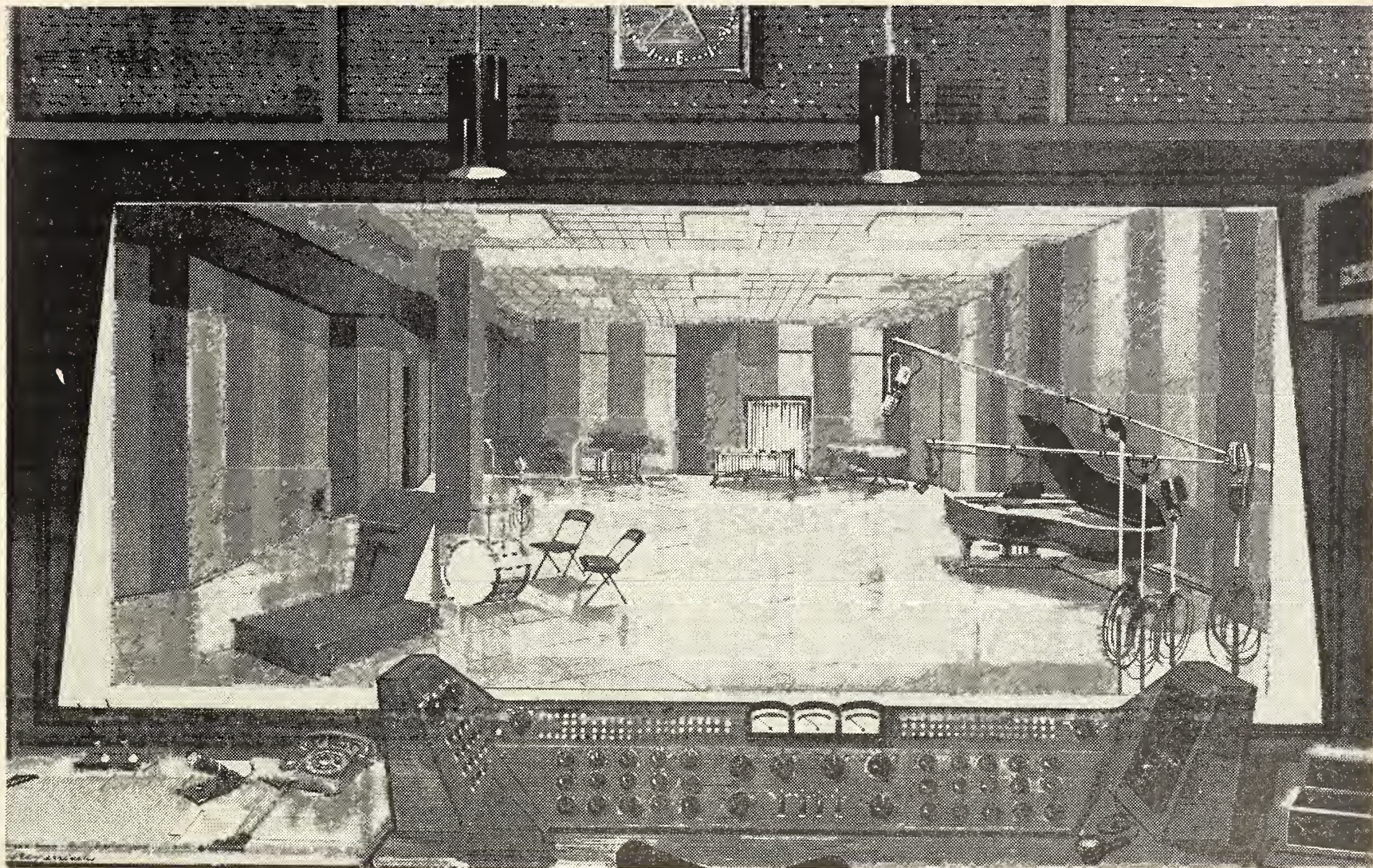

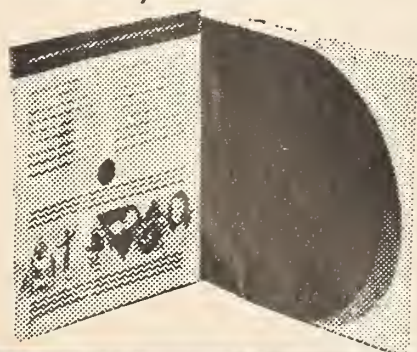

Col. Miami Intros 33 Mono Singles, 4-Track Tapes, Fall Distrib & LP Programs

NEW YORK—The introduction of a seven-inch 33 1/2 rpm monaural single record, the inauguration of four-track stereo tape releases, and a new market development program highlighted Columbia Records' annual sales convention held last week in Florida. More than 400 Columbia executives, distributors and distributor salesmen, including representatives from 15 countries, gathered in Miami Beach to witness previews of new Fall product and merchandising programs, keyed to the convention theme, "Columbia—the People's Choice."

Announcing Columbia's decision to manufacture and market the 33 single, Goddard Lieberman, label president, decided to issue its single 33 as a stimulus to the singles market.

"Single records continue to be the most significant media for the introduction and development of new popular music, talents and personalities," he pointed out.

"Today, an ever increasing majority of adults purchase only 33 rpm album packages. As a result, singles have become the domain of the very young. And now, even they are turning to albums in increasing numbers and show a reluctance to buy both with the mechanical difficulty of interchanging 45's with LP's.

"The 33 rpm single record which automatically interchanges with 12" albums offers the most promising avenue for recapturing this vital but diminishing market. The first step in this direction was taken exactly one year ago when Columbia introduced to the stereo phonograph owner the Stereo Seven 33 single. Despite a limited market, the 7" 33 concept received gratifying consumer acceptance—and even more, immediate acceptance in the juke box industry.

"Now, reaching out to the broadest possible phonograph ownership market, Columbia introduces its monaural 33 single record. Starting with our next release, each new Columbia single will be released simultaneously in both 45 and 33 monaural. In addition, our top selling singles will continue to be released in Stereo Seven.

"In introducing Stereo Seven, Columbia took a bold step—alone. This time other manufacturers, seeing the urgent need to revitalize the singles market and agreeing with Columbia that 33 singles are the media with which to do it, have already announced their intention to produce monaural 33 singles. However, I am pleased to say that again Columbia will be the first major company to actually market these records and have them available In-Stores."

Lieberman also announced Columbia will begin releasing four-track stereo tapes in September. All subsequent new tape releases, as well as selected earlier hit albums, will be available in both two-and-four track stereophonic editions (see separate story for releases).

Convention business also included Columbia's fall marketing program for its distributors. During August and September, Columbia will offer its distributors re-stocking incentives pertaining to all items in the current

catalog. Stocking incentives will also cover all Columbia new releases scheduled to be in stores during those months. Columbia's fall program also includes special dating terms which will be in effect October, November and December. Restocking incentives and special terms, as announced, will be passed on by Columbia's distributors to eligible dealers in their respective markets.

In order to continue its policy of selling product through, rather than to, the dealers, Columbia will equip its salesmen with a new and improved "Profit Pack." The "Profit Pack," first introduced at last year's convention, proved highly successful in stimulating sales through the dealer, the label said. This year's additions to the new "Profit Pack" will include special tools, equipment and materials designed to make Columbia's salesmen merchandising specialists.

For additional in-store promotion Columbia has developed a complete new line of dealer merchandising aids which will feature all albums in the August and September lists of releases. Featured among these releases in the popular category are Tony Bennett, The Brothers Four, Johnny Cash, Miles Davis, Doris Day, Percy Faith, Mitch Miller, Johnny Mathis and many more. In all, Columbia will issue 33 popular albums in the convention release during August and September.

Special Masterworks display material has also been developed for "in store" merchandising designed to feature new classical fall products. Also available will be special material for use in connection with the forthcoming transcontinental tour by Leonard Bernstein and the New York Philharmonic. There will be 27 Masterworks albums including performances by such artists as Leonard Bernstein, Eileen Farrell, Zino Francescatti, Eugene Ormandy, Isaac Stern, Rudolf Serkin, Bruno Walter.

Strohman To New Cap-Post

HOLLYWOOD — Capitol Records' Stephen H. Strohman has been named the newly-created post of director of inventory control, it was announced last week by Bruce Rozet, Capitol's administrator of management planning.

Strohman is resigning as vice president, member of the board of directors and director of operations planning for Capitol Records Distributing in order to accept the CRI post.

According to Rozet, Strohman will be responsible for studies and reports on all factors pertaining to control of inventory for Capitol. In his new post, he will report directly to Rozet.

Strohman joined CRDO in 1949 as a sales representative at that company's Hartford branch. In 1957 he was appointed assistant national operations manager, with headquarters at the Capitol Tower, Hollywood. In September, 1959, he was elected a vice president of CRDO and appointed national operations manager. In January, 1960, he was appointed to his most recent post, director of operations planning, CRDO.

Westons Form Character Merchandising-Promo Firm

NEW YORK—A new character merchandising-public relations agency has been organized by vet promo men Stanley and Jay Weston. Associated with the Westons in the new venture—tagged Weston Merchandising Association—is theatrical publicist Temple Texas.

Currently represented by the agency are The Kingston Trio, Capitol's star songsters, and Soupy Sales, a kiddie attraction over the ABC-TV network.

Stanley Weston was former director of Merchandising for Stone Associate. Jay Weston will continue as of Weston Associates Public Relations Co., which represents such personalities as Debbie Reynolds, Peggie Lee, Alan Ladd, Glenn Ford, Paul Anka and others.

Cadena To Bluesville As Prestige Expands Subsid

BERGENFIELD, N.Y.—In a move to expand his Bluesville line, Robert Weinstock, Prestige Records' topper, has hired Ozzie Cadena to handle the promo, recording, sales, and finding of new talent for the subsid. Cadena was for many years A&R man with Savoy Records.

Though Prestige started Bluesville primarily as a folk line, during recent months sales have spread into the R&B field, according to Weinstock. Such sales have involved three 45's: "Don't Ever Love" by Lonnie Johnson; "Connections" by Mildred Anderson; "Stranger Here" by Brownie McGee & Sonny Terry.

Cadena will fly around the country visiting key R&B areas promoting the singles, and at the same time will scout for new talent and do actual recordings in some of the cities visited.

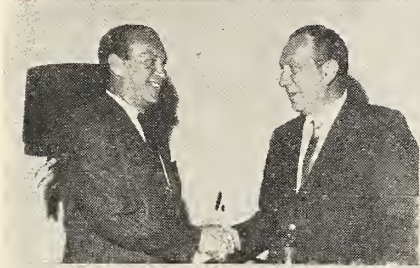

MGM Unveils "Starpower" LP Release At Puerto Rico Distrib Meet; 100% Attendance

NEW YORK—With attendance that included every one of its distributors, MGM Records unveiled its "Starpower" LP line-up—consisting of twenty-nine LP's—at a distrib meet held last week at the Dorado Beach Hotel in Puerto Rico. Meet marked the second consecutive year MGM has had 100% attendance and participation at its distrib convention.

Though at presstime the full tally was incomplete, Sidney Brandt, vice-president in charge of operations, said orders taken should total at least \$1,500,000.

Starting Thursday, July 14, with a welcoming cocktail party and dinner for distributors and their wives, the MGM Records convention officially convened the next morning at 9:30 AM. MGM president Arnold Maxin made a welcoming address. He outlined the "fantastic" growth of MGM Records in the past year and forecast great gains yet to come, touching on the A&R aspect which through strong product has helped to make this growth possible.

Maxin then introduced Brandt, who explained the theme of the convention and elaborated on the thinking and planning both sales and business-wise that MGM Records had for the future.

He pointed out that MGM now has the strongest team of independent distributors in the country and that every effort will be made to keep it that way. Going a step further, Brandt said that all were fortunate to be selling in the fabulous 1960's when the economic atmosphere was such that sales records could be broken, and that MGM Records had full confidence that this fall would offer the greatest profit opportunity ever in the record business for those prepared to take advantage of it.

