## McClenaghan Exits Arbitron

In a move that came as a shock to many, including Bill McClenaghan, Arbitron asked the VP/GM of Arbitron Radio to step down from his position.

McClenaghan told R&R: "...I feel a great sadness in leaving a company and the many people that I like so very much. I feel very close to radio and I want to continue to be a part of it."

Arbitron has not yet announced who will fill the vacant position, and McClenaghan has three months in which to relocate. Arbitron, in its press release credited McClenaghan as the one who helped build the radio rating service to its current dominant position.

## One Day Nelson Picnic In Texas

After an official announcement cancelled the fourth and final Fourth of July Willie Nelson picnic in Texas, because of not being able to obtain a three day permit for the event, a permit was issued for a one day event. Under the Texas Mass Gathering law such an event could only take place during a 24 hour period. Rather than cancelling the event, as was earlier reported, Columbia recording artist Willie Nelson has decided, along with his backers, to schedule the annual Country-Rock festival for one day only. The date will be July 4, be-

ginning around 10am. The site will be on a 28,000 acre ranch just outside of Gonzales, Texas, which is located between Austin and San Antonio. Scheduled performers include Leon Russell, Roger Miller, Waylon Jennings, Jessi Colter, Kris Kristofferson, Rita Coolidge, Jerry Jeff Walker, Rusty Wier, Floyd Tillman, David Allan Coe, and, of course Nelson.

### NEW OWNERSHIP OF WIFE

Indianapolis Broadcasting Inc. took over ownership of WIFE/Indianapolis last Tuesday (1). Sam Holman, former Star Broadcasting national PD, has been retained as WIFE's program director. The station's on-air staff and programming will remain the same. Jack Armstrong and Jerry Steele are the new co-music directors.

### WPGC'S CONCORDE FLIGHT

Two WPGC/Washington D.C. listeners will celebrate the U.S.A.'s Bicentennial birthday in London, compliments of the station. The "Magical Mystery Tour" promotion features a "tour guide" with a British accent who announces 14 London locations on the air. The first person to correctly identify all 14 places will fly via Concorde jet to London.

### BIGGEST BATHTUB RACE

WQTC "15Q" Two Rivers is the official sponsoring station for what may turn out to be the first annual National Bathtub race. Entrants from all over the country will participate in the upcoming event. 15Q's J.J. Jackson reports that all out promotion will be centered around the great race, with possible nationwide network TV coverage.

15Q's "Mini-Indy" record rip off featured all the station jocks "racing" on the air. Callers guess which of the jocks would win individual races, set up on carts, winning album packs totalling \$350.

### MIAMI PULSE RESULTS

Miami Central Zone Pulse total shares Monday-Friday show Spanish WQBA on top with a 14, WHYI (Y100) (R) next with 8, WMBM (B) and WQAM (R) have 6, MOR WIOD, Beautiful WLYF, Country WWOK, and AOR WSHE with 5, MOR's WGBS, WINZ and WVCG, along with Rocker WMJX have 4 shares. Y100 shows a strong lead in teens with a 33,

WMJX second with 14, WQAM has an 11. In the Miami-Ft. Lauderdale-Hollywood Metro Areas, Y100 ties WQBA for first place.

### RKO'S "GENERAL CONCERTS"

The "Eau Claire 500" was recently presented by WEAQ. The 500 biggest hits of all time were counted down on the air, along with hundreds of bottles of Coke given away.

98Q/Vidalia held their second annual 98Q 500 go-kart race for the holiday. Contestants registered prior to the event, then called in to qualify for the race when they heard their names called on the air. The big race pitted these listeners against the 98Q jocks' fastest lap times. First place winner walked away with their own go-kart, with runner-ups receiving other great prizes.

A star studded show was held over the recent holiday weekend, sponsored by KIOA/Des Moines. 26,000 fans turned out to see Foghat, Santana, the J. Geils Band and Pure Prairie League at the first annual KIOA Iowa Jam.

KIOA helped raise over \$150,000 for charity as all the station personalities appeared at a telethon to raise pledges.

### MOVIE PREMIER CONTEST

## Chasing The Charts

One of the things that in our fast-paced business, can make even the few clear days seem cloudy, is not being completely certain about how to go about solving a problem that is a part of your job. This happens to many of us, at one time or another.

