N.Y. Telephone Contest Issue Settled

In a potentially precedent-shattering decision, the **New York Public Service Commission** has issued an order calling for a 24% completion rate to be instituted in all New York City radio station call-in contests, as of November 1. Since every completed call in the New York City area is charged to the caller, a 24% completion rate would mean that 1 out of every 4 callers in a call-in contest would have their calls answered by a recording device, informing them that a winner in the contest had been determined, and the callers would then be charged for the call.

The decision followed hearings in a hotly-contested case dating back to June 1976, with the **New York Telephone Company** pitted against the **ABC, NBC, RKO, Sponderling, and Storer** broadcasting companies, representing stations **WABC, WNBC, WXLO (99X), WWRL, and WHN**. The phone company had contended that mass volume call-in contests had blocked their phone systems, with most callers allowed to participate without paying for the privilege, since almost all calls except those of winners were not answered by the stations. The radio stations, on the other hand, maintained that the effect of using answering devices announcing that winners had already been selected plus the significant new risk of callers paying for their participation which the new system would create, would act as a strong discouraging factor for future call-in contests. Although the New York payment for each completed call system is a special case, the system has been spreading nationwide and is regarded as the wave of the future by most observers. Therefore, the distinct possibility that the Commission's ruling could lead to similar action in other cities may pose a major threat to radio stations' traditional phone-oriented promotions.

The phone company had contended that the blockages in the phone system had caused a situation, according to the company, where even emergency calls could not be completed. Originally, the phone company had sought a ruling for a 67% completion rate. **Ray Baxter**, Production Manager, Mass Calling for the New York Telephone Company, told **R&R**: "The 67% completion rate is the average for the New York City area. The phone company attempted to bring broadcasters up to the average." Radio

stations, on the other hand, contended that the attempt to institute an arbitrary completion rate, forcing callers to pay for calls and discouraging participation in contests, represented a form of discrimination.

Rate Up For Re-Evaluation

The 24% completion figure represents a "break-even point" for the phone company, whereby the special "choke service" instituted to handle a large volume of calls would pay for itself. The commission, Baxter stated, also "recognized the need for further cost studies" on the part of the phone company, and stipulated that the company could resubmit estimates for a future re-evaluation of the 24% completion rate. The company plans to do so "after the market stabilizes," following the adoption of the new system by area stations, with time allotted to study the system's effect on phone use. Under the 24% ruling, after a contest winner is determined, a minimum of one out of every four callers will, instead of getting the usual busy signal, have their calls answered by a recording device, informing them that a winner has been chosen. The caller will then be charged the regular rate for the call, which in the New York market will also result in a large number of toll charges for callers outside Manhattan exchanges. The recording devices will be supplied by the phone company, with radio stations supplying the messages and paying for the added lines and call directors necessary to maintain the system.

Although certain radio stations have objected to the phone company's charges and rates as discriminatory, according to the company itself the actual costs of the "special call-in service lines" are no higher than individual businesses' message rates, with an added stipulation that a minimum volume of calls be recorded, which should be no problem, Baxter says, for radio stations to "exceed three or four times over."

No Lottery Danger

One potentially dangerous implication of the new ruling was minimized by **Norman Levinthal**, the Washington D.C. attorney who represented the New York radio stations in the hearings. Although at one point speculation had been raised that with callers forced to pay for their calls, the conditions of a lottery (prize, chance, and

now consideration) would be suddenly met, Levinthal emphasized that because the callers would be paying a consideration to an outside party (the phone company), and not the radio station itself, that the lottery issue was not applicable. Also, the minimal amount of cost per call was judged as an insufficient amount of consideration of a lottery, similar to a judgment several years ago noting that postcards were not sufficient consideration.

The radio stations had contended that their callers should not be forced to pay for attempting to win a call-in contest, but the commission recognized participants as an "integral cost-causative cause," and maintained that they had made a conscious decision to participate in the contest, with phone charges being no different in essence than paying for a postcard to mail in while attempting to win a contest. For the phone company, the 24% rate will, they believe, serve as a significant discouraging factor to callers, cutting down the number of repeat call-in attempts; however, Baxter opined that radio call-in contests would not suffer significantly if the prizes remained sufficiently attractive to callers.

