Ostin, Waronker & Ostin At DreamWorks SKG Music

MO OSTIN, LENNY WARONKER AND MICHAEL OSTIN will comprise the much anticipated management team for **DreamWorks SKG Music**, effective immediately, announced **David Geffen** DreamWorks SKG partner.

Mo Ostin, widely lauded as the most respected executive in the music business, will be the senior member of the team and function as the chief executive. Taking an unconventional approach, there will be no corporate titles at the company. At its inception there will be two music labels, **DreamWorks Records** and **SKG Records**.

DreamWorks and SKG Records will be marketed through **Geffen Records** in the U.S. in a joint venture and distributed by **Uni Distribution**. Overseas, **MCA Music Entertainment International (MMEI)** will release and market the labels.

DreamWorks Records will focus on soundtracks and specialty recordings, and SKG Records on individual recording artists and bands. The first artist signed to SKG Records is **George Michael**, whose initial single, “Jesus To A Child,” will be released in December, followed by his album in February 1996.

The DreamWorks SKG labels will be temporarily housed at the Geffen Records site on Sunset Boulevard in West Hollywood, CA.

The trio’s arrival at SKG brings to MCA most of the top talent that made a market leader of the Warner Music Group, as **Doug Morris**, former head of Warner Music USA, and **Bob Krasnow** formerly chief of WB sister label group Elektra, also have labels housed at MCA.

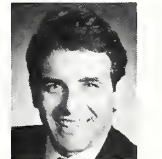

A RESERVOIR OF SOUND: Philadelphia's music scene has had a strange pedigree which has produced a vibrant R&B locale, but (with a very few exceptions) has left its rock floundering. But some shifting has taken place, and the stagnant waters have been stirred. **Bardo Pond** has been part of the resurgence that has made some waves. The five-piece has structured songs that get heads spinning. But when the band gets in front of the footlights, its true *raison d'être* shines through. The band starts out on a single repeated note or riff and builds it, knowing the direction it is heading, but no idea where it will eventually end up. Calling this psychedelic misses its true nature; with the band easing into a mesmerizing rhythm and then beginning to play with the sound in slight textural ways using both instruments and vocals, its true purpose is shown as it slides one into a trance. This effect was in full force at the **Ruba Club** in Philly Friday, October 6 where the group played with the taut noister **Gel-Caps**. With half the band on the floor and the others on the stage they proceeded to weave their spell with great adeptness. **Bardo Pond** is currently recording its next album, which should be released sometime early next year on the **Matador** label.

INFO HIGHWAY FISHING: The Unabomber may be an aficionado of the low-fi revolution in indie-rock, everywhere else though, music is heading into the next millennia and **Sonic Net** is leading that charge. The Internet chat and service group became the first group to sell tickets, have online-only singles and create an alternative label database for members of the modem crowd. Now **Sonic Net** is taking it to that next level by opening a World Wide Web page (<http://www.sonicnet.com>) which will broaden the group's spectrum so that the alternative rock masses can find out more about its favorite (or not so) bands. The current schedule of chats include the **Meat Puppets**, **Radiohead**, **Moby**, **Cypress Hill**, **Superchunk**, and author **Hubert Selby, Jr.** So it's maybe time to get out your virtual swimsuits and head for the silicon beach, looks like surf is up.

BACK IN THE 80S: With the new folkies, few singer/songwriters are as respected as **Shawn Colvin**. Her audience continues to grow as this Grammy-winning, former Austin-native has definitely struck a chord. Now, through **Plump Records**, a label started by her management company **A&F Entertainment Ltd.**, her fans can hear her earliest recording *Live '88*. Colvin did not originally want to release any material until she was signed but relented due to monetary reasons. This collector's item now is once again available to the public with two extra tracks. Her new album is due out in the spring from **Columbia**.

IF THIS DOESN'T MAKE YOU FEEL OLD then I don't know what will. **20th Century Fox** and **Lou Adler** will be hosting a two-night celebration to commemorate the 20th(!) anniversary of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*. The parties will be held October 20 and 21 in Los Angeles.

The festivities kick off the first night of the engagement with a contest at the **Roxy** on the **Sunset Strip**, the home of the original stage musical. Hundreds of *Rocky Horror* devotees are expected to "do the Time Warp again" to earn premium slots in the pre-show at the birthday gala the following night.

The 21st will find the celebration moving into Hollywood for a party to be held at the **Pantages Theatre**. Many of the film's stars, including **Barry Bostwick** (Brad), **Pat Quinn** (Magenta) and **Richard O'Brien** (Riff Raff) are expected to be in attendance. In addition, O'Brien, who also wrote the script, will perform songs from the film's soundtrack.

That's only a small part of the evening's events, though. Also included will be *Rocky Horror* fashion and karaoke contests. The night will culminate with a screening of the movie at midnight, as well as "lost footage" of Bostwick singing "Once In A While." No word yet on whether **Meat Loaf** will be in attendance. Guess we'll all just have to hold our breath.

NEW YORK'S SOUL COUGHING brought its highly eclectic blend of rap/rock/jazz/techno to L.A. for a packed show at the intimate **Jabberjaw** coffeehouse/art gallery. The **Slash Records'** quartet previewed material from its upcoming follow-up to last year's excellent debut, *Ruby Vroom*.

Those who made it through to the end, which was near one in the morning, were treated to a mini-set of songs from the last album. But the very dedicated, industry-heavy crowd was more than open-minded to the new tracks. The perseverance of the crowd through the heat, the lack of standing room and the unfamiliarity with the songs just goes to show what an industry favorite the underrated *Ruby Vroom* really is.

Adding to the excitement of the bill was **Duluth's Low**, the very quiet trio on **Restless Records**. Keeping the music just above a whisper, the group gave the room a campfire vibe, as the folks in front of the stage sat on the ground Native American-style. It was an impressive sight that served as testimonial to the power of the band's music.