MGM Records has backed up this thinking with a 1960 "Starpower Convention Release" (see separate story) based on the theory that Starpower can and will be a dynamic force in selling MGM product. Brandt said that all MGM Convention albums had these reasons for being: 1. Performer power—the artist or the star; 2. Performance power—the quality of superior recording, capturing inspired performance; 3. Concept power—ideas which were fresh, new and exciting; 4. Packaging power—provocative, display-commanding, sales-compelling packaging; 5. Sales Plan power—a sure-fire, intelligent, incentive-filled reason to buy; 6. Follow-through power—unparalleled, intensive, album-by-album promotion.

It was pointed out that this story will be the MGM Story for 1960 and will be told "over and over again" throughout the fall season.

Brandt's presentation was followed by the audio-visual portion of the program—an approximate one hour presentation showing the company's new product.

Following in turn were the A&R staffers, Ray Ellis, Jesse Kaye, Jim Viennau and Eddie Heller, each giving highlights and descriptive background information on the preparations of the albums.

After a tropical lunch, Harry Anger, sales promotion manager, presented an array of sales aids, promotional and window display material. Included in this was a Starpower Salesmen's Kit which will enable each salesman, through use of a slide projector and phono, to give the same presentation in his dealer store that MGM gave at Puerto Rico.

Sol Handwerker, advertising and publicity manager, followed, detailing the trade and consumer advertising as well as publicity campaigns. He pointed out that this year the convention release would be broken down into marketing groups such as: 1. Albums with teenage appeal; 2. Albums the basic appeal of which lies in sound; 3. Albums appealing to the smart set; 4. Albums with country flavor and appeal. Advertising and sales promotion for these specific groups will be aimed directly at the buying target.

Charles Hasin, sales manager, then gave the details of the Starpower Sales Plan pointing out that MGM Records will insist that only distributors who are current will qualify to gain the benefits of this plan which will include:

1. Merchandise Bonus: A 20-percent Bonus in album merchandise (Buy 5,000; get an additional 1,000 at no charge.) This includes the 1960 Starpower Convention Release, as well as the revamped MGM Catalog.

2. Return Privilege: The regular 6½-percent return in addition to the above bonus in merchandise.

3. Exchange Privilege: 100-percent exchange privilege on new MGM Starpower Release purchases.

4. Extended Dating: Four payment periods instead of the usual three-30-60-90-120 days, after receipt of merchandise; but in no case will a payment be due before September 10th.

5. Discount With Dating: Placing order at the Convention qualifies for a 2-percent cash discount, with the dating, on initial and all subsequent Convention Plan orders.

6. Catalog Orders: The catalog portion of order must be in the hands of MGM Records by the close of business, July 26.

Reconvening Saturday morning, the convention delegates were treated to a preview of three new singles, one by Connie Francis, one by Jaye P. Morgan and one by Mark Dinning. This was followed by a five-hour general discussion of the various problems of the business confronting the distributor, the dealer and the manufacturer.

The convention, of course, was dotted with social events the highlight of which was an all-day sightseeing and shopping tour of St. Thomas in the Virgin Islands for which Conway Twitty played host to the wives while the men were busy meeting. Also included in the social program were cocktail parties, dinners, golf, swimming, tennis, etc.

St. Louis Distributors Organize

ST. LOUIS—The St. Louis Distributors Association has been formed as a result of a recent meeting at the Coronado Hotel of five distributors in this city.

In attendance were Bud Lampe and Ed Ockel of Commercial Music Co.; Paul Levy of Midwest Distributing; Norman Wienstroer of Norman Distributing; Skip Gorman and Al Chotin of Record Merchandisers; and Robert Hausfater of Roberts Record Distributing.

The Association members will meet at least once a month to discuss mutual problems. At the first meeting, various aspects of dealer and manufacturer relations were reviewed, including recent ARMADA convention developments.

The major record company representatives in St. Louis will be invited to join the association, and are expected to attend the next regular meeting.

New Duties For Columbia's Clifford Benfield

NEW YORK—The promotion of Clifford J. Benfield, director of organizational development for Columbia Records, to a position including additional responsibilities was announced by Albert B. Earl, vice president in charge of administration.

Benfield's new duties will include responsibility for the operations of the following service departments in the New York location: product coordination, building services, office services, and New York personnel.

He will continue as director of organizational development and as a member of the salary administration committee.

Benfield joined Columbia in 1957 and has functioned primarily in the area of company-wide organization development.

Class Records' Artists, LP's And Singles Acquired By Rendezvous

HOLLYWOOD—Class Records' top artists and its entire catalog of LP's and singles have been transferred to the Rendezvous label. Final contracts were signed last week by Leon Rene, Class prexy, and Rod Pierce, Rendezvous topper. Artists line-up includes Bobby Day, Eugene Church, Googie Rene, and The Jubilee Stars. Sessions with these performers will start immediately.

In a joint statement, Rene and Pierce announced that the Class label itself was not part of the deal, and that Rene would not become a partner in the Rendezvous company. He will, however, continue to write, arrange, and A&R all recordings by Class artists.

The Class LP catalog becomes the property of Rendezvous and will be immediately re-released on that label. Included are Bobby Day's "Rockin' With Robin"; Googie Rene's "Romesville" and "Beautiful Weekend"; "Gone But Not Forgotten", a variety LP of hits by Class artists; and "Who Wrote The Bible" by The Jubilee Stars, now nearing completion.

Other details of the Class-Rendezvous contracts allow Rene the right to publish 50% of the songs to be recorded by Class artists for Rendezvous. In addition, Rene's writing, arranging and A&R work will not be exclusively tied to Rendezvous.

The deal between Rene and Pierce was prompted by the heavy burden of Rene's multiple activities as president and general manager, and head of sales and A&R for Class Records, coupled with continuous composing and arranging for all Class recording sessions, as well as his duties as president of two music publishing firms, Leon Rene Publications (ASCAP) and Recordo Music (BMI).

Pierce, continuing as president and A&R director of Rendezvous, stated that this expansion move on the part of Rendezvous will "greatly strengthen the label in both the domestic and international markets, with Class' hit artists joining Rendezvous stars."

After having previously formed Exclusive Records in 1945, Rene established Class Records in 1956. He developed hits both labels, such as Bobby Day's "Rockin' Robin", "Over and Over", "Little Bitty Pretty One"; Googie Rene's instrumental, "Beautiful Weekend", etc.; Eugene Church's "Miami"; Oscar McLollie's "Hey Boy, Hey Girl"; and before that, Joe Liggins and His Honeydrippers; Ivory Joe Hunter; Herb Jeffries, and many others. As an ASCAP songwriter, Rene has written many songs including "Sleepy Time Down South", "When The Swallows Come Back To Capistrano", "Rockin' Robin", "Hey Boy, Hey Girl, and others. He was given his start in the record business about twenty years ago by the late Jack Kapp on Decca.

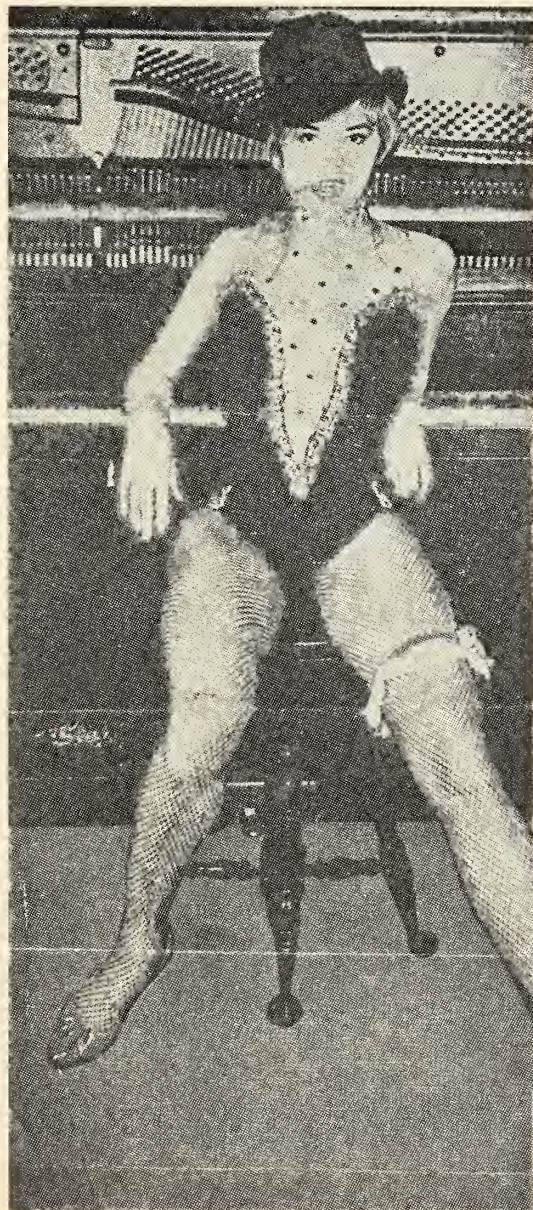

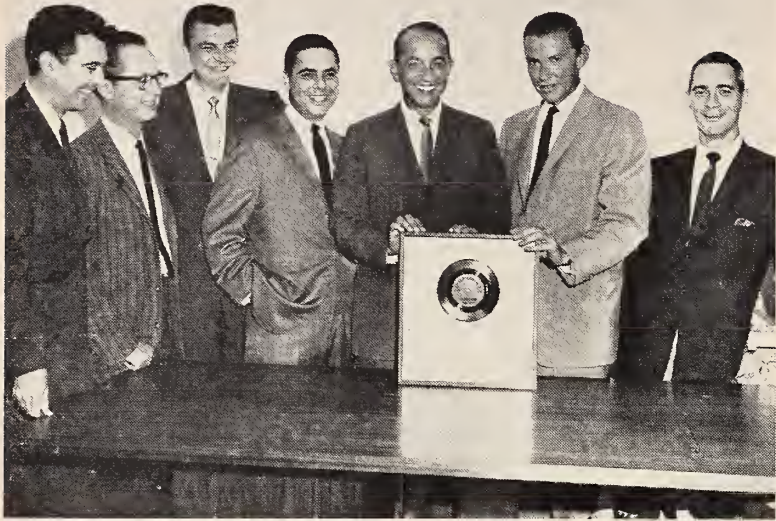

Victor "New Sound America Loves Best" Promo Features 23 Fall Albums

NEW YORK—RCA Victor's "New Sound America Loves Best" 1960 "best buy" program was launched by company executives in four regional distributor meetings across the country, held from July 12 to July 15.

Immediately following the four national conferences, most Victor distributors began to hold their own local dealer meetings to introduce 1960's best buy, the twelfth in Victor's annual series.

Twenty-three new albums make up this year's "best buy," including 11 pop and 12 "Red Seal," to be released over a two-month period, August and September, rather than the usual one-month period.

"The New Sound America Loves Best" theme was chosen for several reasons, according to George Marek, Victor vp and general manager. One is to dramatize for the consumer the results of recent achievements by engineers and sound technicians.

The release will be backed by a saturation advertising and promotion campaign which will cover all media—television, radio, national magazines, record publications, newspapers and point-of-sale. The campaign will be highlighted by a joint promotion with John H. Breck, Inc., manufacturer of Breck Hair Preparations, following up last year's successful best buy joint promotion. The promotion will center around a special "New Sound America Loves Best" preview LP album containing selections from 15 "Red Seal" and pop albums. The preview LP will be available to consumers in monaural or stereo for \$1.00 with a Breck box top label or facsimile.

This year Breck has doubled its advertising expenditures for the promotion and has allocated over \$600,000 for all media and sales promotion. W. I. Alexander, manager, advertising and promotion of Victor stated, that 1959's joint promotion with Breck resulted in "a phenomenal sales jump for Breck and a powerful sales boost for Victor LP's. We expect this year's promotion to be even more successful."