The crucial implication of the New York decision is whether it will be adopted as a precedent in other areas. Baxter termed the decision "a viable solution to the mass call-in problem," and was of the opinion that "many people will be looking toward this decision." Similar action by phone companies across the country can be regarded as a definite possibility, with the future of call-in contest promotions appearing to be subject to drastic change and, possibly, curtailment.

Cables Cut At KYSN; Sabotage Suspected

A crucial guy wire in the transmitter of **KYSN/Colorado Springs** was severed October 25, causing the station to go off the air for three hours. According to **KYSN** Program Director **Marc McCoy**, the damage was inflicted by "someone who knew what he was doing." Colorado Springs police are investigating the incident, as well as the FBI.

Broadcast Bureau Calls For Bartell's WMJX License Denial

The FCC's Broadcast Bureau recommended that **Bartell Broadcasting's** application to renew its license for **WMJX/Miami (96X)** be denied. The recommendation came as a result of hearings on alleged distortion and falsification of newscasts by the station as part of two contest promotions. In April 1975, 96x (then **WMYQ**) launched a "Devil's Triangle Trip" contest, followed up by a "Find Greg Austin" promotion, which involved air personality **Austin** traveling to the mystery-shrouded Bermuda Triangle area with listeners asked to pinpoint his location. Apparently, to promote the "Find Austin" contest, 96X broadcast reports of **Austin's** disappearance during regular newscasts.

The Broadcast Bureau concluded that the station had indeed "broadcast false and misleading announcements and falsified the

news" in connection with the contests. It also found that **Bartell** had failed to abide by representations made to the FCC in an earlier letter of January 20, 1975, regarding the broadcast of false, misleading or deceptive matter. In addition, **Bartell** was cited for a rule violation as a result of "negligent supervision" of its employees.

Concluding, the Bureau stated: "Based on its past performance, **Bartell** cannot be expected to exercise due diligence and comply with the commission's policies, let alone its own rules and contests and promotions... Therefore it is concluded that a grant of **Bartell's** application for renewal of license... would not serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity. The application should be denied." An appeal from **Bartell** on the recommendation is expected.

RKO Acquires KBPI-FM/Denver

RKO has purchased Denver's longstanding AOR outlet **KBPI-FM** for approximately \$2.5 million, according to **RKO** Radio President **Dwight Case**. The station's format will remain AOR, representing **RKO's** first foray into the AOR area. "We have no designs on changing it," **Case** told **R&R**. "It matches perfect-

ly with the demographics we're trying to sell."

