## WRCX And WBCN Lead 1996 Airplay Monitor Radio Awards Rock Nominations

The nominations are in, and the 1996 Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Awards ballot has been unveiled, with mainstream rock outlet WRCX Chicago and modern WBCN Boston leading their respective panels in number of nominations. Each station is in the running for six awards. KLBJ Austin, Texas, is right behind WRCX in the album competition with five nominations.

WRCX is up for major-market mainstream station of the year, with PD Dave Richards and MD Jo Robinson in the major-market PD and MD of the year races. Natalie DiPietro was recognized with a nomination for promotion/marketing director of the year, and two WRCX air talents, Lou Brutus and Mancow Muller, are vying against each other for major-market mainstream rock local air personality of the year.

KLBJ earned nominations in the small-market mainstream station of the year category. Jeff Carrol and Loris Lowe are up for awards in small-mar-

ket mainstream rock PD and MD of the year awards, with Brian Billeck earning a mainstream rock promotion/marketing director of the year nomination. The station's Dudley and Bob with Debra morning-show team is up for small-market mainstream rock local air personality of the year honors.

In modern rock, which, like triple-A, has its own category for the first time this year, WBCN hopes to harvest awards in such categories as major-market radio station of the year, major-market PD of the year (Oedipus), major-market MD of the year (Carter Alan), promotion/marketing director of the year (Larry "Chachi" Loprete). It also has two talents in the running for major-market modern rock local air personality of the year (Bradley Jay and Mark Parenteau).

### GREAT JOB, G'BYE NOW

Radio being radio, a number of nominees are no longer holding the job for which they were recognized, most notably programmers Steve

### Stern Origins; 96X, WNOR Fracas Alleged

A new book by New York Newsday's Paul Colford, "Howard Stern: King Of All Media," claims the shock jock earned \$12.5 million in '95. Colford also claims that modern KITS San Francisco a.m. driver Alex Bennett and WOR New York p.m. driver Bob Grant were Stern's main influences, adding that while at WCCC Hartford, Conn., Stern used to listen to tapes of Steve Dahl on WLUP Chicago. Hal "Lich" Lichenbaum, who worked with Stern at WCCC, is quoted as saying, "[Stern] didn't say much about them, but looking back you can tell that Dahl was the catalyst for what Howard later ended up doing. I know Howard would never admit that but he took what Steve Dahl was doing... to the next dimension."

Modern WROX (96X) Norfolk, Va., issued a press release July 1 claiming that crosstown album WNOR PD Harvey Kojan and promotion assistant William Fiveash "attacked" three staffers last weekend. 96X claims the incident took place in a Kmart parking lot at a WNOR event, during which Kojan allegedly "fractured" 96X staffer Teresa Paluszak's wrist. At press time, officer Lou Thurston of the Virginia Beach, Va., police said a warrant had been issued for Kojan regarding an assault on 96X overnighter Bill Russ and for Fiveash for an assault on 96X staffer Tammy McClanahan. A warrant regarding Paluszak's complaint was "in the system" but was not public at press time. Thurston stressed that these warrants may only request that Kojan and Fiveash appear in court and not be arrest warrants. WROX PD Perry Stone claims that what started as "playful radio warfare" got out of hand, and accuses Kojan of going "ballistic" on Paluszak, who was handing out 96X stickers at the event. Stone confirmed that Paluszak, McClanahan, and Russ have filed charges against Kojan and Fiveash. WNOR GM Jeff Scarpelli says, "No attack took place... this sounds like a radio stunt to me." At press time, Kojan was at the hospital with his wife, who was giving birth. Stone says some WNOR listeners have been lined up as witnesses, adding, "It won't be a radio stunt when it's proven in court."

