FCC Issues Stern Notice On Diary Falsifying

The FCC has reacted to incidents of ratings diary falsification by issuing a strongly-worded statement raising the possibility of license removal for violators. The Commission's attention was drawn to a case in which a station's employees had received diaries and had them filled in falsely to the benefit of the station, as well as a number of cases of diary purchasing and bribing of diary holders.

In its statement, the FCC reiterated that "hypoing" during ratings periods was still a matter

for the FTC, but that "the practices described above involve licensee participation in a deliberate attempt to alter the outcome of a rating survey by providing, or encouraging others to provide false information so as to make questionable the validity of the sampling process itself. We believe," the statement continues, "that these practices raise questions as to whether a licensee that engages in them is qualified to remain a licensee...Licensees are warned...that in the future we intend to consider issuance of an appropriate hearing order."

Greater Media Files Third 'Magic' Suit

Greater Media, Inc. has filed its third suit in recent months to protect its "Magic" service marks, with **KMJC/San Diego** as the most recent defendant. Greater Media, with its stations **WMGK/Philadelphia** and **WMJC/Detroit**, is seeking an injunction against further use by **KMJC** or licensee **Lee Bartell & Associates** of their "Magic" terminology both on the air and in outside promotions. Greater Media, which also named **Lee Bartell** personally as a defendant in the action, contends that **KMJC** is infringing on Greater Media's "Magic Music" service mark and related marks using the word "magic." A recent suit against **Globe Broadcasting** and **WMGC/Cleveland** on similar counts was settled out of court last week (**R&R** 7/1), with **Globe** abandoning its use of the word "magic" in its promotions.

The **KMJC** action, however, goes further, in that Greater Media is seeking an injunction against further use of the station's call letters. Observers cited the Greater Media suit as the first in which a station has been called upon to discontinue use of its call letters because of alleged infringement of another operation's service marks. The suit, filed last week, will be tried in San Diego shortly.

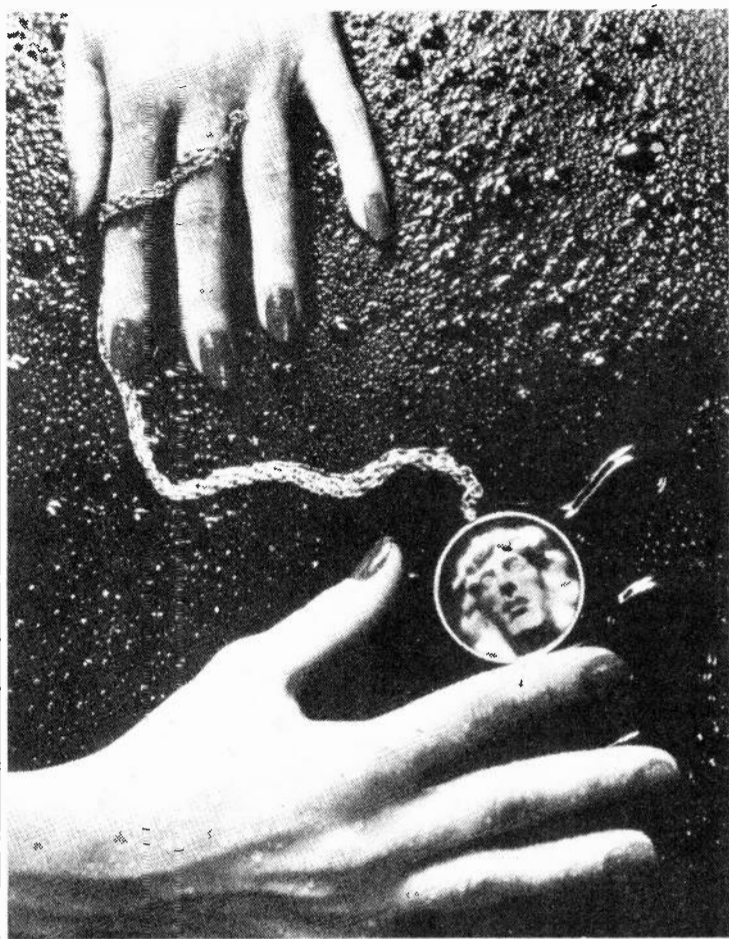

MCA'S UNIQUE DALTREY HOLOGRAM



MCA Records is offering a hologram image of Roger Daltrey in conjunction with the release of the Who lead singer's third solo album, "One Of The Boys." The hologram, through the reflection of light on a laser-created image of Daltrey, depicts a remarkable three-dimensional image of the singer within a glass pendant which fades in and out of view as the light source strikes the image.

