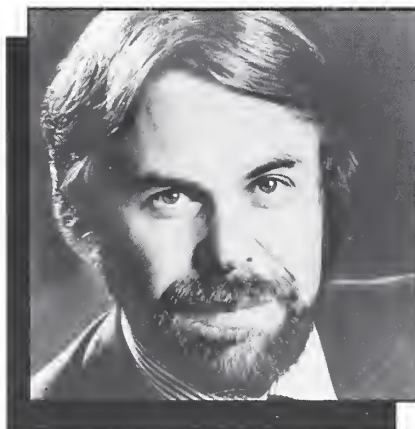

Al Teller Receives "Spirit Of Life" Award

On Wednesday night, September 4, the Music and Entertainment Industry Chapter of the City of Hope will present MCA Music Entertainment Group chairman Al Teller with its "Spirit of Life" award. The record industry veteran will receive the award at a star-studded gala, which is expected to raise over \$2.5 million for the City of Hope.

MCA artists Gladys Knight, Stephanie Mills, Jody Watley and Reba McEntire will be among the performers at the black-tie affair, which will be held on Universal Studios Sound Stage 12. Preceding the dinner will be a silent auction, which will sell collector's items from rock musicians such as Tom Petty, B.B.King and Motley Crue and sports figures such as Magic Johnson, Muhammad Ali and Wayne Gretsky. The theme of the evening is "Building A City Without Limits."



An M.B.A. graduate of Harvard Business School, Teller has helmed both MCA and CBS Records. In 1988, he became president of MCA and was named chairman of the MCA Music Entertainment Group the following year.

In 1988, Teller was the honoree of the T.J.Martell Foundation for Leukemia, Cancer and AIDS Research. Last year he received the "Unsung Hero" Award from the Betty Clooney Foundation For Persons With Brain Injury.

The City of Hope is a non-profit medical and research center that treats and researches major diseases such as cancer, AIDS, diabetes and leukemia. The Music and Entertainment Industry Chapter of the City of Hope was formed in 1974 and has raised more than \$12 million.

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Lewinter Named Atlantic Group Vice Chairman

MELVYN R. LEWINTER has been promoted to the position of vice chairman of the Atlantic Group, a Time Warner company, while retaining the title of chief financial officer. The announcement was made by Atlantic Group co-chairman/co-ceo Ahmet M. Ertegun and co-chairman/co-ceo Doug Morris. Lewinter, who has been with the company since 1970, was most recently cfo/senior vice president.

In his new post, Lewinter assumes a more comprehensive role in the overall business and operation of the Atlantic Group, while continuing to oversee all financial areas. He will also work closely with the various creative areas of the company.

About his new position Lewinter noted, "I would like to thank Ahmet and Doug for giving me this opportunity to work hand in hand with them in creating the Atlantic of the future. The expansion of the Atlantic Group ensures that we will be at the leading edge of an era of great possibilities."

CALLING GERT FROBE: Prince, bless his controversial heart, is about to release a home "maxi video," *Gett Off*, a 30-minute collection of five video clips, one each for "Gett Off," "Houstyle," "Violet the Organ Grinder," "Gangster Glam" and "Clockin' the Jizz," from his upcoming *Diamonds and Pearls* album. All the clips were directed by Rande St. Nicholas, but the one we're interested in is "Violet..." which, we're told, features "Prince, draped in chains and little else paying homage to Violet from behind bars while caged with four obviously 'sex-starved,' half-naked maidens who are painted a radiant gold from head to toe." It's out on Sept. 10, just in time for your Yom Kippur gift-giving.

MUSIC REVIEWS

ALBUMS

■ DONNA SUMMER: *Mistaken Identity* (Atlantic 7 82282-2)

After returning to her Euro-disco roots on her last album, 1989's *Another Place And Time*, Donna Summer surprises us by generally avoiding that type of sound on *Mistaken Identity*. The 12-track CD ranges from uptempo "urban contemporary" cuts like "Say A Little Prayer," "Body Talk" and "Get Ethnic" to the "adult contemporary" pop ballads "Friends Unknown" and "Heaven's Just A Whisper Away" to the smooth R&B/pop single "When Love Cries."



