

MPEG Expert Chiariglione To Lead SDMI

Members of the RIAA, along with other international recording industry executives, met in Los Angeles on February 26 for the first official Secure Digital Music Initiative meeting. As previously reported, this coalition will work to create a secure open standard for the digital distribution of music. During the meeting, organizers began laying out the organization and the structure of the group. Dr. Leonardo Chiariglione, who led the development of the MPEG standards, was named Executive Director of the SDMI. Industry leaders also presented ideas about how to tackle the technical issues facing the initiative. In related news, Sony Corp. said that it was developing new copyright technologies for digital music. Sony noted its plans to propose its new MagicGate, OpenMG and Super MagicGate technologies to the SDMI.

TVT Gets \$23 Million In Financing To Pursue Growth Plans

In order to pursue an aggressive growth strategy, TVT Records has obtained more than \$23 million in financing, backed by revenues from TVT's masters and music publishing catalogs. The asset-backed financing came in the form of a 10-year expected life, seven-year average life loan, structured by CAK Universal Credit Corp. TVT said that the company plans to develop and acquire new labels over the next three years, greatly increasing the number of artists on its roster. "Consolidation within the music industry



OLIVIA TREMOR CONTROL

Black Foliage: Animation Music By Olivia Tremor Control (Flydaddy)

Olivia Tremor Control's music is clearly descended from *Magical Mystery Tour*-era Beatles and *Pet Sounds*-era Beach Boys. Instead of reverentially reproducing these influences, however, the Athens, Georgia, band draws inspiration from its forefathers' mastery of colorful melodies, baroque instrumentation and inventive arrangements. *Black Foliage*'s warm, lilting harmonies and fleeting pop melodies draw the listener in before the group shifts into a whimsical smattering of accordions, pianos and ghostly Theremin. When the band wanders completely off the pop path and into a murky forest of chattering percussion, the band sounds haunted by swirling guitar noise and off-kilter tape loops. Yet for every strange sound and overwhelming idea that floats through the mix, the 27 songs on *Black Foliage* roll by with astonishing fluidity. Olivia Tremor Control never dwells on one idea too long (excluding the 11-minute noise collage "The Bark And Below It"), and its *Abbey Road*-like melodies and textures seem to bleed from one song into the next. It's a long strange trip indeed, proving that pop and experimentalism aren't mutually exclusive. — *Tad Hendrickson*



The Slim Shady LP (Aftermath-Interscope)

Eminem's name is hardly new to rap fans that keep an ear to the hip-hop underground. The MC's resumé highlights include an appearance on Shabaam Shadéeq's classic "Five Star Generals" B-side and a second-place finish in the 1997 Rap Olympics freestyle competition. After catching the attention of Dr. Dre (the executive producer here), the cute, blonde rapper (Marshall Mathers to his mom) has become the Great White Hype of the hip-hop nation, garnering mainstream acceptance from baggy-pants-wearing MTV addicts. But the jokey Eminem is much more than rap's Caucasian court jester. The maestro MC amassed the necessary street cred (and accent) on the mean streets of Detroit. On *The Slim Shady LP*, he skillfully busts pop culture-rich rhymes and name-drops at every beat; Nine Inch Nails, Rage Against The Machine, George Burns and Jan Brady receive not-so-honorable mentions. Over fat beats, the nasally pottymouth kicks madcap metaphors and vivid snippets-of-life from his slightly drug-damaged perspective. While Eminem liberally uses the "f" bomb and makes smutty references to the female body, his colloquial lyrical science is still hilarious. — *Amy Sciarretto*

Tucumã (Verve)

A sensual mix of Brazilian folk and cool jazz, bossa nova possesses a beauty and sophistication unlike any other ethnic music. Vinicius Cantuária is a Brazilian composer, guitarist, singer and percussionist with roots in the great bossa nova tradition of Antonio Carlos Jobim and João Gilberto. Faithful to the past, *Tucumã* is characterized by a soft acoustic guitar that skips along, providing a base for fragile, understated melodies. Despite the fact that Cantuária sings his lyrics in Portuguese, the translations in the CD booklet allow the listener to follow along with the romantic and melancholy stories that are so much a part of Cantuária's musical heritage. Like Arto Lindsay (with whom the composer regularly works), Cantuária pushes music beyond genre boundaries with help from a variety of innovative Americans, including Bill Frisell, Laurie Anderson and Sean Lennon. Named after a rare fruit that only grows along the Amazon River, *Tucumã* has a rare beauty that will nourish the soul and enchant the hearts of Brazilian music fans and novices alike.

