## David Geffen Takes Over WCI Movie Division

Ted Ashley has returned to the chairmanship of Warner Brothers and executive changes and reshuffling has resulted in all areas of Warner Communications.

The major change affecting the record industry is that David Geffen, board chairman of Elektra/Asylum Records is the new vice chairman of the picture making division of WCI.

Geffen's replacement as chairman of E/A has not officially been announced at press time, but R&R learned that it will be another WCI executive, currently president of one of the other WCI record labels.

## FCC Tough On College Radio

Colleges and universities that allow the control of their radio stations to be in the hands of students may have to pay a large price. That price may be either a fine or loss of license if the station broadcasts obscene words.

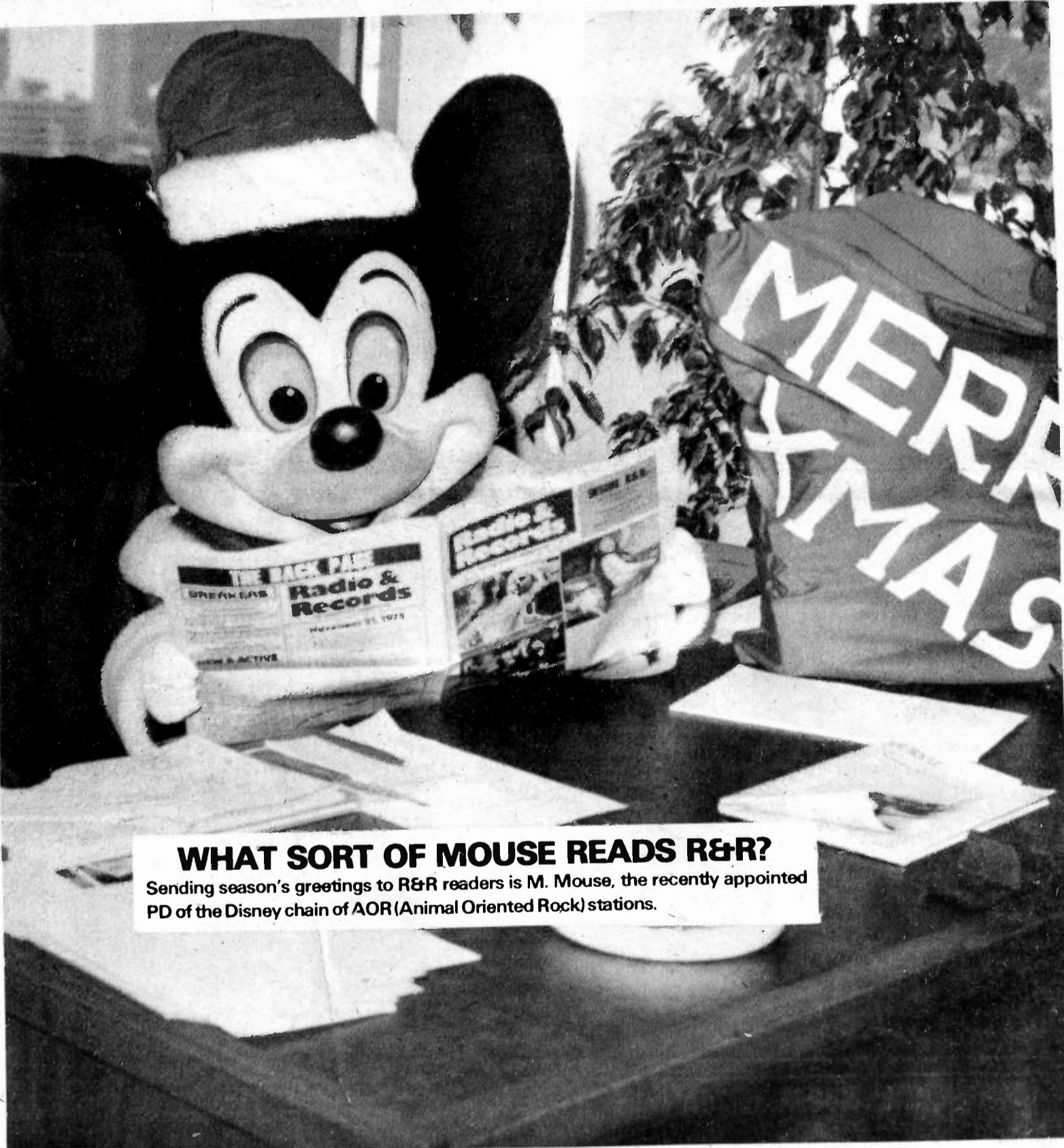
In a decision that was just handed down, the FCC levied a \$2000 fine on the University of Pennsylvania because of obscene language over its WXPN-FM. The Commission now plans to conduct a full hearing on the school's abdication of control of the station to students. The shows in question were billed as "free form music, call in and chatter" type, geared for the rock generation. The language spoken is commonly spoken on today's campus, but offensive to the FCC's morals.

The Commission stated that despite corrective action after the broadcast the university was still liable for violating the U.S. code.

## Dylan's Rolling Thunder Review

Bob Dylan organized a night of history making proportion last Monday, all to benefit "Hurricane" Carter, the man he wrote his current single about.