An additional feature of the fall campaign will be the offering of the John Klein-Sid Ramin LP, "The New Sound America Loves Best," on a money-back guarantee, repeating last year's offer on "Christmas Sound Spectacular," the two artist's initial collaboration. A special sticker on the album cover will carry the message of the money-back guarantee to the

consumer. Victor considers this album the keynote sound album of the 1960 "Best Buy" release.

In a move designed to offer the consumer "dramatic" savings on multi-LP operatic albums, Victor is inaugurating a new nationally advertised price structure on all future 3 and 4 LP operatic releases as well as on those presently in the catalog. The new price structure is effective immediately, with the release of Puccini's "Turandot" with Nilsson, Tebaldi, Bjoerling and Tozzi and Verdi's "Il Trovatore" with Price, Tucker, and Warren in this year's best buy.

The new price structure will run as follows: All 4-LP opera sets will be priced as three disks, and all 3-LP opera sets will be priced as two disks. This holds for both monaural and stereo versions. As an example, the new "Turandot," which contains 3 disks would originally list for \$17.98 and \$14.98 for stereo and mono respectively and now will list for \$11.98 and \$9.98. Victor feels that this new policy places their catalog of great opera within the reach of almost every pocketbook.

The fall pop release includes the following albums: "The Other Chet Atkins," "Hits of the '50's" (Sam Cooke), "Infinity In Sound" (Esquivel), "Kick Thy Own Self" (Brother Dave Gardner), "Skin Tight" (Marty Gold), "Two's Company" (Ralph Hunter Choir), "The Blues and the Beat" (Henry Mancini), "On A Magic Carpet" (The Three Suns), "Hugo Winterhalter Goes Gypsy."

The new "Red Seal" albums include: "Armed Forces Suite"—Robert Russell Bennett conducting the RCA Victory Symphony, "The Music of Franz Liszt" and "Fiedler's All-Time Favorites"—Arthur Fiedler and the Boston Pops, "Carmen For Orchestra"—Morton Gould, "The Desert Song"—Mario Lanza, "A Chorus of Love"—Robert Shaw Chorale, Sibelius: Concerto in D Minor—Heifetz and the Chicago Symphony conducted by Walter Hendl, and three by Fritz Reiner and the Chicago Symphony: Respighi: "Pines of Rome"/"Fountains of Rome," Rimsky-Korsakoff: "Scheherazade," and Tchaikovsky: "The Nutcracker."

The two complete operas are Verdi's "Il Trovatore" with Price, Tucker, Warren, Elias and Tozzi; Puccini's "Turandot" with Nilsson, Tebaldi, Bjoerling and Tozzi.

10 LP's Mark Camden's "Best Buy" Program

NEW YORK—Ten new LP's to be promoted under the theme of "The Record Value America Loves Best" mark RCA Camden's 1960 "Best Buy." Among the ten are new recordings specially made for the "Best Buy," as well as several re-releases by big name artists.

The 1960 RCA Camden best buy includes Perry Como's "Dreamer's Holiday," "Sweet and Swing" with the Ames Brothers, "More Hawaii In Hi-Fi" with Leo Addeo and his orchestra, Florence Henderson with Sid Bass, his orchestra and chorus performing "The Best From Fiorello and Sound of Music," Richard Maltby and his orchestra playing "Music From Mr. Lucky," "Follow The Bouncing Ball" a community sing with Norman Leyden, "Johann Strauss, Jr. Waltzes" played by the Oslo Philharmonic or-

chestra under Iovin Fjeldstad, a jazz collectors' item "Swing, Swing, Swing" with Benny Goodman, and two children's records, "Popeye's favorite Stories" and the Dr. Seuss LP with "Yertle The Turtle And Other Stories."

RCA Camden will back up its 1960 best buy with a special ad in Look Magazine featuring all ten albums and the theme "The Record Value America Loves Best."

Point-of-sale and special dealer ads will include a major full color window display featuring all ten albums, a full color streamer, Perry Como's "Dreamer's Holiday" cover for the RCA Camden blinker box, ad mats, and a four-page supplement. A red window streamer featuring the Dr. Seuss LP will be one of the special features of the point-of-sale material.

Liberty Adds Jerden Label To Nat'l Release Stable

LOS ANGELES—Liberty Records has added the Jerden label for exclusive national release, Liberty national sales manager Don Bohanan announced last week. First Jerden single to be handled by Liberty is "How Long" b/w "Chloe" by Darwin & The Cupids, which Liberty execs found was making noise in Seattle. Label has similar arrangements with the Dolton and University labels.

Additionally, Bohanan said Liberty is negotiating with Sabrina Records' Marascaleo on national release plans for Sabrina's up-coming product. Such arrangement currently involves Sabrina's "My First Love" by Frankie

& Johnny. Bohanan noted the "strongest sales spurt in singles in the history of the Liberty organization during June and early July."

"The diversity of this surge among many artists," said Bohanan, "leads us to the confident expectation of the greatest summer sales volume ever chalked up by our organization."

Current best-sellers at Liberty include "Runaround" by The Fleetwoods; "Look For A Star" by Gary Miles; "Walk—Don't Run" by The Ventures; "Dreamin'" by Johnny Burnette; "Blue Velvet" by The Statues.

Prior to his current appointment, Meinberg was national sales promotion manager for United Artists Records and for Colpix Records and national sales and promotion manager for the MGM disk subsidiaries Metro Records and Cub Records.

Latter album—like Ford's previous “Sing A Hymn With Me”—package includes a song book containing the words and music to the spirituals sung by Ford and a sixteen-voice choir at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in North Hollywood. Book is bound in gold-embossed, leather-like material.

The fourth LP is “This Is The Hollywood Bowl,” the special 2-disk LP celebrating the 36th anniversary of the Hollywood Bowl. Disk contains selections from 30 Hollywood Bowl Orch. albums.

Jacket Design Feature Of Liberty's Fall LP's

HOLLYWOOD — Liberty's fall program of nine LP's—due for early August release—will feature “extravagant, eye-catching and utilitarian” album jackets.

Six color printing processes, some in combination with gold foil lamination, are being processed for the Liberty program.

In addition to the visual appeal of the new LP jackets, which have been fashioned by Liberty art director Bill Pate, they will also serve an added utilitarian purpose according to Chuck Ward, album production-coordinator. A pertinent example is seen in the Jack Costanzo LP upcoming which includes instructions for the beginner in playing the bongos.

Other innovations, under wraps in the development stage, are also said to be forthcoming in Liberty's extensive fall LP program.

Capitol Begins City Promo Of "Bells" Album

NEW YORK—Following on the heels of its successful promo tie-ins for its best-selling "Can-Can" soundtrack, Capitol has initiated similar campaigns for its "Bells Are Ringing" pic LP, including a Guy Lombardo album on the score.

"Bells" promo in Indianapolis features the Indiana Bell Telephone Co. and Loew's Theatre. Indiana Bell is issuing six hundred thousand stuffers into the July phone bills, 275,000 in Indianapolis alone. The firm's house organ — 10,000 copies printed — will carry a lengthy blurb on the pic, and the downtown office lobby will display "Bells" posters, covers (including Guy Lombardo's "Bells" LP), and mobiles. The lobby of Loew's will carry a giant phone surrounded by a Capitol display. The theatre lobby will also have a number of phones which when picked-up feature excerpts from the album and pic. A deejay (Tom Mathis on WISH) will conduct the following stint: during his night show, an alarm will ring, and listeners calling him at that time will win the soundtrack LP. Two restaurants next to the theatre will have a similar gimmick and employ Capitol displays.

In Chicago, key stores are displaying "Bells," and a caravan of beauties recently rode around town plugging same. In Pittsburgh, there are tie-ups with the Penn Theatre, Bell Telephone, department stores, stations (WHLL and WMBS), and at Telephone Answering Service. Fifty dollars goes to the dealer with the best "Bells" display in Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse (promo is tied-in with MGM Pictures). In Cleveland, there's a tie-in with the Ohio Bell Telephone Co.

Top Rank Distributors To Get Look At Fall LP's Via Slide Show

NEW YORK—Using the election as the overall theme for his Fall selling approach, Len Levy, Top Rank's National Sales Director, last week previewed the distributor presentation that he and his field force will take with them when they cover the country in August.

"Distributors have become extremely resentful of manufacturers who cost them time and money by holding sales meetings in virtually every part of the Western Hemisphere. Frankly, I agree with the distributors. My four regional sales managers (Cy Kertman—West Coast, Sam Cerami—mid-West, Lelan Rogers—South and Irv Trencher—East Coast) and I are going into each distributor's home territory. We will hold our sales session either in his office or in our hotel room. Every important member of the distributor's staff will be present and each territory will receive special, individual attention from the Top Rank representative to aid in achieving maximum sales."

Top Rank's Fall release consists of twelve new LP's in the \$3.98 monaural and \$4.98 stereo class as well as the recently issued Tommy & Jimmy Dorsey \$24.95 special, "Last Moments of Greatness." The new albums are: "Men From Interpol" by Tony Crombie; "Melodies On Velvet" by Philip Green; "Good Enough To Keep" by Georgie Auld; "Grandma Merrill Plays Honky Tonk" by Blanche Merrill; "The Unexpected" by Raymond Scott and The Secret Seven; "A Big New Band From Britain" introducing the Dave Lee Orchestra; "A Petty For Your Thoughts" by the Norman Petty Trio; "A New Way To Travel" by Dorothy Collins; "Soft, Swaying Strings" by The Knightsbridge Strings; "We Like Polka Music" by Ted Maksymowicz; "Vaquero" by The Fireballs; "Out Of The Dark" by Peggy Stuart.

Basis for the presentation is the use of a set of colored slides that show a mythical convention in which Top Rank is "The People's Choice In '60." A cartoon caricature of a convention chairman introduces each of the Top Rank candidates (album covers) as a special LP provides running commentary and selections from each of the thirteen packages. The entire presentation takes 17 minutes.

The "People's Choice" election theme is followed in window streamers, banners, display pieces, counter cards and order forms. Consumer ads will break after Labor Day to tie in with end-of-Summer buying activity.

Special incentive sales programs will be outlined by Levy and his regional sales managers on an individual basis as they meet with Top Rank's distributors.

Levy stated, "On the basis of the product we are about to introduce and the advertising, publicity and sales promotion program that is backing the merchandise, I anticipate the most successful selling campaign in our history."

GERMANY — THE PAST 12 MONTHS

The record industry in Germany is still young. Every child has growing pains, and this year the teenage record industry showed its first signs of maturity. Remember that the industry experienced a completely new birth after the war. Since the war, Germany has relied heavily on foreign trends, especially those of America. From 1959 the sales of records has always increased. After the war, the biggest hit sold around 80,000. Today, million sellers in Germany alone are already in evidence. However, the last year showed that first sales drop in the history (after the war) of the business. Record sales dropped 12-15%. On the brighter side of the picture, LP sales increased considerably. However, singles are still the bread and butter business of the German firms.

One of the reasons for the slack in sales is possible saturation in the field of rock and roll. The buying power of the teenager has never been large in Germany. Remember that less than 5% of the total population of approximately 60 million have an income exceeding 250 dollars a month. Most of the production over the past year has been rock and roll. The age group between 25-35 was neglected.

One other trend was greatly in evidence over the past year. Before this year, big artists had big sales. This year, it took a good song and a good production to make a big record. Here's an example. "Heartaches By The Number" recorded by formerly "ice cold" singer, Peter Alexander sold around 400,000. His next release, however, barely hit the 20,000 mark. The one exception to this rule is "Freddy" who has had over 5 million record sales during the past 3 years. This year, "Die Gitarre Und Das Meer" (The Guitar And The Sea), and "Unter Fremden Sternen" (Under Foreign Skies), both went over the million mark. His latest release only sold about 400,000. This is still plenty, but it shows that even the strongest artist can not consistently sell anymore.