The hologram process was invented in 1948, but only recently has become relatively practicable, and may someday replace normal two-dimensional photography.

The Daltrey hologram, taken from an original bronze sculpture, will be available on a limited basis for \$9.95 through inserts in the new album. Subsequently, it will be on sale for a higher price at department stores.

Straus New VOA Director

R. Peter Straus, President of Straus Broadcasting (operators of WMCA/New York), has been appointed Director of the Voice Of America. Straus has worked at WMCA off and on since 1950, having spent seven years working for the International Labor Organization (for which he was U.S. Director) and two years with the Agency of International Development in Africa. He returned to WMCA in 1969, changing its format from Rock to Talk, and was a staunch supporter of the Carter Presidential ticket during last fall's election campaign.

No Unemployment Pay For N.Y. NABET Strikers

The ABC network has been granted a temporary injunction in New York Federal District Court which enjoins the New York State Labor Department from paying unemployment benefits to striking NABET members. The decision stated that the expectation of unemployment money was a significant factor in prolonging a strike, and that such payments would severely reduce ABC's insurance fund for unemployment payments and have an adverse effect on their tax situation. The NABET strikers, who walked out May 17, would have been eligible for benefits July 5.

The use of "Share Trends," when reporting ratings results, is a prime example of why frustration is a way of life to most Program Directors. In the April/May 1977 Arbitron, three San Diego stations collectively accounted for over 16 share points. Two of these stations are brand new, and the third is the baseball station whose "in-season" increase was more than double this year. Due to this huge amount of new listening, 14 of San Diego's 18 remaining stations experienced a decline in their share of the total listening--This in spite of gains on several of the "losers!" The new stations should be commended for good programming--or at least filling an obvious need--but the rest of us should be scrutinized more closely than shares. Here At B-100, Our Cume Increased 20 Percent... Our Quarter Hours Went Up 9 Percent...Yet The Share Dropped Half A Point!

I've always said anyone can find good and/or bad in any ratings book. I've also always said numbers don't mean very much, especially as opposed to human beings. I'm currently busy convincing myself to not be bothered by miniscule frustrations like this one. I think having this letter published in R&R will help a lot!

KVOY Takes A Dive

Pop/Adult-formatted KVOY/Yuma recently organized a charity "Diveathon" which resulted in new world records for underwater broadcasting (40 hours) and an individual underwater broadcast stint (12 hours by guest jock Jerry Hale of KZUL/Parker, Arizona). A special "Aquatower" tank, pictured above with a damp Hale, was built for the promotion, with an underwater air chamber equipped with a microphone, telephone, and a supply of air. The promotion, billed as "Diving For Dollars," raised over \$4300 for the Yuma Foundation for Child Abuse and Neglect. Manning the underwater mike in relays were jocks from KVOY and its sister station KJOK-FM (in addition to record-setter Hale), including Doug Brannon, Mike Del Rosso, Jim Brady, Dow Hardy, Jim Stowe, and Vicki Johnson. The new records have been submitted to the Guinness Book of World Records.

Drivers Verbalize Via "Flash Cards"



Following up our earlier story on the introduction of "Flash Cards," which spell out messages to fellow drivers, the package is now in the hands of consumers, as pictured here. Besides the messages shown here, the series, priced at \$4, includes "I'd Like Your Phone Number," "Get Off My Back," and a custom sign for road hogs in front of your car, "I'm a P.E.L." Since the introduction of the Flash Cards, designed by a car-conscious Los Angeles couple, at least one other company has entered the competition with their "The Hi Sign" series of 21 messages.

"Slime" Becomes Hot Toy Item

One of **Mattel Inc.**'s latest toy entries has turned into its hottest property, after the hit introduction of "Slime." In three months, with virtually no advertising, thousands of youngsters are enjoying playing with a gel-like substance, squishing and squeezing to their hearts' content. The Slime is mostly water, plus some sugar and a few other "secret" ingredients. The manufacturer warns that Slime is hard to clean from clothing, and at least one mother has had to take a pair of scissors to her child's hair to remove the Slime from it.



War On Teenage Alcoholism

The dramatic increase in alcoholism in teenagers has urged parents and community groups to explore new ways to combat the growing illness. Some shocking statistics have come to light in the latest studies of this phenomena, including the fact that more than half of the youngsters reaching the 12th grade drink alcohol at least once a week. Girls are hitting the bottle almost as frequently as their male counterparts, in contrast to statistics from the late '50's, which showed a wide margin between male and female drinkers. More and more juvenile drinkers are getting drunk when they consume liquor, nearly half now claim that they have definitely been drunk in the past year.