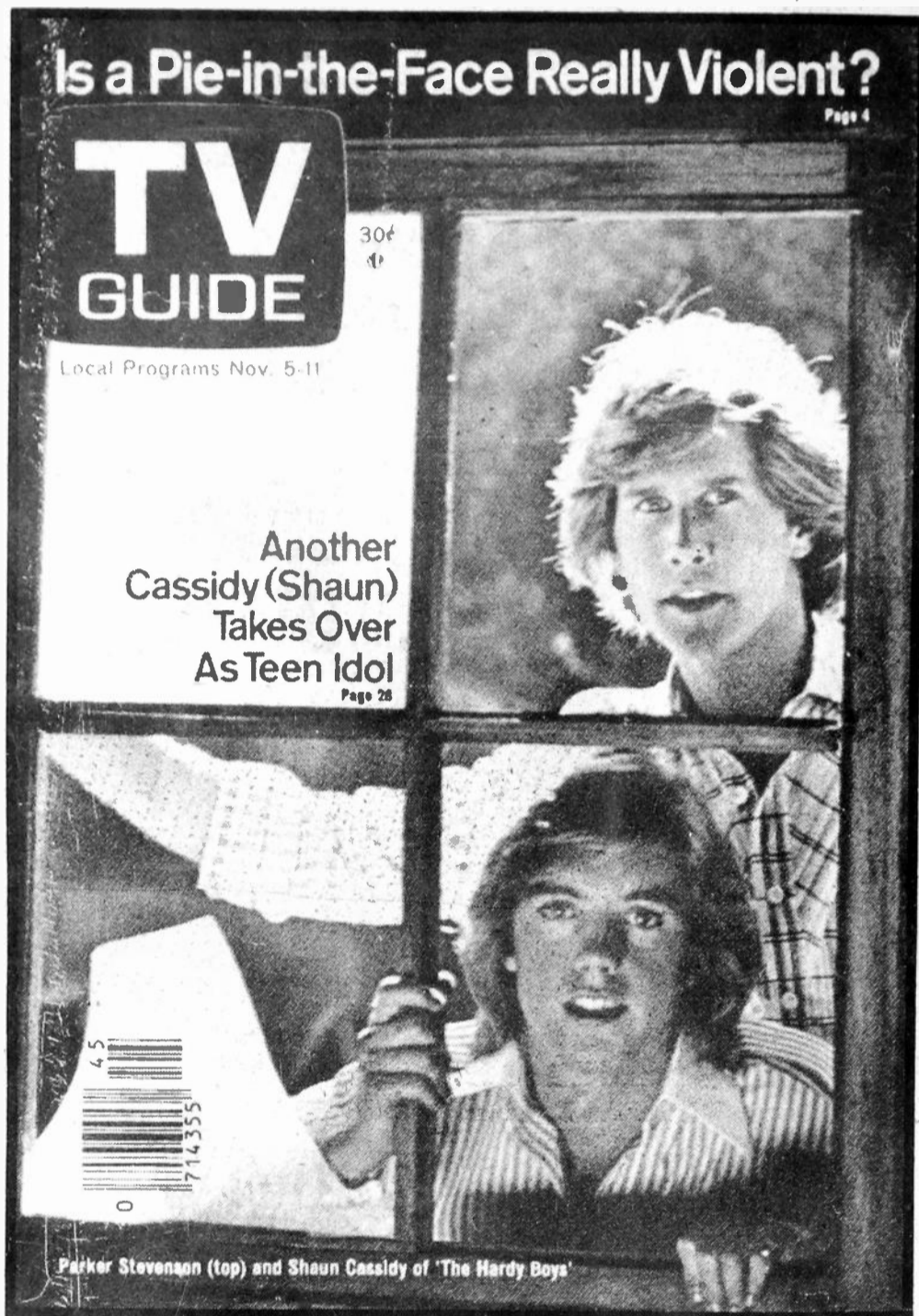
The **KBPI** purchase does not signal an end to **RKO's** expansion. According to **Case**, the new acquisition "still leaves an AM license open, and we're currently looking in four different cities." The sale is subject to FCC approval.

McCoy feels that sabotage is a definite possibility. "We're starting with that basic premise," he told **R&R**. "It's a strange coincidence that it happened in the midst of a rating period." Informal police opinion also indicates some form of sabotage, according to **McCoy**. The station has offered a \$1000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the

perpetrator, with ads running in local newspapers.

KYSN's engineering crew was able to put the station back on the air after three hours via an auxiliary tower. **KYSN** is currently broadcasting on half power pending repair of the main tower within two weeks.

Klein Case Goes To Jury

The income tax evasion trial of former Beatles manager **Allen Klein**, underway since early October, went to the jury for a verdict Thursday (November 3). Klein has been charged with failing to declare over \$220,000 in income from the sales of promotional records in 1970-72.

Recent developments have centered around Klein's former promotion man, **Pete Bennett**, a witness for the prosecution in this case. Bennett testified that Klein had been aware of Bennett's sales of promotional copies of Beatles and other product, and that Klein had received money from the sales.

Bennett has already pleaded guilty to similar tax violations, and his sentencing awaits the outcome of Klein's trial.

A number of prosecution witnesses testified that they had seen either large numbers of promotional records earmarked for Bennett or large amounts of cash allegedly resulting from the sale of the records. **ABCKO** (Klein's company) Vice President **Joel Silver** stated that Bennett had given him cash on approximately a dozen occasions to hold for Klein, with the cash, according to Bennett, coming from promotional record

sales. Silver also stated that he handed the money over to Klein. **Salvatore Vasi**, a musician/personal manager, testified that Bennett had shown him a bag with \$8000-9000 in it, and later had witnessed Bennett giving the bag to Klein at Klein's request.

Last week, Klein denied any knowledge of Bennett's promotional record-selling activities. The defense and prosecution cases wound up this week, with the jury verdict to follow.

