# Retailers:

# Merchandise Your Records

There's a great deal more to the retailing of records than merely having the product to sell.

Unfortunately, record retailers don't always remember this.

Probably the greatest lesson that record retailers as a whole have to learn is the art of merchandising. Too often the record man is using selling ideas that went out of style twenty years ago. Many are not taking advantage of the latest practices in placing their shops and their merchandise in the most advantageous position possible before the buying public.

And this despite the fact that almost every record manufacturer today is doing his utmost to aid the retailer in his merchandising problems. All sorts of programs have been developed by these record firms. There is a store modernization plan; there are window display aids; there are inside merchandising racks which help to properly display records.

Yet many retailers are still living in the dark ages as far as selling is concerned.

Just take the case of packaged merchandise.

In the last few years, album covers

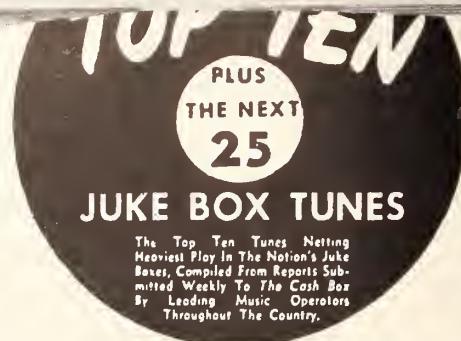
have approached the level of high art. Some covers have been spectacularly beautiful. Many have won prizes for outstanding art jobs. These covers are natural sales aids. They attract the customer, help him want the records which are inside. Yet in many many stores throughout the country these albums are stacked in bins where they are never displayed and are only sold when they are asked for. If merchandisers in other retail businesses kept their stock stored in the same way and simply waited to be asked for an item, the level of American business would be infinitely smaller than it is today.

When business slumps a little, record dealers are used to blaming it on lack of hit records which bring people into the stores. We can hardly deny that that's a factor. But it isn't the whole story. When there isn't a hit record around, the retailer should work twice as hard, experiment with creative merchandising ideas, reconsider his own methods and see whether he can somehow attract people into his store by other means.

Record retailing is still in the horse and buggy stage. If we can't make the transition to the atomic stage in one step, let's make the effort to raise it at least to the mechanized level.

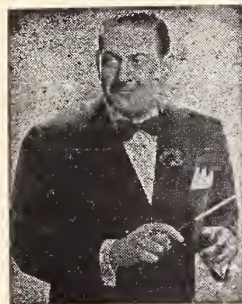

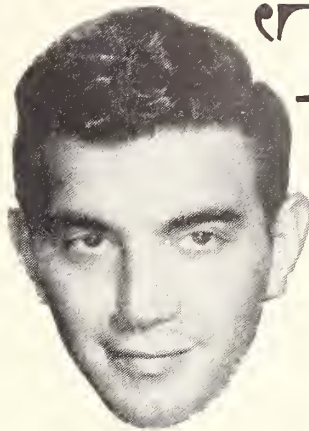

**B+** "MAMBO DE PAREE" (2:54) [Montauk ASCAP—Kennedy, Alstone] Eartha Kitt comes up with one of her strongest efforts to date in this cute mambo novelty with a French and English lyric. Clever arrangement and delivery and it could break big for the thrush.

**C+** "DO YOU REMEMBER" (3:32) [Robbins ASCAP—Brown] A stirring and moody recitation and song is tenderly styled in a hushed manner by the lark. Sultry item.

**B+** "LISTEN TO THE MOCKING BIRD" [P.D.—Hawthorne] Bobby Dukoff makes a potent showing on his first single release with a tremendous rocking rendition of a great oldie. His sax work is magnificent and knits neatly with the swinging vocal by the chorus. Terrific dance deck.

**C+** "MY SILENT LOVE" (2:32) [Famous ASCAP—Suesse, Heyman] The mood is changed to a dreamy one as the crew offers a warm piece of mood music. Great standard. Excellent coupling for the jukes.

**ELLA FITZGERALD**  
(Decca 29580; 9-29580)

**B+** "LOVER, COME BACK TO ME" (1:57) [Harms ASCAP—Romberg, Hammerstein] The queen of vocalists is as great as ever as she drives out a jazzy highspeed rendition of a great standard. Fabulous delivery. Great side that the dee jays will have a field day with.

**B+** "OLD DEVIL MOON" (2:55) [DeSylva, Brown & Henderson ASCAP—Lane, Harburg] The great stylist makes this a tremendous coupling with her exciting latin-jump version of another top standard.

**TRUDY RICHARDS**

**B+** "MERCY (Have Mercy)" (2:41) [Deerhaven ASCAP—Reichner, Ellis] Trudy Richards does a potent job with a dramatic and stirring love song. A strong side that could make the grade. Has strong possibilities.

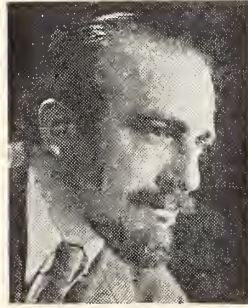

One episode is funnier than the next, and we'll lay odds that the disk will sell as well if not better than the Bloopers. Some of the conversations make you bust. Dealers oughta grab hold of these quick.

The Hi-Lo's, the most exciting, most polished and most talented of the new vocal groups, display their wealth of talent on their second LP release. They mix up four up-beat standards with four romantic oldies and come up with an LP that's just the "most." Their sound is beautiful and they blend as though they've been working together for decades. In addition to the end sound, their arrangements by Gene Puerling (one of the quartet) are just the greatest. Disk jockeys are just wild about the group, as witnessed by The Cash Box 1955 DJ Poll in which the Hi-Lo's copped top honors in the most promising new vocal group category. And this platter will supply plenty of playing time for the DJ's. Frank Comstock deserves much credit on this LP for his orkings.

