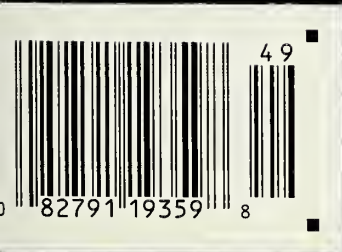

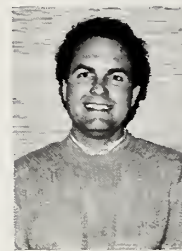

Ex-KMET Jocks To Sue Former Station

At a press conference held on Friday, May 22, former KMET/Los Angeles disc jockeys Jim Ladd, David Perry, and Jack Snyder unveiled the details of their recently filed multimillion dollar lawsuits against their former station. Represented by their counsel Jeffrey Feld, the trio discussed the specifics of the allegedly fraudulent hiring practices utilized by KMET (now KTWV, The Wave), which fired all of its on-air staff in one afternoon just prior to debuting the nation's first disc jockey-less format on February 14.

"The suits are not based upon wrongful firing; rather they are based upon wrongful hiring," read Feld from a prepared statement. "We stipulate that KMET had every right to fire all of their DJ's in order to debut The Wave. However, what neither defendants Howard Bloom, station vice president/general manager, Frank Cody, program director, nor anyone else associated with The Wave had any right to do was hire these three individuals under false pretenses, and without disclosing to them KMET's ongoing plans and research to do away with the very format under which Ladd, Perry, and Snyder were to be employed."

The disc jockeys' case hinges on the chronology of the development of The Wave, a "music for a New Age"

format specializing in soft rock and jazz with no disc jockeys, which took the place of the Album Rock formatted KMET. The Mighty Met, as it was known in Los Angeles, had been a flagship station for rock and roll radio in the late 1970's, but it had fallen to a 1.6 share in the Arbitron ratings. "We have alleged in the recently filed lawsuits that unbeknownst to any of the three plaintiffs here today, at the same time that negotiations were being carried out on their respective contracts, the management of KMET was actively and secretly planning, testing, and researching the disc jockey-less Wave format."

These charges are being denied by KTWV's parent company, Metropolitan Broadcasting, also named as a defendant in the suit. Their attorney, Marsha Hammer, told *Cash Box*, "Their case is without merit. They have misstated the facts, and I offered to explain the chronology of the development of the Wave format prior to the bringing of the lawsuit. They declined the opportunity."

The purpose of the lawsuit is to determine if the three announcers were induced to contract with KMET at a time when the management of the station knew of the possible change to

New Packaging Firm Readies Production

LOS ANGELES—The 3-V Corporation, a new public company based in Las Vegas, will begin production this summer of their "Ultrapak," a new plastic packaging, which the company hopes to market to the music industry among others.

Ultrapak-ing consists of four-color printing (matte or glossy) on durable plastic sheets that are then manufactured into various types of packaging on high-speed machines developed by 3-V.

"When we were down at NARM in February, we came away with requests for quotes in excess of 33 million pieces," says Ann Hansen, 3-V's president and CEO in charge of marketing and sales. "You are looking at every major record company. The requests came mostly from the presidents and the executive vice presidents of their companies and there has been follow up on that."

Production of album jackets and CD boxes is scheduled to begin in July when presses and packaging machines will begin manufacturing the new product. "We're taking orders for

delivery in July," Hansen says. Northern California-based Global Pacific Records, distributed by Columbia Records, will be the first company to use the new packaging for their album jackets and CD boxes.

"There's an agreement between the two companies that, obviously, they want to be the first and they have every right to be because they gave us the support we needed to get the samples," says Hansen.

While the company has targeted the music industry first, they have also had interest from home video, computer software, toy companies and cosmetic manufacturers because of the bright colors produced through the printing process which makes them "color fast." Although 3-V will handle the printing exclusively, they can manufacture the finished product or lease the machines to any company who wants to manufacture it themselves.

"Many package manufacturing machines cost several hundred thousand dollars, but ours will be considerably cheaper depending on how

MTV Reclaims Its New-Music Mandate

NEW YORK — MTV is once again emphasizing new music. Though established superstars still make up the bulk of its programming, clips by emerging acts are being played with greater frequency on the channel and many bands are breaking through because of the exposure.

In the last ten months, MTV has pared its playlists down from 110 clips a week to about 75, and shifted their focus to up-and-coming acts. Middle-of-the-road material and pop balladry has largely been cut-out and relegated to VH-1, which has also undergone reorganization. Where once VH-1 featured strictly A/C fare, now they too have cut-out some of the softer material and added clips by acts like Simply Red, Robert Cray, and Level 42.

Much of this is the result of last fall's management changes at MTV and VH-1. "What we wanted to do was streamline in two areas. We wanted to re-focus the music programming to mainstream rock 'n' roll very sensitive to the leading edge," says Sam Kaiser, an MTV programming vice president. "We wanted to take all the upper demo music and really soft-pop stuff and restrict them from MTV because we felt they really didn't serve the target in the direction we were going into. At the same time, of course, there was the development of VH-1, where those videos have a place to go and where they have an audience that would appreciate them."

"The next thing we wanted to do was pare the new playlists down to a size where these videos on starter rota-

tion could be rotated with enough frequency that we could find out whether people, A) liked them, or, B) didn't like them....We significantly increased the starter rotation so a video getting on even the lowest rotation on MTV would have a shot (at) the proper amount of exposure," he says.

To that end, MTV developed a feature called the *Hip Clip Of The Week*, which puts a video by a new act into ultra-heavy rotation (eight plays a day) for a week. The recent success of Geffen's Whitesnake started with *Hip Clip* rotation, and the Beastie Boys, Los Lobos, World Party, and The Cult all went on to greater success after being featured in the series.

Kaiser says that the *Hip Clip* "reaffirms our commitment to new artists," and features acts that have no previous track record but plenty of commercial potential and lots of support from its record company. "We have to know the label would be behind it and really committed to it," says Kaiser. "The reason we wanted that commitment is that we're going to commit the ultimate heaviest rotation on a weekly basis."

The *Hip Clip*, along with the new-music program *120 Minutes* and I.R.S.'s *The Cutting Edge*, have gone a good way toward recapturing MTV's original, more adventurous spirit.

"What we wanted to do was really bring back the active MTV viewer and active music consumer to the channel," says Kaiser, "and reaffirm the original MTV mandate of being on the leading edge of popular music and popular culture."

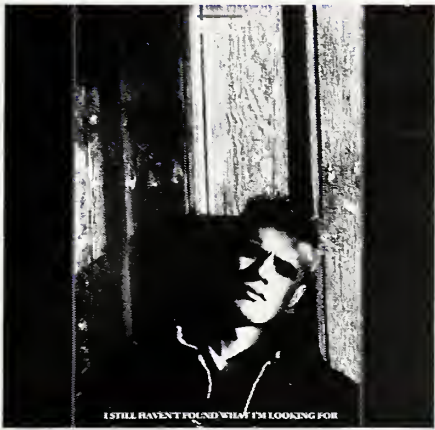

Nick Kamen is a star about to happen. He looks like **Elvis Presley**, sings like **Boy George**, and generally comes off like a male version of **Madonna**. In fact, **Madonna** has been a big supporter of Kamen's; she liked his demo so much that she gave him one of her songs (co-written with **Stephen Bray**) for his eponymous debut album on **Sire** - marking the first time she's penned a tune for another singer.

"We got in touch through **Seymour Stein**, the head of **Sire**," says Kamen. "He sent a tape to **Madonna** and...she called me up and said she had a song for me."

That song, "Each Time You Break My Heart," is but one of the highlights on an album that includes tracks written by **Sam Cooke** ("Win Your Love"), **Stevie Wonder** ("Lovin' You Is Sweeter Than Ever"), **Bob Dylan** ("The Man In Me"), and **Burt Bacharach** ("Any Day Now"). Kamen has an ear for great songs and a breezy, soulful way of getting them across that puts his album in league with such eighties blue-eyed r&b as **Culture Club's** "Kissing To Be Clever," **Paul Young's** "No Parlez," and, of course, **Madonna's** debut LP.

