HARRY POLACK WILL ASSUME MANAGEMENT OF WORLD AT HOME

Amalgamation of Interests by Clyde and Polack

Former Will Devote Attention to Other Business

Irving J. Polack to Handle the Twenty Big Shows

Chicago, Feb. 15.—An announcement of great importance to the outdoor show world was made today by Messrs. James T. Clark, Harry R. Polack and Irving J. Polack, of the amalgamation of the World at Home Shows and the Polack Brothers' Twenty Big Shows, whereby Harry R. Polack assumes the management and control of the World at Home Shows by the middle of 1924 and Irving J. Polack will take over the management of the Polack Brothers' Twenty Big Shows, such show traveling separately.

A complete announcement, including full plans and blue-prints for the two shows, will be given in the next issue of The Billboard.

In a personal interview James T. Clark made the following statement: "For reasons of the growth of the World at Home Shows I resigned my personal attention during the past season."

COURT'S RULING IS HARD BLOW TO THE TICKET SPECULATORS

Two Fined for Soliciting Patrons of N. Y. Hipp.

Jail Sentence Pronounced for Second Conviction

Expected This Will End Invasion of Speculators' Law

New York, Feb. 15.—Two ticket speculators were fined in the Fifth-street Street Court yesterday by Justice Weeks for soliciting patronage in front of the Hippodrome. In proceeding against them, the court said a conviction would mean a workhouse sentence.

The speculators were not actually selling tickets when arrested Thursday and Justice Weeks' ruling is believed to bring about a cessation of the practice by curtailing the speculator's law. Previously it was a conviction it was necessary to actually produce the seat coupons which the speculators were trying to sell on the sidewalk.

To avoid conviction those ticket vendors have been engaging some third parties near the station, where the tickets were actually sold, who actually stood near the theater entrance, drawing their prospective patron to the headquarters of their speculators.

This practice has been going on at the Hippodrome all year. Thursday when a half dozen of these collectors appeared Inspector Morris was expected to and he decided two were defective from his agent, who arrested one of the speculators and seized a quantity of absentee tickets and violating pedestrian tickets. When he they were not actually selling tickets. The decision of Justice Weeks was, therefore, hailed with delight by the public and ticket managers as being a real blow to the business of ticket speculation, against which the New York City has been fighting for two years.

Justice Weeks in his earlier said: "The intention for which you are convicted is one which New York City would be rid of. The Commissioner of Police has made it plain that he wishes the streets cleared of this objectionable practice, and I for one will concur. Whether you actually sell the tickets or not as an accomplice makes no difference. You are a part of a lawlessly which has no right under the law to ply your trade, and a workhouse sentence will give a second conviction."

ADMINISTRATIVE BUREAU CREATED BY THE FAMOUS PLAYERS-LASKY

WHITE RATS PROBE CALLED A TRAVESTY BY FITZPATRICK

In Letter to Mountford He Refuses to Give Up Books—Referee Terms Communication "Very Impudent"—Mountford Tells of His Suspicions of Irregularities

New York, Feb. 12.—James William FITZPATRICK, New Chief of the White Rats, sitting in the parlor of his White-Rats house, had a most remarkable verbal protest, which yesterday afternoon landed squarely in the New York street office where Jeffrey Lewis Mountford was conducting the investigation into the White Rats' affairs. This was in the form of a letter written to Harry Mountford in reply to a communication in which Mountford presented him to turn over to him the names of the various parties, which, it is admitted, are at Fitzpatrick's White-Rats house, and his answer FITZPATRICK declared that the present White Rats' investigation was "a gross perversion of the law and the spirit of justice," and that it was prompted by "artificial persecution of the lower order," and the aim and substance of the whole business was "to bring to the court and a court refused to give report of the papers in his possession."

As a result of this attack taken by Mr. FITZPATRICK an application will be made to the Supreme Court with a view to forcing him to deliver those papers into the custody of the court, according to the demands already made by the court.

Yesterday's hearing was not devoid of interesting features, and the FITZPATRICK issue overshadowed all else. Harry Mountford told of his suspicions of irregularities in the White Rats' affairs, admitted that upon his return to the Rats he discovered many things which furnished these suspicions, and he stated his desire to remove those irregularities and find out who were the guilty parties. He confessed, however, that these efforts had been made, except in conducting the enquiries in his own mind.

At the opening of the hearing Mr. Mountford was again pressed to the

point to produce his testimony. Attorney Edwin T. Haskins immediately called upon him to produce the check vouchers, etc., which he had been ordered to give up.

The new sections, 6, 6-A and 6-B, refer to shipping of unexposed motion picture film, unexposed film and advertising matter. It is proposed that the amendments will be filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission at Washington for their consideration. The amended paragraph 6, 6-A and 6-B is in full in the Bureau of Explosives, Atlantic City, N. J., and is being distributed to all members of the National Association of the Motion Picture Industry.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE TRANSPORTATION OF EXPLOSIVES AND OTHER DANGEROUS ARTICLES BY EXPRESS.

Section 6, Paragraph 6, to read:

6. Unexposed motion picture film, unexposed film and advertising matter, shall be packed in suitable wooden boxes containing two (2) or more boxes, each box containing not more than approximately 1000 feet and shall be packed in one well-ventilated container.

6-A. Outside shipping cases shall also be packed in suitable wooden boxes containing two (2) or more boxes, each box containing not more than approximately 1000 feet and shall be packed in one well-ventilated container.

6-B. Unexposed motion picture film shall be packed in suitable wooden boxes containing two (2) or more boxes, each box containing not more than approximately 1000 feet and shall be packed in one well-ventilated container.