It's a fine recording of the score penned by Victor Young and Stella Unger for the Gant Gaitner-William Bacher production. Gloria DeHaven comes over warmly on two of the score's top tunes "If It's A Dream" and "Where Is That Someone For Me." Robert Clary is refreshing on "C'est La Vie" and teams well with Patricia Hammerlee on "Love Sneaks Up On You." Ricardo Montalban's best effort is "A Man With A Dream." The score, on the whole, is most inviting and will offer many hours of listening pleasure.

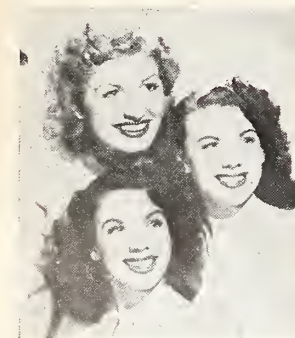

The first disk on which Clyde has solo billing, pairing "Hot Ziggitty" and "Everyon'e Laughing," goes on release this week. An interesting sidelight on these tunes is the fact that both were written especially for Clyde's talents by Winfield Scott, creator of "Tweedle Dee" and "Bop Ting A Ling."

McPhatter is presently serving with the coast artillery at a Grand Island, N. Y., installation, utilizing his off-duty time to wax for Atlantic.

Meanwhile the Drifters, who have been engaged in a series of highly successful one-night and theater appearances on their own since Clyde

entered the service in May, 1954, will continue to perform under the aegis of George Treadwell and the Gale agency. Their first disk without Clyde will be issued by Atlantic as a special release early in August.

## Benny Hunting For His Old Clarinet

HOLLYWOOD—Benny Goodman is looking for a clarinet that was made in 1935 by Henri Selmer of Paris. The instrument was used by Benny to make the original recordings of his theme song, "Let's Dance" and such famous Goodman numbers as "One O'Clock Jump."

Now Benny wants it for recording the sound track for the 1935-36 scenes in Universal-International's "The Benny Goodman Story," the film version of his life which will star Steve Allen. It isn't a case of sentiment; seems that BG can't match the same tone of his early recording with his newer model instrument by the same maker.

If you have, or know the whereabouts, of a 17-key, six-ring Selmer clarinet with the serial number L3682 engraved on the back, write or wire Benny at Universal-International, Universal City, California. Benny merely wants to borrow the horn, but will also gift the person with a de Luxe Selmer Omega model which sells at \$500.

SCHENECTADY, N. Y.—A few months ago, a little six-year-old lad named Timmy Sloan was hospitalized as a result of a horrible accident in which he suffered third degree burns. Timmy is the son of Linda Sloan, secretary of Earle Pudney, WGY dee jay in this city.

Because of the tremendous amount of money necessary for doctor bills to help save Timmy, Earle Pudney started a one-man campaign in behalf of the fatherless child. He immediately informed his listeners of the catastrophe and asked them to help Timmy by sending pennies for the "Timmy Hospital Fund."

Paul Siegel, prexy of Symphony House and Rex Music Publishing Companies, was on a dee jay tour for George Liberace when he met Pudney and got word of the campaign.

Siegel had a letter printed up telling Timmy's story and sent it out to more than 1,000 jockeys throughout the country requesting that they inform their listeners about the Timmy Fund. And at present, many people are behind the campaign.

Timmy is at the Ellis Hospital in this city and will go to the Sunnyview Rehabilitation Hospital as soon as his condition is under control.

## Leahy Sues On Arrangement

NEW YORK—Attorney Martin J. Machat, representing Unique Records exec Joe Leahy, has instituted suit against Mercury Records and Denise Lor for infringement of the arrangement on the Denise Lor recording of "St. Catherine" on the Mercury label.

Leahy recorded the tune with Miss Lor on the Major label but the record was never released. When Miss Lor went to Mercury the song was cut and the suit claims that the exact arrangement made by Leahy was used.

The suit calls for an injunction restraining Mercury from distributing, selling or promoting the record.

## Victor Issues 2nd Pre-Recorded Tape Release

NEW YORK—RCA Victor has made its second tape release available to the public, Lawrence W. Kanaga, Vice-President and Operating Manager of the RCA Victor Record Division, has announced.

Issued more than a year following the shipment of the first tape release, RCA Victor's new series will provide substantial savings to the tape customer and highlight the continuing interest which has been developed in this new market, Kanaga said.

Seven of the 11 selections scheduled for release this month will contain classical music. Three of the seven will be in stereophonic sound. The remainder of the releases will consist of albums which currently are best-sellers in the popular division.

The new tapes will carry substantially lower suggested list prices than the earlier reels. Pricing is determined by the amount of tape required for the specific selection.

The 17 titles issued in March, 1954, also will be repackaged, reprinted and turned out in their new format together with the 11 new items.

I was under oxygen during most of my trip to Hamburg, Germany. In the emotional and physical elevation induced by Icelandic Airlines, (the line of the romping seals) I found myself beginning to think about Hamburg, N. Y., a hamlet devoted to the manufacture of dubious jewelry. This did not preoccupy me for long, because reflection does not come easy to me, a man dedicated to talking at length and frequently to no purpose. But nevertheless, when I recovered from the exhilaration of the heights and the unexpected fact that I found myself in a situation where breaking silence would be like smashing a mirror at Versailles, I swooped down upon Hamburg which was as noisy as my native heath.

In the lounge of something called the Atlantic Hotel—to which no boardwalk was attached—I heard a trio called "Drei, Drei Jools" (with a J yet!) playing "Nearer, My God to Thee" with a four-four beat that really sent me. As a matter of fact, it did send two of the customers in the place as far as they could go, but the shooting was hushed by the really splendid German police who are evidently accustomed to this sort of contrempeps.

When the Dry Jools had finished their turn, I really felt like a crazy cat. At that point I headed for Berlin. But I found no peace for I encoun-

tered "Crazy Otto" a real gehen guy. He was playing in Bully Buhlan's Hideaway. He was bringing the walls down with a rendition of "I Love Paris in the Summertime." You could hardly blame him. It is my opinion that "Crazy Otto" has more talent than you might suspect, but I'm no Valvert and I didn't have time during my stopover in Germany to really discover what made Crazy Otto tick, if indeed he did.

