Mail Theft Indictments In Memphis

The Federal Government handed out two four-count indictments charging George Klein, former Program Director of WHBQ and Robert Neil Wammack, a Memphis postal employee, with conspiring to steal from the mails between February and May of 1976. The alleged thefts apparently involve the Arbitron diary tampering that showed inflated figures for WHBQ in last year's April/May Arbitron survey of the Memphis radio market.

R&R contacted Klein's attorney, Jim Eikner, who stated that he could not comment at this time because neither he nor Klein had yet been served with the official indictment papers. According to Eikner, he and Klein first learned of the indictments in a local newspaper.

Maximum penalty for the crime is 20 years imprisonment or \$16,000 fine, or both.

Mushroom Awarded New Heart Tapes

On Tuesday, February 22, the Federal District Court in Seattle awarded Mushroom Records the studio master tapes of songs previously recorded by Heart for the group's second album, entitled "Magazine." Heart was further restrained from recording, producing or selling such songs while the District Court action is pending. The Court refused to rule that Heart had terminated its recording agreement with Mushroom.

In addition, the Court encouraged the parties to cooperate in releasing the new album. The resolution of all issues, including the issues relating to Heart's contractual relationship with Mushroom, has been deferred until the trial, to be held on a yet to be determined date. VP & GM of Mushroom, Shelly Siegel, told R&R, "Until the court rules otherwise, we will be treating Heart like any other Mushroom act."

Now A Coast-To-Coast Payola Probe

The FCC announced last Friday that it will expand its inquiry into payola and plugola to Los Angeles, Chicago, Detroit and Pittsburgh, with other cities possibly to follow. The announcement also noted that the investigation would also encompass personal managers, manufacturers, as well as discjockeys.

The announcement was made public during open hearings on alleged payola demands by air personalities at Black-format station WOL/Washington D.C. William E. Washington, President of local promotion firm Dimensions Unlimited, charged that five WOL jocks operating a concert promotion firm called

Arbitron Expands Jan/Feb Reports

Two new markets, Baltimore and San Jose, have been added to Arbitron Radio's list of markets surveyed in January/February. These two markets join the other 10 majors who already receive the reports.

KWIZ Launches "Press Club"

KWIZ/Santa Ana plans to have up to 12,000 news "reporters" in the field as members of the KWIZ Press Club, which will provide community participation in the news gathering process. Listeners who become members of the club will receive a station press card, bumper decal and the opportunity to receive up to \$50 for news events covered on a free lance basis. Station Manager Pat Michaels said: "This is not just another 'cash-for-news tips' program. We're asking listeners to tell us what they want to hear. And we intend to respond to their input by putting their stories on the air and paying them for it." Club members will receive a direct phone number to the station newsroom and will be assigned to cover particular stories by KWIZ News Editors Spider MacLean and Ed Nix.

Zoo Benefit

WHHY/Montgomery's "Free Zoo Weekend" raised over \$6000 through donations to purchase bears for the local zoo. Over 30,000 attended during the special weekend, the biggest single gathering at the site in the history of the city. Last year, a similar promotional effort by the station raised funds for the zoo's new kangaroos.

Traffic-Stopping Promotion

WPEZ/Pittsburgh morning man Striker McGuire is holding a contest to help find the worst "pot-holes" in the streets of the city. Listeners find the worst, and take pictures of them to submit to Striker. The top 10 tire-jolters will win those entrants free car front-end alignments, awarded personally by new PD Lee Douglas.

Snow Sculpture

The winter weather has yet to subside, so WGUU/Bangor held their "12Rock Snow Sculpture Contest" to take advantage of the piled up

enough. Listeners send in cards and letters letting the station know where their sculptures are. Station staffers visit the sites and will judge for the first prize of an expenses paid trip for an entire family to a ski resort.

