guy." He started in sales before moving into promotion. He's well regarded by his stations and his peers. A native from Detroit, he's been around the country and back...with around 30 different phone numbers since college to prove it. Here's what he has to say about his music, his stations and Detroit:

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

I started in the sales department for WLS. Afterwards, I sent out 500 resumes to every label in every department and received about 30 responses. I ended up working on the distribution side for three years. After getting off the tracks for a short while with a movie company, I moved to Detroit for Imago. I headed over to WEA—thus the Elektra connection was made. But honestly, the most pertinent reason I'm in promotion is Artie Fufkin from *Spinal Tap*...he's my hero.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

I work Top 40, Alternative, Rock, A/C and AAA. My territory is all of Michigan, Western Ohio and Northern Kentucky. It's sometimes hard to drive around here with the weather, so I fly to some of my stations. Luckily, Greg Thompson understands because he's from Detroit.

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

I really try to be full-service when I work a record. I want to get a radio station involved in a record with a promotion or a concert in town that's all-encompassing, so it involves more than just airplay. I'm really into the marketing side of things. I like to show my stations that Elektra can offer so many records. I have the best of both worlds; if I'm working three or four records at one time, I have a lot of variety to share with my stations.

Have you ever done any wild promotions for airplay?

I dressed up as cupid for D:Ream's "Shoot Me With Your Love." I ran around the station studio for a morning show, shooting arrows with suction cups. I was quite a sight, wearing tights in the middle of winter, freezing my butt off.

What's the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record?

I hear a lot of PDs use their GM as the cop-out, "My GM doesn't like it." The blame is always somewhere else. Sometimes when a station drops a record, but the song is still doing well in the area, it only hurts their listeners.

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

I understand that it's not personal. There's so much music out there, you just can't let it bother you. Coming from a sales background, I realize that perseverance is the key. It may take asking a PD seven times for an add, but that seventh time may be when it happens. It's not a perfect world and if you take a step back, it's easier to put things in perspective.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or ones you think are hits?

I position myself the same way I try to position a PD. It's not really up to either one of us to decide what is a hit and what isn't. It's up to the listeners. I'm a big fan of tests—"pump it or dump it" is my motto. Listeners expect new music and that shouldn't be considered a thorn in their programming. I had many stations tell me they would never play the latest Tracy Chapman; now it's screaming with phones.

What do you like best about your job?

This is the best job on the planet. There's nothing I'd rather be doing right now. As Greg Thompson would put it, I'm the mayor of the market. I have the full support of an amazing National staff and I have the freedom to make my own decisions. There are times when Greg will come to me and say, "Rick, what do you think?" This job is always rewarding and it's never the same thing twice.



DAVE REYNOLDS

**UNIVERSAL RECORDS
LOCAL PROMOTION MANAGER
WASHINGTON, D.C./PHILADELPHIA**

Although Dave is a rookie, this class clown has his act together...his region, his music, his strategy and, most of all, his plans to rule the music world. He has radio experience and the drive to be the best record promotion person for the newest record company to hit this country. And for those of you who already know Dave, don't hold this against us...Cagle insisted.

Why did you first decide to get into record promotion?

I have a very simple story for an un-simple guy. I was a Canadian, hanging out in a bar in Detroit, when I met my wife. I then worked in radio for four years, including WQMZ Charlottesville. Now I'm working for Universal. Honestly, when I was in radio, Bill Cason from Mercury Records and Monte Lipman, who at the time worked for Atlantic Records, put this crazy idea in my head and gave me the inspiration to be good at this job. Universal got on its feet, Daniel Glass called and the rest is history.

Describe your region in terms of the stations you work.

I work all of Pennsylvania and North Carolina in every format except Country and Urban. I love my region, I'm getting to know everyone...and, unfortunately for them, they are getting to know me.

Do you have a specific strategy to work records?

Actually, the smartest person I've met so far is Don Landon at Z104 Norfolk. He figured out that if he plays all of my records, I don't have to visit him. He's the one who caught on the quickest. People don't really want me working them on records. Perry Stone from 96X Norfolk made that mistake already. I stole my daughter's Pocahontas tent and camped out in his lobby. I'm crazy, but he added my song! I have more wacky stunts in store but I can't divulge my ideas. I don't want other Penguins to steal my brilliant brainstormers.

