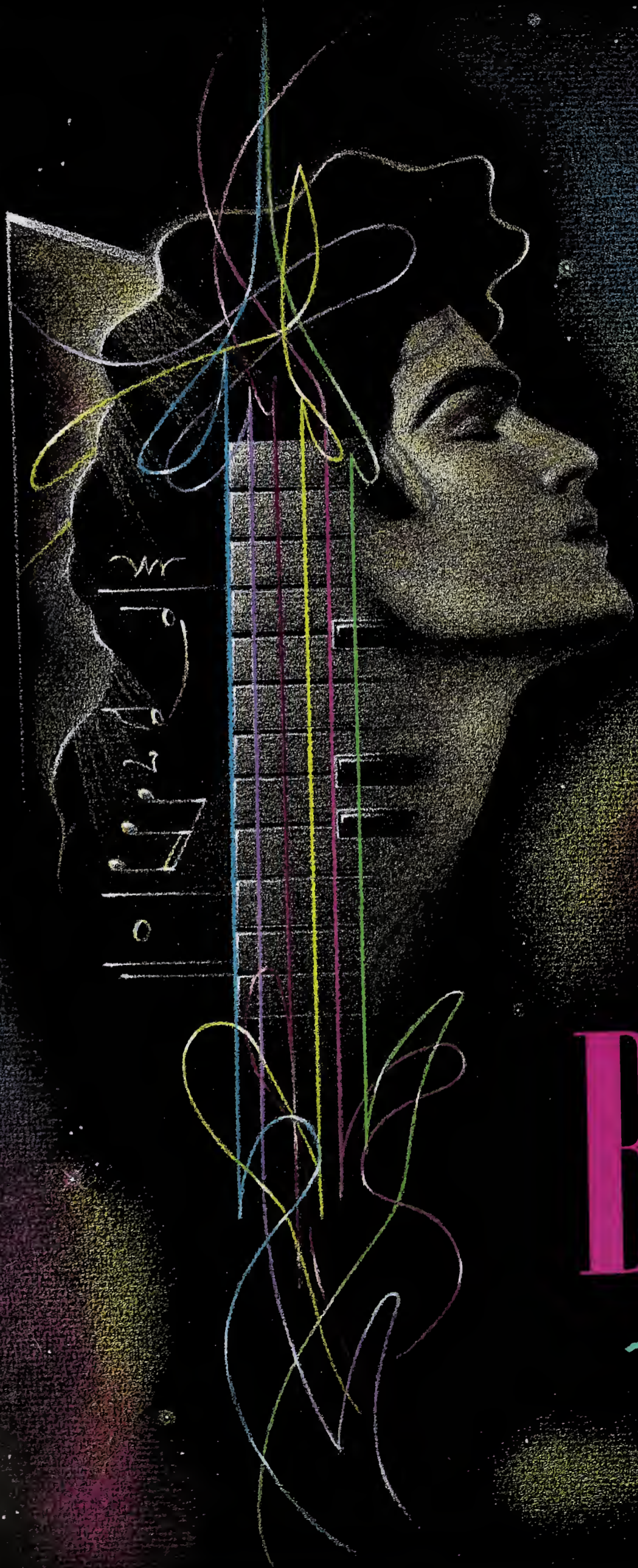

Atlantic Division To Be Based In L.A.

Greenberg Named President Of Atco Records

LOS ANGELES—Last Tuesday (5), Atlantic Records Chairman Ahmet Ertegun announced the naming of Jerry Greenberg as President of Atco Records & Custom Labels, a division of the Atlantic Recording Corporation. The restructured Atco Records will be based in Los Angeles. Greenberg, who first joined Atlantic in 1967 as assistant to then-Executive Vice President Jerry Wexler, served as president of the company from 1974 to 1980. In 1980, Greenberg founded the Atlantic-distributed Image Records label. He became president of United Artist Records in 1986 and was most recently President of the Music Division of GM/UA.

Greenberg spoke to *Cash Box*, discussing his recent appointment: "They (Atlantic) basically had the idea to reactivate Atco Records. When I got through with MGM, I dismissed the plans of possibly starting Image back, they said that they were much more interested in reactivating it rather than putting much more power behind the Atco label." He continued explaining some of the label's goals, "We're going to start signing some artists. There are a few acts already on the label; we have a few big acts like Yes and Pete Townshend already on the label - so it's not like we're starting out cold. We want to just take it to the next plateau. We

want to be very visible in Los Angeles when it comes to things that are available - not only artists, but soundtracks [as well]. We just want to see Atco get a big piece of the marketshare."

Ahmet Ertegun commented (in a press release): "It gives me great pleasure to welcome Jerry back to the Atlantic family. Upon first joining the company 20 years ago, he quickly established himself as one of the most gifted and admired executives in the music world. Over the past two decades, he has demonstrated the rare ability to be equally at home in the creative sphere and in the business arena. Most importantly, he has never lost an infectious enthusiasm for the music. I am proud to count Jerry as a longtime friend, and once again, as a valued associate."

Platiny Year For Platinum Plaques

Megastars, Soundtracks, And A Newcomer Top RIAA's December Gold And Platinum Certifications

NEW YORK - Two soundtracks, our established superacts, and a new face (Tiffany) topped the RIAA's December list of gold and platinum certifications, all racking up multi-platinum honors. Michael Jackson's "Bad," U2's "The Joshua Tree" and Whitesnake topped the list at four million sold per; the "Dirty Dancing" soundtrack chimed in at three million (chalking up two million in the process); and Bruce Springsteen's "Tunnel of Love" (simultaneous platinum and gold), "Tiffany" (simultaneously platinum), and the "La Bamba" Soundtrack rounded out the list, with each selling at least two million platters, CDs or cassettes.

The year-end total for multi-platinum certifications was 71, down from 108 in 1986. The year-end total for platinum certifications, however, took a serious tumble last year, drop-

ping to 79 from 204 in 1986. The large '86 figure was due to labels cashing in the platinum chips on some of their previously - uncertified catalogue product.

December saw 10 albums certified platinum. Joining Tiffany and Springsteen were George Strait's "Ocean Front Property," Jody Watley, Aerosmith's "Permanent Vacation," "A Very Special Christmas" (simultaneous gold), Sting's "Nothing Like the Sun" (simultaneous gold), George Winston's "Autumn" and "Winter Into Spring," and INXS's "Kick."

Gold albums held steady in 1987, with the RIAA pressing 142 gold prizes, up from 140 in 1986. Gold singles fell from seven in '86 to three last year.

Among the 142 were, along with

Bob Jones Joins MJJ Productions As VP of Communications

LOS ANGELES - Robert G. "Bob" Jones, veteran entertainment publicist and staple of Motown Records for the past 17 years, has departed his post as Executive Director of the label's press and artist relations department to join MJJ Productions as Vice President of communications, announced Michael Jackson, head of MJJ.