Also on the quadruple-bill were **Alias' Knapsack**, who delivered a strong set of their powerful pop hooks, and local band, **This Boy's Life**. Signed to indie, **Crank! A Record Company**, currently the band has out a full-length on both CD and vinyl, as well as a growing collection of 7"s. Check 'em out.

THOSE WONDERING WITH BATED BREATH WHERE MTV COULD GO from here, having already taken the show to London, now have their answer. *The Real World* is returning to the States for its fifth season. The next season of the show will take place in **Miami**.

Miami was chosen by the series' creators and executive producers, **Mary-Ellis Bunim** and **Jonathan Murray**. Said Murray, "Miami is a young, vibrant, international city. It will provide *The Real World* with a fresh, beautiful and multi-cultural backdrop."

Alison Krauss Rules CMA Awards

COUNTRY MUSIC'S BIGGEST STARS held forth Wednesday, October 4 at the Grand Ole Opry as the Country Music Association awarded top honors to the best in the business and administered a few surprises as well. The belle of the ball was undoubtedly Bluegrass artist Alison Krauss, a first-time nominee who won all four categories for which she was nominated. Krauss won the Horizon Award, Female Vocalist of the Year, Single of the Year (along with her band, Union Station) for "When You Say Nothing At

All," and Vocal Event of the Year for her critically acclaimed duet with first-time winner Shenandoah for "Somewhere In The Vicinity of the Heart."

Once again, Vince Gill was the host-with-the-most and handled emcee duties with poise and his trademark humor. Gill also took home a record fifth consecutive Male Vocalist of the Year award, which brought the 15th CMA Award to his credit.

Each time Krauss took the stage for an acceptance speech, she became more and more bewildered. Upon winning the Female Vocalist of the Year award, Krauss said, "What in the world is goin' on here, folks?" Krauss thanked musical idols such as Ricky Skaggs and Tony Rice for inspiring her to sing. Closing her speech, she exclaimed, "You guys, I feel really weird. I don't know what to do. I'm gonna have to get a flask or something."

Backstage, Krauss shared her thoughts as she accepted one of her many awards that night. "When we were going up to get the award, when we had Merle Haggard clappin' and smilin' at us, and I looked and Wynonna Judd stood up and was very happy. And that was really incredible. What a nice feeling. It seemed like there were some people out there who were genuinely happy for us. It was really nice."

Canadian Shania Twain opened the show singing her smash country/pop hit, "Any Man Of Mine." Twain began her performance at the back of the Opry and proceeded down the main isle before joining six male dancers onstage. And while Twain's performance was definitely attention-getting, it was a bit unsettling to see her tousling the legendary Johnny Cash's hair just before she sauntered onstage.

Other notable performances included Reba McEntire, who sang her latest single, "On My Own," accompanied by Linda Davis, Martina

McBride and Trisha Yearwood; Dwight Yoakam, singing the new single, "Nothing" backed by a 20-piece orchestra; and Vince Gill joining Dolly Parton for her classic, "I Will Always Love You."

Perhaps the most spine-tingling performance was John Berry's. Accompanied only by his acoustic guitar, Berry sang "If I Had Any Pride Left At All" and received a standing ovation (as did several other artists during the evening).

Rounding out the night's list of performers were George Strait, Faith Hill, Shelby Lynne, George Jones & Tammy Wynette, Mary Chapin Carpenter, Russ Taff, David Ball, John Michael Montgomery, and Patty Loveless, who also joined Vince Gill, Ricky Skaggs and Mark Knopfler for "Go Rest High On That Mountain."

Epic's Patty Loveless won a much-deserved CMA Award for Album of the Year for *When Fallen Angels Fly*. When her name was called, an obviously surprised Loveless gave a teary acceptance speech in which she thanked her husband and producer, Emory Gordy Jr., who could not attend the Awards. "I'm sure he's about to fall over, too," Loveless said.

Loveless' win was especially unexpected, considering that *When Fallen Angels Fly* was added to the category only after Alison Krauss' *Now That I've Found You: A Collection* was deemed ineligible. Responding to the last-minute nomination, Loveless said, "To know that I'm number one is still shocking to me because of the way that I fell into the category. I know that the nomination was pulled from her (Krauss), but she's a wonderful person. I've worked with her myself. She's a wonderful talent, and I feel she's gonna have many, many, many more years in the music business for sure. I love her and I love her music just as well."

Arista Nashville's Brooks & Dunn collected their fourth consecutive Vocal Duo of the Year Award, tying them with The Judds for number of wins. When asked if winning the award is still important, Kix Brooks replied, "I honestly had a flash tonight right as they were opening the envelope that there's gonna be a night when they're not gonna say 'Brooks & Dunn.'" I really felt that this evening, and I cherish that moment. Because there will be a night when they don't say Brooks & Dunn and every time this happens, yeah, it's real important." Partner Ronnie Dunn added, "It's so important for us to

■ ECHOBELLY: "King Of The Kerb" (550 Music/Epic 7351)

Echobelly is an English group that made enough noise last year with its indie release, *Everyone's Got One*, to make the jump to major label 550 Music/Epic this time. With the Sony push behind them look for the band to infiltrate mainstream Modern Rock outlets with this very engaging single from the new CD, *On*. "King Of The Kerb" is a light-hearted romp through the pop playground led by the sweet vocals of Sonya Aurora Madan.

■ ALL-4-ONE: "I'm Your Man" (Blitzz/Atlantic 6423-2)

This latest single from All-4-One finds them following the same trail that's already led them to the top of the charts. "I'm Your Man" is a very schmaltzy middle-of-the-road ballad that should enjoy its strongest response from top 40 radio, though urban, CHR and Adult Contemporary could follow suit. Taken from the group's *And The Music Speaks* CD, this single will also attract listeners curious about the six different mixes. Clocking it at over 30 minutes, the CD single features almost as much music as some punk records.