Let us be very clear about the function of each of us in our respective jobs. A teacher is paid to teach children. An engineer is paid to design, let us say an airplane. The measure of the engineer's success, and therefore his qualification to continue to hold his/her job, is whether the plane designed will fly. The measure of a teacher's success and therefore his/her qualification to continue to hold a job, is whether or not the students learn what they are supposed to, at their grade level.

Nobody asks the engineer about the problems he has in designing a plane. Nobody wants to know if it is in a ghetto or in a suburban industrial park. They just want to know if the plane will fly safely.

What does all this have to do with radio and records? Just this... "We just want to know why our record went on at twenty-nine moved to twelve, dropped to thirty then became hit-bound and is now an extra, which the disc-jockeys never seem to get around to playing and all of which cause us to lose our "bullet?" says one record executive. "We don't care about your battle for ratings, an overabundance of commercials or the fact that you've got two jocks sick and your wife found about your girlfriend and both her father and your girlfriend's main man are looking for you." Does this story sound familiar?

There are many problems facing our industry today, but few as serious as the problem of accurate charts for Black music. This includes both albums and singles. Let's look at why the inconsistencies occur and the problem of tracking the playlist or "chasing the charts" is so difficult, and yet, so necessary.

First of all, buys are made at both the retail and the national level based on charts and any indication of growth or strength, especially in the record's "incubator" stages is most important. For example, for a small new company with limited funds, the difference between twelve and thirty could mean the difference between staying or losing national charts and therein lies obvious success or failure. Since the number of total Black stations is somewhat limited, the number of meaningful major market Black station's charts is even further restricted and the number of these stations who report to the trades is now almost down to single numbers that can be counted on one hand. So you must understand the tremendous amount of pressure this puts on the shoulders of those program and music directors who find themselves in this unenviable position today. Perhaps when we examine all the facts, then we can better understand the problem and set out to find some solutions.

Generally speaking with the emergence of many new Black FMers the problem has now become further compounded because, just as it was in the early days of the progressive "White" stations' who had a lack of charts and total disregard for the industry's chart needs, Black stations are now going through this

state. It was called growth then, and it still is. When you ask these Black stations to tell you which albums they are currently playing, the strongest, most often the answer will vary from station to station and even from jock-to-jock on the same station. This is because they do not call stores and they do not take requests and so therefore they can only reflect their feelings. Many times their feelings are far more honest and accurate than requests and sales input. But still the record industry needs charts. They live "by-the-numbers." So they put together charts based solely on sales.

Very often these so-called indicators of selling music do not influence anyone. They don't influence the buyers at the retail level, certainly not on the national level and they don't influence the radio station's airplay. This is an example of where living by the numbers can be futile. But for an industry that needs these numbers, what other choices do they have?

Black radio station's formats vary from station to station, but there are certain basics which are common to all. A station's format has to accommodate a certain balance between records and commercials. This balance is an integral part of the station's sound. One overtime record per hour requires that station either to omit a commercial (which you know they're not going to do) or to double-spot. Most radio stations are sensitive to a loss of revenue as well as to a loss of audience. There are a very few well-run stations that prefer to sacrifice revenue rather than disrupt a winning format. Now that we are aware of this problem you can begin to understand why even though a record may be on the playlist there will be limited opportunity to rotate them evenly. Many times a cut which is more than five minutes either will not get played at all or only during certain times of the day. Sometimes we can edit a long cut down and this choice takes valuable production time which on a busy day may not get done. But it's cut it down or don't play it at all. It's hard enough to program the hits these days, it would be helpful if some reliable method could be found to correlate sales data, control length on album cuts and find the time to get chart information to all the trades. Remember in most cases you are talking about a one-man job. In all but a few cases the person responsible for charting the hits also has to play the hits, run the program and production departments, answer mail, check contest sheets, attend press parties, be a responsible member of his community and still find some time to be a lover to his main lady and a father to his kids.

And so, faced with so many duties, today's busy program and music directors occasionally forget the importance of accurate charts, and this is both predictable and understandable. What is not understandable, however, is the erratic method many radio station use to determine which numbers are assigned to the music they are playing. For example when a radio station has a "pick" which is never charted, or the idea of reporting records as either being charted or in play which are not. Just as bad, is the practice of playing new music which is not reported. In the latter two categories, many Black radio stations, regardless of the various activities of their

program/music director, have fallen short. And, it is these areas of remissness that we must direct our attention.