Free Breakfast

WLAY/Muscle Shoals is inviting their listeners to mail in entries for their "Have Breakfast On Us" contest. Winner of the drawing will win a breakfast cooked by morning man "Little" Jimmy Smith, with his show broadcast live from the winner's kitchen. In addition, the winner will receive a year's supply of coffee, coffee maker, and full coffee service to make the current high coffee prices less painful.

WLAY's "Good Neighbor Give-away" ties in with a local supermarket chain. Listeners visit the store outlet in their neighborhood to register for the contest, and then listen for their name to be called on the air. If they call back within the allotted time, and correctly name the price of a certain item listed in the store's ads, they win 1500 trading stamps. Consolation prizes of 300 stamps are awarded, and each time there isn't a winner, another 1500 stamps is added to the jackpot.

Hidden "Queen's Crown"

Somewhere hidden in the city of St. Louis is a "Queen's Crown," the basis for KSLQ's current pro-

motion. Clues are given on the air to help listeners locate the crown. The finder and a guest will be chauffeur driven to the local Queen concert, after the show they will be the guests at a private dinner with the group.

"Up Your Nose"

WZOO/Asheboro's "Up Your Nose" weekend tied in with Gabriel Kaplan's single of the same name. Four times an hour at the sound of a "Harpo Marx" type horn, listeners called in to win a copy of the single. All winners were entered in a drawing to win 25 albums.

Valentine Wrap-Up

WLOF/Orlando delved deep into the romantic souls of their listeners for their Valentine's "Kiss & Tell" promotion. At the sound of a "kiss," callers revealed their innermost thoughts about their loved ones, winning either a Heart LP or The Emotions "Flowers." The 15 judged the best won boxes of imported German chocolate for their sweethearts.

"Silly Love Songs" was the theme for KDZA/Pueblo's Valentine's Day. Each hour, callers won "Wings Over America" albums, triple album sets, and heart-shaped Shakey's pizzas. All during the day, various silly love songs from the past and present were heard on the station.

"Hearts and Kisses" were offered to WEAQ/Eau Claire's listeners. Callers had their choice of Heart's "Dream-

boat Annie" LP or Kiss' "Rock & Roll Over."

The weekend preceding Valentine's Day, WPPI/Carrollton, Georgia gave away copies of 10cc's "The Things We Do For Love," and Donna Summers' "Valentine" album, plus red carnations from a local florist.

Other Promotions

WAKX/Duluth ran a special John Denver weekend. Callers won copies of the brand new Denver Greatest Hits album, while the station fea-

tured old and new Denver tunes on the air.

WIRK/West Palm Beach received over 4000 entries in one week for the station's giveaway of Elvis Presley concert tickets. Each jock gave away two pair of tickets to entrants in the drawing.

WWKE/Ocala, Florida is running a promotion called "KEY & The Colonel Take You For A Ride." Listeners call when they hear the sound of a motorcycle, winning a box of Kentucky Fried Chicken and qualifying to win a 1977 Suzuki cycle.

Business News

Wiley To Address NAB Convention

Capital Cities Communications Inc. has now acquired 100 percent of the stock of the **Kansas City Star Co.**, completing an earlier-announced agreement between the companies. The stock was purchased for \$125 million.

Foreign Stones' Releases To EMI

Although no U.S./Canada record deal for the **Rolling Stones** has been announced, the group has signed a long term contract with **EMI Records Ltd.** for worldwide distribution of six albums, excepting North America. Reports on the exact dollar amount of the deal have varied widely, but a Stones' source said that it was nearly \$102 million.

Storer Net Doubles

Storer Broadcasting Co. has reported net profits for the year ending December 31st of close to \$15 million, up dramatically from \$7.5 million in '75. A spokesman for the company said that although these figures could represent an optimistic future, the cold winter weather has already reduced income for the first quarter of the year.

FBI Seizes Bootleg Albums

In a raid on **Scorpio Music Distributors** of Pennsylvania, the **FBI** seized nearly 30,000 allegedly counterfeit records, 26,000 of which were bogus **Bob Dylan** LP's, titled "The Little White Wonder." Authorities said Scorpio violated Federal statutes on manufacture, distribution and sale of unauthorized copies of copyrighted sound recordings.