In the U.S., the album is making the same slow build that **Madonna's** first one did, starting in dance clubs (where "Each Time..." is currently #5 on playlists) and the twelve inch charts (#35 bullet), while gradually crossing into pop.

But in Europe, the album is exploding. "Loving You Is Sweeter Than Ever" was number one for three weeks in Italy, "Each Time..." is currently the most-played track on **French FM** radio, and three singles from the album have charted in his native England.

A lot of people, however, are not going to get past Kamen's sex appeal. Kamen is finding that his good looks and former occupation as a model (appearing in a popular **British jeans commercial**) are making it difficult for some to take him seriously.

"As far as being taken serious by a lot of people, yeah, it works against me," he says. "They just don't get

past the cover usually....But I think that a lot of people have been surprised by the album.

The people who have genuinely listened to the album have actually liked it and not expected to hear what they've heard. So it's going to take time to get across to everybody."

Kamen though has already had a bigger hit with **Wonder's** "Loving You Is Sweeter Than Ever" than the **Four Tops** had with it in the late sixties - back when Kamen, now 22, was still in diapers. Though most of the songs he sings are older than he is, Kamen knows his r&b, having immersed himself in it as a teenager. "A friend of mine in school kind of introduced me to **Marvin Gaye** and I started picking up on earlier stuff and then getting into **Motown** and **Smokey Robinson** and found all the **Stax**. And someone else introduced me to **Percy Sledge** and **Wilson Pickett** and **Otis Redding** and before I knew it I had all this music. It was like - oh, I love it."

Kamen sees himself as a singer above all else; even though he writes, none of his songs were included on the album. "I've been writing on and off," he says. "But I've got a long way to go in terms of satisfying myself. With the kind of songs I've been singing now, I've set a standard for myself. I'm singing **Bacharach** and **Dylan** and **Sam Cooke**. On the next album I want to (include) some of my own songs, if they're good enough, if I'm happy enough with them. I'm not precious about songs. If there is a better one I'll go with the better song whether it's mine or somebody else's."

Max Roach: 40 Years Of Bright Moments

NEW YORK—"I believe you should add," says **Max Roach** in his apartment overlooking **Central Park**. "It if's good, you don't give it up. At least I believe that—you keep collecting and collecting. I don't believe you should give it away. I was told this by a teacher at the **Manhattan School of Music**, **Giannini**. He was the comp teacher there and, when you got to a certain level, he would have you come up to his office on **West End Avenue**. And he would always say, 'Never give anything up, just keep adding to what you already have.'" To say that **Max**

Roach has been adding ever since is to say a mouthful. **Max Roach's** career has been an empire of diversity. One of the founding fathers of modern jazz drumming—he was the favorite drummer of the bebop movement in the '40s—Roach went on to form one of the hardest hard bop bands of the '50s (with **Clifford Brown**), to become involved with the **Civil Rights** movement and to embrace free jazz in the '60s, to become a professor of music in the '70s. He has always been an experimenter, has always looked to add

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Stephanie Mills Lets The Music Shine Through With "If I Were Your Woman"

LOS ANGELES—Stephanie Mills has come a long way since the pint-sized dynamo first blew away audiences as Dorothy in the long-running Broadway musical "The Wiz."

She's progressed, over the years, from child prodigy, to teenage stage sensation, to disco temptress, to the warm, charismatic, and thoroughly grown-up singer featured on her new MCA album, "If I Were Your Woman."

If the album's title and its sensuous, womanly cover photos don't tip listeners off, the music certainly will: Stephanie Mills has made it to a more mature place musically, a place where increased business control has meant more artistic control, and a chance to let her truest musical sensibilities reign.

The project may surprise some listeners, especially those quick to peg the Grammy and American Music Award-winning recording veteran as a sort of disco pixie.

Slight of frame though she may be (4'9"), there's nothing diminutive about Mills' input on "If I Was Your Woman," a project she co-executive produced with manager/sister-in-law Cassandra Mills, and for which she co-wrote half of the album's eight tunes.

Along with her responsibilities as executive producer (a position which not only had her keeping an eye on the budget, but selecting producers and songs) Mills' artistic license grew, and that meant more emphasis on the music and its vocals, and less on the material's immediate commercial value.

"I think before," Mills explained to *Cash Box* recently, "MCA and I got into saying 'Oh, we have to have a dance hit,' whereas with this album we just wanted to make good songs."

The album took ten months to complete, and features a host of hand-picked, top-name producers, including Ken Kersey (producer of Mill's most recent hit single, "I've Learned To Respect The Power of Love"), La La (Whitney Houston), Paul Laurence (Freddie Jackson), Wayne Braithwaite (Billy Ocean), rappers Davy-D and Russell Simmons, Nick Martinelli (whose credits include Mills' self-titled debut album for MCA) and labelmate Robert Brookins.

Undaunted by the hefty producer line-up, Mills' personal influence over the project flourished. "I think this album is definitely my personality," she remarks. "Everything about this album, from the record to the video, is my personality, whereas maybe before I would allow other people to interject. You know how you take opinions from people, and sometimes you get so lost in their opinions that you lose your own identity? With this project it's definitely my personality and my feelings, totally."

The album's first single, "I Feel Good All Over," written by Gabriel and Annette Hardman and produced by Nick Martinelli, is a lush, soulfully romantic ballad featuring a Gospel-tinged chorus and an electrifyingly full-flight vocal from Mills. The tune, which boasts a video directed by Marty

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IT WAS TWENTY YEARS ago this week that The Beatles' "Sgt. Peppers Lonely Hearts Club Band" came out, and Capitol marks the June 1st anniversary with the release of the CD version. For many, it's the highlight of the Fab Four CD series, not because it's their best album ("Abbey Road" is) but because it's their most detailed — and details count for a lot on CD. With digital clarity we can hear the animal noises that connect "Good Morning, Good Morning" to the title track reprise, Harrison's laughter following "Within You Without You," the circus ambience of "Being For The Benefit Of Mr. Kite!," and, of course, the fifteen bar orchestral crescendo on "A Day In The Life." Should be Capitol's biggest yet. But me, I'm still waiting to hear the CD of "Revolution #9" played backwards so we can settle that mystery about Paul once and for all.

MICK JAGGER has produced a demo for Vernon Reid's *Living Color*, one of the top unsigned bands in the New York area. It happened after Jagger and Jeff Beck stopped by CBGBs recently to check-out Reid's band, which was playing on a bill with other Black Rock Coalition groups. The Glimmer Twin was apparently so impressed that he took Reid's *Living Color* into the studio to produce a couple of their tunes. Major labels had already been courting the band, and, with the Jagger-produced tape, a signing now appears imminent.

ACE FREHLEY, ex-Kiss guitarist, is back on the charts in a big way with "Frehley's Comet" (Megaforce/Atlantic), which jumped more than 90 points to number #77 bullet in its second week on the pop album chart. "Into The Night" is the first single and if it sounds something like a Kiss classic that's because it was written by Russ Ballard, who penned "Back In The New York Groove" for Kiss. "I don't feel any pressure to have to live up

to Kiss," Frehley says. "To some people I'm gonna be a debut act. Some people are going to buy this record not even knowing that I was in Kiss." Though he won't be wearing any make-up when Frehley's Comet hits the road this summer, he will be bringing along a Kiss-like exploding guitar. "I think if I don't blow up my guitar my fans are going to get really

upset," he says. "I'm pretty well noted for a smoking guitar so I'm going to definitely do that and a few more surprises. And we will do a few Kiss songs."




GLIMMER TWIN — Mick Jagger has produced a demo for Vernon Reid's *Living Color*, one of the top unsigned groups in the N.Y. area. Word has it that a major label deal is close for the Black Rock Coalition founder.