What's the best excuse for a drop or not adding a record you've ever heard?

Where do I start? I've already heard every stupid one in the book. For instance, "It's not on 'The Back Page' yet." Then I reply, "I didn't think anyone read that rag anymore."

How do you deal with rejection...in terms of not getting your records added?

Even though I haven't been doing this very long, at first it totally killed me. Honestly, reading the Penguin Page really helps. Finding out how other promotion people deal with it really puts things in perspective. Everyone basically seems to deal with it in the same way. I may sit around and sulk for a while, but rejection just gives me incentive to go out and work the next week. I'm completely different than I was just three months ago.

How easy is it to promote records you don't especially like or ones you think are hits?

That is so hard to answer. I give every record everything I have. I know at the end of every day, I tried my best with every song. Actually, I just tell everyone, "Don't worry about it, we'll have the Bush re-mix by the end of the week." Then they look at me like I'm totally screwy.

How do you deal with direct-format competition as far as exclusive releases?

I've already run into this. I keep in mind who was on the particular record first. I think sometimes that's only fair. If a situation gets messy, I'm already smart enough to go right to my Nationals. I figure that's what they are there for.

What do you like best about your job?

The expense account. Actually, meeting the people has been incredible. I love being in the industry because of the people in radio and records, not to mention the lovely ladies at *Network 40*. And last but not least, I have to mention Monte Lipman, Steve Leeds and Daniel Glass...which just happens to be the name of my future son.

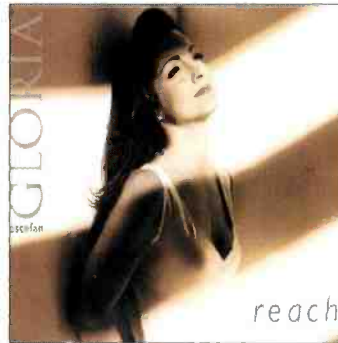

GLORIA ESTEFAN

• For the all-important adult listeners, you could do no better than to spin Gloria Estefan's hit, "Reach" (Epic). Top 40 and A/C radio will embrace this release as it zooms up the chart. This well-known artist always rests well with her trademark delivery—especially on this total smash. Already on WXKS, Star 94, KDWB and so many more, this soft ballad is also the theme of the '96 Olympics....A superb night track that is calling out very well in its early stages is Coolio's reactionary groover, "1, 2, 3, 4 (Sumpin' New)" (Tommy Boy). Already approaching 1,000 Plays Per Week on *Network 40's* Street Chart, this recent Grammy Award winner has hit another home run here. WKBQ MD Tommy Mattern says, "This song is just exploding in St. Louis. Phones are hot and sales are starting to pick up, too." Spinning on all dayparts at WXYK, PD Patty Steele claims, "It's really huge here." The timing of the release on "1, 2, 3, 4 (Sumpin' New)" has fueled album sales again as *Gangsta's Paradise* moves back into *Network 40's* Sales Chart top 20.

WAKX PD Jay Towers tells us, "This song is phenomenal for Grand Rapids; coupled with the heavy video rotation, I think it'll be calling out well for a long time."

• A hit song that is really beginning to prove itself is Bass Is Base's debut track, "I Cry" (Island). Just coming to the party last week were KKLQ and WXXS, yet this smooth number has been rotating on WSSX, WJJS, Fly 92. WFHN and many more for weeks. It's definitely a plus for your female audience; this tune will have a lot of success with the younger demos, too. WMGI PD Beau Richards says, "We're spinning 'I Cry' over 80 times a week—it's really big."

• Don't miss out on Billy Mann's polished release, "Turn Down The World" (DV8/A&M). The phones are hot for the track at WSSX, WLAN, WDJB and WRFY. A brilliant artist with a ton of potential, focus in on daytime airplay for his first release.

• Watch for the official release dates of the following tracks because there is

no doubt they will be the early summer smashes: Tina Turner is back, as her dynamic vocals rejuvenate the John Waite hit, "Missing You" (Virgin). It will cross your desks in about a month....Coming much sooner than that is the next cool track from Garbage. "Only Happy When It Rains" (Almo Sounds/Geffen) is already warming up to take off. MTV Buzz Bin/Stress rotation is a solid way to set up its official release date. Expect big results from this grass-roots band's next song.