Still with general trends, foreign production over the past year has had much less impact on the industry here. Again, there were exceptions to this rule. "Tom Dooley" by the Kingston Trio, "When"—Kalin Twins, "Red River Rock"—Johnny and The Hurricanes, "Chi Chi"—John Buck and The Blazers, "Lonely Boy"—Paul Anka, and a few artists such as Elvis Presley, Billy Vaughn, The Everly Bros., Paul Anka, Ray Coniff, and Chris Barber all enjoyed strong popularity. Normal sales on a Presley platter reached between 50 and 100,000.

One of the reasons for the lack of influence of the American production was definitely the strong sales of rhythm and blues material which is completely unknown to the German record buyer.

Today, the trends point to a strong influence of country and western material and style, the death of the strong teen beat numbers, and a growing popularity of ballads with a mild beat.

New stars became known and retained their popularity in the last 12 months. Names such as Ivo Robic, Detlef Engel, Tommy Kent, Heidi Bruhl, Dalida, Rex Gildo, Jan and Kjeld, Rocco Granata, and the English youngster, Laurie London who hit the charts in America with "He's Got The Whole World In His Hands" a few years ago, all became household words and enjoyed strong record sales and popularity.

Musical films also enjoyed their start during the last 12 months. Teenage stars Peter Kraus and Conny were the strongest in this medium, and their films paved the way for many others.

In July, 1959, rock and roll was strong. However, German folk song material consistently headed the charts. American journals proclaimed "Morgen" from Yugoslavian singer Ivo Robic "Europe's biggest smash," but the record was not yet in the German top 50. Publisher Peter Meisel reports that "Morgen" had not sold 50,000 copies before its popularity in the states. However, after its success in America, it went over the million mark here. Heading the charts was Freddy's smash single, "Die Gitarre Und Das Meer." "Charlie Brown" was a hit with Hans Blum's German version. Chris Barber's "Petite Fleur" was riding high and began to move in the states.

In 1959, the summer slack never really hit the business. French songstress Dalida hit the top of the charts with her German cover of Jane Morgan's "The Day That The Rains Came." Ariola Records began their new low priced line, "Baccarola." They concentrated on cover productions of hits and put their records in newstands, clothing stores and other shops that formerly did not sell records. This was not the start of German "rack sales," as German labels "Tempo," which began before the 2nd World War, and "Starlet," which opened doors in 1957, were already on the market with singles selling for around 60 cents. Billy Vaughn was also on top with "Aloha Oe." August ended, and the new season began.

In September, teenager Peter Kraus hit the top of the charts with "Wunderbar Wie Du" (As Wonderful As You).

On January 1, no records were produced as the record industry started its fight with BIEM the European equivalent to BMI and ASCAP. The record industry wanted lower percents and the BIEM refused to give in. The result was a complete stop in production. Plenty of numbers were on hand from December productions to keep the ball rolling, but in March, productions began to run out, and both sides tightened their belts to stave off a drastic slump in record sales. Meetings were held in Paris with no results. The record industry found its Paris conference met with the same success as the later conference of heads of state. Both sides were seriously injured by this "stop" and both agreed to a truce beginning in April. As of this date, nothing has been settled, but the truce lives on. The industry breathed a sigh of relief and began to produce. The end of March found one more pop music festival. The German state owned non-commercial radio stations opened the same hall in Weisbaden as their Luxembourg competition, and with the same results. Wynn Hoop took top honors with "Bonne Nuit, Ma Cherie," and went to England for the European finals. The winners were French song, "Tom Pillibi" & English march, "Looking High, High, High." The German entry finished 4th. However, the song which finished in 2nd place in the German contest, "Wir Wollen Niemals Auseinander Gehen" (We'll Never Part) sung by Heidi Bruhl won the consent of the strong church, and went on to become a big hit.

Attendance reached a total of 11,382 of whom 3,618 were buyers. Previous attendance record for a Chicago show was in 1958 when 11,034 registered. The trade show will be held again in Chicago in 1961 on July 16 to 20.

Philip Werlein IV, head of a chain of four music stores in the South, Werlein's For Music, was elected NAMM president. He succeeds Clay Sherman of San Francisco.

More than 260 exhibitors showed the latest in musical merchandise at the show, where \$2½ million in musical merchandise, including 450 models of different pianos, was on display.

"Sound Of Sixties" Theme Of UA's 1st Annual Distrib Meet In N.O.

NEW YORK—United Artists Records holds its first annual distrib meet this week (25 & 26) in New Orleans at the Hotel Monteleone. Over thirty UA distributors around the country will hear of UA's fall LP and singles plans, keyed to the theme of "Sounds of the Sixties."

Greeting United Artist distributors were UA's entire executive staff including David Picker executive vice president, Art Talmadge, vice president and general manager, Andy Miehle, national sales manager, Jerry Raker, eastern regional sales manager, Norman Nelson, mid-western regional sales manager, Harry Goldstein, western regional sales manager, Don Costa director of A&P, Si Mael, Controller, Bob Altshuler, director of advertising and publicity and Eddie Mathews, director of national promotion.

Distributors were greeted at their first business session by Picker and the keynote address was delivered by Talmadge. Highlights of Talmadge's speech were "United Artists is taking aggressive and active steps to build up a sound-selling catalog based on name talent. An announcement will be made at a later date of new artist joining the UA roster. A million dollar product program available to the company through its film alliance. Some of the big UA pictures that are due for release include Spencer Tracy and Frederick March in 'Inherit The Wind,' West Side Story, Marilyn Monroe's new film 'The Misfits' and John Wayne in 'The Alamo'."

New displays were introduced that sold UA packaged good exclusively. One of the highlights of this display was the novel means of packaging the albums in a self-contained polyethylene bag which served as a carry out container. An additional source of distribution for these sound track albums have been arranged at motion picture theatres through United Artists alliance.

The general motif of the meeting is of vast political convention hall with illuminated boxes on poles showing the album covers placed at intervals around the meeting hall. The highlight of the meeting was given to a preview showing of the motion picture "Never On Sunday" at a local theatre. This was in connection with UA's current single hit by Don Costa "Never On Sunday."

The album program consists of fifteen new albums: "More Marv Johnson," Alexander & Margie King's "Love And Hisses," "Burl Ives Sings Irving Berlin," Don Costa's "We Play—You Sing—The Great Million Sellers," Barbara Russell's "Swing With Me," The Clovers' "Love Potion #9," Manny Album's "Drum Feast—Percussion," Diahann Carroll

And Andre Previn;" "Sing/Swing Along With Dave Lambert;" "Stan Rubin Plays The Ivy League Jazz Band Ball;" The Axidental's "Axidentally On Purpose;" The DeJohn Sisters' "Yes Indeed;" "Ruth Olney In Person At Mr. Kelly's;" Angelo & His Orchestra "Come Back To Sorrento" and "Bob Darch-Ragtime Piano" plus five strong selling albums, released in June: Don Costa's "The Theme From The Unforgiven;" "The Steve Lawrence Sound;" the music from the film "The Apartment;" the sound track from "Elmer Gantry;" and Dicky Doo And The Don't's "Teen Scene."

As part of the distrib program, distributors who buy five of the new albums receive one free. On other catalog items, a purchase of twenty-five albums means five free.

Victor Releases "Finian's" Revival, "Bells" Instrumental

NEW YORK—RCA Victor last week released the 1960 Original Cast production of "Finian's Rainbow" and a reading of the "Bells Are Ringing" score by the Melachrino Strings.

"Finian's," starring Jeannie Carson, Howard Morris, Biff McGuire, Carol Brice and Sorrell Booke, was so well received at a limited engagement revival at New York's City Center this year that it was decided to have a Broadway run. The show, however, couldn't survive the recent theatre strike.

Mercury Appoints Chas. Fach National Promo Director

CHICAGO—In a realignment of its sales and promotion forces, Mercury Records has announced the appointment of Charles Fach as national promotion director. Fach, formerly Eastern regional sales manager for the diskery, will now headquarter in the Chicago offices. Under his supervision will be the label's staff of promotion managers.

Kenneth S. Myers, formerly promotion manager and recently appointed veep in charge of sales, will supervise the entire sales staff, with all Mercury regional sales managers reporting directly to him.

London To Intro Fall Program At N.Y. Meet

NEW YORK—London Records this week (27) introduces its Fall stock program to some of its Eastern distributors here at the Manhattan Hotel. London headquarters personnel will then travel the country introducing the program locally to each distrib during the succeeding ten days. Full details on the program will appear in next week's issue.

Gortikov Named CRDC VP For Mchdse; Tallant Heads Nat'l Sales & Operations

HOLLYWOOD—In moves designed to strengthen the company's top executive structure and accomplish a more natural grouping of marketing functions, Capitol Records Distributing has named Stanley M. Gortikov to the newly-created post of vice-president in charge of merchandising, and assigned CRD vice president William B. Tallant, Jr., as the company's national sales and operations manager.

The two appointments, effective immediately, were announced last week by CRD president J. K. Maitland.

According to Maitland, Gortikov, who resigns as corporate development director for Capitol Records in order to accept the CRD position, will be responsible for all CRD merchandising and market-planning functions, as well as those market-research and new-product-development activities formerly carried out by Gortikov's Capitol corporate development department.

With CRD assuming these additional responsibilities, Gortikov brings to the company all of his former CR personnel, including William B. Burkhalter, who now becomes CRD market research manager.

Reporting to Gortikov under the new organization will be Arthur D. Duncan, CRD director of market planning, and William L. Mikels, recently appointed national merchandising manager. All of CRD's existing merchandising sections and functions—advertising, popular album merchandising, singles merchandising, Capitol Classics merchandising and phonograph merchandising—will continue to operate with their present managers and personnel, Maitland said.

Maitland also announced the elec-

tion of Gortikov to CRD's board of directors, replacing Stephen H. Strohmman, former CRD vice president and director of operations planning, who is resigning his CRD post in order to accept a new position in CR. (See separate story.)

In a second move, William B. Tallant, Jr., vice president and member of the board of directors of CRD, and former director of merchandising planning, will assume responsibility for all CRD national sales and operations activities, including sales functions recently assigned to Robert E. Camp, who has left the company. Tallant will report directly to Matthew D. Schuster, CRD vice president in charge of distribution. Myron L. Levinson, manager of CRD's national operations department, will now report to Tallant.

Gortikov joined CR in February, 1960, as corporate development director. Previously he had spent twelve years in positions of top executive responsibility with a major Los Angeles apparel-manufacturing firm. Prior to his textile industry experience, he worked in the field of advertising, coordinating creative and customer services.

Tallant joined CRD in 1945 at the company's Los Angeles branch. Subsequently he served as assistant branch manager at Los Angeles, sales manager at Seattle, and district sales manager at Boston. In 1955, he moved to CRD's Hollywood headquarters as assistant national sales manager. In December, 1958, he was appointed administrator of merchandising and advertising for CR; and in January, 1960, he was elected a vice president and member of the board of directors of CRD, and appointed director of merchandising planning.

NEW YORK—Roulette Records has signed Richard Maltby and his orchestra to an exclusive recording contract. Maltby, who has one of the most popular and consistently booked bands in the business, will have his first album, "Maltby Swings For Dancers" out around August 15. According to Roulette's pop A & R chief, Joe Reisman, Maltby will be used as a single performer, as well as an album artist. Before leaving for the Roulette distributors meeting in Miami last week and a vacation, Reisman recorded the first Maltby single, "Rat Race," from the Tony Curtis-Debbie Reynolds movie now playing on Broadway. The flip will be "Walkie-Talkie" an original from the "Maltby Swings For Dancers" LP.

New Connie Single

NEW YORK—MGM Records this week releases a new Connie Francis single, "My Heart Has A Mind Of Its Own" b/w "Malaguena." The "Heart" portion was penned by Howard Greenfield and Jack Keller, writers of the lark's current hit, "Everybody's Somebody's Fool." Session was made in Hollywood where Miss Francis is making her screen debut in MGM Pictures' "Where The Boys Are."