ERASURE's Vince Clarke, in town recently to play two sold-out Ritz gigs, talked with *East Coastings* about his group's new album, "The Circus" (Sire), which has already spawned a top-two U.K. single in "Sometimes." The album is full of potential follow-up singles, among them "It Doesn't Have To Be," a hooky tune with English and Swahili lyrics. "The guy who does our press in England speaks fluent Swahili," says Clarke, who formed Erasure with vocalist Andy Bell. "Before he was a press officer he used to be a snake catcher in the middle of Africa somewhere. We knew what we wanted to say but we needed a translation for it. Andy came up with this brilliant harmony to go with it that sounded really authentic."

But for the most part "The Circus" is less exotic, staying close to the ebullient pure pop that put their first album, "Wonderland" (Sire), in league with some of Abba and Squeeze's best records. "I like Squeeze a lot and Andy's really a fan of Abba," says the former member of Yaz and Depeche Mode. "They're like perfect pop bands. But that's just a case of not kidding yourself that you're doing anything more serious than that. My favorite song is like a three minute song, definitely with a chorus I can remember." Which pretty well describes what Erasure does. Indeed, one listen to "Sometimes" or "Reunion" or "Love Is A Loser" and you'll be caving in to a pure pop craving you shouldn't try to fight.

BRIEFINGS — Twin Tone Records is close to an agreement with A&M Records that would allow A&M first option on acquiring bands on labels under the Twin Tone umbrella. Details have not yet been finalized on the pact, which should be announced some time next week....Upcoming New York area concerts: King Sunny Ade plays The Ritz June 11 and 12, and Wire is there June 13....TVT recording band The Saints play Maxwells' June 29 and the Ritz June 26....The Roches Bottom Line shows (June 5 and 6) sold-out so fast that they will return there the next weekend for four shows (June 12 and 13).

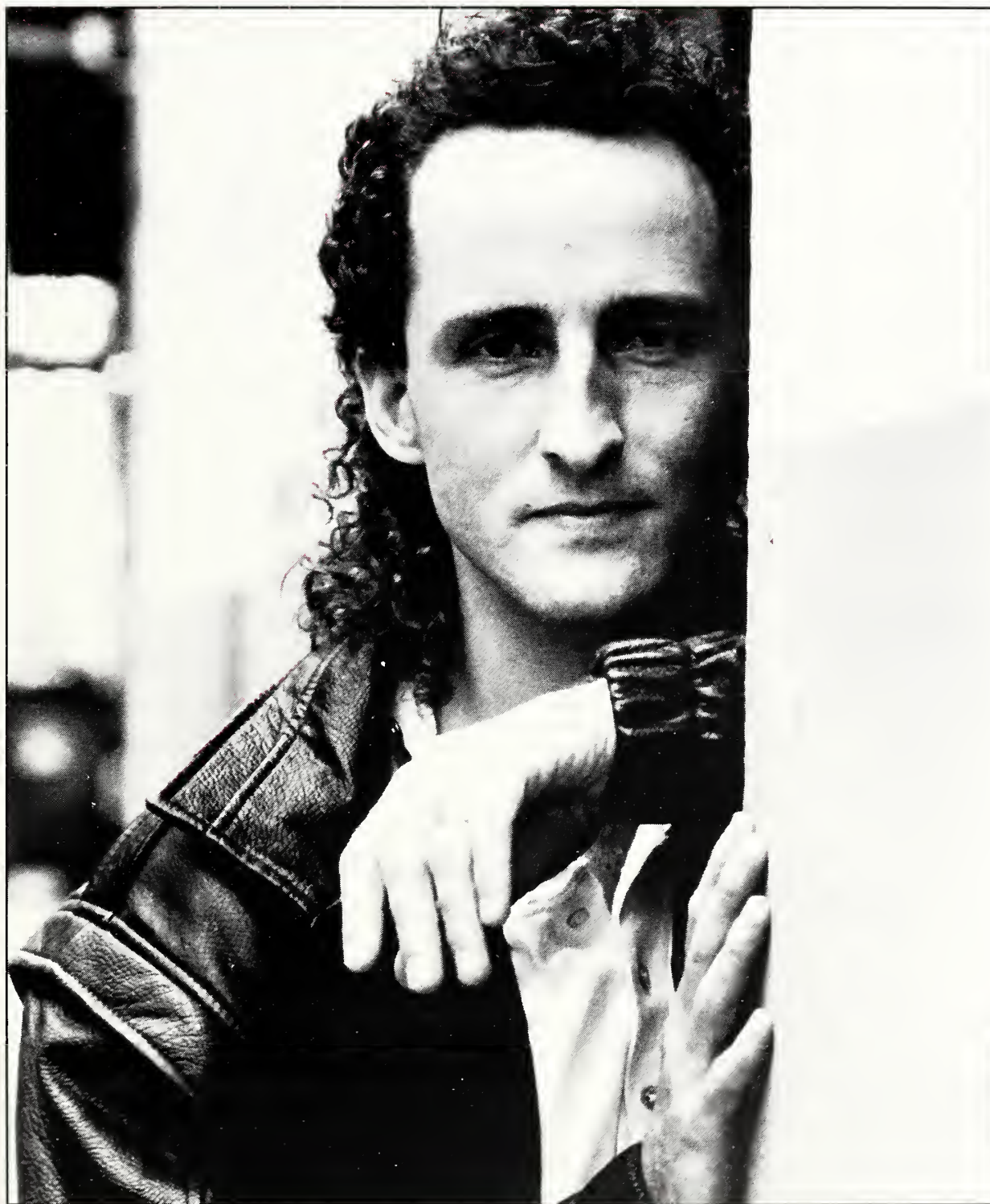

Other strong cuts include the title cut and "Outside The City."

Powerful initial effort from this 23-year old Chicago singer/songwriter, who, despite his tender years, is a studio veteran. He has worked with Lionel Richie, David Foster, Kenny Rogers, and others. His debut features appearances by ex-Eagles Joe Walsh and Timothy B. Schmidt, and the first single, "Don't Mean Nothing," is tearing up AOR and starting to cross to Top 40. "Should've Known Better" might be more accessible for pop radio, while A/C should look at "Hold On To The Nights."

Lawsuit Rocks The Waters At "The Wave" ... The recent saga that rocked the Los Angeles radio market, the controversial format change of L.A. staple AOR station KMET to an experimental "new age, no disc jockey" format as KTWV ("The Wave"), continued as three of the stations popular disc jockeys, **Jim Ladd**, **David Perry**, and **Jack Snyder** initiated a lawsuit against the management of 94.7. "The suits are not based upon wrongful firing, rather they are based upon wrongful hiring. We stipulate that KMET had every right to fire all of their disc jockeys in order to debut 'The Wave'," stated attorney Jeffrey Feld. He continued that the suit claims no one had the right " ... to hire these three individuals under false pretenses and without disclosing to them KMET's ongoing plans and research to do away with the very format under which Ladd, Perry, and Snyder were to be employed." KMET, the suit claims, offered contracts to the three men when management of the station knew of the impending format change, and as Ladd points out "the three of us were all offered, independently, full-time employment at another L.A. station, and had I known that all of this promotion, all of this hype meant I would be working for two weeks and four days, I might have considered some other options. Someone here knew what was going on and purposely misled us." Perry continued "Not only did they have this legal obligation to tell us this information, we point-blank asked them, and they told us that no change was forthcoming. Not only does this make for a more binding legal obligation, it becomes a point of honor." Each filed suits against 94.7 V.P. and General Manager **Howard Bloom** and Program Director **Frank Cody**, as well as parent company **Metropolitan Broadcasting**, charging breach of contract and fraud. Ladd, Perry, and Snyder currently hold positions at Los Angeles' successful KLSX, along with many other former KMET on-air personalities. (see accompanying editorial piece - this issue).