For nearly 25 years American radio, regardless of its musical format, has been exposed to music "by the numbers." The old Lucky Strike Hit Parade used to present the nation's top hits based on sales of sheet music, record sales and plays on the automatic coin machines...then Top-40 came along and record stores in cities all over the country offered their customer printed lists of hits as compiled by one or two of the local radio stations. The interest of both the public and the music industry became intense as to what songs were climbing and, of course, which one would emerge in the new magic number one position. Then, most trade papers began to expand their lists of best selling music from thirty-to-fifty to one-hundred titles. Of late there seems to be a marked decline in the general public's interest in the record's number. With the advent of the album as well as single sales, most radio stations have abandoned the idea of identifying records by its chart number, at least on-the-air, as a regular programming practice. In many cities, today, especially with Black radio, record sales reports are so poor, inadequate and inaccurate that program and music directors have been forced to use more and more personal judgement and fewer statistics in compiling their weekly charts.

Despite its continued and growing importance in the record industry, the increasing regional fragmentation of both single and album sales action makes an overall composite of national sales reports comparatively less significant as a programming guide to today's Black programmer. What is still most important, from strictly a radio standpoint, is to be able to be consistent with the music that shows the most positive signs by all available information, of increasing listener appeal. The problem of course, continues to be that high rotation of the top charted items without regard to balance and day-parts can become very dull for the listener, perhaps, in part, because it is based on the previous weeks' sales and request data.

A close correlation between record sales and the radio audience has long been considered a basic premise on which single oriented stations function best. Telephone requests often indicate listener interest in hearing pre-release music, not yet available in the stores. And it is this early air-play along with its appropriate charting that most record people seek from their promotion staff. Present patterns of record merchandising increase the difficulties for programmers who are trying to survey a broad base or cross section of record sales in and out of their respective markets. Now the racks are moving up to three-fourths or more of all the records sold, surveys of retail stores are probably tapping less than 25% of the record business in most markets. Unfortunately certain singles and albums may be in big demand in many rack locations and yet not reflect their popularity in the retail stores. In some case listeners judging strictly by their requests are particularly interested in newer material, mainly albums. However, often as sales of a par-