• the cranberries have reeled off a giant hit with their forthcoming release, "Salvation" (Island). Very uptempo and carchy, this song will work at Top 40, Alternative and Album radio. For a sneak preview of the release, you can surf the Net.

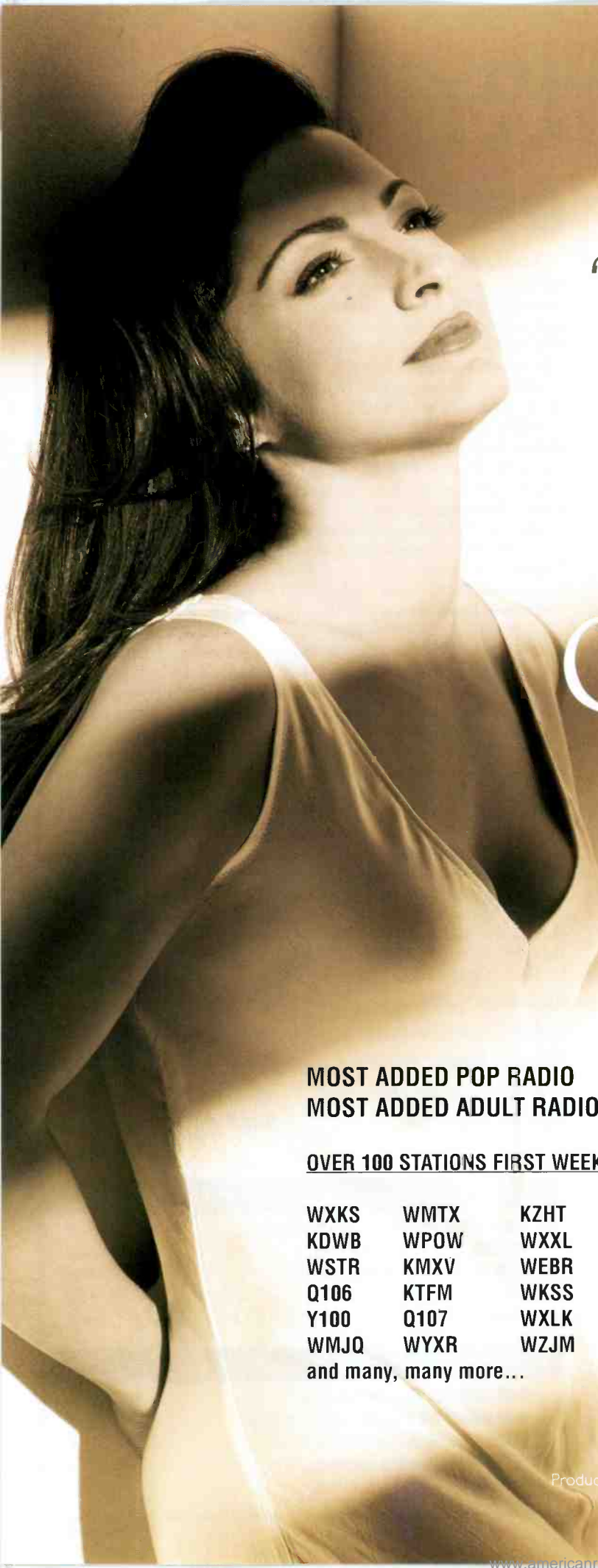
• Hootie & The Blowfish follows their phenomenal debut LP performance with a great, multi-format smash called "Old Man & Me" (Atlantic/AG).

• Tina Arena has exploded at Mainstream radio, increasing by 1,700 spins weekly to total over 2,000 rotations. "Chains" (Epic) is a tremendous hit that we'll be hearing a lot of for several months to come.

The Root Doctors have recorded a very slick, powerful, radio-friendly album. Special Top 40 tracks include "She" and "Home" (Prescription Records). • WNVZ MD Sean Sellers reports, "great call-out on Lina Santiago's first hit, 'Feels So Good (Show Me Your Love)' (Universal Records)." It's quickly dancing its way up the charts as major-market airplay continues to increase.