Benefits Grow Faster Than Raises

More and more employers are favoring fringe benefits for their employees than regular pay raises, according to a **Roper** poll. Since 1973, 5 percent more company heads switched their preferences to benefits, while during the same period, 2 percent of bosses decided they did not like pay raises. Most workers over 45 and most union members actually prefer benefits now. The benefits most popular with workers are dental insurance and cost of living clauses, followed by four day work weeks, retirements after 30 years and flexible work hours.

Elektra/Asylum Pledges Non-Violence Against Women

After the California branch of the **National Organization for Women and Women Against Violence Against Women** banded together against the Warner family of record companies in their stand against graphics depicting physical or sexual violence against women, **Elektra/Asylum Records** has announced their pledge to respect the organizations' wishes. E/A Chairman **Joe Smith**, in a joint release from NOW/WAWAW and his company, said that even in instances when artists have control over album graphics, the company would use its influence to discourage objectionable illustrations.

TV News

How The Ratings Were Won

ABC scored big again for the week ending February 13th. Their "How The West Was Won" mini-series topped the Nielsen ratings with Part II. The three networks lined up like this: **ABC** 22.1 rating, **CBS** 18.7, **NBC** 18.5. After "HTWW," the rest of the top 10 were: "Happy Days," "Laverne & Shirley," "Charlie's Angels," "MASH," "Six Million Dollar Man," "People's Choice Awards," **ABC** movie "The Last Dinosaur," "One Day At A Time," and "Welcome Back Kotter."

In Los Angeles and New York, Arbitron TV's meter service ratings broke down like this: L.A.: 1) "Laverne & Shirley," 2) "Happy Days," 3) **ABC** Sunday Night Movie, 4) tie with **ABC** Monday Night Movie and "Six Million Dollar Man," 6) "Barney Miller" and "Welcome Back Kotter" tied, 8) another tie between "Charlie's Angels," and "What's Happening!," 10) "Bionic Woman" and "Donny & Marie." In New York for the week of February 5-11, 1) "Laverne & Shirley," 2) "Happy Days," 3) "Fish" and "What's Happening!" 5) "Welcome Back Kotter," 6) "Barney Miller," 7) "Happy Days Special" and "Six Million Dollar Man," 9) "Charlie's Angels," and a five-way tie for 10th, **ABC** Monday Movie, **ABC** Sunday Night Movie, "All In The Family," "Donny & Marie," "Rich Man-Poor Man."

members of the record and radio industries started at the first registration at noon Friday at the Fairmont. Interest and enthusiasm was at such a high pitch that even a two alarm fire in the hotel kitchen did not affect the participants. The small fire produced so much smoke that it filled the first floor area and continued upwards to the Registration area on the second floor. However, everyone seemed so pleased to be at the Convention, that no one moved from the lobby or left the line at the Registration area. Although they paid little attention to the smoke, guests did give

a cheer to the fire department when they entered the hotel to put out the fire. The *Dallas Times Herald* picked up the story and the reporter was amazed at the lack of response to the fire. "As fireman used fans to clear smoke from the lobby, the modishly dressed music industry people, apparently oblivious to the smoke, continued to entertain each other and fill the couches and armchairs of the lobby bar." The convention was undoubtedly under way.

Many informal conversations were held while everyone was settling into their rooms. This fraternization was further encouraged at the Cocktail Party and Buffet Supper at 7:30 pm. Although most of the conversations started with what must have been the question of the even-

ing, "When did you get in?", they quickly progressed into questions and answers from people who had never previously met. Besides diverse delicacies, various notables could be found, such as **Irv Azoff** sitting on the floor, **Ed Salamon** near the salmon and **Dallas Cowboy's** cheerleaders passing out stickers as the marachi band played away.