SFX has closed on a number of deals this week, including the 19-station acquisition of Liberty, which includes modern WHFS Washington, D.C., album WBAB Long Island, N.Y., Hartford's album WHCN and modern WMRQ, and album WHJY Providence, R.I. The deal is valued at \$227 million and was followed immediately by a swap with Chancellor Broadcasting, giving SFX WAPE/WFYV Jacksonville, Fla., plus \$11 million cash, for AC/rock combo WBLI/WBAB/WHFM/WGBB Long Island, which could lead to sister WHTZ (Z100) New York being simulcast on Long Island's East End. SFX also acquired album WRDU Raleigh, N.C., from HMW and crosstown classic rock WZZU from Prism Radio Partners. The \$14 million purchase of WROQ Greenville, S.C., from ABS also closed this week.

Evergreen moves WLUP GM Larry Wert to its new senior VP post. His duties include Evergreen's syndication wing and top 40/adult WKQI (Q95.5) Detroit. In that slot, Wert will replace GM John Fullam, who's headed to WKTU New York. Meanwhile, Q95.5 morning/WLUP afternoon jock Danny Bonaduce will relocate to Detroit in August. Bonaduce will continue in afternoons for WLUP through the miracle of ISDN. After nearly three years of FM talk, WLUP has announced that it will re-add music outside morning drive.

Modern WBBX Bangor, Maine, PD Tim Schiavelli returns to modern WBRU Providence, R.I., as PD. Schiavelli had been

WBRU MD until last June, when he left to flip WWBX from country to modern. Interim PD and former MD Stephanie Hindley exits. Afternoon jock Matt Maloney is named MD, with Big John London replacing Maloney in afternoons.

Nearly two months after the departure of album WDRK/top 40 WPFM Panama City, Fla., OM/WDRK morning man Brian Christopher, WDRK PD/afternoon driver Addison Wakeford officially takes over the rechristened "Addison & Bubba" morning show. Wakeford is now also OM for both stations. Night jock Big Woody takes afternoons, with Zak flipping to nights from overnights and part-timer Dan the Midnight Man now holding the overnight shift.

Triple-A WRNR Baltimore morning man Michael Buckley opts for P/T work to allow him to concentrate on managing the music department at a local Border's Books & Music. PD Sean O'Mealy drops afternoons for mornings, with former crosstown WGRX morning man Steve Greenbaum joining for afternoons.

Alan Cook, Mary Reilly, and Bob Brady are now official as the morning hosts of classic hits KHTC Phoenix. The team was formed when middayer Cook joined newswoman Reilly and morning producer Brady. The latter two both up their presence in the morning mix, with local TV sportscaster Vic Lombardi added to the show.

Former modern WLUM Milwaukee promotion director Aaron Roberts is named PD/afternoon driver at album WTAO Carbondale, Ill. That sends interim PD Paxton Guy back to the promotion director role and afternoon host Paul Laurent back to his overnight gig.

Classic rock CFPL London, Ontario, PD Greg Diamond is named PD at album CFBR Edmonton, Alberta.

Modern WNTX Kalamazoo, Mich., names p.m. driver Bill Walters PD, replacing David Perry.

Lee Abrams' new consultancy inks Champion Broadcasting, album WMMR Philadelphia, and classic rock KZPS Dallas. At WMMR and KZPS, Abrams says, his job is to "fine tune" the stations; no major changes are planned. Abrams will "design" programming for several Champion stations and continue to work with ABC's 24-hour formats.

Album WCMF Rochester, N.Y., night jock Rich "the Bull" Gaenzler is named morning producer, with swing jock Marc Cronin in the night shift. The station hires James Justice and comic/magician Penn Jillette as the station voices.

Michael Bratton relinquishes his production director title with modern KTBZ Houston for the same duties at modern KEDJ Phoenix.

Album WWDC (DC101) Washington, D.C., P/T Rick Shockey replaces production director Bill O'Brien, who exits. Voice of America announcer Dave Zyck joins WWDC for P/T. Meanwhile, PD Dave Brown is accepting T&Rs for recently exited overnighter Leslie White's shift.

Top 40/adult WRQX (Mix 107.3) Washington, D.C., P/T and swing-shifter Francis Rose adds middays at album WQCM Hagerstown, Md., replacing Doug Jackson, who remains as P/T... Mary Alice Whinton exits P/T at album KEGF Dallas to join KATS Yakima, Wash., in nights.

