

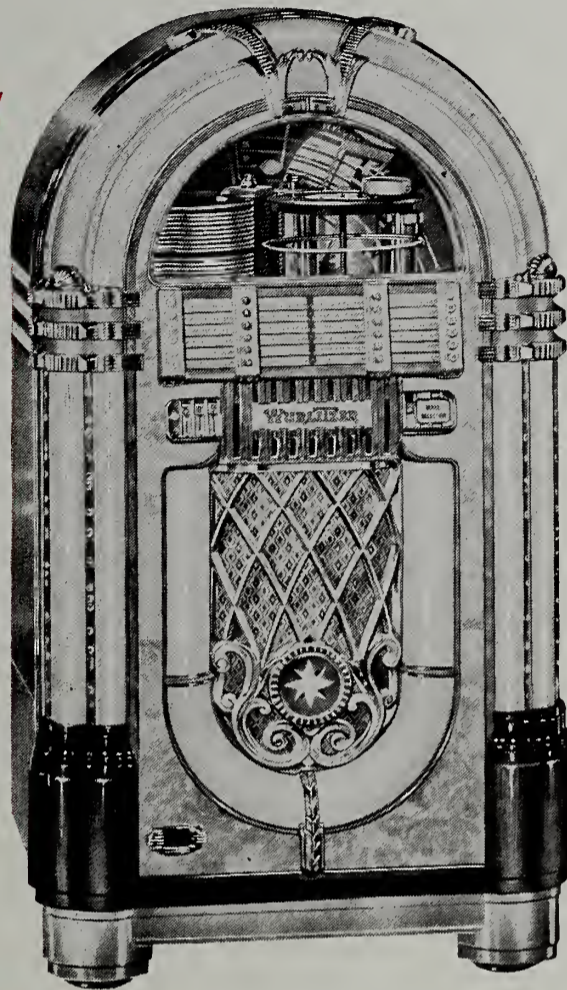

CMI ADOPTS "THE CASH BOX IDEA"

Opens Drive For "Public Relations Bureau"

CHICAGO — For over three years now The Cash Box has been urging the coin machine industry to arrange for the creation of a "National Public Relations Bureau" for only such a bureau would be able to bring about better understanding with the public at large for this industry.

The Cash Box continued to pound home this idea for a "Public Relations Bureau" issue after issue. It met with wide acclaim thruout the nation. It brought forth a great many fine comments from all leaders in the trade who also foresaw this bureau as a tremendous need as the post-war period came into being.

Now the Coin Machine Industries, Inc., the association of all the leading manufacturers (as well as a great many distributors, jobbers, allied industries, etc., who are listed as "associate members" and have no voting power) is coming to the fore to bring about the formation of such a "Public Relations Bureau".

CMI is asking each and every member of the coin machine industry to invest in his future (as well as the future of this industry) by becoming an associate member for the nominal cost of \$25 per year. It is believed that at least 1,000 such memberships will be taken and that this will be doubly matched by the manufacturers themselves so that a "Public Relations Bureau" can get under way with a healthy financial fund.

The letter which left the offices of Jim Gilmore, secretary-manager of Coin Machine Industries, Inc., this week, read as follows:

This year of 1946 is the most serious and challenging year the coin machine industry ever faced. The business outlook was never better but the very favorableness of that outlook presents many new and complicated problems.

One of these problems—and by unanimous thinking the most important of them all—is Public Relations for the Coin Machine Industry.

The pre-war and war periods, and the aftermath of the war have had a definite effect on coin machine operations. The public attitude toward the

idea of coin machine operating is in a vacillating condition — sometimes we think the public is for us and sometimes we think the public is against us. Scores of leading American industries have methodically and cleverly built up a favorable attitude toward themselves by spending definite sums of money for public relations.

We are the organization which has held the coin machine conventions and shows which for so many years in the past gave the industry its great annual inspiration. NATIONAL TAX COUNCIL NEEDED NOW

Nation's Cities Need Greater Revenue. Already Increasing Coin Machine License Fees.

NEW YORK — From everywhere in the nation comes requests that The Cash Box continue its efforts with even greater vigor to help bring about the creation of a "National Tax Council".

These leaders believe that license fees are going to rise to unheard of highs this year unless there is gathered together in this industry an organization which will help coinmen to hold down fees to present base or even cut them where necessary.