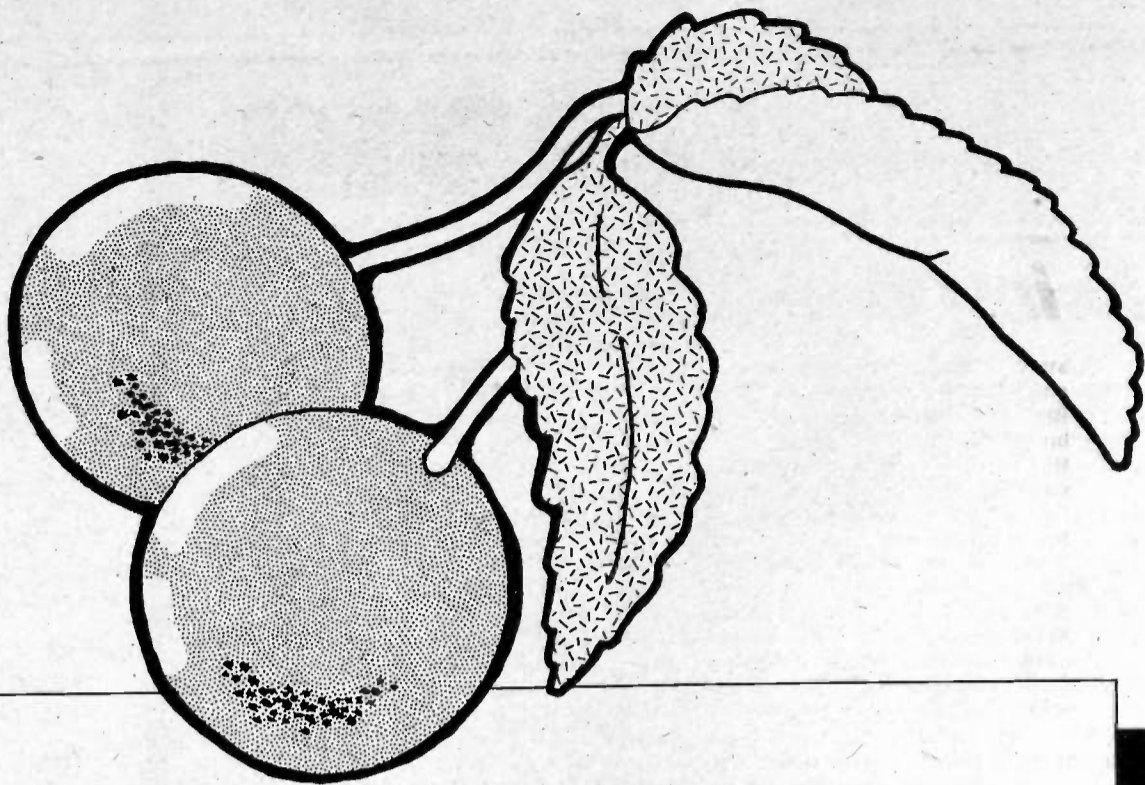

ticular album pick up, requests very often begin to taper off. This may be viewed by some as an admonition against using album sales data in the same way as the singles charts.

In conclusion, if Black program-

mers want their efforts to be counted and shared with the rest of their fellow industry programmers, they must bear the responsibility for accurate reporting of what is being played and charted in their particular markets.