Top 40 KCPI Albert Lea, Minn.'s Vito Gee, PD/mornings, is now album WWCT Peoria, Ill.'s production director... WZZR Williamsport, Pa., P/T Toni Petrovia is now P/T at WZZO Allentown, Pa.... Modern WXEG (the Edge) Dayton, Ohio, names P/T John "the New Guy" overnight host.

### Q104.3 Goes Classic; WNEW Goes Young

The stage has been set this week for a classic rock showdown in New York, with a new classic rock format at WAXQ and a new PD at classic-leaning heritage rocker WNEW-FM.

Immediately after LMAing "Pure Rock" WAXQ (Q104.3) New York July 1, Viacom flipped the 2½-year-old rocker to "the new home of classic rock." GM Randy Bongarten, PD Ron Valeri, and MD Vinny Marino are out, as is most of the former WAXQ air staff. George Wolfson, formerly GM of sister AC WLTW (Lite FM), adds Q104.3 GM duties, and WLTW PD Kurt Johnson moves in as PD. Wolfson says the station will stage a "major campaign" to promote its new format.

Across town at WNEW, former KISW Seattle PD Steve Young was named OM. WNEW GM Kevin Smith has hinted that the station is headed in a heritage-driven direction, although at press time, WNEW—which has been increasingly gold-based in recent months—has not begun using the phrase "classic rock" on the air.

Q104.3's hard-rocking format ended at midnight July 1 with Metallica's "Fade To Black." New morning host Donna Donna, one of two Q104.3 jocks who made the cut, kicked off the Arrowesque classic rock format, followed by former WNEW New York staffer Matt DeVoti in the 9 a.m.-noon shift; Maria Milito from modern rival WXRK (K-Rock), noon-4 p.m.; Kenny King, a.m. driver from Viacom's jazz/AC WJZW Washington, D.C., in p.m. drive; and WLTW P/T Karen Carson in nights. Over-

nights remain open. Julie Slater, the other Q104.3 jock who made the cut, stays on for weekends.

Here's the 11 a.m. hour on Q104.3 from July 1: Pablo Cruise, "Whatcha Gonna Do"; Lynyrd Skynyrd, "Sweet Home Alabama"; Peter Gabriel, "Sledgehammer"; Spencer Davis Group, "Gimme Some Lovin'"; Blondie, "One Way Or Another"; Doobie Brothers, "Take Me In Your Arms (Rock Me A Little While)"; ELO, "Do Ya"; Bruce Springsteen, "Tenth Avenue Freeze-Out"; Outfield, "Your Love"; Joe Walsh, "Life's Been Good"; BTO, "You Ain't Seen Nothin' Yet"; Rolling Stones, "Ain't Too Proud To Beg"; and Billy Joel, "It's Still Rock And Roll To Me."

#### ANALYZE AND STRATEGIZE

On hiring Young, WNEW's Smith said, "I needed someone to strategize and make sure that WNEW is delivering to the needs of its listeners in the rock vein." Smith credited Young's years with Joint Communications and his track record of "being No. 1 in his target demo in Seattle in 22 of the last 23 books."

Here's the 1 p.m. hour on WNEW from July 1: Lynyrd Skynyrd, "Sweet Home Alabama"; Dave Matthews Band, "Too Much"; Rolling Stones, "She's A Rainbow"; Police, "Spirits In The Material World"; Bruce Springsteen, "No Surrender"; Led Zeppelin, "All My Love"; Smashing Pumpkins, "Tonight, Tonight"; Elvis Costello, "The Angels Wanna Wear My Red Shoes"; Tom Petty, "You Don't Know How It Feels"; and Who, "Going Mobile."

### Chiappetta Moves To Mercury; Witzig To Net

Mercury Records hires Christine Chiappetta as national manager of modern rock promotion, West Coast. Chiappetta had been music editor at Virtually Alternative magazine. She replaces Jeremy Brown, who now heads promotion at Moonshine Music.