■ MAX-A-MILLION: "Sexual Healing" (Zoo/S.O.S. 17183-2)

Max-A-Million already scored one hit this year with its cover of the S.O.S. Band's old disco hit, "Take Your Time." Now they try to make it two for two with a cover of Marvin Gaye's "Sexual Healing." Give the band credit for brains. Where this version of "Take Your Time" was very true to the original, the new single finds the group adding a reggae, near-rap flavor to the song, a wise decision given the original is an R&B classic. The result of the changes is a song that will stand on its own and garner airplay.

■ JUDE COLE: "Believe In You" (Island 7059)

Cole has undergone quite a few changes since his last album. However, he remains a source of delightfully unpretentious pop gems. The lead single from his Island debut, *I Don't Know Why I Act This Way*, is more of the same. Sounding a bit like Paul Simon at times, Cole has crafted a nice song that will definitely find its way onto Triple A and may crossover to CHR and Top 40.

PICK OF THE WEEK

■ THE RENTALS: "Friends Of P" (Maverick/Reprise 17720)



Right now, no label is hotter than Madonna's Maverick, thanks largely to Alanis Morissette. The label should stay red-hot with the lead single from this "new" band's upcoming debut, *Return Of The Rentals*. The Rentals is a six-piece band that includes two members of

Weezer and one member of That Dog. It's a little less surprising then, that the first week out this contagious number was the most added song at Modern Rock stations and is already being played on MTV. "Friends Of P" is a simple alternative song that has a ditty feel to it much the same way the Beatles' "Rocky Raccoon" did. Don't be surprised if you often start hearing the song's chorus, "If you're down with P, then you're down with me."

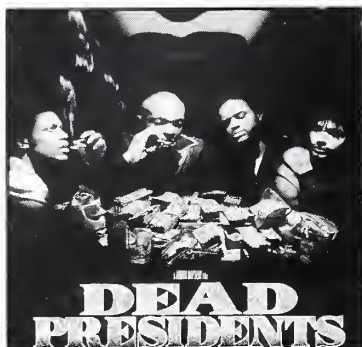

■ RUTH RUTH: *Laughing Gallery* (Ventrue/American 43039-2)

This N.Y. trio's sterling debut is a superb pop/punk CD that, instead of trying to be second generation American punk, brings to mind the early days of British punk, specifically Elvis Costello and Graham Parker. Radio has already jumped all over the first single, "Uninvited," and that's far from the best selection on the 12-song record. The CD's true gems are "All Readydown" and "Amnesia," as well as the instant cult classic, "I Killed Meg The Prom Queen." Led by vocalist/songwriter/bassist Chris Kennedy, Ruth

delightfully blends strong songs with a much needed sense of humor. This could be one of the sleeper albums of the fall.

■ THE FLAMING LIPS: *Clouds Taste Metallic* (Warner Bros. 45911-2)

The Flaming Lips is a testament to perseverance. Since the band hit the scene in 1985, the Oklahoma outfit has made its reputation as one of the most popular underground college music bands, then made do with that until 1994, when they scored a surprise hit with "She Don't Use Jelly." They followed that with a song on the successful soundtrack to *Batman Forever*. It looks like the band had their 15 minutes, and will have to be satisfied with that. On the band's latest effort, the members do more of the things that have made Flaming Lips cult faves, including putting a funky spoken word segment in at the end of "Guy Who Got A Headache And Accidentally Saved The World," and simulating circus music on "Brainville." The straight-ahead mid-tempo rocker "When You Smile" could garner them airplay though.

■ BUFFALO TOM: *Sleepy Eyed* (EastWest Records 61782-2)

As soon as the record's opening song, "Tangerine" kicks in, it's easy to see why this Boston trio is such a critical favorite. They have a remarkably similar sound to the Replacements, maybe the greatest garage band of all time. In fairness to Buffalo Tom, the group has been making records since the SST debut in 1988, where the band was the contemporary of Husker Du and the Meat Puppets. But it's only since Flaming Lips joined the EastWest stable this decade that the band escaped underground attention. Buffalo Tom shows that it can write good songs that go beyond the Replacements with the heavy-throated "Summer" and the melodic "Kitchen Door." *Sleepy Eyed* is a likable collection of singles that will further enhance the band's blossoming reputation.

■ EVE'S PLUM: *Cherry Alive* (550 Music/Epic 66559)

The 1993 debut album by Eve's Plum, *Envy*, spawned a radio hit in the infectious "I Want It All." Since that time, female-fronted rock groups have become the order of the day, witness Elastica, the Breeders and seemingly dozens more found on Modern Rock stations. Given that, look for the Colleen Fitzpatrick-fronted quartet's second album to move the group even higher on the alternative evolutionary ladder. The 12-song CD kicks off with the catchy lead single, "Jesus Loves You (Not As Much As I Do)." The band then has one of its best moments with the wistful "Wishing The Day Away," before returning to the rocker side with the very radio-friendly "Want You Bad." Also of note is the dreamy "Fairy Princess," "Dog In My Heart" and the seductive title track. *Cherry Alive* is brimming with groovy pop tunes that will make people everywhere forget Marcia.



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■ GRATEFUL DEAD: *Hundred Year Hall* (Grateful Dead Productions/Arista 14020-2)

Before you accuse the parties involved of trying to capitalize on yet another tragic rock star death, this two-CD live collection was in the works long before Jerry Garcia's recent demise. The difference is, instead of being another major fall release in a slew of many, this now has a chance to be one of the biggest. The one obstacle standing in the way of its being a sure thing is the overwhelming amount of Dead bootlegs out there. Still, the inclusion of such Dead favorites as "Truckin'," "Sugar Magnolia" and "Bertha" among the 142 minutes worth of music will excite enough fans to make this a strong seller for some time. As for the music, it's the Grateful Dead live, you either dig it or you don't, and you'd know by now if you do.