NAB To Change Obscenity Code Language

The **National Association of Broadcasters** will appoint a committee to draw up a new voluntary obscenity code for its member stations. The code will be changed so that it discourages material which is "perceived" as obscene, profane or indecent. The current code calls for voluntary discouragement of material which is "legally" obscene.

Cox Closes WLIF Deal

Cox Broadcasting has completed acquisition of **WLIF-FM/Baltimore**, for \$3.9 million cash. Cox now owns six FM outlets, and plans to buy **WWSH/Philadelphia** to reach the seven FM limit.

Taft Broadcasting Review Shows Questionable Payments

Some dubious payments made in **Taft Broadcasting's** amusement park division have been turned up by a special financial review made by the company. An estimated \$23,000 was involved, including cash rebates received from breweries which did not show up in the company's books, and were used for employee bonuses, travel expenses and political contributions. Also questioned were home repair and maintenance work expenses done for the division's Senior Vice President.

The Return Of 2001

MGM is planning a major re-release of their 1968 hit film "2001: A Space Odyssey," following the smash box office draw of the also-futuristic "Star Wars." The company has already re-issued "2001" in Mexico, where it is outdrawing any previous "Gone With The Wind" re-releases.

TV News

New Show Hits Top Spot In Ratings

The high-flying "Charlie's Angels" was replaced in the number one spot in the Nielsen ratings by **NBC's** mid-season entry "Man From Atlantis" for the week ending June 26. **ABC** did place number one overall, followed very closely by **NBC**, then **CBS**. Following "Atlantis," the top 10 shows for the week were: "Charlie's Angels," "Laverne & Shirley," "MASH," "Happy Days," **NBC** movie "How To Break Up A Happy Divorce," "One Day At A Time," **NBC** movie "Mulligan's Stew," "Quincy" and "Baretta."

"Charlie's Angels" held fast in the top position in New York and Los Angeles according to Arbitron's meter service. Top 10 in New York for the week of June 18-24: 1) "Charlie's Angels," 2) "Laverne & Shirley," 3) "Baretta," "Fish," "Happy Days" and "NBC's Double Feature" tied, 7) "Barney Miller," 8) "ABC Monday Night Baseball," 9) "Photoplay Gold Medal Awards," "Rich Man-Poor Man," and "Streets of San Francisco." Top programs in Los Angeles: 1) "Charlie's Angels" and "NBC Double Feature," 3) "Happy Days" and "Laverne & Shirley," 5) "Barney Miller" and "Sunday Mystery Movie," 7) "Fish" and "What's Happening," 9) "Quincy," 10) "Baretta" and "Best Of Donny & Marie."

FCC Stops Network Probe

After several Senate members asked the FCC to shelve their impending probe into the three major television networks, the Commission has now announced that they will put a halt to such an investigation. The FCC blamed the Senate in part for the dropping of the inquiry, saying that Congress has slowed down the process by refusing to appropriate funds for the project. The Commission said that they will take no further action on the issue... **A new amendment has been proposed by the FCC** to lift its regulations on time periods feature films may be shown on pay television. Current regulations restrict showing of movies to the first three years after initial release... **A FCC survey shows** the average television station dedicated 24.4% of their broadcast day to non-entertainment programming in 1976. News encompassed 9.4%, public affairs 4.2% and others 10.5%. Sports is considered entertainment in the Commission's study. In prime-time, the non-entertainment figure dropped to 19.4%. Locally produced shows averaged 8.3% of the broadcast day... **46% of the public believes that TV commercials are misleading** according to a recent study, compared to only 28% who think that print ads are.

Ford Has Another Better Idea

The **Ford Motor Co.** will be the first on the market with a new car gauge that tells the drivers how many miles they have left before running out of gas. The electronic measuring device will be optional on new Continental Mark V's sold by Ford, for an approximate \$100 extra charge.

A Record Strike Month

The month of May was a hot one for workers' strikes, according to a study by the **Labor Department**. Nearly 455,000 workers were affected by 908 strikes, totalling 0.24% of the work time available. This marks the heaviest strike month since October of 1976. Nearly one quarter of May's strikes were attributed to 11 huge nationwide walkouts, mostly in the coal, construction and electrical industries.

A Healthy Employee Is A Happy...