In his new post, Jones, who will be responsible for news media and public relations concerns for Jackson and his various activities, will report directly to Jackson. Jones will coordinate Jackson's publicity and public relations with Glen Brunman, West Coast Director of Media Relations for Epic Records and Lee Solters of Solters/Roskin/Friedman, Inc.

"I'm honored to accept this new position working with Michael Jackson," stated Jones. "Leaving Motown

was not an easy decision. I owe Berry Gordy a lot. He gave me the opportunity to do and be what I am. Everyone who knows me knows how I feel about Motown. It was more than a job, it was a way of life." He concluded, "Michael Jackson is one of our greatest entertainers. I'm honored that he asked me to join him."

It's Final: Sony Owns CBS Records Group

NEW YORK - In a memo released Tuesday, January 5, 1988, the Sony Corporation announced the completion of its agreement to purchase the CBS Records Group from CBS, Inc. In early November of last year CBS confirmed that talks for the long rumored sale would go forward, and in the final agreement reached November 19, 1987, Sony agreed to purchase the division for approximately \$2 billion.

The memo of January 5 recaps these details and also says, "The world's largest record company, CBS Records posted an operating profit of \$162 million on worldwide sales of

nearly \$1.5 billion in 1986. Sony officials stated that the company will be operated as an independent wholly owned subsidiary under the name of CBS Records Inc." This final detail was announced earlier in November in a memo from CBS Records Group President Walter Yetnikoff circulated within the company.

Also, the memo added that, "The Blackstone Group acted as advisor to Sony Corporation in this transaction." The Blackstone Group is an investment marriage making firm started by Peter Peterson, formerly of Lehman Bros., and focusing on international mergers.

GRP Sets DAT Software Releases For Early '88

NEW YORK - GRP Records is set to begin selling DAT software in Europe and the U.S. within the next couple of months. In mid-February, GRP will release six catalogue titles and a sampler on DAT in Europe, beginning in seven European markets where there is a blank tape levy and where GRP believes a strong introduction of DAT players will be made by hardware manufacturers. The remainder of Europe and the U.S. should see GRP DAT software on the shelves in mid-April.

West Germany, Austria, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and France will find Lee Ritenour, Chick Corea, Diane Schuur and several other GRP artists on DAT before the end of February. The distribution of

DAT in Europe will be carried out directly through GRP's wholly-owned subsidiary, GRP Ltd., located in Zurich. GRP plans to have over 30 DAT titles available in Europe and the United States by the end of the year.

"We at GRP believe that the recording industry is going through a change of storage medium from analog to digital," said Larry Rosen, GRP co-president, on making the announcement. "We [saw] the change begin nearly five years ago with the black vinyl LP being replaced by the CD. Today we see the...beginning of a change over from analog cassette to digital cassette. We believe in sound quality and GRP intends to remain

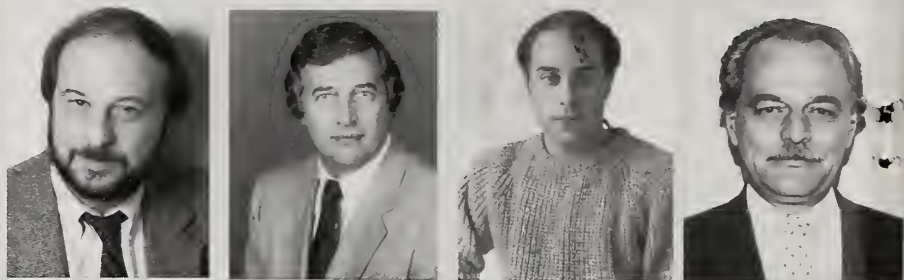

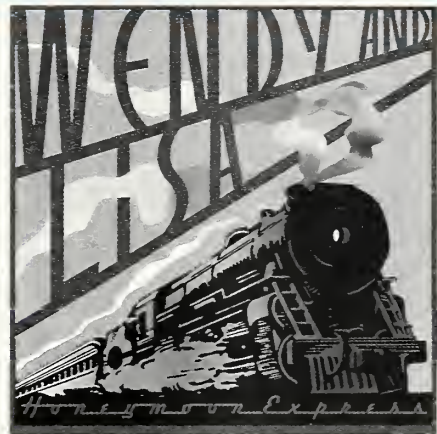

Michael Jackson

LOS ANGELES - Michael Jackson: truly one of the select artists of our time to earn the title of superstar. At 29 years old, Jackson has easily evolved into the most successful contemporary artist around.

It was 19 years ago, in 1969, when Michael, along with his brothers in the Jackson 5, scored their first number one single on the *Cash Box* charts with "I Want You Back." An incredible string of Motown hits, which would go on to become pop classics, followed: "ABC," "The Love You Save," "I'll Be There," "Never Can Say Goodbye" and "Dancing Machine" to name a few. In early years as well, Michael scored several hits on his own, most notably 1971's "Got To Be There" and 1972's "Ben" and "Rockin' Robin."

In 1976 the brothers signed with Epic Records and became The Jacksons. Their first album for the label, *The Jacksons*, quickly achieved gold status with the single "Enjoy Yourself" selling over one million copies.

In 1979, Epic released *Off The Wall*, Jackson's solo debut for the label. The album went on to solidify Jackson as a legend, spawning four smash singles: "Don't Stop 'Til You Get Enough," "Rock With You," "Off The Wall" and "She's Out Of My Life." (Note: both "Don't Stop" and "Rock With You" reached the number one position in *Cash Box's* top 10 pop chart and earned gold certification from the RIAA). *Off The Wall* sold five million copies in the U.S. and an additional three million around the world.

On December 1, 1982 *Thriller* is released. The LP produces an astonishing (and unprecedented) seven top ten hits. The LP went on to become the largest selling album in history. To date, *Thriller* has sold over 38.5 million copies worldwide. In addition, Jackson proved a forerunner in the then-burgeoning world of music videos - releasing a bevy of



groundbreaking clips, including "Billie Jean," "Beat It" and the 14-minute short film "Thriller."

Five long years later, (on August 31, 1987 to be exact) Epic released *Bad*. The album had the distinction of being the first album ever to simultaneously debut at number one on both the *Cash Box* Pop and B/C album charts. Since its release, the album has spawned three singles: "I Just Can't Stop Loving You," "Bad" and "The Way You Make Me Feel." Both "I Just Can't..." and "Bad" instantly reached the top of the charts - "The Way You Make Me Feel" is currently nestled high in the pop top ten (it has already hit number one on B/C), promising to continue the trend of chart-toppers.