American Cancer Society Awards WCBS-FM ... The American Cancer Society's New York division held an award ceremony honoring WCBS-FM Radio for their outstanding service in reaching the community with vital health messages. 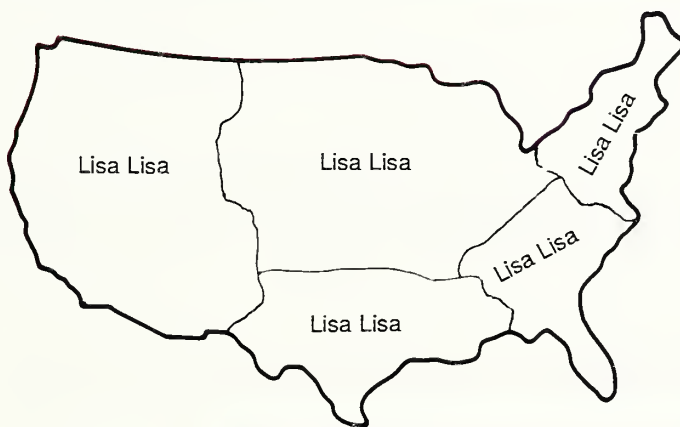

"Country Joe" Flint-Program Director
KSOP AM/FM-Salt Lake City, UT
 "Other than country music, the only thing that's important in my life is my wife and my four daughters," says KSOP's "Country Joe" Flint, and that's not an exaggeration about his love of the music. Not only does he work at the station, but he also produces a country music television

program and operates a country record store. Flint's career in radio started when he attended a San Francisco broadcasting school. From there he came back to Salt Lake City and worked at the University of Utah's radio station. After putting together an underground rock and roll station in Utah, he got his first paying job on-air at KABI, a mixed format station in Abilene Kansas. His job lasted only a month. He returned to Salt Lake City and got a part-time job at country station KRGO in 1969. Shortly thereafter, Flint was offered a full-time position at big band/easy listening station KKBC in Centerville. A little over a year later, a friend who worked at KSOP suggested Flint contact the station for a job. In May, 1971 he was hired at the station and became known as "Country Joe". He has been with KSOP ever since. Throughout the years Flint has done just about everything there is to do in radio. He is Program

Director, Music Director, Operational Manager, has an on-air shift, and has worked as a Production Director. He still prefers on-air work above all. "I guess I still like the element of just entertaining," he says. As KSOP's Program Director, he says he enjoys breaking new acts and new sounds. The station programs independent and local acts as well as major artists. "We try to judge music here by music, not by artist or label affiliation," he comments. As for community involvement, "We're always looking for ways to get the station involved more in the market," Flint says. One involvement is the annual Diabetes Rodeo Roundup in June. This year's rodeo will be the station's 6th, and features well-known cowboys Lewis Feild and Chris LeDoux. Outside of the station, Flint has co-written a book, "D.J.'s Almanac Of Country Music", a fact-finding book especially aimed at disc jockeys first getting into country radio,

so they will have information on country music readily available to them. The book was published in 1981, with a new edition coming out later this year. He and his family have operated Country Joe's Records and Tapes in Salt Lake City for six years. It is known as the only all-country record store west of Nashville, TN. Flint's current project is his new television show, "Country Joe's World Of Country Music", which has been on the air nearly one month. The 30-minute video program airs Saturday nights on KOOG-TV. This D.J., TV producer, Program Director, etc., whose trademark is his cowboy hat and "Made in the USA" hatband, plans to continue to be involved in country music throughout the future. "I believe in promoting it in every aspect that I possibly can," he says. "As long as I can get up and get around I'll be involved in country music." Now that's country music loyalty!

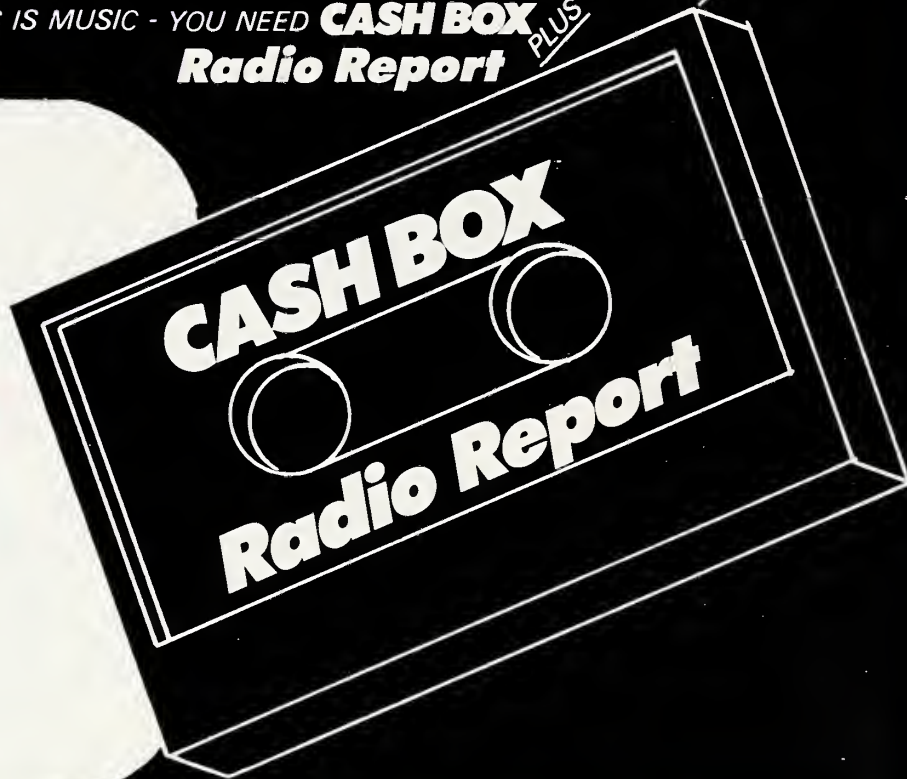

AND THEN THERE WERE NONE—The word is that MTV vjs Mark Goodman and Alan Hunter, the last hold-outs from the channel's original on-air gang, are, for all intents and purposes, leaving the channel. Hunter leaves July 1 with plans to pursue his acting career (a film with Robbie Benson, *The Crack In The Mirror*, is in the works). Goodman, on the other hand, won't be vacating the premises entirely. He'll be on call as a fill-in vj, while working on two film projects now in development which he plans to produce. Hunter has offered to make himself available for remotes, incidentally, and so MTV probably won't have seen the last of him, either, come July.

REMEMBER WHEN—Beginning June 5, VH-1, in conjunction with David Fishof Productions, will be presenting a '60's reunion tour featuring a slew of names from the past, including *The Turtles*, *The Byrds*, Mark Lindsay (of *Paul Revere & The Raiders*), Herman's Hermits, and for selected dates, *Tommy James and the Shondells*. Fishof, you may recall, was the guy responsible for the "Happy Together" tours of recent years, plus last year's "Monkees 20th Anniversary Reunion Tour." VH-1's involvement is mostly off-air, according to a spokeswoman for the channel, with logos gracing programs, banners, tickets, and also a compilation album. VH-1 vj's are expected to make appearances at at least some of the stops on the tour (which, by the way, crosses the continent from L.A. to Toronto). Beyond that, VH-1 will give monthly on-air updates of the concerts, occasionally showing clips

from them, we're told. Mark Lindsay has already taped a promo for the concerts, and VH-1 vj Roger Rowe has taped a radio spot.

MEANWHILE—Those of you who haven't "seen VH-1 lately," (that's the Ford jingle, as applied to VH-1 by *Audio/Video* in reporting the channel's many changes in recent months) should check out *Nouveaux Video*, a recent programming addition. The segment showcases new music video in a heavy rotation level of visibility (up to six airings daily), having debuted with Sire's Nick Kamon (*Each Time You Break My Heart*) and now featuring Elektra's Stan Campbell (*Years Go By*). The *Nouveaux Video* segment won't necessarily appear every week, says a channel spokeswoman, but only when the new product warrants it.