PICK OF THE WEEK

■ K.D. LANG: *All You Can Eat* (Warner Bros. 2-46034)



Lang's follow-up to her hugely successful *Ingenue* album finds the pop superstar continuing the radical growth she's shown since starting out in country. Rather than doing "Constant Craving"—the sequel, Lang makes her latest effort a deeply rich, hand woven quilt of romantic moods and sensual pop textures laced with the tradition of great torch song singers. The summation of her experiment is a dazzling 10-song *album*. The disc kicks off with the erudite "If I Were You," a song that more adventurous radio programmers

will find friendly. On the lovely "Maybe," one of the CD's better tracks, Lang blends her country roots with a smooth ambience to create a '90s sounding love song. *All You Can Eat* is a disc that should be labeled "for lovers only." However, instead of being sold between late-night infomercials it would do best in cyberspace. The beauty of the record though is that regardless of how current it sounds, like any great love story, it has an ageless feel. Other standout tracks include the sultry "Sexuality," the stunning "Acquiesce" and the beautiful "Infinite And Unforeseen."

■ VERONICA: V...As In Veronica (Mercury 528548) Producers: Various

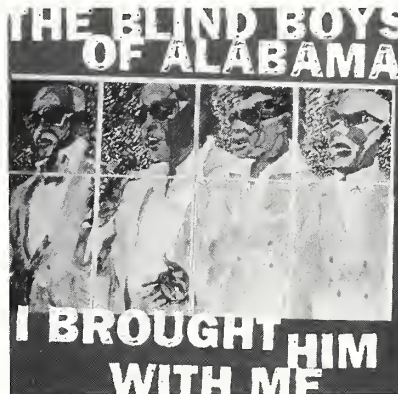

Throughout this album Staton's vocals are strong and give the material covered much personality and deep personal meaning. Although radio has remained reluctant to promote the wonderful sounds of gospel, music like this will hopefully encourage programmers to add more of the great sounds coming from the church onto their rotation list. Standout tracks: "When I See The Blood," "Somebody's Knocking," "You Can Make It," "Rapture Me."



■ THE BLIND BOYS OF ALABAMA: I Brought Him With Me (House of Blues 7003-2) Producers: Clarence Fountain and Kevin Morrow



This old school band delivers some of the best traditional rhythm and blues available in the marketplace today. The vocals here are smooth and clean and the overall production crisp. These guys give you a new understanding about the roots of R&B music. The fellows sing with an honesty that is refreshing and the music here backs them up all the way. Radio programmers across the board would do themselves a favor by checking this record out. Standout tracks: "If I Had A Hammer," "Hush," "King Jesus," and "Amazing Grace."

PICK OF THE WEEK

■ SHAI: Blackface (MCA 11176) Producer: Shai

Shai's follow-up to their multi-platinum is impressive. The group does a good job in duplicating the magic from their last album without repeating it. Everything about this album is first-rate from production concept and merit on through to the artist's performance and the songs' lyrical content. The music here demonstrates that the men of Shai are in touch and hooked into the vibe of what contemporary urban audiences are seeking. This album will get immediate acceptance from urban radio and should do very well on pop formats as well. Congratulations, guys, this one is a winner. Standout tracks: "Come With Me," "Falling," "How Will I Find Someone," and "The Place Where You Belong."

Blur/Whale

JOHN ANSON FORD THEATRE, HOLLYWOOD, CA—Right now, Blur are *the* big thing in England. Blur-mania definitely crossed over to the States for the band's packed show at the John Anson Ford Theatre. Though the Virgin Records' group's new album, *The Great Escape* has only been out since the end of September domestically, the buzz about them in their native England created a fevered pitch that bordered on frightening.

When lead singer Damon Albarn made his way from the backstage area to the stage via the auditorium to join Whale on stage for "Kickin'," from their new album (more on that later), he was greeted by shrieks that normally only accompany orgasms and murders.

When Blur took the stage for their nearly 90-minute set, after being introduced "as the biggest band in England" by KROQ's Rodney on the Roq, the androgynous-in-appearance crowd crushed their way to the front of the stage, a highly unusual situation for the reserved Ford. However, being good anglophiles, the young fans refrained from moshing, instead waving their arms to songs like "Entertain Me," from the new album, and the much requested "There's No Other Way."

While the band lacked the stage presence of many of their British pop peers, including Gene and Elastica, Blur expanded their core quartet to include an additional keyboard player and a horn section, creating a richer sound than the one found on record.

But, this was not so much Blur's night as it was the fans. Yes, they were there to celebrate Blur's music and worship their new idols, but the screaming in the audience, the sea of bodies flowing smoothly to the front of the stage and the euphoria was as much about being there and being seen there as it was about "Girls Against Boys," the band's biggest hit in the states.

Opening the show was Blur's labelmates Whale, the highly charged techno group best known for the out-of-leftfield hit, "Hobo Humpin' Slobobabe." Though the song came out two years ago, the Swedish band just released their debut CD. The disc offers up an impressive variety of styles, a quality the band could've used more of in their very brief 35-minute set. Still, it's hard to make much of an impression in that brief a time span, as the band was just getting going with a strong version of "Kickin'" when they left the stage.

Crusaders Cruise

THE STRAND, REDONDO BEACH, CA—Jazz fusion took on a definite identity when the Jazz Crusaders were born in the '60s. The group's recent performance at The Strand proves that the members can still make you remember the time and place. After more than a decade of performing as a solo artist and producing talent like pianist Bobby Lyle, Hiroshima and Crusader co-founder Wilton Felder, Wayne Henderson has come home. He has survived, and ultimately thrived, something evident by the Jazz Crusader's recent Syndrome Records release *Happy Again*.

The performance at The Strand was a prelude to a three month tour that will carry the band to international venues, including South Africa. The "new Crusader" band consists of Wilton Felder on saxophone, Giovanni Guildo on lead guitar, Tony St. James on drums, Nathaniel Phillips on bass and the ubiquitous Bobby Lyle on keyboards.

The Strand housed an SRO audience, which reflected a divergence of age and culture. And while the sound could have been better and Felder's performance a little more energetic, the audience seemed not to notice. The real treat of the evening was the musicianship exhibited by Lyle, especially during a tribute to Miles Davis. Bassist Phillips also provided a remarkable display of fretboard work. Henderson was the ring master and made it clear that he is a performer as well as a stalwart behind-the-scenes person.