Jackson's long-awaited solo tour is currently underway and should reach the U.S. sometime in the spring. All hype aside - Michael Jackson has taken an incredible gift of song and elevated to a height of acceptance and popularity that is unprecedented, and there is absolutely no sign of it letting up. He has achieved goals that were unheard of, enjoyed unfathomable success, and continues to deliver his magic to appreciative fans everywhere. The legend continues...

Martha Davis On Her Own

"I never really wanted to be a singer. I always thought of myself as a songwriter," says Martha Davis, former leader of the Motels, and now on her own with her debut solo album *Policy* (Capitol). "But if Bob Dylan can sing... so can I. If your gonna get a hit song from somebody, it's gonna be a pretty standard unit. Whereas if you do something more out, you're gonna have to sing it yourself."

Not many people have complained about Davis' singing. It comes from a brooding, sultry voice, from a singer/songwriter who tends to see the darker side of things. When

Though Andrea Del Conte will be the first to tell you of her great fortune in the music business, she will also tell you that it is not easy. "In fact, becoming a 'rock star' has been quite a challenge. There is a long and heartening process of demo tapes, showcases, negotiations and compromises before the record is even pressed. Then you have to hope that not only will be released but promoted as well. Often times, good songs get lost in the enduring process."

First time around, Andrea thought she lucked out. Born and bred in New York with an ability to sing and dance and come across as extremely sensual, Andrea caught the eye of producer Bobby Orlando, who was starting his own record label. He made Andrea the lead singer of an all girl (old '60's type) group called the "Flirts". They did extremely well for an unknown group and their first album and hit single "Jukebox" caught the eye and ear of many. Along with the help of a "just taking" cable music show called MTV, the group and Andrea were on their way to stardom. Numerous television appearances and tours in both America and Europe followed. Major labels now took notice and offered lucrative deals. A second album, already recorded, was on the way, but, as is often the case, management problems occurred. "Litigation began over the ownership of the 'Flirt' name," says Andrea.

"The producer thought of the name but we created the concept. Unfortunately, the producer and the ex-manager had trademarked the name. Andrea likes having some control over her destiny, and not wanting to waste her talent and time in court, she decided to go off on her own. She signed with Scotti Bros. CBS, who had been scouting her for a while and formed her own group called Andrea & The Hot Mink. Her first single

"Manhattan", which appeared in *Revenge of the Nerds*, was a rhythmic pop song with a calypso flavor. Unfortunately, the movie promotion was not enough to push the record or the artist. Still full of enthusiasm, Andrea recorded two more songs, which were to be part of an album. A crisis in the CBS network followed and though the label felt the songs would be hits, they were never released.

Andrea later parted amicably with Scotti Bros. and decided to start again.

With strong purpose and enthusiasm, she signed with her present manager/producer, Joe Messina and went back with the studio. Along with engineer Rory Young (who did Atlantic Star's first album), she recorded several songs. Messina then enlisted the services of his client, director David Saperstein and they created three videos from the songs. These videos have since been viewed on both cable and network television. (In fact, Andrea herself appeared on the Joe Franklin Show, November 19 & 20th, 1987.)

Her new concept and music go back to the basics. The songs' rhythms and feel come from the roots of rock and roll circa 1950's and the melodic structure is reminiscent of music from the '60's. Andrea says, "I feel that with the fast paced lives we lead, and the technology of the world far surpassing the human element, the last thing I want to hear is all this repetitive, 'microwave' music." Andrea, now nicknamed "Fallen Angel" (when asked for a definition she she says it's a mysterious guide in times of need), is on her musical quest towards basic rock rhythm with beautiful melodies and just the right flair for fun.

Andrea concludes, "Music is an art as well as a form of entertainment - so let's keep it that way!"

Despite the admonishments of her father, she decided to pursue a career as a musician.

"Reading my mother's diary, I saw that she had sacrificed everything for my father. She had given up her friends, her bohemian interests. She had nothing left for herself. If you have desires in your life, you have to fulfill yourself. I sat my kids down and told them it was going to be hard, we weren't going to have clothes, money and a nice place to live. I told them I had to try... I didn't want to resent them in ten years."

Shortly afterwards Davis was in Warfield Foxes, which a couple of incarnations later would become the Motels. She recalled her first time on a stage: "I was scared to death before

(sales of 500,000), and a press release announcing that *Whitesnake*, released last year, had just been certified quadruple platinum (sales in excess of FOUR MILLION units). I mean, with consumers this irresponsible, maybe **Joe Biden** should get some spandex pants and re-enter the race.



IN A PENSIVE MOOD - Wasn't it David Lee Roth who said most rock critics like Elvis Costello because most rock critics look like Elvis Costello? Yeah, well, my glasses don't look anything like the ones Costello is wearing above, OK?

SOME NEW PRODUCT - Elvis C. has a new record, currently available as an import on his own record label, Demon. *Out Of Our Idiot* is a collection of 17 non-LP cuts, like 1980's *Taking Liberties*. Since he moved beyond the punkish power of bile and affrontery Costello's output has been frustratingly spotty, and the man has been shuffling identities looking for a new crown. Meanwhile, fanatics like me were snapping up every 12" and import single to check out the b-sides for single shots of genius. Lots of gems are collected here, like a stunningly lovely duet with Nick Lowe on the Shirelles's "Baby It's You." Costello dances around the melody without ever leaving it, and the embellishments are worthy of comparison with Chet Baker and Thelonius Monk. The album is an often thrilling mish-mash of everything from soul to country to an Allen Toussaint produced cover of a Yoko Ono song. You'll wonder how some of this stuff got left off the records, until you reach the last four songs on the second side, at which point you'll know why some of this stuff got left off the records.

ROCKIN' AROUND N.Y.C. - Some cool and groovy shows will

soon touch down in this hip Reggae roots harmony groove. Culture will bring their deep v S.O.B.'s on Wednesday, Jan. 19, touring behind their exc Shanachie LP, *Culture At Work*. Past summer Shanachie was enough to re-release the 1977 classic *Two Sevens Clash*. Same night across town at World homeboys U.T.F.O. v rapping it up in support of album *Lethal* (Select), currently on the *Cash Box* B/C all chart... On Friday, Jan. 15, Feelies will be at the Ritz... Ponce will be celebrating the end of his hot platter of Latin dance music, *Arawe* (Antilles S.O.B.'s on Tuesday, Jan. 19... and Saturday, Jan. 22 & Jan. 23). You can find me snapping my fingers while popster Marshall Crepps rips it up at The B.B. King... **Game Theory**, whose album of Alex Chilton-esque (Sister Lovers era) *Lolita* woulda made one of the year's best single LPs with some editing, will play the *China Club* on Thursday, January 28. The once and future Mountain is at Milbrook Sound Studios in upstate New York with bassist Bruce and Twisted Sister drummer Joe Franco. They're talking of calling the project Leslie & Joe. Martha Davis sang her Motels hits "Only the Lonely" and "Suddenly Last Summer," you sensed that if anyone could deliver a song about alienation and longing, it was her. Martha Davis, however, is anything but morose. Talking to her, one is struck by her bubbly energy, by her resilience through some tough times. Berkeley, CA native, she grew up with her parents in a culturally rich, but emotionally unsettled home. A shy and timid girl, she nevertheless married at 15, and moved to Florida to raise children. When her husband went to Vietnam she returned home to raise her two daughters. When her parents' marriage began to crumble, resulting in the suicide of her mother, she turned back to her lifelong passion, songwriting and singing.