Beatles Lead UK Industry Britannia Awards

Two splintered acts, the **Beatles** and **Simon & Garfunkel**, were double winners in the **British Phonographic Industry's** Britannia Awards celebration. The awards, designed to coincide with the Queen's Silver Jubilee, honored outstanding record achievements of the last 25 years, as selected by representatives from British record companies. The Beatles won Best British Pop Group and Best British Pop Album ("Sgt. Pepper"), while Simon & Garfunkel won Best International Pop Single for "Bridge Over Troubled Water" and Best International Pop Album for their LP of the same title, one of the most successful in chart terms in British history.

Other winners included **Cliff Richard** for Best British Solo Artist (Male), **Shirley Bassey** for Best British Solo Artist (Female), and **George Martin** for Best British Record Producer. **Procol Harum's** "Whiter Shade Of Pale" and **Queen's** "Bohemian Rhapsody" tied for Best British Pop Single, while Most Outstanding New British Record-

ing Artist awards were won by **Julie Covington** (of "Rock Follies"

repute) and **Graham Parker**. Closing the program, which featured performances by many of the winners, was a rare, temporary reunion of Paul Simon and Art Garfunkel for one number.

KGFJ Becomes New "Kat" In Town

KGFJ/Los Angeles, longtime Black-formatted mainstay in the market, is undergoing major call letter, identification, and style changes. The station has switched to call letters **KKTT**, but is identified almost universally as "The Kat." A new airstaff has been brought in, and the station has shifted its music emphasis considerably. "We don't have a Top 20 playlist playing over and over," said Program Director **Don Mac**.

The station will also stress greater community involvement. "There's more to it than just playing the hits up on Wilshire Blvd.," Mac told R&R. "We plan to offer a forum for our listeners — access to the airwaves." The station has also equipped a complete mobile studio vehicle capable of broadcasting remotes from any location, and has air personalities out on the streets frequently. The new air lineup is as follows: **Early Allen** from K104/Dallas, 6-10am; **Warren Epps** (WDIA/Memphis), 10-2; **Don Mac**, 2-6; **Deon Jackson** (KLOS/Los Angeles) 6-10pm; **Darcot**, a KGFJ holdover, 10pm-2am; **Tyrone Nelson** (WPDQ/Jacksonville), 2-6am; and **Donnell Boyd** (KOSM/Ontario), weekends.

"We'll be playing more older material, a broader spectrum radio approach, a lot of album cuts, old and new. We found in our audience surveys that the repetition factor was a big turnoff."

KFC Aims For Unified Ad Theme

Kentucky Fried Chicken, switching agencies to Young & Rubicam, is looking to establish its new "It makes you feel good inside" campaign on a national basis to reverse a slight slump. In their nationwide game of chicken, Church's Fried Chicken of San Antonio gained 10% in sales per store, while KFC dropped 5%. KFC hopes that if the new Young & Rubicam campaign proves strong enough, that the company's 900 company-owned stores (represented by McCann-Erickson) will also utilize the same slogan and approach. The new campaign reportedly features an uptempo song sung by a female vocalist with back-up group, with "family-oriented, Americana" visuals. KFC's kiddie-oriented cartoon symbol, Fowler the Fox (subject of an earlier R&R report), although created by KFC's outgoing agency, Leo Burnett U.S.A., will continue to be tested in some markets.

Martin's Silver Hammer

Comedian Steve Martin has been signed to play the role of "the villainous Dr. Maxwell Edison" in the upcoming "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Heart's Club Band" movie, a role which presumably involves a silver hammer and a tendency towards braining innocent passers-by with it. That's assuming that the Beatles tune "Maxwell's Silver Hammer" is the basis for the character in the first place. If not...well, excuse us.

FCC Nominee Opposes Government Censorship

Tyrone Brown, nominated to fill the last remaining FCC vacancy, told the Senate subcommittee reviewing his nomination that he opposed government regulation and censorship of programming content. He stated that public pressure, even in the area of TV violence, would eventually cause broadcasters to respond. He also suggested that a tax incentive could help encourage minority ownership of broadcast facilities. Brown expressed support of the fairness doctrine, but also registered reservations on its effects. He said he had reason to believe that he would be appointed to a full FCC term following the expiration of the term of Benjamin Hooks, the commissioner Brown was nominated to replace.