TOGETHER AGAIN—Video vet Toni Basil, who is co-directing, staging and choreographing David Bowie's "Glass Spider" tour, also has her work featured in Bowie's new *Time Will Crawl* video. Basil and Bowie first worked together long, long ago, on Bowie's Diamond Dogs Tour in 1974.

REMAKE—Gravel-voiced songstress Marianne Faithfull has a new album, "Strange Weather," due from Island Records June 22. Produced by Hal Willner, the LP's first single in the UK and Europe is a remake of Faithfull's '60's classic, "As Tears Go By," with a video directed by English *Vogue* photographer Terrence Donovan (who also directed Robert Palmer's *Addicted to Love*). We're told the clip makes use of Faithfull TV clips and news footage from the '60's.

CYNDI GOES FRANCAISE—This past March, Cyndi Lauper was in Paris, and she wasn't just shopping. The girl who likes to have fun (and dye her hair a lot) was in town for the last stop of her recent world tour, and also to film an HBO special, *Cyndi Lauper In Paris*, on the tour's last night. The show, taped at Paris' Le Zenith theatre for CBS Music Video Enterprises, is Lauper's first full-length solo tv concert. Her biggest hits are featured (natch). Andy Morahan directed.

THE RELEASE BEAT

From Vestron MusicVideo in July comes two music releases: *Billy Idol: Vital Idol* and *The Beach Boys: An American Band*. The Idol tape - the pop star's home video debut - is a compilation of hit videos, including recent hits, *To Be A Lover*, *Don't Need A Gun* and *Sweet Sixteen*. The Beach Boys reel is a specially edited 25th Anniversary version of the band's acclaimed film biography, featuring footage from the Beach Boy's private archives and 20 of the band's songs in stereo. Both releases retail for a suggested retail price of \$19.98, VHS and Beta ... From MCA Home Video next month comes the second of the label's Doors home video releases (following the highly popular *Doors: Dance On Fire*), *The Doors: Live At The Hollywood Bowl*. Taped in the summer of 1968, the cassette chronicles the only full-length Doors concert captured on color film. Suggested retail price for the hour-long concert tape is \$24.95, available in VHS Dolby HiFi stereo and Beta HiFi stereo, digitally mastered and mixed from the original master analog tapes.

VSDA/NARM NEWS—Mickey Granberg, executive vice president of the Video Software Dealers Association, recently sent a letter to VSDA regular members asking them to help combat the pro-home taping messages, which are found in Pay Per View and Cable advertisements such as "you'll never have to go to your video store again," or "tape 2 (movies at 2 (AM)," by sending such "originals or copies of any direct mail advertising" which encourages home taping or "denigrates the video retailer or home video" to the VSDA. Send the ad, a taped copy or printed piece, identifying source, date and place with the name of publication, cable system or television station and the geographic region to: VSDA PPV Project 3 Eves Drive, Suite 307 Marlton, NJ 08053. "It is important in making our case to the studios, that we have as much actual documentation of such advertising as possible. Home taping and piracy hurt the video retailer AND the studios. We need the proper window to protest our dynamic, growing industry," says Granberg...VSDA Reports, the Association's monthly newsletter has a new editor, Elizabeth Hanlin, who will be coordinating the entire publication including editorial content and advertising...The board of directors of the National Association of Recording Merchandisers (NARM), adopted a resolution at its meeting in Los Angeles on April 28, 1987, fully supporting the proposition that creators and owners of intellectual property (copyright owners) be adequately compensated for their intellectual

contributions. In the case of digital audio recorders, the board favors the imposition of an appropriate royalty, to be distributed to the copyright owners. Since this legislation will probably take some time for analysis and passage, NARM supports a limited one-year statutory requirement that digital audio recorders include a copy-code scanner, and that any device that would render such a copy-code scanner inoperative would also be deemed illegal. This board support is contingent on the establishment of valid scientific evidence that such technology will not result in any degradation in the quality of the sound produced by the digital audio player...NARM will ship Country Music Association Awards Show merchandising display materials in August for the awards show which is broadcast on October 12. Nine different "Bring Home country's Brightest Stars" aids are available at no cost to NARM member companies. Also, for the third year in a row, NARM and CMA jointly sponsor a display contest of these materials with prizes totaling \$4,000 in both retail and rack jobber categories.

VIRGIN RECORDS LAUNCHES CATALOG RE-ISSUE PROGRAM—Virgin Records' new American operation has begun to release select titles from the UK company's large catalog—many of which have never before been available domestically to US consumers. All will carry a catalog price tag of \$6.98 for LP or cassette and most will also be available in CD. The leadoff titles in the program were three works by

Mike Oldfield, the first artist signed by Virgin founder Richard Branson. They were, "Tubular Bells," which remains one of the company's three strongest international sellers with over 8 million copies sold worldwide to date, "Hergest Ridge," and the soundtrack to the film *The Killing Fields*. Last month, the release of two early *Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark* albums (Their self titled debut and *Organisation*) and a vintage *Simple Minds* album (*Sister Feelings Call*) continues the program. Other Virgin acts whose early albums are tentatively set for

release through Virgin America include Japan, Tangerine Dream, Mick Karn, UB40 and the Human League.

CONGRATS!—Howard Wuelling, Jem Records' national media services manager and Lynda Kady, Jem Records' college promotions manager recently got hitched. Howard, also a musician, has played with the Slickee Boys, Half-Japanese and the Lovepushers. Lynda, a veteran of the New Brunswick music scene, fronted the bands Venus East and Automotive Angel.

UK BUZZ

This year's Montreux Rock Festival and the International Music and Media Conference were hugely-expanded events. The conference provided a launch pad for CDV and MTV in Europe, and the rock festival had an unparalleled line-up of 48 big name acts. But most of the action took place in the hotel lobbies, where uninvited throngs of fans gathered daily.

The Beastie Boys had an argument with Run DMC, nothing more than a tiff really. But it managed to get blown all out of proportion by the British press, which resulted in further attempt to ban them from performing at London's Brixton Academy. One British paper alleged they had dismissed crippled leukemia victim children, and refused to give their autographs. The Beastie Boys claim they never saw any leukemia victims. I was in the hotel lobby at the time the incident was meant to happen, but all I can say is the Beastie Boys are well-brought-up, good-mannered creatures, and no such leukemia victims came in sight.

Their press conference, however, was a complete shambles. Europe's press did not seem to have anything to say to them, except, "What is the recipe for cold Medinas" (one part vodka, one part peach schnapps, topped with orange juice). They were surrounded by a six-rows-deep horde of photographers all shouting at them. And Ad Rock confessed afterwards, "I was really frightened." It seems their desire for publicity has turned against them and the press were crying, "Oh, it's '77 again. It's just like the Sex Pistols."

Nick Rhodes from Duran Duran said, "It was like this for us too in the beginning of our career. The press are always writing half-truths and making ridiculous exaggerations, and there's nothing you can do about it. I'd say that in all our career's, only 15% of what has been written about us is true."

After the evening shows, bar entertainment was provided by Spandau Ballet and Martin Jackson of Swing Out Sister, playing the chair game in the Hyatt bar. They wheeled three spongy chairs into the middle of the dance floor, got together in a scrum, and all leaped over their chairs together, ending up on their backs. No-one really understood the rules of the game, so I can't really tell you who won. The Swing Out's album, "It's Better To Travel," is a fairly excellent piece. It has gone straight in a number one on the album charts, and deservedly so. Corinee Drewery's voice is perfect for this post-Sade age, and she's got a lot more style and originality.

EGGING ON in the chair game was UB40. After performing in Montreux they were off to star in a tv film called *Yob*, a remake of *The Fly*. It is supposed to be a comedy. UB40's drummer, Jimmy, has just opened a restaurant in Birmingham called Latin Quarter. It sells burritos and Montezuma pie.