The Jazz crusaders have made fitting return to what could prove to be a bright limelight.

SABOR DE LA LUZ ORQUESTA DE LA LUZ

With their lead vocalist Nora, the band from Japan has enjoyed an incredibly steady level of mass consumer support from the Latin Salsa market. This is the group's second album for the BMG label. Nora sounds as dynamic as ever with a band that any New York musician on the Cuchy Frito Circuit can respect. The track "Sabor" is a classic example of why De La Luz has been able to succeed for so long. It's high energy with a tremendous swing. All ten selections, including the Carpenters' "(They Long To Be) Close To You," have an undeniable attraction.

■ **SONORA DINAMITA: *Cumbia Caliente con la Sonora Dinamita* (Discos Fuentes/VEDISCO, 1100) Producer: Julio Ernesto Estrada-Fruko. TROPICAL/CUMBIA.**

This band bears a legacy of over 35 years as popular recording artists in their native Colombia. The Sonora Dinamita band continues to reign as one of the premiere cumbia groups. Under the direction of master musician, Julio Ernesto Estrada, popularly known as Fruko, the group offers 14 fresh selections as recorded by its trio of female singers as well as two male vocalists. The 37th album by this group will undoubtedly sell well among cumbia enthusiasts.



■ **FELISHA: *Felisha* (NRT, 1023) Producer: Rubén González. TROPICAL/REGGAE.**

Puerto Rican vocalist Felisha comes from a long line of musicians. Her uncle and guitarist, Aristides García, interpreted the beautiful folkloric music of the island. Felisha has taken a more modern approach to her musical inclinations. Her debut recording offers reggae and similarly inspired ballads in Spanish as well as two sides in

English. The two more interesting ballads "En todo estas tú" and "Estando junto a ti" have the best hit potential for this young artist.

For those unfamiliar with this label from Mexico, you better get familiar real quick. There's been a surging market throughout the world for Afro-Cuban music from Cuba. This Mexican record company collects, records, and produces recordings of traditional folk music of Mexico and the islands of the Caribbean. This particular album offers a great source of the Cuban rhythm known as the "Son." The product is distributed by Rounder/Messidor. For more info, call: 617-354-0700 or fax: 617-491-1970. Before Salsa, this was the real McCoy.

One of the truly great pioneers of the Caribbean, respected bassist and bandleader, Cachao of Cuba returns with the second installment of his *Master Sessions* masterpiece. Some may recall that the first edition won a Grammy Award in the Tropical music category last year. Cachao better look for another spot in the trophy cabinet.

A sure-fire nomination, *Volume II* simply extends the "descargas" or jam sessions it was originally intended to create. You're taken back to the Cuba of the late 1940s and hurled with lightning speed to the sophisticated, yet raw message of today's truly inspired class of musician. From descarga to danzón, Cachao delights the incessant appetite of any true connoisseur of Cuban music. Of course, novices are especially welcomed.

HARD ROCK CAFE PAYS TRIBUTE TO SELENA: Stain Tejano star Selena was remembered by friends and family in San Antonio on October 5 in San Antonio. The special tribute was held at the **Hard Rock Cafe** in that city.

The late singer's husband, **Chris Perez**, and father, **Abraham Quintanilla** joined Hard Rock Cafe general manager **Trey Moore** in unveiling a star with Selena's name on it in the sidewalk in front of the music-oriented restaurant. During the tribute, Moore announced that the company would donate \$5,000 to the **Selena Fund**, which provides scholarships for students throughout Texas.

Art Levitt, the CEO of **Hard Rock Cafe International**, also made a special trip to San Antonio for the tribute. "During the short time that Selena was with us, she had an enormous impact on the community and the music industry. We are remembering her today because she was an incredibly talented performer, a forerunner in the music industry and a great role model for young people," he said.

In a touching ceremony in front of the restaurant, a star in the sidewalk was unveiled as the mariachi group, **Campanas de America**, played. The star, which is the first of its kind in front of the cafe, is carved out of limestone and includes Selena's name emblazoned across the center in brass letters. The idea for the star was born when fans unsuccessfully petitioned for a star for Selena on the **Hollywood Walk of Fame**. After hearing about fans' efforts, Hard Rock Cafe officials decided to commemorate the singer with a star in South Texas, where she got her start.

They also unveiled the display of memorabilia donated by Selena when she performed at the grand opening of San Antonio's Hard Rock Cafe. The display was moved into a tall display that previously contained **Elvis Presley** memorabilia—a sign of the singer's popularity there. The centerpiece of the

exhibit, a beaded, white evening gown, was worn by Selena to accept her Grammy Award for Best Mexican-American album for her 1993 recording, *Selena Live*, and to film the video of

her hit single, "No Me Queda Mas." The **Lillie Rubin** original was made out of 100 percent silk and decorated with thousands of silver and white bugle beads. The formal, floor-length gown was a purposeful departure for Selena, who was known for her flashy stage costumes.

"When we decided to build in San Antonio, we made a commitment to highlight the music and culture of this area in the Hard Rock Cafe," said Levitt. "Today, we are keeping that promise and unveiling memorabilia representing some of the biggest legends in Tejano music. This is just the start—we plan to keep adding and updating this exhibit."

Fans can visit the exhibit during the Hard Rock Cafe's operating hours from 11 a.m. to 2 a.m. every day. The Hard Rock Cafe is located at 111 W. Crockett Street in the South Bank Complex.

LOS TEMERARIOS HIT GOLD: Indie label, **AFG Sigma**, recently certified the designation of an R.I.A.A. Film Reviews

UA's *Leaving Vegas*: Dark, Beautifully Honest Work

SOMETIMES A LOW BUDGET brings out the best in filmmakers. Of course, it helps if they have material they believe in to start with, good material. Honest, real material, no matter how dark and seemingly tragic is the *good* material. Material like this lives and breathes on screen because it affects the filmmakers who truly care about what they are doing as they prepare it. That care shows, beginning to end in *Leaving Las Vegas*.