As 10:00 pm rolled around, the informal one-to-one meetings began. Keeping with the concept that **R&R Convention & Expo '77** was to be "the ultimate lobby," the meetings started out as continuations of the conversations started at the Cocktail Party. But as each of the moderators introduced the various panelists and various specific topics and questions were raised, people

settled down and the meetings, while retaining the informal one-to-one atmosphere, developed into a question-and-answer session. Both panelists and other members of the audience felt free to raise points. In most of the sessions, Top 40, AOR, Country, and Pop/Adult, the questions of research vs. gut feeling, programming vs. sales, radio and record company relationships, and personality vs. management were raised. All sides of the issues came up during the heated debates. It is interesting to note that the different sides that developed on such issues as research were not divided by age, management position or the lack of a position. It was a democratic process in the true sense. Air personalities could stand up and voice their disagreements with GM's and

PD's. Younger, newer members of the industry could express opinions without the apprehension usually apparent in more formal settings. The sessions ended at about 1:00 am but many people were reluctant to stop their debate on the fundamental issues raised. Many people did in fact continue to talk, despite the strong draw of having the opportunity to see a screening of "Rocky."

The hospitality suites provided another opportunity for people to meet each other in order to continue discussions and start new ones. The Saturday morning One To One Brunch provided a unique opportunity to meet key programmers and industry notables as well as the **R&R** staff. They were available for

specific questions at pre-assigned tables. During the brunch and conversation a special audio feature "The Last Dance" (Your First Chance) was presented. The clever and mildly satirical view of radio in the future was written by Jim Long, George Burns, Royce D. Applegate and Ira Miller, and produced by TM Production for the R&R Convention.

The Keynote Addresses were undeniably one of the high points of the Convention. Gordon McLendon, pioneer of Top 40, All News, and Beautiful Music formats, made a keynote speech that was full of headlines. Charlie Van Dyke, PD of KHJ/Los Angeles introduced McLendon. Van Dyke related a few of the fabulous stories that surround the man and admitted that Mr. McLendon was his idol in the industry. The warmth and respect the industry holds for Gordon McLendon was demonstrated by a standing ovation on his way to the podium. After making the relatively low-key point "the stronger the signal, the more successful the station," McLendon immediately revealed that he would offer a \$50,000 reward for the person who had information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone found tampering with an ARB Diary. This point was cheered by all present. Not content with this,

McLendon went on to suggest some important FCC changes. First, he said, the community ascertainment survey on the FCC license form was unnecessary and self-serving on the FCC's part. McLendon added that FCC Commissioners should include programming men, who would be responsive to the real needs of the radio industry. Both points were enthusiastically applauded. Perhaps the comment that sums up McLendon's speech best is his own, "I am bullish on radio."

Neil Bogart, President of Casablanca Record and FilmWorks was the next Keynote speaker. Bogart spoke on the future of the record industry. The need for record industry flexibility in the face of ever changing technology was the theme of his speech. He downplayed the controversy on 12 inch 33 1/2 rpm singles, claiming that 20 years

from now, no one would care what size the singles were in 1977. Instead he centered on the oncoming video-disc revolution, where air personalities will have to think about what they will present visually as well as what music to play. Bogart also mentioned that the future of the record industry is not threatened by this new technology, that it should instead be considered a new and innovative tool that will have a positive effect on the record buying audience. Earlier in his speech, he spoke of being able to travel through the telephone in the future. Demonstrating this concept, he picked up a ringing telephone on the podium. Saying his thank-yous and farewells, Bogart proceeded to disappear in a burst of flame and smoke. A more fiery speech would be difficult to imagine.