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Elements Tour - Earth, Wind & Fire will kick off their first tour in five years at St. Petersburg, Florida's Bayfront Center January 9th. The show the band unveils at St. Petersburg, FL will be one of astonishing proportions. The spectacle has taken a crew of sixty 45,000 man-hours to put together, and has cost over a million dollars to produce. It draws on the talents of behind-the-scenes experts like: Stig Edgren, designer and producer, who conceived the staging for The Pope's visit to LA's Dodger Stadium and for the grand finale of the Los Angeles Olympics; Roy Bennett, lighting designer for Prince; and Michael Peters, who choreographed videos for Michael Jackson (Peters did "Thriller") and for Lionel Richie, and who helped conceive Broadway's "Dream Girls."



The return of Earth, Wind & Fire to the stage is an event of unusual proportions. From 1971 to 1983, Earth, Wind & Fire won six Grammys, sold close to 40 million records, and landed 30 singles on the pop charts. Those singles were not normal commercial fare. They were, said The Village Voice, "inordinately brilliant... everything a fan could want: transcendent, experimental, mellifluous, quirky."

But Earth, Wind & Fire was one of those rare bands whose stage shows were pioneering extravaganzas on a par with their music. Earth, Wind & Fire tours were among the first to employ lasers, the first to recruit specialists like magician Doug Henning, and the first to take visual spectacle to a level that could only be called breathtaking.

In November, 1987, Earth, Wind & Fire returned with their first LP in four years. The results were impressive. 'Touch The World' entered the pop charts in its first week higher than records by George Harrison, Steve Winwood, Neil Diamond and Bryan Ferry, all of which debuted at the same time. In addition, the band's first new single since 1983, "System of Survival," soared to number one on the dance and R&B charts.

Earth, Wind & Fire mastermind Maurice White has been determined to keep the visual details of the band's upcoming tour under wraps. But one thing is certain. White and group members Philip Bailey, Verdine White, Andrew Woolfolk, Sheldon Reynolds and Ralph Johnson have planned a show that carries the standards established by Earth, Wind & Fire in the early 70's to a level that will set new standards for the 90's.

Mega Talent - One day in 1986 Garry Glenn, as a songwriter, had three songs on the national charts at once: "Rapture" by Anita Baker, "Heaven In Your Arms," by R.J.'s Latest Arrival and "Flame Of Love" by Jean Carne. The distinction was the career highlight of a multi-faceted artist who, either as a songwriter, singer, producer, keyboar-

dist, arranger or all of the above, has worked with Freddie Jackson, Atlantic Starr, Billy Ocean, Phyllis Hyman, Melissa Manchester, Earth, Wind & Fire and The Emotions, among a list of others. That day in '86 was the highlight - until now.

Feels Good To Feel Good is the debut Motown LP of Garry Glenn, written, arranged, performed and produced, need less to say, by Garry Glenn. the swaying, yearning, heartfelt "Do You Have To Go," Garry's first single, is typical of the album. Songs like "Torch For You," "Running Away," "Out Of A Dream," "You Don't Even Know" and the title track (his current single) all share special qualities: exciting rhythm tracks (many of them cut "live" as opposed to being overdubbed, instrument by instrument; remember real drums?) and dramatically soulful arrangements. At the center of it all are forever-captivating vocal performances that find Garry going from a macho gruff to a soaring falsetto - and everything in between - with no problem whatsoever. Indeed, if Garry is anything, he is a singer.

Feels Good To Feels Good ends up an ambitious mission completed, but then, Garry has had this particular ambition for years. "It has been a dream of mine to record an album of this type of music - soulful, sophisticated stuff that calls for real singing and playing - and it's always been a fantasy of mine to



record for Motown. Both of those dreams have come true and it's great."

Garry's dream was born, fittingly, in the same place Motown chairman Berry Gordy's dream was realized - in Detroit, where Garry, one of seven kids, was born and raised. "I grew up in a religious family where everyone plays, sings and writes," says Garry. "My earliest experiences of working in music were with my older sister, Beverly Glenn, who made gospel records and toured. I'd travel with her, playing and singing. We'd play the churches and colleges of different cities. And in high school I directed an 80-voice choir. So, I was always around music, always doing it."

Garry calls Feels Good To Feel Good, recorded over a two month period between his road gig as Anita Baker's keyboardist, "a labor of love. The most difficult part in making it was being objective. When you're wearing three hats - that of artist, songwriter and producer - it can be tough. But my demos are what got me the deal at Motown in the first place and I produced those, so I kept that in mind."

And Garry says he feels no special pressure to succeed over the growing number of male vocalists today. "I look at it the way (basketball giant) Dr. J sees it," he says. "We were talking backstage at one of Anita Baker's shows and he said, 'There's room for us all.' I'm just going to keep that in mind and do my best." Introducing Garry Glenn.

LOTS OF LEFTOVER STUFF - It's too early in the year to get analytical and incisive, so let's just clean off the desk: First off, last issue I published my list of the 10 best jazz albums of '87. It wasn't an easy list to compile, but I'd just like to mention the artists whose albums almost made the list (the runners-up, as it were). In no particular order: Michel Petrucciani, The Sonny Clark Memorial Quartet, Tim Berne, Dave McKenna, Dave Holland, Marvin "Smitty" Smith, several Steve Lacy projects (a couple with Mal Waldron, some other duets, another Sextet album or two), George Adams/Don Pullen, Joe Williams, Shirley Horn, Ray Anderson, Mose Allison, Charlie Haden, Major Holley/Slam Stewart and Mike Westbrook. As usual, I didn't include reissues or previously-unissued items (there'd be too many and it's unfair for contemporary records to be compared to reissued masterpieces) or such non-jazz items as the new records by Joao Gilberto and Caetano Veloso...*Wolf Trap Salutes Dizzy Gillespie: An All-Star Salute to the Jazz Master* will be aired around February 26 over most PBS Stations, as part of the new season of *Great Performances*. The 90-minute show - culled from a fantastic 70th birthday tribute to the great Diz taped at Wolf Trap last year - will feature the baron of bebop in numerous settings, including performances with the likes of Sonny Rollins, Wynton Marsalis and Carmen McRae...Virgin Records is getting set to unveil Venture Records, an - are you ready? - "adventure across the boundaries of music". Well, we'll see about that, but among those with debut Venture releases due in February are Lester Bowie's *Brass Fantasy* and England's *Itchy Fingers*...The National Academy of Jazz has inducted Barry Manilow into its Board of Governors - a worthwhile choice, goodness knows...In the upcoming (figure Christmas of '88) film *Scrooge* (just what we need, another screen version of *The Christmas Carol*), starring Bill Murray, there's a scene in which Miles Davis, David Sanborn, Larry Carlton and Paul Shaffer appear as street musicians. Ho, ho,