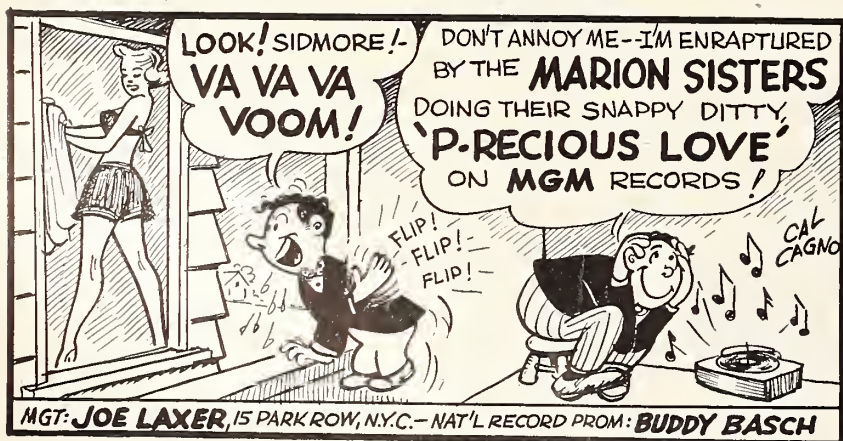
But I had to be off, for Rome was a-calling, and while I didn't meet any LoLabrigidas I did hear some extraordinary jazz lined out over a questionable ravioli at the Palazzi. This particular quintet including an accordion, violin, mouth organ, clarinet and wine-bearer, specialized in a pleasant little Verdi number called "I Love Paris in the Summertime." I figured that I could take a hint as well as the next one so I boarded a plane for Paris. The big song there was "Sh-Boom." I did not stay long.

It was an interesting trip. By the way, in my headlong pursuit to New York and obviously to that nest of singing birds known as WINS I paused briefly in London where most of the leading music publishers attended me. This is a rather odd thing to happen to a d.j. Come in, Irving Berlin, and others.

# Mercury Distributors Meet In Chi; Wing Holds First Distributor Meet

CHICAGO—Mercury Records has called a meeting of all its distributors for July 18th at the Conrad Hilton Hotel in Chicago. The all-day session will be guided by Irving B. Green, Mercury President, who will lead the distributor meeting in discussions of the label's future plans.

Mercury distributors and branch managers from all over the United States will gather in Chicago for the all-day session. During the same week Wing Records, subsidiary label of the Mercury Record Corporation, will stage its first national distributor meeting in Chicago. This will be held on July 19th. The meeting will take place in the Wing Records' suite of rooms at the Conrad Hilton Hotel during the National Association of Music Merchants annual convention.

Meanwhile, the label has added three more artists to its roster, and named a midwestern promotion manager. The latter post has been filled by Eddie Mathews, formerly with the James H. Martin distributing firm in Chicago. Mathews will work under national promotion manager Warren Ketter. A few weeks ago, Wing named Arnold

Mayers as Eastern Division Advertising & Promotion Manager.

Newest artists on the label are vocalist Frankie Castro, a female vocal group assigned to the rhythm and blues field—The Honeytones—ad pianist Sid Nierman. The latter is a well-known staff musician in the Chicago area and is noted for his honky-tonk piano style. First Wing disks by Castro and Nierman are being rushed to deejays and dealers immediately.

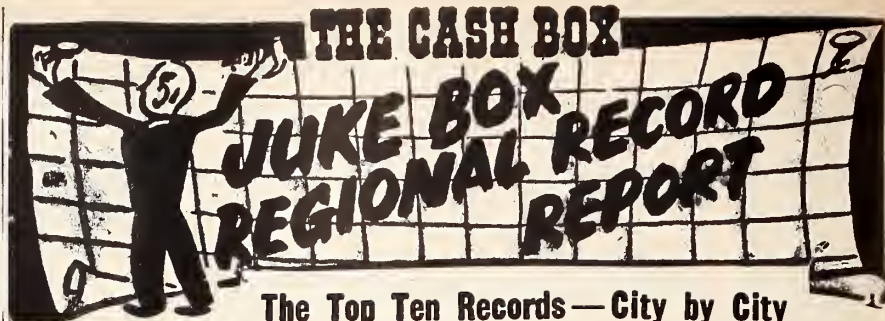

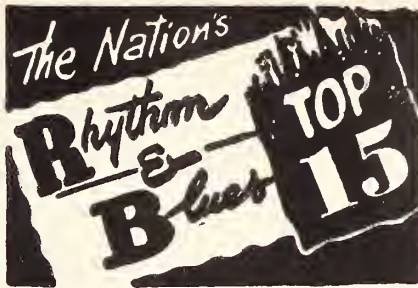

## "Encyclopedia of Jazz" Set For Publication

NEW YORK—"The Encyclopedia of Jazz," a 250,000-word volume on which jazz critic Leonard Feather has been working for the past year, will be published by Horizon Press Inc. on September 5, it was announced this week.

Designed to serve as a reference book while simultaneously appealing to jazz fans and record buyers, the encyclopedia will include 1065 alphabetized biographies of musicians and singers from the dawn of jazz to the present day. Lists of LP records and musicians' addresses will also be included.

Other features are a factual history of jazz; a technical chapter analyzing the musical foundations of jazz; a basic library of fifty LP records; a glossary of terms used by musicians; a comprehensive list of record companies' addresses and a list of domestic and foreign magazines and books. There will be about 100 picture pages with over 200 photographs, old and new.

A unique feature will be a day-to-day listing of musicians' birthdays as a service to disk jockeys and others who wish to salute the artists on their anniversaries.

Duke Ellington has written a foreword for the Encyclopedia, which will retail for \$10.

"It might be of interest to you to know that the recent price change has given the 45's a push upward, accounting for 60% of all sales to operators.