At a remarkably fast pace, companies all over the nation are building health facilities for their employees, including swimming pools, gyms, jogging tracks and the like. One Ohio company even has a full time athletic director to help workers take advantage of their gym and tennis courts. Other firms now offer low-calorie lunches in their cafeterias. Most don't charge for the health and recreation services, although at least one company reported that they deduct a specified amount from users' paychecks for the rights to use the facilities.

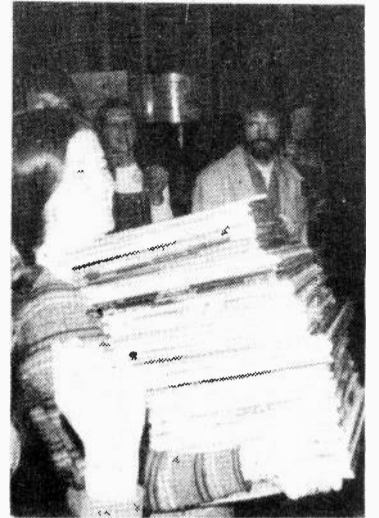

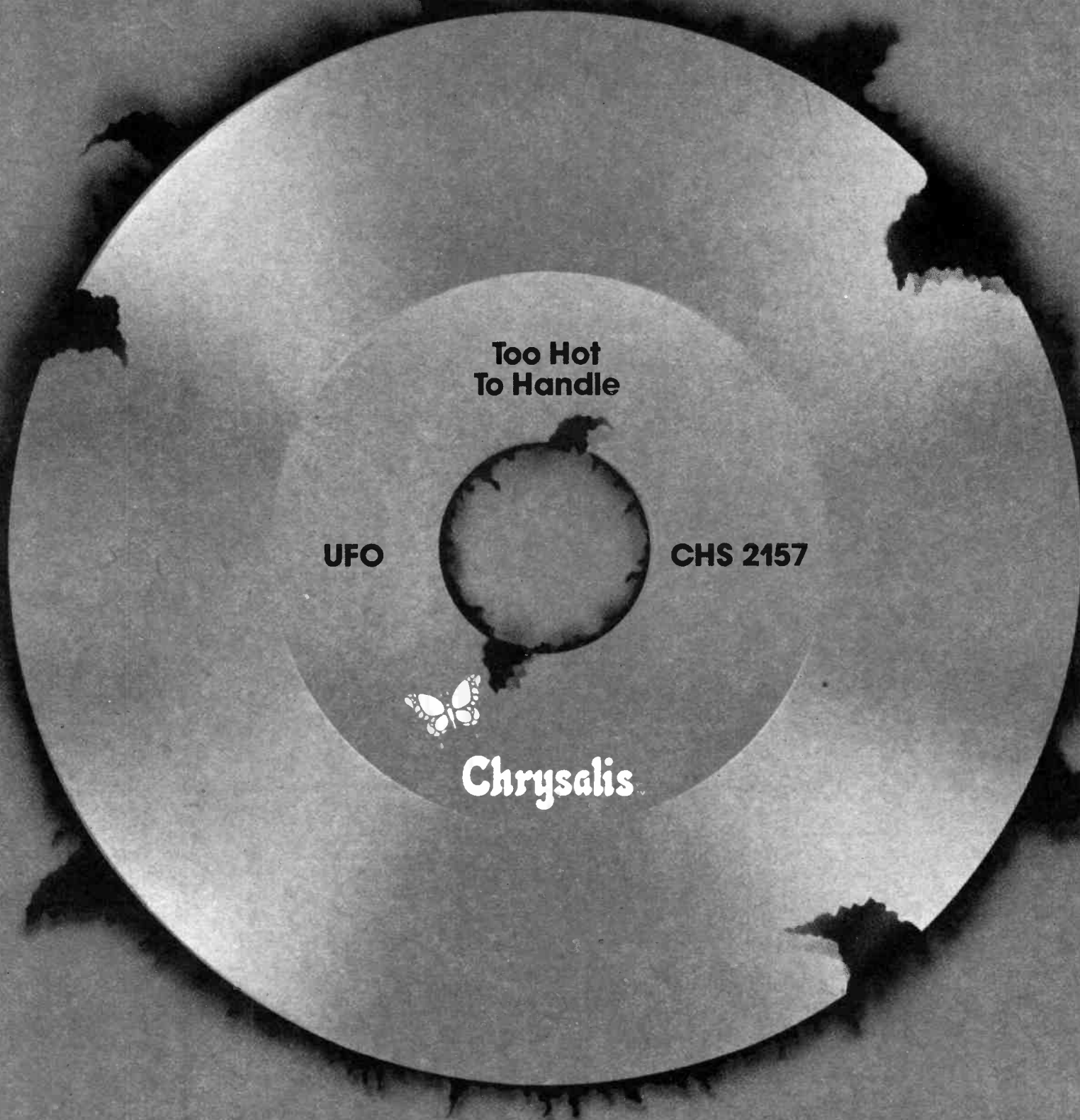

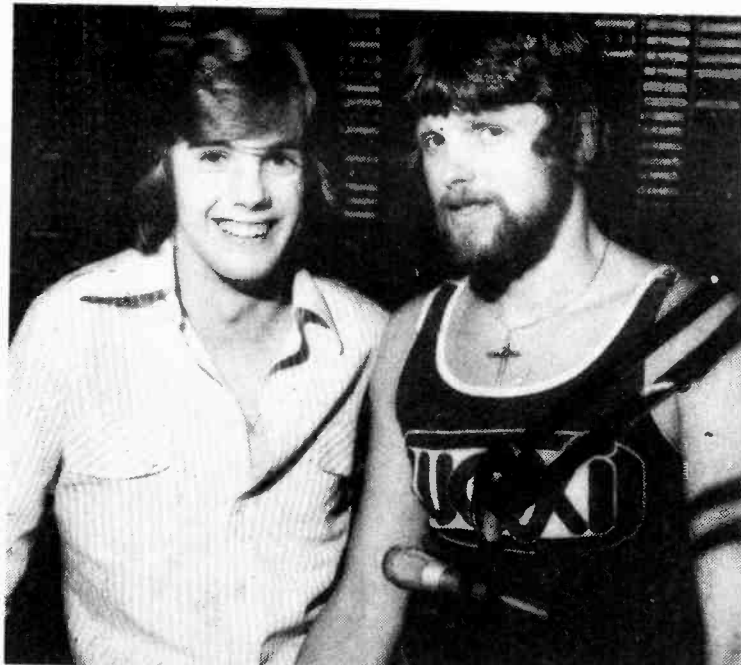

The results of the April/May Arbitron are pouring in now and as always R&R will keep you posted with brief summaries of each market as they become available, leading up to our regularly published national Arbitron-Breakout special edition.

This survey period, once again, shows significant growth for AOR radio. The important aspect of this growth, however, cannot be judged solely on the success of individual stations, but rather, on the tremendous share of listeners available to AOR radio as a whole. It is when a city can support more than one station geared to the same target audience that you know there is indeed a valid market for the concept. Not bad for an approach that only a relatively short period of time ago was considered a fringe alternative!