Gospel Morning (Bobsled)

Kevin Junior's songs reference many styles of retro music — from orchestral pop to R&B to British Invasion-era rock — while retaining a unique vision. A veteran Chicago musician, he once fronted the Mystery Girls and the Rosehips, and has also collaborated with the late Epic Soundtracks. Junior's years of experience are evident on this debut album (an earlier version was self-released in 1997); *Gospel Morning* is so fully-realized that it seems more like the product of a band that has honed its style for decades. While the album's lush arrangements, clean production and poignant emotions are a constant, there's a great deal of variety on these 15 songs. The Chamber Strings move from the fragile, melancholic ballad "Flashing Star" to the piano and guitar pop of "I Can't Lose" to the scorching blues rock guitar and horn blasts on the Black Crowes-esque "Dead Man's Poise." Teachers always say that we should study history so as not to repeat it, yet Junior's study of pop history is proof that some things are too beautiful to not relive. — *Wendy Mitchell*

Viacom To Start New Music Web Site, Acquires Imagine Radio

Entertainment and publishing powerhouse Viacom Inc. has announced plans to develop a new, general music Web site with a working title of "The Buggles Project." Viacom's MTV and VH1 units will work together to create the new online community, which will launch in June. Viacom said that the Buggles site, dubbed "the ultimate online music destination," will include pre-programmed and customizable audio channels, streamed music video channels, news and reviews, concert information and tickets, message boards, chat rooms and a guide to other music Web sites. The audio channels will be developed by Imagine Radio, the Internet broadcasting company acquired by Viacom. "Working with the pioneers of music on television, we can build a new brand offering the best customizable music experience on the Internet for music lovers of every kind," said Rotem Perelmuter, founder of Imagine Radio and the Buggles Project's VP of Strategy. Viacom said that the project would be a part of its new Internet division, which will have an office in San Mateo, California. The company plans to commit \$150 million worth of promotional support to the music site. Viacom also announced plans to have its Nickelodeon unit develop a new children's site, "Project Nozzle."



Lauryn Hill Wins Five Grammy Awards

Capping off a year of commercial success and critical acclaim, Lauryn Hill was the most celebrated winner at the February 24 Grammy Awards. Hill received five Grammy Awards, breaking Carole King's 1971 record for the number of awards won by a female artist. Hill, who went into the Grammys with 10 nominations, won Album Of The Year, Best New Artist, Best R&B Song, Best Female R&B Vocal Performance and Best R&B Album. Her Album Of The Year win for *The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill* (Ruffhouse/Columbia-CRG) marks the first time that a hip-hop album has claimed that honor. Celine Dion's *Titanic* theme "My Heart Will Go On" won Record Of The Year, Song Of The Year (a songwriter's award) and Best Female Pop Vocal Performance. Other female performers also fared well; the Dixie Chicks, Madonna and Alanis Morissette each won multiple awards. The Beastie Boys picked up two awards, for Best Alternative Music Performance and for Best Rap Performance By A Duo Or Group. Despite the fact that he boycotted the awards ceremony because "too many major rap artists continue to be overlooked," Jay-Z won for Best Rap Album. The Brian Setzer Orchestra picked up two Grammys, for Best Pop Performance By A Duo Or Group With Vocal and Best Pop Instrumental Performance. Other notable wins included Elvis Costello & Burt Bacharach for Best Pop Collaboration With Vocals, Metallica for Best Metal Performance and Lucinda Williams for Best Contemporary Folk Album. In total, the National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences gave out 95 Grammy Awards. For a complete list of winners, visit www.grammy.com.

The first Transmissions festival was held in July 1998 in neighboring Chapel Hill. A live CD compiled from last year's performances will be released in April. Sub Pop Signs The Hellacopters

Sub Pop Records has signed Swedish rockers the Hellacopters. Man's Ruin Records recently released the garage rockers' debut American album, *Supershitty To The Max*. The

record was originally released overseas in 1996. Sub Pop plans to release the group's label debut in early June. The band has planned a May tour of the U.S. with the Quadrajets and the Nomads. The Hellacopters formed in 1994, and they won a Swedish Grammy Award for Best Hard Rock Act in 1997.

JAMTV Changes Name To Tunes.com, Launches New Hub Site

JAMTV Corp. has changed its name to Tunes.com. The company has also launched a music hub site at www.tunes.com, which includes daily editorial content, audio and video archives, customizable options and other features. Starting in April, Tunes.com will also offer downloadable songs in the MP3 format. Tunes.com's partners include *Rolling Stone*, *The Source* and *Down Beat*.

Seahorses Disband Due To Creative Differences

The Seahorses, the group founded by former Stone Roses guitarist John Squire, has disbanded. In a statement, the Brit-pop band's representatives said, "Due to a general divergence of musical directions, the Seahorses have decided to disband. No formal plans for the future have been made but all four members intend to continue along their own separate paths." Squire, vocalist Chris Helme, bassist Stuart Fletcher and drummer Andy Watts formed

the band in 1996. Geffen Records released the quartet's debut album, *Do It Yourself*, in 1997. The split has renewed rumors that the Stone Roses might reform. But Roses vocalist Ian Brown continues to deny those rumors, four years after the band's dissolution. A post to Brown's official Web site announced that, "A spokesman for Ian Brown denies that there is any truth to the rumours that the Stone Roses will reform following the demise of the Seahorses."