Dylan and his "Rolling Thunder Review" sold out New York's Madison Square Garden to 20,000 fans. On the show were Joni Mitchell, Ronoe Blakley, Joan Baez, Muhammad Ali, Roberta Flack, Rambling Jack Elliott and Roger McGuinn. Dylan came out and did an acoustic set and then was joined by a super group of side men. Hurricane Carter called and talked to the assemblage via telephone from his prison cell.

If you haven't already made your plans to attend, please do not procrastinate because the rooms are going fast. One of the subjects penciled in for discussion is the growing amount of what I call "closet rockers." By definition, these are stations that are not quite full-blown rockers and at the same time could hardly be considered (pardon the expression) musically "Middle Of The Road." Whatever your view, the emergence and successful application of these stations in many big markets is a topical subject. We also plan a complete musical review (going back to the Thirties) of Pop music. All in less than ten minutes. And many more topics, presentations and the like. The major change affecting the record industry is that David Geffen, board chairman of Elektra/Asylum Records is the new vice chairman of the picture making division of WCI.

Geffen's replacement as chairman of E/A has not officially been announced at press time, but R&R learned that it will be another WCI executive, currently president of one of the other WCI record labels.

## FCC Tough On College Radio

Colleges and universities that allow the control of their radio stations to be in the hands of students may have to pay a large price. That price may be either a fine or loss of license if the station broadcasts obscene words.

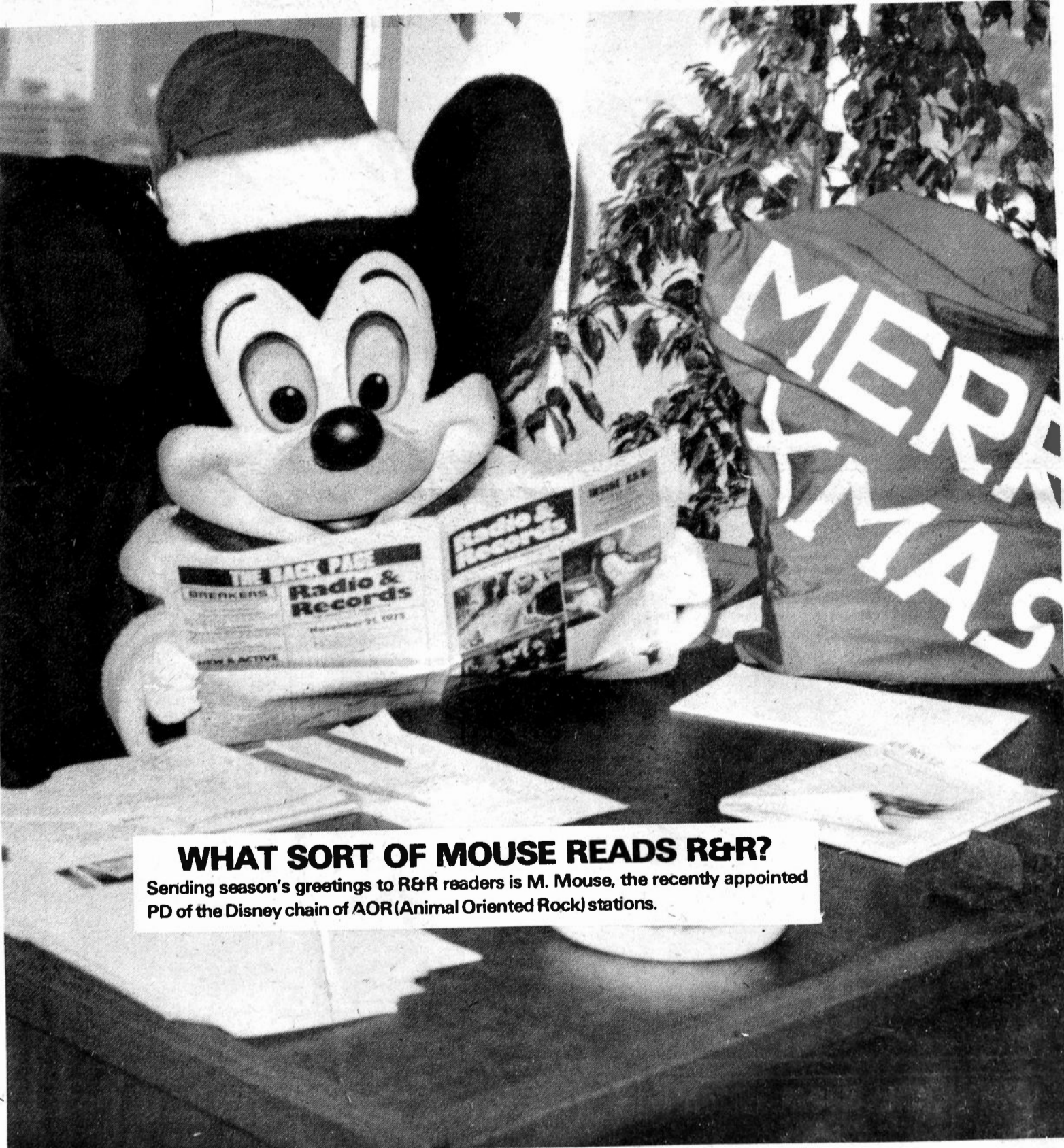
In a decision that was just handed down, the FCC levied a \$2000 fine on the University of Pennsylvania because of obscene language over its WXPN-FM. The Commission now plans to conduct a full hearing on the school's abdication of control of the station to students. The shows in question were billed as "free form music, call in and chatter" type, geared for the rock generation. The language spoken is commonly spoken on today's campus, but offensive to the FCC's morals.