There is no organization or individual in this industry where the trade can go in an emergency to obtain precedents of former tax cases, data on taxes now in effect, information on city or state ordinances regarding taxes and on the legalities necessary to the raising of tax revenue. There are no tax experts devoting themselves to the needs of this industry.

And taxes are beginning to skyrocket. Los Angeles County has just placed a tax of \$12 per year on each phono and \$1 per year on every wall box. The music operators of Southern California are fighting (by petition) to get this down to \$6 per year per phono and 50c per wall box.

In the meantime pinball license fees in Los Angeles County jumped to \$36 per year but by the good work of Samuel (Curley) Robinson of

AOLAC this was lowered to \$24 per year. But, even this is an increase over former fees.

At the present time Omaha is fighting an increase from \$10 per yearly license fee to \$150 per year on pinballs in addition to a \$1,000 per year occupational tax for each operator. Pinball ops here are countering with a \$20 per year fee and a \$100 per year occupational tax. Juke boxes in Omaha, unless something is done, will be increased from \$5 per yearly license to \$100 per year plus a \$1,000 per year occupational fee for each juke box operator. The juke box men are offering the city \$10 per machine plus \$50 per year occupational tax.

The City of Chicago went all out in an ordinance of its own and boosted the juke box fee to \$50 per year. And tho defeated in the Illinois Supreme Court as a state revenue measure it now remains a city of Chicago ordinance.

The city of Minneapolis is asking that juke boxes pay \$50 per year license fee where they formerly paid nothing at all per year. This is a record jump for any city. And as far as pinballs are concerned Minneapolis wants an increase from \$50 per year license to \$150 per year. They pushed this into effect as a "regulation" to pay for 40 more patrolmen needed to "regulate" pinballs and juke boxes

in this city.

Outstanding record of all time for asking an increase in pin game license fees is the small town of Irvington, N. J., which is attempting to increase its yearly license from \$5 to \$2000 and an additional \$10 per year from each location owner.

Philadelphia, too, is facing an ordinance which will kick its yearly phono license fee to \$25. This is being bitterly contested by the juke box association here. And now Philly's coinmen fear that pinballs, too, are in for another increase.

Economists are crying out that with the U. S. Government over 262 Billions in debt it cannot carry the load for unemployment and poor relief. It must turn this burden over to the states, they claim. Many of the states are out of the red for the first time in a decade. These states are naturally going to seek additional revenue. They are not going to let such relief be cut into their present financial reserve.

It is therefore up to the members of this coin machine industry to get together immediately to create the nucleus for a "National Tax Council". This need grows greater every day. Such a council must be put to work now to help this business survive the tremendous revenue bills which are being introduced thruout the nation.

ANTI-CLIMAX TO THE BUCKLEY BILL

Reports Claim No Action Taken Or Will Be Taken And That Rep. Chas. A. Buckley Himself Will Not Push For Passage Of H. R. 3190. But Bill Still Remains In House Patents Committee.

IF REP. BUCKLEY MEANS IT WHY DOESN'T HE WITHDRAW BILL FROM COMMITTEE ENTIRELY? Trade Asked To Withhold Any Further Letters And Wires To Congressmen.

NEW YORK — As a result of the intensive campaign by The Cash Box to halt the Buckley bill (H.R. 3190) from being a threat to the members of the juke box industry, word reaches this publication from confidential sources that there will be "no action taken on the Buckley bill" and that "Representative Charles A. Buckley (D.-N. Y.) will not push for passage".

Naturally, these are the most heartening words yet received. They are a result of the many hundreds of wires and letters which reached Congressmen from members of the juke box trade. There is no doubt that many of these Congressmen immediately investigated the bill and also contacted Rep. Chas. A. Buckley and that, after discussions with him, learned that he would not push for action.

But, what puzzles many juke box leaders, is why Representative Buckley does not entirely withdraw his bill from the House Patents Committee if he intends to let it be shelved. The fact remains that as long as the bill is there someone, at some later date, may take advantage of it just when the members of this industry are completely lulled to sleep.

In the meantime, the trade is asked not to send any further letters or wires to their Congressmen or to Congressmen who are members of the House Patents Committee while no action is being taken. It will be up to those men who worked so hard to get Rep. Buckley to state that he would not "push for passage" of this bill to watch that no other Congressmen, who may be a member of the House Patents Committee, will push for its passage.