Mike Figgis writes, directs and scores and does a superb job on all three. If the budget on *Leaving Las Vegas* were larger and, by some miracle, it should meet with commercial success, this would—*should* anyway—come up with multiple Oscar nominations. It may, however, be simply *too* soul-honest to play for the in-denial, escapist-loving majority of the movie-going audience. This requires becoming caught up in the characters, caring—bottom line: suspension of fantasy and acceptance of reality.

Yes, there *are* people in the world who've just had *enough*. This is a brutally honest look into the souls, not necessarily the cogs of what makes

these people go forward but rather, their acceptance of their own, however self-manipulated, fulfillment of what they perceive to be their destiny.

Figgis' screenplay is based upon the novel by John O'Brien who, two weeks after making the deal for this work to become a film, committed suicide. O'Brien's father has said his son's book was his suicide note.

Nicolas Cage stars as the alcoholic screenwriter who's lost everything in L.A. and sets out to drink himself to death in Las Vegas. His acceptance of his condition and its ultimate outcome is a driving force, *the* central post, so strong and resolved that hooker Elisabeth Shue, combined with her own perception of existence, accepts it totally. These two people love one another through his protracted suicide and her protective acceptance of that.

There is nothing weak about an alcoholic. These people are strong. A weak person couldn't take the punishment alcoholics dish out to themselves and accept from others in order to pursue their *rights*. For a practicing alcoholic to set out to drink himself to death is tragic only to those who do not understand the alcoholic mind. Figgis' script and Cage's performance gives us, if not insight, at least the rises and falls and glimpses of the internal strength it takes to carry through with such a destructive life. It is the finest performance to date for Cage.

And Elisabeth Shue's work puts her in the running for -A- List *Actress* roles. Shue lays open her hooker character as a feeling, eared but beaten—emotionally and physically—survivor, standing up to, taking what life does out, and moving one foot in front of the other to whatever end awaits her. The actress layers her performance with acceptance, subservience, longing, love, pride and hope even through mud. She is brilliant.

Julian Sands as a doomed Russian pimp on the run from hoods etches a strong portrayal, and, while not absolutely essential to the central issue, goes to allowing us to see another side of Shue's character.

The overall piece has a Charles Bukowski spirituality to it, but without the manic level his *Barfly* projected. Where that concerned itself with survival spirituality, *Leaving Las Vegas* has a resigned, at-peace spiritual aura to it. But it is deep and full and, at moments, *desperately* real. Figgis is a director with a deep feeling for humanity when he is in control of a project. Here he writes, directs and integrates his own score which is a character in itself. This is one of the most wonderfully haunting soundtracks you're going to find, especially this season: "Angel Eyes," "It's A Lonesome Old Town," "My One And Only Love," "Lonely Teardrops," "Come Rain Or Come Shine," "The Third Man Theme." All of which absolutely *naïl* the moment on screen so perfectly they *naïl* you to your seat. Sting performs the vocals on three.

Declan Quinn's Super 16mm photography gives the film a deep, strong core look which serves as a steely visual spine. Done on actual locations with long lenses for a peeping tom-like docu feel, we often experience a desire to turn away as if witnessing something too personal.

The material and director's integrity has attracted the likes of Richard Lewis, Steven Weber, Valeria Golino, Mariska Hargitay, Julian Lennon, Bob Rafelson and Lou Rawls into small roles, all of whom are solid.

20th's *Strange Days* Lives Up To Its Name

WHATEVER RESULTS YOU WOULD EXPECT from a teaming of superstar producer/director/writer James Cameron (*Terminator*, *Terminator 2*, *Aliens*) and director Kathryn Bigelow (*Blue Steel* and the wonderful vampire film, *Near*

Dark) is what you get in the rapid fire sensory overload that is *Strange Days*. Bigelow directs the over-two hour futuristic odyssey from a Cameron/Jay Cocks script (he also produced the film with Steven-Charles Jaffe), but it's the wonderful leads, Ralph Fiennes (*Schindler's List*, *Quiz Show*) and Angela Bassett (*What's Love Got To Do With It*) that not only bring some semblance of coherency to the disjointed story, but make it an entertaining, albeit, long experience.

Fiennes plays Lenny Nero, an ex-vice cop that now deals in the illegal trade of "wiring." In 1999, when the movie takes place, scientists have devised a technology that allows people to record "clips" of life. Basically, this wire-filled device is attached to the top of the head and it records, from the emotional cortex, whatever the person wearing the device is doing, touching, hearing, saying, seeing, etc.

Created initially by the feds, the device has become the narcotic of choice in 1999. As Lenny says, "This is not TV, only better. This is life—a piece of somebody's life, straight from the emotional cortex." And Lenny is one of the top dealers, a guy who can supply you with anything you want if you have the money, except "blackjack," death tapes, which he won't deal in.

One of the film's best scenes comes early on, when Lenny is trying to close a deal with an attorney looking for some vicarious sex thrills. Lenny looks the customer right in the eye and says, "I'm the Magic Man, the Santa Claus of the Subconscious." Fiennes, who was nominated for an Oscar for his portrayal of a Nazi in *Schindler's List*, portrays evil better than anyone else in films right now. If ever there was a candidate to portray the devil or a vampire, it's this alluring actor.

One of the biggest drawbacks to the film comes from the fact that Lenny doesn't get to be evil enough. As the story progresses, we learn that Lenny is essentially a lovable loser. A guy hopelessly in love with the wrong woman, Faith (Juliette Lewis), and nothing more than a nickel-and-dime, though on a larger scale, salesman. Lenny's shortcomings though, give Bassett, as his friend Mace, a chance to portray the heroine. And it is a nice change for Hollywood to have the woman saving the man's ass, instead of the other way around.

For all of its high-tech special effects, of which there are many, and its futuristic ideals, *Strange Days* is more a love story than anything else. It's also very much a sermon on race relations.