"Lone Ranger" Remake Makes Grade Hopeful

Sir Lew Grade, the famed British entertainment figure, now has \$100 million committed to a number of films in production, and has announced plans to start a big-budget remake of "The Lone Ranger." The "Ranger" will be "modernized," and will start filming in the summer of 1978. Grade will also make a family-oriented film starring the Muppets, who have risen to phenomenal popularity heights in England.

Burger Chef Goes To "Wars" On Radio

The Burger Chef chain has inaugurated a six-week midwestern radio campaign tied in to a "Star Wars" poster offer. 30 and 60 second radio spots are being used in addition to 30 second TV spots and point-of-sale materials, with commercials featuring "Star Wars" characters coming to a Burger Chef outlet in outer space to collect their posters.

Most Believable Ad Slogan

According to a consumer survey covering 10 well-known major advertising themes, Hallmark Cards' "When you care enough to send the very best" received the highest believability rating. 2531 respondents were asked by R.H. Brunkin Associates of New Jersey to rate the slogans as completely true, partially true, or untrue, with Hallmark's 33-year-old slogan garnering a 62% completely true rating. Hallmark barely edged out Kodak's "Kodak makes your picture count," which notched up a 60%. Lowest of the batch? Beneficial Finance's "You're good for more," which received a 30% completely true rating, with a 31% untrue rating to match it.

Yogurt Shakes Up Radio

The connection between yogurt drinks and disco music may appear to be slight, but the combination is being tested on West Coast radio stations and in newspaper ads. Avoset Foods is marketing "Shake 'n' Drink," a low-fat yogurt fruit drink in four flavors, stressing the need for shaking before drinking because the fruit mixture tends to settle at the bottom. To emphasize this shaking process, the company is using "shake your yogurt" theme with KC & the Sunshine Band-styled music. Avoset plans to break the new drink nationwide in 1978, pending results of the West Coast test.

Station License Revoked

WWLE/Cornwall, N.Y. has had its license revoked by a FCC administrative law judge, for making a number of misrepresentations to the agency. Judge Thomas Fitzpatrick stated that the station had undermined its trust when it filed inaccurate information regarding a transfer of control of the station.

Harte-Hanks Southern Purchase Terms Change

Harte-Hanks Communications has signed a definitive agreement to buy Southern Broadcasting Co., with terms slightly altered from those announced previously in R&R and elsewhere. The total \$57 million price stands, but \$15 million will be paid in cash at closing instead of \$16 million, with the balance to be paid in 10-year 8% notes. The purchase is still subject to Southern shareholders approval.

New Soft Drinks Ready To Pop

Procter & Gamble and Pepsi-Cola are both reportedly readying new soft drinks for test marketing purposes. The P&G brand is particularly interesting, as it supposedly utilizes carbonation at the point of use (presumably like the famous "Fizzies" of the 60's, or using a tea-bag-style arrangement). Pepsi's new entry is called Aspen, and is said to resemble champagne vaguely, and be similar to Pommac, a European soft drink marketed here by Dr. Pepper a decade ago. Reports of the new champagne-styled soft drink led to rumors that Coca-Cola would be developing a new wine-like beverage called "Coke Au Vin," but this seems unlikely.

Bowing to the reader pressure, the youth-oriented Moscow newspaper *Moskovski Komsomolets* has inaugurated three monthly music charts—one for top Soviet songs, one for top foreign tunes, and an album Top 10. As in much of the world, Abba dominated the charts, placing their current U.S. single "Money Money Money" at No. 3 and past hit "SOS" at No. 5, as well as an album at No. 6 in the LP charts. 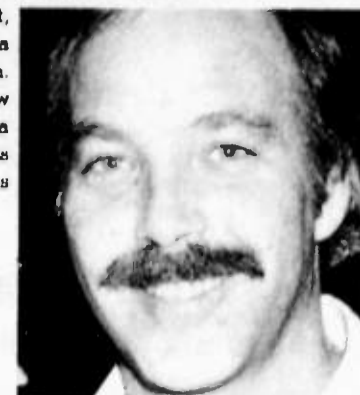
Frisoli New Phonodisc President