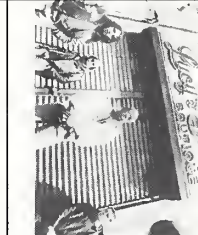
■ STEVIE NICKS: *Timespace: The Best Of Stevie Nicks* (Modern/Atlantic 91711)

Timespace: The Best Of Stevie Nicks boasts "Edge Of Seventeen," "I Can't Wait," "Stand Back," "Talk To Me," "Leather And Lace," "Room's On Fire" and other songs that have become favorites among Nicks' followers during the Fleetwood Mac member's 10-year solo career. Also included are two new songs that are slick but edgy: the single "Sometimes It's A Bitch" and "Love's A Hard Game To Play," which was produced by Poison's Bret Michaels.



■ LUCY BROWN: *Lucy Brown* (Megaforce/Atlantic 7 82292-2)

Get-down soul and funk meets metallic, guitar-crunching rock on Lucy Brown's self-titled debut album. This CD is not only among the most fresh-sounding releases of 1991—it is also a shining example of the type of creativity and risk-taking the Black Rock Coalition has been fighting so valiantly for. And besides being strong musically, *Lucy Brown* stands out because of its intelligent lyrics addressing such topics as racism and inequality.



■ CUT 'N' MOVE: *Get Serious* (Soulpower/Epic EK 47938)

European crew Cut 'N' Move provide a variety of club-conscious sounds on *Get Serious*. This 12-track CD ranges from pumpin' dance/rap cuts like "Spread Love," "Girl, You Got Me Working" and the title track to "No Connection," a smooth dance number featuring seductive vocals by female singer Thera, to "Jazz House," which combines a sleek, instrumental house track with jazz-influenced guitar, piano and vibes solos.



■ WALTER "WOLFMAN" WASHINGTON: *Sada* (Pointblank/Charisma 91743-2)

Singer/guitarist Walter "Wolfman" Washington's *Sada* is an R&B CD—not in an "urban contemporary" sense, but in a soul sense recalling folks like James Brown, Otis Redding and Bobby Womack. The CD's strongest soul food goodies include "Girl, I Wanna Dance With You," "I'll Be Good," "Southern Comfort" and a reading of The Ohio Players' "Skin Tight."



■ JIBRI WISE ONE: *Jibri Wise One* (Ear Candy 72827-31000-4)

The "super hype" Jibri's debut album has been impressing hip-hop radio DJ's and hip-hop listeners of all sorts. "The House The Dog Built," the album's first single, has been climbing rap charts nationwide and bringing his name into the mainstream of rap. "I'll Be There For You," "Could'a Would'a Should'a" and "Blame It On The Horns" are some of the tracks to be looked out for in the near future.

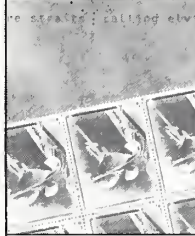
■ FOREIGNER: "I'll Fight For You" (Atlantic PRCD 4141)

Atlantic didn't choose an aggressive, guitar-crunching rocker for the latest single from Foreigner's current album. Instead, "I'll Fight For You" is a slick and highly commercial pop-rock "power ballad" that will probably appeal to those who fancied "I Want To Know What Love Is" and "I've Been Waiting For A Girl Like You." CHR programmers who played those hits should give this CD single a close listen.



■ DIRE STRAITS: "Calling Elvis" (Warner Bros. PRO-CD 4953)

Dire Straits' "Calling Elvis," which appears on the band's most recent album, *On Every Street*, is an eerie, haunting rock number that was obviously inspired by the late Mr. Presley and the enormous amount of publicity that continues to surround him 14 years after his death. The vocals, low-key yet expressive, add to the song's moodiness. "Calling Elvis" was produced by Mark Knopfler and Dire Straits.