However, I won't even attempt to get into that, as to try and capture all of this film's subplots would be like trying to summarize an entire season of *Melrose Place*.

As for the rest of the cast, Lewis is fine as Lenny's lost love, Tom Sizemore is excellent as his best friend, the low-life P.I., Max. The lovely Brigitte Bako is good in a brief but vital role as Iris, a hooker who used to do some "wire work" for Lenny and Glenn Plummer gives a charismatic feel to the very important character of Jeriko One, a militant rap star/activist.

It is Fiennes and Bassett's film though, and the two Academy Award-nominated actors deliver with sterling performances that make *Strange Days* a worthwhile endeavor. Though, be advised, the best way to see this film is as a late-at-night, tripping on "X" movie. It will have a decent run at the box office, but I see definite *Clockwork Orange* potential here for the future.

Rae Sanchini serves as executive-producer. Graeme Revell and Deep Forest provided the movie's fantastic score.

Trimark's *The Doom Generation*, A '90s Cult Flick

90S AUTEUR GREGG ARAKI doesn't lay the blame on anyone except his participants in this, his second in an intended trilogy—first being *Totally F***ed Up*—with his title. These characters don't bother whining about being doomed—with an *e-d* on the end to point the finger at those who have gone before. Hell no, they say, this is straight *Doom*. And they carry that doom proudly with unsafe and unsanitary sex and/or anything else that could be even remotely compared to that old cliché 'taking care of oneself.'

Actually, in one respect, it's sort of refreshing to see characters behave the way they behave because that's the way they *want* to behave; they've made their stys, now they'll wallow in them—and enjoy them without whining.

Metaphorically—the three central characters surnamed Red, White, and Blue, are selfish, obsessive and sweetly naive—it's pretty bleak in its outlook though Araki does make some rather salty observations throughout in rather loopy fashion. Cinematically, though he had a bigger budget for this one, he retains a low budget level manner of making movies—driving scenes in a stationary vehicle—which is rather off-putting, and he pulls some refrains and images from other, more mainstream filmmakers. (Shows you how fleeting creativity is in filmmaking when Quentin Tarantino can seem 'mainstream' so quickly.)

These characters are devoid of feelings. James Duval is the simple, naive, puppydogish Jordan White. Duval as Jordan shows some emotion, and the actor makes the character likeable. Rose McGowan as Amy Blue is rather pornographic, moody and sports a direct steal of Uma Thurman's *Pulp Fiction* look and a couple of traits with that character. McGowan invests the character with an icy core. Johnathon Schaech is Xavier Red, the devil, evil, bisexual, corrupt and loving it. The actor brings only superficial belief to the character, nothing we haven't seen before.

Around this central trio, floating in and out in bits and pieces as clerks and TV broadcasters are the likes of Margaret Cho, Lauren Tewes, Christopher Knight, Amanda Bearse, Don Galloway and Heidi Fleiss. Something and/or somebody for everybody.

Araki gives the piece a truly grungy, depressive feel. The *Doom* is on the rose, on the lives of these people and on society completely, he seems to be saying. What comedy there is is dark, black and superficial. Actually there is little fun in a head being blown off and continuing to talk while spewing green bile; or an arm being blown off and pumping blood; or a character jerking off while watching a couple having sex then licking ejaculate off his own dirty hand—not once, but twice. The appeal will be largely to the lip-nose-eye-tongue-penis-pierced, Mohawk-spiked after-dark denizens of Hollywood Blvd. who should bring this to *Cult* status. Don't look for mainstream audiences to embrace this anytime soon.

URGE TO MERGE: Verity Group, manufacturers of musical instruments and audio electronics products has acquired **Quad Electracoustics**, a professional audio and hi-fi company for £2.37 million. Initial payment was £1.38 million with the rest of the monies dependent on Quad's 1996 sales. Quad's pre-tax losses last year was in the range of £300,000.

GET RICH(ER) QUICK: Out next month is **Julian Richer's** book, *The Richer Way*. Richer is founder of **Richer Sounds**, the hi-fi chain. According to the book, his shops set records for sales per square foot. His main theme is motivation of employees as a way to make more money. He is known for lending his Rolls Royce to employees when requested for special occasions.

KIERAN CAVANAGH was presented with the European Promoter of the Year Award at Nashville's **Country Music Awards**.

NEW RECORDS SET: This year eight singles went into the number one and number two positions the week they were released. In the past, a single usually came onto the charts in the mid-twenties or thirties and worked its way up to the top. In a highly competitive market, many singles come on with so much hype that they immediately go to the top in the first or second week (depending on the seven day period covered by different charts). It took almost 40 years for some 25 records to hit the top spot on the week of their release. It looks like the period from 1990 through 1995 will show it now takes less than five years. Negative side to all this is that promo costs have been rocketing up to the stars, so that there isn't much profit in the top singles.

SINGLES REDUX: Cash Registers are ringing as sales from singles were up 15% in 1994 from 1993 and it looks certain that 1995 sales will outdo the 1994 figures.

YOU'RE NEVER DEAD IN THE MARKET: Talk in the trade is that the two singles expected to top the Christmas charts are the upcoming "Free As A Bird" and "Heaven For Everyone." Of course, we're talking **John Lennon** and **Freddie Mercury**.

HALF A NOTE IS BETTER THAN NONE: Scotland's national opera company, **Scottish Opera**, is to go on part-time in order to save the jobs of its musicians and chorus. They refused the request of the Scottish Arts Council to make use of the other three orchestras in the country. Company is £750,000 in debt. They are cutting their year down to nine months and foregoing all tours outside the country.