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ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

WACO BROTHERS

The Waco Brothers are a Chicago-based insurgent country sextet with a knack for rocking, honky-tonk tunes. Waco World, the group's second album for Bloodshot Records, contains music for late-night, heavy drinkers made by later-night, even heavier drinkers. Waco leader Jon Langford, known for his work with the Mekons, the Three Johns and Skull Orchard, spoke to CMJ over the phone, from his art studio in Chicago.

CMJ: Why did you start the Waco Brothers?

Jon Langford: Well, I just wanted to be in a band that kind of lived in my neighborhood, y'know? I mean, after I came and moved to Chicago.

You didn't care about its sound?

Not really, no. I just liked the idea that I was in a band with my friends...It's kinda easy that way. You can just get together in the middle of the afternoon and then see what you want to do. Then we go out for a drink together after. The Mekons was like that. When I came to Chicago, I just thought it would be a nice thing to have.

So how did you find this band?

It was just me and [singer/guitarist] Dean [Schlabowske] that started it. We just played country covers, like George Jones, Merle Haggard songs 'cause we liked them. Then we got a rhythm section and Bloodshot approached us and said, "We should make an album." [We initially thought], "Yeah, just what the world really needs—a country covers album." But then we thought, "Maybe we could write some songs for it, as well."

What's your description of the Waco Brothers' music?

Drunken, drug-crazed rock 'n' roll.

If you listen to the lyrics, you can't deny the drunken part.

Yeah, well it's substances, really. Substance abuse rock 'n' roll. We all have some substance we abuse. Alcohol would be my choice.

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

Lucinda Williams Tops Village Voice's Pazz & Jop Poll

Lucinda Williams's *Car Wheels On A Gravel Road* (Mercury) topped this year's Pazz & Jop music critics poll, sponsored by the *Village Voice*. Williams narrowly edged out Lauryn Hill's *The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill* (Ruffhouse/Columbia-GRG) for the top honors. Rounding out the top 10 were Bob Dylan, Billy Bragg & Wilco, Elliott Smith, OutKast, PJ Harvey, Air, Beastie Boys and Rufus Wainwright. Fatboy Slim's "The Rockafeller Skank" was voted top single, while Rhino's *Nuggets* box set was voted best reissue. The Pazz & Jop poll, now in its "25th or 26th year," queried 496 music writers. 

Sloan To Release Double Live Album

Canadian rock band Sloan plans to release a double live album, recorded in November 1998 in Toronto. The band's own label, murderecords, will release *Four Nights At The Palais Royale* in the U.S. and Canada on March 23. The two-CD set will be imported exclusively by Never Records Group/Proper Sales and Distribution. The discs consist of 28 tracks, spanning Sloan's four albums. Brendan McGuire, Sloan's live soundman, taped the shows. He also helped the band mix the performances, without overdubs, at Toronto's Reaction Studios. In March, Sloan will return to the studio to work on a followup to 1998's *Navy Blues*. The studio album will be released this fall.

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

Fans of the *Post Marked Stamps* series of split singles can now pick up a full-length compilation of those releases. Chicago's Tree Records has configured nine of its previously vinyl-only, dual-artist titles onto one CD. The **Get Up Kids**, **Rainer Maria**, **Braid**, **Jen Wood**, **Tim Kinsella**, **A Minor Forest** and **Hal Al Shedad** are only a handful of the participating performers.

Ajax Records recently released *Protein Source Of The Future...Now!*, a collection of hard-to-find and out-of-print singles, cassette tracks and compilation appearances by the **Mountain Goats**. The record spans the band's output from 1993-94, amassing highlights such as "Going To Tennessee," "Alphabetizing" and "Two Thousand Seasons" alongside 20 other rarities. Ajax is planning to issue even more Mountain Goats odds-and-ends later this year, as *Protein* is only volume one in the label's planned three-part series. The second volume will be entitled *Bitter Melon Farm*, and — according to the liner notes that accompany *Protein* — the third, still-unnamed volume will be made available around "the time that the survivalists all head into their mountainside cabins to hide from the Y2K catastrophe."

The soundtrack to the teen thriller *Cruel Intentions* contains hits by the **Verve**, **Fatboy Slim**, **Faithless**, **Blur**, **Counting Crows** and others. The film stars Ryan Phillippe, Reese Witherspoon and Sarah Michelle Gellar.

If you're looking for real insight into the Pacific Northwest college radio scene, look no further than Kill Rock Stars' new *Drinking From Puddles* compilation. The 16-track album contains live performances recorded during Brandon Leiberman's show on KBOO, in Corvallis, Oregon. Local and national artists such as **Lydia Lunch**, **Come**, **Dead Moon**, **Prolapse**, **Cadallaca** and the **Murder City Devils** contribute to the album, which will arrive in stores on March 23.