And, furthermore, as time goes on leaders in the trade should make it their business to get this bill removed from the Patents Committee entirely.

GOTTLIEB LISTS CMI MEMBERS

CHICAGO — Dave Gottlieb, president of Coin Machine Industries, Inc., whose headquarters are at 134 North La Salle Street, this city, is listing the entire voting membership of this organization for the benefit of all coinmen who are interested in helping the association to create a "Public Relations Bureau".

According to Mr. Gottlieb, there are eight members of CMI in the music machine division of the industry. There are ten merchandising machine manufacturers who are members also. There are twelve amusement machine manufacturers and six arcade machine manufacturers. The one, old, original weighing scale manufacturer is also a member of CMI.

"This", says Gottlieb, "is truly representative of the entire industry."

He also reports, "It is expected that this new program will attract the membership and support of all manufacturers of the various types of coin operated equipment who do not at present belong to Coin Machine Industries, Inc."

He also stated, "Many new manufacturers coming into the industry will also join up just as soon as production gets under way."

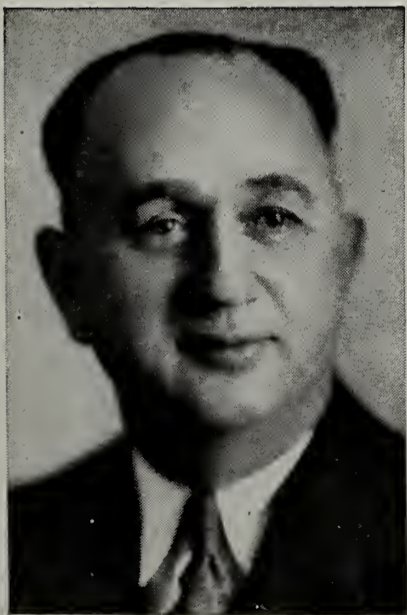

O. D. JENNINGS DISTRIBS DISPLAY NEW "CHIEFS"



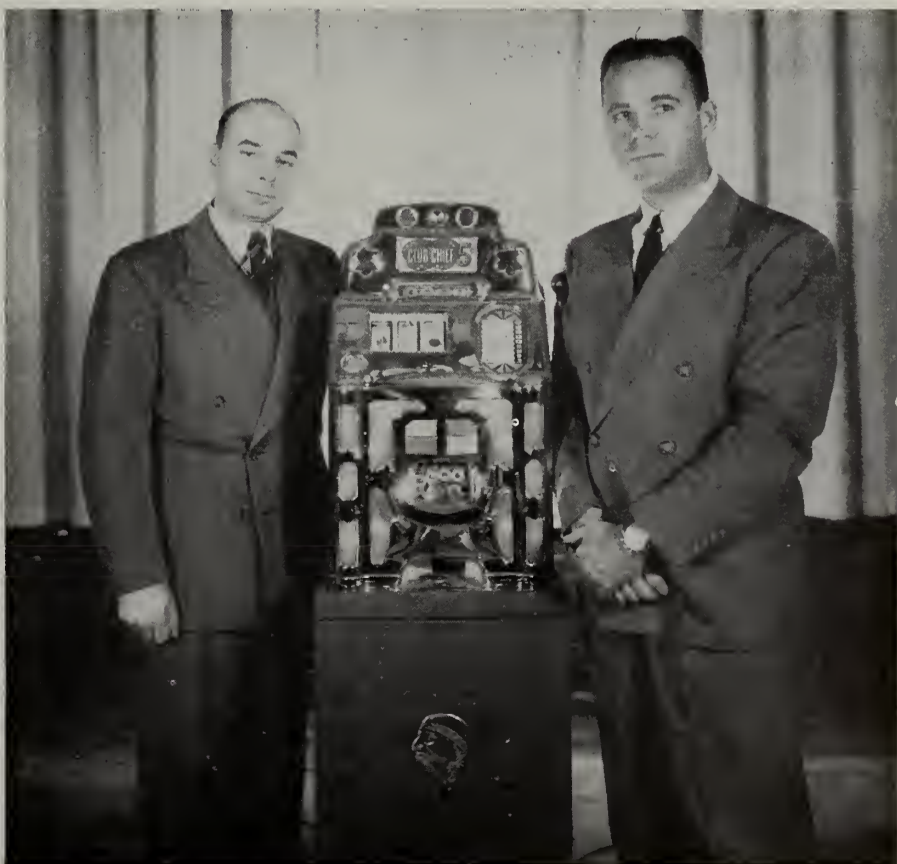

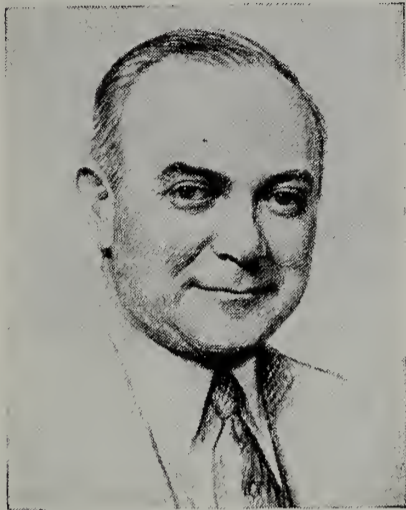

CAPT. CALLAGHAN JOINS BALLY

Former Secret Service Official Will Head Music Division

CHICAGO — Capt. Thomas J. Callaghan, who recently retired as chief of the United States Secret Service in the middle west, has joined the Bally Manufacturing Company staff as director of the Bally music division, according to a statement by Ray Moloney, Bally president.

"George Jenkins and I," Moloney said, "believe that, not only the Bally organization, but the entire industry is fortunate in attracting Tom Callaghan to our ranks. His prestige and personal popularity, among leaders in every community in the country, are definite assets to the industry as a whole. His familiarity with local conditions, not only in the middle west, but in all sections of the nation, will enable him to assist operators in solving local problems. His tremendous energy and administrative ability will directly benefit all who look to Bally for their post-war equipment."

"We know that we have in the Bally Phonograph an instrument unmatched in brilliance of style, rich tonal quality, mechanical precision and simplicity. Tom Callaghan's job is to push that wonderful Bally Multiple Music into the top rank in a hurry. His countless friends know he is the man who can do the job."