HUSH HUSH: **Julian Lloyd Webber** (the brother of) later this month, will help launch *The Quiet Pint*, a guide book to English pubs that don't have piped-in music

AND SPEAKING OF PIPED-IN MUSIC, Phonographic Performance, the U.K. organization that administers music copyright has some 70,000 on its books. But the days of "muzak" are numbered, together with picking up the signal of local radio stations. Comes the day of the specialist who fine tunes the sounds for venues like pubs, hotels, supermarkets, gas stations and any place that uses background sound. **Chrysalis Retail Entertainment** has been launched by Chrysalis and its programming, manufactured for specific companies, is a mix of music, in-store promotions as well as paid-for product advertising. They are following the example of the **Asda** supermarket chain which has its own radio station, **ASDA FM**. Another store-owned group is **Retail Broadcast Services**, whose **Bhs Radio** is in 80 Bhs stores with another 50 of Bhs' outlets coming online next year. **AEI Rediffusion Music** has joined with **Music Choice Europe** in a satellite service offering to start four music-only channels to U.K. stores. **Virgin** and **Capital Radio** are reported to be investigating the field.

ANOTHER WAY TO MAKE MONEY is to go the plastic route. **The Rolling Stones** lent their name to the **Chevy Chase Savings Bank** (not the actor) in Maryland for its name on the plastic credit card. Several groups in the U.K. are investigating putting celebrity faces into the market place, with the celebrity getting a percentage of sales. So, can we look forward to a **Michael Jackson** or **Barbra Streisand Visa**?

THERE WILL BE NO "TIME GENTLEMEN" when Jazz fans mark their calendar, keeping October 27-30 open for the 18th **Guinness Cork Jazz Festival**, one of the top jazz festivals in the world. More than 120 bands from all over the world will be playing Dixieland to bebop and other jazz-related music in more than 50 venues starting at 10 a.m. and ending late at night. The Irish government has extended pub hours for the event. Music will be heard from the Opera House to hotels to clubs to pubs and ending up with free street concerts.

HE'S IN HOT WATER: **Julian Lennon** has been set to write the film score for a dolphin movie. One of the conditions of his employment is the requirement that he spend some time swimming with the dolphins in the Caribbean.

THE IRISH MUSIC USERS COUNCIL has asked Ireland's government to review the current copyright laws. The council members claim the laws now on the books are outdated and they also are protesting increased charges of as much as 100% at a time.

IRON MAIDEN was set to play Beirut's 8,000 seat **Mont La Salle Hall** this week. However, the Lebanese government banned the gig because it was "not in the interests of the youth of the country."

UK SINGLES: **Simply Red's** "Fairground" moves up to first base from second position last week. While on second is newcomer "Mis-Shapes/Sorted For E's & Wizz" by **Pulp**. **Shaggy's** "Boombastic" drops back to third base and **Michael Jackson's** down to fourth spot with his "You Are Not Alone" followed by **Smokie's** "Living Next Door To Alice" in fifth up from eighth. **Mariah Carey's** "Fantasy" drops to sixth spot and **Wet Wet Wet's** "Somewhere Somehow" comes up onto the charts at seventh. News From Japan And The Orient

THE TOTAL WHOLESALE SHIPMENTS of audio and video software for the first eight months of 1995 in Japan showed increases in money and volume, according to a report issued by **RIAJ (Record Industries Association of Japan)** comparing the same period to 1994's tallies. According to the report, the total shipment of AV was, \$4,340 million, up 7%, while 336.141 million units in volume, an increase of 17%. Breaking down the total: Audio software was \$3,411 million, 79% of the total, up 9%; Videos were \$799 million, up 2% while CD-complexes (CD Graphics, CD-I, CD ROM) were \$129 million, 3% of the total, down 1%. Showing in detail according to items: CDs were \$3,273 million, up 10% while in volume, 266.671 units, up 15%. Of the total shipment of CDs, local repertoires reached \$2.611 million, 80% of the total, up 9% while international repertoires showed \$898 million, 20% of the total, up 12%. In volume, domestic repertoires were 205 million units, 77% of the total, up 15%, international repertoires, 61 million units, 23% of the total, up 15%. Of the total shipment, audio tapes were \$132 million, down 16% and in volume, 15 million units, down 17%. Video softwares (including disks and tapes) were, \$799 million, up 2% and in volume, 24 million units, up 11%.

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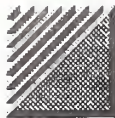

continue to get these awards. This is what keeps the diesel in the buses and keeps us going each year."

Following its performance of "Here Comes The Rain," the group The Mavericks was named Vocal Group of the Year, the group's first CMA Award. Lead singer Raul Malo spoke on behalf of the group, saying "This is unbelievable. You're probably all as stunned as we are." The Tractors also picked up its first CMA Award, winning Music Video of the Year for "Baby Likes To Rock It."

The Entertainer of the Year Award was bestowed upon Alan Jackson, a first-time winner in this category. After receiving the award from Johnny Cash, Jackson recited a few lines from "Job Description," which he wrote for his daughters.

Other award winners for the evening were songwriter Gretchen Peters for "Independence Day," which won Song of the Year; and fiddler Mark O'Connor, who won his fifth consecutive CMA Award for Musician of the Year.

Hall of Fame inductees for 1995 included the late singer/songwriter Roger Miller and former CMA executive director Jo Walker-Meador. Miller received an emotional tribute by Dolly Parton, Willie Nelson, Merle Haggard, Dwight Yoakam and Marty Stuart. His widow, Mary Miller, joked to the audience, "Roger always liked to say he was 20 minutes ahead of his time." She also added, "Roger was a dreamer, and this would have been his wildest dream come true."

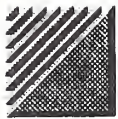

This list spans several decades. The '60s were most prominent, with 20 songs; followed by the '70s, with eight; and the '50s with six.

You will notice, only four artists made the list two times. They are: Patsy Cline with "Crazy" and "I Fall To Pieces;" Elvis Presley with the back-to-back "Hound Dog/Don't Be Cruel" and "Jailhouse Rock;" The Beatles with "Can't Buy Me Love" and "Hey Jude;" and Meat Loaf with "Paradise By The Dashboard Lights" and "Two Out Of Three Ain't Bad."

The earliest song listed on the chart was "Stardust" by Artie Shaw, from 1942.