Seattle's Up Records has issued another label sampler, this one aimed at Up aficionados who don't own turntables. The 18-track *Up Next* collects previously released songs from some of the



label's vinyl-only releases. **Modest Mouse**'s "Grey Ice Water" and **Karp**'s "Prison Shake" have been digitized for the first time, along with tracks by **Quasi**, **764-HERO**, **Mike Johnson**, **the Pastels**, **Tad** and **Jana McCall**.

The **Meat Puppets**' complete SST catalog is being remastered and reissued. Rykodisc will release enhanced CDs of six of the group's full-length albums, complete with bonus tracks and one video clip per disc. The first re-release in the series was the Phoenix trio's self-titled debut LP, initially issued in 1982 as a co-release between SST and **Joe Carducci**'s Thermidor label. Ryko has since spiffed-up the record with the addition of the Puppets' pre-SST, debut 7" EP. Reissues of *Meat Puppets II* and *Up On The Sun* are scheduled to be released on March 16, while a combined version of the *Out My Way* EP and *Huevos* will hit stores on April 6. The final two albums, *Monsters* and *Mirage*, will arrive on April 27. In addition, Rykodisc has also issued the Puppets' previously unreleased album *Live In Montana*, recorded onstage in 1988.

Sealed Fate Records' 15-track *Mystique* compilation is a fundraiser to benefit the AIDS Action Committee. Such notable indie popsters as the **Future Bible Heroes**, **Beachwood Sparks**, the **Push Kings** and **Purple Ivy Shadows** donated tracks to this worthy cause.

Hollywood Records' soundtrack to the film *The Other Sister* includes brand new music by **Joan Osborne**, **Savage Garden** and the **Pretenders**. The **Lemonheads**, **Fastball** and **Paula Cole** also make appearances on the 11-track collection. "Come Rain Or Come Shine" might very well be the record's most curious inclusion, though; the track is performed by none other than the movie's female lead, **Juliette Lewis**.

The original score to *Johnny Cool*, the 1963 gangster film starring Telly Savalas, **Sammy Davis, Jr.**, Jim Backus and Elizabeth Montgomery, has finally been released on CD. **Billy May** — known for his jazz arrangements and his songwriting efforts for Frank Sinatra and Nat "King" Cole — composed the movie's music. Two May-penned vocal tracks graced by Davis' golden tones, "The Ballad Of Johnny Cool" and "Bee Boom," also figure prominently on the soundtrack.

Australian label Camera Obscura Records has given a wider audience a chance to appreciate the eerie, resonant soundscapes of **Alphane Moon**'s *The Echoing Grove*. The album's mate-

rial was originally released in a limited run of 100 cassettes, recorded in 1994. Though New York indie label Spiffing had previously reissued some of these tracks on a 1996 EP, *Grove* marks the first digital pressing of Alphane Moon's entire sequential endeavor.

Root-O-Evil Records has released *Roots III (A Trilogy)*, the third installment in a trio of underground metal, hard rock and "otherwise uncategorizable" international collections. Boston's **Sam Black Church**, Finland's **Walhalla**, Minneapolis' **Impaler** and Chicago's **Usurper** are among the acts throwing their hats into this dark ring. For some obscure but welcome reason, the anthology also contains an acoustic track by the decidedly un-metal **Aerial M**. Otherwise uncategorizable, indeed.


New York City indie rock band **Versus** recently cut its ties with Caroline Records and signed with Chapel Hill, North Carolina's Merge Records. The band's first release for its new label is *Afterglow*, a five-song EP. The EP includes new songs and older, previously unreleased material. Versus has also taken to the road in support of this release.



Sonic Image Records has released the soundtrack to the Showtime made-for-cable-movie *Mr. Music*. The film stars Fleetwood Mac's Mick Fleetwood as a struggling independent label entrepreneur. Included on the soundtrack are cuts by **Reel Big Fish**, **Blue Flannel**, **Pat Benatar**, **Treble Charger**, **Caramel**, **Eva Cassidy** and **Graham Nash**.

The **Selecter**, the first band signed to the Specials' legendary 2-Tone label in 1979, has released its third album since the group reformed in 1992. Vocalist Pauline Black calls *Cruel Britannia* (Snapper Music) the group's best work since 1981. The Selecter honors the late ska legend **Tommy McCook** on a track entitled "Musical Servant." The band will embark on a U.S. tour in April.

First came the hype about NBC's miniseries *The '60s*. Now that turbulent decade is examined again by two new Columbia-Sony Legacy releases. *Hear It Now! 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


Under terms of the deal, CD Warehouse paid \$4 million — \$3 million in cash and \$1 million in stock — to Jeff and Debbi Clark. "Jeff and Debbi started in a flea market and have grown their business to 16 stores that produced \$7.4 million in revenue in 1998," said CD Warehouse Chairman/CEO Jerry W. Grizzle. "This acquisition, combined with our purchase in June of 1998 of the Disc Go Round concept, positions us for substantial expansion efforts in California." Jeff Clark will work for CD Warehouse to expand the CD Warehouse/Music Trader chain throughout the state. CD Warehouse financed the deal using a \$7 million credit facility from Banc One, including a \$5 million term loan and a \$2 million line of credit. As of December 31, CD Warehouse franchised or operated 314 stores in the U.S. and abroad.