The General Meetings were next on the agenda. The first dealt with the hottest issue of our combined industries, the FCC investigation into Payola. Featuring Arthur Ginsberg, Assistant Chief of Complaints and Compliance Division of the FCC, and Jeff Baumann of the Renewal and Transfer Division of the FCC, the panel was moderated by Jason Shrinky. Immediately, questions poured forth on what should radio stations and personalities accept from record companies, as far as gifts, concert tickets, and airplane flights were concerned. Ginsberg noted that expensive dinners and trips were given by record companies to PD's and MD's, rather than midnight to 6am air personalities and weekenders. This he noted, was obviously payola. He emphasized that the airwaves are the public's and the public has a right to know how records receive airplay on a station. The answers centered on the point that if a station accepted a gift and mentioned a record or concert in return, and did not log it as commercial time, then it was payola. Shrinky voiced his opinion that all gifts from a cigarette lighter on up should be politely turned down. That way, he explained, you do not reveal yourself as having a price. The questioning was direct and the answers were also refreshingly frank. Questions on Contests and EEO were also raised.

The next meeting concerned Music Research Methodology, with John Sebastian of KDWB, Bob Pittman of WMAQ & WKQX, Lee Abrams of Burkhart/Abrams, and Bob Duckman of WASH answering

questions on how they go about their research. Although the methods varied in degree and complexity, they boiled down to a combination of both research and gut feeling. Most of the questions during this session dealt with how to apply the bigger markets research in smaller markets.

A special treat was the session on How To Maximize Your Promotions with Harvey Mednick of RKO, and a panel of experts in the advertising and graphics field. The audience was presented via a series of slides and video presentations with the varying degrees of effectiveness of billboards and television advertising. The main thrust was that outside professionals should be brought in when a station is going to spend money on advertising. It was pointed out that it is more effective to have an advertising person learn radio than it is a radio person to learn advertising techniques.

The final Keynote Address turned out to be nothing of the sort. In a rare appearance, actually his first at any industry convention, David Geffen made himself available to any and all questions posed to him from the audience. Starting things off and guiding the conversation was R&R Publisher Bob Wilson. Geffen was refreshingly candid in answering questions on what motivated him in the record business, what made Asylum Records the gigantic success that it is, and how he feels about the radio and record industries in general. Geffen emphasized that radio was probably the single most important aid in marketing records and that it had played an important part in his success. Geffen also expressed his belief that the artist makes the record company and not vice versa. Expressing his happiness in his present position as Special Assistant to the President of Warner Communications, Mr. Geffen also related that he has no idea of what he is going to do next, and he likes it that way.

The culmination of the Convention came at the Superstar Banquet & Show. Hosted by Tony Orlando and O.J. Simpson, it turned out to be a rousing and satisfying musical event. Before the music started, O.J. asked Tony to explain some things about the music industry to him. Such humorous questions as who is "R.T. Mongrel" and "Steve Polish" highlighted the amusing

conversation. Emmylou Harris started the entertainment, displaying the versatility in both Pop and Country that has made her one of the newest superstars on the scene. After a slight intermission where O.J. attempted to fill the gap by revealing a surprisingly good singing voice, Boz Scaggs came on. Performing most of the songs that have made him popular, Boz thoroughly entertained the audience, getting them on their feet many times during the performance.

As always, the conversations continued in the hallways, and elevators after the show. At the One-To-One Brunch Sunday morning many people expressed both their satisfaction at what they had accomplished during the Convention and their disappointment that it was over so soon.

D.J. Productions, had exerted undue pressure on performers and promoters by threatening to withhold radio airplay.

During the hearings, Washington cited recent Al Green and Earth, Wind & Fire concerts as examples of interference by D.J. Productions, involving threats of reduced airplay for those artists unless D.J. Productions was permitted to join in the promotion of the concerts. Jack Boyle, head of Cellar Door Concerts, Inc., was also slated to testify. The complaint regarding the WOL personalities was the original catalyst spurring the FCC to schedule the public hearings on payola.

Bill Hennes resigned as Program Director of WNDE/Indianapolis, this week to accept a similar position at WFIL/Philadelphia, effective Monday, February 28. Before WNDE, Hennes programmed CKLW/Detroit and WKLO/Louisville. A new Program Director for WNDE will be named later this week.