"It is our honest opinion that this trend will continue.

"Needless to say, we are pleased with this upswing in 45 sales, as the latter are much easier to handle, present no problem of breakage, and save all parties concerned quite substantially on transportation costs."

**B** "DO - BE - DO - BE - WOP - WOP" (2:31) [Gallo Otis BMI—] A fast jump that comes out a fair side, but provides the necessary dance beat for the kids.

They'll be lining up distributors for the diskery at the show. The boys will hold a dinner for all their distribs at Lin Burton's Steak House on Tuesday and will have open house at their Palmer House suite. They'll also be spinning their new Ruth Brown, Joe Turner, Clyde McPhatter and Al Hibbler releases. One of the Ruth Brown sides is a cover of a hot r & b item. . . Herman Lubinsky, Savoy prexy, just barely escaped the arms of Mr. Death last week. At four in the morning, he went fishing and his clothing got caught on the dock as he stepped into his boat. He was hanging in the water, unconscious, when someone passed by and saw him. He's all better now and will be at the convention. . . George Goldner, whose Eddie Barclay Tico platter "The Bandit" is starting to catch in New Jersey and New York, will introduce a new Puente and Afro Cuban release at the NAMM. Puente's release couples

"Coco Seco" and "Los Marcianos". . . Mercury keeps riding high with Dinah Washington, the Platters and Ella Johnson. And Bobby Shad informs us that the Sarah Vaughan and Clifford Brown with Strings LP's are going wild on Em Arcy. . . The new Paradise label is getting off to a flying start. The Harptones waxing of "Life Is But A Dream" is starting to catch big all around the country. . . Groove is coming out with a two sider by the sister team, the Two Sweethearts. The girls were formally called the Copperettes. Bob Rolontz left on a trip to Atlanta and Nashville where he will record Piano Red and a new group tagged the Cherokees on Groove. He'll be back later this month. . . Jubilee's amazing vocalist Del'a Reese has been booked for the Howard Miller Chi Theatre package that will start a two-week stint on Aug. 19. She'll be starred with Pat Boone and the Meadowlarks. . . Jack Angel and Al Silver will introduce a new group to their distribs at the NAMM. They're called the Turbans and have just waxed "Let Me Show You Around My Heart" and "When You Dance" for Herald, and the partners expect big things from the disk.

## CHICAGO:

A noted R&B distrib puts it this way — "The people who buy these records do so for emotional purposes. There's no seasonal slump here like you might find with pop music. They don't buy a record because it's the latest one out, but because, at the time, it appeals to their emotional need. They hear it, it happens to fit their mood, so consequently they buy it. Surprisingly simple, but an important thing to remember when you deal in this business." . . Gale Agency getting a package deal together featuring, Billy Boy, The Spaniels, The Eldorados and Tommy Dean. . . "Abner" of Vee-Jay Records reports The Eldorados latest release, "At My Front Door," "Clickin' like crazy." This is backed with "What's Buggin' You Baby," penned by Bob Drews, local deejay, and the first pop tune to be recorded by Vee-Jay. . . Nat Cole booked into the Chi Thitter starting Sept. 9, after his appearance at the Indianapolis State Fair. . . George Leaner, United Record Distribs, busy traveling between Chi and their Indianapolis office. George tells us, "Biz there really goin' great." He went on to say, "In the past few years there's been a tremendous uptrend in the R&B field in that location. Five or six years ago the people there seemed to have no sales incentive. Indianapolis was more or less dependent on Chicago. Now all that has changed. Since we opened our office there, we've discovered a definite sales potential for R&B. "And," said George, "We not only have

done very well but also helped bolster the other fellows income. . . Which only proves, competition is still the greatest thing in the world." . . The Danderliers continue to climb the Hot Charts with their latest States release, "Shu-Wop."

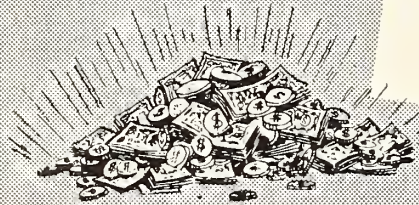

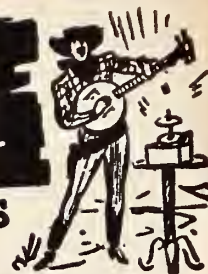

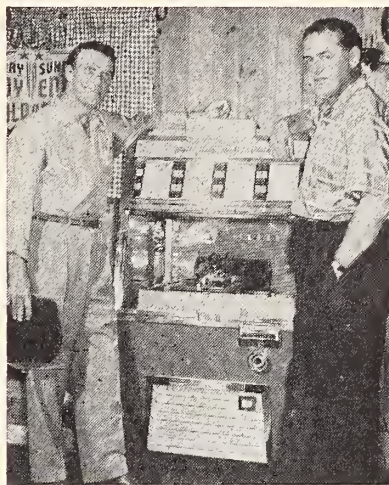

The Heilicher Brothers also operate the Advance Music Company and distribute the Mercury line as well as the Soma label which they press themselves.

**"Texas" On Its Way**

NEW YORK—It seems that in the music and entertainment industry, things happen in a glamorous way. And the story behind the tune "Yellow Rose Of Texas" is no exception.

About a year ago, Columbia Records issued an album of Confederate Songs under the direction of A & R executive Goddard Lieberson. Bill Randle played a few of the tunes from the album on his show a few weeks ago. While these numbers were being played, publisher Phil Kahl was in Cleveland listening to the show. The PD tune "Yellow Rose" stuck in Kahl's mind. He picked up a copy of the album and took it back to New York.

He had Don George set lyrics to the tune over the weekend, and brought the lyric version to Mitch Miller because of the fine job Miller had done previous on his tune "Napoleon".

Miller cut it on Thursday of last week and was so enthused with the results, that he had 100,000 copies pressed and shipped before dee jay copies were sent out.

Other versions of the tune are coming out fast. Johnny Desmond's Coral platter has already been released with other versions on Capitol, Mercury, and Decca set for the near future.