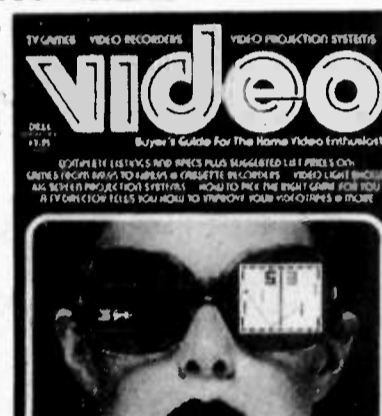


CBS Scores Record Third Quarter, 9 Months Earnings

Paced by the CBS Records Group, CBS set sales and earnings records for both third quarter and nine-month periods in 1977. Net third quarter income was up 7.4% over last year to \$43.8 million, with net sales up almost 25% to \$655.4 million. Nine-month figures showed estimated net income up 14% to \$131.7 million and net sales up 24% to \$1.94 billion. CBS Chairman William S. Paley and President John D. Backe singled out the records group, stating that "earnings growth in the quarter was led by the outstanding performance of the CBS Records Group."

Features include coverage of video games, projection systems, home videocassette recorders, videodisc, and similar items, with item-by-item comparisons (including prices) emphasized. Skynyrd Members Weigh Future Options

R&R has learned that the six surviving members of Lynyrd Skynyrd have not decided definitely to disband. Any future plans must await their recovery from injuries suffered in the October 20 plane crash that took the lives of three group members, including the band's leader, chief songwriter and lead vocalist Ronnie Van Zant. According to MCA Records, however, it is "extremely likely" that the surviving Skynyrd members will record and play again at some point in the future. A trust fund has been set up for Van Zant's two daughters and Steve Gaines' daughter; donations may be sent to the Van Zant/Gaines Memorial Trust Fund, c/o SIR Productions, 130 W. 57th St., New York, NY 10019. In addition, a music scholarship fund on behalf of Steve and Cassie Gaines has been established by Northeastern Oklahoma Arts and Music College, with donations payable to the school's President's Office at Second & I Streets, N.E., Miami, OK 74354.

The sixth and final game of the 1977 World Series was a solid winner in the week's Nielsen sweepstakes, racking up a 33.9 rating with ABC. That network won the week's competition with a 21.1 rating, vanquishing a strong NBC with a score of 19.9 score, with CBS a distant third at 16.9. NBC's showing was in large part due to the success of its "79 Park Avenue" three-part series; Part I fell into last week's ratings period, but Parts II and III finished second and third for the week ending October 23. Following the Series and "79" were 4) ABC's "Charlie's Angels" 5) ABC's World Series pregame show 6) NBC's Saturday Night Movie, "Little Big Man" 7) NBC's "Little House On The Prairie" 8) a tie between two CBS entries, "All In The Family" and "Alice," and 10) ABC's "Barney Miller." Highest rated new series was ABC's "Love Boat" at 23rd, with NBC's "Rosetti & Ryan" finishing last at 65th. New shows debuting during the week were CBS' "Baby I'm Back" pilot, coming in 36th on Saturday, and NBC's revival of "CPO Sharkey," which finished 52nd.

In Arbitron's ratings week ending October 21, the World Series scored a clean sweep in Los Angeles, but surprisingly, the Yankees' victorious final game couldn't win the top spot in New York. That city's viewers gave the nod to NBC's "79 Park Avenue Part II," with the final Series contest finishing second. From there, 3) "Charlie's Angels" 4) a three-way tie between "79 Park Avenue, Part III," ABC's "What's Happening," and Game 5 of the World Series 7) Game 4 of the Series 8) ABC's "Welcome Back Kotter" and CBS' sole Top 10 entry, "All In The Family" tied, and 10) "Barney Miller" and "Love Boat."

In Los Angeles, Game 4 of the Series topped the ratings by a healthy margin, with Games 5 and then 6 following. Next, 4) ABC's Sunday Night Movie "White Line Fever" 5) "Barney Miller" 6) a four-way dead heat between "All In The Family" (again CBS' sole Top 10 contestant), ABC's Monday Night Football, "79 Park Avenue, Part III," and "What's Happening" 10) matched "Charlie's Angels," ABC's "Starsky & Hutch," and "Kotter."