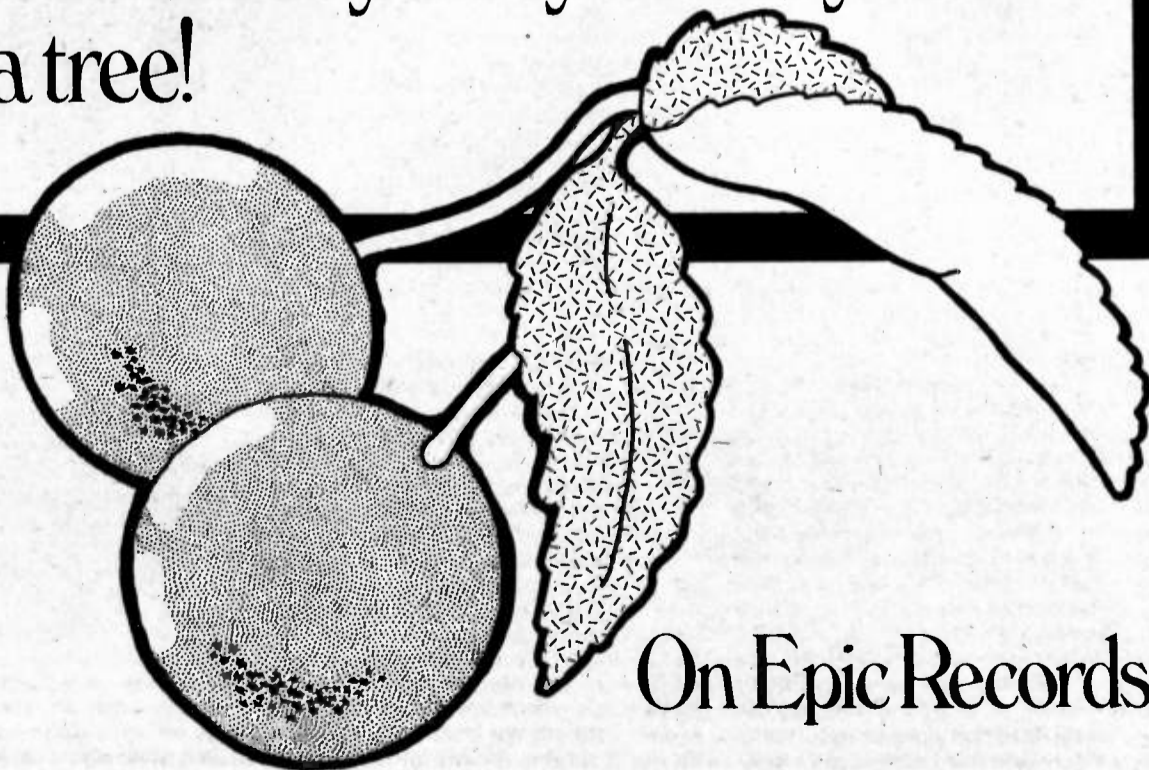

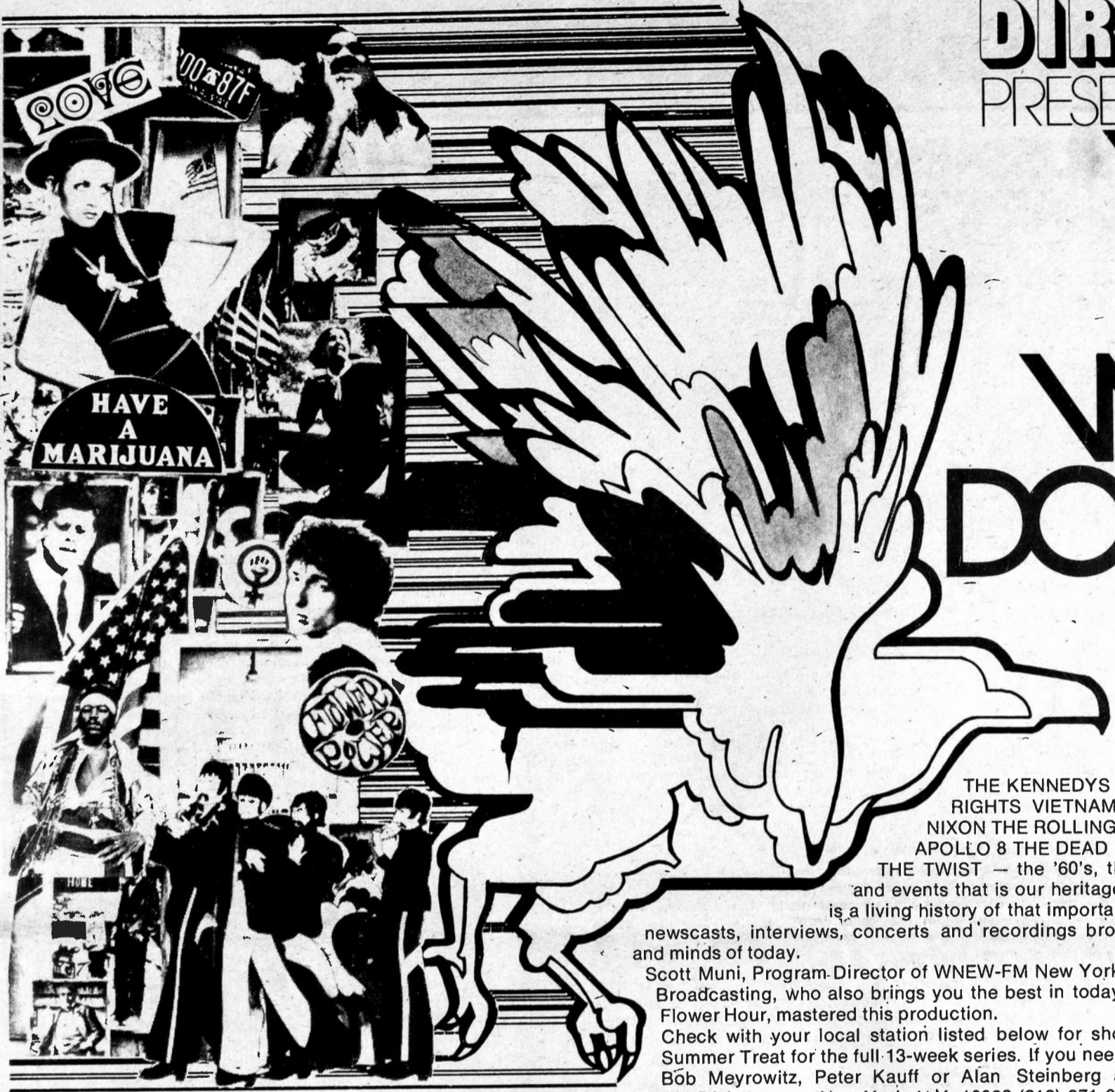

## THE FCC [So You Can Understand It]

### FCC Submits Anti-Obscenity Legislation

The Federal Communications Commission has sent suggested legislation to Congress which would hand down \$10,000 fines or one year prison terms for broadcast stations who aired obscene or lewd material. In its proposal, the Commission defined "obscene" along the U.S. Supreme Court's guidelines, which describe the term as representing or verbally describing acts of sexual nature, and which do not have redeeming literary, artistic, political or scientific value. The term "indecent" applies to subject matter which is offensive under "contemporary community standards." The FCC suggested that reasonable safeguards taken to protect children from viewing or hearing such matter would protect broadcast outlets from criminal action.