The Commission stated that despite corrective action after the broadcast the university was still liable for violating the U.S. code.

## Dylan's Rolling Thunder Review

Bob Dylan organized a night of history making proportion last Monday, all to benefit "Hurricane" Carter, the man he wrote his current single about.

Dylan and his "Rolling Thunder Review" sold out New York's Madison Square Garden to 20,000 fans. On the show were Joni Mitchell, Ronoe Blakley, Joan Baez, Muhammad Ali, Roberta Flack, Rambling Jack Elliott and Roger McGuinn. Dylan came out and did an acoustic set and then was joined by a super group of side men. Hurricane Carter called and talked to the assemblage via telephone from his prison cell.

Sending season's greetings to R&R readers is M. Mouse, the recently appointed PD of the Disney chain of AOR (Animal Oriented Rock) stations.

The show ended when Dylan began singing "This Land Is Your Land" and was joined by the entire cast on stage.

share is double the nearest competitor, who scored with a 5 share. WABC also doubled the nearest station on weekly cumes.

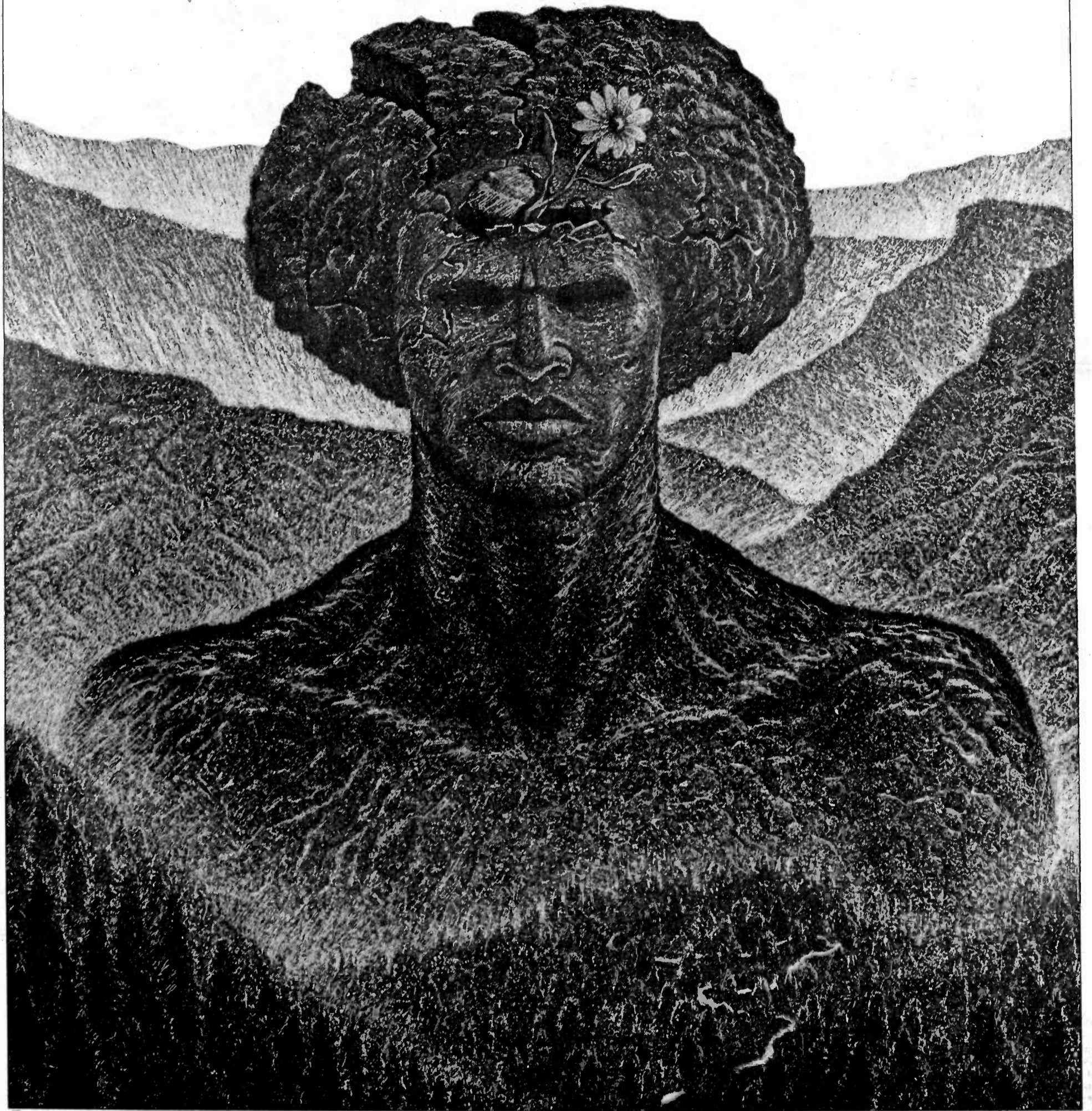

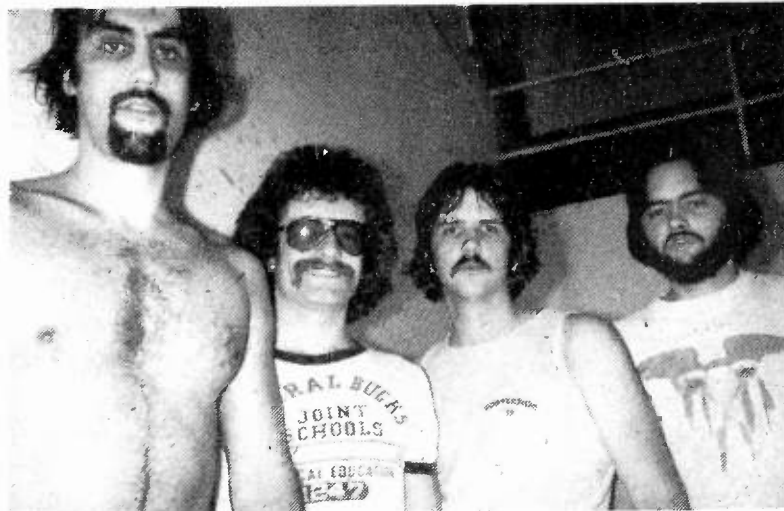

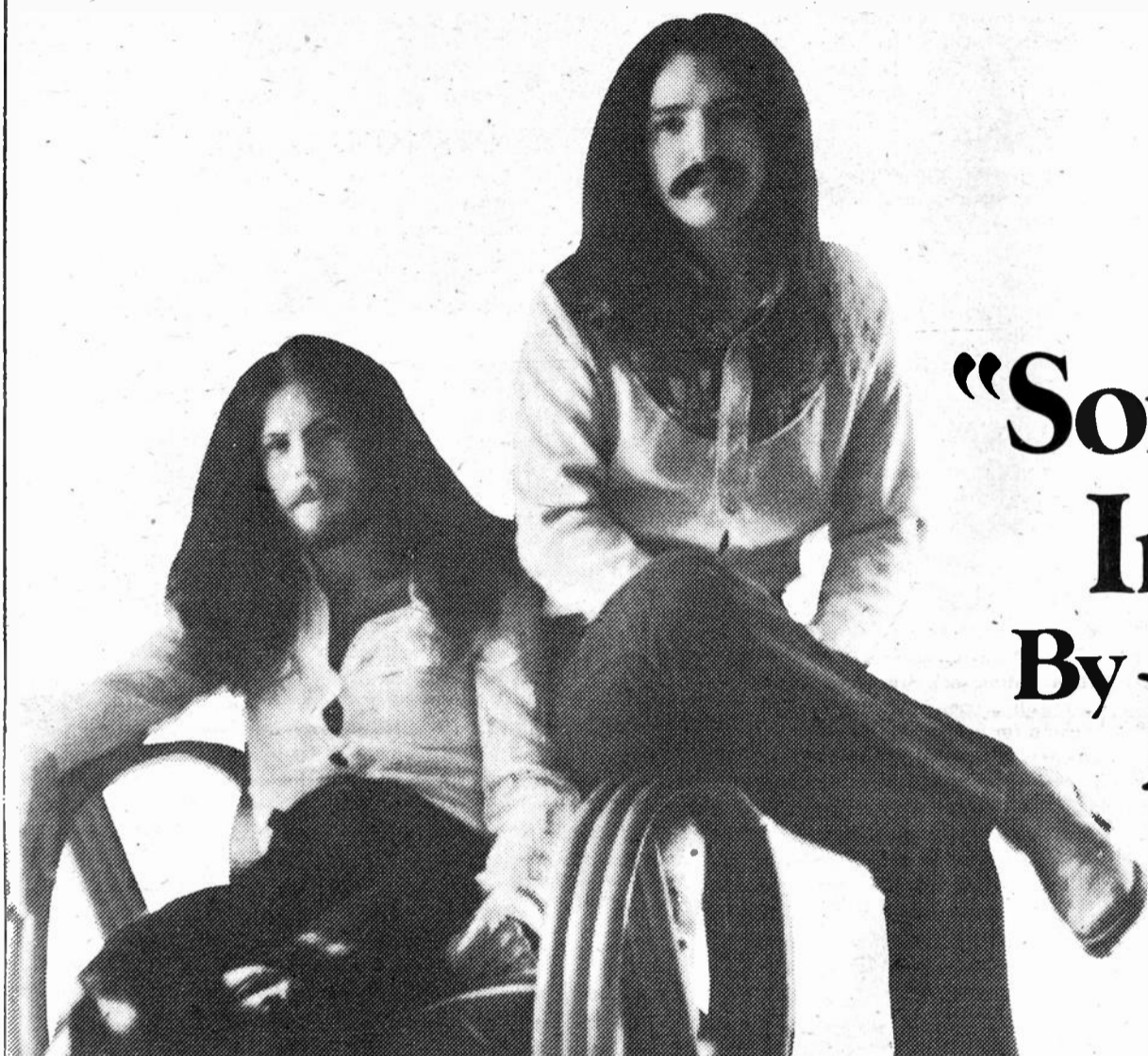

### B OF A BANKING ON ADVERTISING

America's largest banking institution, BANK OF AMERICA, has announced the largest single expenditure for advertising for 1976. \$16.7 million is planned for advertising next year, up from \$15.9 million. Bank spokesmen commented that next year might prove to be a tough one for profits, making the advertising push necessary. The CALIFORNIA Market will be one of the focal points for the ad push, featuring spot on services that the Bank offers. All media will be involved in nationwide spots.