ho...*Singers & The Song*, Gene Lee's account of popular (read: Sinatra, Sarah, Peggy Lee, etc.) singers has recently been published (\$18.95, Oxford University Press)...GRP Records has signed Japan's Yutaka (a koto and synthesizer player), Hungary's Szacksi (a pianist), and Americans John Patitucci (a bassist) and Eric Marienthal (a saxophonist) to record deals. If the last two sound familiar, they're in Chick Corea's current band, and ol' Chick is producing the records...Look, vinyl lives. Since just about every jazz reissue this day is coming out on CD only, it's almost surprising to see that Atlantic, anyway, is still reissuing jazz on vinyl. New in the Jazzlore series are Big Joe Turner's 1956-59 "Big Joe Rides Again" (a jazz album with, among others, Coleman Hawkins, Lawrence Brown and Pete Brown), "The Art Farmer Quartet Featuring Jim Hall Live at the Half Note" ('63), the Modern Jazz Quartet's 1962 "Lonely Woman," Esther Phillips' "Confessin' The Blues" (a '66 big band date and a '70 small group date), Charles Mingus's wonderful "Oh Yeah" ('61), Lee Konitz's fine "Inside Hi-Fi" (two '56 quartet sessions), and Jess Stacy's "A Tribute to Benny Goodman," '54 sides done with Goodman sidemen and released to coincide with the Goodman screen biography...*Jazz From the City*, a weekly two-hour contemporary jazz radio show hosted by Ken Webb, is now available via United Stations Satellite. Call (212) 401-1236 for the low-down...Antilles New Directions has just reissued saxophonist Jim Pepper's "Comin' and Goin'," a well-named album that has, in a few years, been on Europa, Rykodisc and Antilles...Photographer Joe La Russo has put out a limited edition poster of Woody Herman to benefit the National Academy of Jazz's Woody Herman Foundation Fund. The poster is available for \$20 (unsigned) or \$30 (signed) from La Russo Photography, PO Box 480357, Dept. BB, Los Angeles, CA 90048...Billy Taylor, Art Blakey and Lionel Hampton are the recipients of the National Endowment for the Arts' 1988 Jazz Masters Fellowships. The Fellowships carry \$20,000 grants...GRP toured a good hunk of its artist roster in Japan in October, "GRP Super Live '87," and expect to see live albums, videos, and all sorts of other stuff from the tour early this year...NEWJAZZ-TV is a new service that broadcasts new age and jazz album cover art videos (trust me) unscrambled, for free, to cable systems. Want to know more? Call them in Fort Collins, CO at (303) 484-5535 and they'll tell you more...Next week I'll get incisive and analytical (about various boxed sets, OJCs, OBCs, and more).

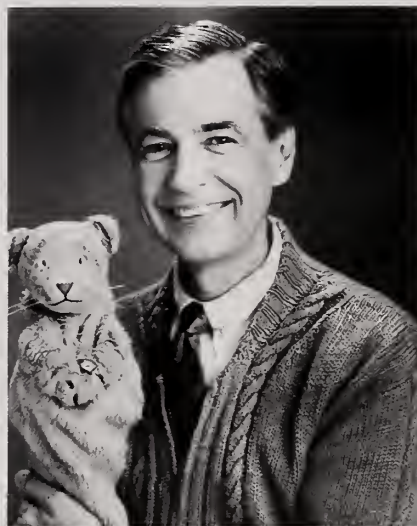
ACE AWARDS - This year's ACE Awards will be hosted by Elayne Boosler and John Larroquette

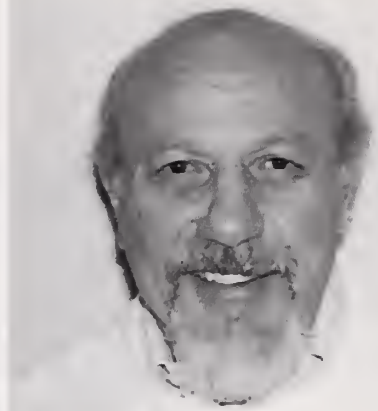

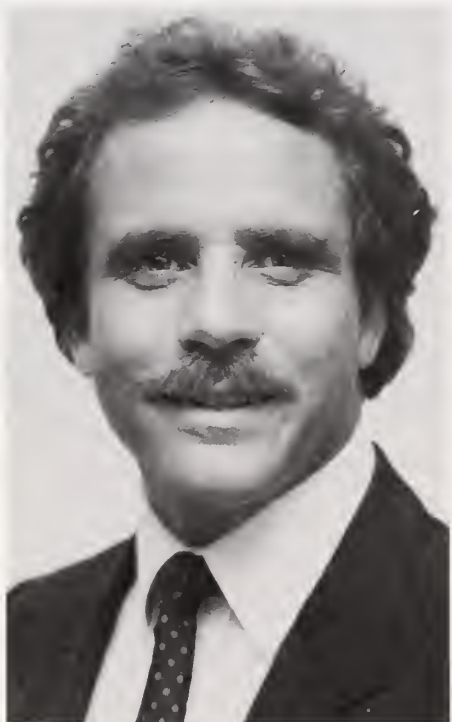

Meet Eric H. Paulson, Navarre Corporation

In just four years Navarre Corporation has experienced phenomenal growth, and is now recognized as one of the largest independent distributors in the United States, and is without equal in this country as a rack-jobber/distributor of home computer software.

Paulson's own astonishing success marks him as an innovative and resourceful marketing man. There is little doubt that he will prove to be not only a valuable member of the sub-committee on marketing, but a true force in the overall development and progress of the independent record industry. ■

Following in the footsteps of such 80's power trios as the Minutemen, Husker Du, and the Meat Puppets comes Austin's own Texas Instruments. The 13 song, self-titled effort marks their first long-playing release, and the beginning of their collaboration with Rabid Cat Records. Other artists featured on the label are Happy World, Not For Sale, and the now defunct Scratch Acid.