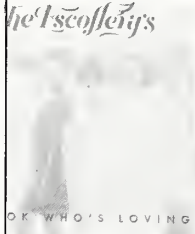
■ NEMESIS: "I Want Your Sex" (Profile POO 7341)

"I Want Your Sex," not to be confused with George Michael's song, isn't as hardcore as some of the songs by Dallas rap crew Nemesis. Instead, "I Want Your Sex" is a melodic rap song with a mainstream R&B appeal along the lines of Slave and Steve Arrington. Suggestive but not explicit, the lyrics are closer to Tone Loc's "Wild Thing" than N.W.A.'s "Just Don't Bite It," Ice-T's "Sex" or The 2 Live Crew's "Face Down, Ass Up."



■ THE ESCOFFERY'S "Look Who's Loving Me" (Atlantic PRCD 4132-2)

Both radio programmers and club deejays may have use for this five-track CD single by R&B group The Escoffery's. The single edit and radio mix of "Look Who's Loving Me," a sleek, smooth and relaxed yet danceable number, is friendly to "urban contemporary" programmers, while the house remix is quite club-conscious. "Look Who's Loving Me," which appears on the group's *Opinions* album, was produced by Marcus Johnson & Steve Campbell.



■ WHO AM I?: "Nickel Slick Nigga" b/w "Action" (Ruthless/Epic ESK 73776)

Who Am I?, a hard core rap act on the gangster tip, examines the realities of a player's life on "Nickel Slick Nigga," which is smooth and melodic and lacks the dissonance of hardcore rap, and the more abrasive "Action." Both of these songs, which appear on Who Am I's slammur' debut album, *Adictos Hip-Hop Muzick*, were produced by Above The Law's Cold 187um, with Eazy-E and Laylaw serving as executive producers.



■ RAW FUSION: "Throw Your Hands In The Air" b/w "Do My Thang" (Hollywood BASIC HB-66546-2)

Raw Fusion is an outside project for Digital Underground homeboys DJ Fuze and Money B, who are still members of the popular Oakland rap posse. Raw Fusion, whose sound isn't as overtly George Clinton-influenced as the Underground's, deal with the everyday realities of ghetto life (police harassment, Black-on-Black crime) on "Throw Your Hands In The Air."



PICK OF THE WEEK:

■ TIN MACHINE: *Tin Machine II* (Victory/PolyGram 314 511 216-2)

Tin Machine, an all-star four-piece consisting of David Bowie (lead vocals, rhythm guitar, saxophone), Reeves Gabrels (lead & rhythm guitars), Hunt Sales (drums, percussion, lead & background vocals) and Tony Sales (bass), follows up its debut album with *Tin Machine II*. The music on this 12-track CD is often haunting and moody but often rockin', melodic rock. Songs to watch out for include "If There Is Something," "Betty Wrong," "You Belong In Rock & Roll" and "Baby Universal."

In the Best Thrash Band category, Megadeth, Sepultura, Slayer, Suicidal Tendencies and Wrathchild America are contenders. Contenders for Top New Artist are Alice In Chains, The Electric Boys, Firehouse, Lynch Mob and Pantera. In the Best Hard Alternative Band category, Fishbone, King's X, Last Crack, Jane's Addiction and Primus are competing. In the Top Artist (Radio Album) category, the discs are Anthrax's *Persistence Of Time*, Megadeth's *Rust In Peace*, Queensryche's *Empire*, Suicidal Tendencies's *Lights... Camera... Revolution* and Wrathchild America's 3-D. For Top Artist (Retail), contenders are AC/CD's *The Razor's Edge*, Megadeth's *Rust In Peace*, Poison's *Flesh & Blood*, Queensryche's *Empire* and Slayer's *Seasons In The Abyss*. ROCKER HISTORY: EMI has a release date of September 10 for *T-Bone Walker: The Complete Riverside Recordings, 1950-1954*, a two-CD, 52-track collection focusing on the bluesman's work for Imperial Records. The set, which will include alternate takes, could make Stormy Monday a little easier. Nonetheless, Tuesday's just as bad. Wednesday's worse, and Thursday's oh so sad... That's what time it is. R&B MUSIC

CASH BOX ARTIST PROFILE: Since the disappointing split-up of New Edition, the former members of the hit group have gone on to be hitmakers on their own. Bobby Brown, Johnny Gill, Ralph Tresvant and Bell Biv DeVoe have been setting trends and topping music charts worldwide in their solo careers.