### RAB Ratings Task Force

New York based Radio Advertising Bureau has announced the formation of a special task force to study improvement in radio rating services, and to encourage competition "by at least two competitive measurement sources." The task will be headed up by Plough Broadcasting chairman Harold Krelstein.

### Blair Opens Regional Office

Blair Radio will open its 11th regional sales office in Minneapolis-St. Paul in August. Craig B. McKee, currently a Chicago based account exec, will head the new office.

### Jaeger New WOKY GM

William S. Jaeger, formerly general manager of WNCN/New York, has been appointed vice president and general manager of WOKY/Milwaukee.

### Better Business Emblem Furor

A number of local Better Business Bureau offices throughout the country are fighting the Council of BBB's decision to allow the Bureau's emblem to be used in advertising. The Council changed its rulings in March to allow such use. Local BBB offices in Nashville, Knoxville, and Shreveport have already voted to withhold their dues until a review of the Council's decision is made.

### Free Toilets OK In New York

A New York State court has upheld a year old law banning pay toilets, after an appeal by two manufacturers of toilet locks. With the court's decision, an injunction preventing the removal of nearly 4000 locks was lifted. Similar legislation banning the pay-as-you-go facilities have also been passed in Wyoming, Alaska, Iowa and Tennessee.

### Nielsen Index Fights Hypoing

A.C. Nielsen, Co., in conjunction with the Advertising Research Foundation and the American Association of Advertising Agencies are planning to start distribution of a meter based network TV index to help combat possible rating hypoing. The index would alert ad buyers to any unusual shifts in shares during the May Nielsen sweeps. The first index is scheduled to be released the middle of this month, and will be distributed to all Nielsen clients.

### Postal Service OK's Discounts

The U.S. Postal Service has approved proposed rate discounts for bulk mailed first and fourth class mail. The 1 cent per-piece discounts will take effect July 6. Rules will apply only to pre-sorted mail of 500 or more pieces. Other rate changes OK's by the Service include surcharges, effective in 1978, for larger than standard first and third class envelopes, and reduced fees for business reply mail for users who establish advance deposit accounts.

### McDonald King Of Fast Foods

A 26% increase in sales for McDonald's restaurants last year helped the fast food chain hold its number one position. The industry as a whole saw across the board sales increases, with all of the top 25 fast eateries noting upward figures.

### Carnation "Gourmet" Ice Cream

California is the test market for Carnation Co.'s new "1800 Old Fashioned" ice cream. The 60 day test is using radio ads, starting in Fresno, with further testing scheduled for San Francisco. The multi-flavored line is billed as gourmet ice cream.

### Zenith Expands Audio Line

1977 will be a banner year for introduction of new audio products by Zenith Radio Corp. The Allegro 2000 and 3000 speaker enclosures are the first planned new items, to be included in top of the line console stereos. The company plans to introduce 9 new console stereo units next year. Advertising is scheduled to start this fall.

### Wrangler Hosiery

Blue Bell Inc., manufacturers of Wrangler jeans and sportswear, has entered into an agreement with Maro Hosiery Corp. to market Wrangler hosiery. The new line will feature socks and hosiery for the whole family. Major market ads are slated for later this year.

### Canine Comfort

Such luxuries as a miniature brass bed, carpeting, cookie breaks and automatic drinking fountains are available to dogs in Prairie View, Illinois' new Animal Pet Motel. The spoiled canines are also eligible for clean linens each day, all for \$8. Special breakfasts are extra, however.

### LOGGING LIBERALIZED

At long last the FCC has liberalized its program logging requirements. Specifically, the Commission has deleted the requirement for initialing corrections to Program Logs. The new Rule simply requires the person keeping the Log to certify, when signing off duty that the Log, without any changes or corrections made before he or she signed off, is an accurate representation of what was actually broadcast.

In the case of automatically kept Logs and of automatic maintenance of logging data, the person responsible for keeping the Log must certify that he or she checked the automatic equipment periodically throughout his or her tour of duty, and that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, at no time during the tour of duty did the equipment fail or malfunction, unless otherwise noted. In addition, the certification must state that any part of the Log which was kept manually, with any corrections or additions made before he or she signed off duty, accurately represents what was in fact broadcast.