Mick Hucknall played snooker with UB40. But, according to UB40 sax player Brian Travers, he never wins because his arms are not long enough.

Hucknall himself put forward some extraordinary contradictions in his press conference. He claimed he was deeply political and his strongest desire was for a restored National Health Service. But, at the same time, there was no point in him voting or encouraging his fans to vote. "I don't want to be blamed for anything. Why would I even have to say what I believe in? I don't want to use my position as a pop star." He also said he liked being fat, and that he got fat when he gave up smoking, and that he did not care who called him gross.

Alannah Currie and Tom Bailey of The Thompson Twins were in much improved form. Alannah said, "This album is the most personal we have ever made." It seems "Close to the Bone" really is living up to its name. "The new single, 'Long Goodbye,' is the most painful thing I've ever written. It's about my mother dying, and at the same time losing my baby. It's very difficult for me to perform it live." Nonetheless, the Thompson Twins are embarking on a short UK tour, followed by a world tour. "I can't even think about getting pregnant again until after the tour. I couldn't bear another miscarriage, I nearly died after this one."

I continued my conversations with Tom, and we discussed the thin line between madness and sanity, and his beliefs in alternative medicine.

Whitney Houston threw a rather disappointing tea party. It was a supposedly intimate affair to which she arrived 90 minutes late. Whitney seemed falsely enthusiastic and very guarded, and very tired of being asked whether there was a man in her life. We listened to a preview cassette of her new album, "Whitney," which looks to outstrip sales of her multi-million-selling debut album.

For me, Crowded House was the highlight of Montreux. They epitomize the movement of those who want to subvert from within. They are on the opposite end of the pole to the Beastie Boys, and slip a country and western version of "Anarchy in the UK" into their set so people hardly notice.

All of the Wolfgramm family, in the form of the Jets, with father Mike videoing on his home video camera, were very excited about meeting all the other stars. The pensive Rudy sat glued to his book throughout the proceedings. It was called *The Road Less Travelled—The Psychology of Love And Traditional Values*.

The Communards gave a press conference where they extolled the values of using women. Said Richard Coles, "They are so much more passionate and emotional. We find it easier to work with them and much more rewarding." Their former singer Sarah Jane Morris is currently acting in a production of *The Sleep*, a play based on a true story of a girl who got sleeping sickness and fell asleep for years and years.

The Wave. Feld believes that the DJ's were treated unfairly, and that information was withheld from them during their contract negotiations. "At the same time that they were promising these guys the commitment to KMET, to the call letters and to the rock and roll format, there was a billboard being planned for The Wave, or a jingle being recorded, or research on audience reaction was being conducted. These things were being done at the same time." Hammer denied these allegations, saying, "the information was not withheld from them at the time of their negotiations."

Ladd, Perry and Snyder had all been independently offered full-time employment last year at KLSX, a Los Angeles "Classic Rock" station, but turned the offer down in order to attempt to return KMET to its former position at the top of the album rock ratings. In numerous meetings with station manager Bloom, the three disc jockeys were assured of management's commitment to the Album Rock format, and all rumors of a possible format change were quickly squelched. Bloom went so far as to "swear on the life of his children" that no change was forthcoming, according to Snyder. Attorney Feld commented, "had any

of the three men suspected that despite the public and private assurances to the contrary, a secret plan was being devised to ultimately do away with their jobs and the station itself, neither Ladd, Perry, nor Snyder would have committed themselves to KMET over the other opportunities presented to them."

"I think our possibilities of winning are very good," continued Feld. "There is a concept known in the law as fraudulent inducement to contract, which means that two sides dealing at arms length for a contract must have equal bargaining power. The employer-employee relationship is a fiduciary relationship based on trust, and obviously the management had information that the DJ's had no access to so they were not dealing fairly."

The three disc jockeys admit confusion when contemplating the reasons for the station's abrupt dismissal of the air staff after such a short attempt at rectifying the poor ratings. "The question of why this was done is something that we've been asking ourselves since it happened," stated Perry. "It's something that I hope a judge will ask, because I have a feeling that when they find out the answer, someone's going to have to write us a check."

Callner, is making firm strides on the *Cash Box* B/C singles chart.

One of the album's more ingeniously chosen cuts is its title track, the Gladys Knight and The Pips chestnut, "If I Were Your Woman," produced by Ken Kersey. Mills, a confirmed Knight fan, has a vocal field day with the song.

"I like singing music that has a lot of feeling and a lot of soul to it," she says of the album as a whole, which is more ballad-oriented than previous efforts. "I like dance music to go out and dance to, but I don't think I'm a dance artist. I don't think that's what my forte is. I think ballads and maybe uptempo songs are, but moderately uptempo - not dance music."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Mills first appeared on Broadway at age 9 in "Maggie Flynn," with Shirley Jones and the late Jack Cassidy. A single recorded for Burlington Music helped land her the lead role in the "The Wiz," the triumphant all-black, rock music stage adaptation of *The Wizard of Oz*. Her success during that show's five-year run set the stage for continued success as a recording artist. Her debut album, a 1979 teaming with James Mtume and Reggie Lucas, "Whatcha' Gonna Do With My Lovin,'" sold more than a million copies.

The successes kept on coming. In 1980 she won a Grammy for Best Female R&B Vocalist with her gold "Sweet Sensation" LP, and in 1981

garnered an American Music Award in the same category with her album "Stephanie." A year later, her "Merciless" album was nominated for a Grammy.

Returning to theatre in 1984, Mills set a record as the youngest actress to do a revival of a role she created with her return to the revival production of "The Wiz," which toured widely. Even so, success in her other occupation - that of a recording artist - was never far away. Her "I've Got The Cure" album, recorded during that time, spawned the hit dance tune "The Medicine Song."

Her unusual ability to maintain careers in theatre and recording continues. Following a 25-city summer tour as part of the Michelob Class Act Concert Series (along with The Whispers and Robert Brooks), Mills will return to the Great White Way late this year in another original role. The show is an updated, '80's musical adaptation of the 1960's coming-of-age film classic, *To Sir With Love*, in which she'll co-star with Dorian Harewood (*Roots*). In it, Mills plays the part created 20 years ago by British recording star Lulu, as well as singing the title song (the rest of the score will be new).

Meanwhile, "If I Were Your Woman," with its first single already taking the charts by storm, promises to mark a further milestone in the career of this chart-topping, audience wowing "Wiz" kid.

On the other hand, net-profit after tax was 4,394,000,000 yen (\$29,300,000), a drop of 51.8 percent from the prior year.

Teichiku-Record Co., Ltd. has reported that the sales for the first half of fiscal 1987 (August 21, 1986 to March 31, 1987) were 11,213,000,000 yen (\$74,700,000). Broken down by configuration, records yielded 1,800,000 yen (\$12,000,000) while cassette tape showed 4,636,000,000 yen (30,900,000) and video reached to 4,028,000,000 yen (\$26,800,000).

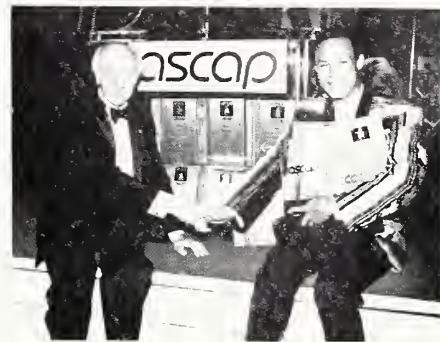

automated they are," says Richard Colness, 3-V's senior vice president of design and manufacturing as well as the creator of Ultrapak. "This makes start-up relatively inexpensive for most companies."

The Ultrapak printing process will print 260 per minute and is cost effective with current paper products according to Hansen. "We're right on the mark," she says. Unlike cardboard which can be separated into layers to gain access to a product for pilfering or tampering, Ultrapaks, which are seam welded by glue or ultra-sonic equipment, cannot be opened with a finger nail or stuck with a needle.