Bobby Brown's MCA album *Don't Be Cruel*, completely dominated 1988 and 1989 with hits. The title track attacked the singles charts, and after only a few weeks, it secured the number one position. "My Perogative," a hit produced by Teddy Riley, held number one spots and was on heavy radio rotation all over the nation for almost a complete year (if not more). "Roni," was just one of Brown's ballads to really take the industry by storm and land him yet another number one slot.

Johnny Gill dazzled music fans with his incredible vocal talents which he displayed on his self-titled Motown album. First he released the R&B/Dance smash, "Rub You The Right Way," which received heavy radio and club play, escalating him to the top of the *Cash Box* Rhythm and Blues charts. Then he struck again with the highly acclaimed number one, mood-for-love hit, "My My My." "Wrap My Body Tight," a catchy remake, followed and found its way to the top of the R&B charts as well.

Ralph Tresvant took his own road in music by approaching the industry with a traditional Rhythm & Blues sound that did quite well for him. His super-sensitive single on MCA, "Sensitivity" stormed its way past other artists and landed in the number one spot on R&B music charts worldwide. "Stone Cold Gentleman," his second single, did not fare nearly as well as "Sensitivity," but "Do What I Gotta Do," seemed destined to be a hit from the minute it was released. His latest single "Rated R," is currently on a steady move upwards on the *Cash Box* R&B charts.

When Bell Biv DeVoe released their MCA album *Poison*, I don't think they were ready for the hits that were to follow. The title track became one of the biggest hits of 1990, and the style which they describe as "mental" became addictive for their listeners. Soon after the success of "Poison," they released "Do Me." Taking the same route as "Poison," "Do Me" rocketed up the charts at an amazing pace, leaving the competition far behind. "I Thought It Was Me," "She's Dope" and "When Will I See You Smile" all met with chart success. Now they have released another single, "Word To The Mutha," which is taking its own route up the charts, helping make Bell Biv DeVoe's album even more successful.

INDIE PROFILE

THE JAZZ ALLIANCE

AFTER SUCCESSFULLY RUNNING CONCORD JAZZ SINCE 1973, the label's founder/president

Carl E. Jefferson decided to start another jazz label: The Jazz Alliance, which has released six CDs since June. "It's a totally separate company from Concord," stresses Phil Sheridan, the Jazz Alliance's vice president and general manager. "It is distributed through Concord's distribution network, and both companies are owned by Carl Jefferson. But The Jazz Alliance and its subsidiary All Art Jazz are completely separate from Concord Jazz."

Jefferson had the idea for the Jazz Alliance for several years, but things gelled in August 1990 when Sheridan (who founded his own jazz label, Innovation Records, in Toronto in 1981) left his native Canada in August 1990 to serve work with The Alliance. "The Jazz Alliance is basically set up as a company to lease product. The product that is on Concord Jazz is owned by Concord Jazz; most of the product on the Jazz Alliance and All Art Jazz is leased. Many times, an artist will do a project and put it out on their own label, and get virtually no distribution or little distribution—the Jazz Alliance is set up to lease that project. In some cases, we may redo it in so far as remixing it or redoing the artwork, getting new liner notes and putting it in a fresh package. There's a label in Japan called All Art Records, and it's been distributed only in Japan for the last few years. So we made a deal with All Art to distribute what we pick of their product; that arm of it is called All Art Jazz. We lease the product from them."