Capt. Callaghan, whose career with the Secret Service extended over a period of 37 years, is recognized as one of the most colorful and able executives in America. He numbers among his friends the civic and business leaders in practically every community in the country. He was, at various times, personally responsible for the safety of six presidents of the United States — Teddy Roosevelt, Taft, Wilson, Coolidge, Hoover and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The responsibility for protecting the King and Queen of England, Winston Churchill, Madame Chiang Kai-Shek and other distinguished visitors from foreign lands also rested on Callaghan's shoulders.

Madame Chiang Kai-Shek expressed her gratitude by presenting Capt. Callaghan with a watch of rare beauty on the face of which time is indicated in Chinese characters. The Chinese Government also honored Callaghan with a special decoration, the Order of the Banner and the Cloud, which he was unable to accept while in the service of the United States. Since his retirement, however, the State Department plans to present the decoration to him.

Of special interest to coin machine men is Capt. Callaghan's record in breaking up the largest counterfeiting rings in the country. During the war, he fought the rising tide of ration coupon counterfeiters and in June 1944 broke up the largest black-market syndicate in the middle west.

Capt. Callaghan requested permission to retire from the Secret Service just prior to the outbreak of war, but was persuaded by Frank J. Wilson, Chief of the Service, to remain in charge in Chicago until the end of the war. On his retirement from the Service, Callaghan was honored at a testimonial dinner on October 20, 1945 in the Grand Ballroom of the Stevens Hotel, Chicago. The dinner, at which Callaghan was presented with a Cadillac automobile, was attended by more than 1,500 guests, including many federal, state and city officials, as well as legal and business leaders from all parts of the country.

Discussing his appointment to the Bally staff, Capt. Callaghan expressed his faith in the future of the coin-operated equipment industry. "While with the Secret Service," Callaghan said, "I had ample opportunity to observe the development of the industry. I was very favorably impressed at the rapid growth of the industry, from a comparatively small group of men, not too sure of their status, to a large industry on a sound and stable basis.