### APPEAL TO FCC TO ELIMINATE HYPOING

In an effort to destroy the practices which breed hypoing, BROAD STREET COMMUNICATIONS CORP., based in NEW HAVEN, has appealed to the FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION to give their OK to year round audience measurements.

### BOSTON "RADIO ACTIVE" IN 1974

Included in the FCC's annual summary of radio markets was a giant leap in revenues for BOSTON radio. A 5.9% overall jump was noted, with total revenues up to over \$21 million. These figures move Boston up into the 7th place rank, deposing DETROIT who had held that position. The 43 signal Boston market came in second to SAN FRANCISCO-OAKLAND in percentage of revenue increase.

### HERE COMES THE RETAIL SPENDING

ZIFF-DAVIS PUBLISHING CO., publisher of MODERN BRIDE, has released results of a survey of new brides and grooms, showing that a very high rate of retail spending is evident for first marriages. Most of the spending does not rely on brand name loyalties, and is compressed into a very short period of time before and after the marriages.

### GE JOINS FORCES FOR AMERICA'S BIRTHDAY

TV, major appliances, housewares and audio electronics divisions of GENERAL ELECTRIC CO. will combine forces for an advertising campaign for the first quarter of 1976. The theme for the push is "Happy Birthday America," with nearly \$3 million planned to be spent for network TV and radio ads.

### RCA PUSHES XMAS CATALOG

RCA RECORDS' 16 page Christmas catalog has been shipped to retailers nationwide, complete with display materials. Half a million catalogs have already been placed in retail locations. RCA is also starting their multi-faceted promotion of "SOUL TRAIN '75," featuring the Soul Train Gang. TV spots will run on the syndicated Soul Train show, with print ads and window displays on the retail level.

### TV'S FAMILY HOUR RATINGS UP AND DOWN ACROSS COUNTRY

According to A.C. NIELSEN studies, five markets dropped one to two rating points during the new family hour periods. LOS ANGELES, NEW YORK, DALLAS, ST. LOUIS, and SEATTLE displayed downward trends compared to last year's October measurements, while 12 other markets showed opposite trends with gains in the same time period.

### STUDY SHOWS VIOLENCE DISTURBING TO PUBLIC

In a survey done for TV GUIDE, the OPINION RESEARCH CORP. announced that their study showed that more Americans are worried about the effects of violence on TV, rather than sex on the tube. The telephone survey sampled over 1000 consumers, and also showed that a great majority favored the new "family hour" regulations. 8 out of 10 people liked the new policy, women generally liking the family hour by almost 10% more than men. A great majority also labeled TV programming as much too violent, and 44% showed more concern over violence than sex.

### RETURN OF RIN TIN TIN

WFM MEDIA SERVICE CORP., who brought back the original MICKEY MOUSE CLUB into national syndication with much success, is planning the return of RIN TIN TIN to television. Original black and white prints of the shows will be supplemented by new color footage.

### MOBIL OIL SPONSORS RADIO PROGRAM

Starting with an airing of WOR/NEW YORK on December 31, MOBIL OIL CORP. will present a special 4 hour radio show feature titled "1975-Farewell to an Eventful Year." The program was produced by TIME MAGAZINE, featuring the editors of Time discussing national and international events, covering the spectrum from sports, records, and law to business, TV and movies. Other stations are already planning to air the show in January.

### HIGH INCREASE IN FCC COMPLAINTS

October saw nearly twice the amount of complaints received by the FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION as in September. A total of 10,588 official complaints from the public were received in October. Comments and inquiries also increased by over five hundred, with a total of 1856.

### KFMB STRIKE ON

KFMB-AM-FM-TV/SAN DIEGO is still in the midst of an IBEW walkout, with no ground yielded by either management or union reps as of presstime. Operations are still going as usual, but 4 AFTRA members have refused to cross IBEW's picket lines.

### CANADA POSTAL STRIKE OVER

Although union leaders are not completely happy with the settlement, CANADA's postal employees went back to work last week, ending the 43 day strike. The wage increases that were agreed upon were about the same as the Postmaster General had offered before the strike began.

### FTC AGAINST FALSE CLAIMS

The FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION has reminded one company that false and misleading claims about products can prompt legal action. The firm advertised that their thermal windows were the world's warmest, cut fuel costs by 32%, and were burglar proof. The FTC disputed all the claims in the case.

### POSTAL FEE CHANGES IN EARLY JAN.

Along with postal service rate changes due the end of this month, January 3rd is the date for fee changes for special mailing. Special Delivery mail up to 2 pounds will increase 100%, from 60¢ to \$1.20. Registered mail jumps from 95¢ to \$1.90, certified mail increases from 30¢ to 50¢. Cost of postal money orders will increase over 80%.