David Witzig is named VP of the NetRadio Music Group, a live, 24-hour-a-day, Internet-only

radio network. Witzig had been regional director of sales and marketing for EMI Music Distribution. NetRadio, which debuted Nov. 1, has five radio formats.

Warner Bros. hires Linda Walsh and Howard Frank for local promotion rep spots. Walsh fills the New York spot vacated by Al Carolanza, who is now the label's Miami-based local rep. Frank takes the Charlotte, N.C.-based Carolinas spot.

### Soft Modern: Dawn Of The Living Dead?

Everything is cyclical, and the fact that some stations are being drawn to modern AC like moths to a flame is proof. The pendulum that was set in motion by punk's revolt against soft rock is swinging back. It's my civic duty to refresh everyone's memory on some of the tunes that made the mid-'70s the vast radio wasteland it was.

Morris Albert's "Feelings" is an example of the stuff that created an entire generation of serial killers and other dysfunctional adults. More frightening than ol' Mo were such bands as Jigsaw ("Sky High"), whose members dressed to look like rock stars. How about America? Gary Wright? Paper Lace? That stuff was downright subversive. It rotted the minds and musical sensibilities of millions.

Fast forward to today. What is truly modern rock, and what is on the verge of being the next Bread? Let me throw some names at you: Gin Blossoms, dog's eye view, Jars Of Clay, Dishwalla, and Deep Blue Something. History repeating itself? It's only a matter of time before someone walks up to me and says, "Keep on

truckin'." Stop the madness!

Let's move away from the return to soft rock and to something we all care about—David Lee Roth and Van Halen reunited. Definitely a sign of the cyclical nature of rock.

When Sammy Hagar joined VH 10 years ago, it was a sign of things swinging in a serious direction. Sammy gave the band a corporate, very '80s Wall Street vibe, where Roth was all show biz. I blamed it all on Reagan. While many of the folks with whom I debated this point actually liked Van Hagar; that's not a question in my mind which VH rules.

Sure, Sammy spent more time than Dave in the band, and they've cranked out the platinum discs all right. But quick, name three VH songs with Sammy and three with Dave. I'll wait.

See what I mean? "Panama," "Hot For Teacher," "Beautiful Girls." Easy. Now for Sammy: "Dreams," "Finish What Ya Started," and that other one.

Sammy vs. Dave is kind of like the DII rule in baseball. You either think its great or sacrilegious.

## Mainstream Down, Modern, Classic Up In First Airplay Monitor/M Street Format Tally

Country radio has lost stations in the past year, but not as many as you might think and not nearly as many as AC, according to information from industry data-provider The M Street Journal. Mainstream and rhythmic top 40 continue to lose outlets, but adult top 40 is growing nicely. Mainstream R&B has lost stations, but R&B adult and R&B oldies formats have picked up the slack.

Airplay Monitor's exclusive new feature, The M Street Format Monitor, will show the fluctuations in radio's major formats from month to month. The list will appear in each month's first issue. This month's Format Monitor will show only station counts for June '96 vs. those from a year earlier.

Country radio, which remains, handily, the most programmed commercial format in the country, lost a net total of 20 stations in the past year—less than one might expect, given the consolidation that's taken place in some of that format's second and

third outlets recently. Mainstream AC, by contrast, lost a total of 118 stations in the past year, some of which were compensated for by the growth of the top 40/adult format, which was up by 42 stations. The bulk of those outlets probably came from AC and top 40, which lost 25 outlets in the past year. Soft AC stations, which are combined for the purpose of this feature with easy listening, were down by 34 outlets.

Big gainers in the past year were news/talk stations, which continue to grow through the greater availability of syndicated programming, and modern rock, which, despite a gain of 50 stations in the past year—nearly one a week—remains the 18th-most-programmed format nationally. Classic rock, despite allegations of its demise, actually jumps 12-10 this year on the basis of 41 new stations, most of them classic hits stations (some of which evolved from '70s oldies outlets). Spanish-language radio, in addition to its highly publicized ratings gains of the past year, is up 9-7, with 30 new outlets.