At long last the Commission has combined into one, the present requirement for two entries—one, identifying the sponsor of commercial matter and two, showing that sponsorship identification was given over-the-air, thereby deleting the confusing "check mark" option.

### INTER-FACILITY PROMOS ARE NOW COMMERCIALS

The FCC has amended its Rules so as to now require promotional announcements made on behalf of commonly owned stations in different broadcast services serving the same community to be logged as commercial announcements. Under the old Rules these announcements were not logged as commercials but rather as promotional announcements.

Trading spots between commonly owned stations is a regular practice. A typical example is found where a television licensee is also the licensee of an AM or FM station in the same market. The action, which amends Part 73 of the Rules, becomes effective July 2, 1976.

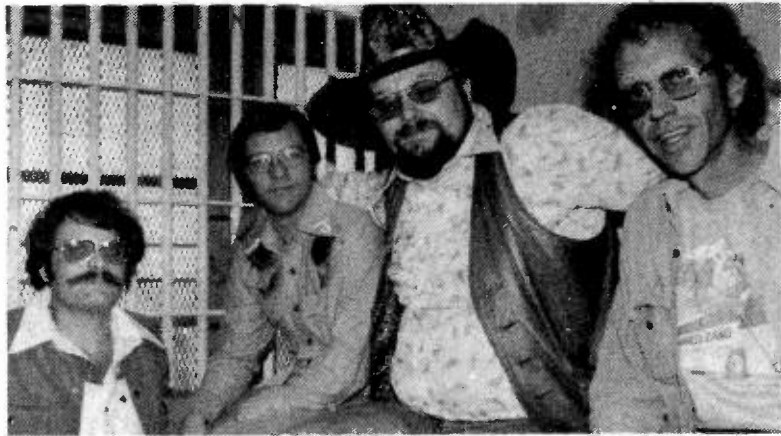

OHIO PLAYERS



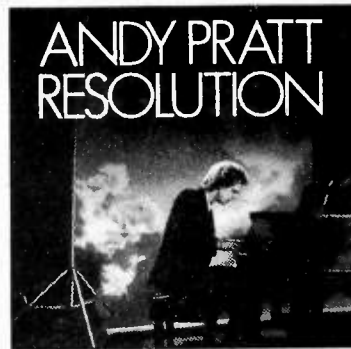

FELIX PAPPALARDI



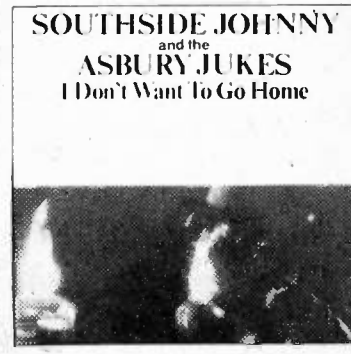

## The Return Of Terry Reid

**T**erry Reid was one of the '60's most popular rock and roll prodigies. He was fronting his own band in England at the age of 15 and at 16 he was on the road in Europe with the Rolling Stones. 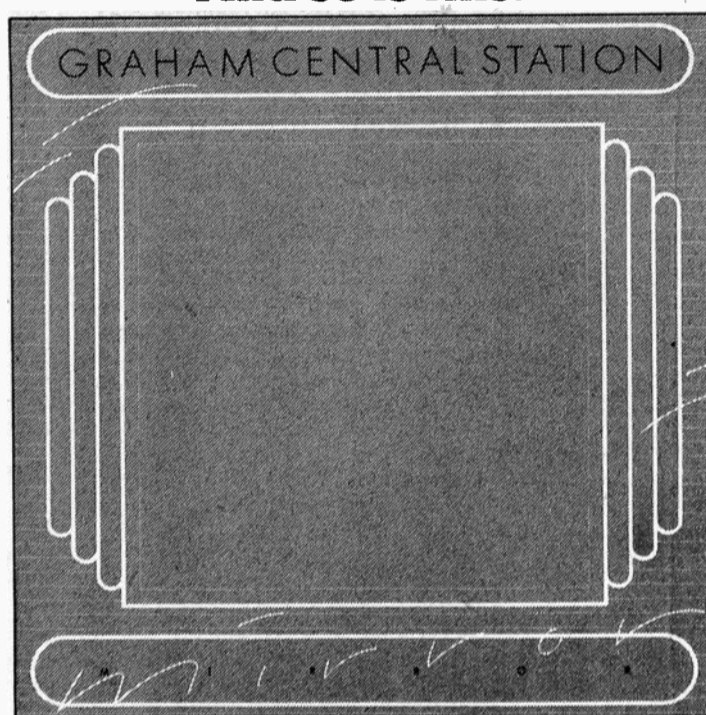