Starday's "Country Music Spectacular" 20% LP Discount

MADISON, TENN.—Don Pierce, president of Starday Records, announced last week that the label is inaugurating a country music spectacular package goods sale for the month of August. During the month Starday will extend a 20% discount on its entire line of country and gospel (20) LP's and (35) EP's with a 100% exchange privilege.

Highlighting the sale will be a "Country Music Spectacular" 2-set album containing 36 of the golden country hits of the 1950's. The package will retail for \$4.98 and will feature a four color cover with a 2 pocket jacket. There will be new August-released albums by Cowboy Copas (currently hot with "Alabam"), Lonzo and Oscar and Marshall Pack. In addition, there will be the recently-released LP's by Bill Clifton, Wally Fowler, the Stanley Brothers, Carl Story, George Jones, the Sunshine Boys and many other combination hit parade, bluegrass and gospel issues. The entire catalog is in stock and is available for immediate shipment from the home office.

Darin's First Feature Pic

NEW YORK—Bobby Darin makes his feature film bow this September with the filming of "Come September," which co-stars Rock Hudson, Gina Lollobrigida and Sandra Dee. Pic will be shot in Italy by Robert Mulligan for Universal-International release. It was announced last week that the Atlantic star would make regular appearances in a new TV show bowing this fall, "Dan Raven."

Roulette Unveils "Profit" Combination At Miami Distributor Conclave

NEW YORK—During a two day meeting in Miami, Florida, Roulette Records last week presented its fall sales program and new album releases. Tagged "The Profit Combination 10-20-30-60-90 + 5 + 2," these numbers make up the salient points of Roulette's August & September sales program. The diskery is offering 10% off on all monaural album purchases, 20% off on all stereo packages and 30-60-90 day deferred billing plan.

The plus 5 figure is an additional 5% return privilege which embraces all initial orders, but does not include any subsequent orders. The plus 2 number refers to the total dollar volume quota assigned to each distributor. When the distrib meets or exceeds this quota figure, the salesman working on the Roulette lines will receive a 2% cash amount of this figure which is to be split among them. "The Profit Combination" sales program includes all the new releases for August and September, as well as the Roulette, Roost, Tico, Gee and Forum Records catalogs.

Two catalog sellers were singled out for special sales promotion. "Rock N' Roll With Frankie Lyman," which contains his current single hit, "Little Bitty Pretty One," will be offered on a one for four basis. For every four albums purchased of this LP, the dealer will receive one album free. A quantity of stickers, referring to the fact that the hit single is in this album, will be shipped to the distributors.

Joe Reisman's "Instrumental Imports" is the other album that was marked for special treatment. As the "Album Of The Month," "Instrumental Imports" will be pre-packed in a special cardboard counter display browser box. It will be shipped in pre-packs of fives or tens and will offer the consumer a \$1.00 savings off the suggested retail \$3.98 price.

One of the highlights of the new releases for August and September is the introduction of a new Gold Classic Series on Roulette. Prior to this release, Roulette's only classical LP's were on the low priced Forum label. These new Gold Classic Series LP's will be issued on Roulette and will go for the suggested retail price of \$4.98 monaural and \$5.98 stereo. Included in the first Gold Classic Series release are the complete six Bach Brandenburg Concertos in three separate LP's and a 150th Commemorative Anniversary album of "Chopin's Twenty-Six Preludes." Roulette indicated to its distributors that all classical releases will now be issued on this new Gold Classic Series.

In a forty minute color slide and three track stereo tape presentation, Roulette sneak previewed for their distributors, the new products for August and September. The albums shown and played were: "At Home With Jimmie Rodgers" (An Evening Of Folk Songs); "Naughty, But Nice"—Pearl Bailey; "Maltby Swings For Dancers"—featuring Richard Maltby and His Orch.; "Sing Along With Emmett Kelly" which spotlights a four-color photograph of the renowned clown; "Neapolitan Memories" with the voice of Doreen; "Italiano, USA," Lou Monte's first album for the label; "Ivory and Bone" with Al Lerner, His Piano and Quintet and "New Selections In Sound" which introduces a new instrument, the Accorgan, as performed by Louis Del Monte.

The Birdland Series of jazz albums includes: "Not Now, I'll Tell You When" with Count Basie and His Orch.; "Newport Suite"—Maynard Ferguson and His Orch.; "My Crying Hour" which introduces Cora Lee Day; "Gretsch Drum Night At Birdland," which ties in with the drum makers, the Gretsch Manufacturing Company,

and was recorded live at Birdland, featuring on drums Art Blakey, Philly Joe Jones, Elvin Jones and Charlie Persip. One of the most well received albums in the Birdland Series was "The Most" Vol. 1. This album contains selections by the label's top jazz artists, such as Sarah Vaughan, Count Basie, Maynard Ferguson, Billy Eckstine, Joe Williams, Lambert Hendricks Ross, Johnny Smith and others.

Roost Records will release "Guitar and Strings" featuring Johnny Smith and Tico Records is represented by "Fiesta Night At The Eden Roc," an on-the-spot, live recording, by Luis Varona, his piano and Latin-American Orch. from "Harry's American Bar" at the Eden Roc Hotel in Miami Beach.

Forum Records, Roulette's low-priced \$1.98 line, releases: "Cha Cha Cha Carnival" featuring Titi Puente, Tito Rodriguez, Machito, Pete Terrace and others; "Dixieland" with The Mound City Six; "Hawaii" with William Kealoha and His Orch. "Hollywood Themes" featuring Jack Shaindlin conducting the Symphony Of the Air Orchestra; "Let's Dance With Tony Pastor"; "Just Say I Love Her" with Julius La Rosa and "Let's All Sing With The Hugo and Luigi Family Singers."

A full scale promotional campaign is set to support "Profit Combination" program. Distribs will be shipped new album order and inventory control pads, full DJ samples on key albums, four-color mounted easels and four-color window streamers on many of the LP's in the release. Full reviewer service will be made on all the albums and reprints of the reviews on the classical albums will be sent to salesmen. The advertising schedule will emphasize consumer ads, and co-op mats for local newspaper advertising will be available. A special advertising and radio promotion drive with Italian language newspapers and stations will be made on "Neapolitan Memories."

The Roulette meeting was marked by heavy emphasis on open discussion periods, after short informal speeches were made by the diskery's president, Morris Levy and Joe Kolsky, executive vice-president. The second day of the meeting was devoted entirely to private meetings, in which each distributor was allotted some twenty minutes to a half hour to discuss individual problems and sales with the Roulette executives.

Due in part to these private meetings and the heavy initial orders placed on the new albums, Joe Kolsky reported that this 4th Annual Meeting was, "without reservations, the most successful meeting the company has ever held."

The Roulette Meet was marked throughout by an effort on the part of the label to affect a closer harmony between the company and its distributors. This effort was noted in the arranging of private meetings for each distributor and in the formation of the Distributor's Planning Committee, as set forth in prexy Levy's speech to the distribs. The Distributor's Planning Committee will be made up of four different distributors, who will be selected each month by Roulette and invited into the New York Office to discuss with the Roulette executives problems, sales programs, merchandising ideas and in general all phases of the business that in any way affects the company and its distributors. The distributors selected will represent a cross section of the country, and each Roulette distributor will, at one time or another, serve on this "Planning Committee."

The first Distributors' Planning Committee Meeting is scheduled to be held sometime in September.

The 33 Single:

Answer To Singles Slump?

NEW YORK—The second-half of 1960 may see the inauguration of the most dramatic change in the singles speed picture since the debut of the 45 disk more than a decade ago. At that time, the birth of the 45's signaled the beginning of the end for 78's. Now, will the 45's eventually go the route of 78's and bow to a 33 speed?

At this moment the majors and a host of indies are holding top-level meets with this in mind: is the 33 single the answer to the singles slump? Why many music men feel it is centers around the all-speed phonograph.

While adaptable to any speed, the all-speed phonograph has, ironically, made the playing of 45's an inconvenience. In the early days of 45's, phonos were built which only handled 45's. If then a console phono were purchased, there was a separate turntable for 78's and 33's and one for 45's.

When all three speeds were later incorporated into single turntables, it became somewhat awkward and inconvenient to spin a 45. Either a special big-hole adapter had to be inserted into the 45 hole to bring it down to the 78-33 size, or a special 45 cylinder had to be put on the turntable spindle. The situation was greatly magnified as 33's became increasingly popular, and less time was devoted to 45 plays, with switching speeds becoming more bothersome.

Thus, the thinking is, singles sales can be re-vitalized by a standardization of disk speed to 33. With some automatic changers' ability to intermix disk sizes (7", 10", 12"), it is possible to play singles and LP's as one would a stack of LP albums alone.

Early last June, Seeburg introduced a new juke-box capable of handling seven inch 33's as well as conventional 45's. Over twenty labels have already responded to the needs of such a machine by releasing—for juke-box use only—some of their top artists in seven inch. 33 stereo form. Selections always include dates from a particular artist's LP catalog.

To help promote the 33 single, Seeburg has instituted an "Artists Of The Week" program which enables the juke-box operator to merchandise his 33 singles selections. On the front-glass-panel of the 33-45 machine there is space for a 7x7 version of an album cover by the one selected "Artist of the Week."

While Seeburg feels it is important to offer the public tried-and-true programming in its juke-boxes, the diskery's themselves still, of course, want to develop new talent via singles, and they are looking for the answer to the problem of keeping the single record in its important, traditional role as the medium whereby most new disk talent and material are introduced.

What is the current feeling of labels on the 33 single? A recent survey by The Cash Box of label execs drew the conclusion that while most labels are taking a wait-and-see attitude, anything—including the 33 single—that would give new life to singles sales would meet with their approval.

If some firms were looking for 33 singles activity from a consumer angle from a major label, they got it last week from Columbia, which at Miami distrib meet announced monaural 33 singles would soon issued simultaneously with regular 45's.

In announcing the move, Columbia president Goddard Lieberman said that "single records continue to be the most significant media for the introduction and development of new popular music, talents and personalities."

"Today," he said, "an ever increasing majority of adults purchase 33 album packages. As a result, singles have become the domain of the very young. And now, even they are turning to albums in increasing numbers and show a reluctance to buy both with the mechanical difficulty of interchanging 45's with LP's."

"The 33 single record which automatically interchanges with 12" albums offers the most promising avenue

for recapturing this vital but diminishing market."

Lieberman said 33 singles would be "reaching out to the broadest possible phonograph ownership market." Columbia best-sellers, Lieberman noted, would continue to be represented in the label's 33 stereo single ("Stereo Seven") line.

Capitol Records is expected to announce soon a release schedule of 33-45 singles to be released simultaneously.

A spokesman for RCA Victor said last week that the diskery "is looking closely at the aspects of singles record business" and the prospects of a 33 single. At the moment, Victor is conducting a market research program on the 33 singles, and any Victor action in this direction will be based on "conclusive evidence, one way or another," the spokesman said.

Decca's national promotion head, Leonard Salidor, said that the label "if 33 singles will help the business, we're obviously for it," and added that the firm was "waiting for the demand." MGM's position is that it would take its "cue from our distributors." United Artists is for "any speed that will sell records" and sees the need for the eventual standardization of speeds to ease dealer inventory. ABC-Paramount is holding "regular meetings" on the subject, according to national sales manager Larry Newton. Warner Bros., a spokesman said, is "contemplating" consumer 33 singles, and feels that "if the industry goes with it, so will we."

Some execs said that a low-priced (i.e. \$12.95) 33 phono—ala Victor's years-back 45-only unit—must go along with a 33 singles. This unit would be backed by a strong promotional campaign, they added.

Pincus & Siegel Form Publishing Firm Abroad

NEW YORK—Publisher George Pincus has announced the formation of a joint publishing firm with Paul Siegel in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. New firm is called Pincus-Siegel Music Verlag.