Thus far, The Alliance has released big-band albums by The Dave McMurdo Orchestra, The Brass Connec-

tion; live albums by piano greats Hank Jones and Roger Kellaway that All Art previously released in Japan; a duet album by guitarist Ed Bickert and valve trombonist Rob McConnell; and Don Thompson's *Winter Mist*, which finds him playing

vibes instead of bass or piano. Sheridan notes, "Concord Jazz has—and I hate the term—a stable of artists, whereas The Jazz Alliance will not necessarily have that. We won't sign any contracts for a three-album deal or anything like that. There's a contract for each project. If we put out two things by an artist, there would be separate contracts for each project. We take one thing at a time. It's a good deal for the artist because they get their product out there. We pay for the manufacturing, the new art work and the new liner notes."

While Concord sells both cassettes and CDs—mostly CDs—The Jazz Alliance is a CD-only label. "I just felt that in jazz, cassettes are not that big a seller," Sheridan asserts. "I had cassettes with innovation, and I couldn't give them away. I want to put out a high-quality product, and I don't want to lower the quality of the product by putting it out on cassette. I've never particularly liked the sound of cassettes."

Unlike Concord—whose roster boasts Phil Woods, Scott Hamilton, Charlie Byrd, Tito Puente, Poncho Sanchez, Ray Barretto, Marian McPartland, Rosemary Clooney, Stanley Cowell, Hal Galper, Howard Alden and quite a few others—The Jazz Alliance is a mid-line label. "It's sold at mid-price partly because the amount of money we have invested in each project is not a huge amount," Sheridan points out. "The other thing is that most of it has been released before. I had one new project, The Don Thompson Quartet. I recorded it (for Innovation) in Toronto a little over a year ago. I may do some more things on Innovation that will be leased through The Jazz Alliance."

ALBUMS

■ LIONEL HAMPTON BIG BAND: *Outrageous* (Timeless CDSJP 163)

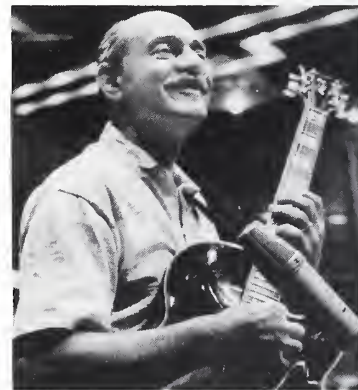
Octogenarians Benny Carter and Lionel Hampton being among the exceptions, few jazzmen who were established in the 1930s are getting busy in the '90s. *Outrageous*, recorded in 1980 and 1981 and recently reissued on CD, is one of the many exuberant, good-spirited albums Hampton has recorded over the years. Among the CD's pleasures are fresh-sounding readings of Charlie Parker's "Koko" and Chick Corea's "Tap Step"; the funk-influenced "Dr. Lambchop" and the Glenn Miller hit "In The Mood." ■ THE ACCUSED: *Straight Razor* (Nastymix NMR 72000-2)

Nastymix Records made a name for itself with rap, but these days, the Seattle-based indie is also into thrash metal, dance and jazz. The Accused beat, bruise, batter and bludgeon on *Straight Razor*, a CD EP containing both live material and studio thanzg from the Emerald City thrash posse's last Nastymix album, *Griming Like An Undertaker*. With song titles like "The Corpse Walks," "Straight Razor (Going For The Throat)" and "Blind Hate, Blind Rage," you know that The Accused appreciates the finer things in life—and death.

■ JOE PASS: *Appassionato* (Pablo/Fantasy PACD-2310-9460-2)

Along with Kenny Burrell, Jim Hall and Barney Kessel, Joe Pass enjoys a prestigious niche in mainstream guitar royalty. So when the electric



and acoustic guitarist interprets Charlie Parker's "Relaxin' At Camarillo," Horace Silver's "Nica's Dream" and Coleman Hawkins' "Stuff" for his 57-minute CD *Appassionato*, one expects depth, sensitivity, warmth and intellect. *Appassionato* has all those things and more. While Pass often excels unaccompanied, *Appassionato* features John Pisano (acoustic guitar), Jim Hughart (acoustic bass for your face) and Colin Bailey (drums) as sidemen.