The album has been doing well for these Texas natives, having already charted on several college radio and alternative music polls. Combining musical influences as diverse as folk, punk, and psychedelic, the Texas Instruments have managed to come up with a sound that is refreshing with the first listen, while more revealing and rewarding after each new spin. The group consists of drummer Steve Chapman, bass player Ron Marks, and guitarist David Woody. Marks and Woody first started playing together in El Paso while they were still in high school. After moving to Austin in 1983 they hooked up with Chapman, and have been a mainstay of the local club circuit ever since. Musically, these dudes can shred, blowing away most of the groups they tend to be categorized with. Lyrically, the same. They preach optimism and survival without sounding righteous or insincere.

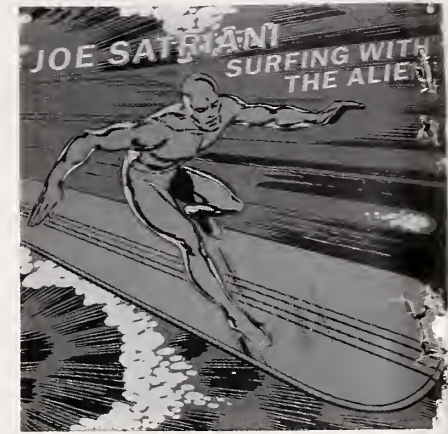
Outstanding cuts on the album include the originals "Prussian Blue," "The Action Jackson," the instrumental "Don't Let Anything Get Empty," the lyrically literate "No Wonder I'm Confused," and a remake of the Dharma Bums' "Girl Like You." The band also turns in some great covers of Woody Guthrie's "Do Re Mi" and Dylan's "A Hard Rain's (Gonna Fall)." Dylan's influence in particular can be heard throughout the LP.

The release was recorded during a three day period at Austin's Europa Sound Centre. Producing, engineering, and mixing the effort was Spot, whose past production credits include the first Texas Instrument EP and early efforts from Husker Du.

The Texas Instruments have toured extensively throughout the Southwest and are making plans for their first west coast gigs. The tour will most likely commence after the

release of their second album, *Sun Tunnels*, which is set for a March release. Joe Satriani
SURFING WITH THE ALIEN
Relativity (88561-8193-1)

Often times the most highly developed musicians spend years mining for new sounds and redefining what is possible on their instruments. This may include years living in obscurity, with no recognition for the ingenuity and commitment necessary to be a true pioneer in the highly competitive world of contemporary music. Guitarist Satriani is one such innovator who is becoming more visible by the day with his his second LP, *Surfing The Alien*, recently released Relativity Records.

Satriani is perhaps best known for having been Steve Vai's guitar instructor. Vai has become one of rock's most respected guitarists, having played with Frank Zappa, Alcatraz and currently the David Lee Roth Band. Upon first listen to Satriani, it's apparent his association with Vai had a symbiotic effect, each reaping benefits from the other's style and intensity. Satriani taught the book on wang bar technique back before such a thing had been developed. He is also a master of the two handed approach, first made fashionable by Eddie Van Halen, but something Satriani's been polishing for the past fifteen years.

Many modern guitar heroes come to mind when spinning "Surfing With The Alien." Besides Vai and Van Halen, Kirk Hammett of Metallica, also a former student of Satriani, Yngwie Malmsteen, Jeff Beck and traces of Al Dimeola all come to mind. "A cross between Van Halen and the Neville Brothers" as Satriani himself has described. This is not all stuff you've heard before, however, as Satriani pushes, wails, and glides his way into undiscovered caverns of sound and technique sure to rile any guitar enthusiast or music energy freak.

Most of the album is playful straight ahead throbbing rock music with relentless soloing. Satriani never resorts to mindless riffing, however, as each solo is packed with

fresh ever unfolding new ideas. The title track and the barn burnin' "Satch Boogie" could wake you from the dead of sleep into a vertical salute in one motion.

On the more mellow side, the jazzy intro to "Circles," the Oriental flavor of "Lords of Karma," and the flamenco-sounding "Midnight" are subtle highlights revealing Joe's broad range of influences. "I didn't take guitar lessons when I started playing. I just played along with records by Hendrix, Clapton, Beck, Johnny Winter, Mike Bloomfield, as well as the pop-oriented stuff like the Beatles and the Stones. I'd just imitate those things, figure out the sounds and then take it somewhere else."

Satriani has most certainly arrived 'somewhere else.' Co-produced and engineered by John Cuniberti, *Surfing With The Alien* is an expedition into the world of "Guitar Fantasy." Musically speaking, if you like your coffee black and drive a Maserati on the coast highway at night, Joe Satriani is your man and *Surfing With The Alien* should be a centerpiece in your collection.

VALENT ON STAGE

Allan Holdsworth



THE PALACE COURT, HOLLYWOOD - The eclectic wizardry of Mr. Holdsworth & Co. began at The Palace Court tonight in the first of his six shows here. Loyalists packed the club for a glimpse of the masterful Holdsworth at work, revealing his unique brand of music. If you've never seen Holdsworth or heard him play it's difficult to describe the experience. NWGIGKLBMCINODUFN. That's like a line of music streaming from his fingers, restructuring the musical symbols with which the listener is familiar in order to generate obscure beauty and meaning.

Opening the show with a cut from *Sand*, his latest LP for Relativity Records, the set was a good cross representation of several of his albums, *Atavachron*, *I.O.U.* and *Road Games*.

As you listen to this band it is apparent they are thinking in a highly developed language only distantly related to any established musical idiom. Perhaps electric cathedral jazz of the 21st century. Holdsworth's inventive unconventional approach to harmony creates an orchestral magnitude to his sound, particularly with his Synth-Axe, the most sophisticated guitar synthesizer available. Holdsworth has been pushing the envelope of current technology for years, sporting walls of rack mounted effects affectionately dubbed "Mission Control."

Simultaneously he has been redefining the technology of guitar playing, transcending the conventions and cliches of his instrument much the same way as John Coltrane reinvented the saxophone. Needless to say, Holdsworth has been revered throughout the world by guitarists and musicians alike, and is continually expanding his community of listeners through frequent tours and recordings. Wednesday evening he more than satisfied - he satiated his fans at the Palace Court with dazzling virtuosity and timeless compositions.

The rhythm section of Gary Husband on drums and Jimmy Johnson on bass countered Holdsworth with improvisational fire, constantly shifting the feel and responding with sensitive fervor to undulations in the sea of melodies. Keyboardist Steve Hunt rounded out the quartet with some staggering soloing of his own, very much in the leader's vein. In fact, with Holdsworth's highly developed left hand attack, making even a conventional guitar sound more like a keyboard or horn, the voices of the two players were, at times, almost interchangeable.