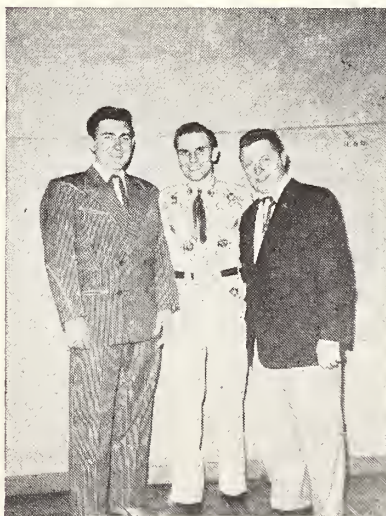
Along with Dean, Mercury acquired country fiddler Buck Ryan, who recently won the title of "National Champion Fiddler" in an open com-

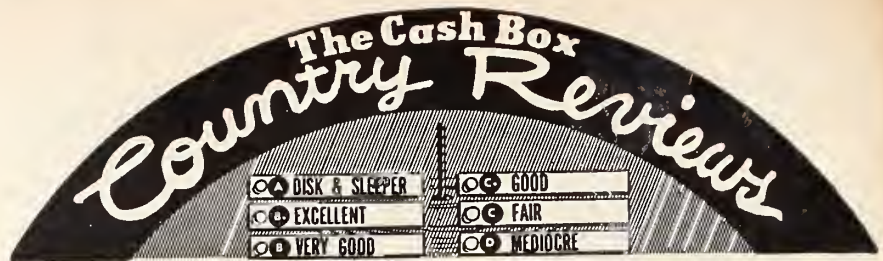

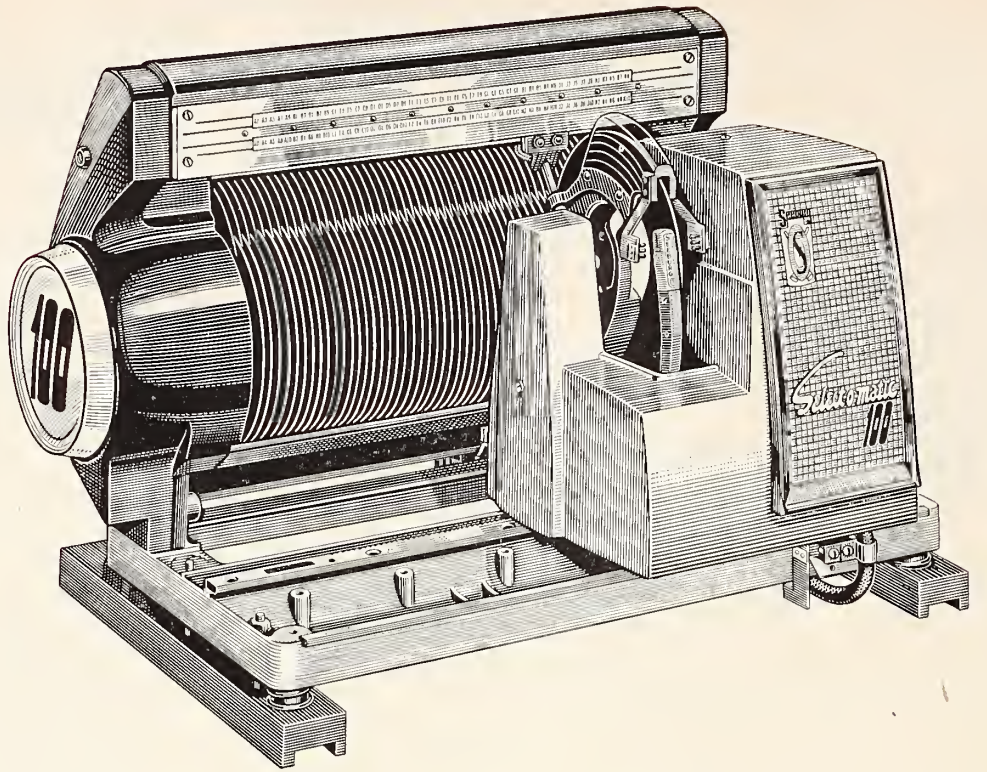

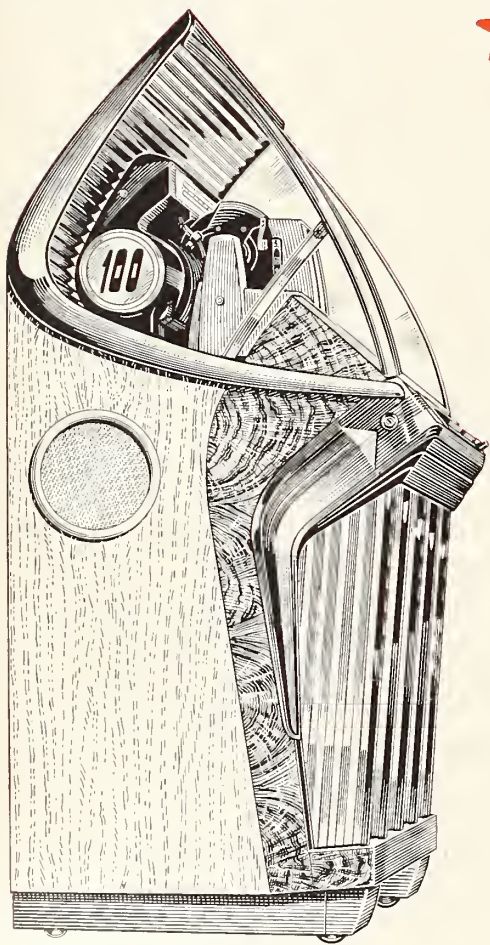

## Here and There

DETROIT, MICH.—It's quite evident that other industries, besides the coin machine industry, have to solve the problem of complacency and laziness. A publicity director of a firm in this city explains his secret weapon, a built-in "Goose-O-Tron". This weapon, he describes as "manufactured from industry, imagination, enthusiasm and plain hard work. It is the element in the successful personality that never lets him think that yesterday's way is good enough for today. It's a device that consistently reminds him that his customers are people not just figures in a statistical report. And that no two of them are alike. Further, it tells them that change and improvement are the life-blood of this fast moving world."