■ BLUES BOY WILLIE: *Be Who 2* (Ichiban ICH 1119)

Gary B.B. Coleman serves as producer/arranger on fellow bluesman and labelmate Blues Boy Willie's *Be Who 2*. "Where Is Leroy" and "I Still Care" are among the CD's urban blues tracks. But like Coleman, B.B. King, Bobby "Blue" Bland and Little Milton, Willie is a bluesman who often crosses over to soul—"Break Away," "The Rest Of My Life" and the caressing "Let's Get Closer" are examples of soul music as we knew it during the '60s and '70s.

■ VARIOUS ARTISTS: *Rock This Town: Rockabilly Hits, Volumes 1 and 2* (Rhino R2 70741)

Those who acquire both volumes of *Rock This Town* will hear a total of 36 rockabilly songs spanning the early 1950s to the '80s. Exclusively '50s, *Volume 1* contains Roy Orbison's "Ooby Dooby," Carl Perkins' "Blue Suede Shoes," Johnny Burnette's "The Train Kept A Rollin'," Ritchie Valens' "Come On, Let's Go" and Jerry Lee Lewis' "High School Confidential." *Volume 2* ranges from the late '50s action of Eddie Cochran's "C'mon Everybody" and Conway Twitty's "Danny Boy" to The Blasters' "Flattop Joint" (1989) and The Stray Cats' "Rock This Town" (1982).

■ FENTON ROBINSON: *I Hear Some Blues Downstairs* (Alligator ALCD 4710)

Yo! I'm sendin' a crazy shout out to Alligator, Chicago's premier blues label, for reissuing Fenton Robinson's 1977 recording *I Hear Some Blues Downstairs* on CD. The singer/guitarist knows how to make his Chi-Town blues lowdown—an approach that certainly works well on "As The Years Go Passing By," "West Side Baby" and "I'm So Tired." Meanwhile, "I Wish For You" is more rockin'. But either way, *I Hear Some Blues Downstairs* is blues with lots of soul.

COUNTRY MUSIC

CMT Scores Another Ratings Victory



COUNTRY MUSIC TELEVISION LEADS OTHER BASIC CABLE NETWORKS in results of July Nielsen Ratings. In just-released Nielsen people-meter data for the month of July, CMT leads other basic cable networks including MTV, VH1, Lifetime, USA, Nickelodeon, TNT, Family, TBS, Discovery, CNN, ESPN and TNN, in the composition of its audience for delivery of women 18-49 and women 25-54 in prime time from 8 p.m.-11 p.m. Monday through Sunday.

For every 100 homes viewing CMT during prime time in July, CMT has 52 women 18-49 viewing—more than such young skewing networks as MTV (41), VH1 (46) and more than the basic networks listed above.

CMT was also first in audience composition for adults 25-54 and third for adults 18-34 and adults 18-49 during prime time. Country Music Television even ranked third in audience composition for teenagers in prime time (behind MTV and VH1).

News Box

COUNTRY IN SCHOOLS—Secretary of Education Lamar Alexander recently visited Music City for Nashville's *Cities In Schools* Country music promotion. Alexander was on hand to help inaugurate the release of "Let's Open Our Hearts," a song dedicated to "at-risk" youth and featuring Kathy Mattea, Garth Brooks, George Jones, Barbara Mandrell, Charlie Daniels and more than 50 other talented artists. The event, which took place at the Country Music Hall of Fame, sparked from the recording project entitled H.O.S.S. (Help Our Schools Survive), was initiated by Hoss Burns, disc jockey for Nashville's WSIX Radio. The lyrics are a plea for all Americans to help children pursue their dreams. All proceeds from the cassette single and video will support the *Cities In Schools* campaign.

OOPS!—To correct last week's mistake of tagging Garth Brooks as the Amusement and Music Operators Assn. (AMOA), ASCAP Songwriter of the Year, please take note that it's Clint Black who will be presented with the ASCAP honors during the 1991 Jukebox Awards, at the AMOA Expo, on September 13. Garth Brooks will receive the BMI Songwriter of the Year award.