CD Radio Sues XM Satellite Radio

CD Radio Inc., the satellite-to-car broadcasting company, has filed a patent infringement suit against XM Satellite Radio, the only other company holding an FCC license for satellite radio broadcasting in the U.S. CD Radio's suit, filed in the Southern District of New York, claims that XM's proposed transmission system would infringe on three CD Radio patents. The suit seeks an injunction to prevent XM from constructing the system.

SESAC Works New Deal With Concert Promoters

Performing Rights society SESAC has negotiated a new agreement with the North American Concert Promoters Association. Promoters will no longer have to pay music licensing fees to SESAC for empty seats, a traditional practice in the industry. SESAC also simplified its reporting process for concert promoters. "We have listened to the concert promoters and have addressed their concerns in this new agreement," said Bob Pauley, SESAC's National Sales Account Executive.

The full collection will contain more than 500 performances.







type of financing enables us to retain full equity, while giving us substantial capital with which to grow. It puts us on an equal footing with the major record companies." TTVT labels include TTVT Records, Wax Trax! Records, Blunt Recordings, United Producers and TTVT Soundtrax. TTVT's current roster includes XTC, Sevendust, Bounty Killer, Gravity Kills, Gil Scott-Heron and Brian Jonestown Massacre.

Edison. More tracks will be released in coming months. "The job of any record label should be to reach out to a given artist's fans by any means necessary," said Sub Pop Co-Founder and CEO Jonathan Poneman. "Let others debate the so-called MP3 controversy; Sub Pop is ready to do its job."

Mogwai (Continued from cover)

U.K. label, Chemikal Underground, which is also the overseas home of Matador act Arab Strap. Chemikal Underground released Mogwai's 1997 albums *Ten Rapid* and *Young Team* (the latter of which peaked at #6 on CMJ's Radio 200 chart) in Europe, while New York-based Jetset Records released those titles domestically. Matador's Head Of Radio Promotion, Donovan Finn, says, "Chemikal Underground asked us if we would be interested in licensing. I think they saw us as a larger company with a bigger profile."

But Mogwai's fanbase extends well beyond music industry employees and college radio music directors. Last year, Jetset issued the double album *Kicking A Dead Pig*, which peaked at #8 on CMJ's Radio 200 chart. That collection increased Mogwai's non-rock profile, as the record featured genre-crossing remixes by such notable studio mavens as Aphex Twin, Alec Empire,

Arab Strap and the Third Eye Foundation.

Matador hopes to build upon Mogwai's increasingly eclectic reputation. "While Jetset did an amazing job with the last record, I think [the band] wanted to step up a notch," Finn says. "From Jetset, you go to a bigger indie or a major. I don't think [Mogwai] were quite ready for a major, or [that] a major was ready to have them." Matador hopes to improve upon the group's already-respectable sales base by attracting new Mogwai fans through college radio, fanzines, the music press and word of mouth.

The five Scottish lads, all in their early 20s, recorded *Come On Die Young* at Tarbox Road Studios in upstate New York. Dave Fridmann, a former member of Mercury Rev who also produced that band's acclaimed *Deserter's Songs*, manned the board for *Come On Die Young*. Finn calls the result a "more composed, less discordant" album, compared to some of Mogwai's previous work.

Come On Die Young arrives in stores and goes for college radio adds on March 29.

As the Internet Retail industry grows, some new sites are catering to audiences that the CD superstores tend to gloss over. Saul GoodMan, M.D., (a play on "It's all good, man" and the M.D. is for Music Distribution, not Medical Doctor) stocks a post-hardcore/punk blend of independent and major label releases, backed up by editorial content. In a neat, frames-based format, the site offers an extensive catalog and a Pinpoint-powered search functionality. Beyond its focused catalog, SGMD builds a community through its email newsletter and chat section. SGMD has plans to launch a "wwwboard" where shoppers will be able to follow threads and post replies to comments, much like a newsgroup. Saul GoodMan also supplies content like the "Special Album Of The Month" — this month's feature is Capitol's Jimmy Eat World. Flash technology enhances this section, and visitors can hear clips, see videos and read lyrics from the album. Elsewhere on the site, Saul GoodMan M.D. shares reviews of the punk 'zine *Rocket Fuel*. Other SGMD pages includ: a "HIGHLY Recommended Releases" section, an extensive Links page and tour/booking info on the site's favorite acts. Saul Goodman has good prices, good deals and a unique attitude that many shoppers will relate to, giving it a distinctly different feel than your average superstores. Saul GoodMan, M.D. is one of the first sites in what will undoubtedly become a significant part of Internet Retail: thoughtful, provocative niche marketing. — David Day

When Your Heartstrings Break (Sugar Free)

Like many bands in the Elephant 6 collective, Beulah plays heartfelt, homespun pop.