### POST OFFICE OPEN ON HOLIDAY FRIDAYS

Even though there is a possibility of PRESIDENT FORD granting holidays to federal workers on December 26th and January 2nd, the Postal Service has announced that they will maintain regular service on those dates. The increase in postal rates effective December 28th are partially responsible for the postal decision, since a flood of mail beating the deadline is expected. The move also saved \$48 million in holiday for postal workers.

### COKE INTO HUMOR

The COCA COLA CO. will keep their old line "Look up, America" theme for new TV spots, while inserting a bit of humor into the new look. Film clips from old movies, including some well-known one-liners and pie-in-the-face scenes will be interspersed with young people of today doing imitations of the scenes. Coke is very excited about the new wave of spots, citing the new look as a way to let the public know that Coke and good times go together.

### MEDIA CONGRESS COVERAGE

Radio and television coverage of HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES floor proceedings are being discussed by a House subcommittee, with some House members lobbying for certain rules and regs on the possible coverage. Representative JACK BROOKS told the committee that a testing period should be designed, to last 6 to 8 weeks, in order to accommodate the equipment media would use, and to acclimate the House members to being on live camera. Brooks also urged the House to set up rules making the Congress responsible for setting fees for independent TV and radio use of the film or tapes.

### RCA LAUNCHES SATELLITE

The RCA CORPORATION's first domestic satellite will be launched today (12), after FCC approval of a temporary orbit to serve all 50 states. The Commission is also considering a similar application from AMERICAN TELEPHONE for the same orbit.

### DIM JOB HOPES FOR COLLEGE GRADS

A COLLEGE PLACEMENT COUNCIL survey shows that hiring of college graduates may drop another 5% for the 1975-76 year, after a 18% decline the year before. Engineering and business graduates see a slightly brighter future, with some job demand in those fields acknowledged. Lower employee turnover is cited as one of the main reasons for the dismal job outlook.

### NO NEW JOBS FORESEEN

Most employment experts in government and private industry expect to see no new jobs come into this country's market, even though the national economy seems to be coming around. Some workers are working overtime to create the extra output that is now necessary. Layoffs are ending in most areas, while the only new jobs opening up are in the West Coast.

### EMPLOYEES CAN REFUSE HAZARDOUS JOBS

The NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD disputed one U.S. company's firing of employees for refusing to work on hazardous jobs, citing the TAFT-HARTLEY ACT as the basis for the decision. Any worker may refuse a position on the grounds that the job would cause concern over their personal safety.

### STOCK PROFIT DEADLINE

Stock investors should mark DECEMBER 23rd as the cutoff date for taking a stock profit to be counted in 1975's income for tax purposes. Stock losses can be counted up until December 31.

### COFFEE PRICES STAY UP

Commodity experts in London announced that coffee drinkers can expect to keep paying high prices for their habit, while most other commodity prices will also make moderate gains.