LITTLE BIG TOWN MUSIC ANNOUNCES NEW STAFF ADDITIONS—In a joint venture with MCA Music, Little Big Town Music Group recently made two new additions to its songwriting staff. Billy Montana is best known as leader of former Warner Bros. recording group Billy Montana and the Long Shots. Catesby Jones is co-writer of Travis Tritt's breakthrough hit "Country Club." The music group has also employed Stephanie Cox as song plugger. Little Big Town currently enters its fifth year of operation as one of Music Row's publishers.

WALDOXY RECORDS IS NEWEST SOUTHERN LABEL—Tommy Couch, Jr. has announced the launching of the South's newest independent label, Waldoxy Records, in Jackson, Mississippi. "My goal is to establish an alternative label that produces quality product, but at the same time preserves the integrity of the artist and his or her songs," Couch explains. Waldoxy's first release, *Mesas And Mandolins*, will be by former Arista recording artists Stealin' Horses and will ship early next month.

TALENT ON STAGE—Music City recently played host to new Atlantic recording artist Tracy Lawrence, who performed at the 12th & Porter. DPI Records also took pride in showing off one of its newest artists, Mario Martin. The 17-year-old singer unleashed a "high" performance at Nashville's famed Union Station Hotel. Hosting the special showcase were Lorianne Crook and Charlie Chase.

Williams will be featured as the headliner at the \$8 million facility for at least the first six months of operation. The Moon River Theatre will be the centerpiece of a 22-acre complex with a 250-room hotel and restaurant in future plans.

CHRISTY LANE: BRANSON'S INTERNATIONAL LEGEND—It was only a little over a year ago that country/gospel/pop songstress Christy Lane was honored by being dubbed Nigeria's #1 selling recording artist. MARGARET BELL, WARNER ALLIANCE RECORDS—Music has always played an important role in the life of one of Warner Alliance's latest signees—Margaret Bell.

Early on, Bell blended her voice with others as part of the choir at her father's church, the Mt. Everett Church of God in Christ, in Detroit. From then until now, music has meant a great deal more to Bell than the mere expression of lyrics and notes—it goes much deeper. "I have to sing about my life," she says. "Whom I love, who protects me, who has set me free. I don't have a choice. It's what I'm about."

While growing up, Bell never had to sing alone. Bell has two talented sisters who always sang with her. Vanessa Bell Armstrong is a Jive Records artist, and Charlene Bell has appeared on both of her sisters' albums as well as releasing her own.

Margaret's debut Warner Alliance album displays the rich texture and power generated through her superb vocal stylings. The strong, urban contemporary flavor of the record, enhanced by the production and songwriting of BeBe Winans and Tim Miner, depicts where Bell's heart is and the direction in which she is headed.

How Bell was signed to Warner Alliance is an interesting story. "BeBe Winans and I happened to be at a mall in San Francisco," Bell explains. "We came across one of those 'Record Yourself' booths, where we, not taking it seriously at all, laid down a song. Mervyn Warren (formerly of Take 6) stopped by my home one day and asked to hear the tape. He must have liked it, because he ended up taking it to Jim Ed Norman, president of Warner Bros.' Nashville division. After he heard it, I was offered a deal."

But Bell's "luck" was not entirely out of the blue. Previously she had appeared daily on television as one of the Richard Roberts Singers; toured extensively with BeBe and CeCe Winans; performed with Whitney Houston; performed in the stage productions of *Don't Get God Started* and *God's Trombones*; and married Philadelphia Eagles star running back Keith Byars.

"God's using all avenues to get His Word out," Bell says. "I've seen it with BeBe and CeCe. They are right in the center of the action, and that's where I want to be."

D.O.C.: Rappin' Discord Into Harmony

THE IDIOM OF CHRISTIAN RAP continues to grow in popularity at a rapid pace. This is evident by the increasing number of rap artists being added to the rosters of the various labels in the Christian music industry. One of the latest to join this ever-growing posse of rappers for God are the Disciples of Christ, aka, D.O.C.