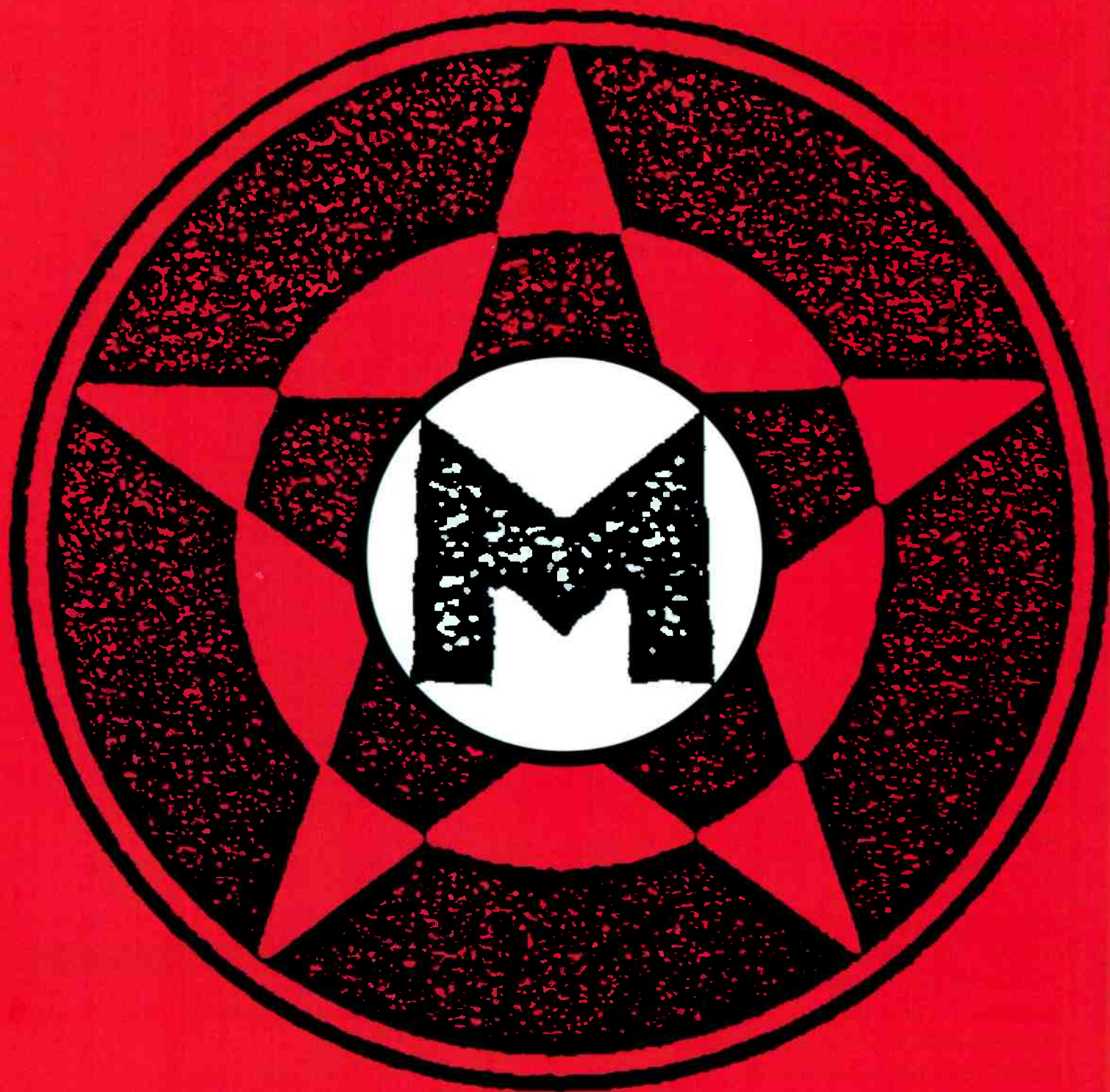

• The Nixons are military kids who met when they all ended up in Oklahoma City, OK.

• Davis met Brooks at the mall and Maloy at school. John was enlisted into the band later on.

• Frontman Zac Maloy's grandfather was a Country musician who played guitar with Buddy White and the Western Aires at the Grand Ole Opry.

• They've been together for five years and have played more than 300 gigs in the last year-and-a-half, including pizza parlors, skating rinks, weddings and birthday parties.

• When they aren't performing, they like to go to the movies, fish and watch old KISS videos.

• In 1992, they independently recorded and released "Six," which was followed by an album, *Halo*.