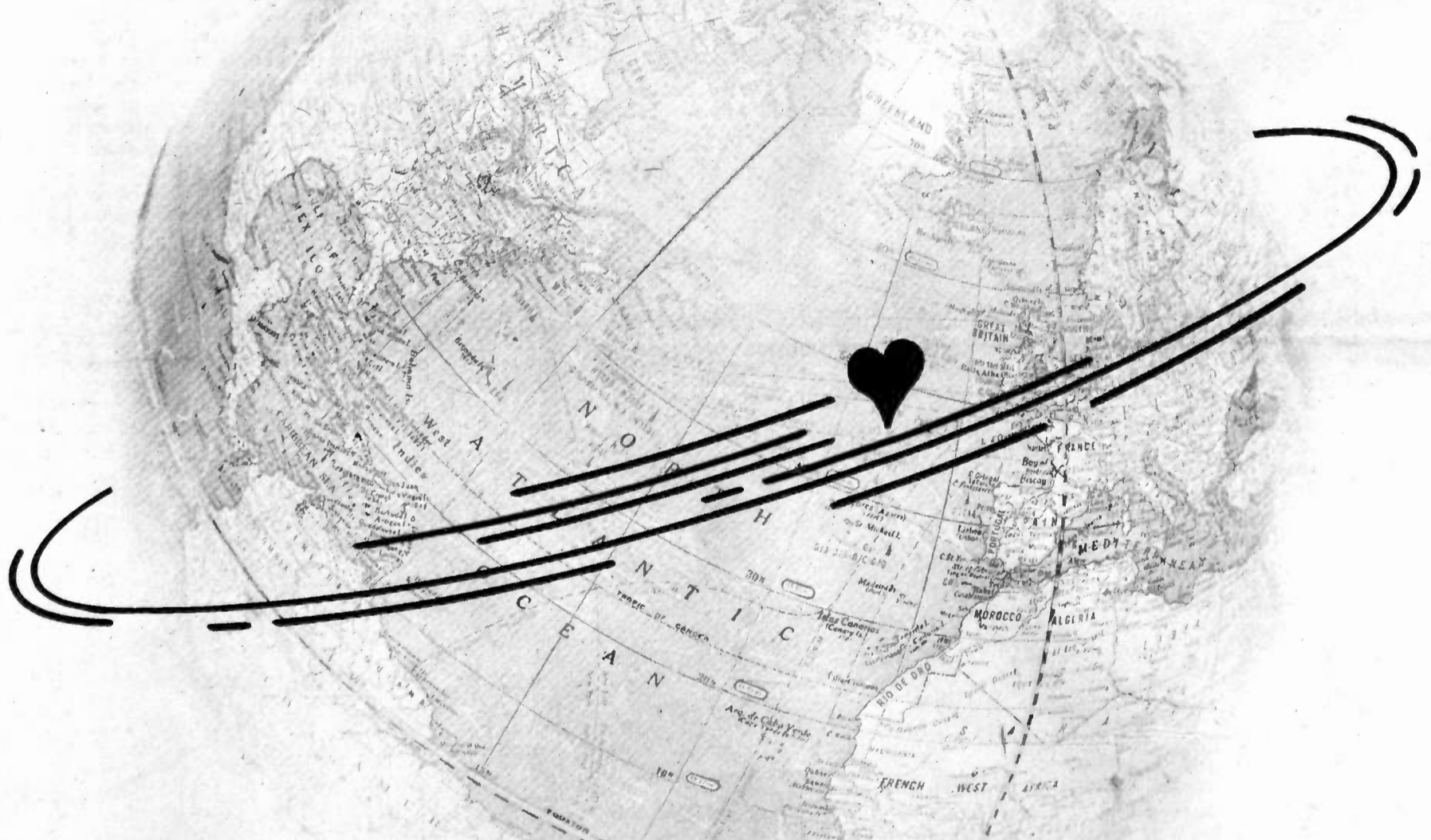

We've all heard the expression, "Radio is the theatre of the mind" many times. However, because of the fast and sometimes shallow pace of contemporary society coupled with the easy availability of radio in places and situations that people do "other things," we should not put as much faith in the saying as we would like to. When you compare the habits of the public when it listens to radio to the way it responds to, say, television or the cinema, perhaps, we should change the expression to, "Radio could be the theatre of the mind."

When people sit down to watch a television program or motion picture, they usually start at the beginning and finish at the end, shutting out the rest of the world during the duration. These media forms that require primary audience attention work on pre-set schedules that the public makes it its business to adhere to. Radio, on the other hand, is on just about everywhere but necessarily listened to. People do other things while it's on and do not shut the rest of the world out. The public, for the most part, gives this form of media secondary attention and is not very willing to adhere to radio's feeble attempts to perpetrate a schedule. Thus, you have your heavy ratings emphasis in the old quarter hour average.

This situation gave birth to the concept of the single (a little, self contained bit of primary fantasy) thrown into a highly repetitious continuum

(secondary media radio). Or, maybe, the situation came as result of this kind of programming. That can be argued forever.

We've all heard stories about how people, in the old days before television, would gather in the living room glued to the radio. Today, with the hypnotic crutch of video permeating their consciousness, people seem to have lost the ability to listen. Unless there is something else going on they get ants in their pants.

I've attended many industry conventions and seminars in the past few years. One of the things I've noticed (and you probably have, too) is that whenever there is a taped presentation, within a minute or two, everybody is talking and getting nudgy. This occurs even in high quality presentations. However, if a slide show or movie is added to the program, everyone gets attentive. These are people in the audio industry! It's worse with the public.

This is what radio is up against. The question is, are people like this because radio has become less interesting and absorbing (then, say, television or old time radio) or is radio geared to be a secondary media because the public intelligently wants it to be.

Whatever the answer may be, one thing is for sure. Habits are slow to develop and even slower to break. AOR Radio, more than any other contemporary music format, has been sprinkling it's secondary media continuum with primary program specials.