Again, I have the pleasure of calling to your attention to the Cleveland market. AOR powerhouse **WMMS** made a notable resurgence from 6.0 to 7.5 (Monday-Sunday 6am-12midnight, average quarter hour share). AOR competitor **WVWM** (M105) went from a 4.3 to 6.0 proving there are enough listeners in the market to support two dominant AOR stations. It's important to note that both WMMS and M105 have more total listeners each than any other station playing Rock music in the market. Congratulations to **John Gorman**, PD WMMS, and **Eric Stevens**, PD, M105, and their entire staffs for a job well done!

WDVE/Pittsburgh jumped from a 5.7 to 7.8 making AOR number one of all Rockers in that market and **KGB-FM** lead the way in San Diego with an impressive 7.0, while leaving competitor **KPRI** room for growth from 2.6 to 3.3.

The two leading Rock stations in Sacramento are both AOR. **KROI-FM** leads the way, 3.7 to 6.0, while **KZAP** solidified 5.1 to 5.2. With all those numbers, there was still room for **AOR KSFM** to pull a 3.5.

In Detroit **AOR WRIF** jumped from 6.7 to 7.3 to lead the Rockers in that city. In Boston, both **WBCN** and **WCOZ** showed increases.

New York, Chicago, and Los Angeles continue to support a variety of AOR stations.

Those are just some of the success stories coming in with this book. It is likely that there will be even more, as the Arbitron reports continue to be released.

Interestingly, as AOR continues to prove its viability as a major style of radio, there will subsequently be more AOR stations popping up around the nation creating even fiercer competition and the need for further evolutionary experimentation. In this regard, the future looks exciting!

Drinkin' & Pickin': **KRST/Albuquerque** presented their 2nd annual "Guitar Contest/Get Drunk And Get Crazy Picnic" at the Golden Inn, a bar in the mountains.