# Parallels

Since 1946, the Ernest Tubb Record Shop has become THE place in the world to buy Country records, the site of the Saturday "Midnight Jamboree" broadcast on WSM directly following the Opry. The new store has three times the square footage of the downtown store, plus a souvenir section of equal size, all located less than a block from the Country Music Hall of Fame. Tomorrow night (12th) the 30 year Midnight Jamboree broadcast on WSM will originate from the new store amid flashing lights and as many hundreds of Country fans as can crowd close enough to see or hear dozens of stars welcome Tubb's shop to the Music Row area. They planned this opening for fan week and should have; the Ernest Tubb Fan Club, headed by NORMA BARTHEL for over 25 years, has sorta set the style and mold for successful clubs for fans honoring Country stars and would-be stars.

I think this year's Fan Fair has "come of age." Watching the literally hundreds of artists who have ASKED to be able to participate in some way tells me something. Three years ago I heard record executives refuse to ask their stars to come here free and perform with personal payment or official recognition. This year, looking at the roster of artists who've been involved, it's obvious to me Fan Fair is becoming what I predicted the first year HUBERT LONG and JO WALKER asked me what I thought about it: "The world's fair of Country music." One day soon they'll have a midway, sideshows, fancy and sophisticated presentations by the participating firms who WANT to spend scads of money for the fans and the world to see and hear more about what we used to call "hillbilly" music.

A PEOPLE POTPOURRI: Into Nashville during Fan Fair week, names like CHARLTON HESTON, BILL COSBY, CAROL CHANNING, CHAD EVERETT, CHRIS CONNELLY, SCOTT SHANNON, ROBERT REDFORD, C.W. McCALL, STEVE MARTIN, JIM VARNEY, RUTH BUZZI, MAC DAVIS, ROY CLARK, producer LEE MILLER, the GOODYEAR BLIMP, representatives from most countries in the world included in the first visit of the UNITED NATIONS body to anywhere other than the U.N. building, add up to 16,000 Country fan-atics, a hundred or so oldtime or longtime stars from the past and top off with 300 stars and would-be stars of 1976, stir well with music business executives from all over, "HEE-HAW" production staff, CBS-TV staffers here doing the JOHNNY CASH mini-series, and you've got a "wad" of Music City madness!!!

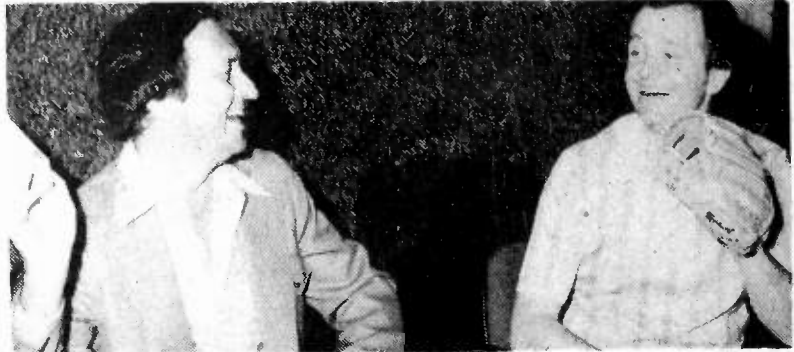

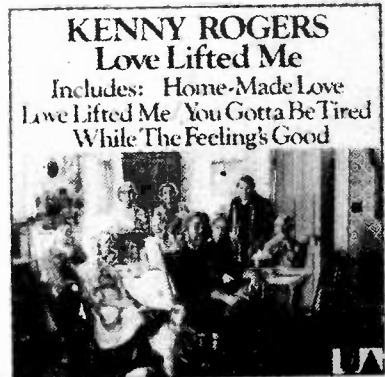

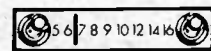