"Think of all the poor people who collect albums and the paper is frayed and torn and they look beat up and junky and they're ripped at the bottom," says Hansen. "That won't happen. It'll look as good ten years from now as it does today." She emphasized that 3-V is not trying to change the existing shape of any current packaging itself, but supplying what they believe is

SPECIAL REVIEW

Capitol Records this week commemorates the 20th Anniversary of the release of the Beatles' "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Heart's Club Band" with the first-time release of the CD version of this monumental treasure of rock and roll. Twenty years after its original release, the new technology gives the LP's original details striking new life.

Most "ambitious" albums in rock and roll history have ended up just that, ambitious. It took the singular brilliance of The Beatles to combine ambition, vision and execution. The result was the cultural landmark that is today still hailed as the finest rock and roll album in history.

The glory of CD brings to the listener's attention every sparkling sound from rock's first (arguably) "concept" album. The tape loop experimentation, almost buried on traditional vinyl, leaps out at you from the CD. The layers of sounds, orchestrations, voices, effects, etc.—what producer George Martin calls "sound collages"—are all more intelligible on CD.

This CD is the only one that Capitol has released separately. The previous two batches included four and three CDs, respectively. The decision to release "Sgt. Pepper's" (CDP 7 46442) by itself demonstrates the power of this title. When it was first released in 1967, it spent 15 weeks at Number One and sold 2.5 million copies in just three months. 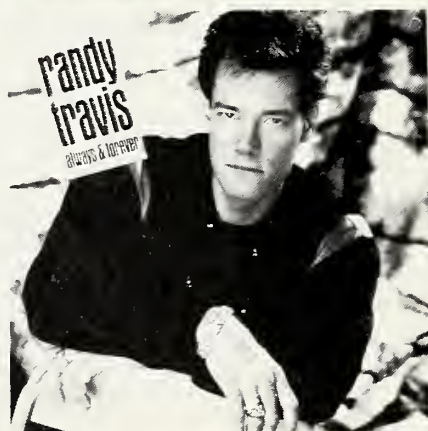

You'll start moving with the guitar-boogie type pickin' intro to this song. The producers and arrangers sneak in another instrument or two, then, we have the whole band by the second verse. The unique sound and style of the Academy of Country Music's Entertainer of the Year will have a lot of people dancing the boogie to this one! Hank Jr. has built a career on songs which explain himself to the listeners. Like most of the nation, we remain totally intrigued by this superstar of country music! Another big hit for Bocephus!

THE OAK RIDGE BOYS (MCA 53023) **This Crazy Love** (3:01) (Tom Collins-BMI) (R. Murrah, J.D. Hicks) (Producer: J. Bowen)

The intro leads us directly to the incomparable harmony of "The Oaks". The mid-tempo song is strongly produced with bass emphasis of voice and instrument. Lyrics should gather a bunch of fans by association.

DON WILLIAMS (Capitol P-B-44019) **I'll Never Be In Love Again** (3:10) (Sabal-ASCAP) (B. Corbin) (Producers: D. Williams, G. Fundis)

Ah, the mellow voice of Don Williams and his specialty: an easy going, laid-back song. Light strings and guitar blend with keyboard work in the background. "Goodbye" song with excellent one-on-one conversation type lyrics.

STEVE EARLE (MCA 53103) **Nowhere Road** (2:47) (Goldline-ASCAP) (S. Earle, R. Kling) (Producers: T. Brown, E. Gordy, Jr., R. Bennett)

The fine guitar picking intro sets the mood, and Steve Earle gives a strong vocal effort. Keyboard "diamonds" are strong in unison with guitar, bass and drums. The song is definitely not a timid production. Good "feel".

NASHVILLE NOTE-ABLES

THE AVERAGE MAKES THE DIFFERENCE. One of the reasons I enjoy writing for Cash Box is the fact that, if we can't say something good about someone, we say nothing at all. This is especially true of our record reviews. This is a rewrite of a column which was partially omitted in a previous issue. I deemed it important enough to explain again.

Just so everyone understands the Cash Box record review system, let's go through a typical session in our Nashville office... Thursday morning is record review time. Our panel of five gathers with the record review sheets containing the listing of 45rpm records submitted to our office during the previous seven days. The listing is divided into major label releases and indie label releases. Providing we have a minimum of two copies, every record is reviewed. (Editor's note: Those records showing no A and B sides are discounted. You must designate which song you want reviewed.)

Our review panel is comprised of entertainers, writers, journalists, and critics. The panel contains younger members and older members. In other words, we have made a concentrated effort to assemble a "scope" panel, where individual likes and dislikes are balanced out as fairly as possible.

Points are given, by our members, in categories such as *the song*, *vocals*, and *production* on each record. The total points for each record are added together, giving us a grand total. This grand total is then divided by five (the number of panel members) to give us an average point score for the record. The average determines our "picks" for the week to be featured in Cash Box print.

On major labels, the top point-getter receives our "Out Of The Box" feature. In order of ranking, the next three highest totals are awarded the "Feature Picks" positions. For independent labels, the procedure is much the same. The top point total receives the "Indie Spotlight". The next three highest totals are given "Indie Feature Picks", and depending upon the closeness of the vote, one or two more releases may be line-listed as "Sleeper Selections".

Don't be under the wrong impression, however! Our silence on a record is not to say that we feel it is a poor product. Simply, we only give print to the top 5 or 6 vote totals (averaged) each week. We have been proven wrong many times. We like it that way. It keeps us on our toes! What we print is the results of a consensus opinion, and we are proud to say that we have never intentionally wronged some artist or his/her product.

Each panel member fully understands that we are listening to the efforts of people who are betting their futures on their releases. We do not belittle anyone for trying. There is more than enough heartbreak in the music business as it is. Why should we print anything that would add to it? True, our position can be argued both ways. But, we happen to believe that the longest journey begins with the first step. And.. we try to make certain our first step is not on someone!

new things to his purview, but, over the past decade or so, Roach has outdone himself.

For example: Max Roach has performed a number of pioneering duets (with Archie Shepp, Anthony Braxton, Cecil Taylor, and Abdullah Ibrahim), led his regular quartet, led a double quartet (his quartet plus a string quartet), led M'Boom, an all-percussion ensemble; performed solo drum recitals, recorded a contemporary classical piece ("Survivors"), performed at New York's Kitchen with Fab Five Freddy and several other rappers and record scratchers, collaborated with video artist Kit Fitzgerald, composed the music for a series of Sam Shepard revivals at LaMama (for which he won an Obie), and performed in the odd bebop reunion.

At the moment, Roach is touting his fine new Double Quartet album for Soul Note, "Bright Moments" (he'll be doing an in-store concert week at Tower's Greenwich Village store this Wednesday to promote it), preparing the music for productions of *A Midsummer's Night's Dream* and *The Hairy Ape*, to take place later this year on the West Coast under the direction of George Ferencz, and thinking about writing a book (or books). M'Boom, teaching, the duets (he's hankering to do one with Dizzy Gillespie and he and Cecil Taylor are discussing the possibility of doing another one), the quartet, etc., etc., etc. continue apace.

"You know, little things like that thing that Giannini said stay with you all your life, it's like information. Like the first time I worked with Lester Young. Working with Pres, I thought that I should play like Jo Jones. Pres had just left Basie and was getting out there on his own to freelance on 52nd Street. So I'm playing everything I knew Papa Jo played. Then, one night when we were leaving the gig, Pres said to me, 'You know, you can't join the throng until you write your own song.' Those are the little things that stay with you for life, because they're so powerful."

Max Roach says he didn't set out to constantly change, to constantly seek new forms of expression, that is just evolved.