"Sweet" Dick Whittington is returning to KGIL/San Fernando after departing KFI/Los Angeles, where he was afternoon drive personality. Whittington will return to his former morning star position with KGIL where he spent seven years before recently moving to KFI.

John Chaffee has been elected Vice President, Programming of the Malrite Broadcasting Company. The promotion was announced by Malrite President Milton Maltz. Chaffee was most recently National PD for the ten station chain which includes WHK and WMMS/Cleveland, where the chain is headquartered.

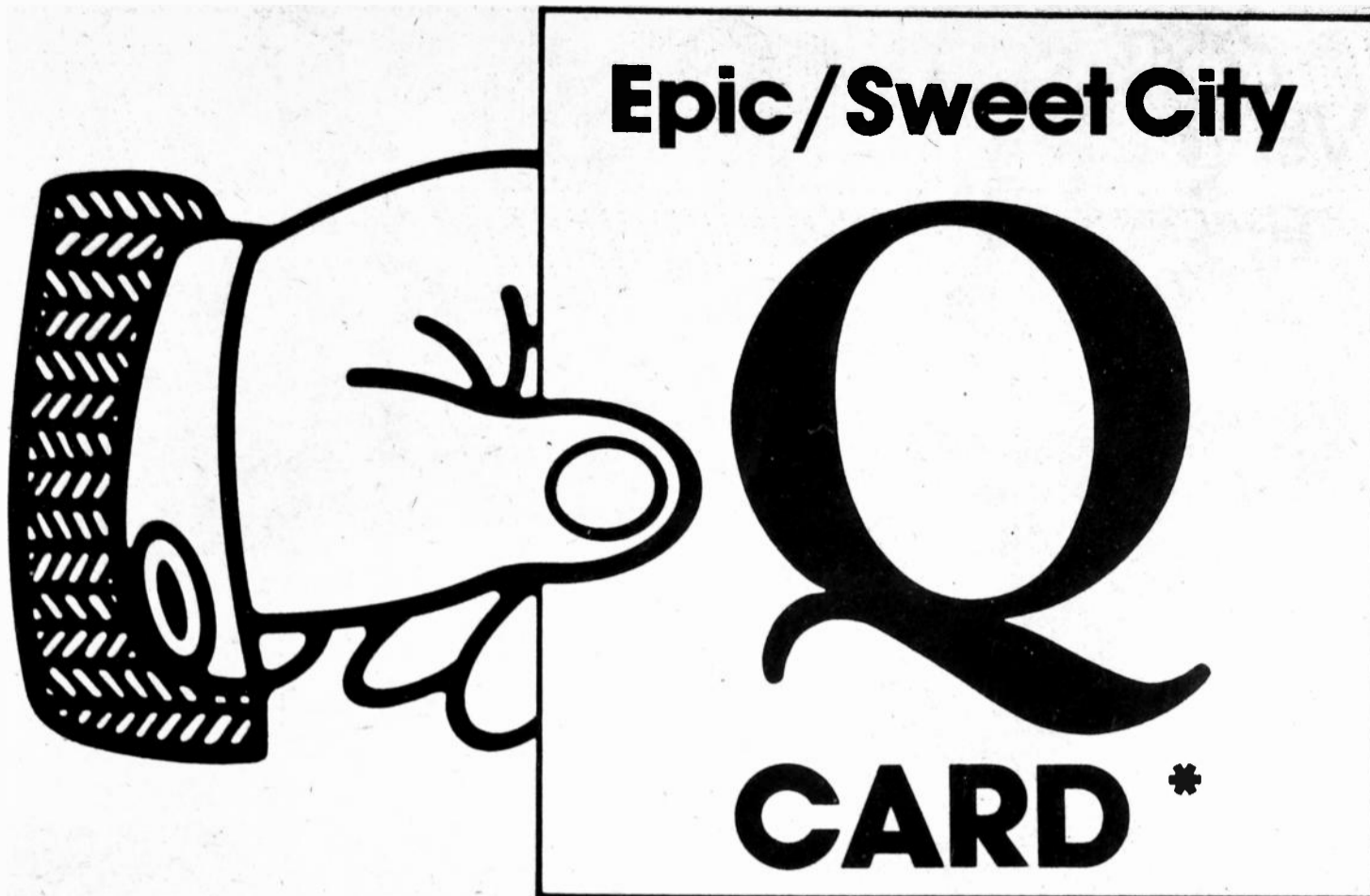

ACADEMY OF COUNTRY MUSIC AWARDS HELD

Los Angeles— The annual awards of the California based Academy of Country Music, presented Thursday (Feb. 17) at Los Angeles' Shrine Auditorium, are often a better barometer of the direction of Country music than the CMA Awards or the Grammys. The Academy of Country Music's "most promising vocalist" categories predicted the successes of Linda Ronstadt and Mickey Gilley two years ago. Ronstadt won her Grammy this year and Gilley walked away with an arm load of Academy of Country Music trophies.

Gilley, who owns, operates, plays and sings in one of the biggest honky-tonks in the country (Houston's Gilley's) was honored as the entertainer of the year, male vocalist, album ("Smokin'"), single ("Bring It On Home") of the year. His band won the best touring band award. Baker Knight's "Don't The Girls Look Pretty At Closing Time," which Gilley recorded, was named the best Country song of 1976.

Loretta Lynn's beautiful kid sister, Crystal Gayle, was honored by the Academy's 1500 members as the best female Country singer. Billie Jo Spears and Moe Bandy were named the most promising Country performers. Loretta Lynn and Conway Twitty were honored as the best vocal duo for the third consecutive year.

Roy Clark's recent trip to the Soviet Union earned him the Academy's coveted Jim Reeves Memorial Award, for furthering international acceptance of Country music. Record executive, Owen Bradley, veteran musician, arranger and record producer was honored with the Academy of Country Music's Pioneer Award.

The televised portion of the award show (ABC's Wide World Of Entertainment, Thursday, Feb. 24) was MC'd by Patti Page, Pat Boone and Jerry Reed.