WMMS & WEA are co-sponsoring an "Independence Contest" that kicked off on the 4th of July. Contestants must complete a quiz in the June 30 issue of "Scene" magazine or pick up an entry blank at most area record stores. The winner will receive a pair of tickets to every Cleveland-area concert featuring a WEA artist through the end of 1977. Second prize is 101 WEA albums. Five third prize winners will each get their choice of a complete library from one artist on each of the three WEA labels.

Music Of the Past ten years was played on **WNEW-FM/New York** over the holiday weekend to celebrate Independence Day and the station's 10th anniversary.

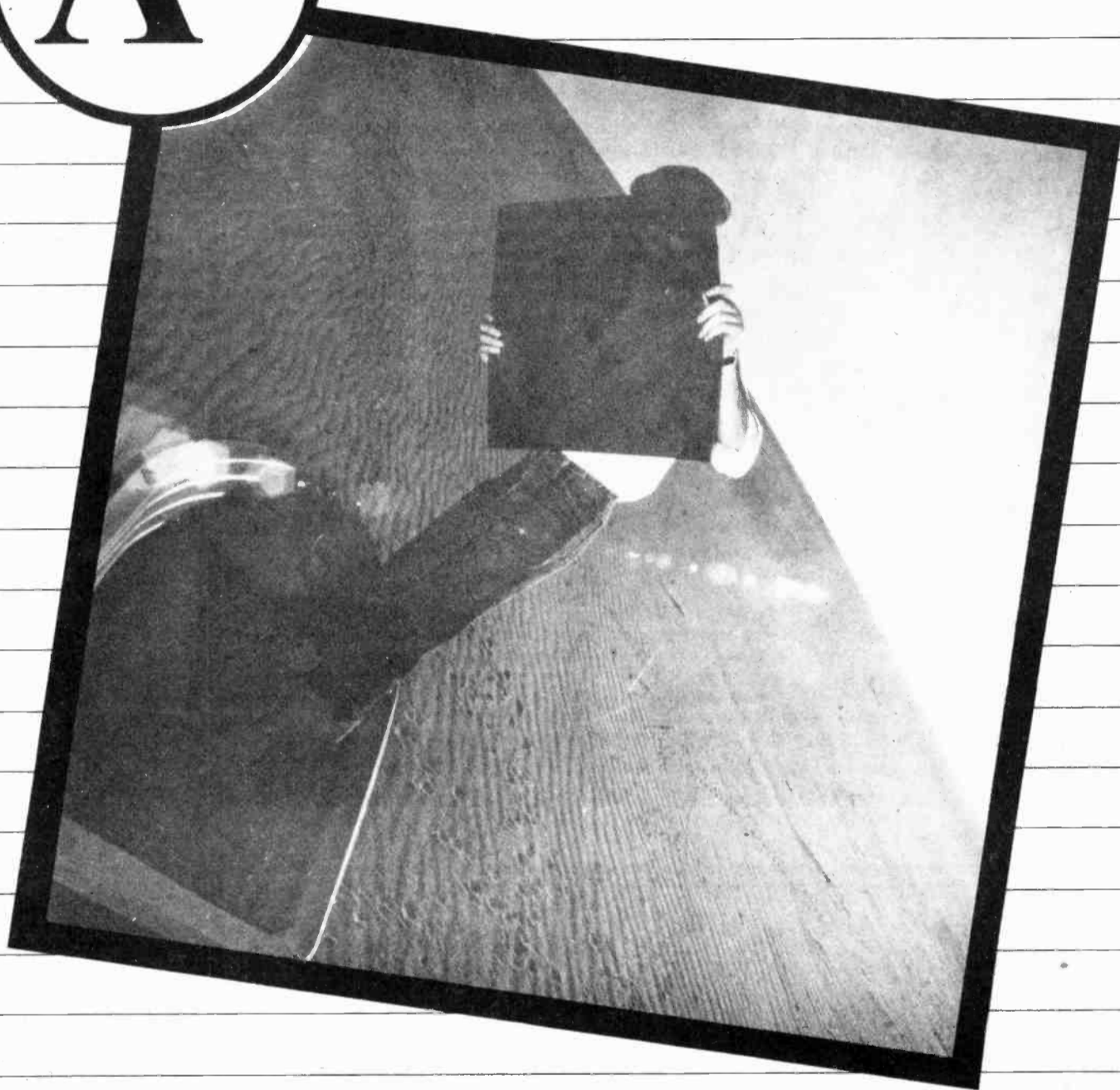
Yates Update