In exchanges between Pincus and Siegel, Pincus has acquired for the U.S. and Canada two German hits, "Melodie Der Nacht" and "Irgendwann Gibt's Ein Wiederseh'n," which have been assigned to Gil Music and Siegel's Rex Music. Siegel in turn has been assigned Pincus' current smash, "Itsy Bitsy Teenie Weenie Yellow Polkadot Bikini," and has arranged for the release of several German versions of the novelty. Decca has released here the hit "Melodie" deck by Freddy.

Pincus said he was in the process of opening his own firms in England, Scandinavia and other parts of the Continent.

Wallichs then goes to New York City where on Aug. 1 he will attend a meeting of the board of directors of the Record Industry Association of America, of which he is a founder.

FTC Accuses 2 Distributors Of Payola; 8 Sign Orders

WASHINGTON — Capitol Records Distributing and Schwartz Bros. Distributing were charged last week by the FTC with giving payola to broadcasting personnel. The Federal agency also announced that eight firms had signed consent orders agreeing not to make such payments. The FTC said the signings were settlements, and not admissions of guilt. Firms are Ideal Record Products, N.Y. and its affiliate, Ideal Record Products of N.J.; Lou Fargo, trading as Fargo Records, N.Y.; King Records, Cincinnati; Eric Distributing, San Francisco; Southern Record Distributors, Nashville; Field Music Sales, San Francisco.

Roulette-Hanover-Signature Deal Approved By Stockholders

NEW YORK—In a joint statement, Morris Levy, president of Roulette Records and Bob Theile, president of Hanover-Signature Records announced last week that the stockholders of Hanover-Signature had unanimously voted approval of the plan whereby Roulette will loan Hanover-Signature \$25,000 and based on this loan will have a five year option to acquire 55% of the outstanding stock in Hanover-Signature.

The mechanics of the new arrangements call for Theile and his Hanover-Signature organization to move into the new Roulette offices located on Broadway & 50th Street in Manhattan.

The offices, now under construction, will be completed the latter part of August and the new Roulette recording facilities a short time thereafter.

With rental costs and the services that Roulette will place at the disposal of the Hanover-Signature label, the firm will automatically cut more than \$3,000 a week from its weekly

overhead, it was announced. Such items as bookkeeping, recording studios, packaging and merchandising of albums and other services will, also, now be offered by the Roulette organization to Hanover-Signature.

According to Theile, Hanover-Signature, which currently has a hit album on its hands in "My Name Jose Jimenez", has Some Thirty-Five Albums Cut And In The Can. Most of these albums are scheduled for the fall release program. Theile, also indicated that all the Hanover-Signature artists will remain signed to the label.

Both Levy and Theile issued statements to the effect that this move is in the "interest of both companies and is aimed at contributing to the continued growth of both labels." Levy stated, "Bob Theile is one of the most imaginative and talented record men in the business. He will now be able to carry on his A & R efforts with complete freedom and with the full backing and support of the entire Roulette organization. Such an advantageous collaboration can only lead to even greater expansion for both Roulette and Hanover-Signature."

Morris Diamond will remain as Hanover-Signature national sales manager.

ARMCO, Seeco, Bon Ami Join For Melis LP Premium Promo

Al Hoffman Dies

NEW YORK—Al Hoffman, the vet songwriter, died here last week (21) after a long illness. He was 57.

For the last ten years, Hoffman had collaborated with Dick Manning to cleff some of the top hits of the decade. These included "It Takes Two To Tango," "Allegheny Moon," "Hot Diggity," "Papa Loves Mambo" and "Hawaiian Wedding Song." He was one of the few of older cleffers who were able to successfully bridge-the-gap between musical tastes going back thirty years, and the currently popular teen-beat.

Born in Russia, Hoffman was educated in Seattle, Wash., and was a boy soprano in a Seattle synagogue. He formed his own band in Seattle, and, in 1928, he came to New York to continue his musical career. In 1930, he wrote "Heartaches," which became a smash hit, and is still popular today. He gave up orchestral work for composition.

He went to England in 1934 at the request of English film producers, and while there wrote the score for such musical comedies as "This'll Make You Whistle," "Going Greek," and "Hide And Seek." He returned to the U.S. in 1938. He wrote the scores for at least twenty films, including Walt Disney's "Cinderella." His other songs include "Little Man' You've Had A Busy Day," "I Apologize," "There's No Tomorrow," "A Dream Is A Wish Your Heart Makes," "Bib-bidi Bobbidi Boo," "Mairzy Doats," "Chi-Baba Chi Baba" and "Fit As A Fiddle."

A funeral was held last Sunday (24) at Manhattan's Riverside Chapel. Surviving is his widow.

K. notes that country music is even making a dent on the top stations thereabouts. Three stations in the area are now airing the stuff with the likelihood of more to come Charlie Phillips would like us to mention that he is now with KZIP-Amarillo, Texas.

In commemoration of the world-famous Calgary Stampede, Apex Records of Canada has released an album of songs from that great show featuring Wilf Carter (Montana Slim). Entitled, "Songs of the Calgary Stampede," the LP is for Canadian consumption only. Incidentally, the Stampede took place just recently, and from what we hear it was, as usual, a tremendous success. In connection with the Calgary show, a severe attack of laryngitis forced Johnny Cash to cancel his engagement there (July 12, 13, 14). All Ft. Wayne bands and callers of ACME will participate in raising funds for Earl, who is stricken with Cancer. . . . ANALYZATION OF THE 1st QUARTER (JAN., FEB., MAR., 1960)

1st QUARTER 1960 EXPORTS UP 11%

Music and Amusement Machines Show Increase Over 4th Quarter of 1959. Also Better Than Same 1st Quarter Period of 1959.

For the first time in over a year, export statistics for a quarterly period show an upswing. Total shipment in the first quarter of 1960 by United States firms were 22,209 machines, valued at \$5,034,790. These figures are extremely encouraging, compared with the last quarter of 1959, as 3,000 less vendors (could be low prices machines) were shipped—but the overall increase was 890 machines, valued at \$894,040. Another interesting factor is disclosed when shipments for the 1st quarter of 1960 are compared with shipments made in the 1st quarter of 1959. In the comparative quarter of 1959, 19,273 machines were exported, valued at \$4,568,275. The increase in 1960 is 2,936 machines, and \$466,515. Further study of the statistics discloses the fact that improvement was made in both music machines and amusement machines.

As usual, in Europe, Belgium and West Germany, were the leading buyers. In the last quarter of 1959, the United Kingdom increased its buying, and it could be envisioned that coinmen here would keep expanding their purchases, but figures disclose that almost an equal amount of machines, at about the same dollar value, was bought in the 1st quarter of 1960. Other areas and countries thruout the world imported practically the same amount of equipment as in the previous quarter.

An interesting development is the recent lifting of the import restrictions in France. A result of this move, French buying will probably show in the 3rd and 4th quarter statistics of 1960.

1) Phonographs: American exporters shipped 4,057 music machines, valued at \$2,723,046 in the first quarter of 1960. This compares with the shipment of 3,347 machines, valued at \$2,208,007 in the 4th quarter of 1959. Increase in this quarter over the past quarter was 710 machines, and a dollar value of \$525,639. Europe, as usual, was the biggest buyer, taking 3,102 machines, valued at \$2,036,047. United Kingdom imports remained practically the same as the previous quarter, but West Germany and Belgium increased its buying. Most of the other European nations showed an increase as well. Following the same

trend as in previous quarters, North America (with Canada leading) was the second largest importer. South America, with Venezuela leading, was the third largest buying area.

2) Amusement Machines: Shipments of games also showed a very healthy improvement in the 1st quarter of 1960 over the 4th quarter of 1959. 12,035 amusement machines, valued at \$1,564,090, were shipped thruout the world in the 1st quarter of 1960, compared with 8,848 machines, valued at \$1,136,267 in the 4th quarter of 1959—a gain of 3,187 machines and \$427,823. Comparison with the same 1st quarter of 1959, shows an increase 6,854 machines, and \$401,200. Europe, leading importer, bought 7,361 machines, valued at \$1,082,510 in this 1st quarter of 1960. This was an increase over the 4th quarter of 1959 of 2,528 machines and \$326,234. In this division, the United Kingdom really stepped up its buying in this quarter over the previous period, buying 2,331 machines, valued at \$355,031. These purchases, compared with the 4th quarter of 1959, show an increase of 1,743 machines and \$233,853. Belgium and West Germany, always big buyers, also improved its imports in this period. In North America, Canada, biggest buyer, bought considerably more machines in this quarter than it did in the previous one. Asia also more than doubled its buying. Australia increased its buying by a considerable margin, taking in 425 machines at \$55,335, compared with previous quarter purchases of 136 machines for \$16,670. The only area which slipped with South America, with Venezuela always a big buyer, dropping down to practically nothing.

3) Vending Machines: This division slipped, both in quantity of machines shipped, and dollar value. 6,117 vendors, valued at \$747,054 were exported in the 1st quarter of 1960. This compares with 9,124 machines, and \$796,476 in the 4th quarter of 1959, a drop of 3,007 machines, and \$49,422. Sweden improved its buying over the previous quarter in both machines and money, while Belgium dropped off in both. The United Kingdom bought more machines, and spent less money, while West Germany bought less machines, but spent more money.

British Gaming Laws To Be Strictly Enforced

LONDON—Undoubtedly the most important single factor to concern and influence coin men in this country during recent months has been the forthcoming change in the Betting and Gaming Laws. Commenting on the latest development in this direction, Mr. John Singleton, Secretary of The Amusements Caterers Association reports that when the Bill was further considered by the House of Lords last week a last stage amendment was agreed to—the effect of which is to limit to two the number of gaming machines that can be operated in any one building, under Clause 17 of the Act. This is the clause which permits the operation of gaming machines in clubs and other private premises, subject to the two original conditions: 1) That the charge made for the use of the machine does not exceed 6d and 2) That the profits are devoted to purposes other than private gain. This limita-

tion to two machines does not apply to licensed amusement arcades where there is no limit on the number of cash pay-out machines that can be installed, providing that the maximum pay-out is not more than 1/— (the maximum charge for use of the machine is also 1/—).

Singleton further comments that it is obvious that great concern is being felt in some quarters over recent developments in the trade regarding the threats of mass importation of fruit and other types of gaming machines. In fact, during last week's debate a strong attempt was made to persuade the Government to insert into the Bill a new clause which would have given them (the Government) powers "to prohibit, control or regulate the sale, importation or use of gaming machines"—although eventually the suggestion was withdrawn, it seems that the Government will be keeping a very watchful eye.

1961 A.T.E. Show On Same London Site

LONDON—Despite every effort by Mr. John Singleton and his Committee to find a larger and more suitable venue for the 1961 Amusement Trades Exhibition Convention, the search has proved unsuccessful and, once again, it will be held at the New Royal Horticultural Hall, Westminster, London, S.W.1. from Tuesday, January 31st through Wednesday and Thursday, February 1st and 2nd 1961. It is expected that the prospectus will be ready and despatched in late September and that stands will be allocated during the first week of November. In view of the fact that there will certainly be more applications for stands than in previous years and the likelihood that exhibitors of long standing will require more space to exhibit the ever increasing variety of equipment now available, the failure to secure more spacious premises is most regrettable.