Some of the evening's highlights were during "Pud Wud" from the newest album, "Devil Take The Hindmost," and "Letters Of Marque," with extended stretching by each member of the band. It is challenging to cite highlight's however, as the intensity of the entire episode was more salient than individual moments.

Allan Holdsworth continues to delve into fresh sonic territory, inspiring those daring and patient enough to participate. Not for the passive of mind or squeamish of notes, really listening to Holdsworth can be much like reading a novel by Carlos Casteneda.

VERN GOSDIN - Chisled In Stone - Columbia, FC 40982

Just when you think this guy has done the best singing of his career, he comes out with a new album! Gosdin's Columbia debut album is a real "candy store" for Gosdin-lovers, and he demonstrates his ability to do both ballads and up-tempo numbers equally well. There's no doubt about it, Vern Gosdin treats a lyric like no one else. This album has some of the best material we've heard in a long time. The only difficulty in listening is deciding which cut you like best! In the mood for a good



old-fashioned case of the goose-bumps? Get yourself a copy of this product.

OUT OF THE BOX

JOHN COUGAR MELLENCAMP (Mercury, 888-934-7) *Cherry Bomb* (4:49) (Riva-ASCAP) (J. Mellencamp) (Producers: J. Mellencamp, D. Gehman)

John Cougar Mellencamp and I grew up in the same part of southern Indiana so, it came as no surprise that he wrote this country song about a "country town" and "out in the sticks." John gives us a fine vocal delivery on this song with a heavy beat and quick phrasing. Harmonies and background singers are well-placed in this fine production. Some instruments may not be considered "country," but the combined product surely qualifies. We give credit where it is due. This is a good country release!



FEATURE PICKS

HOLLY DUNN (MTM, B-72093) *Strangers Again* (3:08) (Blackwood, Tree-BMI) (H. Dunn, C. Waters) (Producer: T. West)

This is a very pretty ballad with exceptionally strong lyrics. It may well be one of those songs that challenges the vocalist to produce more than the ordinary in emotion and delivery. The product has an overall easy feel about it, featuring a fine fiddle in the ride. Not in the same "mold" as Holly's previous releases.

THE McCARTERS (Warner Bros., 7-28125-A) *Timeless And True Love* (2:35) (Chappell, Chriswald, Hopi Sound, Buzz Cason-ASCAP) (A. Roberts, C. Black, B. Cason) (Producer: P. Worley)

Right from the intro, this is a solid country arrangement. The lead vocal is pleasant, but the harmonies add "punch." However, The McCarters may need a little more flair in their delivery. It works well enough, but the sound was almost too laid-back, and the song lyrics do not dictate solemnness.

MARY CHAPIN CARPENTER (Columbia, 38-07681) *Just Because* (3:05) (Getarealjob-ASCAP) (M. C. Carpenter) (Producer: J. Jennings)

Talk about "laid-back"! Mary Chapin Carpenter really puts the soft-sell on this one. This song has a good lyrical message, but it's difficult to absorb without emphasis anywhere. With a voice like hers, Mary should be "excited". Tender is tender, but.....

RAPPIN' WITH THE WRITERS:

PATTI RYAN

Patti Ryan says, "I started writing late in comparison to most songwriters."

Patti attained her masters degree and was teaching art at Gulfport high school in Mississippi when thoughts of songwriting first crossed her mind. She had been interested and involved in music earlier in life. Her mother taught classical piano. So, Patti heard a lot of music and even played with a few bands. However, she thought the odds were too high against becoming a successful songwriter when choosing a career for herself.

In 1976, after spending a year in Europe, Patti decided she would give songwriting a try. She met Wanda Mallette, a second grade teacher, and they co-wrote some songs and sent them to Bob Morrison in Nashville. "It was like a miracle," said Patti. "There was a little song titled 'Lookin' For Love In All The Wrong Places' in that group of songs." That was the 1980 Country Song of the Year. Patti still didn't move to Nashville. She was afraid of being a "flash in the pan" success. However, in 1984, Anne Murray recorded another of her songs "Just Another Woman In Love". That was her second #1 song, and Patti Ryan moved to Nashville convinced that she should write full-time.

Since moving here, her songs have been recorded by such greats as Reba McEntire, Mel McDaniel, Tammy Wynette, David Frizzell, Con Hunley, Del Shannon and Moe Bandy.

Nintendo of America provided the following service information with respect to the VS. System, Play Choice 10, Gun Games.

Symtoms

1. Pulling the trigger does not start game (with gun pointed at monitor).
2. Pulling the trigger and game starts (with gun not pointed at monitor - excluding VS. Gunshoe game).
3. Pulling the trigger does not produce a bright flash on the monitor.
4. Gun intermittently hits wrong characters.

Solutions

Examine the swivel located in the handle of the gun. The two nuts which hold the swivel together work loose, causing a break in continuity. Re-tighten the two nuts while making sure the contacts are in their correct position in relation to the swivel plates.

Examine the light sensing diode P.C. Board located in the barrel of the gun. The solder joints where the P.C. Board shield makes contact with the P.C. Board break loose. Re-solder this joint using a generous amount of solder. If the problem still exists after the internal wiring, harness and swivel have checked out okay, then replacement of the light sensing diode P.C. Board is recommended. Applying a generous amount of solder to the shield-P.C. Board joint of the replacement diode P.C. Board will insure proper operation.

verdict and lower court ruling in Arachnid, Inc. versus Industrial Design Electronic Associates (IDEA), Donald DeVale, Bonita DeVale and Kidde Recreation Products. The decision by the Federal Circuit upheld the finding that the IDEA company had violated the terms of a 1980 consulting contract with Arachnid. When IDEA and its principals conceive the invention of a dual microcomputer for use in electronic dart games, the jury and lower court had found that the invention actually belonged to Arachnid under the terms of the contract. As a result, the District Court required Kidde Recreation Products, which had purchased IDEA's assets including the patent right to the dual microcom-

puter invention out of bankruptcy, to assign the United States patent to Arachnid.

In its decision, the Court of Appeals found that "Donald DeVale met with his patent lawyers to commence an application for a patent on the dual microprocessor in June, 1982. During that meeting, DeVale provided drawings labeled with IDEA's project number for its Arachnid work." According to Paul Beall, president of Arachnid, IDEA's electronic dart games including Century darts, All American darts, Sargeant darts and others have employed the dual microcomputer for the past several years and have thus unlawfully infringed upon Arachnid's right to that invention. When asked what action Arachnid might take against purchasers and users of the

intruding IDEA dart games, Mr. Beal stated that he would have to review his available legal alternatives before making a decision.