### From New York City To 'Surf' City

Why does **Matthew Caws**, guitarist/singer/songwriter in **Nada Surf**, love New York? "You can hear a record and fall in love with it, and chances are, within three or four months, that band will be playing near you. Everyone plays [New York]. I feel like I'm so lucky... Until the other night in Harrisburg, Pa., I don't think I'd ever seen a cover band in my whole life."

For bands, New York can be downright Darwinian. Caws says, "Rehearsal space is really expensive. You're not riding around in cars, you're trudging through the slush [and taking] the train everyday. There are lots of clubs, but no one goes to them. There's no reward, there's no dessert, it's all work. So, I sort of feel like when bands from New York get to the rehearsal space, the music has to be a little more urgent to make it worth it. There's just more tension, more to take out."

That can be discouraging at times. "I had been in a band that was very career [oriented]. It was taking all the fun out of it. So, I totally gave it up," he recalls. Well, not totally. Caws got a job as an editor for *Guitar World* magazine; playing in a band took on a smaller role. "It was always about just going and practicing. It was its own reward." Ironically, the less-driven version of the band started to attract a following. "For this band, our friends came back more often." Caws and bass player **Daniel Lorca** "knew something had changed. We used to sort of beg. Some people would come, some wouldn't, but this time, everyone would come and come back again and again."

That included major-label reps.

Elektra signed the band and released its breakthrough single, "Popular." On tour, Caws notices people with "a funny look on their face" when they play the song, a montage of quotes from '60s etiquette books. One quote suggests that adolescents restrict dating to one month in an effort to improve social skills. "I think people who were popular will hear it a certain way, and people who were more of outcasts will hear it another way," says Caws. "My high school experience was really mixed. One year I'd be part

of the accepted crowd, and then another year, I was completely outcast." The son of a French professor, the teenage Caws attended an unusual high school in Manhattan, N.Y., for French students. "It's not like I wrote [that song] because I had some horrible high school experience and I want to wreak my revenge on people. It's more that I'm fascinated with the pack mentality, the mob mentality. At that age, actually any age, people are waging little wars. Early on, it's popularity, then in your late teens, it's more of a sexual thing, and then later, it's the power of money. I really think the pack mentality is the root of everything."

Young at album KISW Seattle (now OM at WNEW New York) and John Gorman at modern WMMS Cleveland. Each left their stations when new owners came on board. Butthole Surfers singer Gibby Haynes left his small-market modern rock local air personality of the year-nominated shift at KROX Austin before he had the chance to play the band's No. 1 modern hit, "Pepper."

Stations, too, have found the duopoly age impacting their formats, despite ratings success. So, if they win, MD of the year nominees Booker Madison and Steve Robinson will have to pick up their awards in honor of their "late" modern rock outlets, WNRQ Pittsburgh and WJRR Orlando, Fla., respectively.

### YOUNG TURKS

On the other end of the station life-cycle spectrum, at least five modern stations have found themselves on the ballot during their first full year



of operation. WEND (the End) Charlotte, N.C., and KROX Austin are each up for three awards. WNVE (the Nerve) Rochester, N.Y., WPLA (the Planet) Jacksonville, Fla., and WEJE (the Edge) Fort Wayne, Ind., are each up for two.

The first-ever triple-A nominations were also dominated by a handful of stations. KGSR Austin, KSCA Los Angeles, WVRV (the River) St. Louis, and WXRT Chicago are each nominated in all three of the format's award categories—station of the year, PD of the year, and MD of the year. KMTT (the Mountain) Seattle is nominated in both the PD and MD categories.

### REPEAT CONTENDERS

Several broadcasters are up for awards in multiple categories. Syndicated morning personality Howard Stern got three nominations: nationally syndicated air personality of the year and both the mainstream and modern rock network/syndicated program of the year.

While Stern may be as popular as some rock stars, some rock stars are trying their hands at air work, such as Haynes and veteran rock instru-



mentalist/writer/producer/performer Todd Rundgren. The Rundgren-hosted U.S. Radio Networks program "The Difference" is, in fact, competing against Stern for the network/syndicated program of the year distinction in mainstream and modern rock formats.