NEW YORK—One of the ways to determine just how good or bad business is going is to watch freight car loadings. The 13 Regional Shippers Advisory Boards covering the entire United States, released an estimate this week of just what to expect for the 3rd Quarter. It indicates the biggest spurt in freight carloadings compared to a year ago period. The estimates pointed to a 10.4 per cent gain in loadings of the 32 principal commodity groups compared to the third quarter of 1954. The estimates indicated loadings of 7,515,231 cars against 6,805,819 in the 1954 period.

DETROIT, MICH.—If you've had any trouble driving anywhere these summer week-ends, it's easy to see why. General Motors reported this past week that its car divisions sold a record breaking 1,947,906 new cars, and 2,510,980 used cars in this year's first six months. The former record for new car sales was 1,475,943, sold in the first half of 1950. The old record for used car sales was 2,170,791 delivered in the first half of 1941.

NEW YORK—For operators in any community in the country worrying about their patrons being "away on vacations", a statement made by one of the executives of a large advertising agency, studying this matter, is of considerable interest. "Many firms believe that a great many people are away on vacations during the summer, leaving a void in city buying. This is not true. Our study shows that at most, only 10% of a community's population is away at any one time, and some of these absences are made up by visitors to these communities."

# SUNSET FOR SPECIALIZED OPERATIONS

## Ops No Longer Specialize in but One Type of Equipment. Diversification is Now the Rule—Not the Exception.

The year of 1955 will probably be remembered by a great many thruout the industry as the year the sun set on specialized operations.

Diversification is the rule—not the exception—today.

Few, if any operators, are confining themselves to but one type of equipment, whether that be amusement games, kiddie rides, music or various types of vendors.

For some years this was a general expression, "Oh, that operator, he operates nothing but cigarette machines."

Few such expressions are heard these days. The usual statement is, "He operates just about everything. From coke vendors, to hot coffee and cigarette machines—as well as games and phonographs."

This came about when the operator began to realize that the location was more important than the equipment he featured.

In short, it was the location (or the patrons of that location) that was bringing the money into the machine. By and of itself the machine meant nothing.

As this began to sink in ever deeper into the operator's conscience he played up to the location itself. He learned that it paid him to feature everything that certain good locations wanted and needed to help stimulate the location's business as well as to bring himself a better income from that location.

He installed the phonograph and wall boxes, and added the cigarette machine and soft drink dispenser, and later a hot coffee vendor if it could be used, and also a hot certain that his games were the games the location featured.

The location's importance is growing greater every day. As taverns close here and there about the nation and as other locations are lost to the industry, the operator realizes he must concentrate more effort on each one of his individual spots, so that he is assured a decent return on his investment.

It is not at all surprising to wander into an operator's place of business and find games, vendors and music equipment neatly stocked and ready to be moved into any location that develops in his territory.

The average operator has learned that diversification has paid off. He finds that when play falls down on one type of equipment, usually the other will hold up. In this fashion he maintains a more steady income thruout the year.

It is not at all surprising to meet operators at a vending machine showing one day and at a music show the next. Operators have diversified their routes to the point where they are interested in all sorts of equipment—as long as this is the equipment their locations request and require.

Diversification has also proved very helpful to all the manufacturers. They realize that sometimes one product may be dependent on another for more steady and sustained income and that being able to pay for their machines may be due to the fact that other of the operator's machines were able to earn just that much more.

All in all diversification is proving more profitable all around because there is one definite resultant effect of diversifying any route and that is the operator, himself, pays more close attention to his locations and this, if anything at all, will help assure him a more profitable future.

# With Dime Play:

# PROGRAMMING PHONOS MORE IMPORTANT NOW THAN EVER

NEW YORK—Programming music machines is one of the most important functions of a music operator. The manufacturers turn out the greatest playing, the most attractive and the finest sound producing machines. Patrons are drawn to the machine because of the time and effort the manufacturers put into its design and mechanisms.

Operators pay large sums of money for these attractive phonographs, and the least they can do to implement the value of their machines is to see to it that each machine has the best money-making records inserted. The next step is to see that the little strips are correctly inserted into the program holder (and incidentally make sure the machine is dusted and clean looking so as not to detract from the beauty that is so instrumental in drawing the patron to the machine in the first place.)

During the past several years, music operators have come to realize, more and more, the great importance of giving their patrons the music they want to pay their money to hear. With the multi-selection machines of these past few years, the opportunity is there. The operator must use it to the best advantage.

One of the country's most famous music personalities, in a recent discussion with your editor, pointed out a condition which we all realize subconsciously, but have never followed thru seriously. This woman, traveling all over the world—in the smallest, as well as the largest cities, knows the music tastes of the public intimately. She has records in juke boxes. In every town, hamlet or city, she watches the records in music machines.

"Today, with our present method of travel" she stated, "distance means nothing. One day we're playing in the United States, and the next we're in Europe, or on the way to Australia. In all of our travels, we find that the music tastes of the public is generally the same. Some prefer the pop tunes of the day, others prefer standard hits of years ago, and we found that some patrons of juke boxes want to listen to classical and operatic tunes. With the juke boxes today, capable of serving such large number of selections to the public, it seems to me that a certain number of selections should be devoted to every possible type of music. In that way, the owner of the machine would be able to cash in on every angle. We know that, for the most part, the public wants to hear the pop tunes of the day (for which we're mighty thankful), but at the same time, there are lulls, in which certain customers would insert coins for music other than these tunes. In that way, the machine would continue to earn money for the owner."