"The industry is performing a service desired by the American people, and the American people are beginning to recognize the value of that service. I am proud to belong to this great industry and particularly proud to be associated with Ray Moloney and his aggressive, forward-looking organization."

SILBERMAN URGES UNIFIED INDUSTRY

Acclaims "The Cash Box" 70% - 30% Commission Basis. Urges Creation Of "Public Relations Bureau".

CHICAGO — Al. A. Silberman of Williams Manufacturing Co., this city, writes the following letter to The Cash Box:

"The tremendous importance of the campaign initiated by 'The Cash Box' on the 70%-30% commission idea has manifested itself thruout the length and breadth of the country.

"No longer will it be possible for an operator to run his business on a 'hit and miss' basis. With the advent of new peacetime products, prices for equipment will be, of necessity, much higher. An operator must first and foremost look to retrieve his investment. Commission arrangements must be made with locations on a sensible, sound business basis, whereby an operator can look to liquidate the cost of his equipment within a reasonable period of time.

"Locations must be properly educated to the necessity of cooperation with operators. They should know the many complex problems with which operators will be confronted in regard to high cost of equipment, servicing, taxes, etc. This can be done thru intelligent organizational work, calculated to beat down the unreasonable demands of locations.

"Operators already have experienced the favorable results of unity. Associations in various cities have already helped operators immeasurably. More associations should be organized. They will be needed, because thru this medium, a sound policy can be worked out and definitely established in any given territory wherein all operators within the framework of their particular association will be assured of a fair return on their investment.

"Authentic statistics bring out in bold relief the following facts. There are tremendous unfilled demands for goods and services which have not been available during the war — demand without precedent in the history of this country. There is plenty of money to satisfy ALL these demands. All types of buyers are 'financially liquid' and installment indebtedness is practically nil. Buyers of all kinds of goods have an insatiable hunger to purchase products and services, which have long been unsatisfied. It is reasonable to assume that very soon there will be sufficient labor, materials and facilities available to produce those things which are needed.

"This combination of circumstances has never existed in the history of this country before to a degree even approaching that of the present.

"These fundamental factors are undeniable and during the next few years will carry this country to a productive level which has never been approached in the past.

"The Coin Machine Industry must make adequate preparations to take the fullest advantage of these extraordinary conditions. There will be no place in the business for the operator with 'isolationist' tendencies — the smug non-conformist, the guy who

'goes it alone', or the one who says 'he doesn't need an association', the type of 'rugged individualist' commonly referred to as the 'lone wolf'. The truth is, they will not survive.

"The industry must gird itself for action from top down—manufacturers MUST set aside petty jealousies and personal feelings, and set an example by getting together and giving new and forceful significance to the term 'strength in unity'.

"A public relations plan, an idea so commendably put forward by 'The Cash Box', should be given immediate consideration. Operators not now belonging to an association should apply for membership at once in their respective cities. The first order of new business for 1946 in all associations should be a resolution with 'sharp teeth' adopting 'The Cash Box's' idea of 70%-30% commission and settling it once for all as a matter of permanent policy.

"The Coin Machine Industry has made a magnificent contribution to Victory, and now as we settle down to peaceful pursuits, we should all have learned by bitter experience that such evil influences as the 'Buckley Bill', ridiculous legislation directed against coin machine operators and obnoxious taxation, can be successfully stifled with a strong, unified and harmonious organization."

"Woman's Home Companion" Features Juke Box Story

NEW YORK — The "Woman's Home Companion", one of the largest women's magazines in the nation, features a story entitled, "Juke Box Jamboree" in its new February, 1946 issue now on newsstands.

The item is written by Eleanor Hiteshow and the sub-heading to this title is: "Those fabulous machines that jingle-jangle-jingle while you jitter . . . know what makes them tick? Here's the behind-the-scenes story of the juke box business —and it's a big one."

The author reports on the fact that the juke biz is becoming more important daily and that it used 30 percent of 1944's \$2,000,000 worth of record sales.

The item is featured in the "junior" section of this magazine and addressed to the many juvenile readers. It is, generally speaking, a very favorable story.

Small Town Paper Tells How Slots Helped Pay Taxes

CHITTENAGO, N. Y. — The "Times" of this community advised its readers in an editorial on January 11 that, "While most state governments have laws prohibiting slot machines, collections amounting to \$7,556,200 were received by the Internal Revenue Bureau during the 1945 fiscal year thru the \$100 tax on gambling devices.