The San Francisco fivesome's latest concoction has an accomplished yet easygoing feel thanks to songs that hum along at an up-tempo pace without

moving so fast that you couldn't hum along. (Don't be surprised if you find yourself adding your own Beach Boys-style harmonies to the proceedings.) Despite the record's general intricacy and tabla-to-trombone contributions from 18 guest musicians, *When Your Heartstrings Break* exudes a wonderfully uncrowded, lived-in vibe. Beulah makes fine use of its rag-tag orchestra; the dress code here may be casual, but the tasteful interplay of strings, flute, horns and rock instrumentation is worthy of tux and tails. — Steve Ciabattoni




scends labels, allowing the strength of the material and Willis's beautiful, spellbinding voice to make the loudest statements. — Glen Sansone



For a guy whose career has spanned nearly half-a-century, it seems impossible that Dawson could be putting out such fiery, funny, personality-soaked albums, but he is. *More Bad Habits* will likely be remembered as one of the best recordings of the man's career. Dawson practically lives on the road, playing a couple hundred gigs a year, so don't miss your chance to hear and see this rockabilly guitar legend at work. — Cheryl Botchick



Savoir Faire: The Best Of Family Fodder (Jungle-Dark Beloved Cloud)



ZOMBIES

Odessey & Oracle (Big Beat)



The Zombies' story has all the drama of a VH-1 *Behind The Music* special, minus the overdoses and divorces. The group came together as school chums in St. Albans, England, in 1962. Shortly thereafter, the Zombies were ready to abandon music for traditional careers until they won a local battle of the bands. A series of singles, including the hits "She's Not There" and "Tell Her No," quickly followed suit, but these chestnuts gave way to a string of commercial flops. The Zombies had decided to disband by late 1967, though they agreed to record a sophomore album as a final artistic statement. *Odessey & Oracle*, from 1968, was yet another commercial disappointment until "Time Of The Season" was picked up by a U.S. radio station. Posthumously, the song became the band's biggest hit. Sadly, *Odessey & Oracle* marked the end of the Zombies, but what an epitaph it was. In terms of gorgeous melodies and intelligent pop songwriting, this classic is easily in the same league as *Pet Sounds* and *Sgt. Pepper's*. The Zombies' principal songwriters, Chris White (guitar) and Rod Argent (keyboards), are lauded for their arrangements (innovative use of keys, unexpected chords, classical influences), yet the pair also never forsakes emotional power in the name of technical achievement. *Odessey & Oracle* isn't exactly a concept album, but its themes are complementary, as Colin Blunstone's breathy man-boy vocals detail the horrors of war ("Butcher's Tale") or the tragedy of a life without love ("A Rose For Emily"). The mere chorus of "Care Of Cell 44" moves me more than many entire albums. That's just one of countless reasons why the anal-retentive editor in me can overlook the creative misspelling of *Odessey* and recognize this record as a timeless pop masterpiece. — Wendy Mitchell





Featuring accordion, guitar and violin, *Memory Is An Elephant*, on Angel (phone: 212.253.3038, email: roger.evans@emimusic.com), is a quiet record with a beauty that will appeal to fans of Kronos Quartet and Astor Piazzolla. Like the works of Piazzolla and Kronos, the traditional instrumentation and song structure leave plenty of room for soloing, and sometimes two musicians step out at the same time. Passionate music that is well played, *Memory Is An Elephant* is a promising start from this young band...Produced by Bill Laswell, *Boniche Dub* (A.P.C., phone 212.477.0563, email info@roir-usa.com) is the dub version of Algerian guitarist Lili Boniche's *Alger Alger*, also just released by A.P.C. The record will be in stores on April 6...Recently, CMJ had the chance to sit down and talk with **Juvenile**, Cash Money-Universal's own rising star. Here's how it went.

You nagged the Cash Money family everyday until you got a contract?

Yeah, I wanted to let them know that I wanted it. They had a lot of rappers on their label, they didn't want [to sign me]. Hate to say it, but I bumped them all off this label. 'Cause I came with a better work ethic than all of them.

Let people know what Juvenile and Cash Money are about.

We street. That's our approach. Because they don't have no gangsta rappers no more. We represent the ghetto, 'cause about now, we the only rap group that goes into the ghetto clubs all over the United States to perform. And hard work is our motto right now.

In your video for "Ha," you show off your hood. How important was that for you?

That meant a whole lot to me, because I've been saying all my life that I'm going to shoot my video back here.

How do you balance the line between gloss and street?

I do it by still going out to the ghetto. That refreshes me and at the same time I get a feel for my people, and my people get a feel for me.

So what's the recipe for your innovative flow?

You need the clubs. If the club scene and the ghetto don't love you, nobody will. When you get into doing slow music you won't make it, bottom line. And I never rap the same on a track, 'cause that's boring. Like Eminem — that kid is on some other shit, and kids want to hear that. That's why they like me.