The group, consisting of Michael Brown, Alton Hood, Kelvin Harvey and Matt Stevens, recently released their debut album on the Star Song label titled, *So How Ya Livin'?* D.O.C.'s sound is unique, combining the authenticity and lyrics of hard rap with soulful harmonies that showcase the group's strong vocal capabilities—something not commonly associated with this musical genre.

Life has not always been pleasant for these four young men from Canton, Ohio. Hood, a highly sought-after, high school scholar-athlete, experimented with drugs and alcohol, winding up in high-level occult practices. Brown was introduced to drugs at the tender age of eight, abandoned at 13, enlisted in the Army after losing a college athletic scholarship and was arrested for selling cocaine, receiving two years probation. Stevens and Harvey renounced their faith, involving themselves in everything the "world" had to offer.

"Everything changed at Oberlin College in Ohio," lead singer Brown explains. "That is where Alton and Kelvin received God in their hearts. They used to write poems. One particular day they were inspired to write some Christian poems, then putting a beat to them. A couple of years later we added keyboards. We felt the need to minister, with rap being the most effective way to minister in the inner city, of which we were a part. We wanted to reach our brothers and sisters in the projects and other places and give them something positive to grasp and think on."

Brown continues, "Our main objective was to go out and be a force within the community. We were going out to different places—churches, what have you—spreading the Word. Recording was the furthest thing from our minds. To be perfectly honest, we didn't even know Christian rap existed, let alone recorded. People would always say to us, 'You guys should put a demo together, shop it around. You know, it wouldn't hurt.' We eventually went into the studio, laying down some of the songs we had written over a period of time. We sent tapes to a number of record companies. A week or so later, Star Song called us, sending a contract and asked if we were interested in signing



with them. We talked it over for a while and eventually said, 'Yeah, this is what we want.' That's how it happened."

The making of *So How Ya Livin'?* was a collaborative effort. "All of the guys had input into the direction of this album," Brown relates. "This helped in keeping the sound from being one-dimensional. Each one of us has his own style. Blending them together helps to make D.O.C. what it is."

Unfortunately the popularity of Christian rap has not caught on with radio. Brown has very strong feelings about the medium's reluctance to program and add Christian rap to its playlists. "I don't feel radio should be biased in any way," a disgruntled Brown insists. "We all have a ministry, reaching certain people through various musical styles. There is definitely a need for Christian rap. I feel radio has an obligation to reach out to those people who enjoy this form of music. If radio can play Christian heavy metal, then it can play Christian rap. Most of the kids today are listening to rap music—Public Enemy, GangStar, NWA, and all the others out there. We're trying to reach those same kids with a positive, spiritual message, and we need the support of radio to be totally effective in doing that."

D.O.C. has gone from a Canton, Ohio group, performing at local churches to a group of national prominence, traveling and performing all across the country. Has this changed the initial focus and outlook of these four talented men?

"No," Brown quickly responds. "We've gone through so much in our lives to the point that sometimes it seems as though we haven't yet arrived, and other times we're this rap group of national prominence. It is still a very humbling situation because we still face real-life situations and problems on a daily basis. We don't feel like we're stars or anything like that. We realize that this is something God wanted us to do, and we're just being faithful to it."

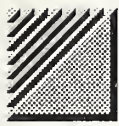

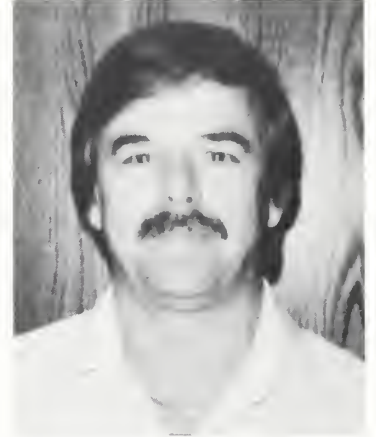
Jensen Elected To IFPA Board

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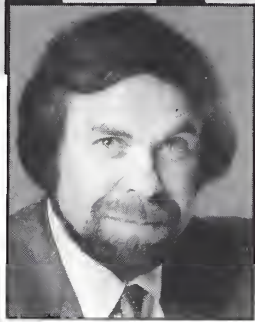
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