The non-televised, early portion of the program presented awards to Bill Ward, KLAC, Los Angeles, Radio Station of the Year, Charlie Douglas, WWL, New Orleans, Country Music Disc Jockey of the Year and Tommy Thompson, owner-operator of The Palomino Club, North Hollywood, Ca. for Country Music Club of the Year. MC Chris Lane also presented awards to outstanding West coast Country musicians.

It's hard to believe that R&R could have topped last year's convention, but judging by the comments...this was the best ever.

Specifically, I had more good comments on the "one to one" Pop/Adult session than could be imagined. The format design allowed, as we thought it would, an opportunity for everybody to make comments and observations and/or ask questions in a much more relaxed atmosphere. Many programmers felt, and rightfully so, that we could have easily gone another two hours of rap Friday night.

Ted Atkins drew a lot of attention and comment with his explanation of how the Todd Wallace service, MARS, has helped WTAE's programming during the past year. The point of this was well taken considering that most Pop/Adult stations do very little research from an outside source.

Another heavily commented on subject was the one brought up by John Lund concerning the interplay between management and programming. Steve Bell, PD of KMBZ, commented that he spends at least two hours every day with the sales people at the station...this was in direct answer to a young programmer who said he's had problems getting a "realistic" budget from management for promotion. Bell's point was, of course, that the more time you spend communicating with sales/management people, the better your chances of getting the available dollars to spend for programming purposes. Many good points were made by all those attending the meeting and I thank you for caring enough about our business to have shared your thoughts and ideas with everyone.

One of the most commented on Saturday general sessions was the Gordon McLendon speech. Those who heard what he had to say, know if they hadn't before, why he's been a giant success and force in this business for twenty years.

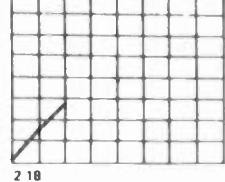