Other multinominees include mainstream WIZN Burlington, Vt., PD Steve Cormier, who is

ying for small-market mainstream PD of the year and small-market mainstream local air personality of the year. Album WAQX (95X) Syracuse, N.Y.'s Dave Frisina is in the running in the small-market mainstream MD of the year and local air personality of the year categories. Matt Vaughan of KNCN Corpus Christi, Texas, is competing with Frisina in the same two categories. Modern KNNC Austin PD Mike Peer is nominated for that format's small-market PD and local air personality of the year.

### THE BIG PICTURE

When nominations for all formats (AC, country, R&B, top 40) are factored in with the rock categories, radio in Chicago collects the most nominations (19), with New York (17), Boston (12), Atlanta (10), and St. Louis (10) rounding out the most-nominated major markets.

In medium-market categories, Milwaukee radio was frontrunner with 15 nominations, followed by Tampa, Fla.'s 11, Charlotte and Rochester with 10 each, and Orlando and Providence, R.I., with eight each.

Austin stations are up for 17 awards, pacing the small markets in front of Wilkes-Barre, Pa.'s nine nominations and Chattanooga, Tenn.'s seven.

Looking at owners, Evergreen pulled 26 nominations from various formats, with 10 nominations going to the company's stations in Chicago alone. Aside from the aforementioned WRCX's six nominations, R&B WEJM and R&B/adult



WVAZ each got two. Clear Channel, Infinity/CBS, Jacor, Nationwide, and SFX stations brought each of those owners at least 20 nominations. In Rochester, ARS is bringing in 10 nominations: five for top 40 WPXY, three to album WCMF, and two from modern WNVE. (All ownership data is based on who owned or was in the process of acquiring various stations as of June 26.)

In the consultant contest, two of the Pollack Media Group's minds, Tommy Hedges and Pat Welch, are up for mainstream rock radio consultant of the year. Jacobs Media is recognized in both mainstream and modern categories for the work of Fred Jacobs and Tom Calderone, respectively.

A final ballot listing nominees in every category and format is included with this issue and will also appear in all domestic copies of the July 13 Billboard. It can be filled out and returned in the attached envelope no later than Aug. 4. Awards will be handed out Sept. 7 as the culmination of the Billboard/Airplay Monitor Radio Seminar, scheduled for Sept. 5-7 at the New York Sheraton. Winners will not be notified in advance.

The 1996 awards cover the period of May 1995 to May 1996. Stations in the top 20 Arbitron markets are eligible for the major-market awards. Markets 21-50 are considered medium for the purposes of these awards. The remaining stations are counted in the small-market category.

## ROCK GODZ

### Bryan No Longer Jonesing To Play New Music, Thanks To WHTG

When T.J. Bryan moved from the MD slot at album WDHA Dover, N.J., to the PD role at modern WHTG Asbury Park, N.J., the change seemed natural.

Bryan, who began his radio career at age 15, says WHTG is "a station I grew up listening to, and to come here and program it is a tremendous opportunity. It's a chance to get PD stripes, which wasn't going to happen staying at WDHA."

He adds that it was difficult "working at a classic-leaning album station and jonesing to play 90% new music . . . It was always the classic PD vs. MD struggle. It was definitely stifling. Being here and calling the shots, it's fun to be able to get all this new music on and champion bands . . . Despite the [top 40] mentality of a lot of modern stations, this station still tries to

break a lot of acts."

Inheriting the mantle of such formidable former PDs as Matt Pinfield (now with MTV), Mike Marrone (Rykodisc), and Mike Boyle (FMQB), Bryan has some tough acts to follow. Especially when it comes to maintaining the station's heritage as musically adventurous.

"WHTG was one of the first alternative stations, and there's a lot of weight behind that," says Bryan. "The heritage is what sets us apart from [modern WXRK (K-Rock) New York] and [WHTZ (Z100) New York]. Sure, we're sharing a lot of the same artists—Butthole Surfers, Everclear, Porno For Pyros—but as far as library goes, we're the only station where you're going to hear the Replacements, the Wonder Stuff, Dramarama, and the Pixies. Stuff that people who have listened to the station for years heard here first and have come to expect to hear from the station. It still gets good response."