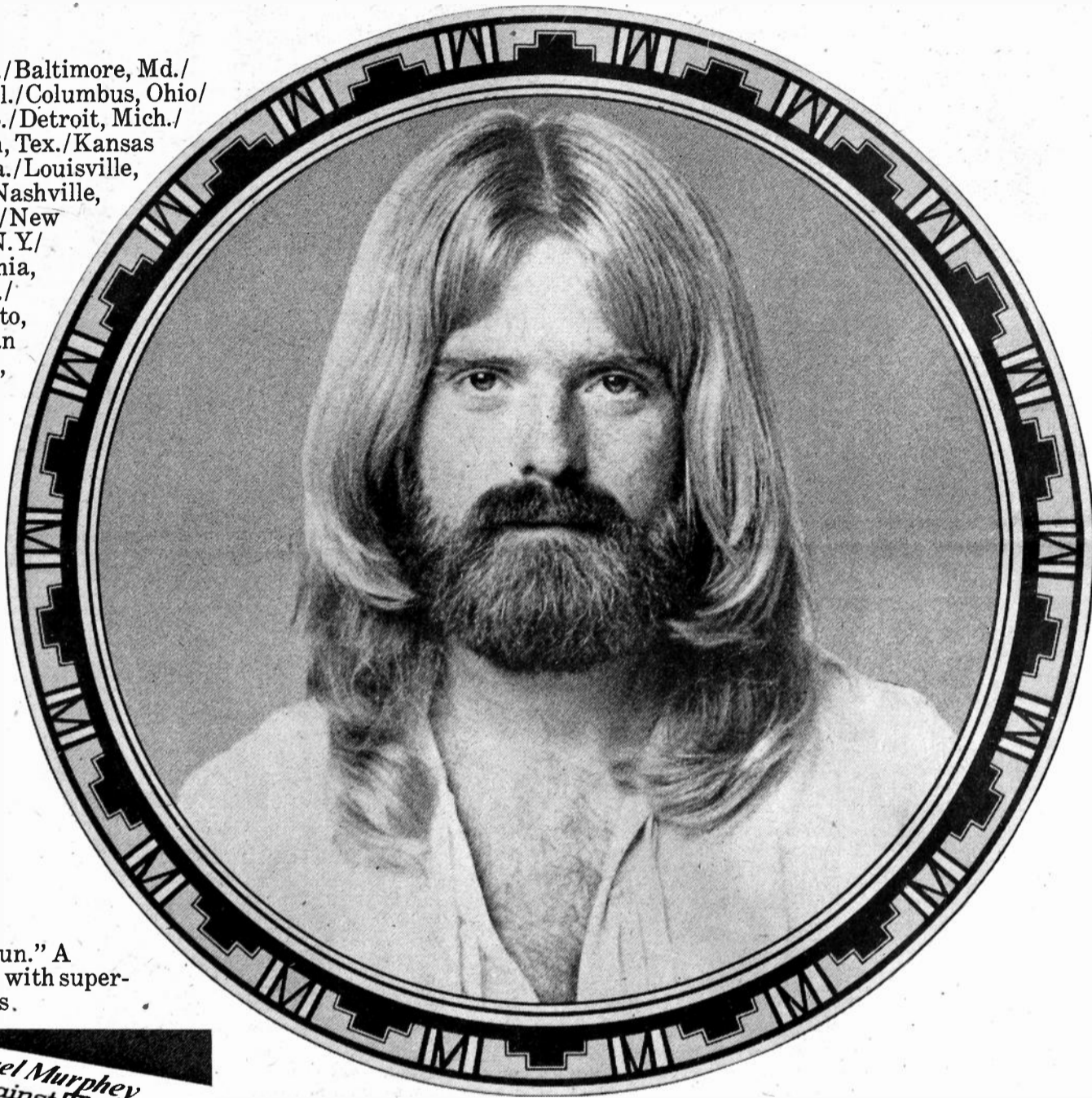

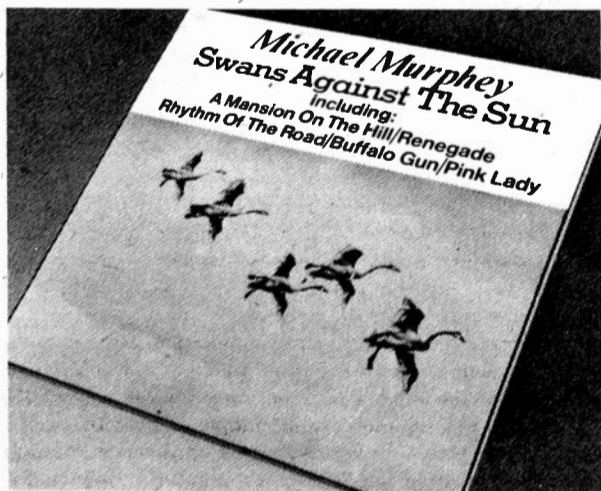

This is dangerous, but good. Dangerous, if not handled properly. Good, if it rubs often people's listening habits and attitude toward radio in general.

If you run radio concerts, album hours, interview shows, or syndication don't promote them with anything less than the upmost enthusiasm.

You'll notice that as TV Guide and the television sections of your local major newspapers get stronger and larger, the radio sections become thinner and more obsolete.

Develop a rapport (if you haven't already) with your local daily and educate them to the fact that Classical FM and Sports radio are not the only formats that offer programs worthy of a listener "tune in at..." and keep your jock line-up up to date. Don't think of it as a throw away. That's just a start. The point is that journals play an important role in influencing people's attitude toward other media.

If AOR Radio slowly but surely is able to bring attention getting dimension back to radio and succeed, not only will radio become more potent for all of us involved in and dependent on it, but the public may learn to be able to concentrate on using its imagination.

These are, indeed, worthy goals. In the meantime, music radio has the not so bad distinction of merely being the soundtrack of contemporary life.

After initial resistance at the Pop level, the Staple Singers' "Let's Do It Again" is now starting to happen in some areas. Pittsburgh powerhouse WTAE reports it as one of their hottest.

C.W. McCALL's "Convoy" continues to be one of the top year-end action leaders. As a special service to all the nation's "in-tune" jocks, R&R Country editor Jim Duncan has provided a quick reference guide to C.B. jargon in this issue's Country section. Some of the more inventive slogans used by our nation's C.B. operators include: Ten-One-Hundred...which means "I Gotta Go Potty." Seat Covers...meaning "Girls In Cars." And the ever popular Pregnant Roller Skate which of course stands for "Volkswagen." Like I mentioned, the complete list appears in Jim's section this week.

We've noted some strong action on the Band Of The Black Watch record "Scotch and Soda." After only one week of play at KAKE, it reports hot.

Good regional action again this week on the Bing Crosby record. Hot action at both KCRA and KMBZ.