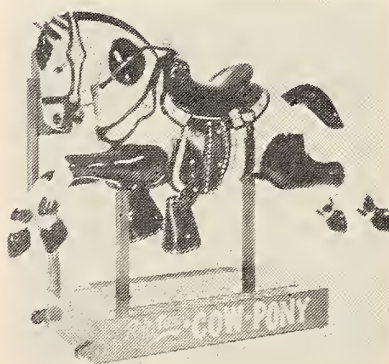

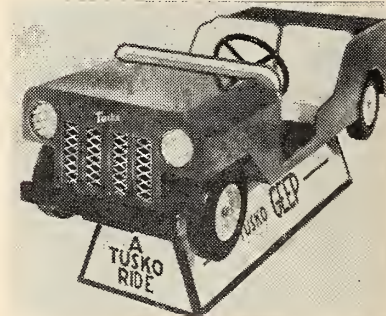

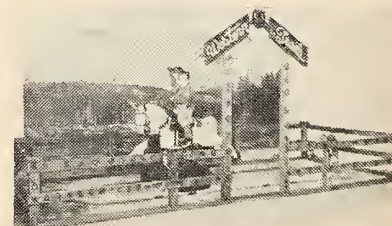

Views On Britain's Coin Machine Market

Cyril Shack Sees More Stable Industry Evolving

LONDON—Cyril Shack, Managing Director of Phonographic Equipment Ltd., sole importers of Wurlitzer Juke Boxes reports that with the free imports of amusement equipment into this country, particularly gaming machines and bingos, many of the so called investors who originally came into the juke box business with an eye to making quick money, and who were mainly responsible for cutting terms to locations bringing them down to uneconomical figures, have now switched their attention to gaming machines and bingos which are considerably lower in price than phonographs and therefore the return is higher—this in turn is bringing greater stability to the Juke Box Industry. With no influx of new operators into the industry new locations are being absorbed by existing operators who are aware of the dangers involved in cutting terms, thus making operating uneconomical. There is, therefore, much closer co-operation between bona fide operators than before.

Following the freeing of imports in July 1959 operators were faced with enormous depreciation on equipment purchased prior to that date and were not immediately interested in buying any more equipment. However, with this new found stability they are now becoming much more interested in purchasing new equipment, particularly as the prices of leading American imported machines are more realistic to present operating conditions. Shack adds that: "We at Phonographic Equipment Ltd. are doing everything to help bona fide operators price wise and we feel that we are getting more than our fair share of business for both new and used phonographs."

Mrs. Shaw Advises Of Good Operating Year

LONDON—As far as juke boxes are concerned business is satisfactory and there are now approximately one third more juke boxes in this country than there were this time last year. Commenting on the present position Mrs. Lilian Shaw, Hon. Sec. of The Phonograph Operators Association reports that the industry has had a very fair year and although returns, per machine, are not as high as they were, operators have nothing to complain about. Mrs. Shaw went on to say: "The trade is making satisfactory progress and prospects are good, providing we can combat the influx into the market of gaming machines, and in this respect, it is encouraging to find that by and large responsible site operators are not having anything to do with fruit machines except to sell them if they are asked to supply them".

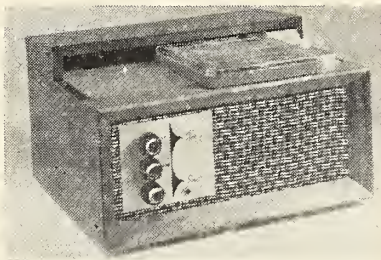

Si Redd Organization Moving Full Speed Ahead On Multiple Projects Ships "Candid Camera", Moves Plant, Establishes One-Stop Vending Service In N. Eng.

ALLSTON, MASS.—Si Redd, Redd Distributing Co., Inc., this city, very seldom does one thing at a time, but it is still unusual for him to tackle several large projects at once and that's what Redd has gone and done. "I've got the bug to make real progress now that I've just about made the circuit in this business and I aim to see that I'm successful in not only my main business, buying and selling equipment, but a couple of other tasks I've picked up along the way."

One of the current ideas out of the Redd camp is the newest novelty machine on the market. "The Hollywood Candid Camera." The coin-operated machine allows the patron to view his face in a distorted, but humorous manner, about four different funny faces for a nickel. "Its the old distorted-image-in-the-mirror idea we've all seen at amusement parks only this time I've managed to charge money for each peek. And our eight week location-testing in Chicago and the midwest has proven that the machine

will earn a lot of money for the operator with one on location."

Redd's optimism is confirmed by the signing of no less than fifty-two top flight distributors across the country. Samples went out during the past few weeks and according to Redd, every distributor should have one on display. "It's the novelty machine that does nothing but take in money as far as I can see," states Si. "No service, no heavy equipment, no large space user. Everything is in its favor and I wouldn't be going ahead manufacturing this machine if I didn't have my heart and soul in it."

"Really there is nothing wrong with this business that a little money would not cure . . . and that is exactly what the new Hollywood Candid Camera does . . . makes money! The price is right! As a matter of fact, the Candid Camera is just an improved model with many added features that Exhibit Supply Co.'s old Arcade Division manufactured some forty-five years ago; yet it is one of the top money-makers in Arcades, discount houses, theatre lobbies, airports, etc. etc. The Candid Camera is the first of a series of different machines which Redd will present to the Industry in the future. Be on the look-out for the new nickel weighing scale which, in addition to giving you your weight also gives you your height—the new Engraver machine that has many useful purposes," states Redd.

While Redd's manufacturing crew is grinding out the daily production on the "Hollywood Candid Camera," Si keeps busy with still another expansion project which entails moving from his present quarters at 298 Lincoln Street to a new and larger building over at 130 Lincoln Street. Two floors totaling 29,000 square feet of space will offer operators fast, efficient tailgate loading, larger than usual quantities of games and music, facilities for expanded export trade, and, another new wrinkle in the Redd program, a one-step vending service that will embrace complete vending equipment for even the largest full-line operations, including merchandise and supplies. "We're already selling freight car loads of coffee and syrup each week and our vending machine business is increasing to the point where we did what appeared logical. Expanded to carry the greater vending business. We've done something else and that is to concentrate in the distributing and selling end of the business. We do not operate and we don't intend to operate vending machines. We will, however, provide vending operators, or potential vending ops, and there are new faces every day, to come in and avail themselves of our fine service."

Si Redd started one of New England's first one-stop record services many years ago, and as he pointed out, he has completed the circuit. Now its one-stop vending and he'll probably be just as successful.

Atlas Music Holds 2nd "Artist Of Week" Dinner "Public Wants LP Selections!"—Gordon

CHICAGO—Edward Ginsburg, president of Atlas Music Company of this city, hosted the second in a series of dinner meetings to acquaint music operators throughout this area with the new Seeburg "Artist of the Week" promotion and the swing to 33 1/3 rpm 7" records, Tuesday evening, July 19, at the Sheraton Blackstone Hotel.

Ginsburg, who was assisted by his Atlas Music associates Nate Feinstein, Harold Schwartz, Gene Waldman and Manual Herman, was the perfect host in catering to the pleasure of his guests during a cocktail party preceding the dinner, and finally the meeting.

Representing Seeburg Corporation were Delbert Coleman, president; Bob Kelly, executive vice president; Jack Gordon, vice president in charge of the phonograph division; Tom Herrick, vice president; Fleming Johnson, senior vice president; Bill Clark, comptroller for Seeburg; Malin Kenny, chief engineer; and Newell Bellamy.

The meeting was opened by Ginsburg, who introduced Del Coleman to the guests in attendance. Coleman strongly pointed out the pressing need these days for a program, such as Seeburg's "Artist of the Week" program to greatly increase play in automatic phonographs.

He said, "We must offer our buying public, you music operators, the right kind of merchandise so that they can in turn enjoy much higher collections in the cash box."

He further added, in reference to the current trend of so-called "hit tunes" being programmed on 45 rpm in phonos: "The people who visit taverns do not purchase this inferior type of music—they're solely interested in the good music they seek in their album purchases. If they won't listen to the inferior music in their homes what makes you think for one moment that they'll put dimes and quarters in juke boxes to play it. We are offering the people what they want in Seeburg's 'Artist of the Week' plan! The American public has a habit of demanding standardization in an industry. Now we've come to that stage in our industry with 33 1/3 rpm records for phonographs."

At this point in the showing Jack Gordon brought the guests up to date with Seeburg's progress in the automatic phonograph field with the advent in 1948 of the first 100 selection phonograph—the Seeburg M100A. He then reminded operators of the introduction in October, 1950 of Seeburg's B100B phonograph, which first programmed the 45 rpm record.

He said: "Now 33 1/3 records, which are generally represented at this time in 12" LP's, garner 85% of the total record business. Only the teenagers and music operators use 45 rpm single records!"

He then explained the vast changes through the past several years being wrought in recording techniques which finally brought in the exciting stereo field. He exclaimed, "There is nothing deader than a 45 rpm record in the public's eye!"

Tom Herrick then took over the meeting explaining the facts and figures in a changing music market.

Nate Feinstein cited several clear cut cases of operators in this area who have swung to Seeburg's "Artist of the Week" plan and have considerably improved collections. Another factor, he said, was that several ops who were having difficulty with location owners solved their problems with this plan, which is most desirable for the location owner as well as the operator.

Gordon closed his remarks when he returned to direct the meeting with the fact that the "Artist of the Week" promotion is available on the See-

Features Bouncing Balls and Star Reserve Bonus

Pingames led the field once again with a total of 26 new models introduced. Pool tables and shuffles tied for third place with 12 each and the remaining types games fared in the following manner: Ball Bowlers (9); Guns (7); In-Lines (5); Novelty (4); Baseball Games (3); Card Vendors (2); and shuffleboards (1).

Last year's twelve month period turned out ten less machines than this 12 month fiscal with a total of 88 machines. There were 7 more pin games produced and exactly the same number of bowlers (9) this year over last. Pool tables doubled its number of new entries moving from 6 in 1958-1959 to 12 this past 12 months. Guns were one up over last period with a 7 to 6 score.

"Now to get down to bare facts concerning 'Vend-A-View,'" Howard added. "The machine has a capacity of 800 color slides (100 of each selection) and is easily refilled by anyone at the location. In fact there is storage space for more slides inside the cabinet. Operation is on 110 volt, 60 cycle, A.C. There is a selector button in front of the cabinet."

"Operators," he added, "have great opportunities with 'Vend-A-View'. It offers them locations which are unavailable to them with other types of coin-operated equipment, and assures them of higher earnings, and an extremely low cost operation."

Irving Kaye Firm Takes New Quarters

**32,000 Sq. Ft. To Be
Used In Manufacturing**

BROOKLYN, N.Y.—Irving Kaye, president, Irving Kaye Company, this city, manufacturers of pool tables and amusement machines, advised that the firm will move from its present quarters on Bergen Street to new and enlarged manufacturing facilities located at 363 Prospect Avenue, Brooklyn.

The new plant occupies 32,000 square feet of space and will be ready for occupancy in about 30 days.

"We've decided that larger quarters is our only answer to improved operator service. The larger space will enable us to more efficiently serve the coinmen in the nation with our production on five different coin-operated games, stated Kaye. The manufacturer is currently producing "Fleetwood" and "Jumbo Fleetwood" single-ball viewer pool games; "El Dorado" pool table; "Q-Ball;" and "Klub Pool." In addition, the firm's subsidiary manufactures hand dryers, gasoline driven vacuum cleaners, electric purifiers and other electronic equipment.

Kaye also advised that the company will announce a new game at a later date and that the new manufacturing facilities will enable the production and delivery to operate at peak efficiency.

Buddy Fox, sales manager of the firm, stated that the move will also help coordinate various functions of the company enabling larger production runs to be more easily accommodated.

The latest device to come off the Kaye assembly lines has been the metal replacement bumper for use on the bumper pool games. Kaye introduced the metal bumper at the MOA Convention in May and reports that sales have been very good since the announcement.

Music From The Adult Viewpoint

Seeburg Exec Outlines Reasons Behind Change To LP Programming

33-1/3 Speed Disks Fill Juke Spot Requests

By Jack Gordon, V.P. In Charge Phonograph Sales



J. C. (JACK) GORDON

It has long been a paradox in our industry that the music the public likes best is frequently unavailable on the instrument the public plays the most—the coin-operated phonograph.

Out of every dollar spent on phonograph records John Q. Public now spends 80¢ or more on 12 inch 33-1/3 RPM albums. And as recently as 1953 it was singles which accounted for over two-thirds of the dollar volume of record sales.