Once on site, Bryan rearranged the station's music clocks. "Unfortunately, with a list of 65 [currents] a lot of the stuff just wasn't getting played enough for the audience to know what it was." Now, Bryan says, with the changes, most currents receive at least 10 spins a week. The PD also weeded out some moldy oldies from the station's library. "You do have to evolve, he says, "and there was stuff in there that didn't fit anymore. As cool as it may be to play 'Dumbwaiters' by the Psychedelic Furs, who knows it or cares about it at this point?"

Other tracks, such as Dramarama's "Anything, Anything," which the PD says was "voted the No. 1 song of all time" by the station's listeners, stayed. "[It's] a core band for this radio station."

Here's a recent 1 p.m. hour on WHTG:

Pearl Jam, "Daughter"; Pete Drobe, "Mr. Jade"; Little John, "Shoelace"; Dinosaur Jr., "Feel the Pain"; Refreshments, "Banditos"; Nada Surf, "Popular"; Jane's Addiction, "Mountain Song"; Garbage, "Stupid Girl"; Everclear, "Heartspark Dollarsign"; Squeeze, "This Summer"; Tribe, "Red Rover"; Cure, "Close To Me"; Semisonic, "Down In Flames"; and Jawbox, "Mirrorful."

With literally no promotion budget, "trying to come up with creative promotions has been the biggest challenge." But Bryan says the record industry has been supportive, because "this is a station with an active audience. We play records, and we sell records."

On July 5, WHTG will present Surfstock 3, featuring the Connells, Soul Cotching, Pete Drobe, and Dramarama's John Easdale. It may be an offbeat lineup, but it is one that fits in with WHTG's image. Bryan explains, "When you're competing with Weenie Roasts, Endfests, and HFStivals, it's kind of hard to get all the big name bands out there. But I think, true to the spirit of the station, we have a tremendous lineup that the audience knows." He adds that Surfstock 3 may not be the biggest show of the year, "but it's certainly one of the hippest."

Despite New Jersey's reputation as the state that keeps New York and Pennsylvania from falling into the ocean, it's home to an active music scene. Asbury Park and New Brunswick are two areas in which there's a lot of activity within WHTG's reach.

The station has received many accolades from local music papers for its commitment to local music, Bryan says. "At the annual Asbury Music Awards . . . we were named radio station of the year. We're very excited to be part of the local scene."

Bryan recently put out the call for part-timers to augment his regular air staff. "This station has always been a springboard." Therefore, Bryan is looking for jocks who are "excited about the music with some kind of talent I can mold. I don't want this to sound like a college station. I want to have some sort of professionalism to it. But still have the hip factor of people who are into the music [and into] the scene."

Bryan believes that liner-card jocks wouldn't cut it with the station's "hip" audience. "[They] wouldn't settle for someone presenting the music to them who isn't into it also."

How does the PD keep a staff motivated without paying out elephant dollars? "Free CDs and concert tickets, and I buy them pizza once in a while." Seriously, Bryan adds, "I think people do this not so much for the money but for the love of the music and to be on the radio and expose it. That's why anyone gets into radio to begin with, the love of the medium and the music, not so much for the cash. Although that's always a nice benefit."

One of the benefits of working at WHTG—especially now, during post-telecom Act fever—is that it's unlikely the station will be sold. "Faye Gade, who owns the station, has turned down several offers for big, big bucks. This station's been here under the same ownership since the beginning."