There's a great deal of sense in what our record artist friend says. We realize that the operator must go with the records that bring in the money—and that every location, like every human being, has different problems. But, we say that if the operator would take each location, study the patrons who play the phonographs, and give them the music they want, they would increase their collections. And, they might find, as our friend states, that some locations would bring in additional money, if certain classical, opera, and foreign language records were included in their programming.

[Also known as the "C. M. I. (Coin Machine Industry) BLUE BOOK" and "The Confidential Price Lists"]

**FOREWORD:** Many times, wide differences appear in the quotation of high and low prices of certain equipment. Like any true reporter "The Price Lists" can only feature the market prices as they are quoted. "The Price Lists" act exactly the same as the market quotation board at the Stock Exchange—posting the prices as they are quoted for the past week, regardless of how much they may seem to be out of line. Some prices do not change for months. "The Price Lists," rather than show no price, retain the last known quotations for such equipment so that the subscriber at least has the last known prices as a basis to work with. Prices may be very widely divergent. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth \$150.00 whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but \$75.00. Of course, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, and condition of equipment must be taken into consideration. (Some equipment offered by outstanding firms, having a reputation for shipping completely reconditioned machines, will be offered at higher prices than others, due to the added cost of reconditioning.) "The Price Lists" reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depends on the subscriber to make average price adjustments to fit the peculiarities of his territory.

**METHOD:** "The Price Lists" should be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price quoted for the week; Second price listed is highest price quoted.

**FOREIGN BUYERS:** To cover cost of packing, crating, shipping, etc., figure an additional \$20 to \$25 on Pin Games—and \$25 to \$30 on Phonographs.

### REGARDING SELLING PRICES

## IMPORTANT!

Reports received indicate that, in some cases, purchasers become upset due to the fact that they cannot, many times, buy equipment listed in the lower price brackets. Sometimes sellers of machines listed at from \$10.00 to \$25.00 ask from \$50.00 up to \$75.00 and even more for these very same machines. Purchasers of such equipment must realize that machines in the very low priced categories are much worn to be priced at these low figures. To completely recondition such machines, the reconditioner must add onto his price the cost of transportation to obtain these machines, the labor, parts and supplies needed to recondition the machines, plus the cost of cartons, crates and labor for packing and shipping of the machines, in addition to a decent profit which will, in most cases, raise the price of a \$10.00 to \$20.00 machine to anywhere from \$50.00 to \$75.00 and up. In the case of arcade and kiddie ride machines these may even be higher due to the fact that many of the parts have to be made by hand or contracted for at some machinist shop, since manufacturers of many of the old arcade machines and kiddie rides are no longer in business and it is impossible to obtain parts for reconditioning. Purchasers of such equipment should take these facts into consideration and, at the same time, should also realize that many buyers today have their own repair and reconditioning departments as well as experienced mechanics, such buyers will purchase machines "as is", at prices quoted by the trade at large, and recondition the machines themselves to meet their own operating standards.