KnitMedia Inc. has announced its plans for this year's jazz festival. For past ten years, the event has been called either What Is Jazz?, or the Texaco New York Jazz Festival. This year, the extravaganza will be billed as the 1999 Bell Atlantic Jazz Festival, thanks to the sponsorship of that communications company. Though the 1999 festival will still feature a long, diverse list of jazz noteworthies along with performers in other genres, the event will now take place in four East Coast cities — New York, Boston, Philadelphia and Washington, DC. Each non-NYC city will host week-long satellite festivals, which will run in succession from May 13-30. The main New York festival will then occur from June 3-

13. Bell Atlantic will supply the entire affair with multi-media technology, enabling the Knitting Factory's Web site to Webcast most of the performances...Hot off the success of the Grammys won by the *Miles Davis Quintet 1965-'68* box set, Columbia has announced that its next Davis box will collect the jazz luminary's complete, collaborative, Columbia recordings with John Coltrane. The material on the six-CD set dates from 1955-1961, encompassing such quintessential recordings as *Kind Of Blue*, *Round About Midnight* and *Milestones*. The label will hopefully issue the anthology late in the summer. Forthcoming, if not imminent, multi-disc sets based around Davis' *In A Silent Way* and *A Tribute To Jack Johnson* will be the next titles the Davis retrospective series, in the vein of the recently issued *Bitches Brew* box...In other box set news, Prestige will mark its 50th anniversary with the four-CD *Prestige Records Story*. The title will arrive in stores early in the summer...Prestige parent label Fantasy will release a six-CD set of unreleased material by the late Bill Evans. In the spring, Fantasy will issue the pianist's live *Homecoming*, and, this summer, the label will release his final recordings, *Time Remembered*.

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**Interview by Steve Ciabattoni**

Though only in his early 20s, Gene Hoffman is already a high-tech veteran, having worked as the Director of Business Development and Interactive Marketing for Pretty Good Privacy, Inc. and as Executive Vice President of PrivNet, Inc., where he handled the company's business affairs and technology licensing. Since co-founding GoodNoise (www.goodnoise.com) in January 1998, Hoffman has helped establish the company as a leader in the downloadable music market, offering MP3 files from Frank Black, They Might Be Giants, artists on the spinART label, and others. A recent licensing deal with Rykodisc and the acquisition of Emusic are GoodNoise's latest shots in the digital music revolution.

This interview is being recorded. Do you mind if I turn it into an MP3 file and offer it on CMJ Online?

That is a great concept — for you to do inter-

views with bands and make them available as MP3s. You could end up having people put interviews in their music collection.

Does the technology make it easier to set up your own company?

Absolutely. People forget that the reason the Internet revolution is happening, and that the economy is being changed, is that the [U.S.] defense department sunk a bunch of cash into interconnecting universities. It's one of those odd cases where public policy has worked really well.

You've surrounded yourself with some savvy people there.

To really be successful, you have to network well. Every so often, people ask me for my references, and the funny thing is that I *hire* most of my references. So it's hard to find an outside reference that isn't part of the team.

What's been your role in the numerous rights issues that have arisen with MP3, including the Rio Player case?

We were very actively involved in that. [Board Chairman] Bob Kohn — he won the Supreme Court case, *Lotus v. Borland*, a copyright look and feel case — has been instrumental in high-tech law. Between that and his father having such a long and respected career at Warner-Chapell, we have very good inroads to all the licensing issues, understanding how the [licensing company] Harry Fox Agency thinks and works. There's as much politics to the law as there is law.

Are you encouraged that labels are starting to embrace MP3?

What's been enlightening is that certain groups have really started to understand what they're going to have to do to move into the digital age.

Does that include musicians and bands as well?

A lot of artists really get this, because if you're close to your fan, you understand what your fan does — he uses MP3 to listen to your music.

Is there any chance that digital distribution will make the major labels go away?

The concept of major labels as it exists now? Yeah. But major labels going away, no. I think the label function is going to be extremely valuable. But the distributor owning a major and being the only way you do stuff...that's going away.

Does the concept of labels, such as Sub Pop, warming to MP3 and offering tracks cut in on what you do?

If you're Sub Pop, building and running this is not trivial. Running a distribution point online is hard. It's not hard if you're a tech guy. You know what it costs, and you have to have credit card relationships. It's much more economically feasible to [have us] aggregate and [for labels to say], "Let somebody else deal with [Harry] Fox." We've got a big [international] accountant group. We can make it a lot easier for Sup Pop than Sub Pop doing it itself.

How are your recent acquisitions positioning you for the future?

We're going to be re-branding the company as Emusic.com. We're different things to different constituencies. The primary constituency is the customer — the actual end-user of music. We want to give customers music the way they want it, how they want it, and as cheaply as we can possibly provide it in a way that makes money for everybody. To an artist, we look like a digital label. To a label, we're a digital distribution point. There's no reason [for a label] to do it in-house. Their primary focus should be A&R, marketing and promotion and we want to help them do that.