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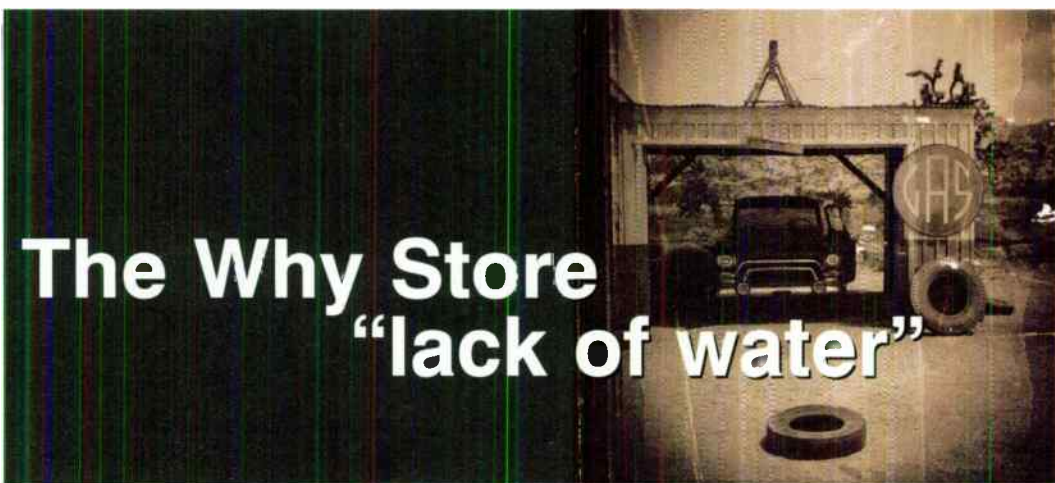

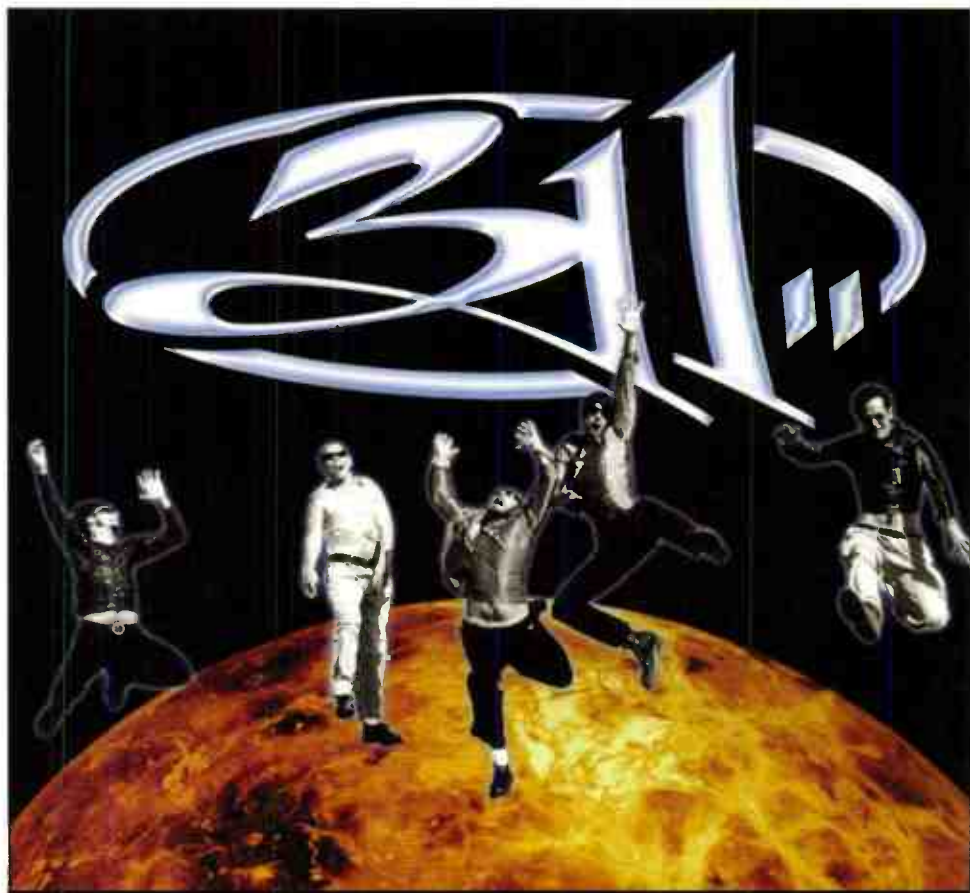