Today the single record is running an amazingly poor second to album sales and this is causing considerable alarm and much wonderment in the industry. Actually there are in our opinion at least, good and logical reasons for this development.

However, let's forget for a moment all of the reasons theoretical and actual—the inconvenience of two speeds, a different center hole and the economic fact that a discounted \$3.98 12-tune album is a much better buy than two tunes for \$.98.

Let's just talk about the music. Al-

though hit tunes are finding their way into albums to some extent the music to be found in albums is characteristically different for the most part than that found on singles. It might be called "adult" music, as opposed to teenage music.

Now, it is a matter of record in all industry surveys that the tavern (where teen-agers may not congregate) shelters more than half of the country's juke boxes. So it follows that if you can get only teenage music on single records and the juke box can play only singles, the adult taste in music is certainly not being satisfied by what's available at the location level.

On the south side of Chicago there is a new weekend phenomenon in top locations called "jam sessions." Several imaginative young entrepreneurs have set up a little Saturday night business which involves visiting top locations with a good stereo record player and an armload of albums.

For a \$10 fee they set up shop during the busiest part of the evening and play the latest best selling albums for the cash customers. What do you suppose is happening with the juke box while this is going on? It's unplugged and deadlier than a doornail.

The people sit around and listen to all the artists and kinds of music that they can't hear on the juke box—all of the top vocalists and big band material; the Sinatras, Darins, Kingston Trios, Mitch Millers, Basies and others who automatically sell a jillion of a new album. Do you suppose there would be any market for this service if this same music were available selectively on the juke box?

The public is hungry for a kind of music that they can't get on single 45's. Certainly the hit tune record is a dominant factor in our business—and always will be. But its predominance in coin-operated phonograph programming is far in excess of what retail record sales indicate it should be.

33 1/3 RPM Singles Currently Available

NEW YORK—At the present time approximately twenty labels are producing packages of 33-1/3 rpm 7" singles which are available for juke box programming. According to the record manufacturers regular releases will be made at intervals increasing the amount of programming material.

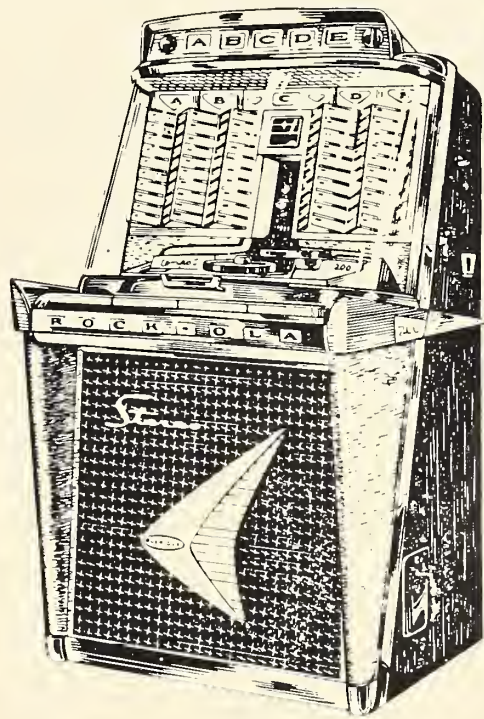
Cole Announces "Iceburg"

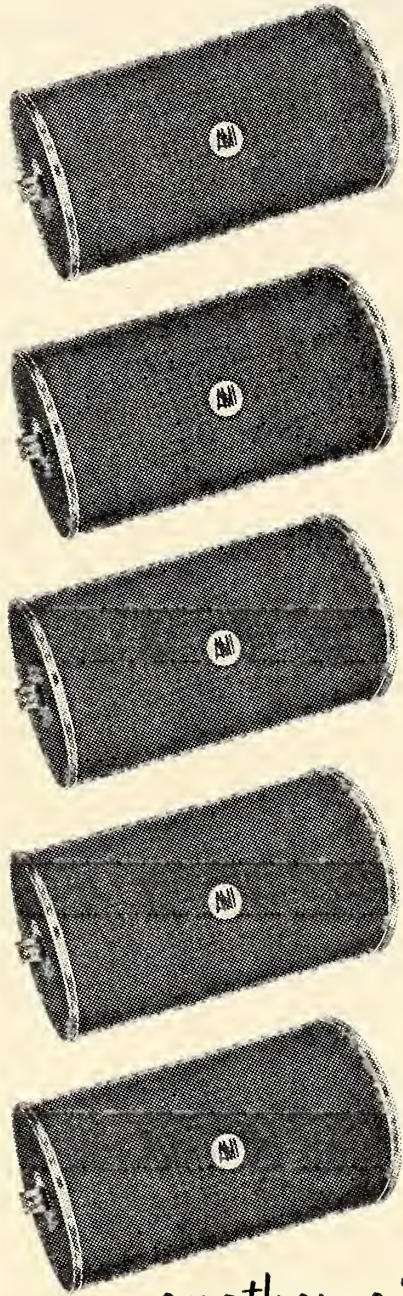

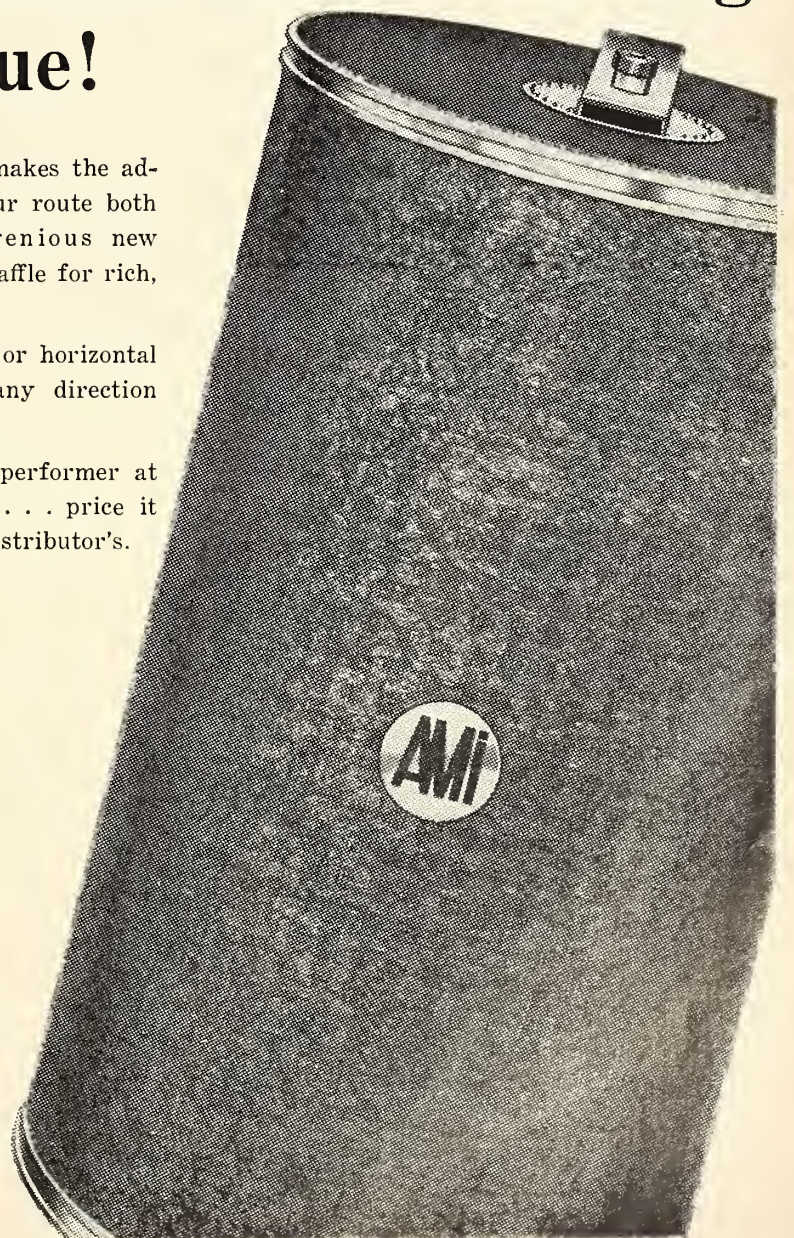

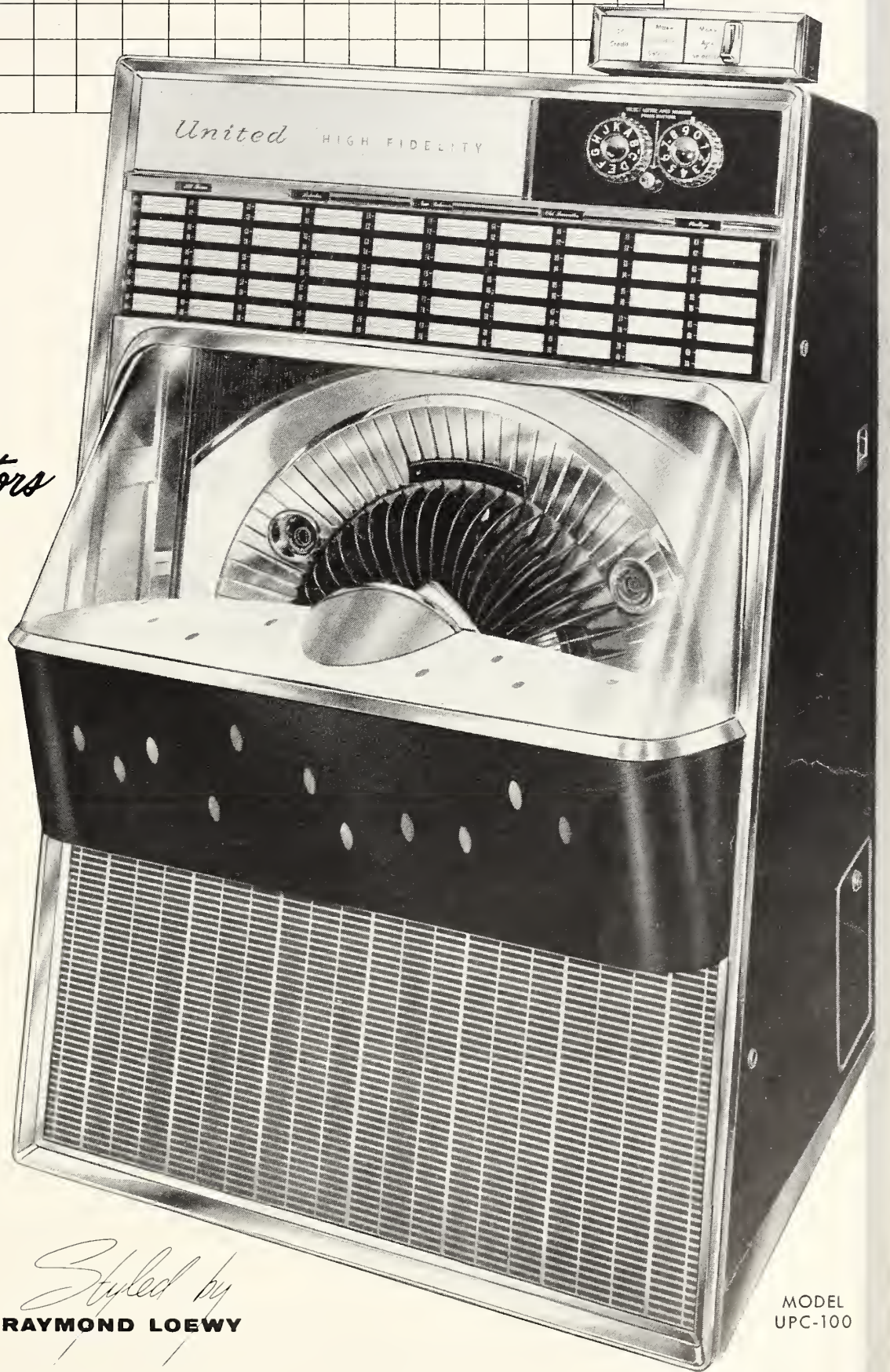