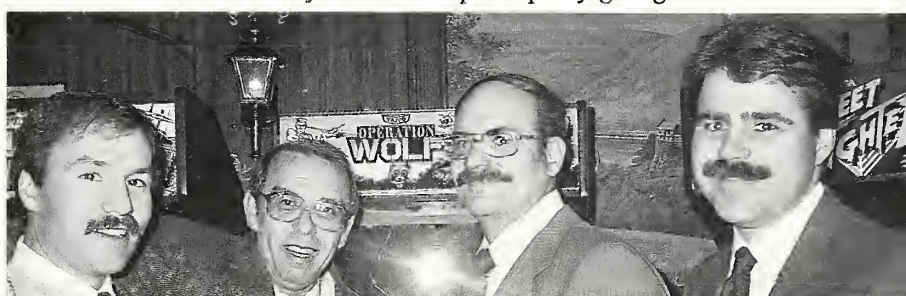
At The Atlas Dist. Holiday Bash

I ever got on stage, which was appropriate because my first encounter with an audience was in San Francisco, 1971... it was Halloween night at an artist community based in a warehouse and everyone was on acid. There was a man in front of me painted blue and he was naked. This was Rock and Roll folks! I was totally aghast. I was trying to get out of the place, when someone said... 'if you're not going on, they're going on.' I just went 'uh-uh, we're going on.' I walked on stage, staring everyone in the eye. I got on my knees, I became an animal. It happened totally naturally, and shocked the hell out of me... All of a sudden another part of me came raging out. Over the years, it's become the most psychologically healthy thing for me."

Soon the band moved to L.A., and became the first generation of Motels. The band played local gigs, always attracting a loyal following. They found themselves opening for the then unsigned Van Halen. The band seemed to be going more in the direction of a heavier rock sound than Davis wanted. The band was reformed in 1978. The new band had the melodic, understated quality that was to become the classic Motels sound. Capitol signed them in '79.

The Motels became internationally known and it was while Davis toured with the band in Europe that she penned "Only the Lonely." It was a song about being on the road with Tim McGovern, Martha's boyfriend and guitarist in the band.

"We were trying to have a relationship... trying to stay in the same room... fighting constantly. Here we were in this setting that was 180 degrees different from what we felt. Everything should be perfect, but we were out there just pretending."

The Motels recorded five records for Capitol. *Policy* began as a Motels album. But Davis sensed the time was ripe for a change, for a chance to

work with new people. She had been writing and demoing all the songs anyway, and had enlisted the help of synthesist Gary Chang and producer/guitarist Richie Zito. "I was talking to Marty Girard (the Motels keyboard player) about how to explain the breakup," said Davis. "He said tell everyone that a May fly has a lifespan of two days - the Motels were together for eight years! Some things just have to end."

Despite a recent bout with cancer, Martha Davis remains more philosophical than religious. She says about "Heaven Outside My Door" a song on the new album: "Some people might look at the song and say I'm born again... but it's me looking outside at Mars and Jupiter. My personal belief is more of an awe of science."

Songwriting remains her primary form of self expression, besides being a necessity to put together an album. Davis writes fifty or more songs for each project. "A great song is captivating emotionally, it may not even be very commercial at times. I've always wanted to write film scores. That is pure emotion to me." (She sang on the soundtrack to the film *Made in Heaven*).

Her interest in films has led to her recent acting debut in *Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure*, along with Clarence Clemons and Fee Waybill. She even read for the part of Dorothy in *Blue Velvet*. "That one would have been a hard one to pull off. Imagine making my film debut with Dennis Hopper in my crotch!"

"People say, 'Martha you're so good on stage you should be in movies.' They don't realize that it's 180 degrees different. Live you're playing to the guy in the back. On film you see everything. It's not easily transferable."

Martha Davis remains a unique artist, committed to the integrity of her music. She concludes confidently, "I'll never change my style to please anyone."

Home Video Year In Review

LOS ANGELES - The public continued to show an appetite for home video viewing this year. At year end, the top-selling videos come from HV giants like Disney (*Lady and the Tramp*, *Sleeping Beauty*), Paramount (*Crocodile Dundee*, *Top Gun*, *Star Trek IV*), Lorimar (*Jane Fonda's Low Impact Workout*) and MCA (*An American Tail*). These were the visible successes, but as in any highly competitive industry it is the news from the trenches that tells the story of Home Video in 1987.

Video piracy continued to be a nagging problem. Jack Valenti of the Motion Picture Association estimated that worldwide one billion dollars has been lost this year to pirates, 700 million in the U.S. alone. Stepped-up law enforcement efforts by the FBI have scarcely put a dent into illegal duping. September raids in the Los Angeles area resulted in the arrest of 15 suspects.

New developments in VCR technology may aid home taping, not to mention video pirates. However VCR hardware companies feel unfairly persecuted. GO Video of Scottsdale, Arizona filed a \$250,000,000 lawsuit against the MPAA and several Japanese and Korean firms. GO claimed that their attempt to manufacture a new double-cassette video player/recorder was being stymied by a boycott. The machine will allow high quality video cassette duping in one unit.

On another battlefield, a fight over home video distribution rights for the blockbuster *Platoon* was waged between HBO and Vestron. Hemdale Film Corp. the owner of the master, originally penned a deal with Vestron before the film became a hit, then claimed a breach of contract with Vestron. A new deal was struck with HBO for a reported 14 million, more than twice the original selling price to Vestron. Before the dust had cleared, Chrysler's Lee Iacocca had paid HBO 1 million for an introduc-

tory tribute, and HBO had already prepared for shipment of nearly 400,000 copies. At this writing a court ruling appears to have gone in Vestron's favor. In the meantime the film may have already missed the boat for this X-mas rush. And so it goes.

In Las Vegas this summer the Video Dealer's Software Association held one of their largest conventions, drawing nearly 12,000 people. In seminars and meetings several conclusions were drawn. First, made-for-video productions were in no danger of overtaking feature films with "A" titles; Spanish language videos show an enormous potential for growth; commercials in home videos will continue to increase; video producers ought to adopt MPAA type ratings; music video sales are soft; and Vegas is a hell of a place to try to win a little money.

Cable TV continued this year to fight for its right to party. The Academy of Television Arts and Sciences announced that cable programming would be eligible to compete for Emmy's. Home Video producers continued to complain about pay-per-view cable films as a threat to the video rental business. Finally, the National Cable Association survey revealed that although basic cable costs have gone up, viewers are getting more quality entertainment for their money.

This year we saw the continuing controversy over black and white film colorization. Hollywood directors, led by giants like Woody Allen, testified before Congress that the process was raping and pillaging this century's greatest works of art purely for profit. However, the public, it seems, likes to watch colorized films. Proposed legislation protecting finished films from changes has a slim chance of approval. One wonders what the people at Turner Entertainment would do with *The Wizard of Oz* - Kansas does look better in color.