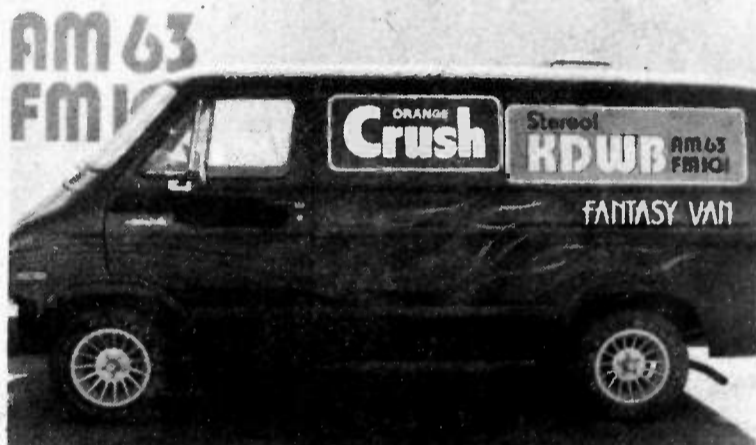

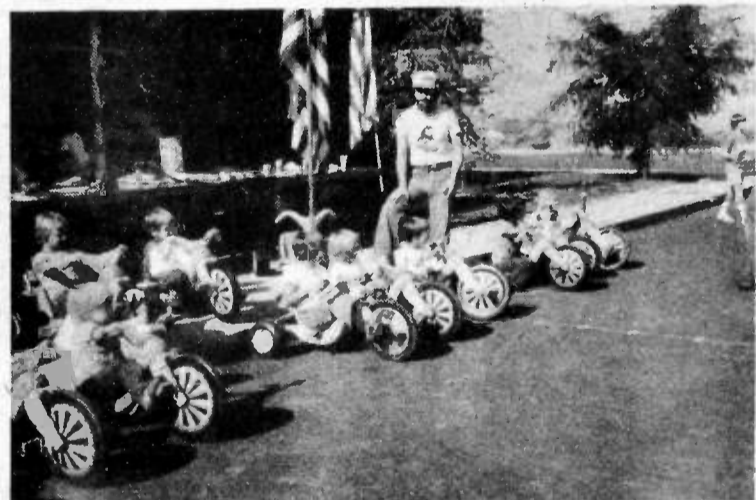

The songs are thematically tied to places and happenings in the local community. The announcement of the settlement failed to mention the dollar amount involved. KGB has just released its fifth Homegrown album which also features cover art submitted by listeners, and the station expects to sell-out all 60,000 albums produced by Christmas. Proceeds of the album sale, as with past editions, go to the United Way. The concept of the Homegrown album began a few years back at KGB under the Program Directorship of **Ron Jacobs** (now in Hawaii). The station claims rights to the concept. It is advisable for any stations interested in doing similar promotions to contact KGB officials and check details...

Congratulations to **DIR President Bob Meyrowitz**, Exec VP **Peter Kauff**, and fine company upon the superb publicity, excitement, and momentum being built up in anticipation of the forthcoming **North American Rock Radio Awards** which will air as a two-hour special on Thanksgiving (11-24) on 258 participating stations (mostly AOR) throughout the United States and Canada. Latest developments include the selection of **Grace Slick**, lead singer of the **Jefferson Starship**, and **Mike Harrison**, this old editor, as co-hosts, with the show being scripted by **Ben Fong-Torres**, Senior Editor of **Rolling Stone**. Nine awards are to be given out, with the award itself being a **Tiffany** designed **Baccarat** crystal replica of Cleopatra's needle, valued at about \$500. Nicknamed the "Crystal," it recalls the earliest sets in which the crystal was the critical component...