• The Nixons cite Neil Young, The Who, Judas Priest and Led Zeppelin as their musical influences and have been known to light guitars on fire to get an audience's attention.

• Their latest album, *Foma*, was produced by Mark Dodson (Judas Priest, Ugly Kid Joe) and contains "Sister."

VOICE OF THE BEEHIVE (DISCOVERY)

• Sisters Melissa and Tracey Belland grew up in Southern California as part of a musical family.

• Their father, Bruce, was lead singer/songwriter for the '50s group The Four Preps, who had the #1 hit, "26 Miles."

• As children, Melissa and Tracey acted in TV ads, although music was their first love and main ambition.

• In the mid-'80s, Tracey went to London on vacation, decided to stay, then persuaded Melissa to join her.

• They recorded a demo tape that was heard by Food Records' Dave Balfe and Andy Ross, who released their debut single, "Just A City," in 1987.

• The band's first incarnation was Melissa, Tracey and ex-Madness members Daniel Woodgate and Mark Bedford.

• They released their first album, *Let It Bee*, as well as the '91 follow-up, *Honey Lingers*, in London.



• They went on tour under the name Orgy Under The Underworld, which featured a live sex show, Russ Myer videos and colored condoms.

• It was about this time that Melissa and Tracey lost their boyfriends, their band, their record company (London) and several close friends passed away.

• The sisters' grief is expressed in Voice Of The Beehive's latest album, *Sex & Misery*, which was produced by Pete Veresse (Seal, Annie Lennox, Sophie B. Hawkins). The first release from the album is "Scary Kisses."

KOOL & THE GANG (CURB)

• Robert (Kool) Bell, his brother Ronald (Kahlis Bayyan), George Brown, Dennis (DecTee) Thomas and Robert (Spike) Mickens (Claydes (Charles) Smith later joined) were high school students growing up in Jersey City when Kool & The Gang first got together.

• While playing at a local Newark club, they were billed as Kool and the Flames. They changed it to "The Gang" to avoid confusion with James Brown's "Famous Flames."

• They debuted in 1969 on DeLite Records and went on to produce numerous #1 hits, such as "Jungle Boogie," "Ladies Night," "Too Hot" and "Celebration."

• Lead singer J.T. Taylor, who joined the group in 1978, made his acting debut in *The Mambo Kings* with Antonio Banderas and the Broadway musical, *Raisin*.

• They've been continuously performing for the past 30 years—longer than any Black group in history.

• They were the only American performers to be involved in Band Aid's 1984 recording of "Do They Know



It's Christmas?" with proceeds dedicated to provide relief funds for the famine in Africa.

• They are dedicated to public service, participating in programs such as the Big Brother/Big Sister Organization, Tomorrow's Children, Live-Aid and The Red Cross.

• Kool & The Gang's latest efforts have produced *State Of Affairs* and the new single, "Salute To The Ladies."

FOO FIGHTERS (ROSWELL/CAPITOL)

• *Dave Grohl, vocals/guitar.* • *William Goldsmith, drums.* • *Nate Mendel, bass.* • *Pat Smear, guitar.*

• Foo Fighter lead singer/ex-Nirvana drummer Dave Grohl grew up in a musical family; his mother sang in groups as a teen and his father was an accomplished flautist.

• He played with several bands before dropping out of his Washington, D.C. high school halfway through his senior year to play with hardcore legends Scream.



• William Goldsmith got his first drum kit in the eighth grade and started his first band, The Screaming Hormones, in high school.

• With Nate Mendel, he formed Chewbacca Kaboom, which became Sunny Day Real Estate.

• Nate Mendel bought his first bass because he wanted to be in a band and thought bass was the easiest instrument to play.

• His first band was called Diddly Squat, he also played with Christ On A Crutch and Brotherhood before forming Sunny Day Real Estate in 1992.

• Pat Smear is the former guitarist for the seminal '70s L.A. Punk band the Germs. He joined Nirvana on several tour dates of the *In Utero* tour, and he appeared on the *Unplugged* concert.

• When Nirvana guitarist/singer Kurt Cobain died, Grohl picked up the pieces by recording the *Foo Fighters* album. He played almost all of the instruments himself.

• He quickly formed a band, switching from drums to guitar and brought in Smear, Goldsmith and Mendel.

• Foo Fighters' latest release is "Big Me."