"More than 75,000 machines were reported to have paid off in taxes during the 12 month period ending June 30, 1945.

Court Orders Seized Slots To Be Destroyed

SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH — Destruction of eight machines (six slots and two consoles) was ordered by City Judge Joseph G. Jeppson.

Judge Jeppson declared that the machines were "gambling devices kept for the purpose of being used as games of chance for money" and that for this reason they should be destroyed.

The machines pictured in the local newspaper, "Desert News", were three Brown Fronts, three Gold Chromes and two Four Bells. No one appeared to protest the destruction of the machines.

Judge Jeppson also directed the sheriff's office to hold any money found in the machines until it is determined whether the state, county or city is to receive it.

Microton Introduces New Phono Needle

STAMFORD, CONN. — The Microtone Company, a division of Connecticut Industries, this city, introduced a new "Loranium" tipped phono needle which they claim will give 6,000 perfect plays with less record wear.

The needle is packaged in a service man's record book. It will be offered to the ops thru leading distributors.

It is also reported that the Microtone Company is now ready to release its output for civilian use after having devoted practically its entire production for the military during the war years, according to E. B. Murphy, executive director of Connecticut Industries.

Branson Takes On Two Partners

LOUISVILLE, KY. — P. H. Branson and William R. Steele have joined the H. M. Branson Distributing Company on a partnership basis. The Branson company is distributor for Aireon Electronic Phonographs in Kentucky and southern Indiana. The two new partners are joining Hy Branson and Gil Brawner in the business.

P. H. Branson, younger brother of Hy Branson, has served twenty-seven months in the Seabees. Steele has just returned from thirty-six months in the Army, most of which was in the European Theater.

Young Branson, while new to the business, has already shown great adaptability as a Service Manager. His Seabees experience has already proved helpful in this field.

Steele was employed by the firm as a bookkeeper and office manager before going into the Army. He will continue in the same capacity, in addition to doing sales work.

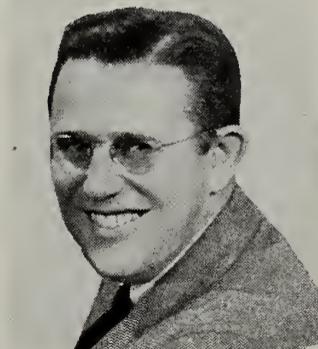

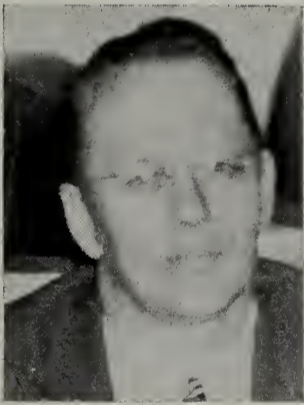

J. — In the "Town Crier" column of the local newspaper here, "The Record, the columnist reports, "Local folks found Trenton phones dead when operators were forced out by strike pickets from Western Electric. Phone booths became slot machines; didn't know whether you'd get anything or not."

MADISON WIS. PAPER SAYS IT WILL FIGHT RE- PEAL OF THOMSON LAW

MADISON, WIS. — The "Capitol Times", this city, in an editorial (Jan. 13) wrote, "The Wisconsin Supreme Court has unanimously upheld the constitutionality of the Thomson anti-gambling law. By doing so it has assured a complete victory over the slot machine crowd whose growing power had become a menace to the integrity of government in this state.

In this editorial the "Capitol Times" reports all the many publicity releases which it had featured against coinmen in the state. It also tells how County Judge Larrabee of Chippewa county held the Thomson law unconstitutional. How the case then went to the Supreme Court and was declared to be constitutional.

This paper then goes on to say, "But the fight is not over. There will be a powerful drive to repeal the law. It must be fought. There will be a need of constant vigilance to see that the law is rigidly enforced. The Capitol Times wants to serve notice now that it will be on the alert to fight on either one of these counts whenever and wherever necessary."

Coinmen who have read this editorial claim that, "Here again is a perfect example of the lack of public relations effort by the industry. If the trade would have made it a practice to cultivate its customers, that means the public, and completely explain its products and its business methods no such drastic law could ever have passed."