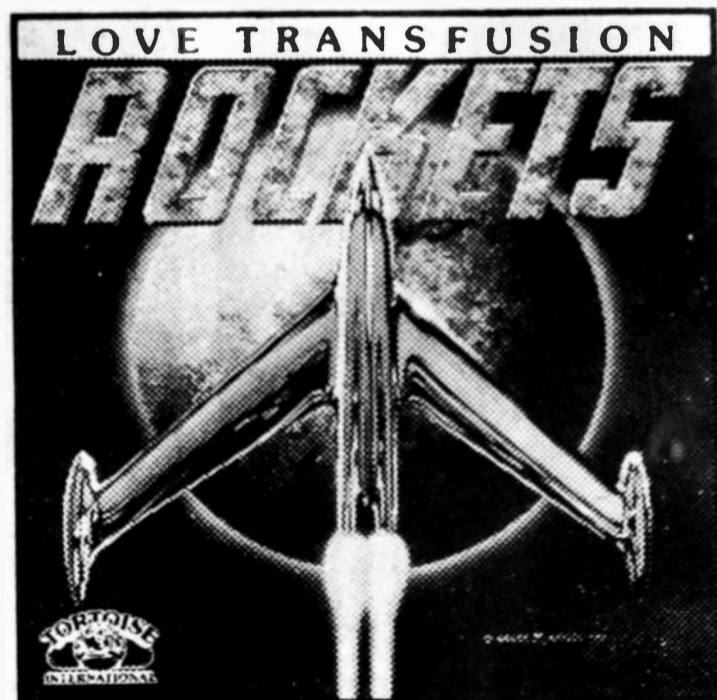

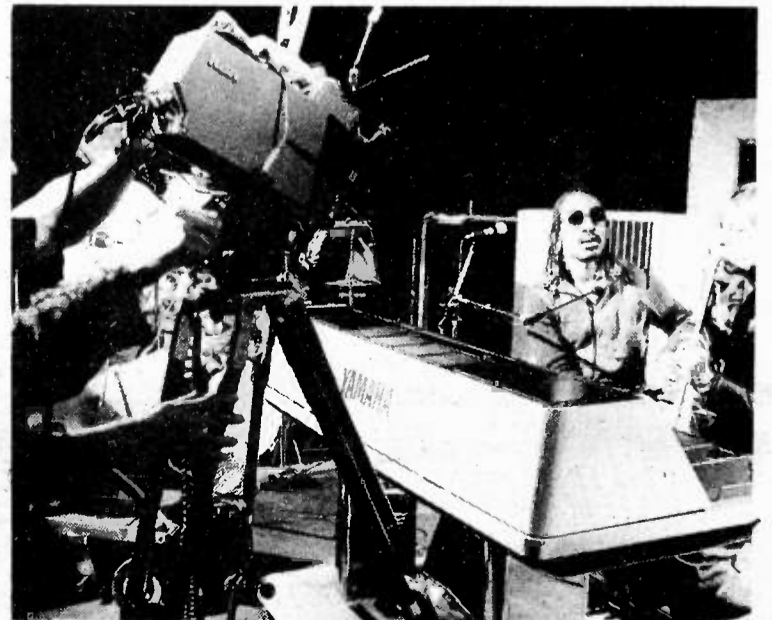

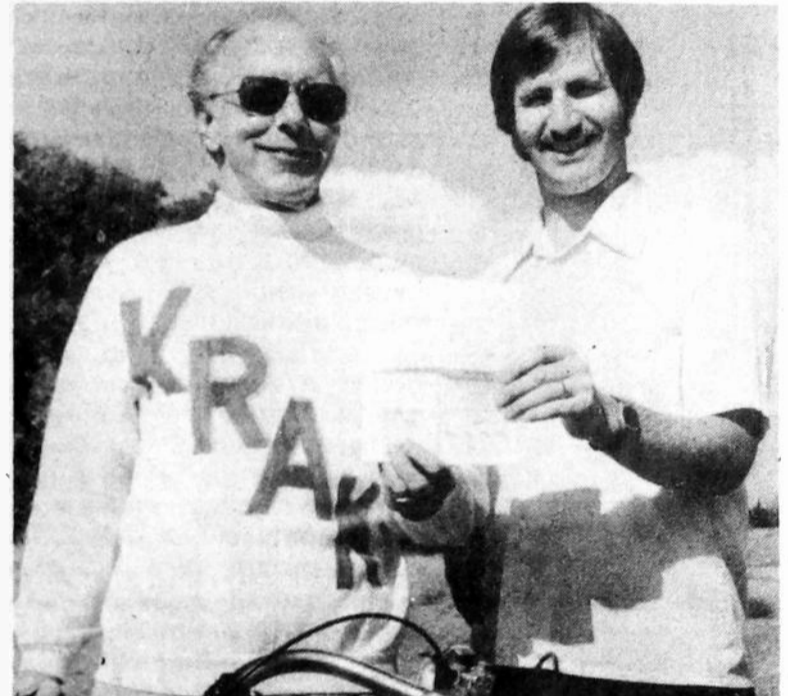