"It was natural. Because the groups I've always had have been made up of individuals. Like when Clifford and I started working together, the first group we had had Sonny Stitt, he worked with us for about the first six weeks. And Sonny had a different kind of personality altogether and the group was really influenced by the strong personality that Sonny had. Then Sonny had to leave us, and Teddy Edwards joined us. And the group took on another shape. And then Teddy Edwards wanted to stay in California, so we found Harold Land."

And so on. Another change, another slightly new direction. Yet

what Max Roach describes for himself applies to himself—many, let's say most, jazz pioneers spend their lives dealing with a single thing. Playing it into the ground some would say, refining it others would say. Yet Max Roach's "natural" development evolved thanks not to the personalities of the people he hired, but to the personality of Max Roach. Roach has always kept his eyes open and his ears open and he's always retained the hallmark of youth—the willingness to try.

"It's an evolution," he continues. "Then in the '60s I became involved with Civil Rights and the whole thing and became politically this-that-and-the-other, and that kind of took on another shape. 'Okay, here are worlds, let's see if we can do this. Here are thoughts, here are feelings, here are passions. Okay, great.' Of course, I was heavily criticized for that period."

Dig. With experimentation comes criticism. With the need to try comes the possibility of failure. Max Roach, now aged 62, could probably play bebop drums into his '90s—no problem. There he is, folks, the oldest living bebop drummer. Max Roach has never done that. Has never even thought of doing that. If the thing with Fab Five Freddy doesn't work, solid—it was done, it had its shot. Where did this come from—this need to keep moving, musically?

"I don't know," says Roach, "except to say that drummers and rhythm section people had to grow up dealing with every possibility, every genre of the music. For example, growing up in Brooklyn, I played with the symphony orchestra at the Brooklyn Museum. Because I wanted to play tympani, so I played some of the very simple things that they did. Plus, I was involved with marching bands—playing at things like Brooklyn Day.

"Then, as I got older and began to get into clubs, I played with Louis Jordan. Then I discovered Harlem and Minton's and the five-cent Eighth Avenue subway and that just did me in. Then I discovered there was music going on after hours, like at Monroe's Uptown House, and I began to meet people like Bud Powell, who was also in high school then. Thinking the same way and listening. So, as a drummer, one day I'd be playing with Louis Jordan, then, after I finished high school—when I was working with Coleman Hawkins and Bird—I also played with Wilbur and Sidney DeParis [a traditional band]. Every kind of situation. Also, I did a string of V-Discs with some of the real pop—really pop—bands of the day. It was really 'oom-pah, oom-pah,' but you did it, you know, you did it."

Roach says those days aren't really gone, that if an upcoming musician today wants to, the opportunities are there to learn your craft in a variety of

settings. The difference, he says, is that it's now centered around the schools—where guys'll play heavy metal on Thursday nights, play in the school symphony on Friday morning, and then, perhaps, bebop their weekends away. It's a "good, healthy environment" he says, though it seems more jazz pioneers were bred on 52nd Street than in every college since jazz first entered the academy. Still, Max's advice is to keep the eyes, ears, and options open, to stay progressive. As he says, about Wynton Marsalis' criticism of brother Branford for playing pop music with Sting, "If he's going to do Haydn, I don't think it's as adventurous as his brother with Sting. But Haydn is acceptable—it's very classic and acceptable, everybody can really relax with that."

Relax. Good word that. Good word for Max Roach. On the outside, Max Roach is as relaxed as they come—cool, straight-ahead, there to deal. He sits behind his drum kit and he is al-

ways so relaxed, so calm. He doesn't say so, but that outward relaxation has to help him deal with his musical eclecticism, help him keep his flock of ducks in a nice, even row.

"If you're a creative musician, it's funny that people can't understand that in order for you to survive, you can't do what you did yesterday. People go up to Miles and say, 'Man, I loved it when you had Trane.' But Trane is gone. People say, 'We loved Max with Clifford Brown.' But Clifford is gone. And, besides, if all those people were here today, they would be called upon to produce new music—bad, good or indifferent. You can't do what you did 20 years ago. I can't go back and do stuff that I did with Brownie—it's been done. So you keep going out there, taking chances. And you know somebody's going to say, 'I don't like it.' But you do it."

Over 400 attended the reception, jointly sponsored by AAMA and AMOA, which was among the key events held during the three-day conclave (5/11-13); and the guest list included senators and congressmen along with a number of people from various government agencies who welcomed the opportunity to get to the coin-op industry, its products and the people who make it tick. Well, as Taito exec **Rick Rochetti** told us, initial production is targeted for mid-June (and the game's been testing beautifully)—so watch for it!

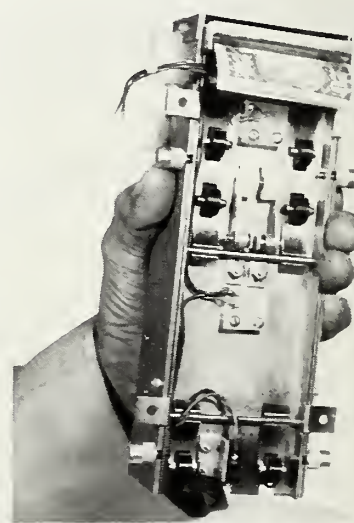

Flex-Tron's Game Machine

Flex-tron Corporation of Tulsa, Oklahoma has released a unique, coin-op amusement game, based on the sport of competitive arm wrestling. It's housed in a one-piece cabinet of welded heavy metal and constructed with wear resistant textured powder-coated paint to resist marring and scratching. All upholstered parts are of Milano vinyl for durability.

When the game goes into play, after insertion of a coin, the clocks will begin counting down from "20" seconds. Each person's elbow must be in place and hands clasped before the clock (or clocks) reach "0" seconds, which is the start of the game. Upon reaching "0" seconds the clock will begin to count up, until a winner is determined. Lifting an elbow after "0" seconds is reached will end the game by default. The winner is determined when the opponent's hand is pinned against the pressure sensitive cushion, causing the border light to flash and a

musical tune to play. Clocks indicate the winning time.

The unit employs solid state electronics. Lights, musical tunes, sensors and virtually every component used is 12 volts or below, according to the company. Suggested locations are bars, private clubs, game rooms, truck stops, student unions and tournaments.

Bally Midway's 'Party Animal'

Rounding up the gang, heading for the nearest social spot and making merry is a global activity which is captured by Bally Midway in its newest pinball release, "Party Animal." The game has universal appeal for both arcade and street locations and features ingenious sound effects, party tunes played on a miniature jukebox and eye catching graphics portraying humanized animals participating in crazy party antics.

Players step up to Party Animal and get lost in the experience," commented Steve Blattspieler, vice president of sales for Bally Midway. "The fun loving ambiance typified by this game lures the player time and again. The game tickles and entertains due to its unique game concept...from the 'wolf-on-the-make' featured on the backglass toasting you with an overflowing frosty cold drink, to the subtle flirting 'yoo-hoo' of a pink hippo."

A "hip" wolflike partygoer is in the circle with the game title and when green letters are hit the player hears his query, "How ya doin'?" receive a "Get lost, jerk!" response. Champagne corks pop and other wild party noises go on throughout game play.

After all the letters in PARTY ANIMAL are spotted, the player is urged on by a drum roll and a crowd shouting "surprise" as play advances to a surprise party in the overhead ramp. This is a multi-ball sequence where playfield values increase by as much as three times. Inline drop tar-



gets, operator-adjusted bull's eye targets, and spotting the letters of the words P-I-G on the left and O-U-T on the right side of the playfield, provide added score value. When "pigout" is hit, a variable dance bonus is collected and pig squeals announce the award. A second flipper button allows the player to "Lane Change" letters. A 2X, 4X and 6X bonus multiplier add to the excitement.

"The most engaging feature of Party Animal is the four-dimensional realistic jukebox on the playfield," said Blattspieler. "Its three bull's eye targets increase point values on the thumper bumpers when flashing and when all three are hit, the background music changes. It won't take players long to realize the added fun and interaction available to them in being able to change the music." 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