Are labels coming to you now?

In the past, it had been us going to them — introducing what we could do and how we could help them with the piracy problem. Now I think it's changing, especially after the Rykodisc announcement.

MP3 is no longer the future. It's now. Are you looking out for what's next?

We're spending a lot of our strategic thought on trying to roll the technology forward. I mean the actual CODEC. How good is the sound? How small is the file? Is it supported by a whole bunch of players? Actually, we're on the cusp of moving off of MP3. One of the CODECs out there...eight in ten audio professionals can't tell the difference [between it and a CD], where with MP3, it's five in ten.

I take it your car doesn't have an eight-track player?

[Laughs] No. I've got a three-disc changer in the dash and I really hate it because I want an MP3 player in my car. I think I may splurge on the MPEG one and try to install it.

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
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STEVE REICH:

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A LEGENDARY COMPOSER'S MUSIC ENTERS A NEW PHASE





THE LAST WORD

In 1965, Steve Reich was playing with tape recorders. While looping a recording of a San Francisco street preacher, the future composer set his machines a hair out-of-step, thus stumbling upon the technique of phasing. "We played them on the public radio station," says Reich, recalling the debut of his early works. "The switchboard lit up like a Christmas tree! People would say, 'Fix your transmitter! It's stuck in a groove!'" The rhythmic, if not maddening, allure of these tape loops would eventually influence not only Reich's future orchestral work, but also the work of musicians outside of classical and avant-garde circles. The experiments served as the inspiration behind Brian Eno's development of ambient music, and as the forerunner to The Orb's atmospheric house musings (The Orb track "Little Fluffy Clouds" samples Reich's "Electric Counterpoint"). Reich's work has also left a mark on the nine remixers that have contributed to the recently released *Reich Remixed* (Nonesuch), a radical, yet wholly logical, reinterpretation of the avant-garde pioneer's compositions.

Reich's only exposure to the remix/DJ scene admittedly consists of little more than his vague familiarity with The Orb and his absorption of the pieces submitted for *Reich Remixed*. But the composer is thrilled that his work might be heard outside of its normal scope. "It's nice to be useful," he says. "It's nice that your music can serve some function to other musicians."

Though classically trained at Juilliard and elsewhere, Reich found inspiration in a variety of musicians. "[In the '60s] a lot of things were happening that people were responding to," he says, "like John Coltrane and non-Western music finally being performed live [in the U.S.]. Ravi Shankar being here, African drumming being performed, Balinese gamelan in New York City." In all of this music, including the grooves of Junior Walker's "Shotgun" and even Bob Dylan's "Maggie's Farm," Reich heard what he calls "a kind of harmonic constancy." Suggesting that the pulsing, repetitive nature of his work was an inevitable result of these influences, Reich offers: "We are fish in the water, and the fish do not control the water, they respond to it."

In the '70s, Reich's intense study of African and of Balinese music deepened the harmonic and rhythmic possibilities of his music. Mantronik's *Reich Remixed* version of the epic "Drumming" practically serves as an intricate thesis on the influence and the manifestation of traditional African rhythms in hip-hop culture, but the track's main role is that of rhythmic ass-kicker, with turntables and breakbeats blazing behind the original piece's tightly woven tapestry of marimbas.

Appearances by Coldcut, DJ Spooky, Howie B and others on *Reich Remixed* will no doubt help keep the composer's music vital to a pop audience, but Reich has

always strived to keep his work fresh by constantly seeking new challenges. "There are artists who get a certain thing and stay with it," he says. "There are minimal artists who build boxes and then two years later build *blue* boxes and then two years later build *silver* boxes [laughs]. I get bored with what I've done. It's basically me trying to stay alive and interested."

Reich has been drawing inspiration from his Judaic roots for many years. "It wasn't until I was in my early 30s," he says, "that I finally began to get in touch with an Orthodox synagogue, where I began to get the education that other people would get when they were children. That gave me a desire to somehow bring this into the music. If you're Christian, there's a place in the liturgy for new masses, new passions and new cantatas. There's a demand for it. In Judaism, the idea is that there's one man chanting from a parchment scroll and that's it." The 1981 *Tehillim* LP revisited Hebrew psalms, leading the newly spiritual iconoclast into new musical and thematic territory.

New themes and old techniques met in 1988's *Different Trains*, a compelling exploration of both the Holocaust and the passing of the golden age of the American railroad. Beneath the chugging strings of the Kronos Quartet, Reich inserted loops of tape-recorded interviews, including those from actual Holocaust survivors, who gave the Grammy Award-winning piece a powerful dramatic resonance.

Subsequently, Reich has been expanding his theatrical scope, working with video artist Beryl Korot on *The Cave*, a complex, historical multimedia piece about Arab-Israeli relations. "For a musical, dramatic work it's important that the composer [should] really be on fire about the subject matter," Reich theorizes. "Because if I'm not interested, how could you possibly be interested?"