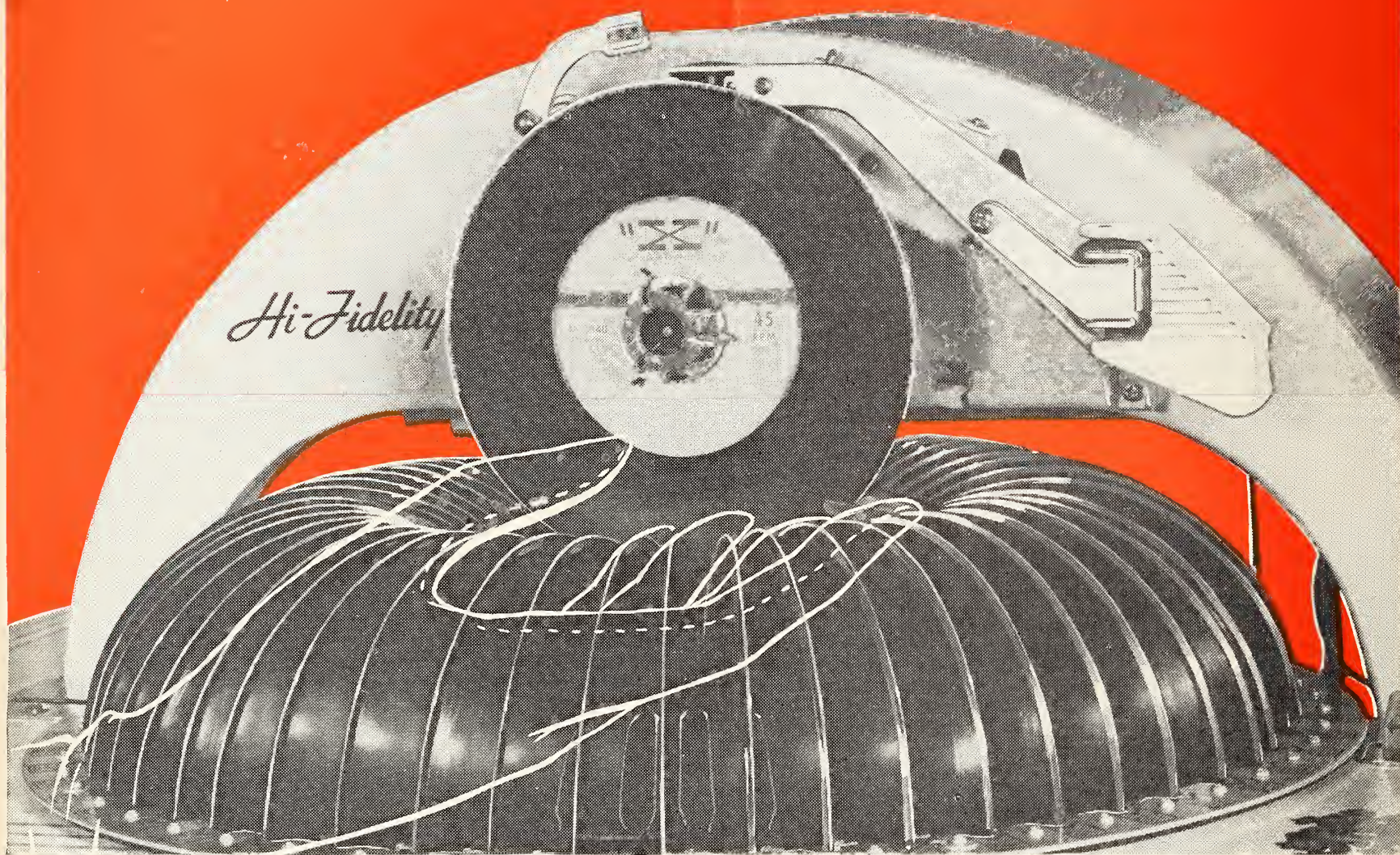

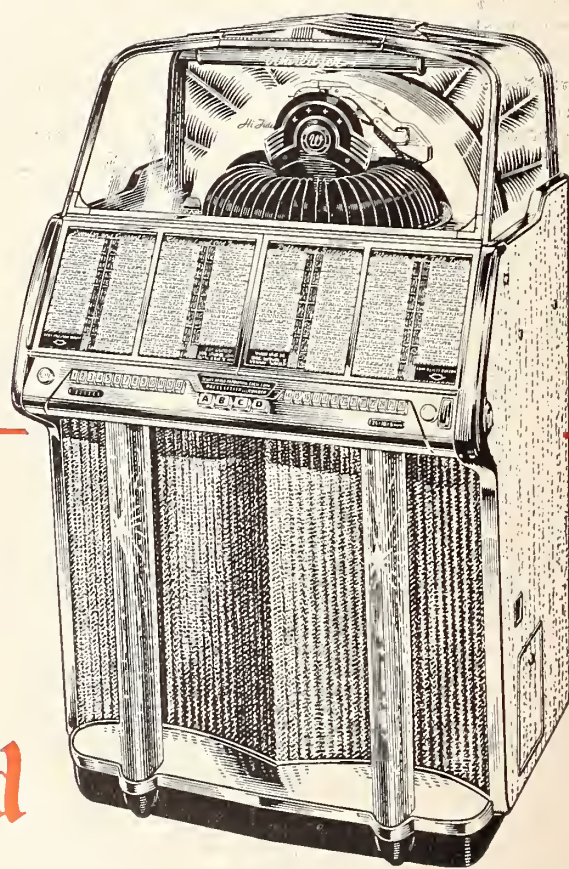

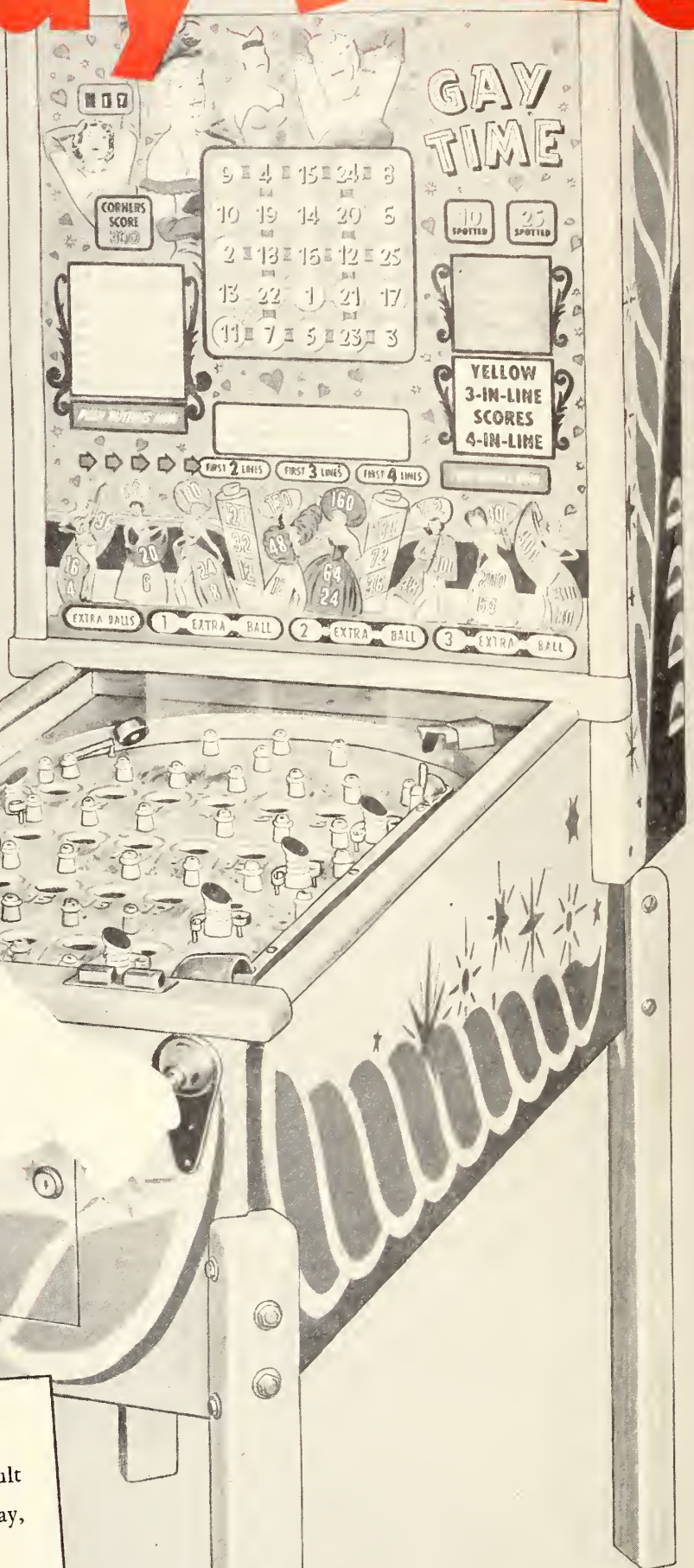
